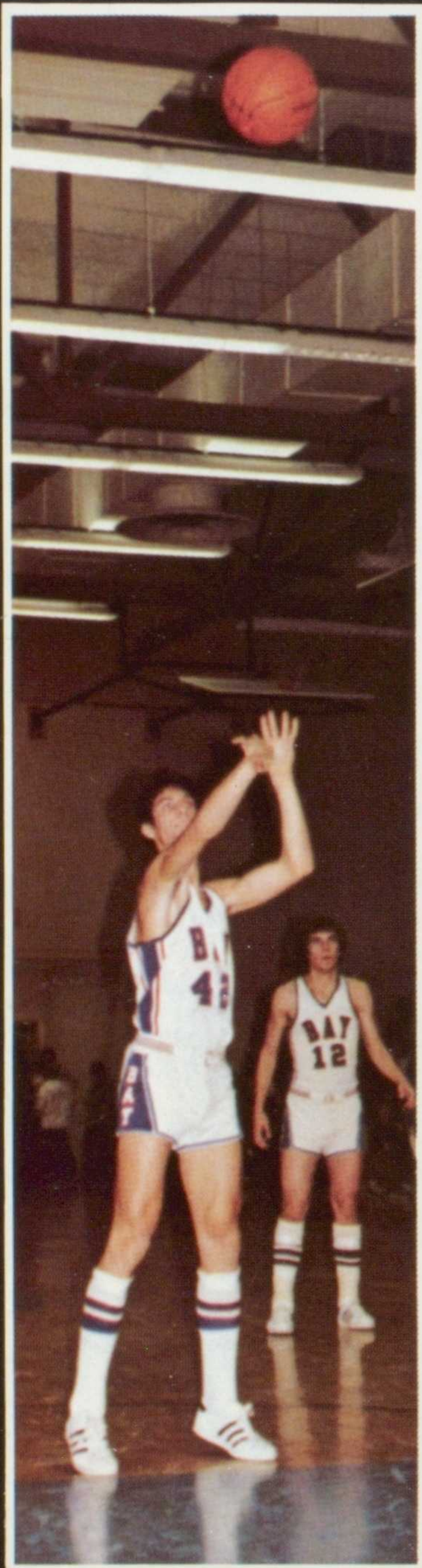




Time In A Bottle

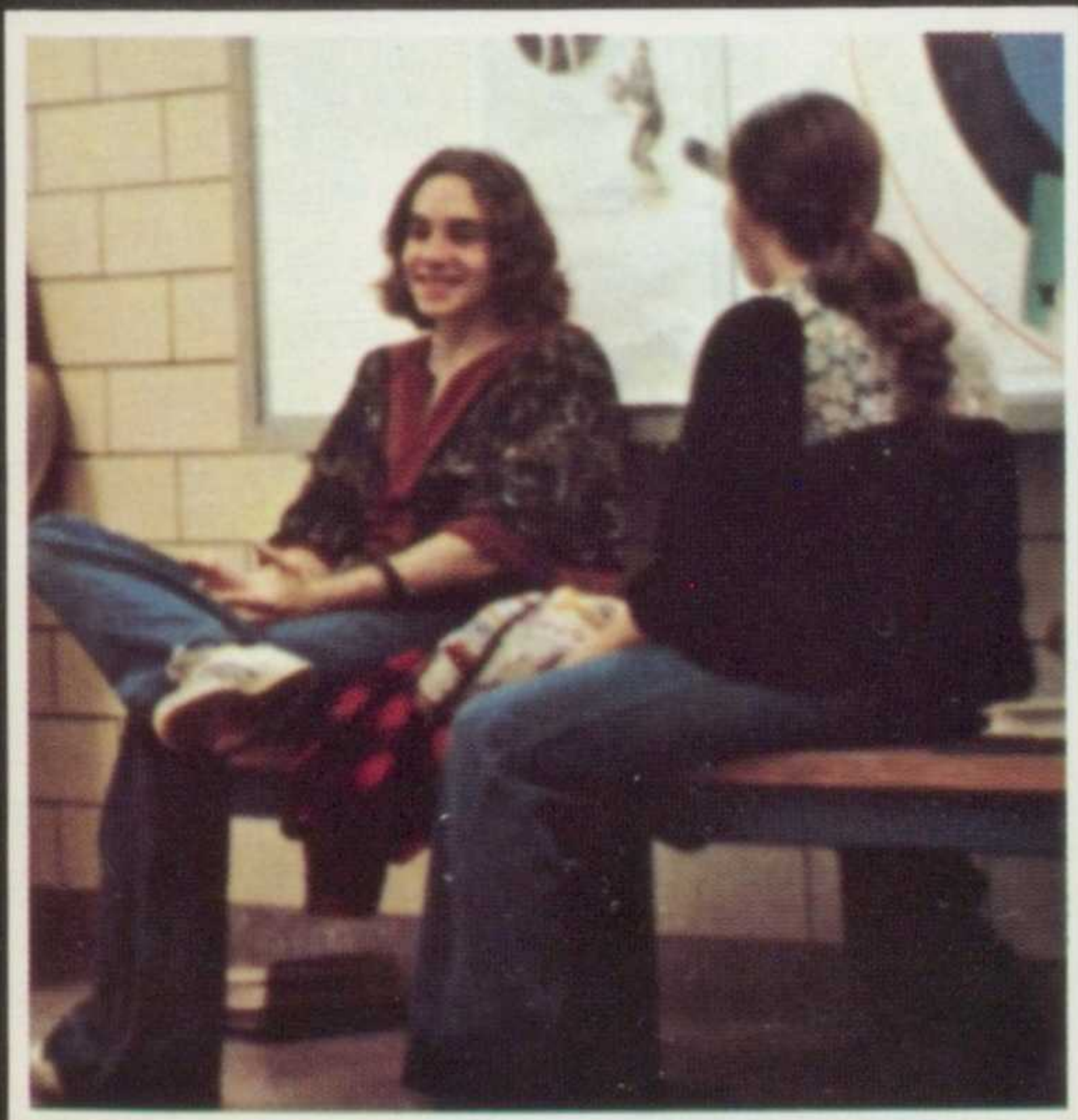

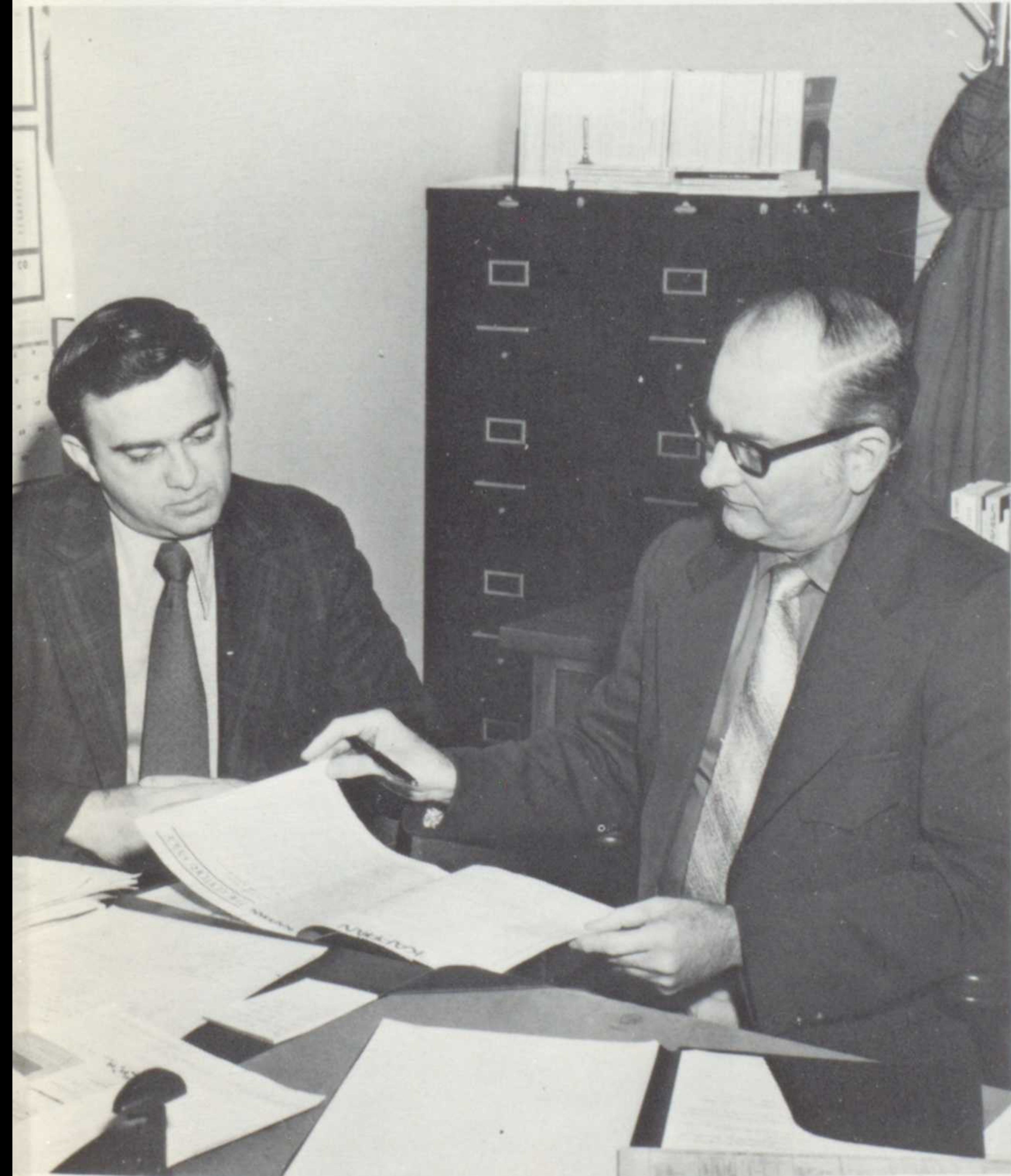

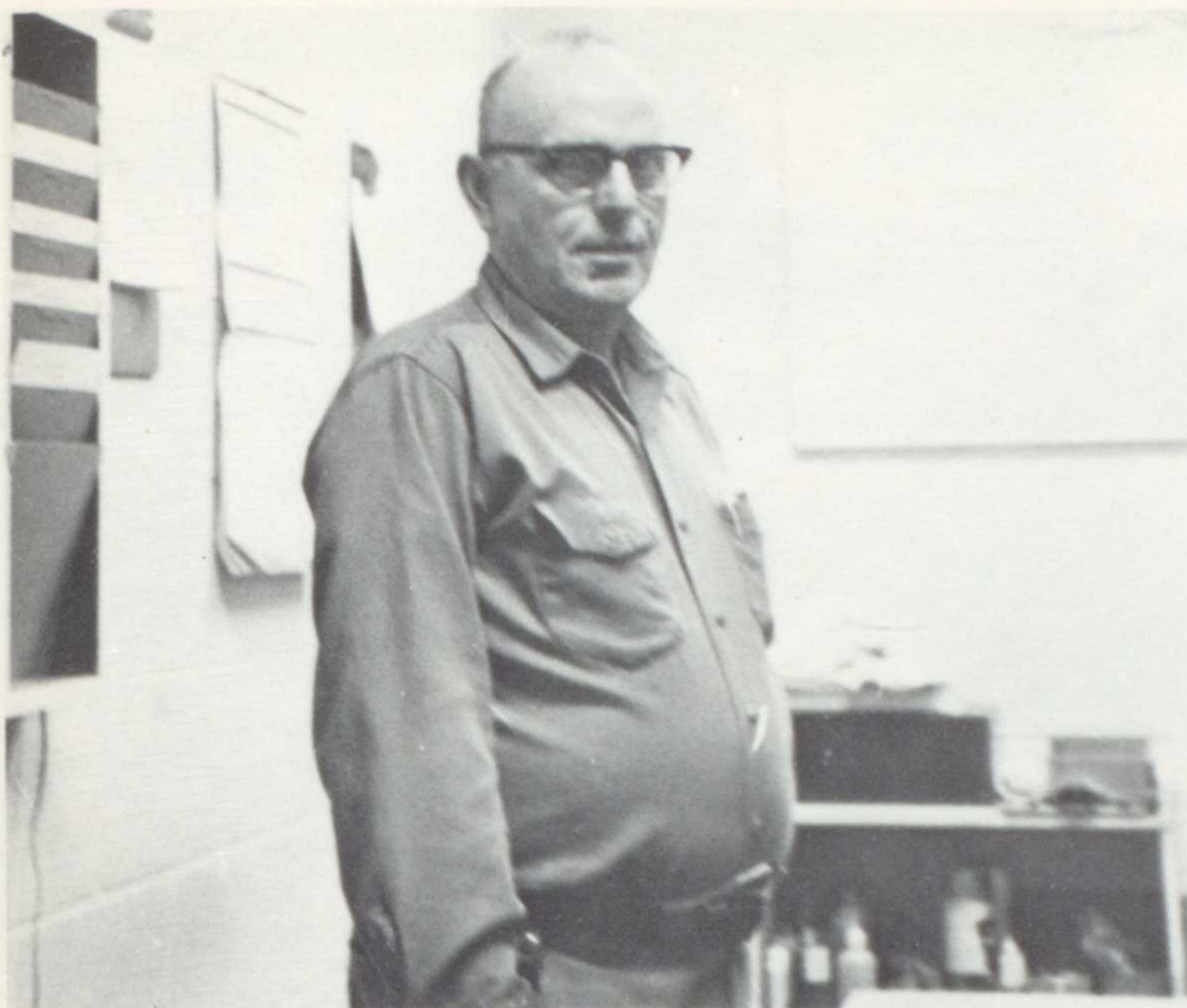

