

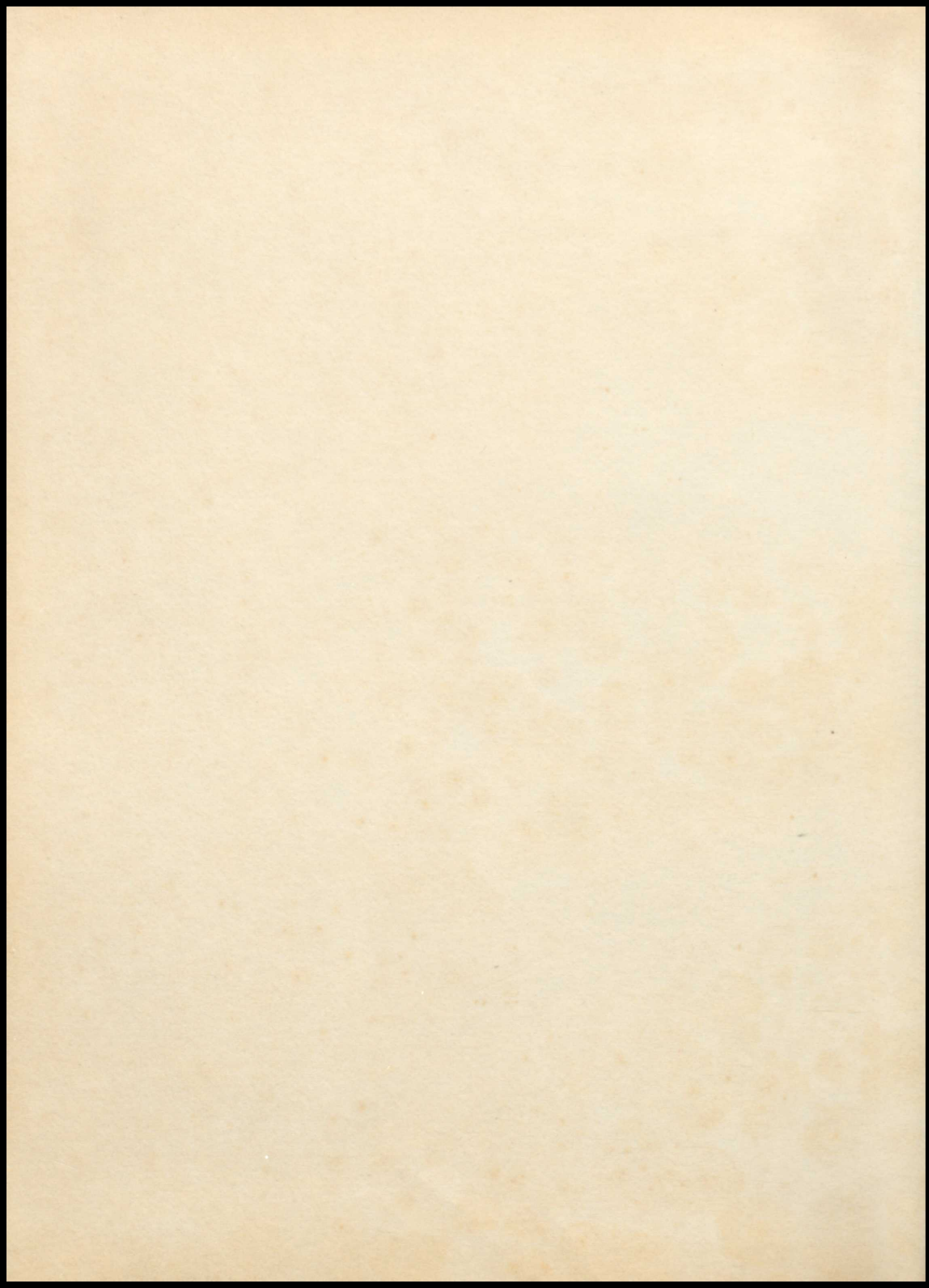

For souls depth, for life's heighth.

