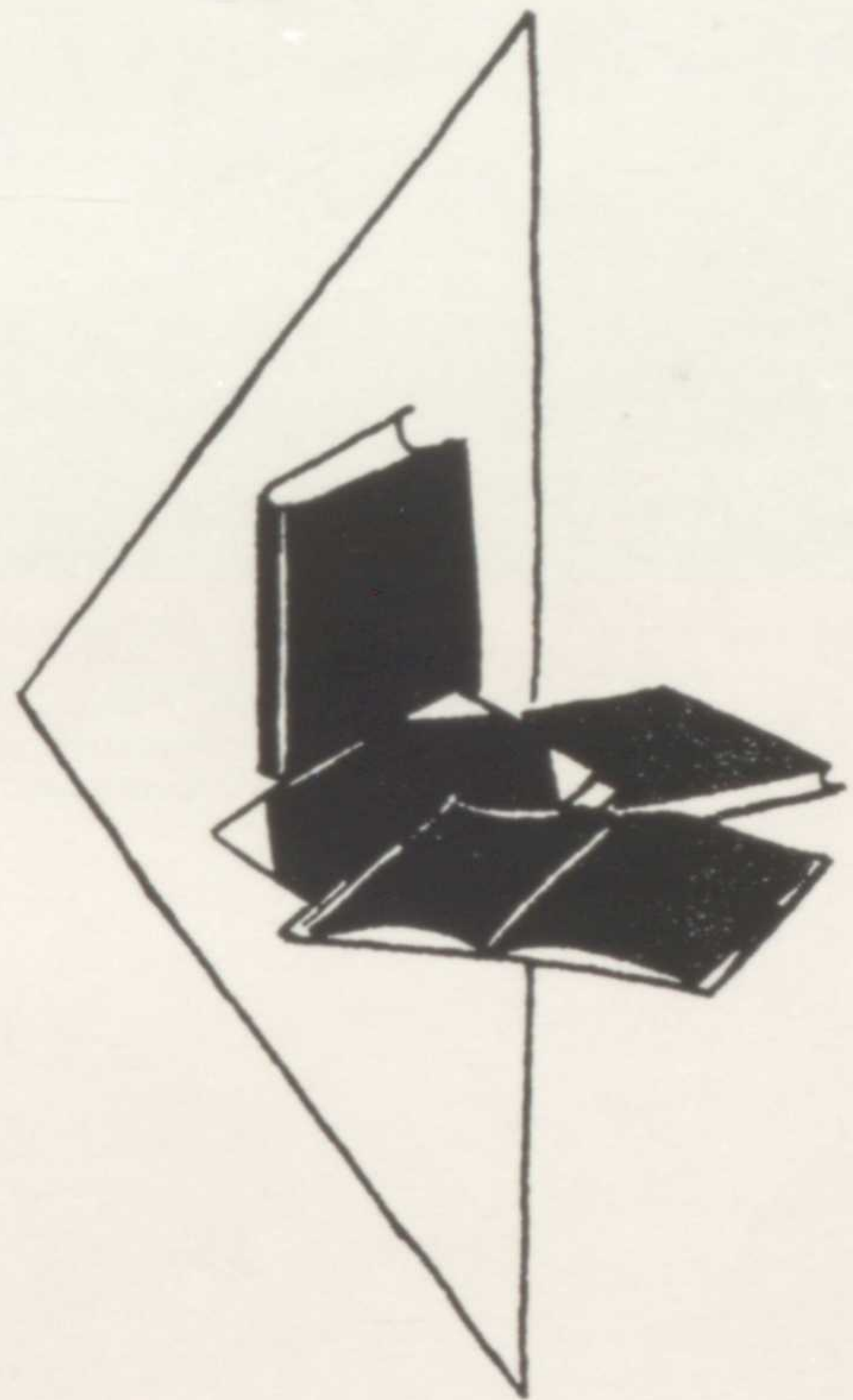
Thus, the Class of '55 takes great pride in dedicating this yearbook to a deserving, very surprised Mr. "D" — Gerhard H. Deutschlander.

# Senior Class History

What terminated in Bay High School June 9, 1955, began in the same place—then Parkview — thirteen years earlier. Members of the Class of '55 took their first toddling, education-bound steps in its hallowed halls and years later marched their "last mile" together to the pompous strains of the Processional. Like Alice and the proverbial mushroom, they bit hard into the fruit of knowledge and grew, and grew, and grew . . . .