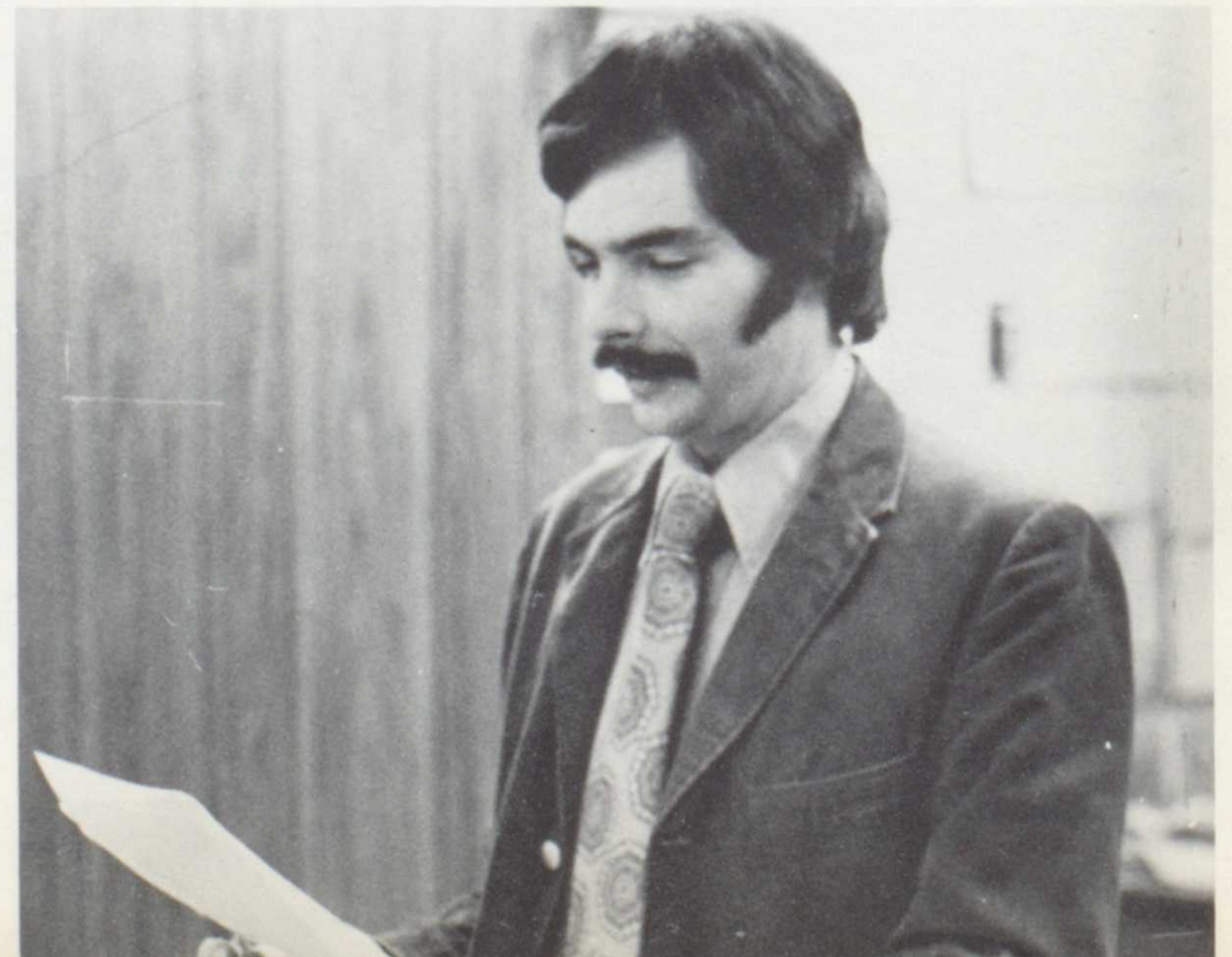

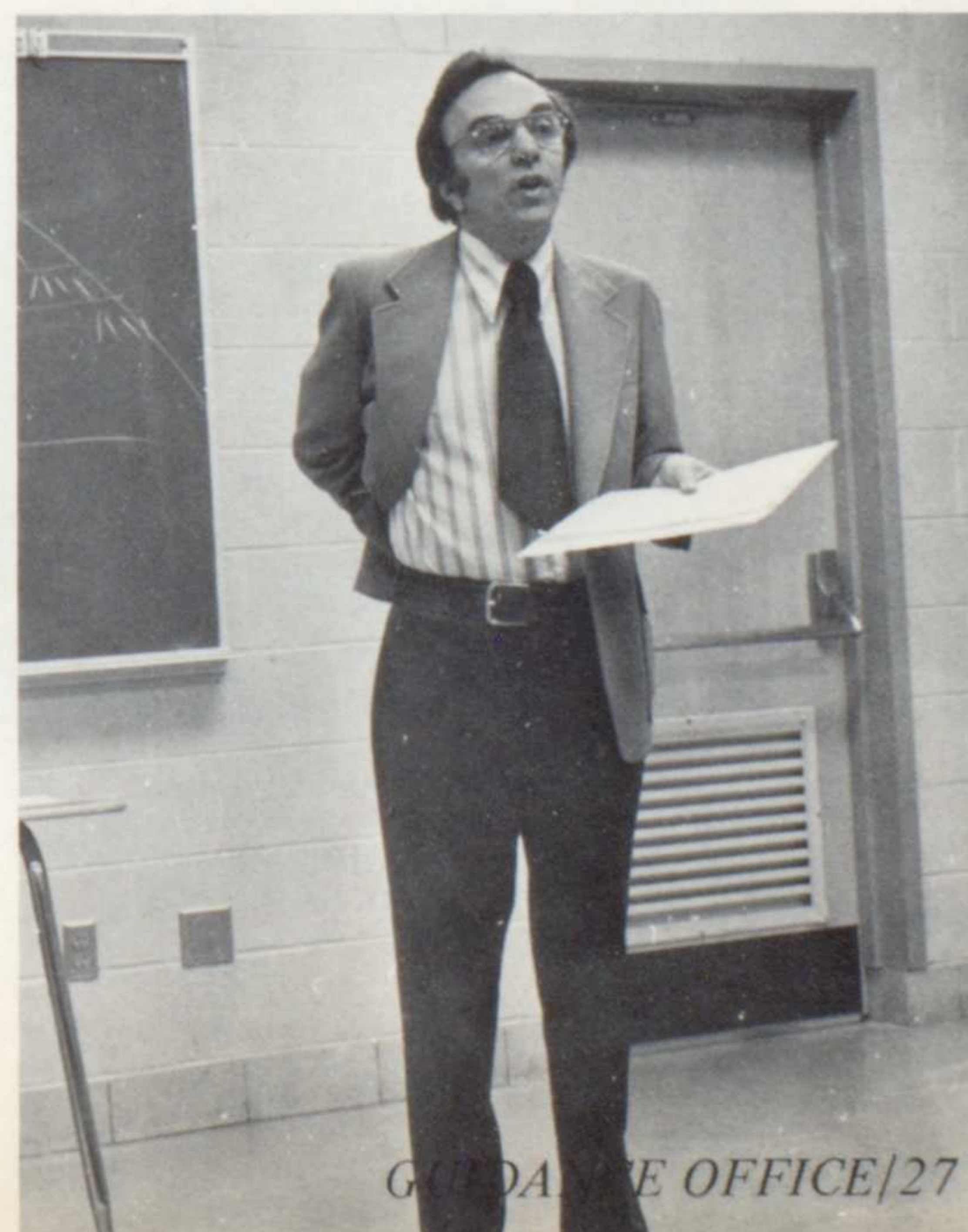

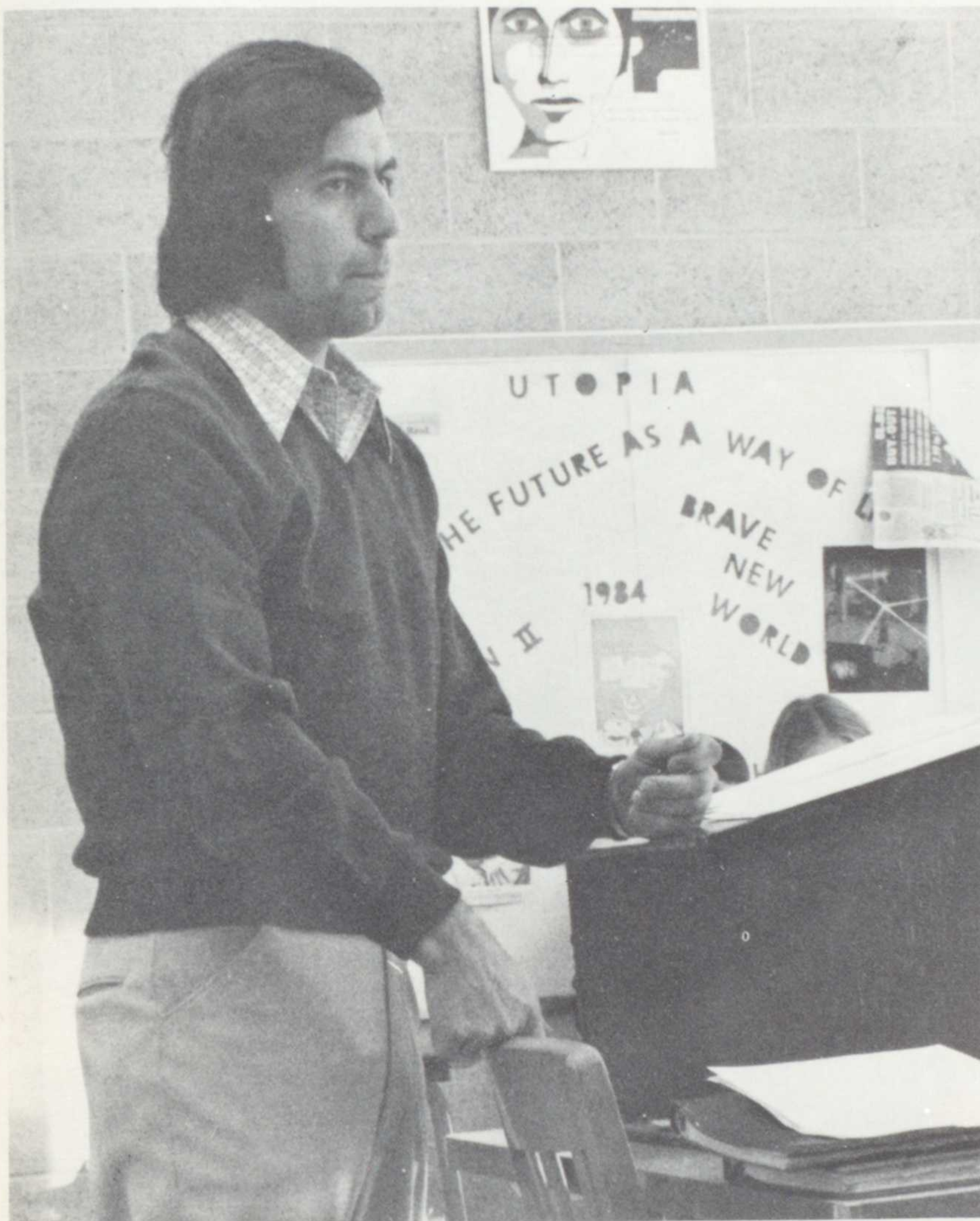

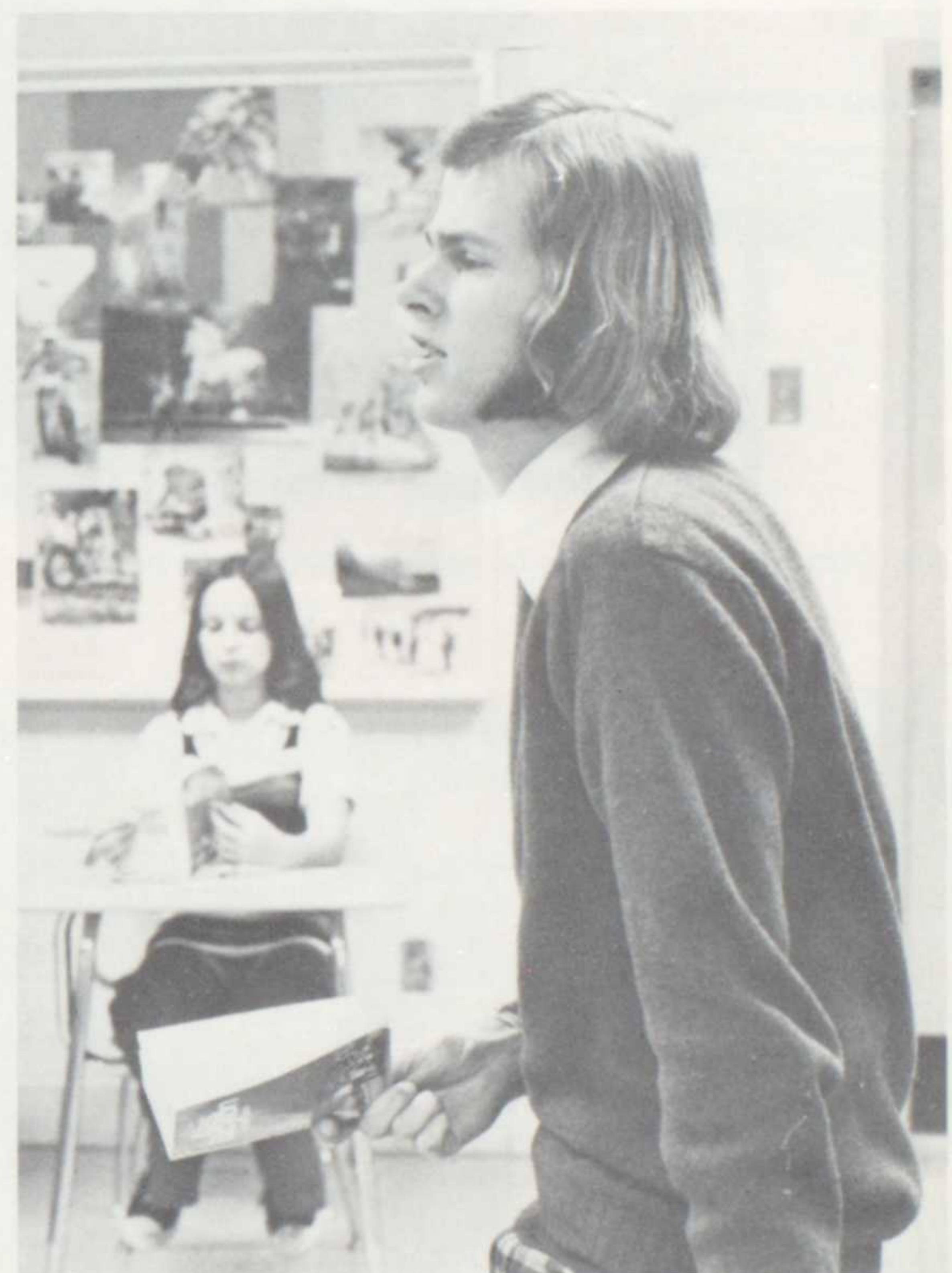