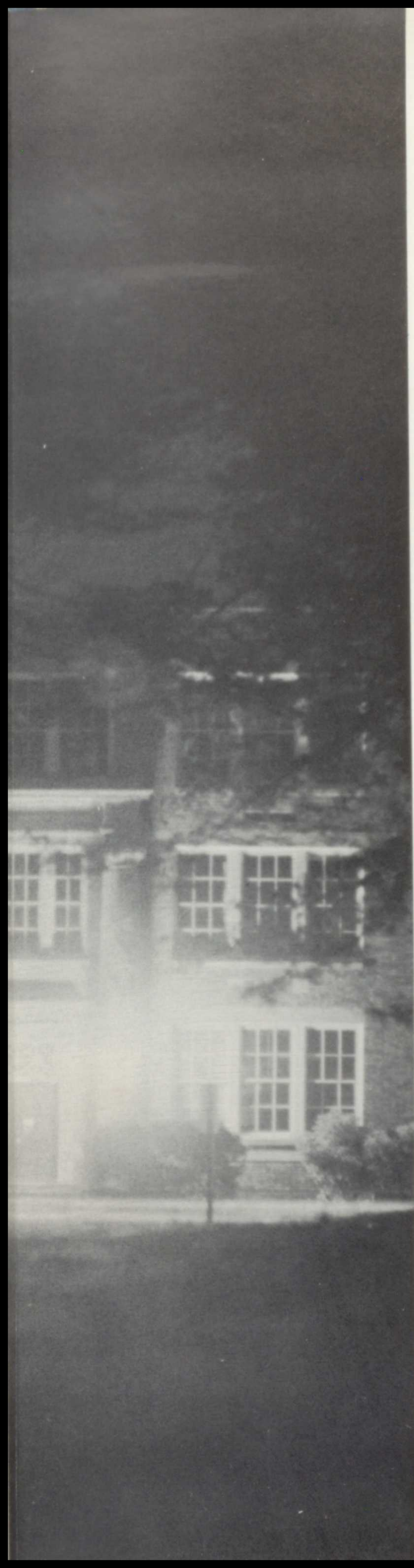
Service is the deeds of love

Success lies ahead — golden.

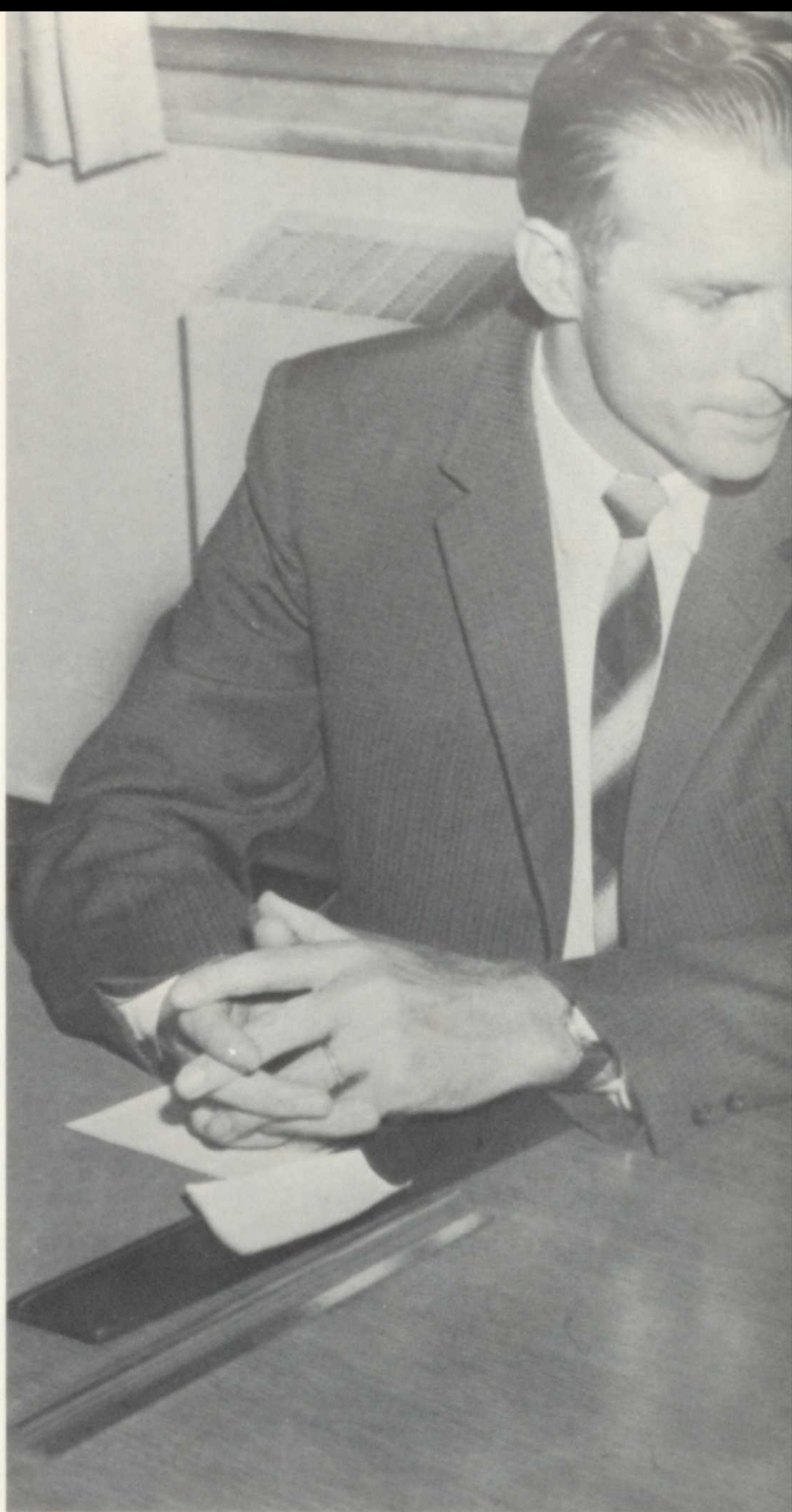

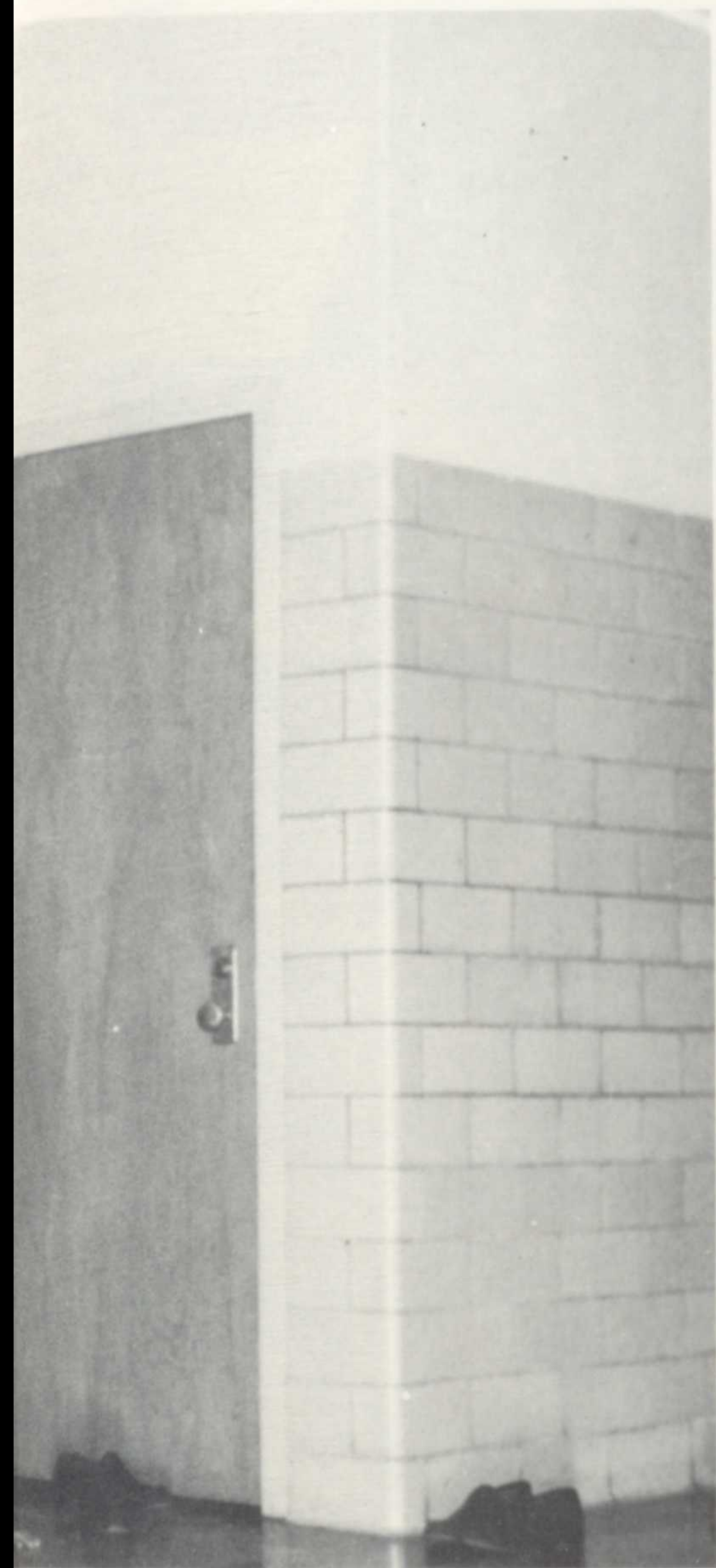