It all began in Mrs. Ranney's pre-school class, where Kay and Gay Rothaermel and Sue Hook claim membership in that first famed kindergarten. There they learned all sorts of useful things, like how to keep time in the rhythm band and how to make clay ash trays with their own hand-print.

In first grade, school began in earnest. In between, Dick, Jane, Sally, Puff and Spot, students found time to appear in the first of a long series of musical productions. Dressed as crepe-paper and cotton snowballs, the girls danced for their beaming parents. Another enjoyable "first of a series" was Nancy Hockett's birthday party, featuring home movies and a peanut hunt.

Second grade flew by, and by third grade the youngsters were quite grown up. Rog Coulton and his rendition of "Shoo Fly Pie" were much in demand, and the girls vied for the distinction of carrying him around on their shoulders. "Paddle-to-the-Sea," the story of a carved wooden Indian, was dramatized by Mrs. Thornton's geography class. Each school day began with David Clark's kissing each girl good morning. That same year the first classmate to be pierced by Cupid was Gay Rothaermel. Jim Redinger took advantage of the mail service to send her love letters.

Until fourth grade the small fry from the east end of the village attended the only grade school in Bay at that time, while West-enders stayed in the high school. Crowded conditions at Parkview, however, forced the classes to be thrown together at Forestview, where rivalry between the two

factions erupted. About this time the Rothaermel twins and Sue Hook became the proud owners of three guinea pigs; a truck loaded with guinea pigs had overturned at Wolf and Bassett Roads, and the girls seized this opportunity — and the animals — to acquire some pets.

Christmas in grade school was always extra-special, and in the art classes labors of love were created to surprise long-suffering parents. From the ash trays in kindergarten to the wooden plates painted with Indian symbols in third grade, each gift was from the heart. The culmination of all these Yuletide efforts was reached in fourth grade when the little cherubs laboriously stitched a tree of life on white linen.

Glenview was ready for opening by fifth grade. There the class became agile through Miss Byrd's setting-up exercises each morning. A baton became a "must" for Glenview girls; so each recess was spent imitating the cheering done by older sisters.

Down at Forestview the fifth graders were the stars of a newspaper article concerning Mrs. Sanford's unique history classes, in which marionettes and puppets dramatized historical events. All the students made paper-mache marionettes and produced a Thanksgiving extravaganza. Barb Wheeler and Dave co-starred, and Judie Harris embarked upon her literary career by writing the play.

Forestview-Glenview rivalry became intensified. Al Pirnat and Bradley Sheets seized an inopportune moment on a joint field trip to explore on their own. The next day they shame-facedly appeared before the Glenview class to apologize for getting lost. However, the climax in school loyalties was reached in the annual Army-Navy baseball game. Feelings ran high between the two, and even though Forestview's big-league girl pitcher, Carol Hess, threw her deadliest balls, Glenview copped this and the next year's games.