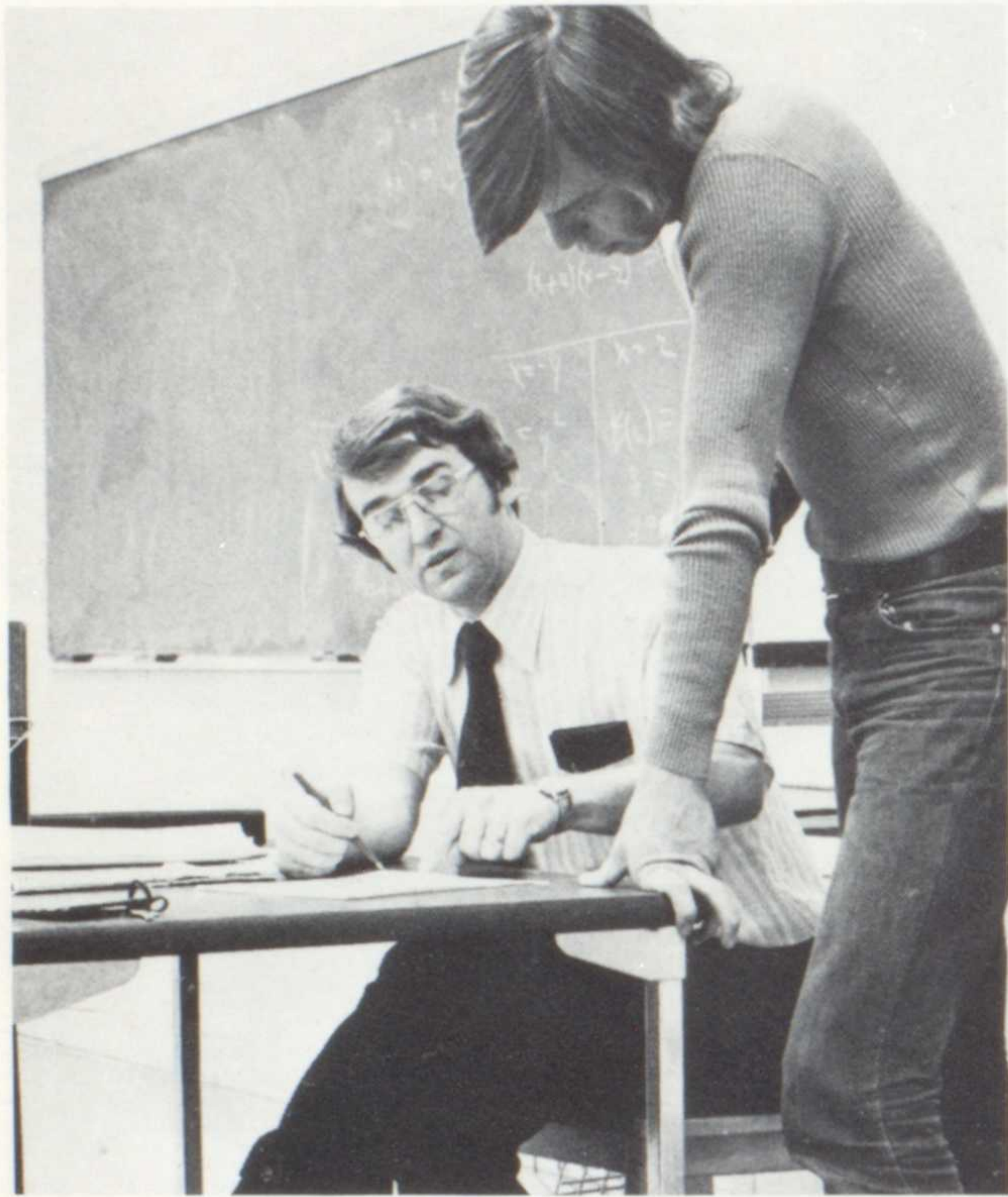

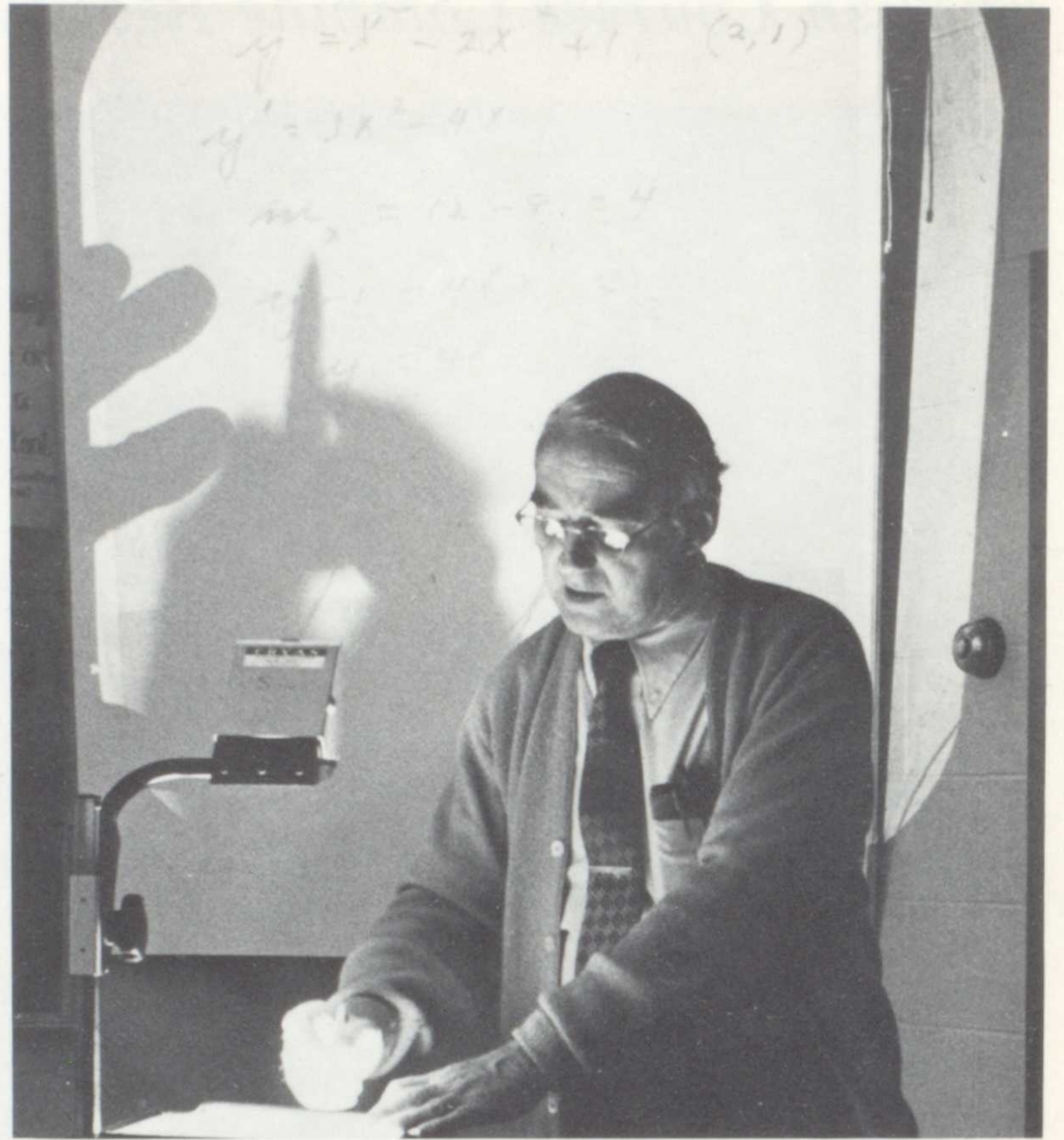

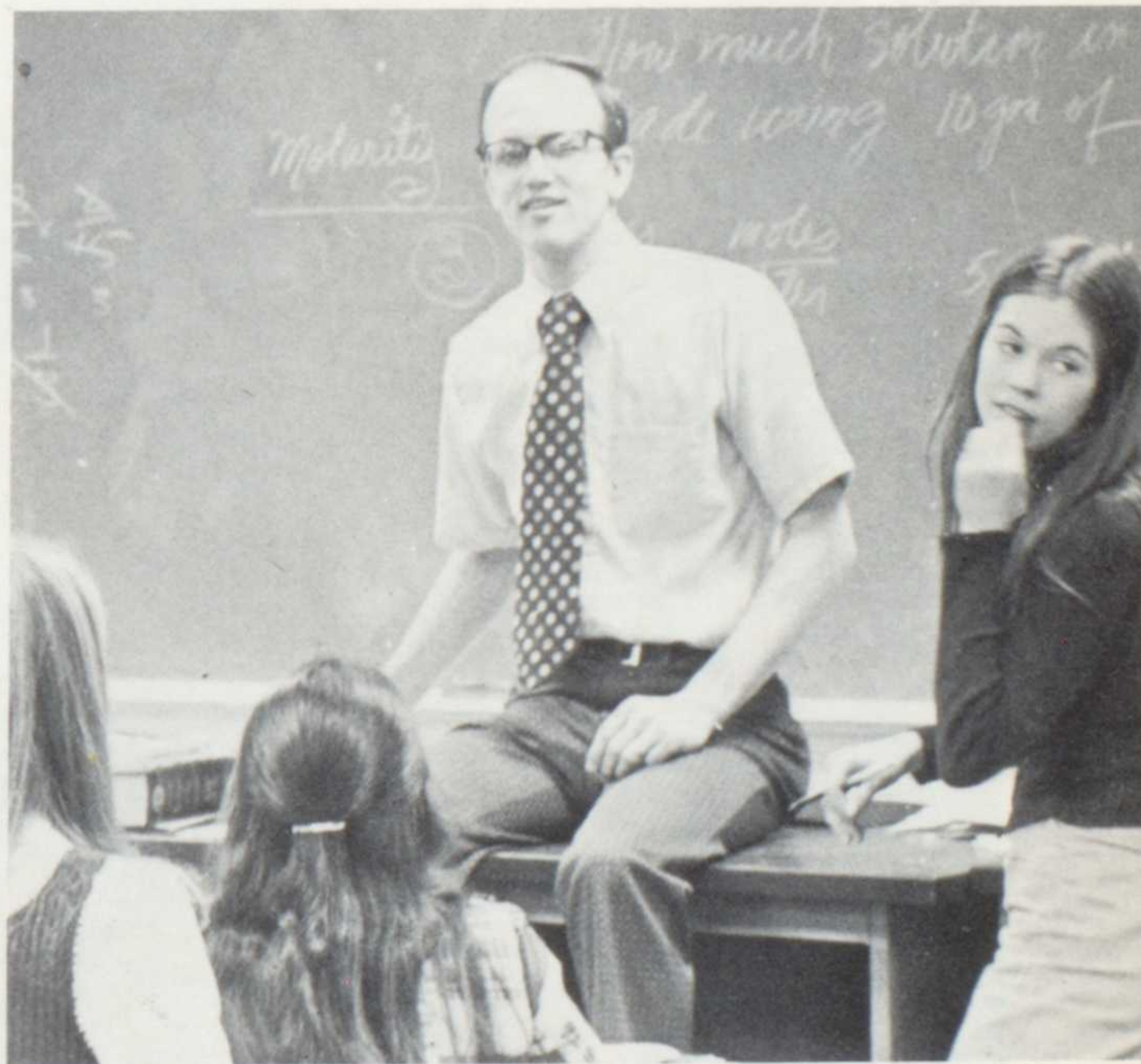

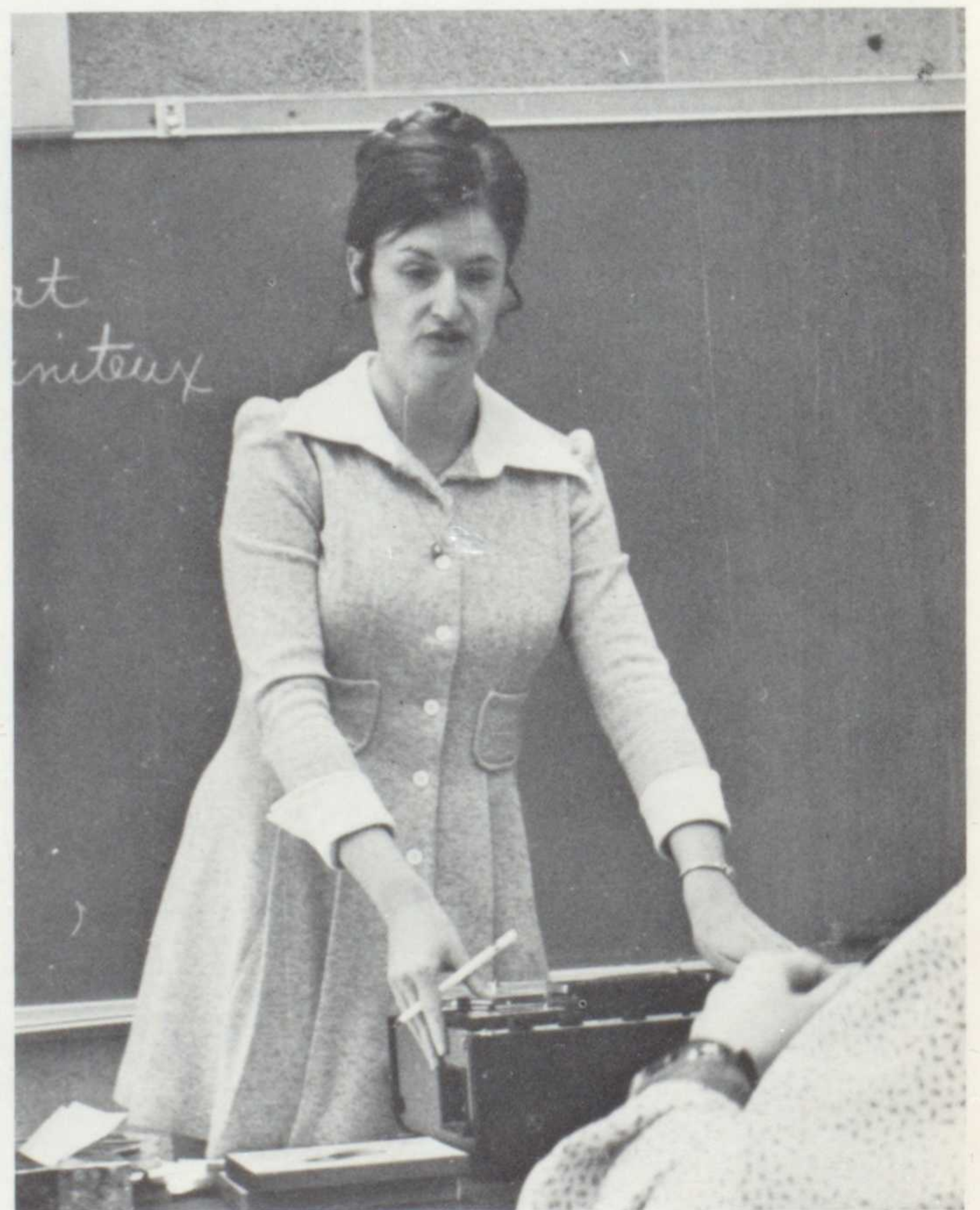