# 1962

# 1960 FOOTBALL TEAM

The team started the season with an impressive 27—0 victory over Avon Lake sparked by Len Friedel's two touchdowns, then went on to squeak past North Olmsted 6—0 and defeat Olmsted Falls 27—16. Co-captain Tim Kohl came off the injured list to lead the team in a 13—6 victory over unbeaten Rocky River in one of the most exciting games of the season. Another impressive game, a 52—18 win over Oberlin, was highlighted when tackle Lynn Bolling galloped 85 yards for a touchdown. 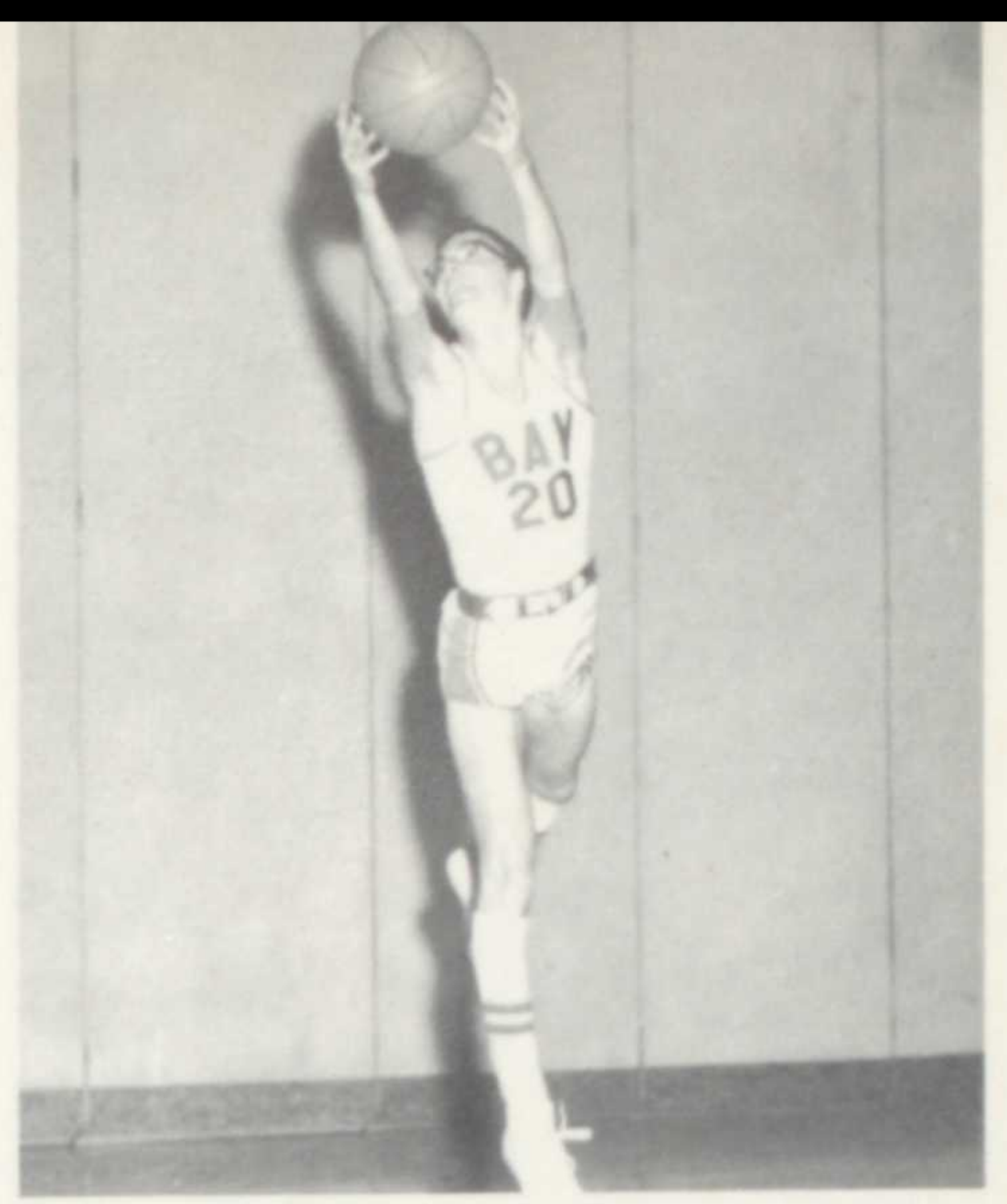

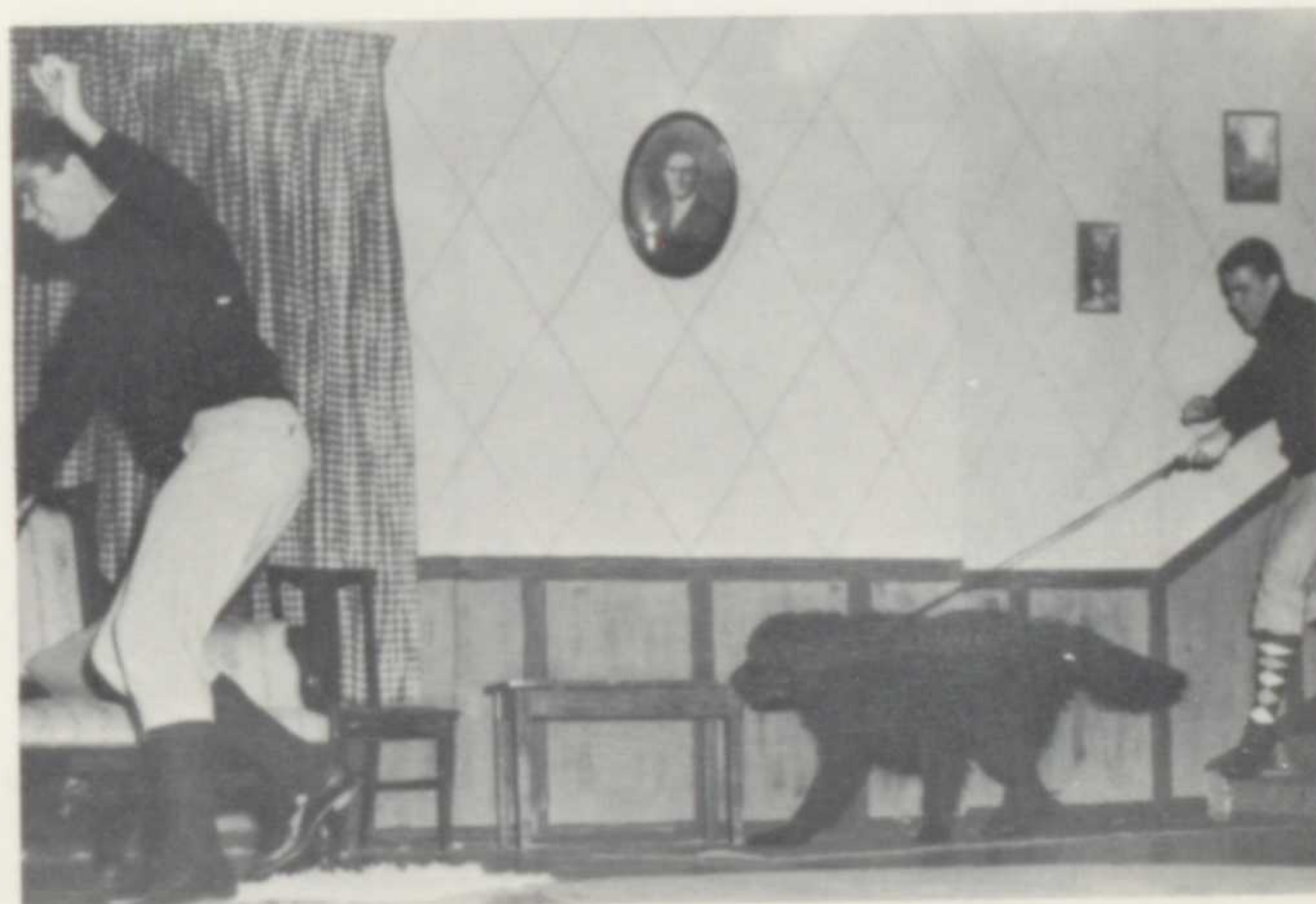


children learn of their father's condition.