With the dawning of the final grade-

## BAY DEFEATS FAIRVIEW

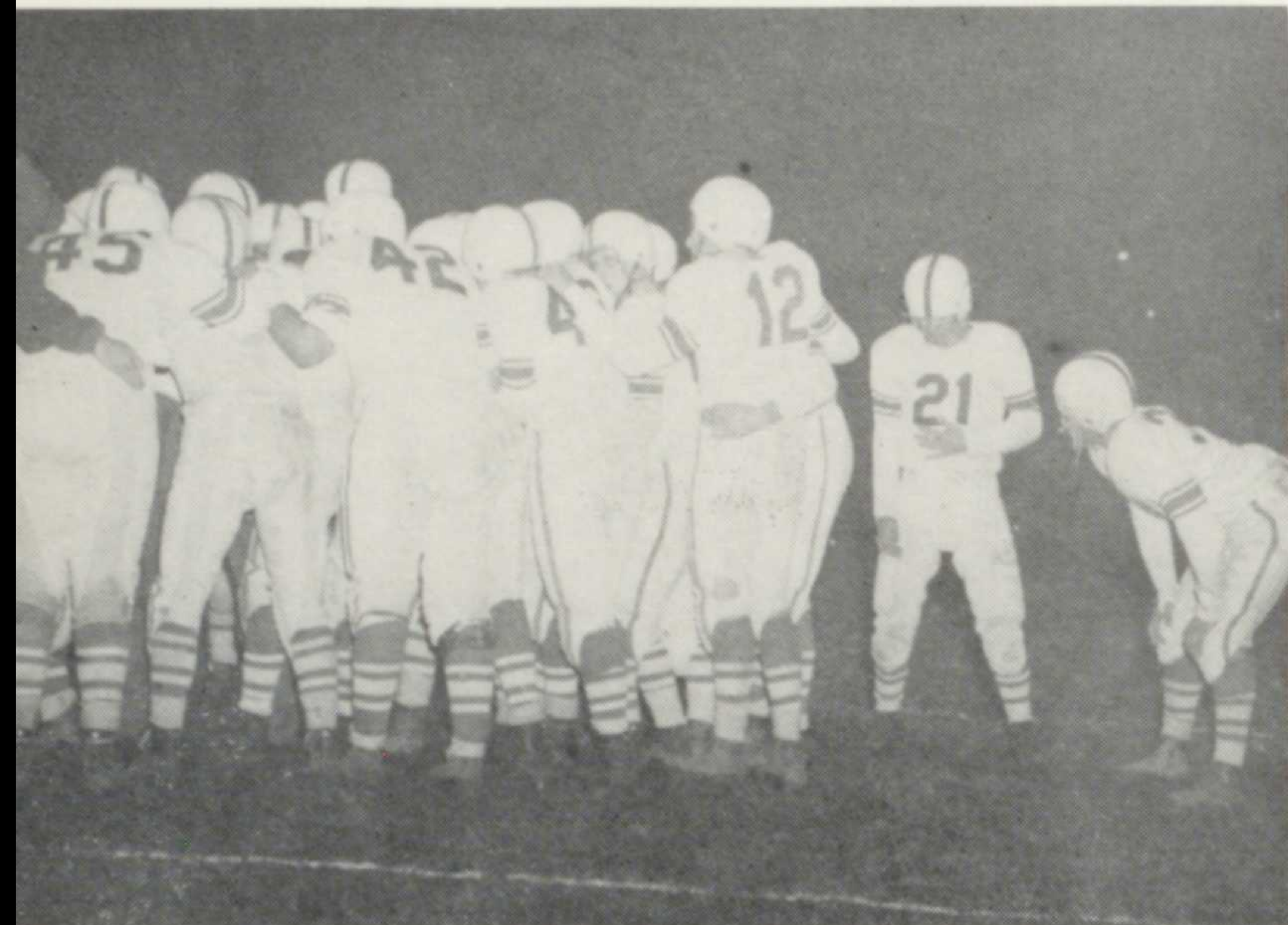

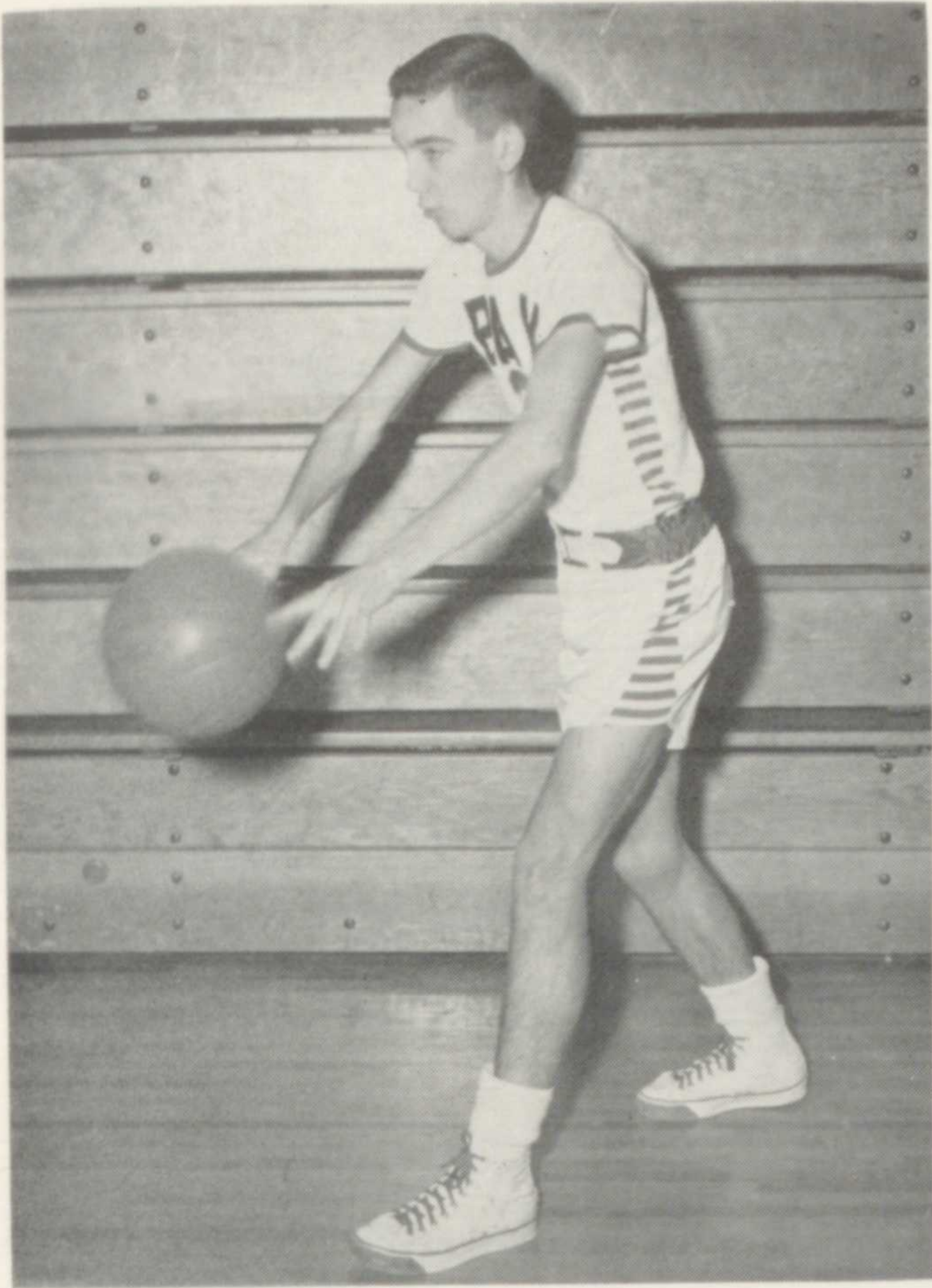
