The Class of 1957--Past and Present

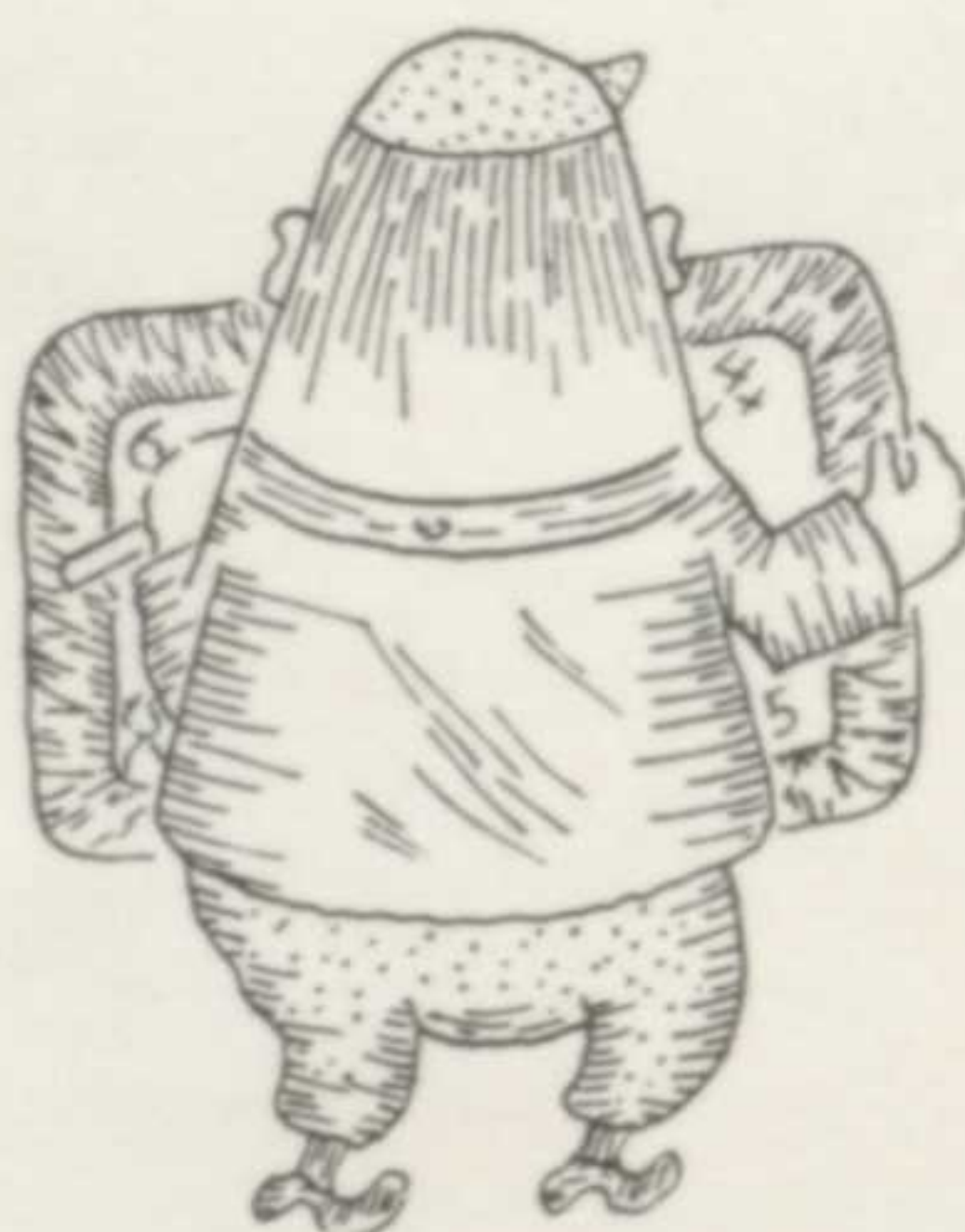

Included in this year's activities were the annual Christmas and spring concerts. The band also played host to Brush and Willoughby bands in a joint concert at Bay.

