Rocket, the team's mascot, makes a debut that no one will ever forget! He made up for his shortcomings by spurring the team to victory by his presence at the games.



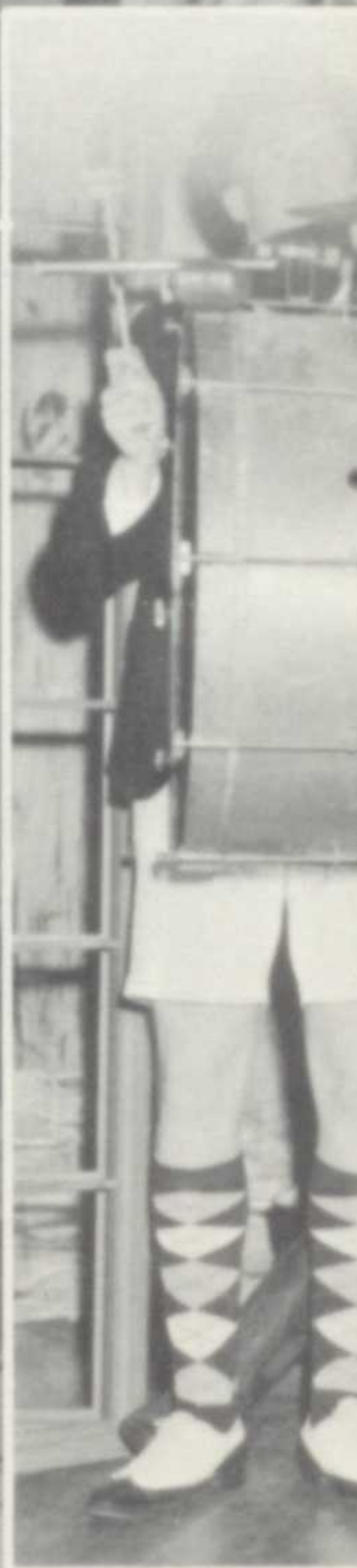
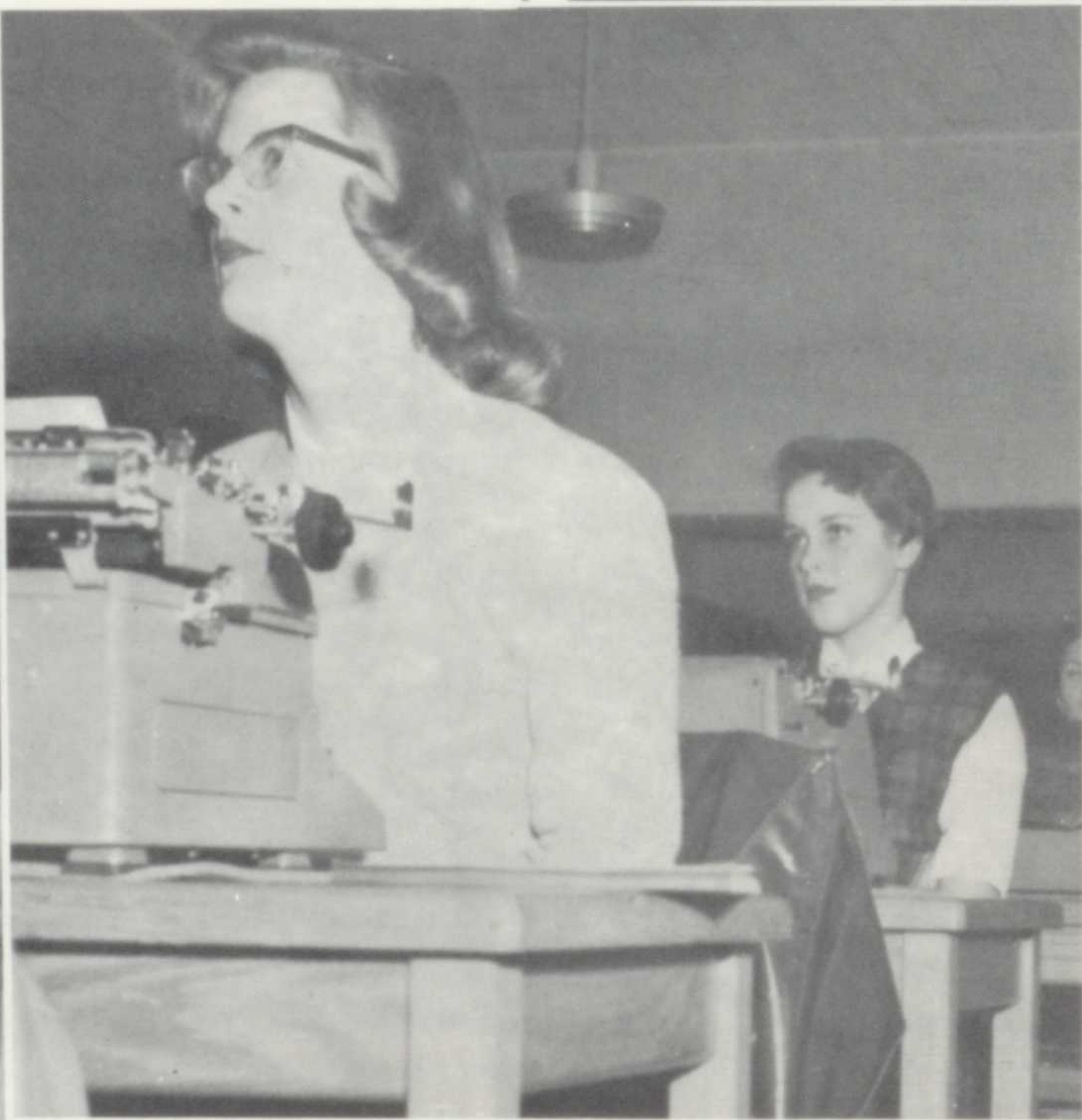
Mr. Wells helps Mr. Judd with the morning "line" during the flu epidemic when nearly a third of the school was absent. Wonder how many were really sick?

