Nearly eighty-five percent of last year's graduates attended college this year. Part of this percentage must be accredited to the communication between the students and the Guidance Department. This year, the guidance department was able to meet with all juniors and seniors as a group during the new four-period lunch hour. Each sophomore received an individual conference. To aid student communication with college catalogs, the department offered over five hundred college catalogs. For the first time, over one hundred college representatives visited Bay High. 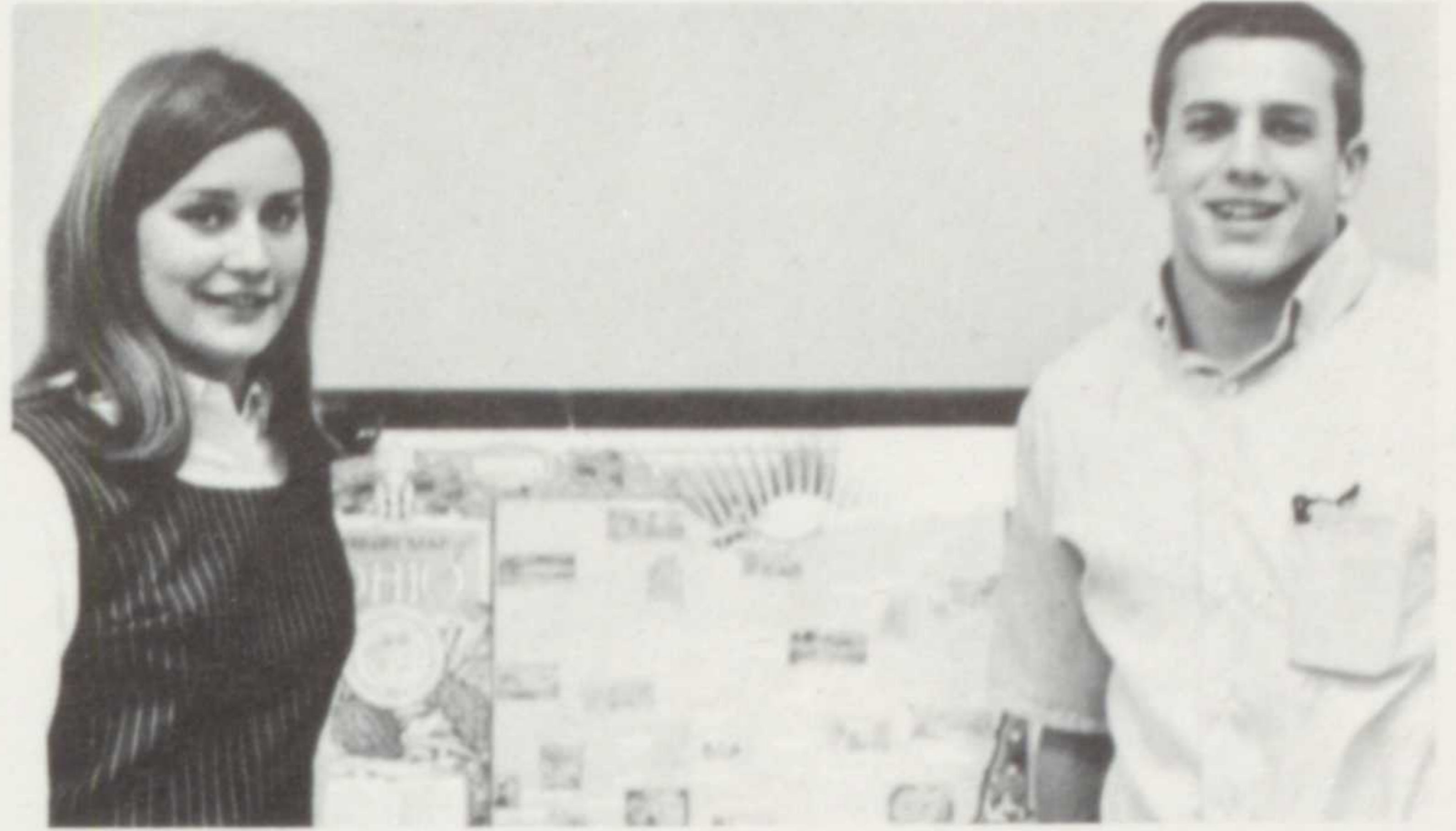