Languages Bridge Gap Between Lands

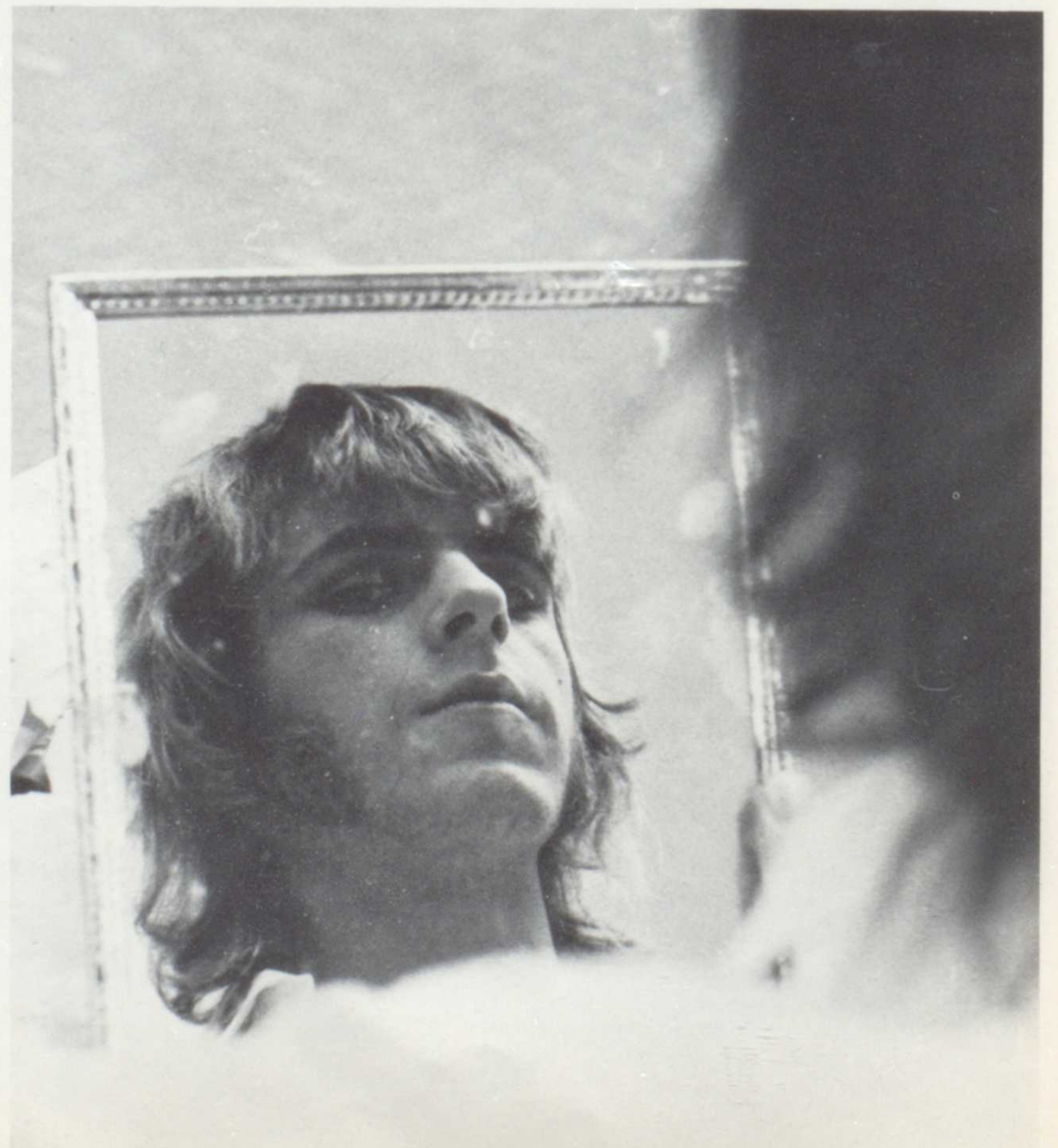

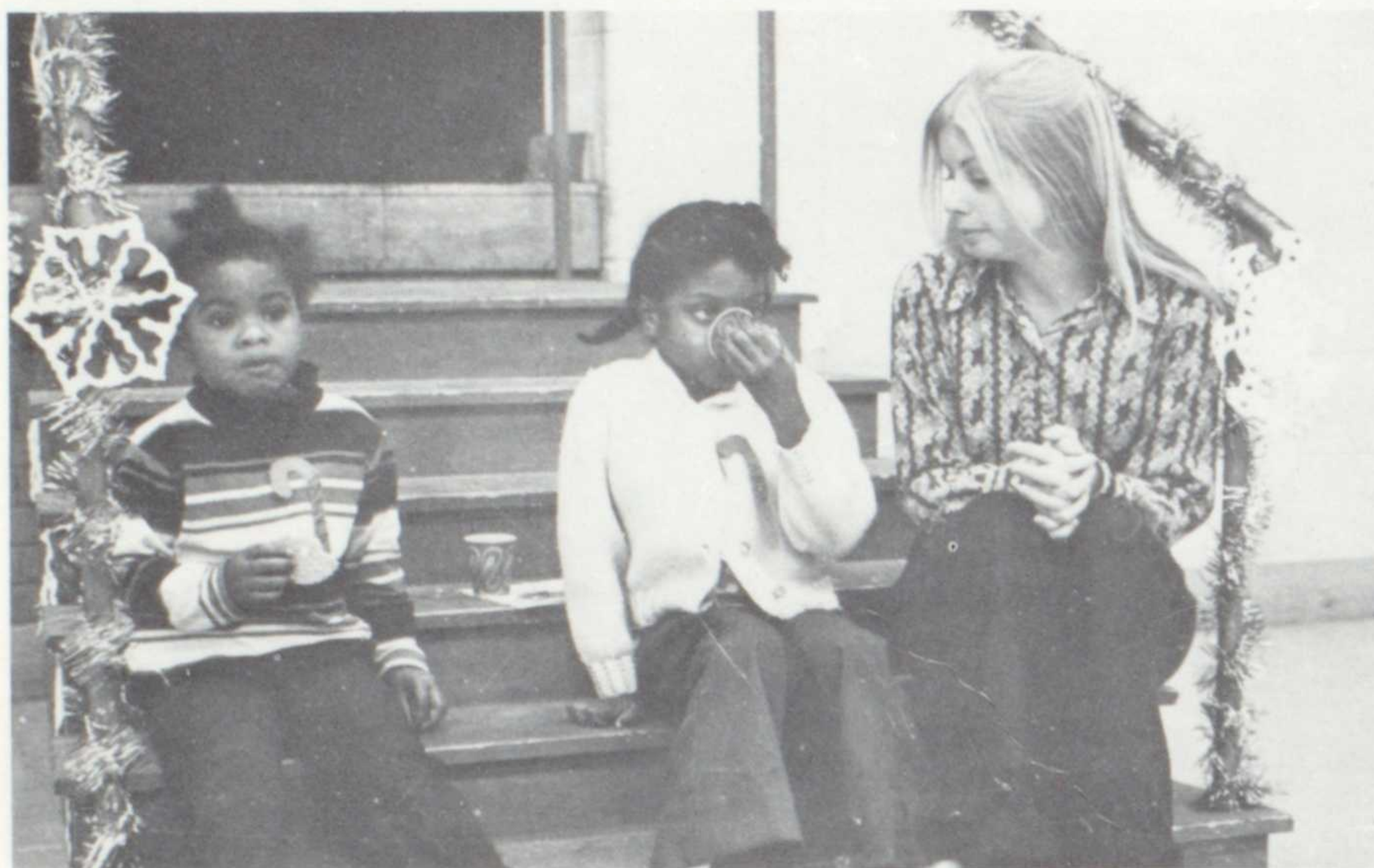

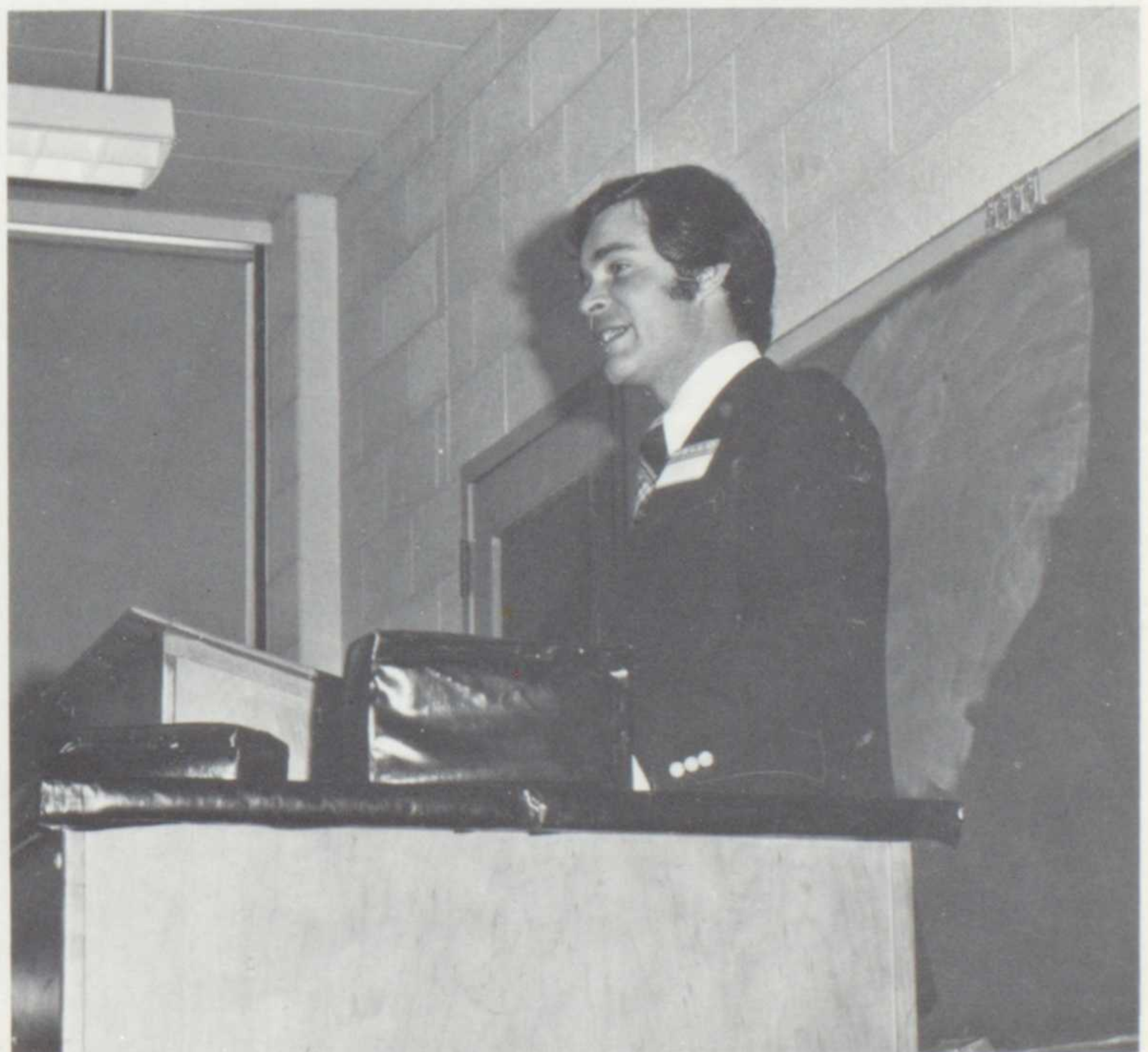