#### BAY FOULS UP WESTLAKE

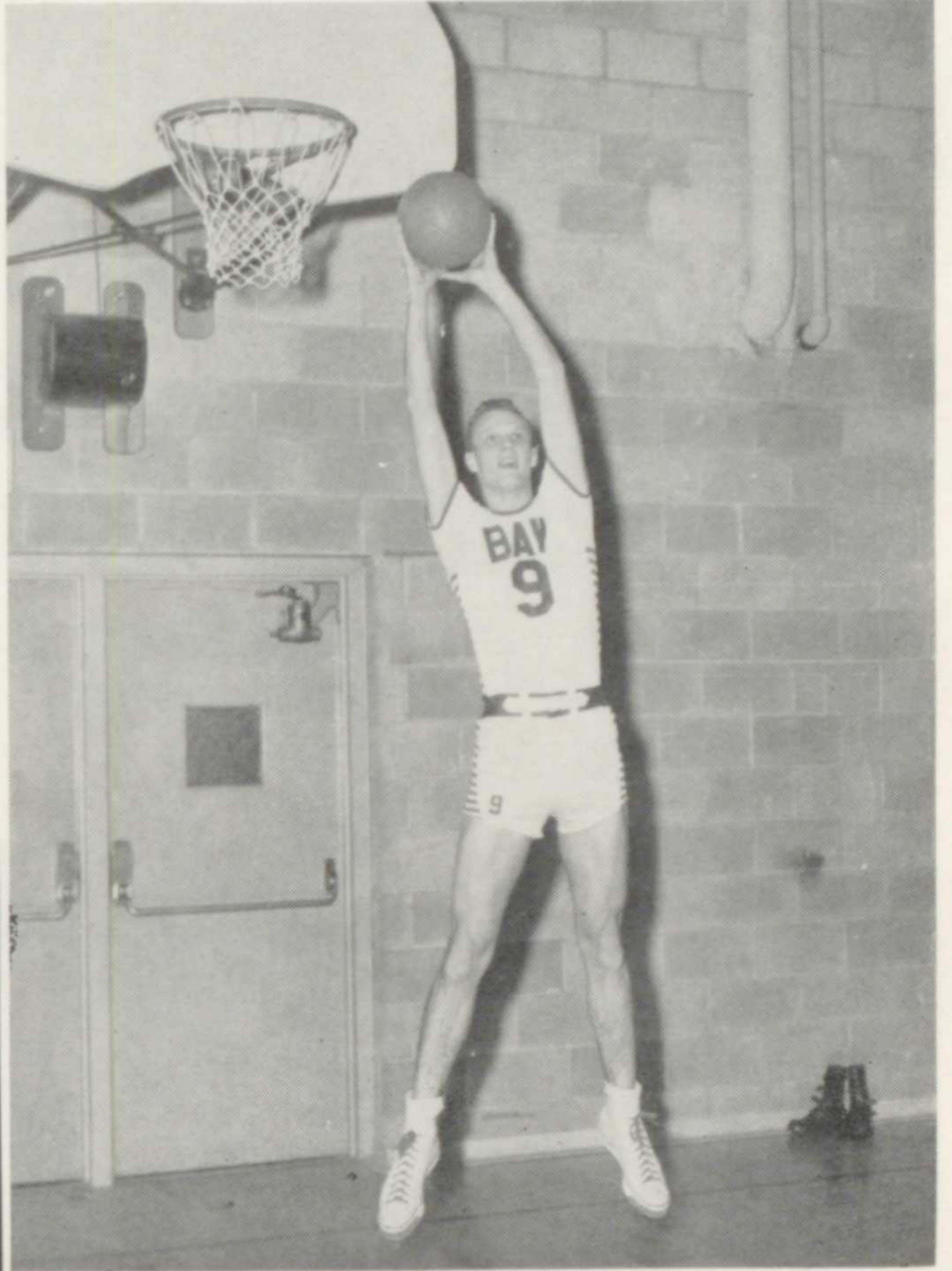