English Department Stresses Western Literature

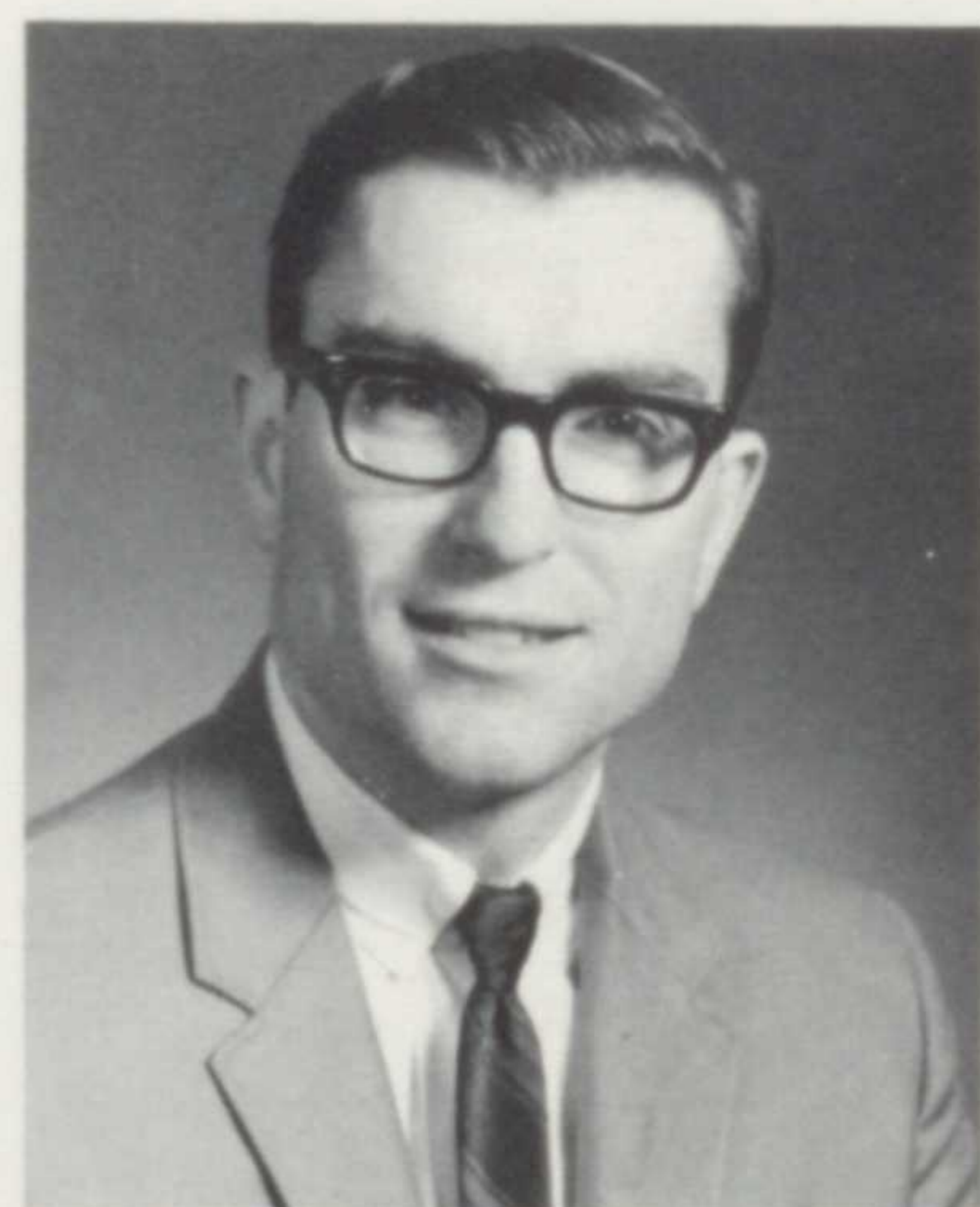

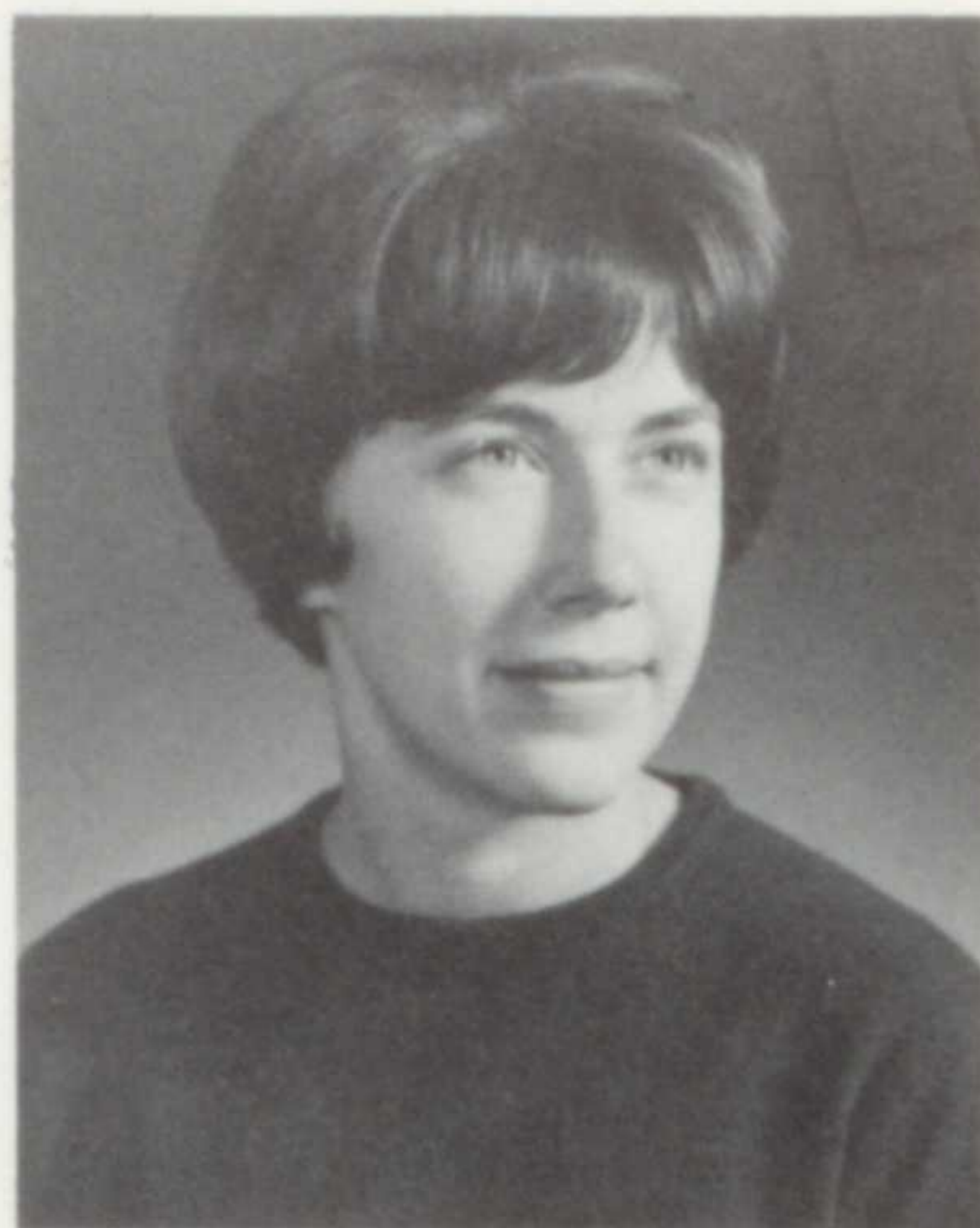