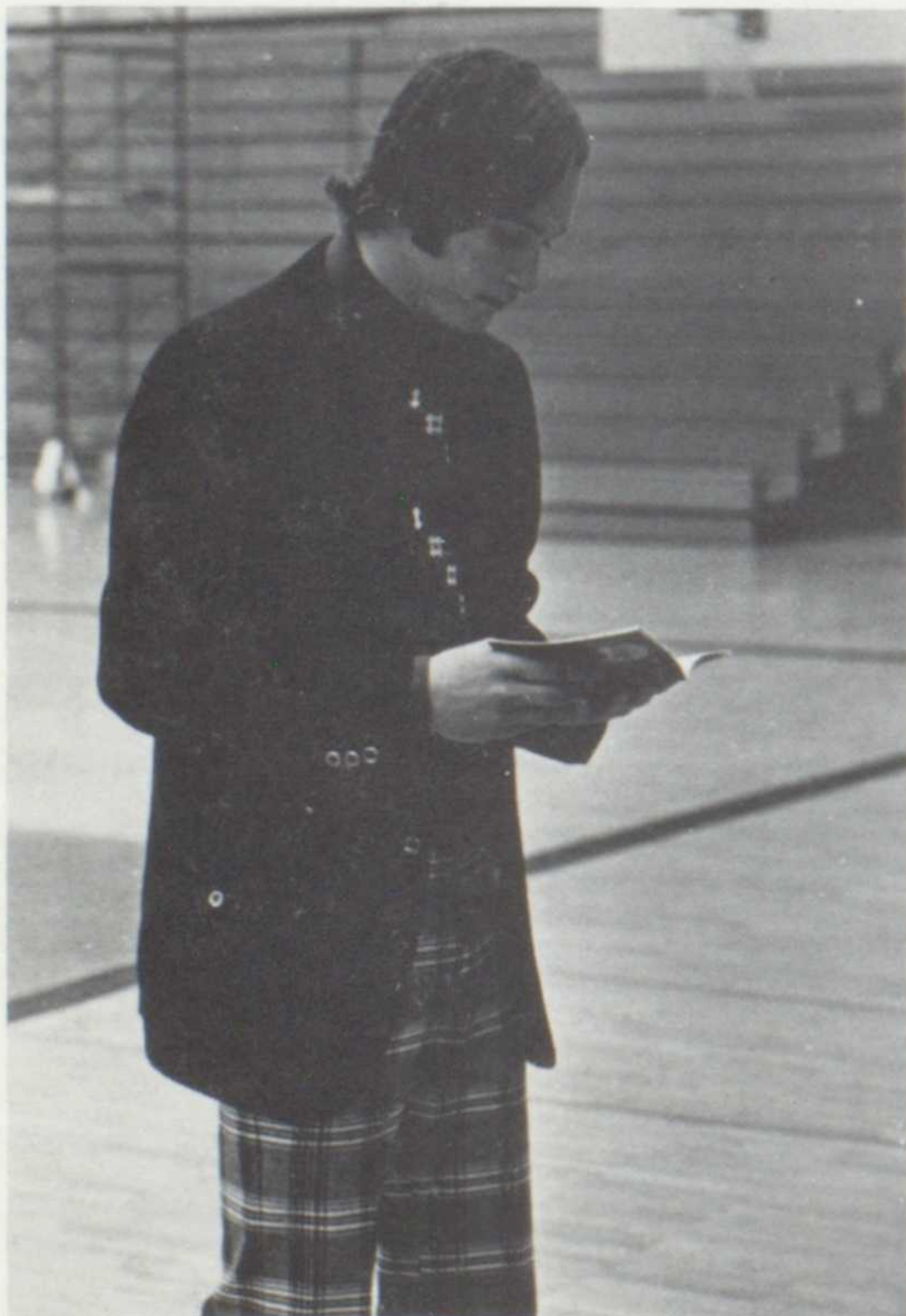

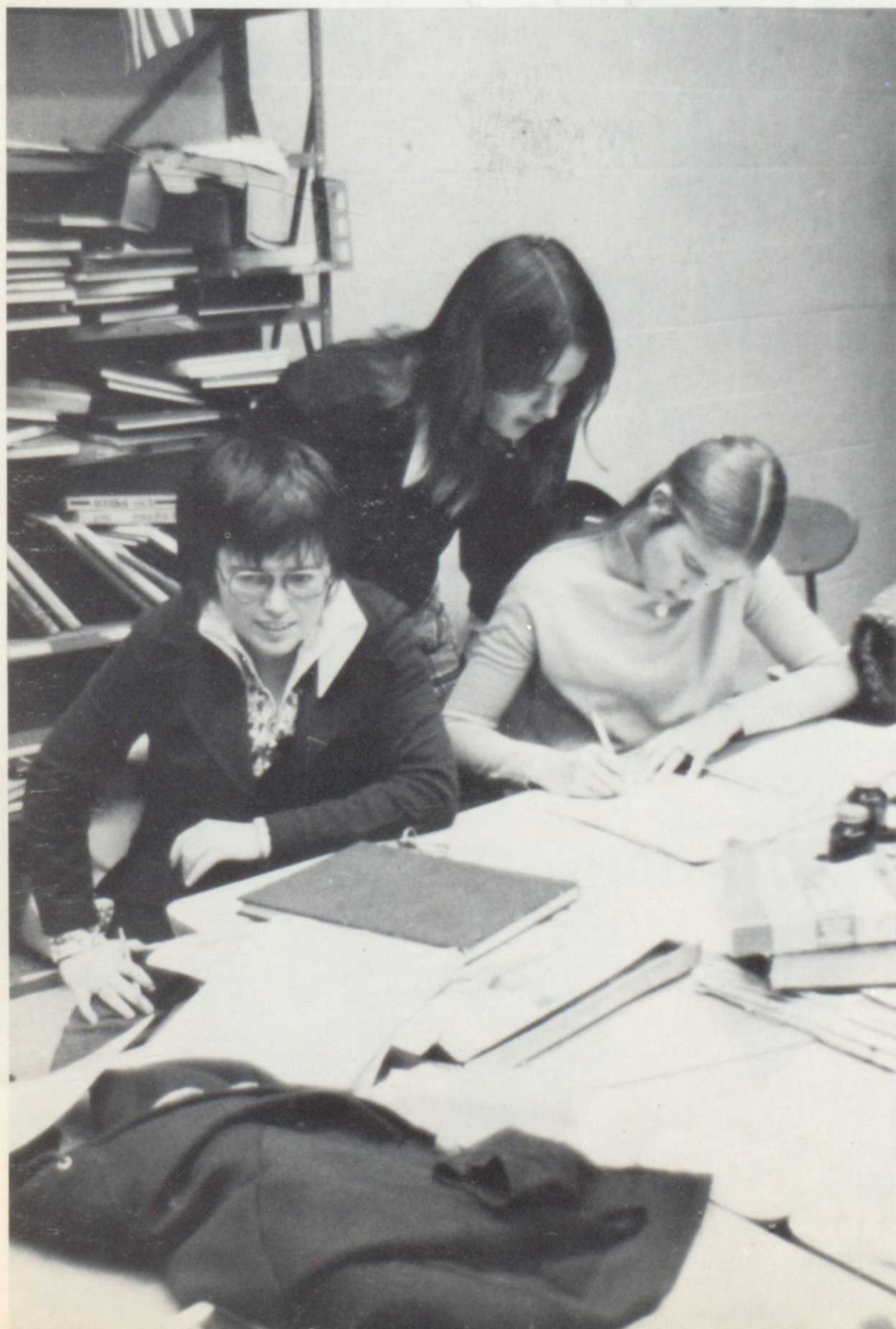

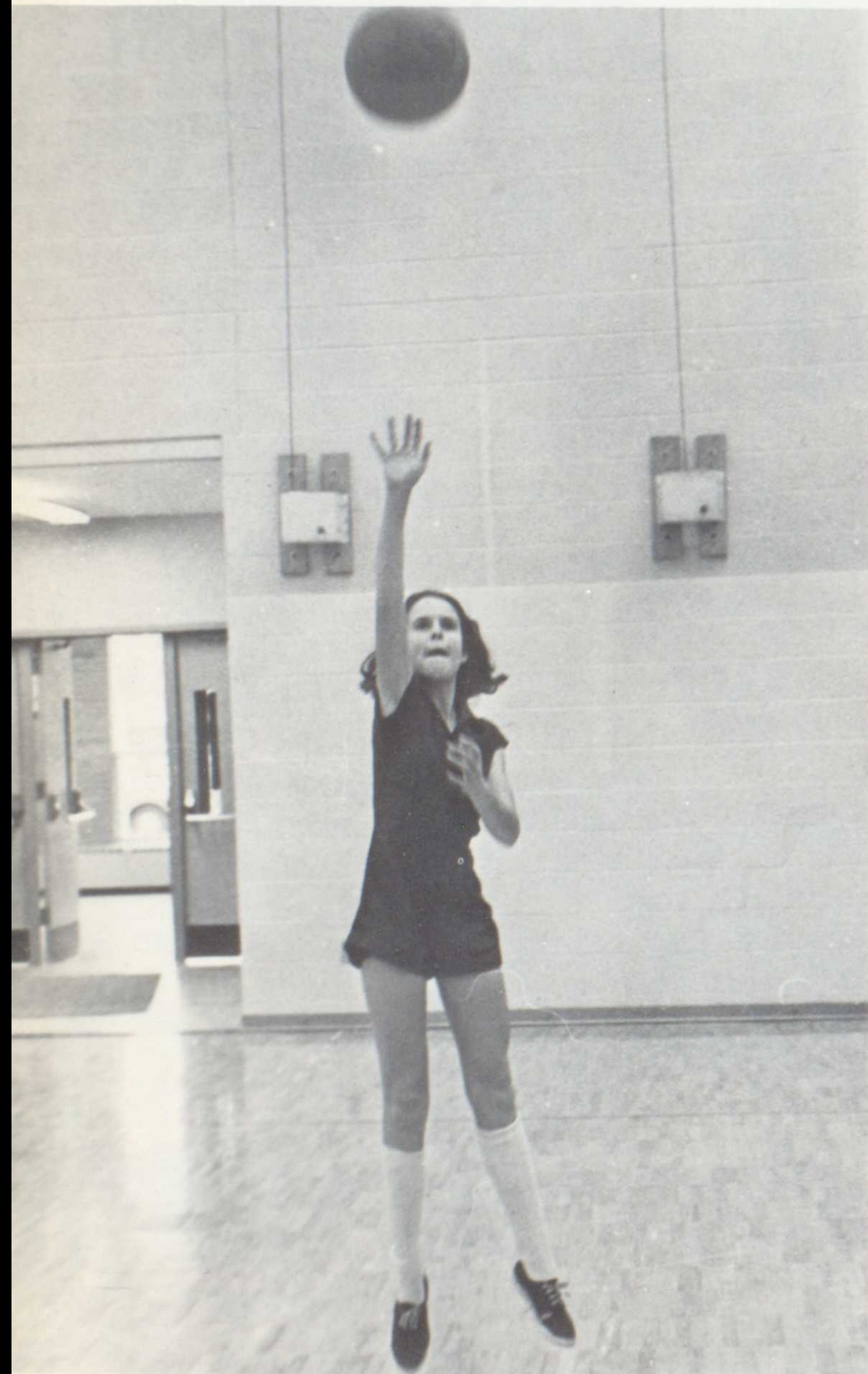

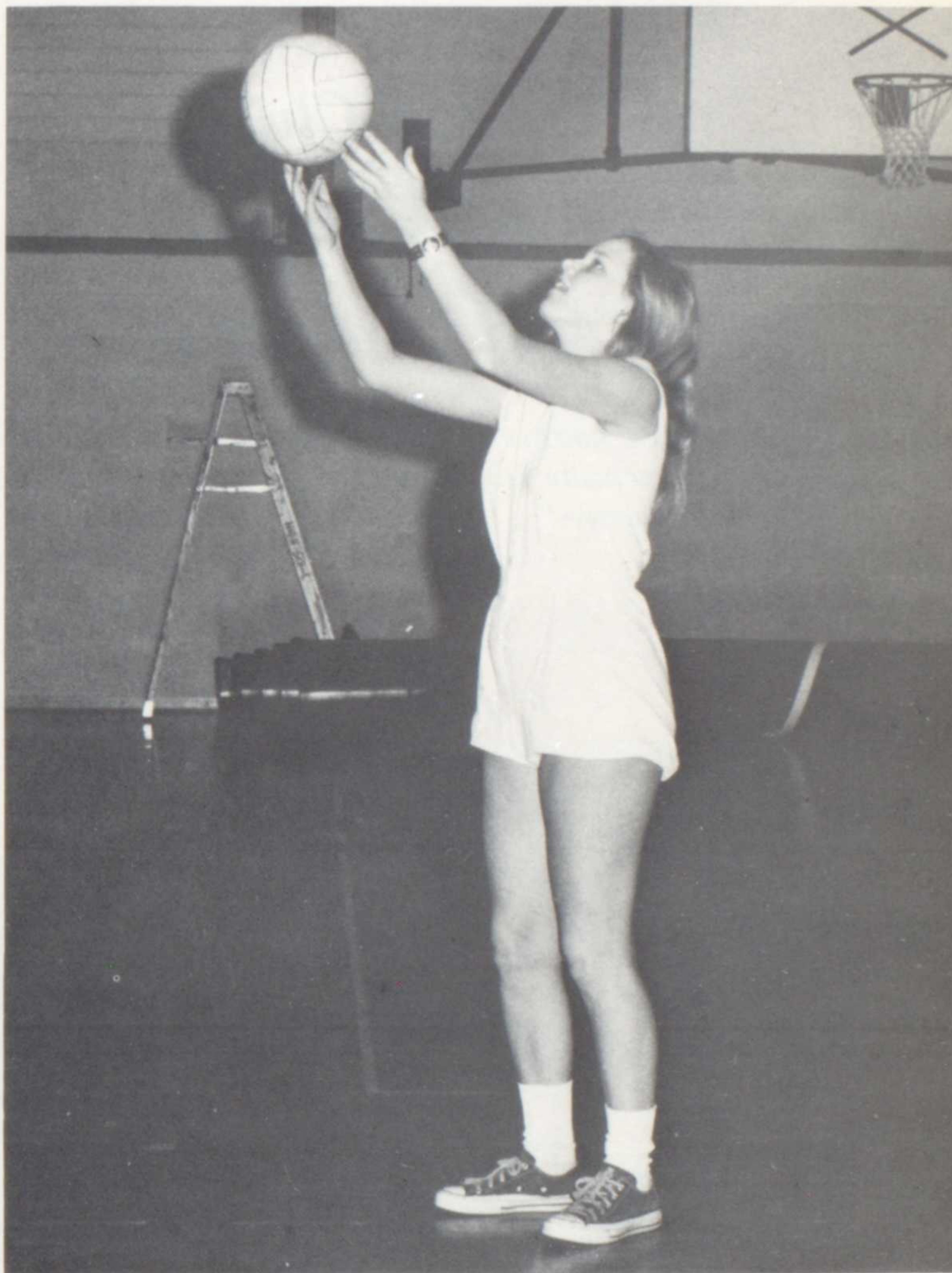