#### FAIRVIEW VICTOR AGAIN

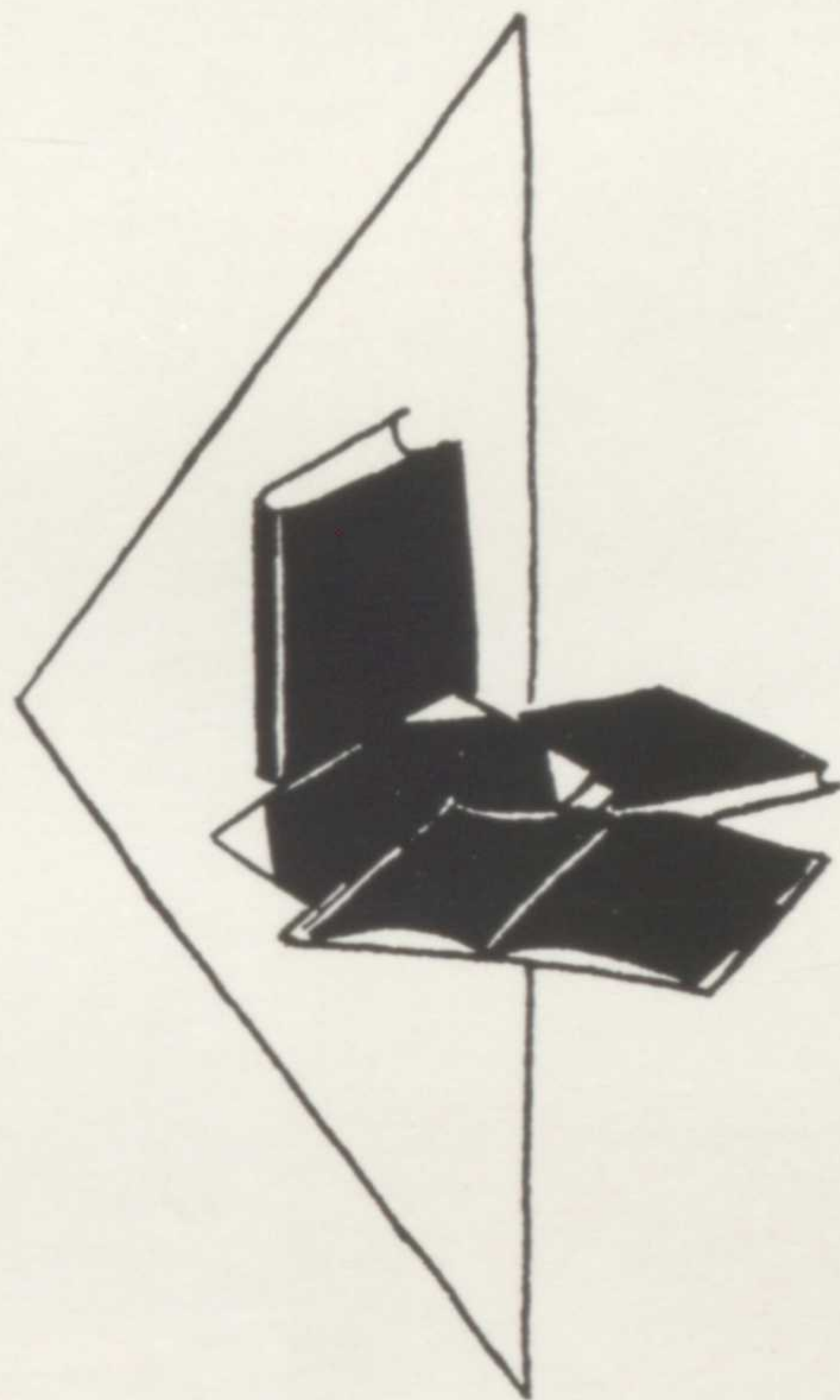

