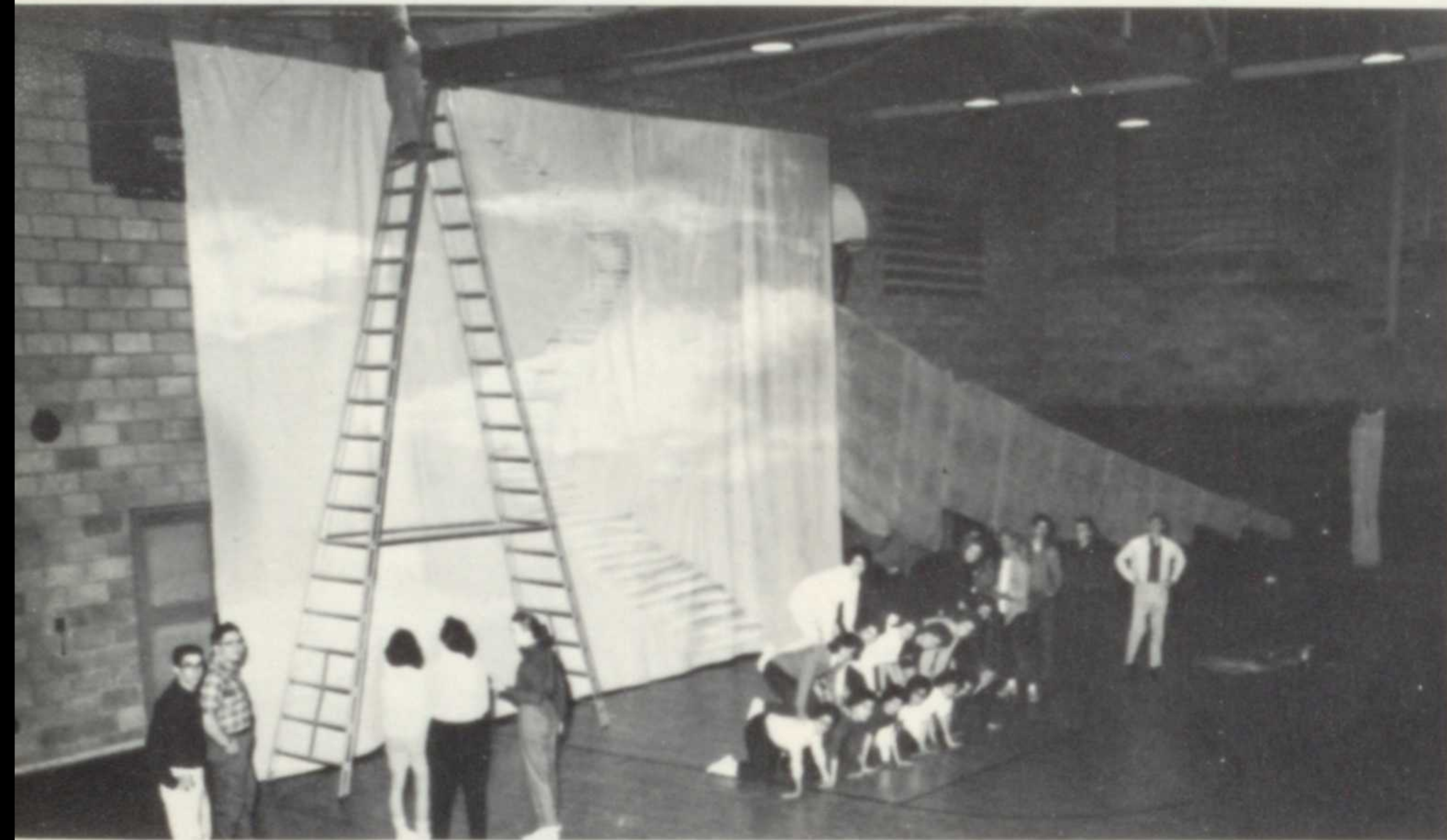


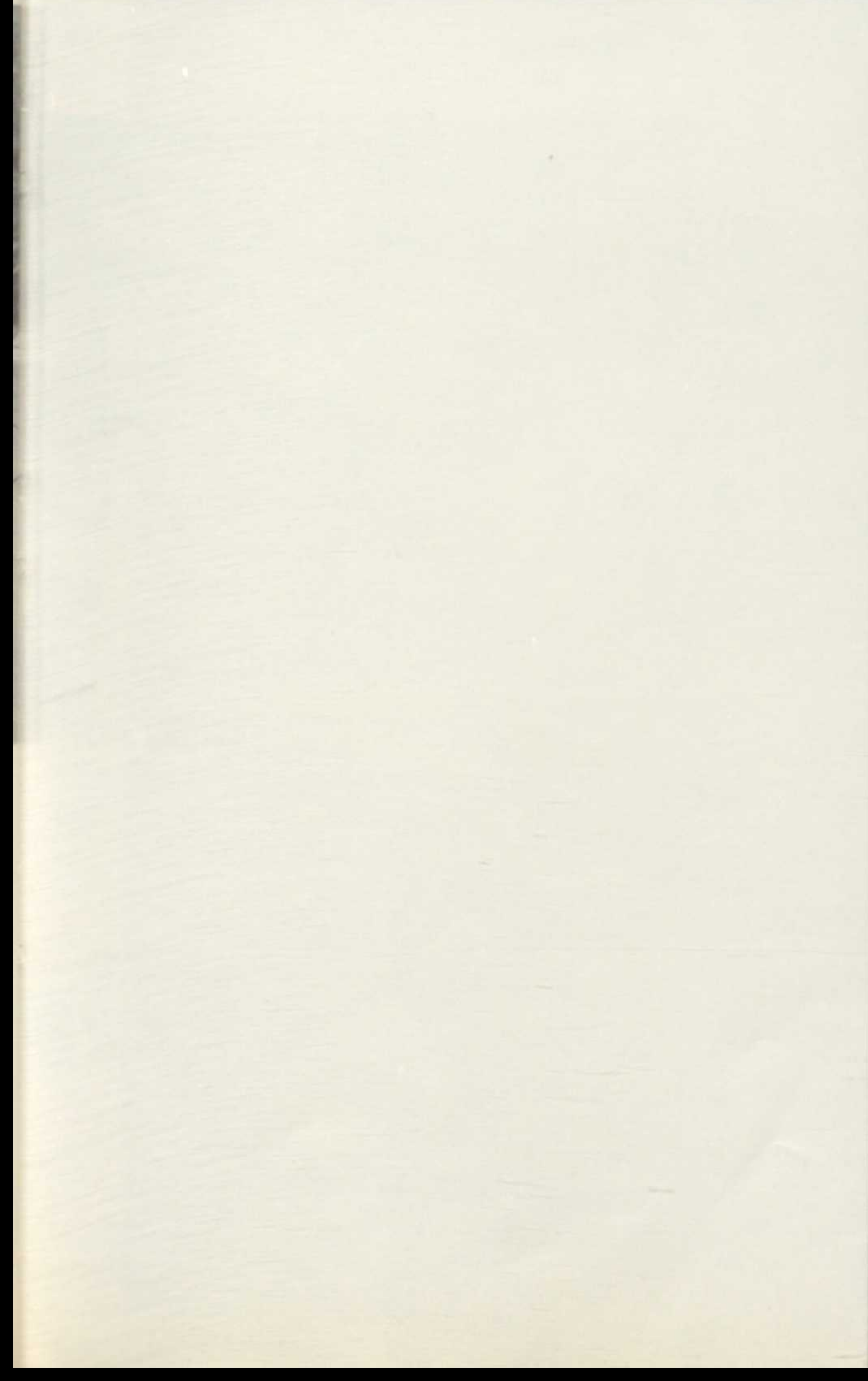
SENIOR PROM