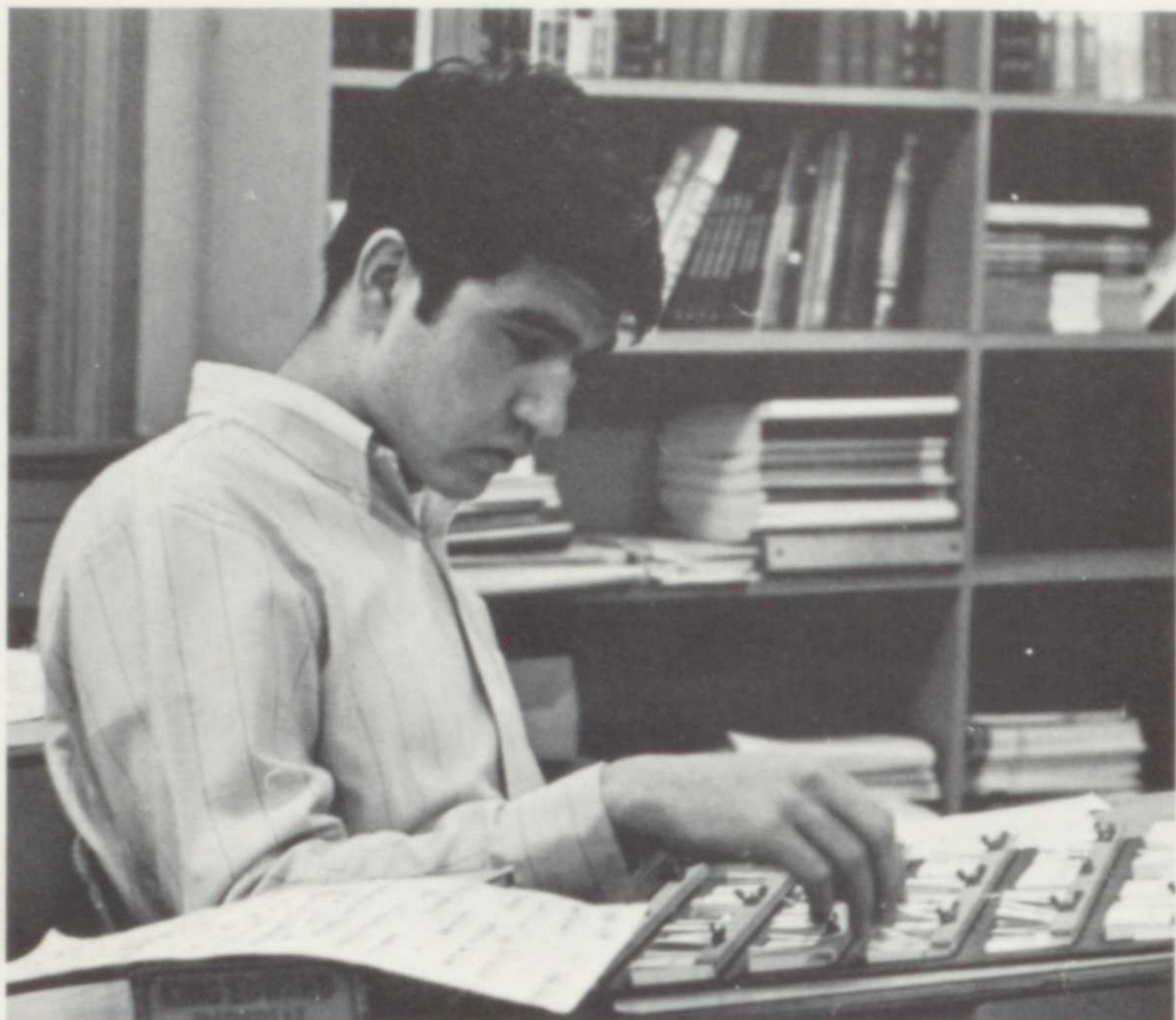

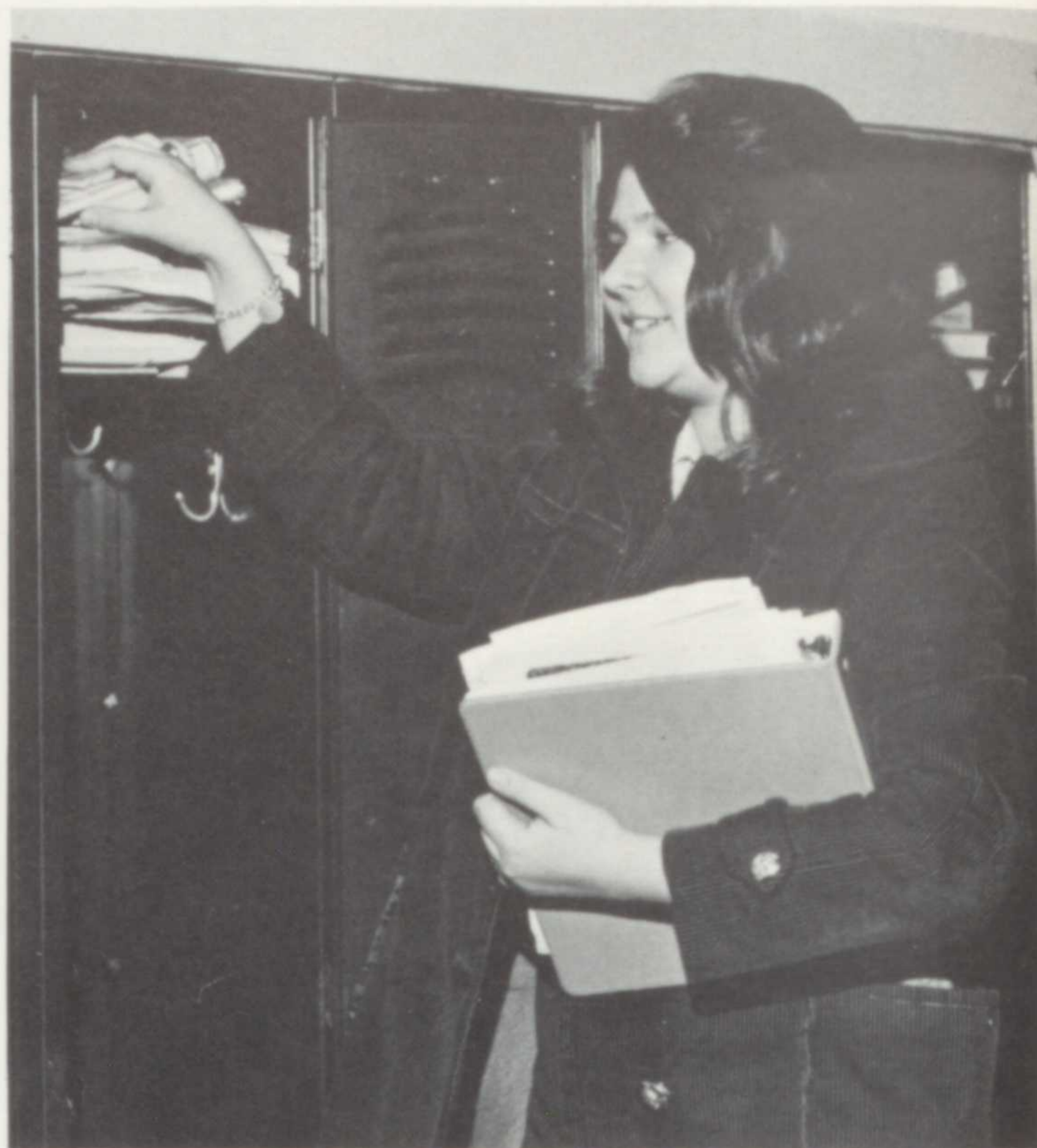

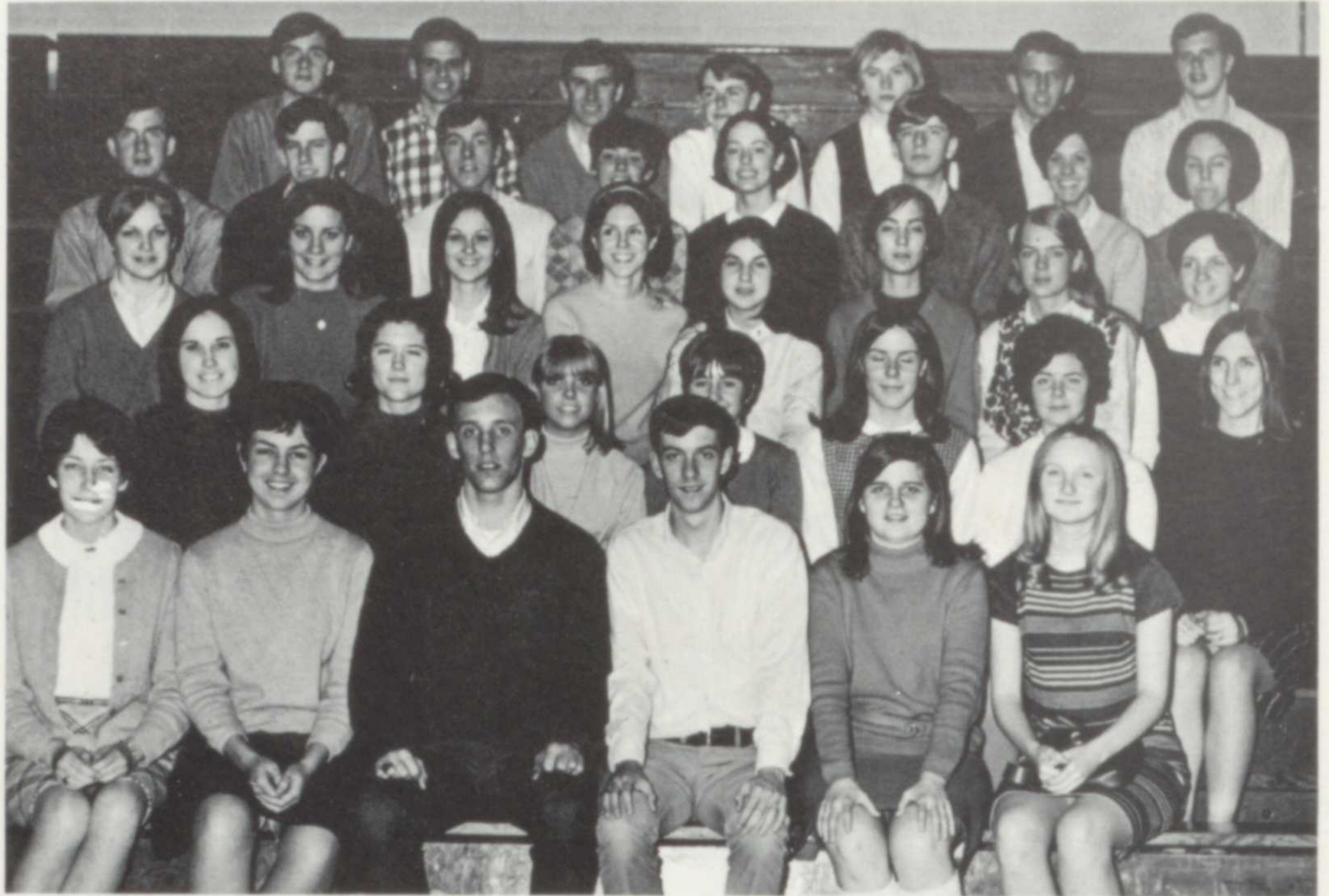