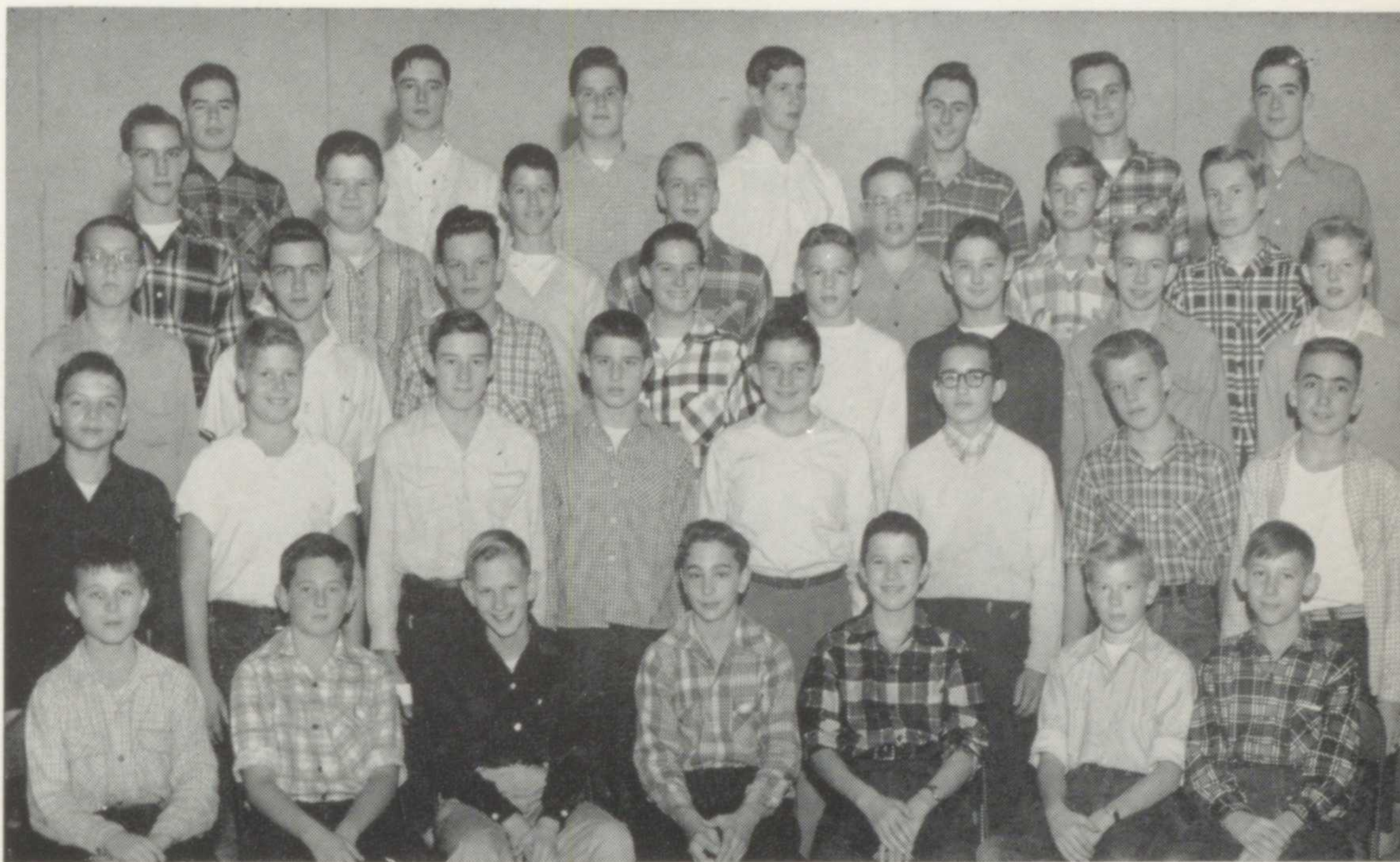

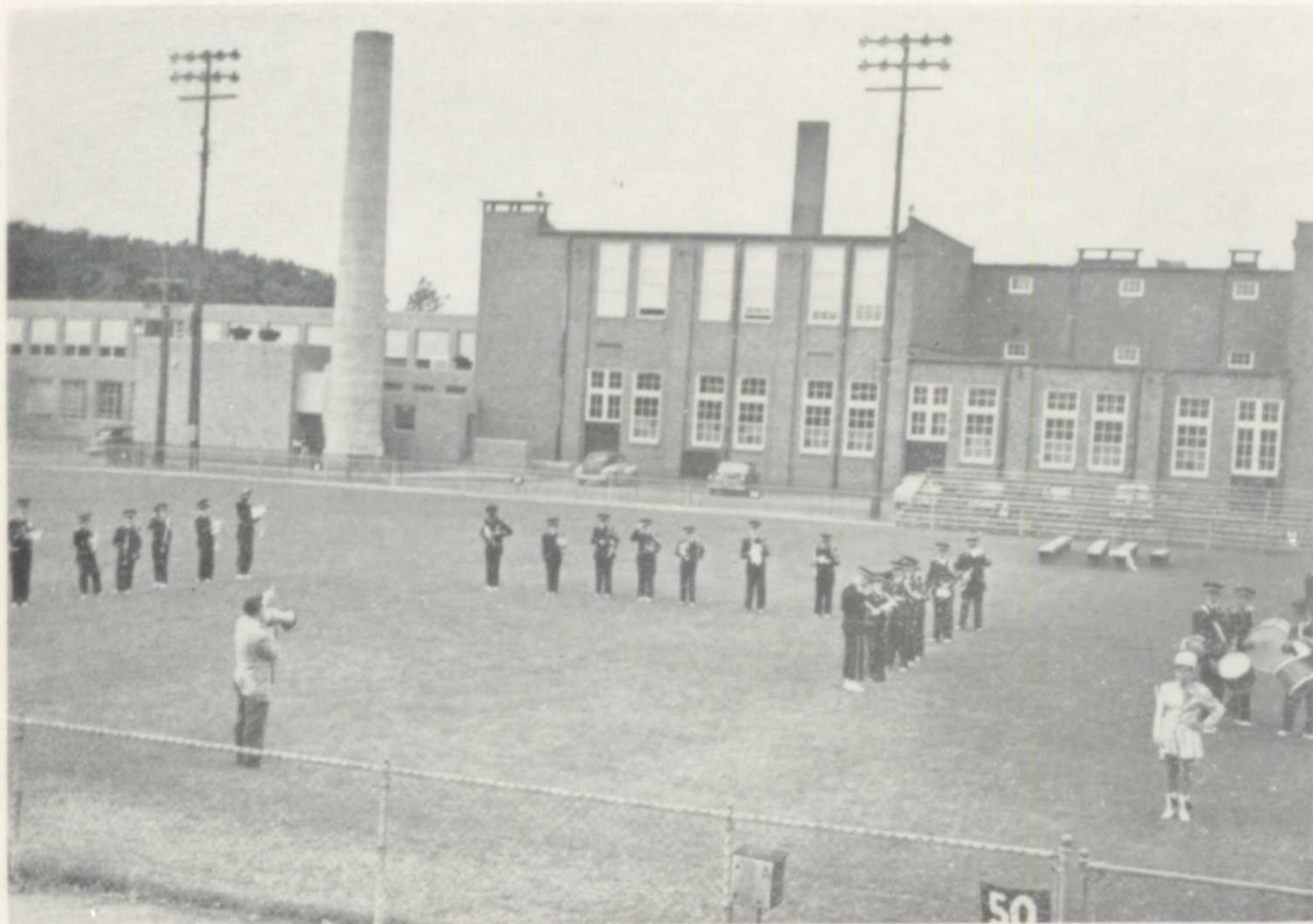