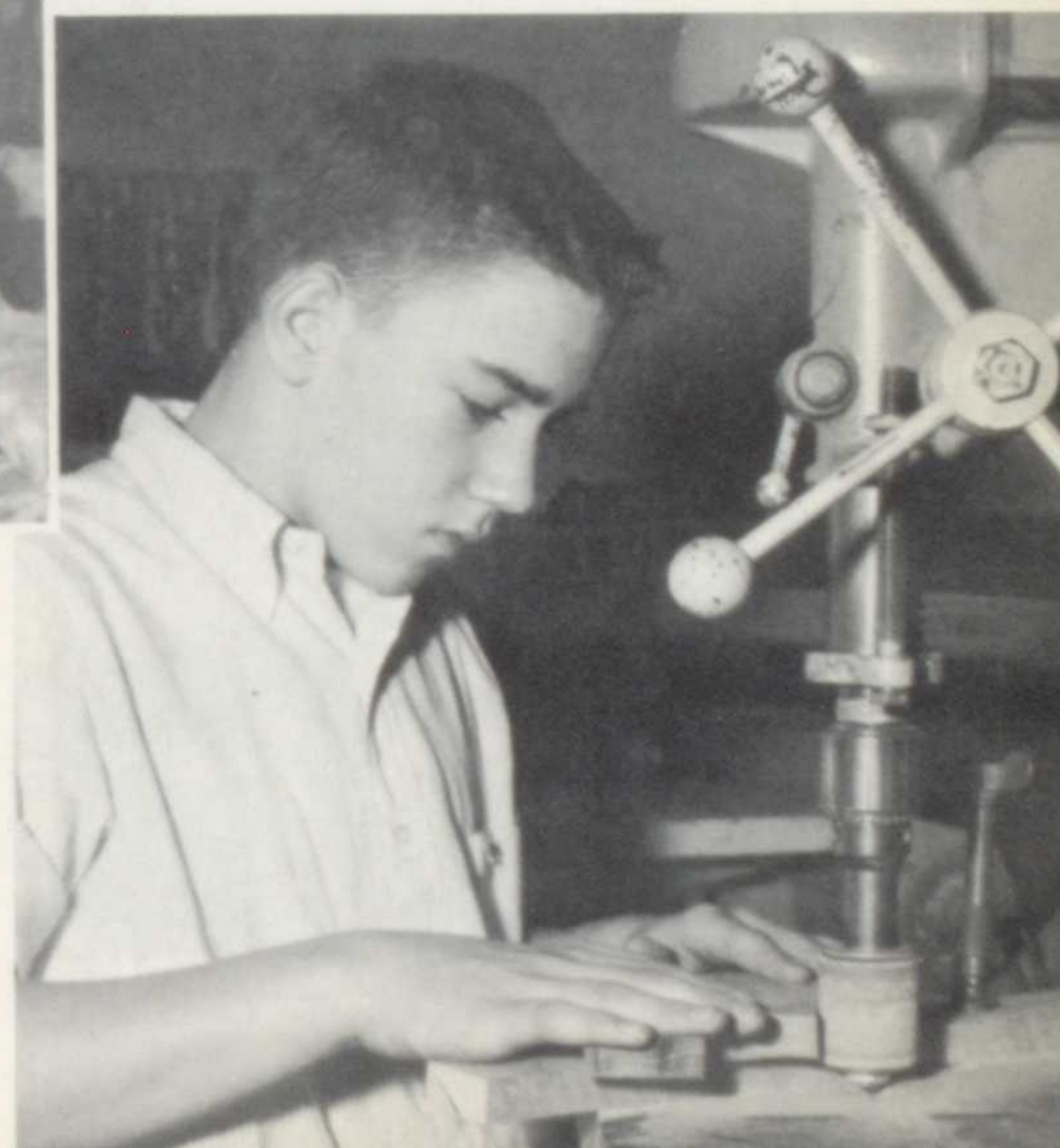
Looks like part of the track team started practice early this year. Regardless of the weather, you can be sure that these boys will run . . . at least once around the school!