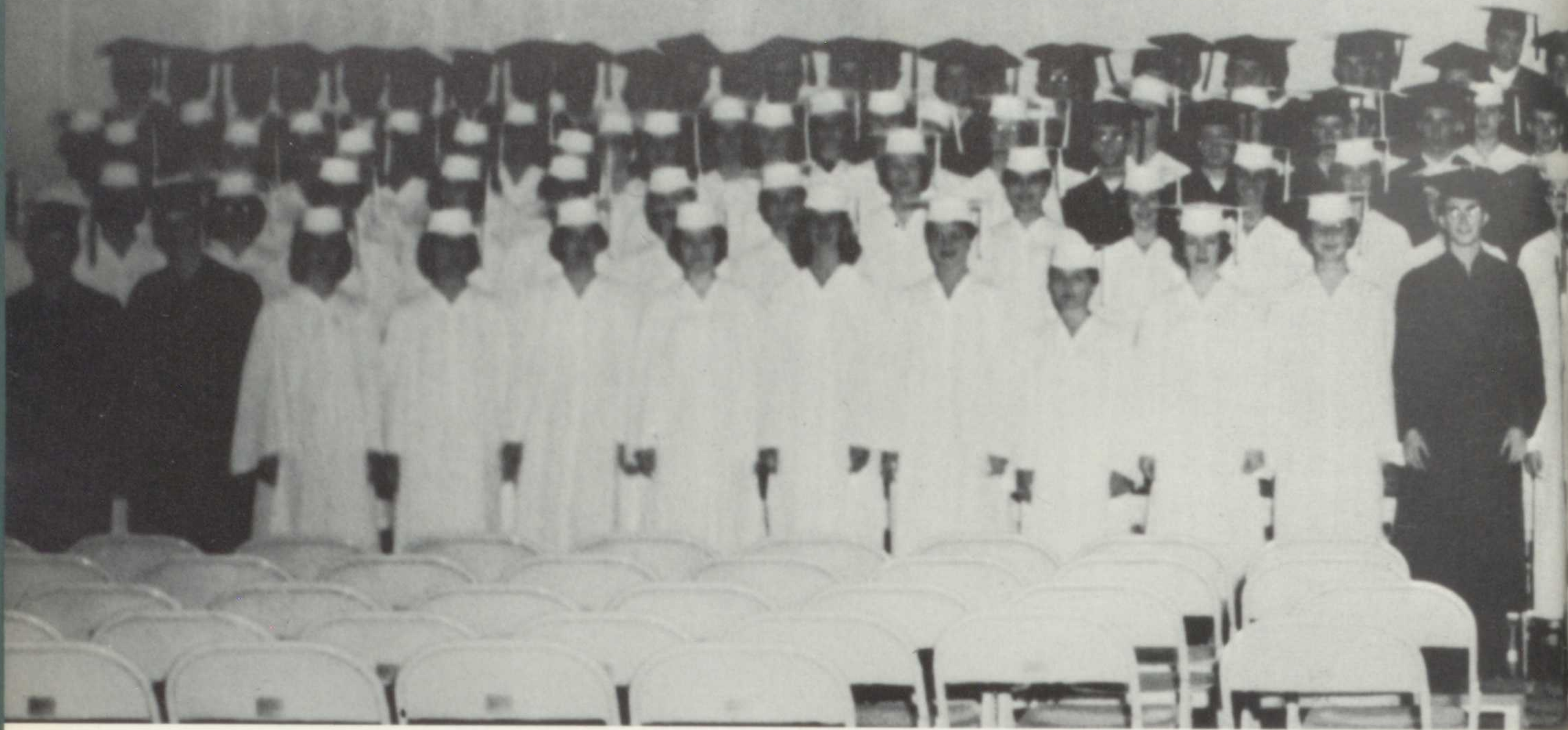


BACCALAUREATE

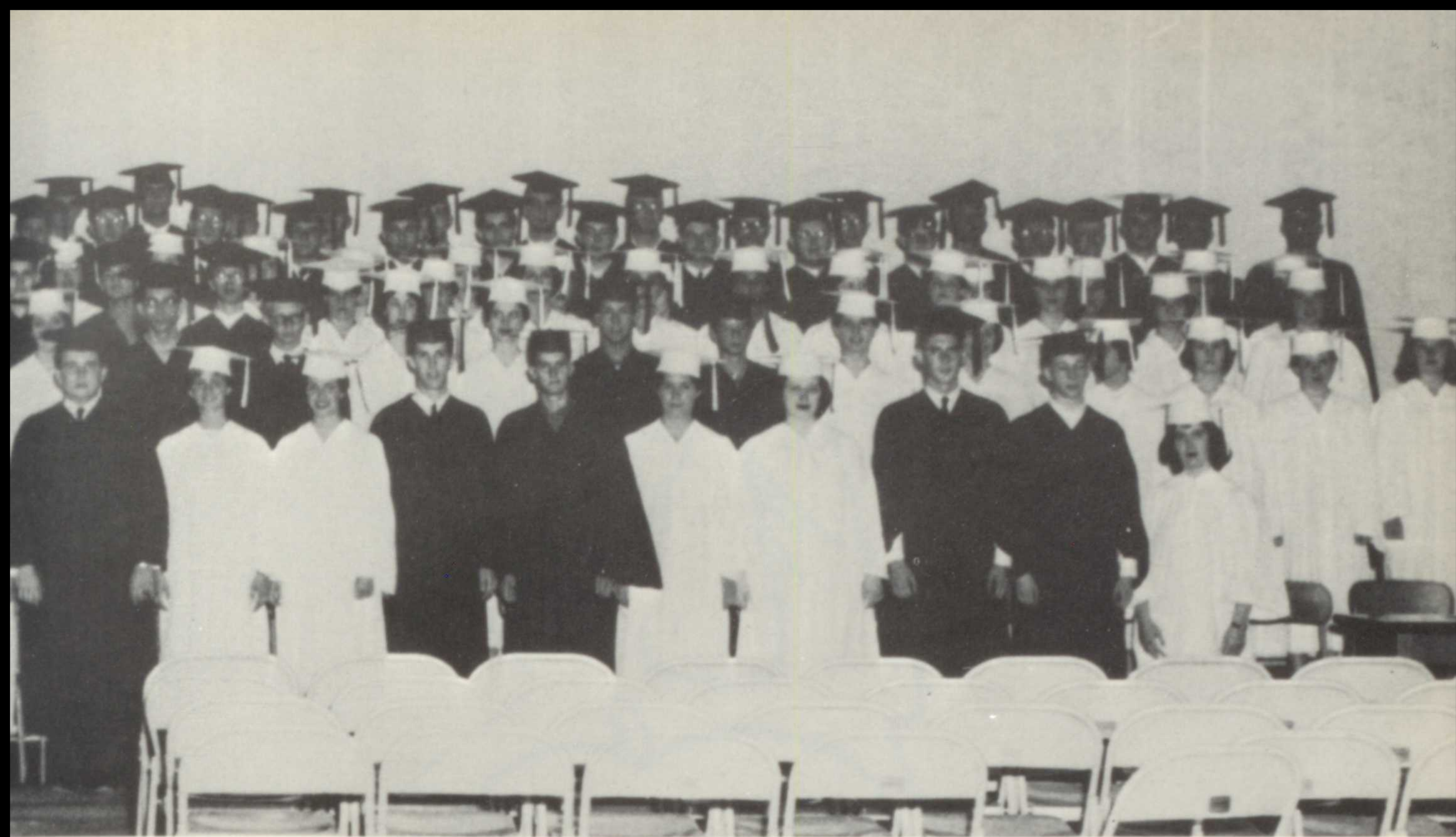


COMMEN

One of the most responsible jobs, as far as the people of our school district are concerned, is being a bus driver. These gentlemen are entrusted with transporting the students to and from school each day.