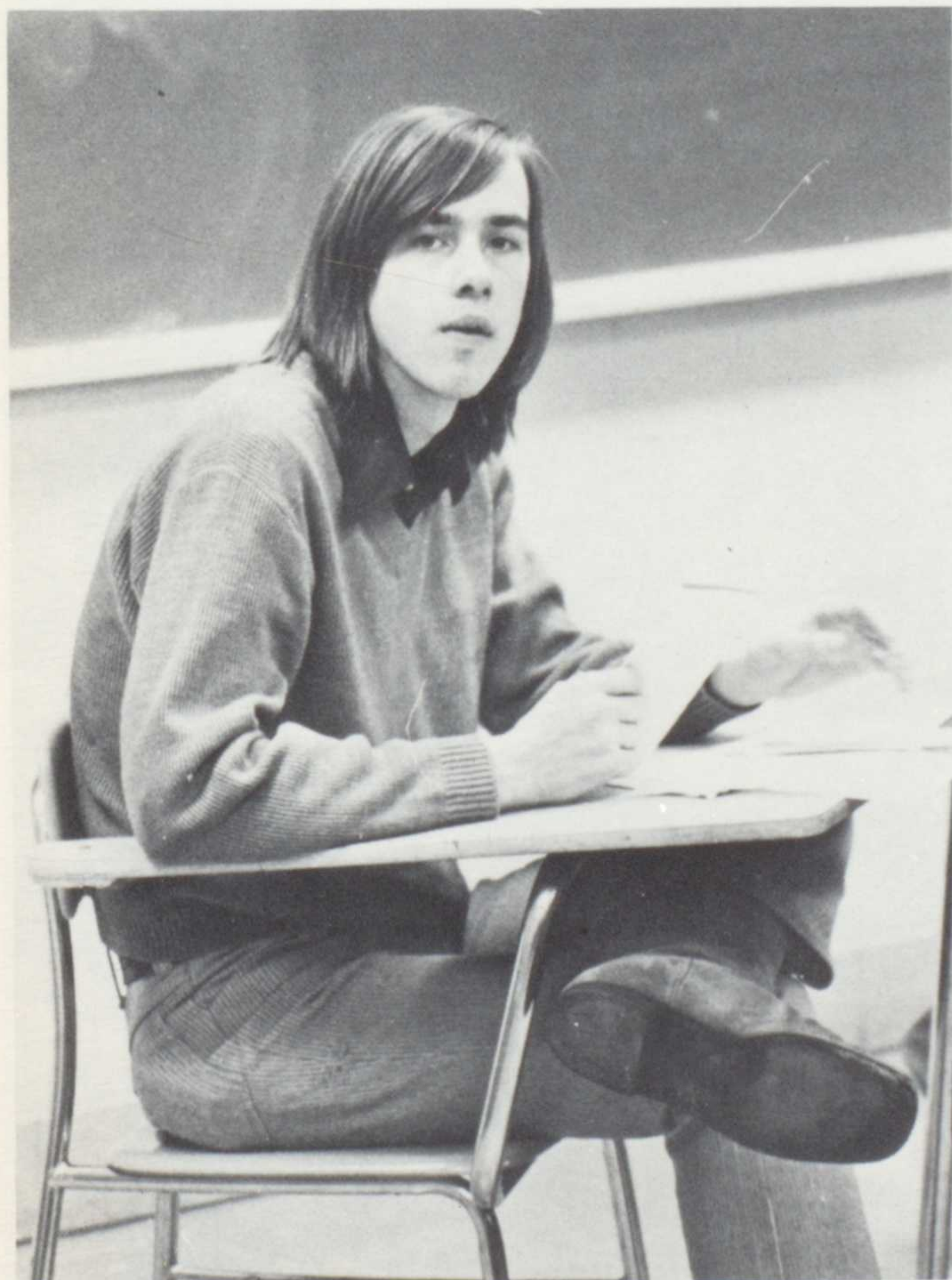

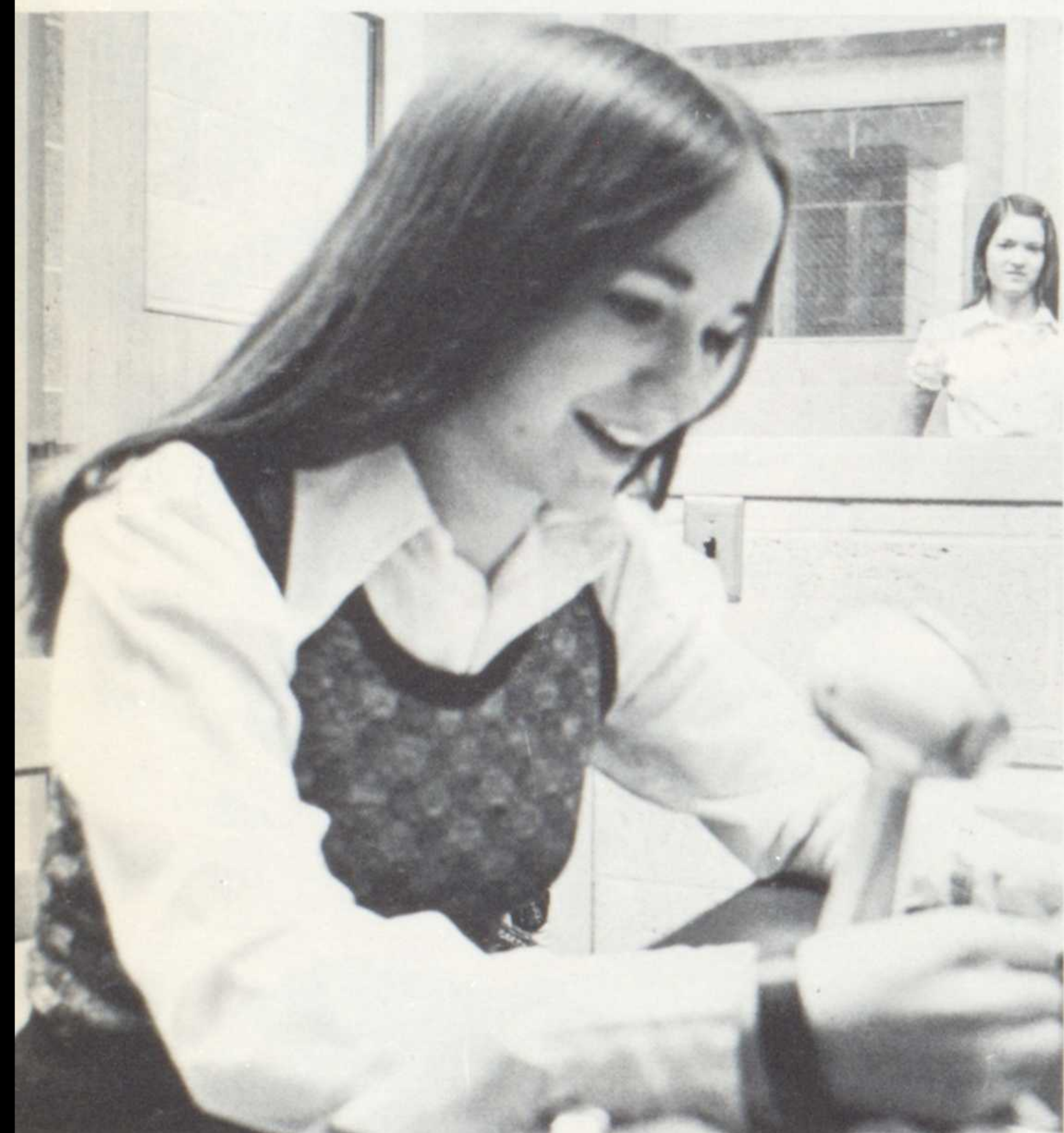

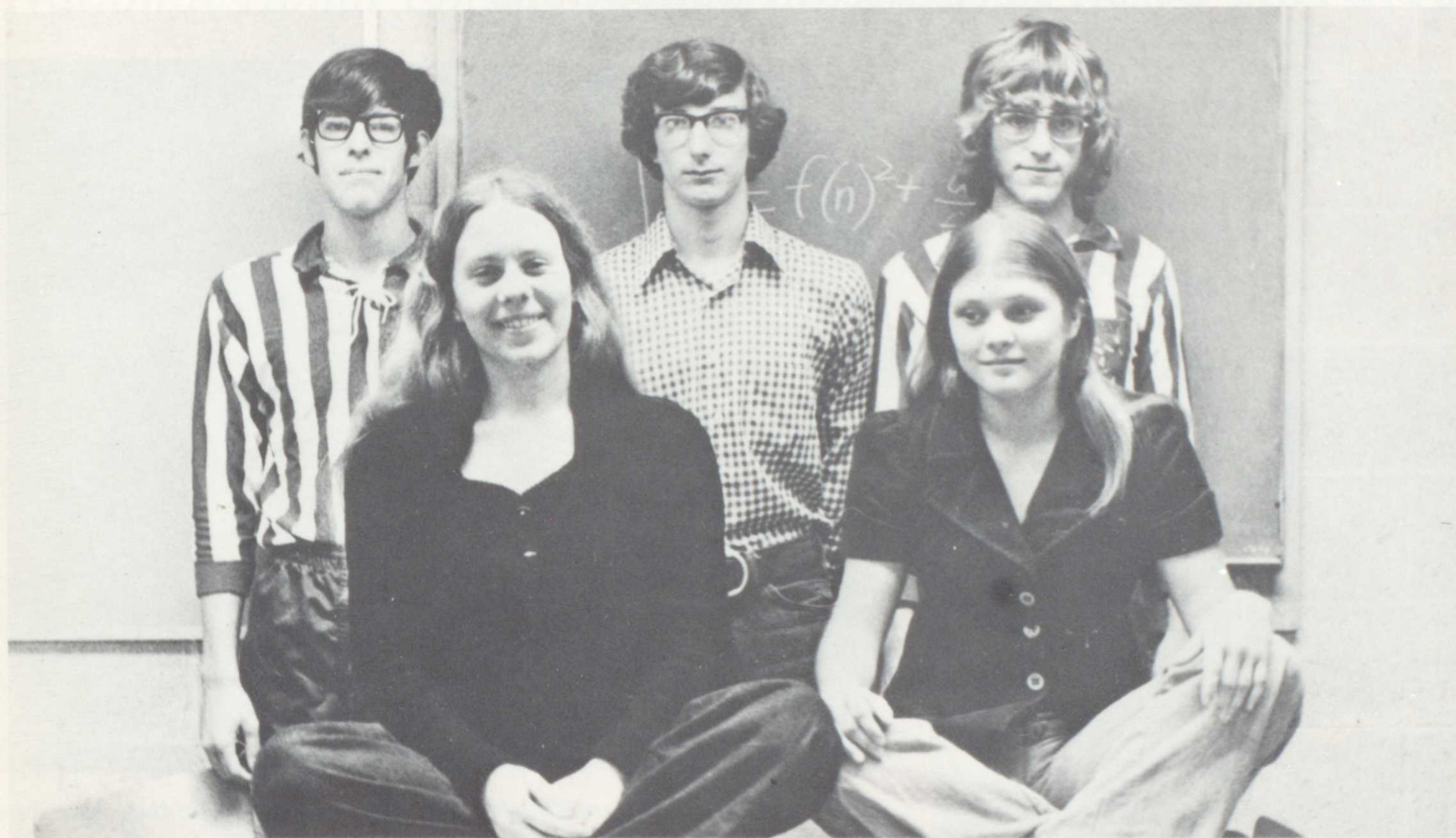

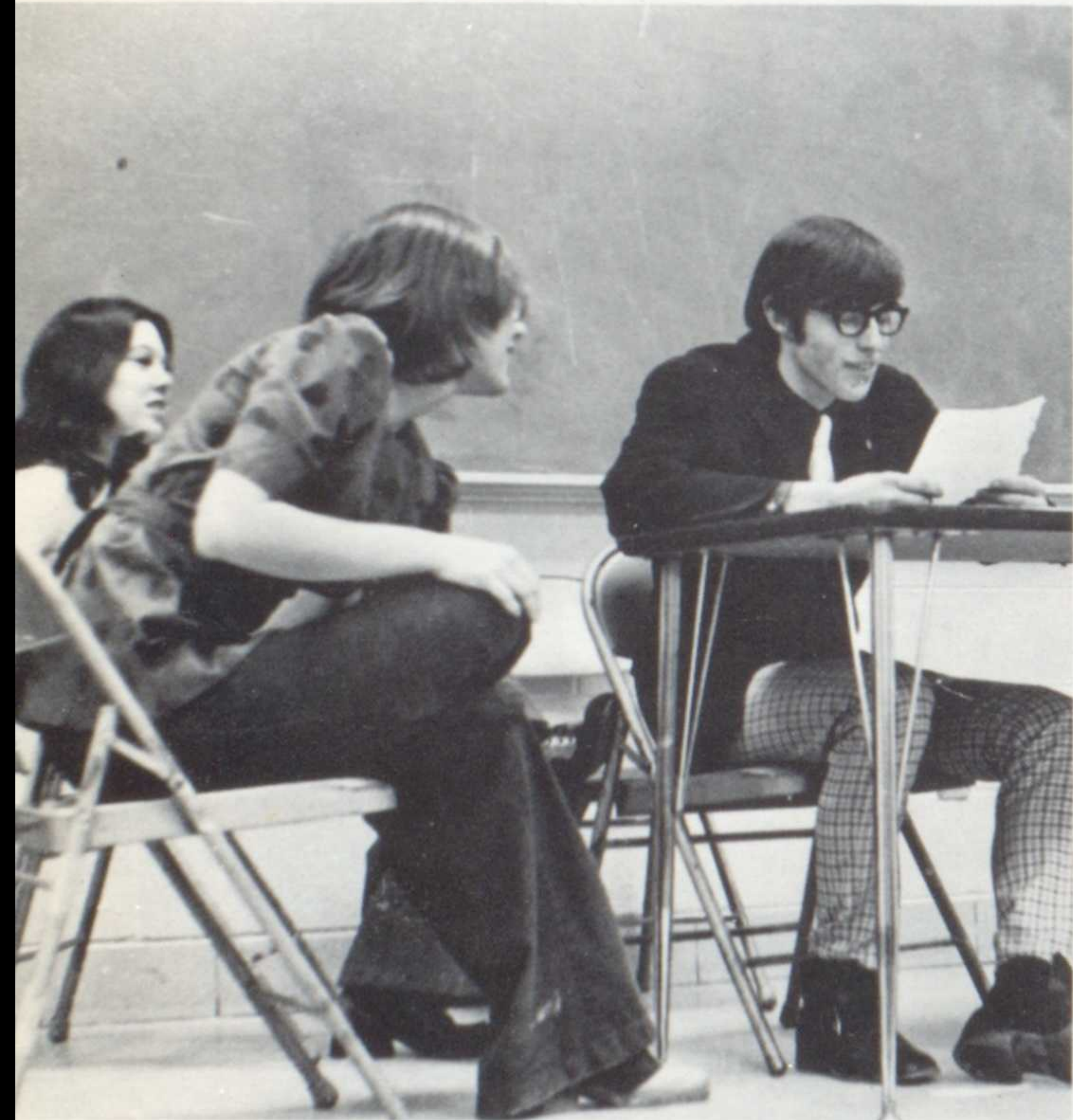