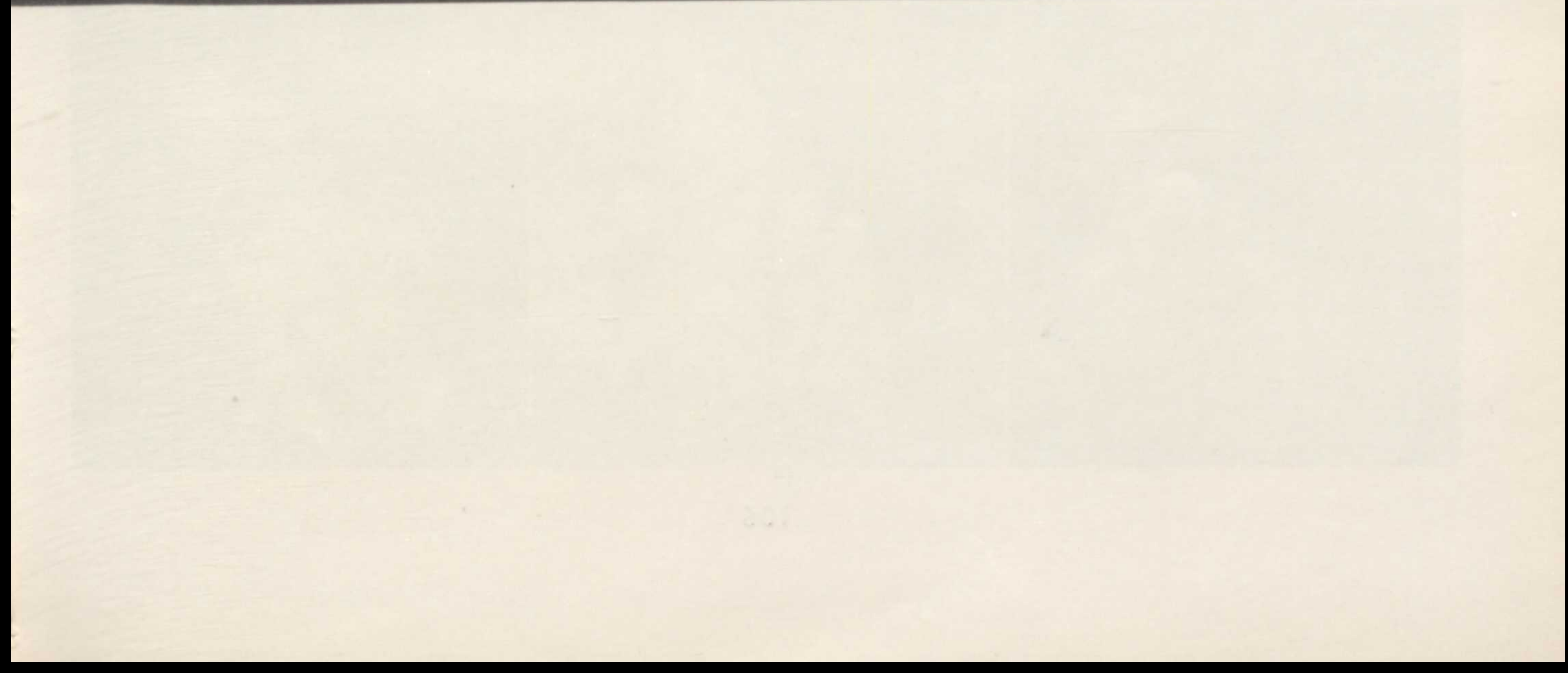

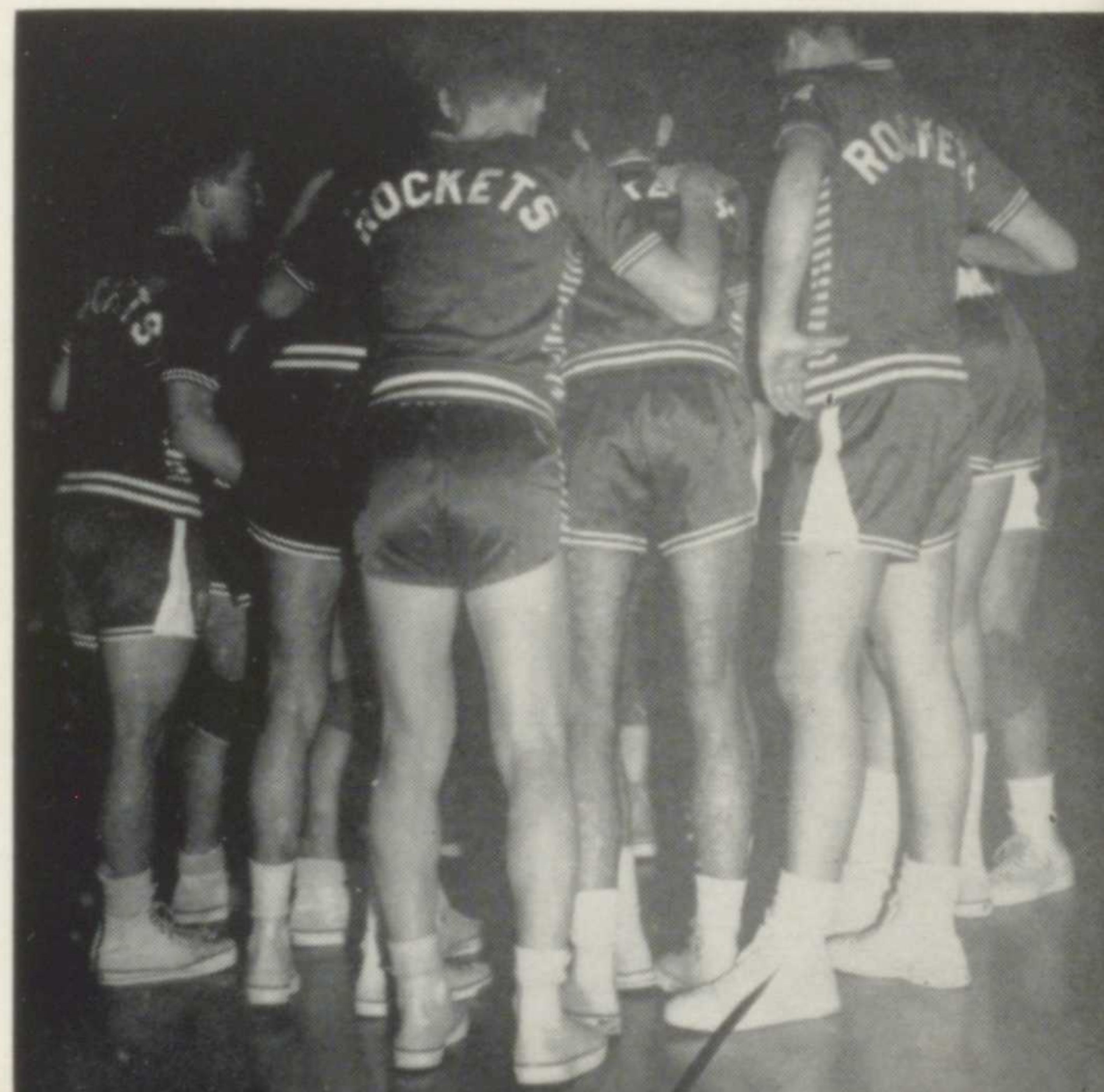