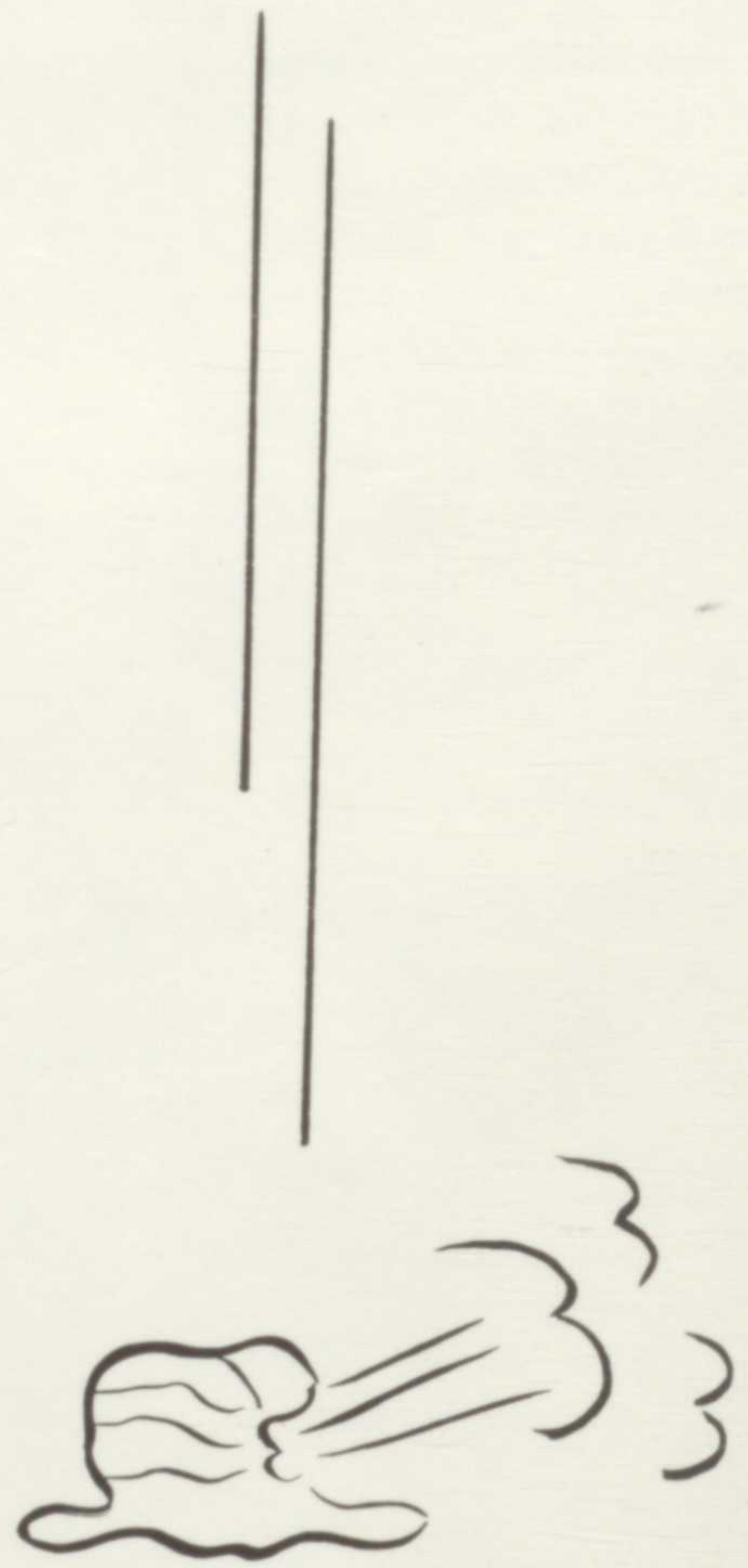

Bay came in fourth out of eight entries in the South Western Conference meet, which was held on May 17, at Baldwin Wallace College.