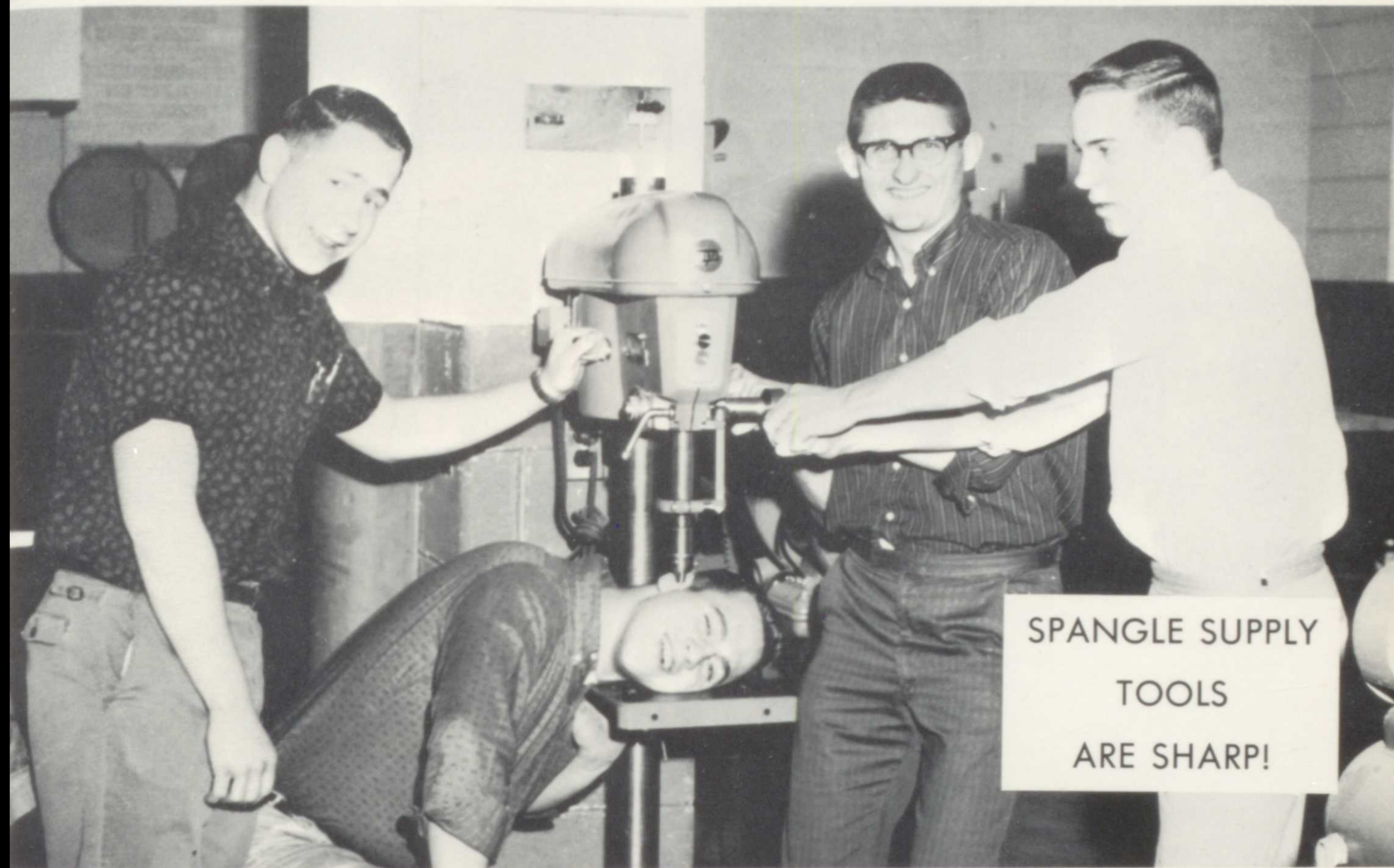