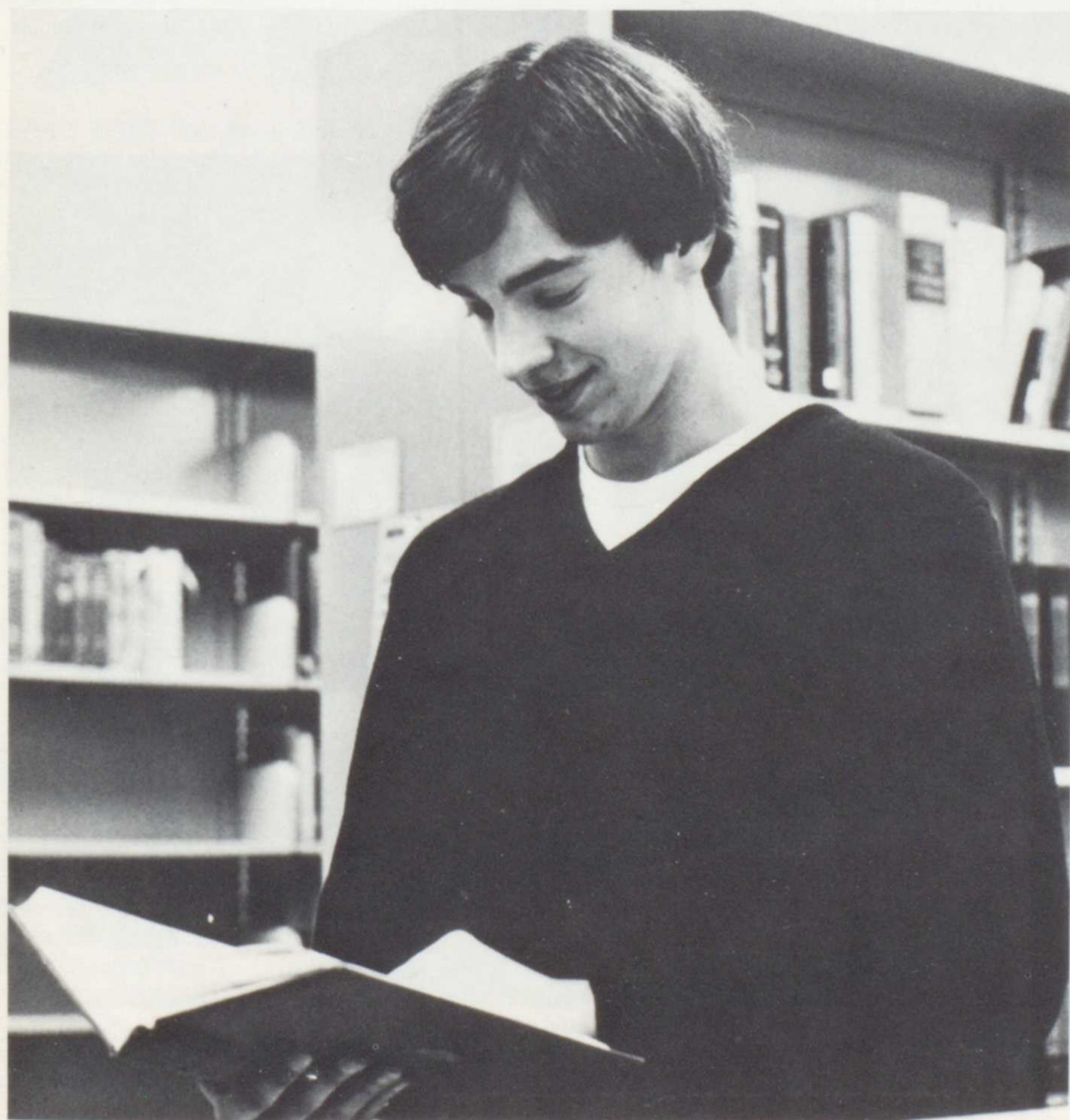

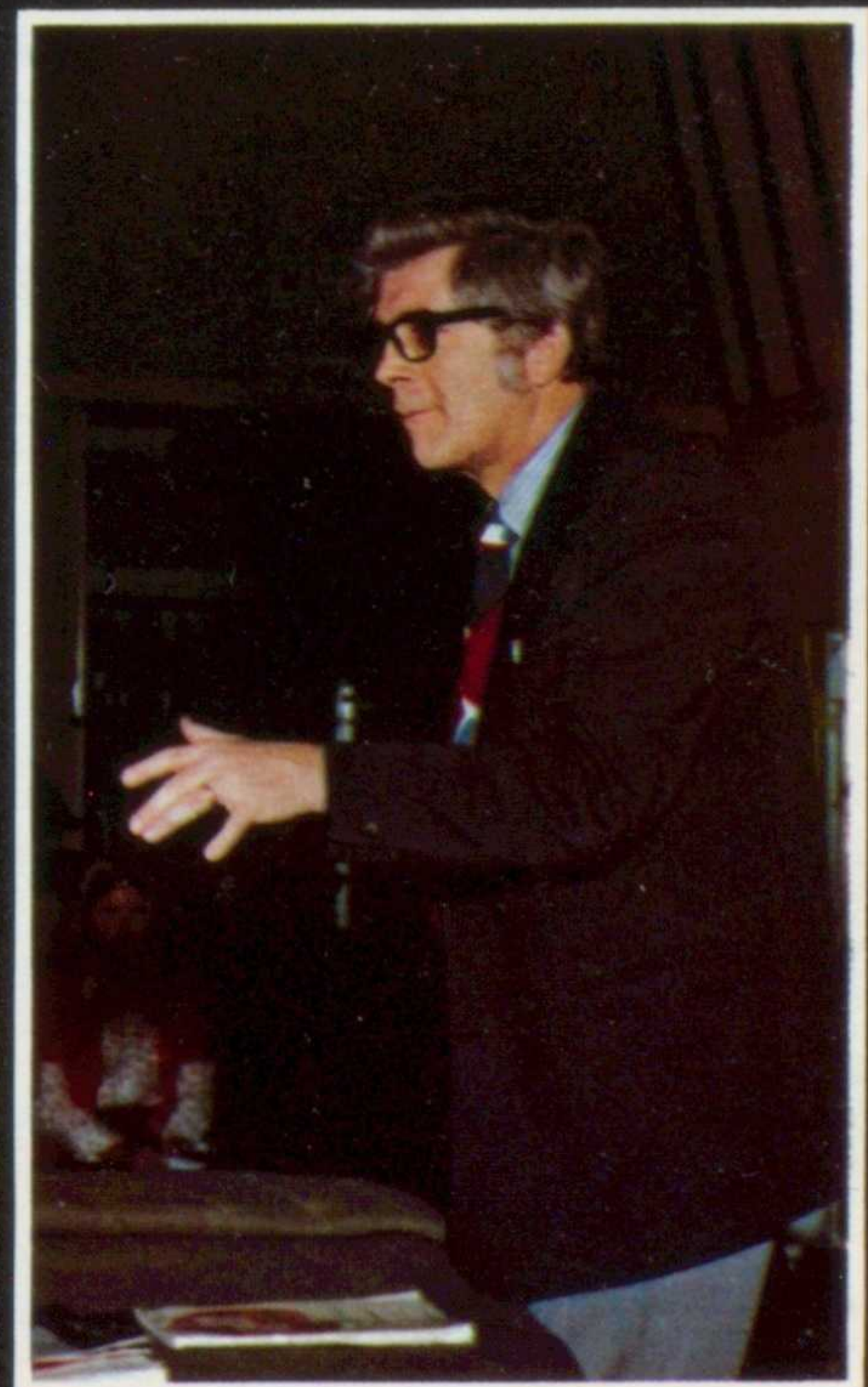

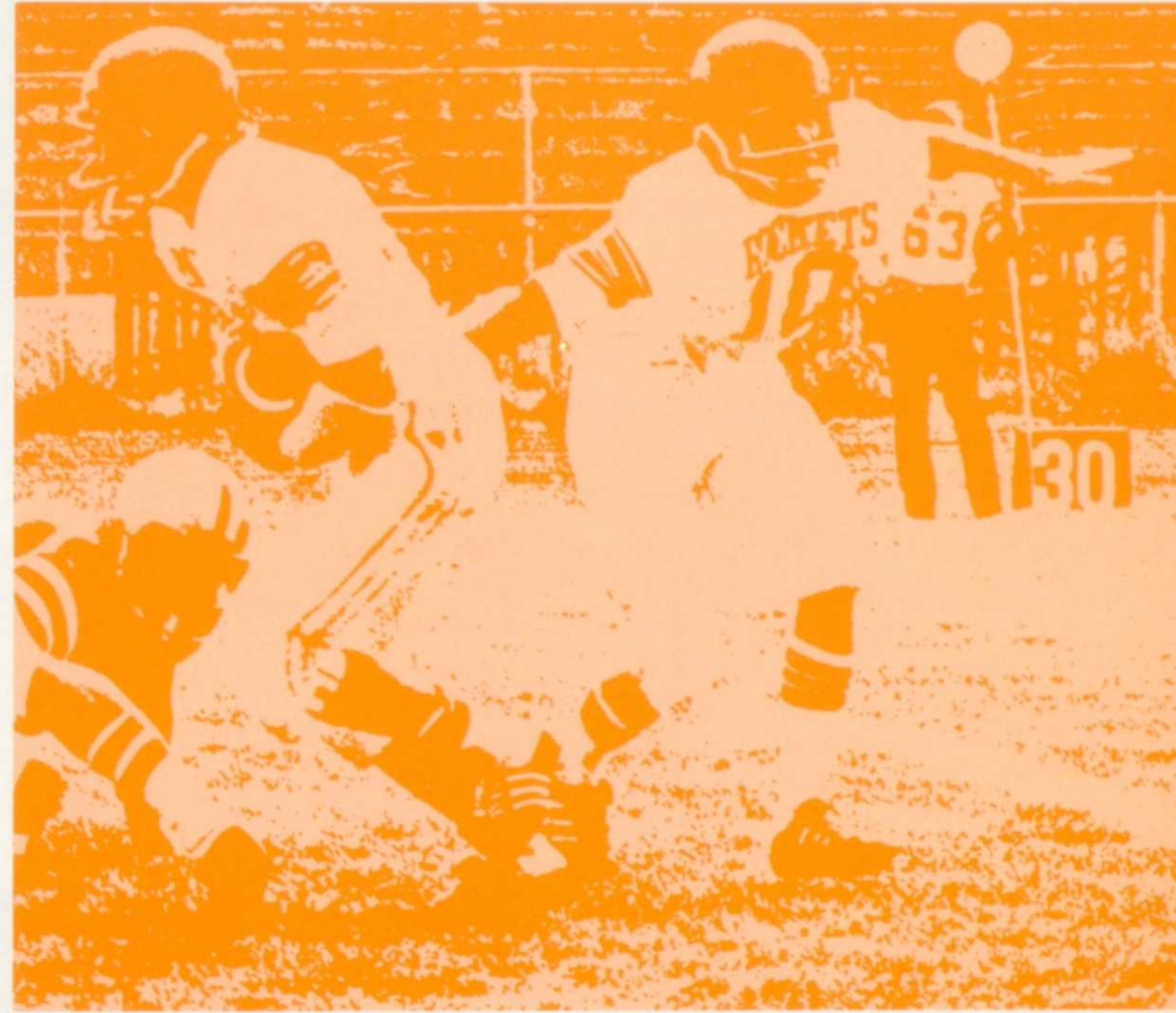

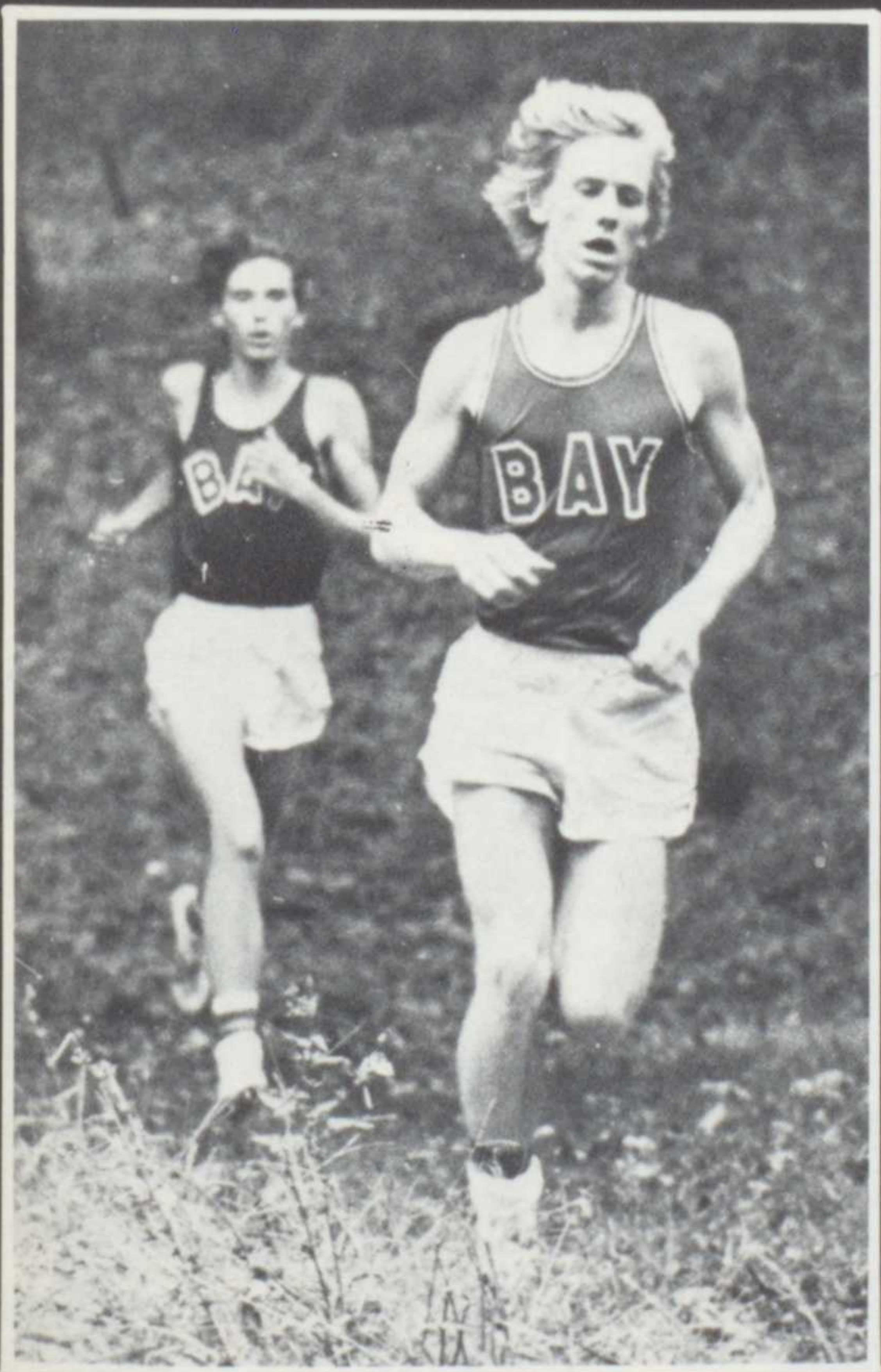

Cagers Seize 2nd Place Finish