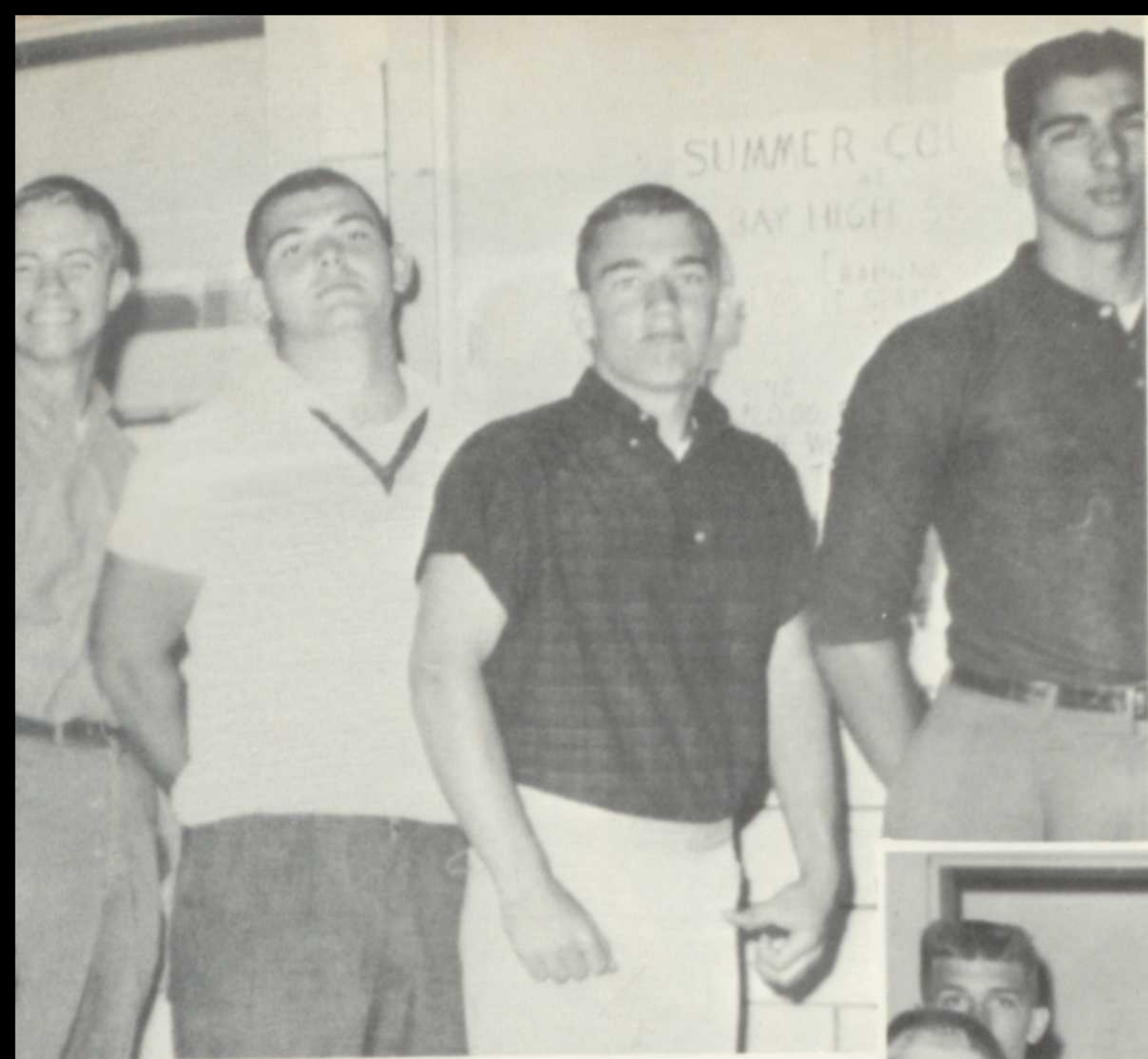
NELSON NARKS MEMORIAL AWARD

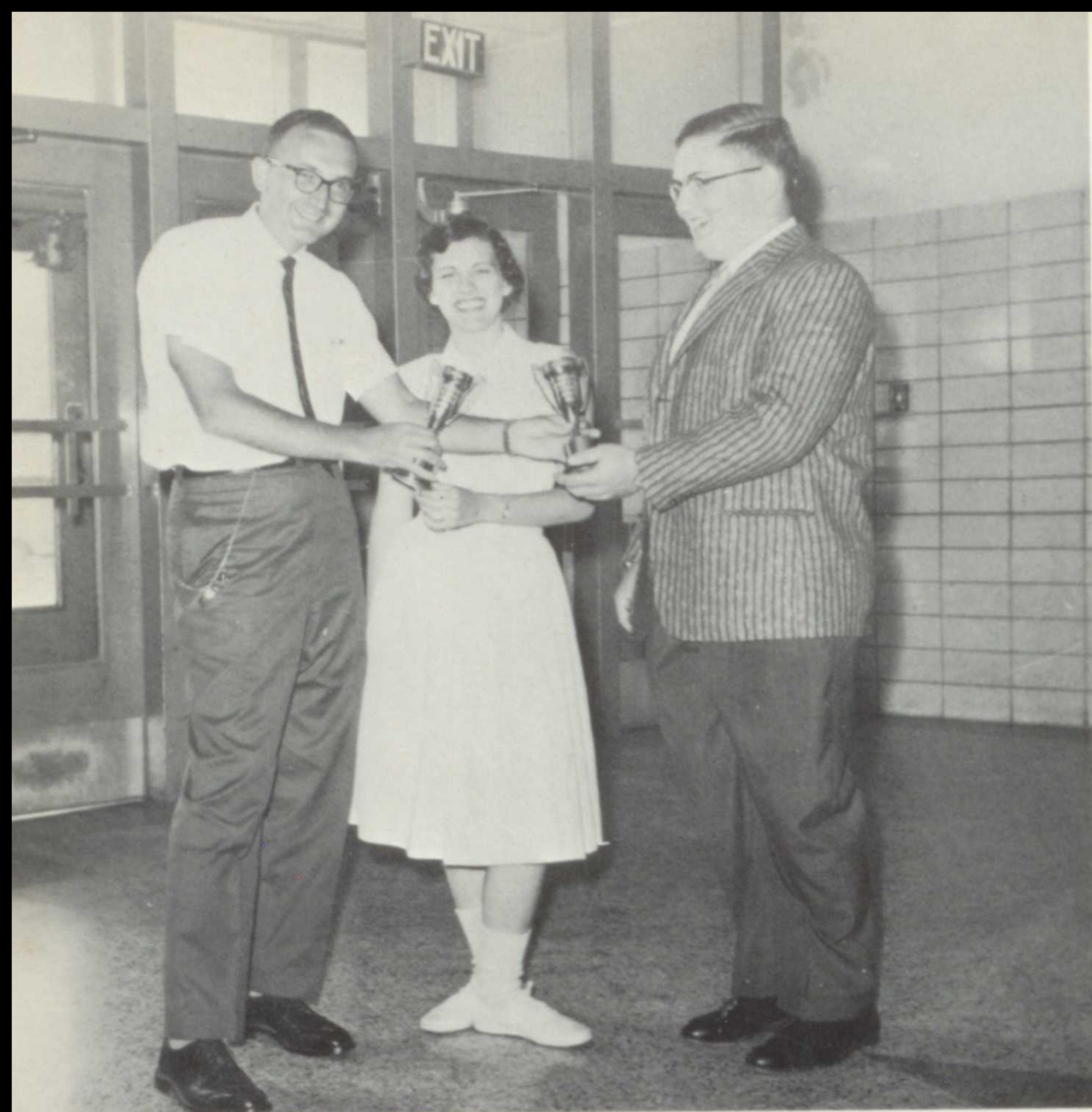
The club's main purpose is to assist the physical education instructors for girls. Other activities include their annual breakfast for new members and officiating at girls' intramural athletic games.