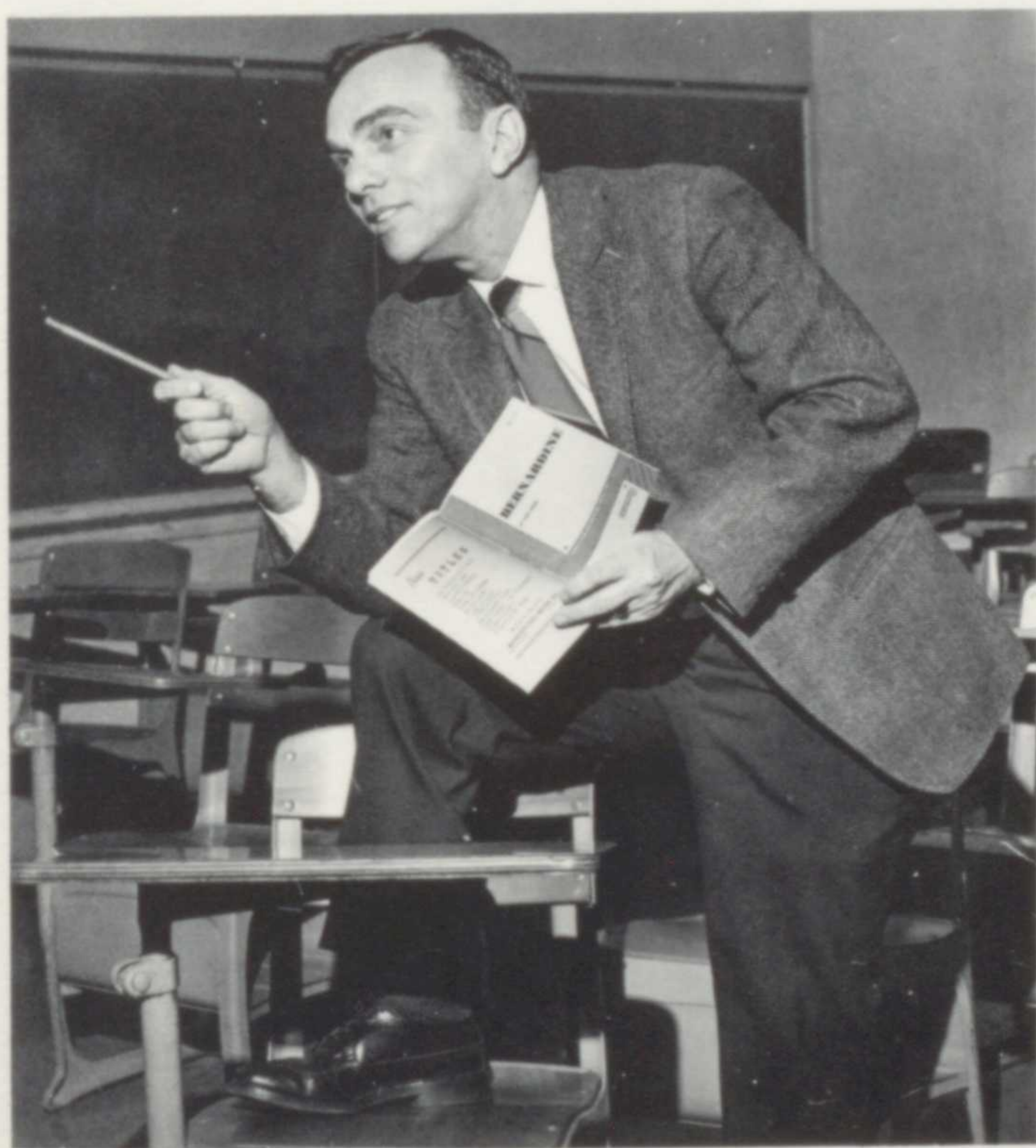

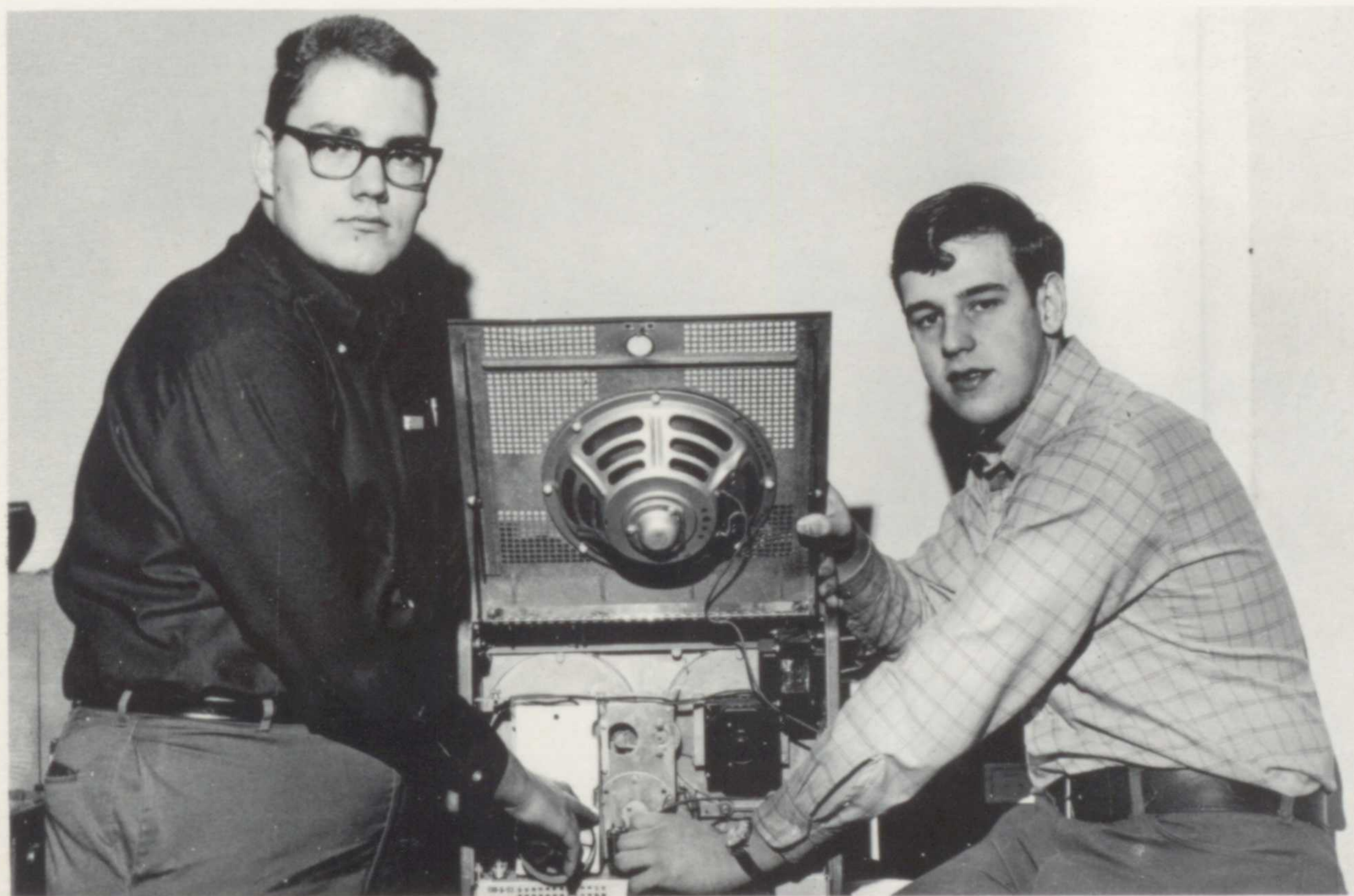

