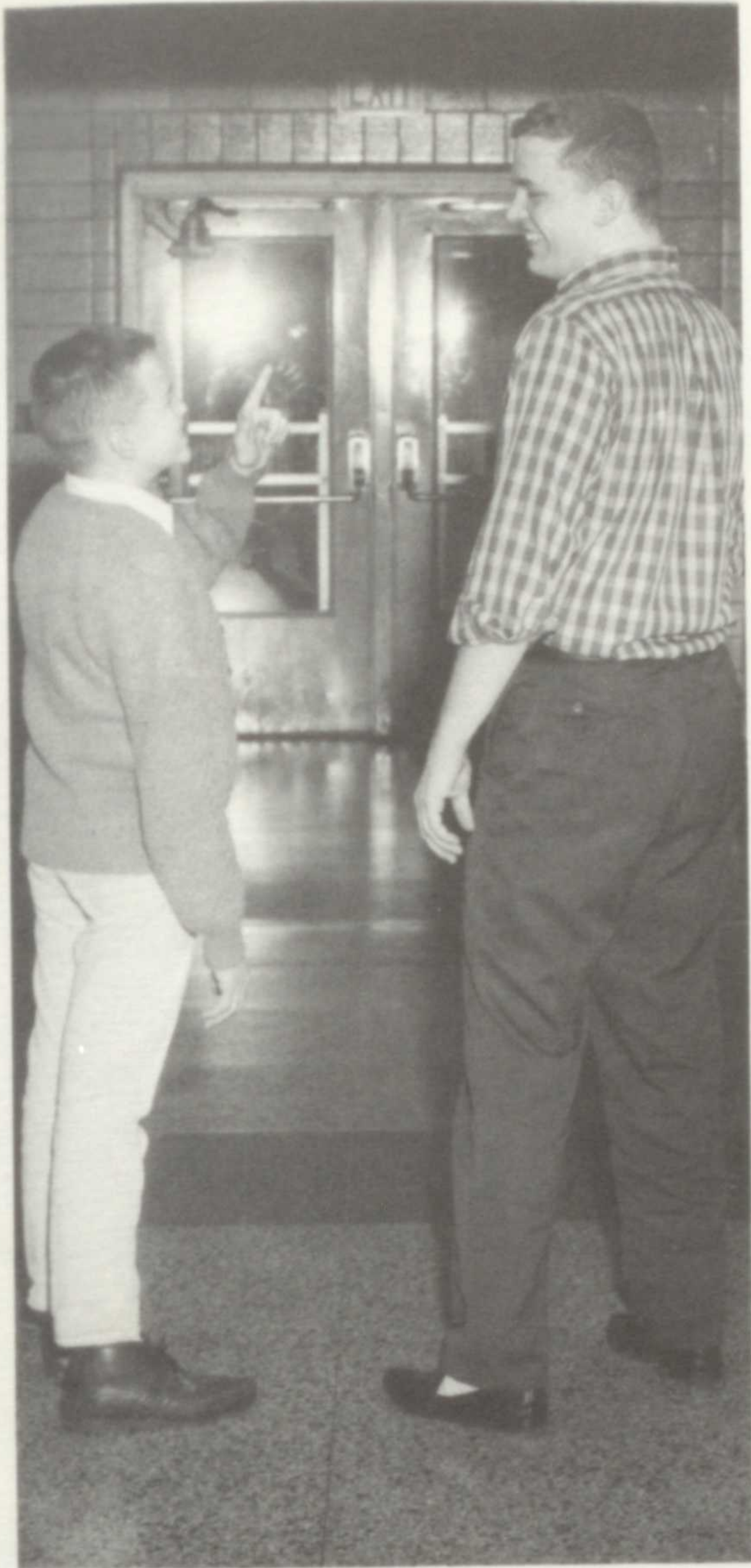
## school life