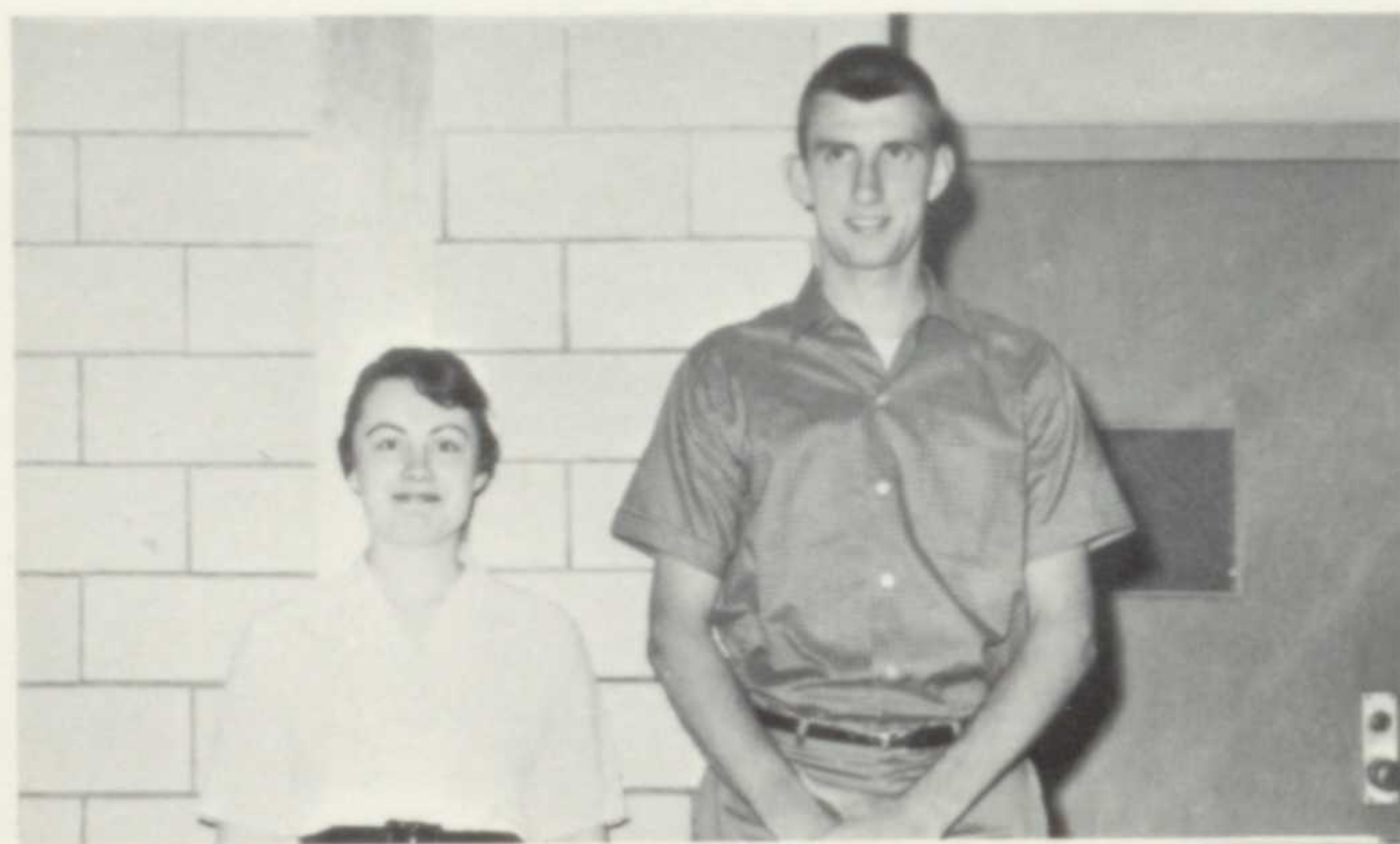
STUDENT COUNCIL CITIZENSHIP AWARDS