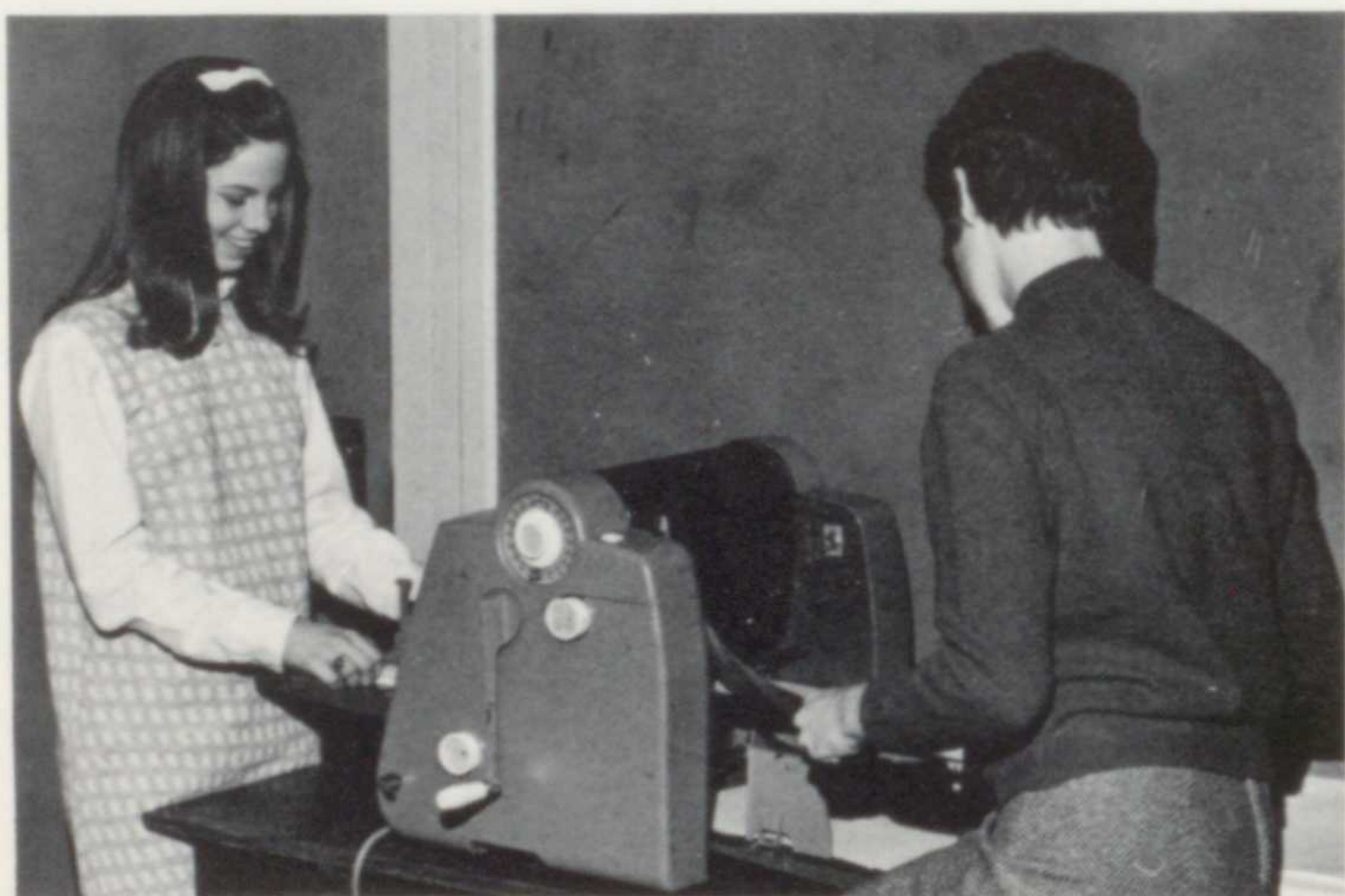

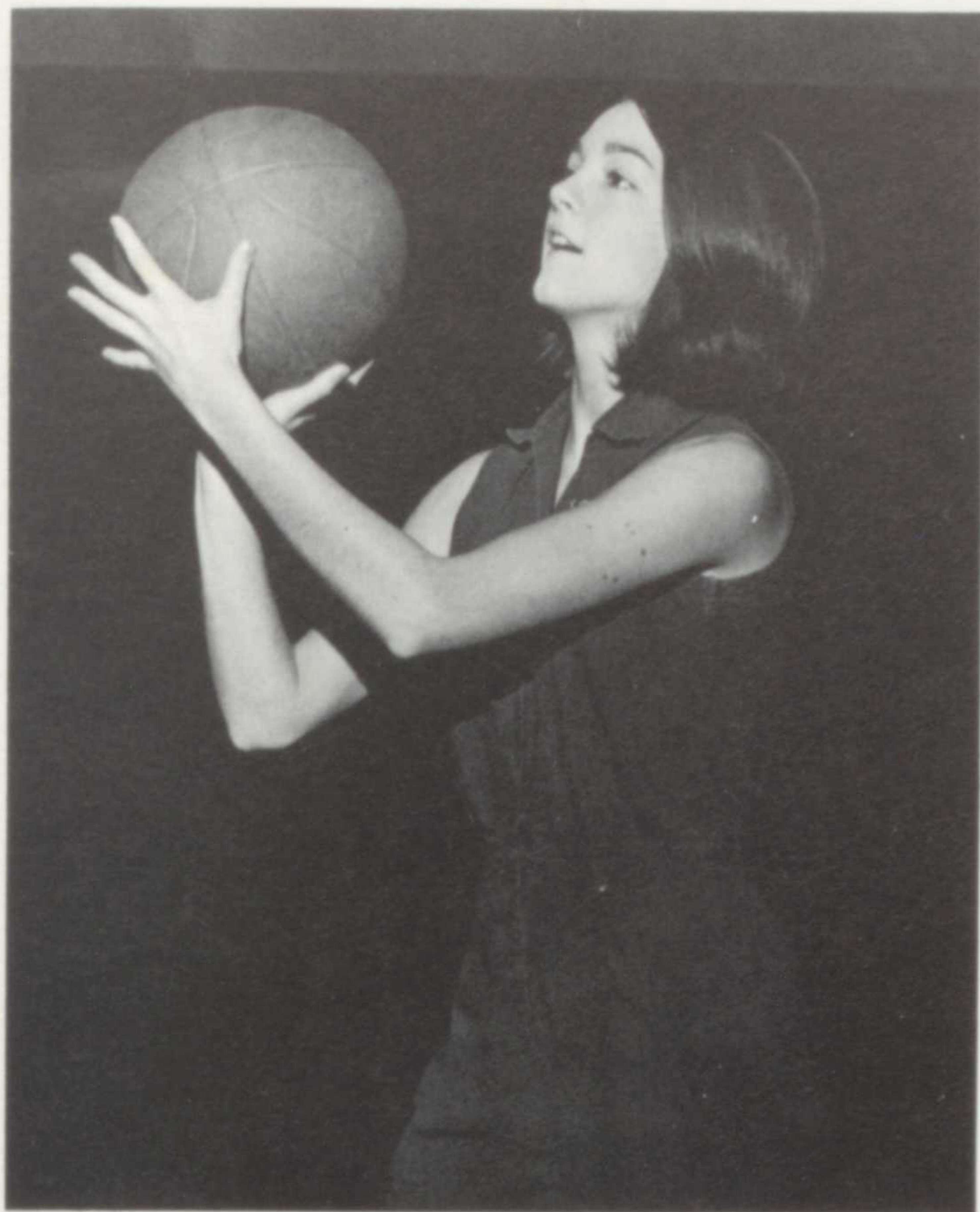

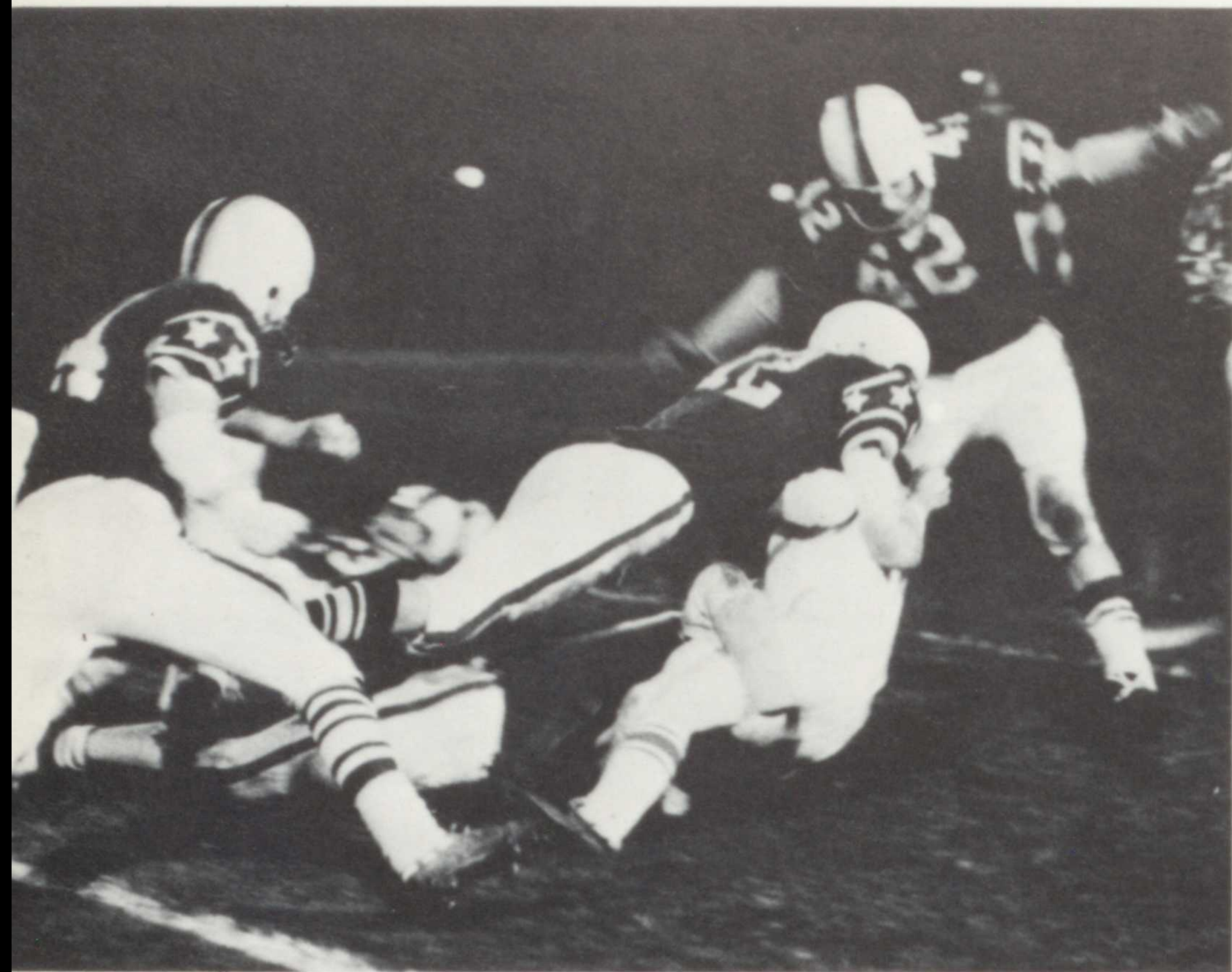