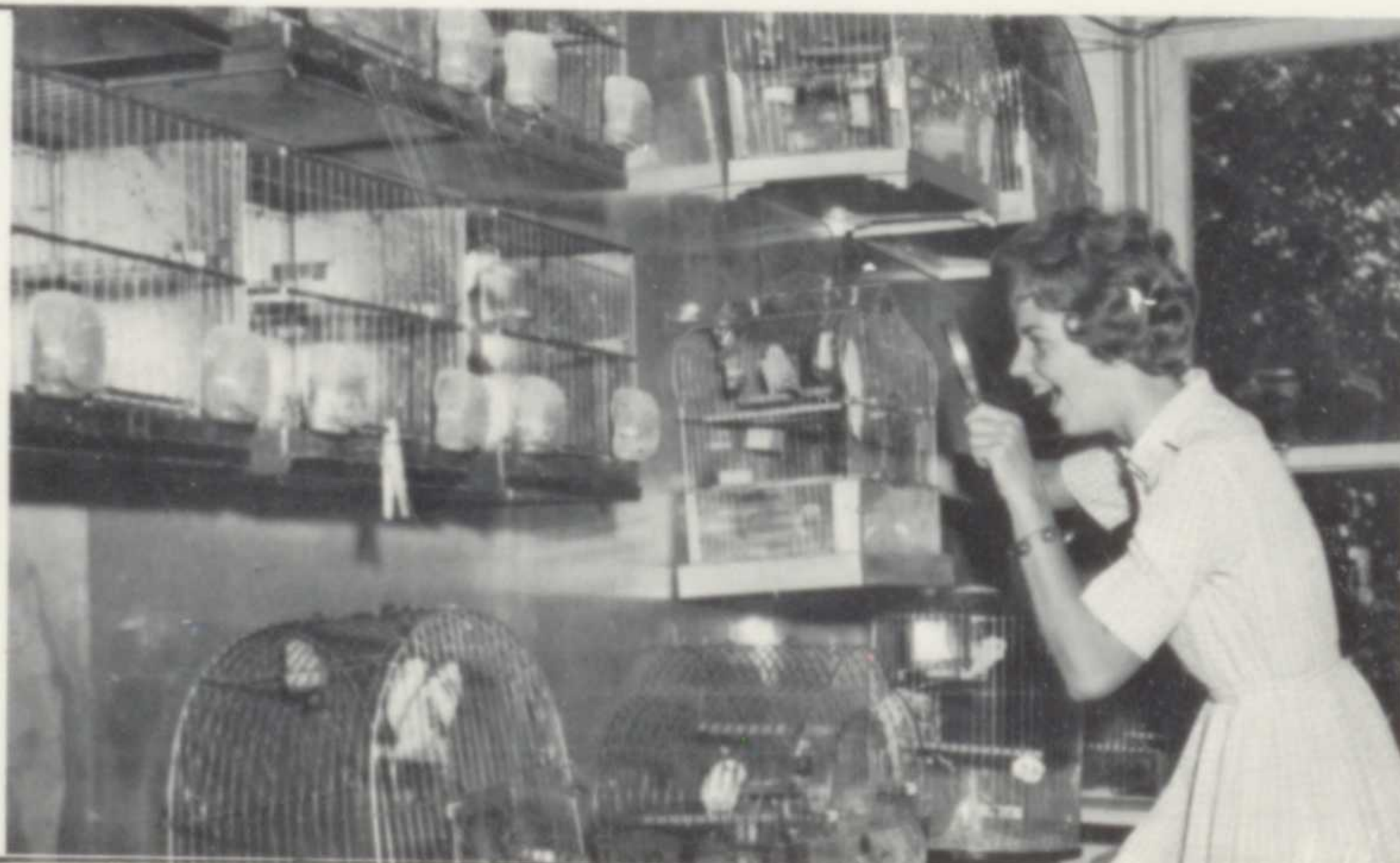