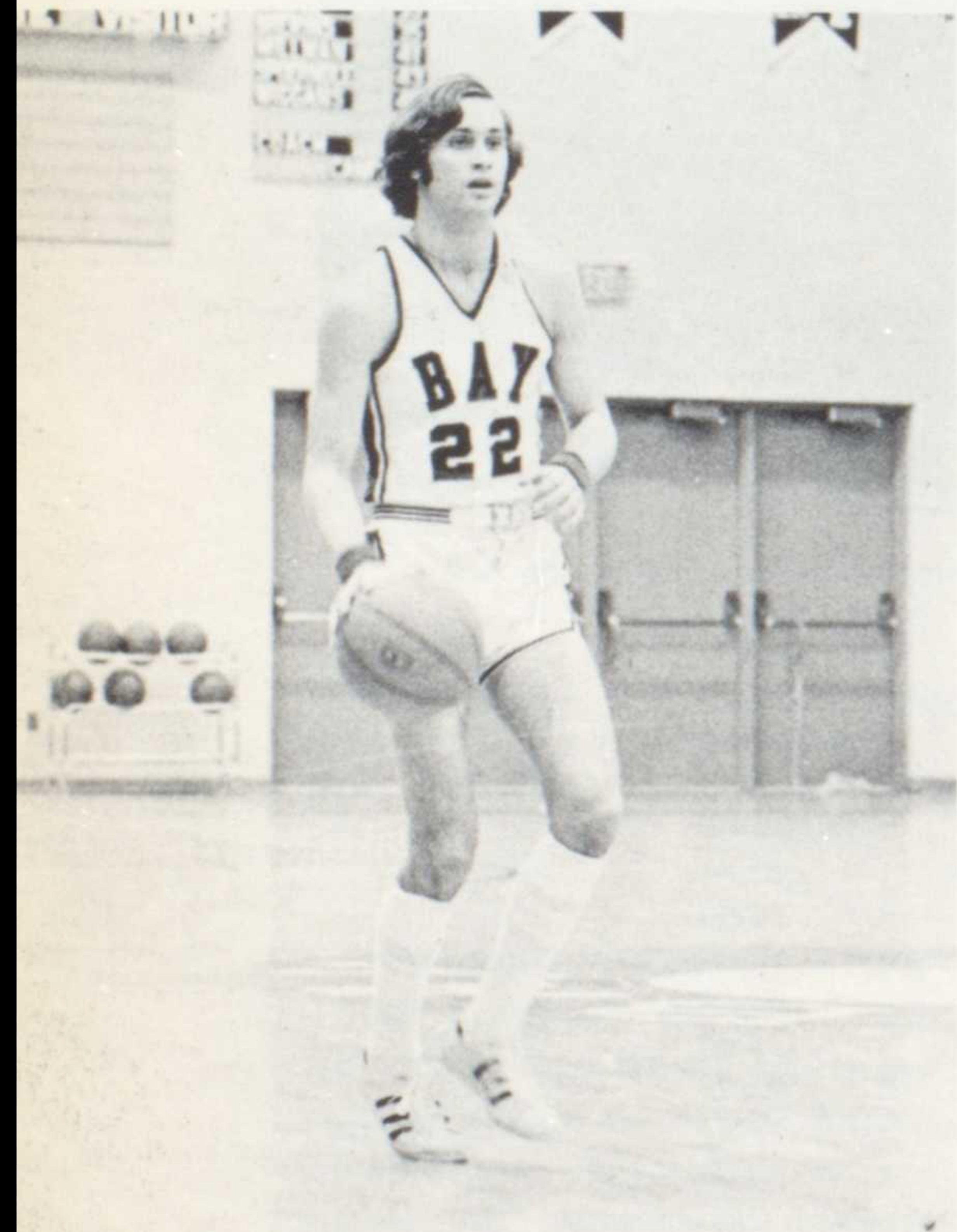

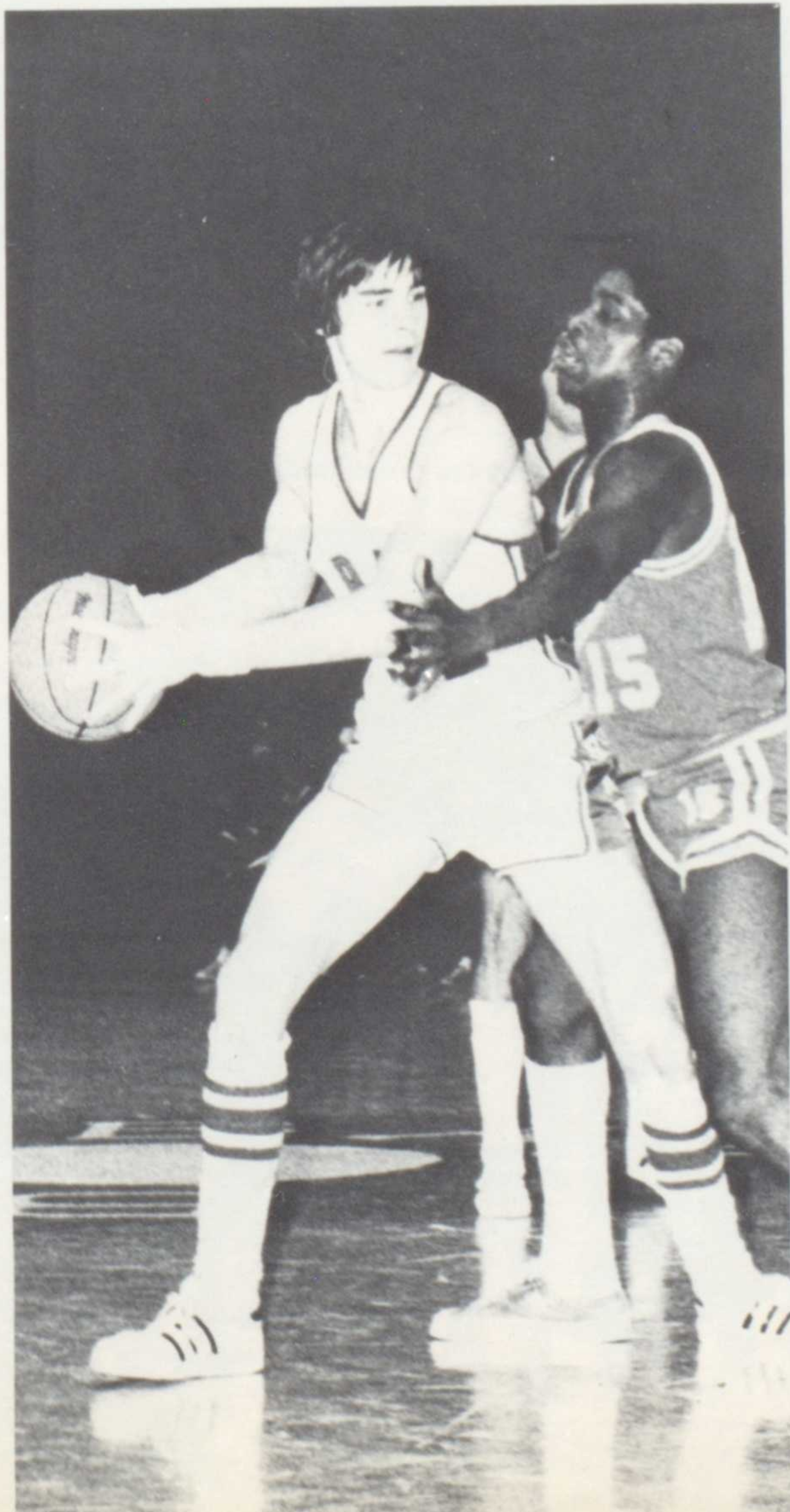

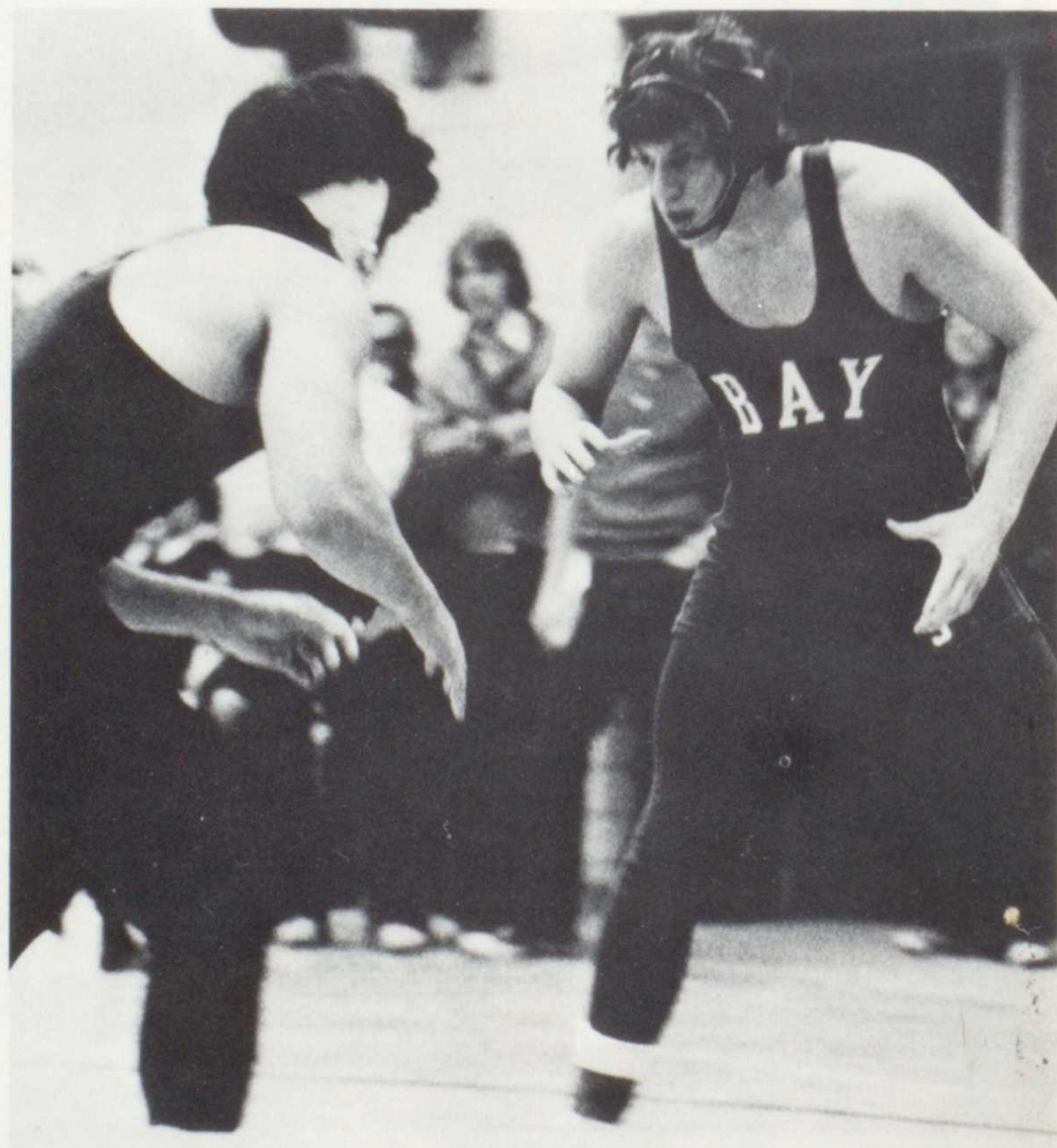

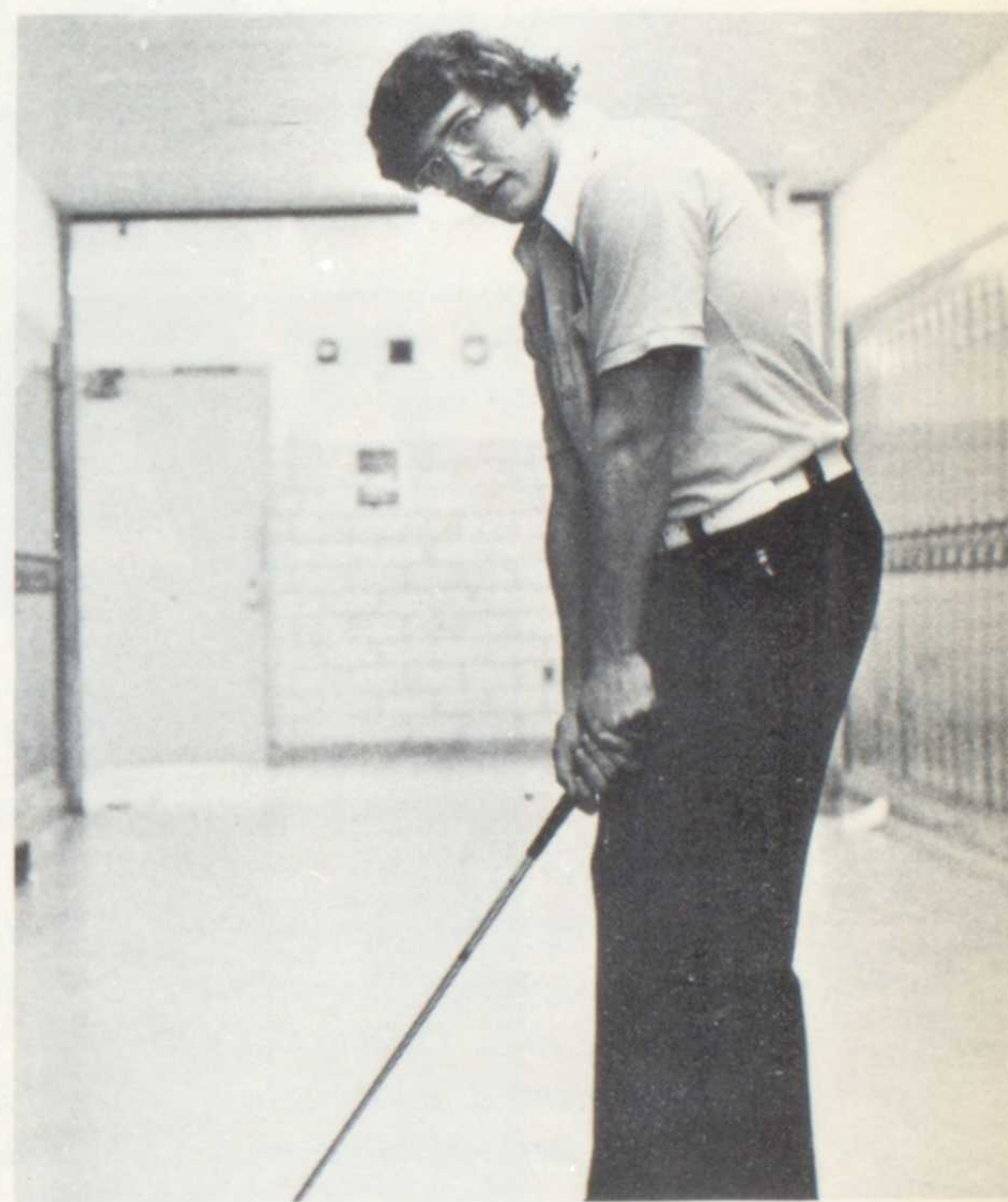