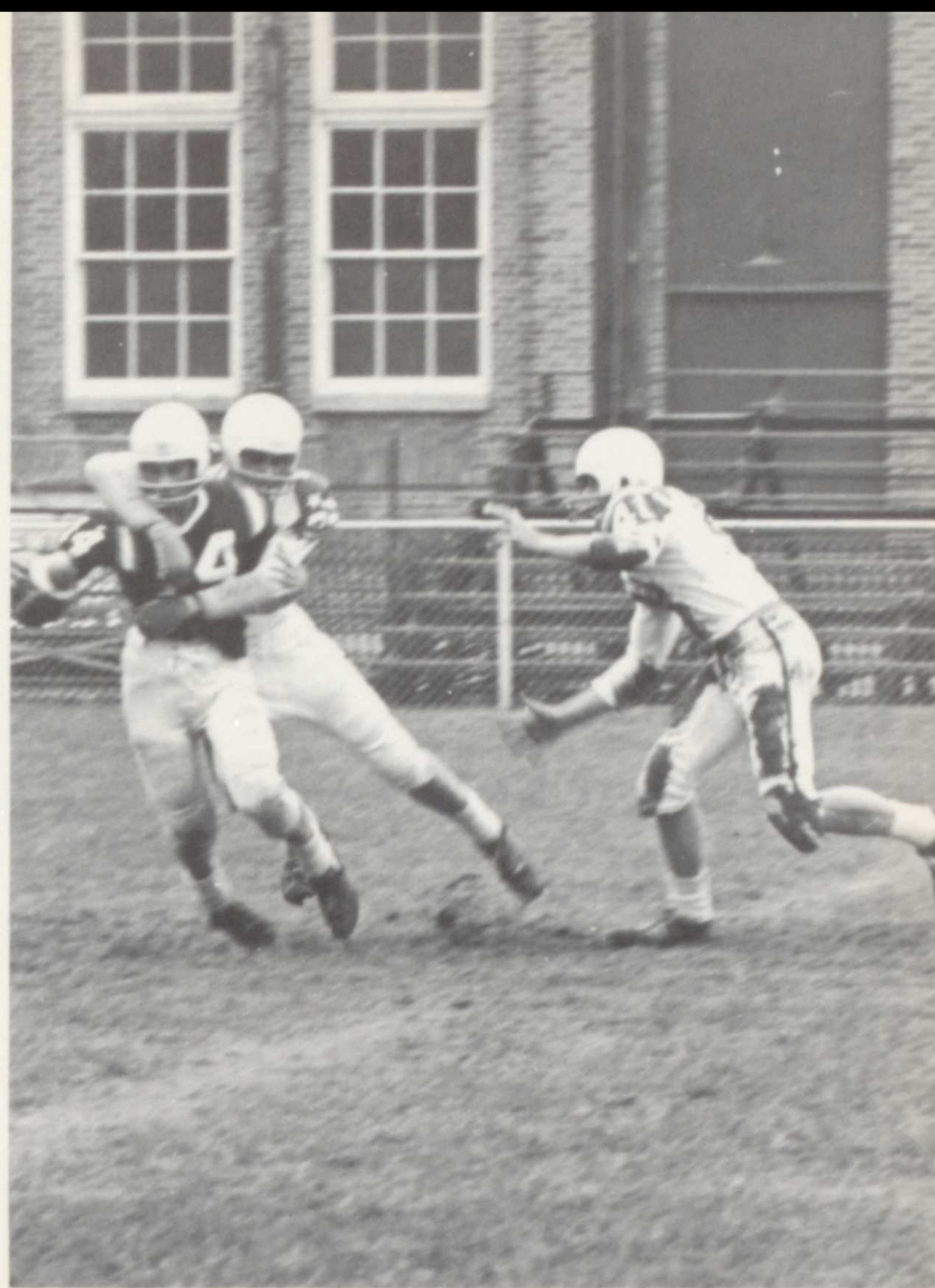

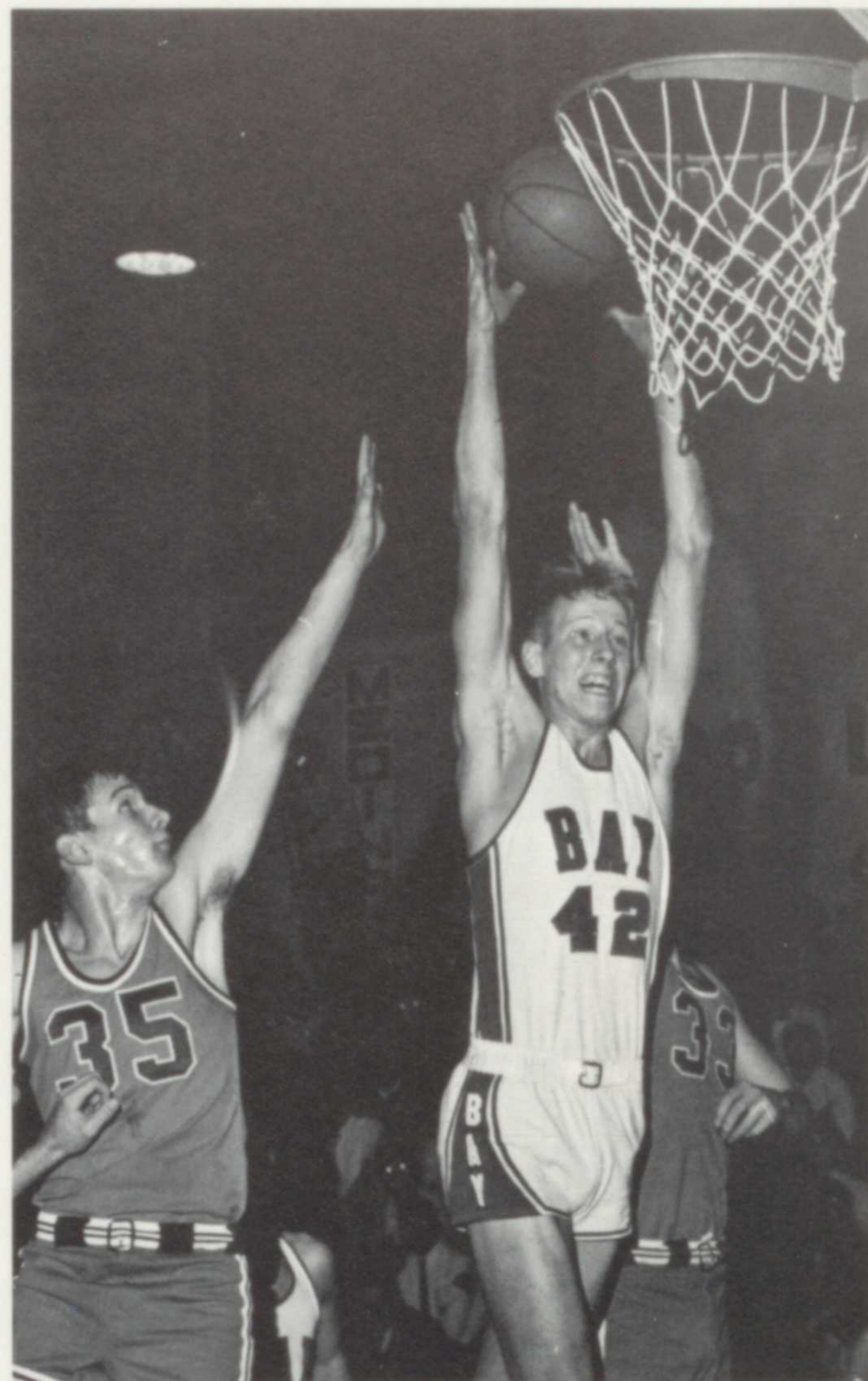

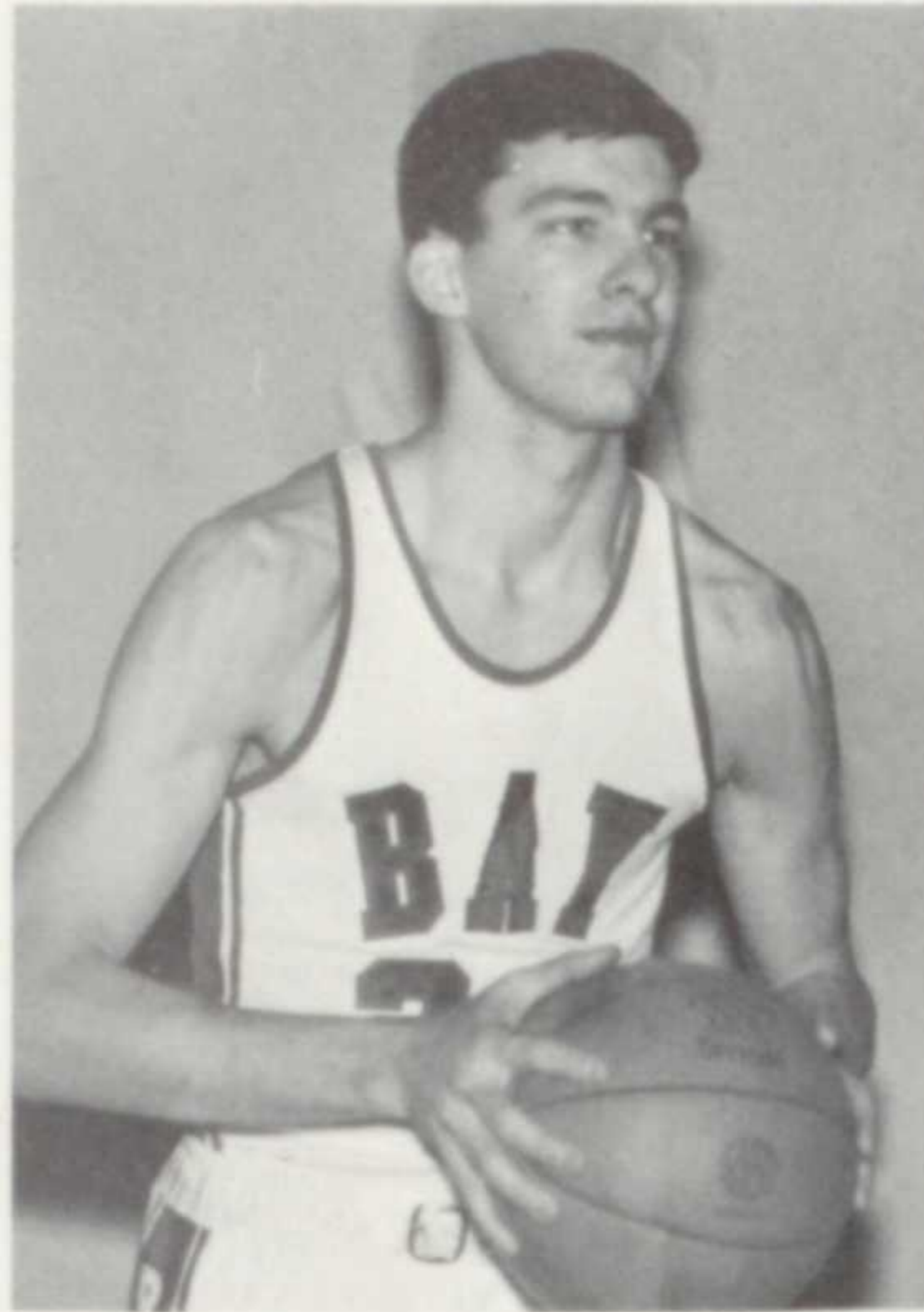