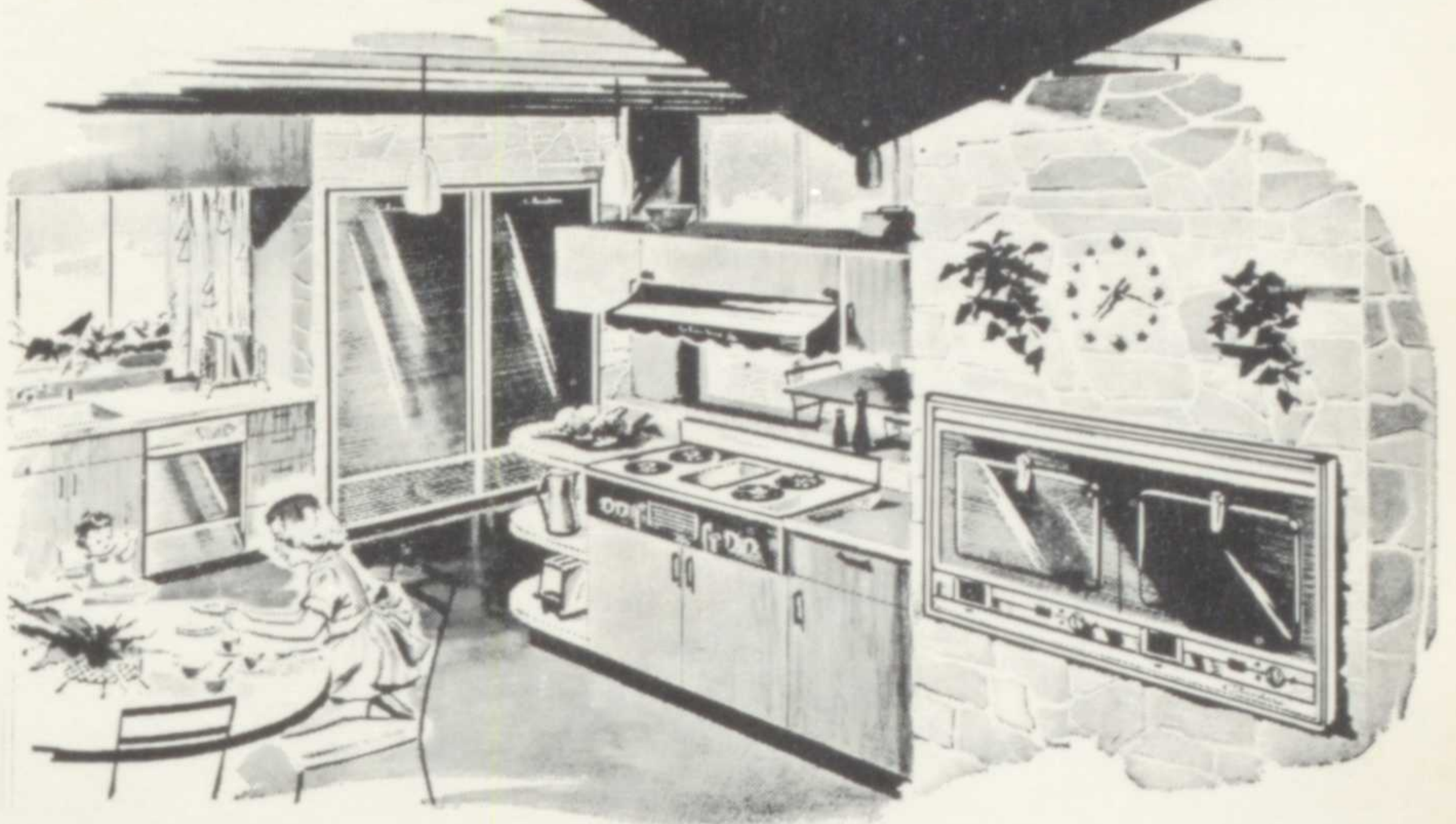