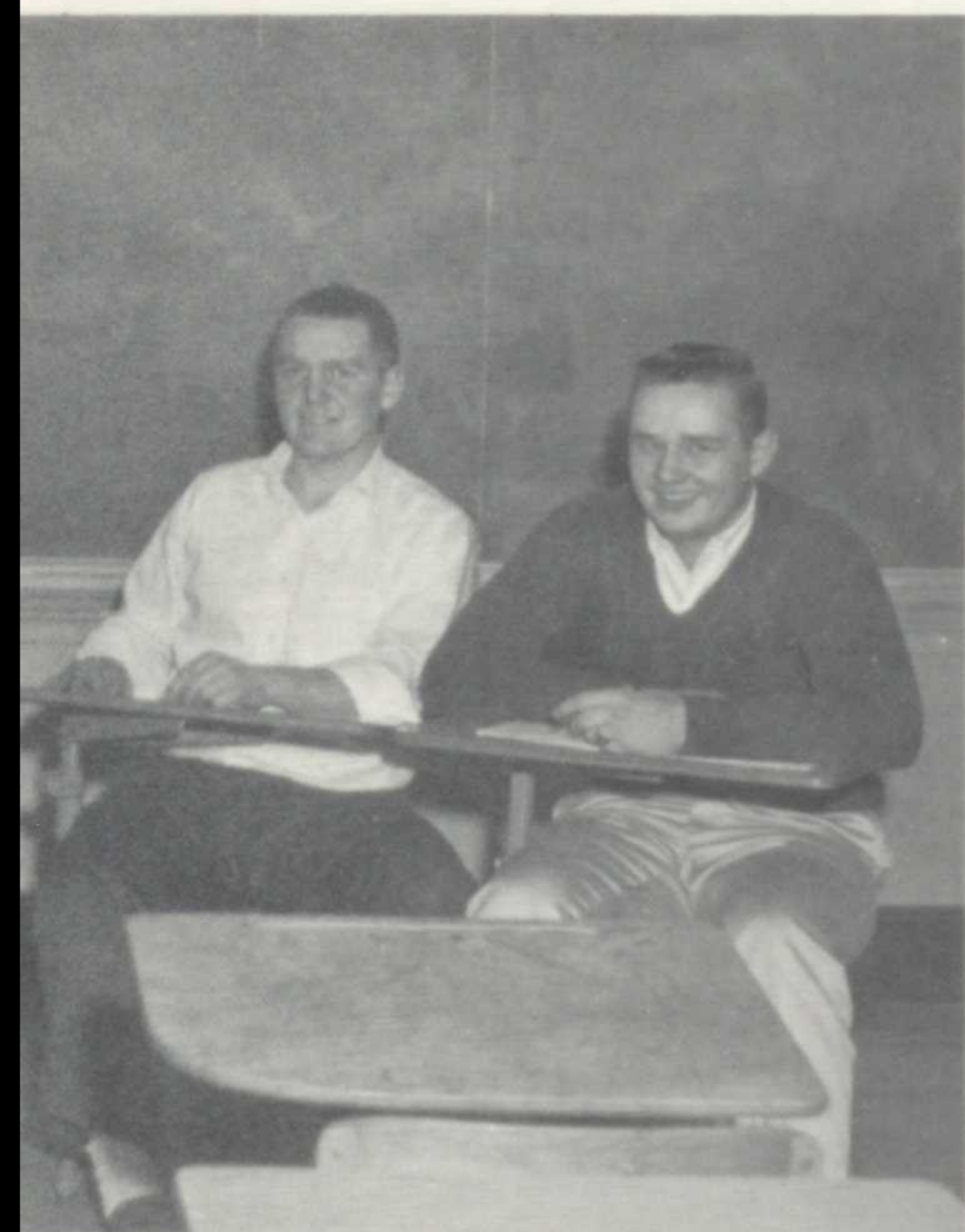