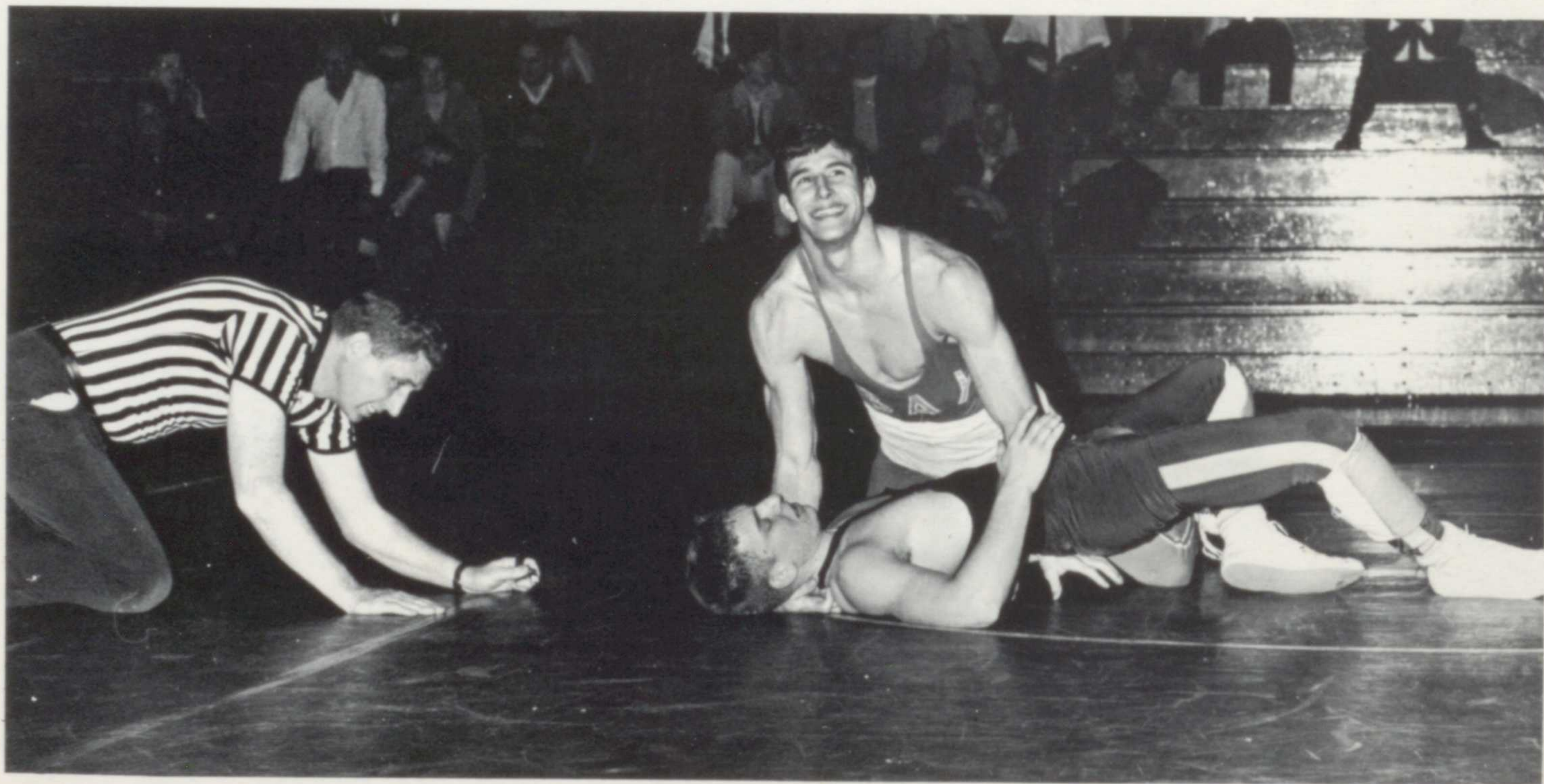
Grapplers Send Eight to District

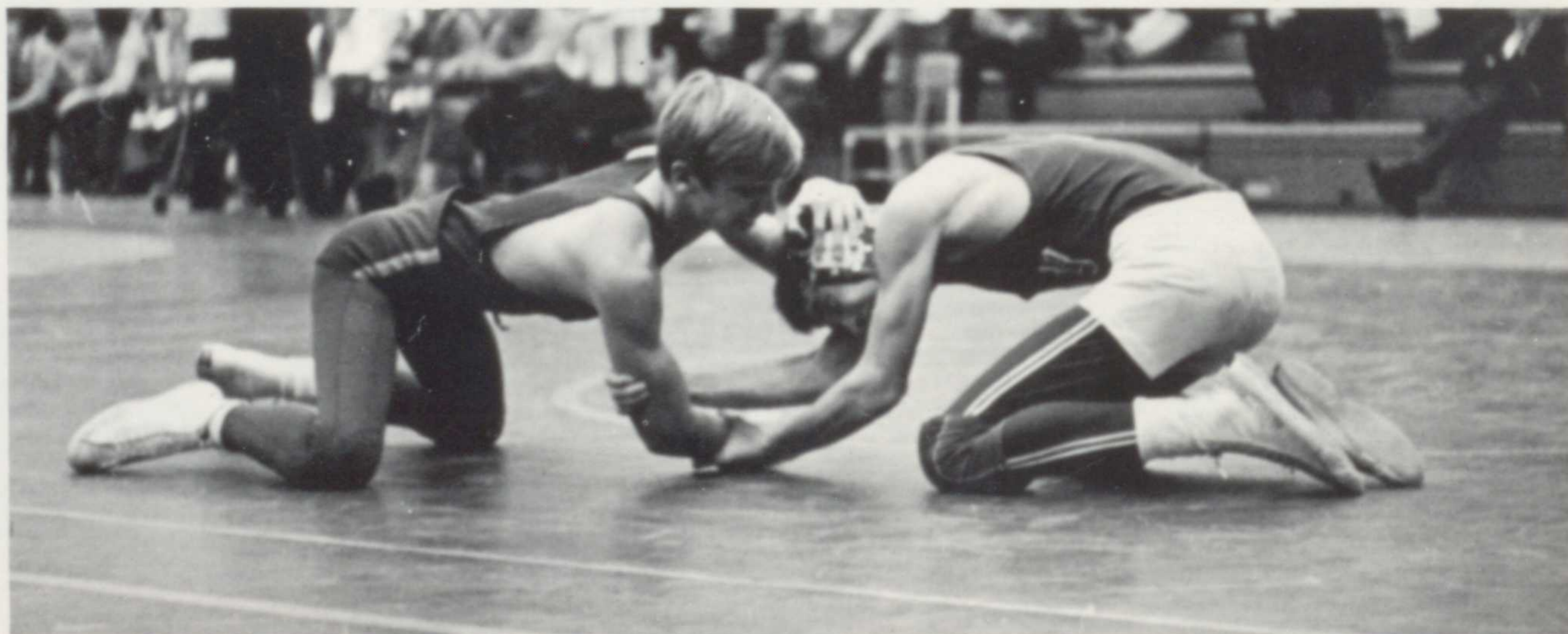
J.V. Matmen Share 1st Place

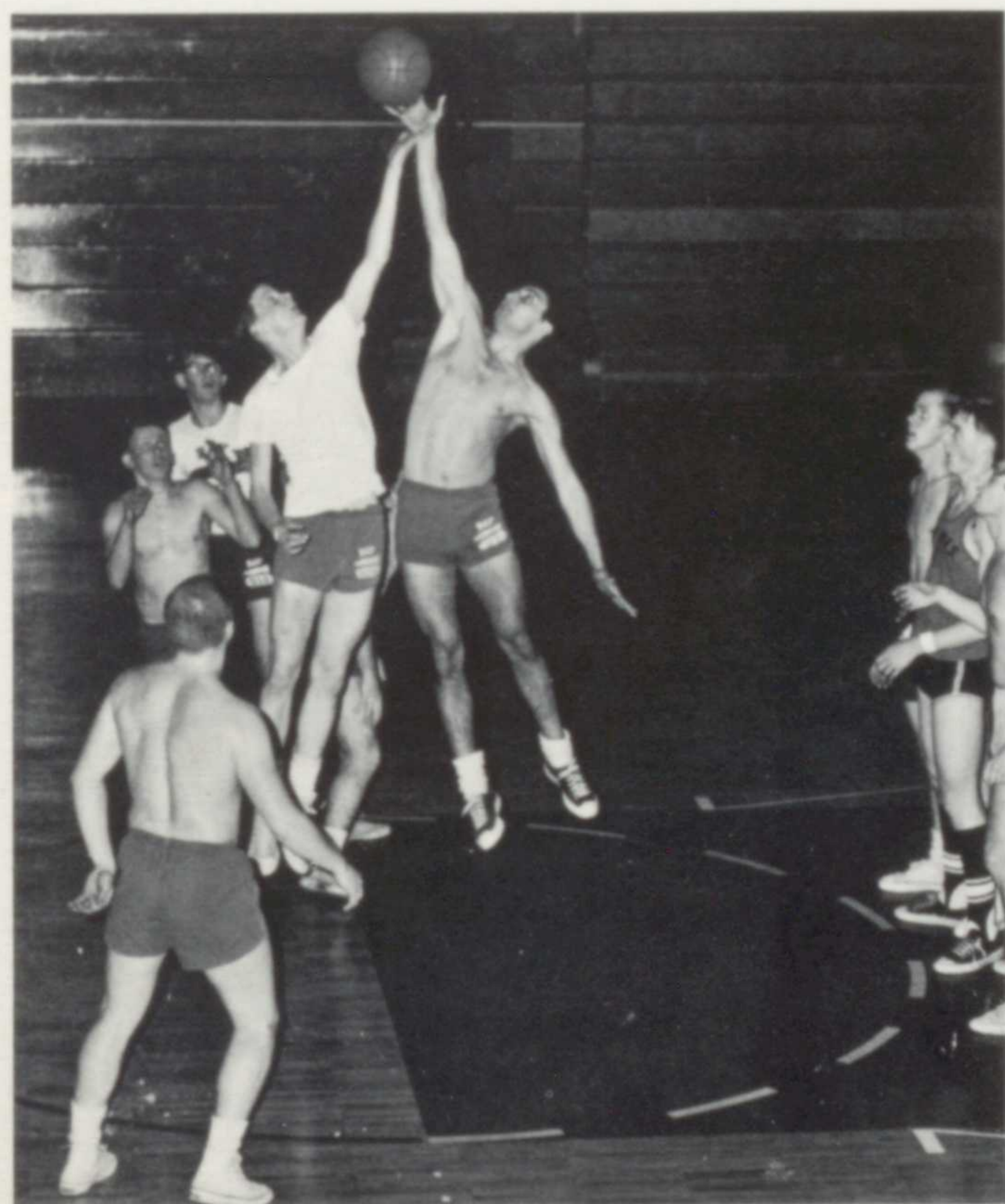

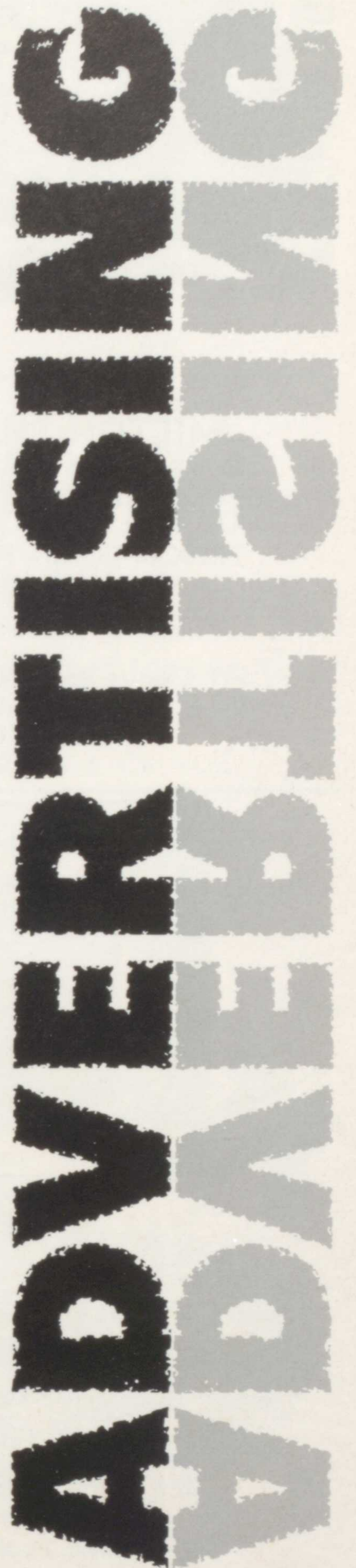




Senior Farewell
