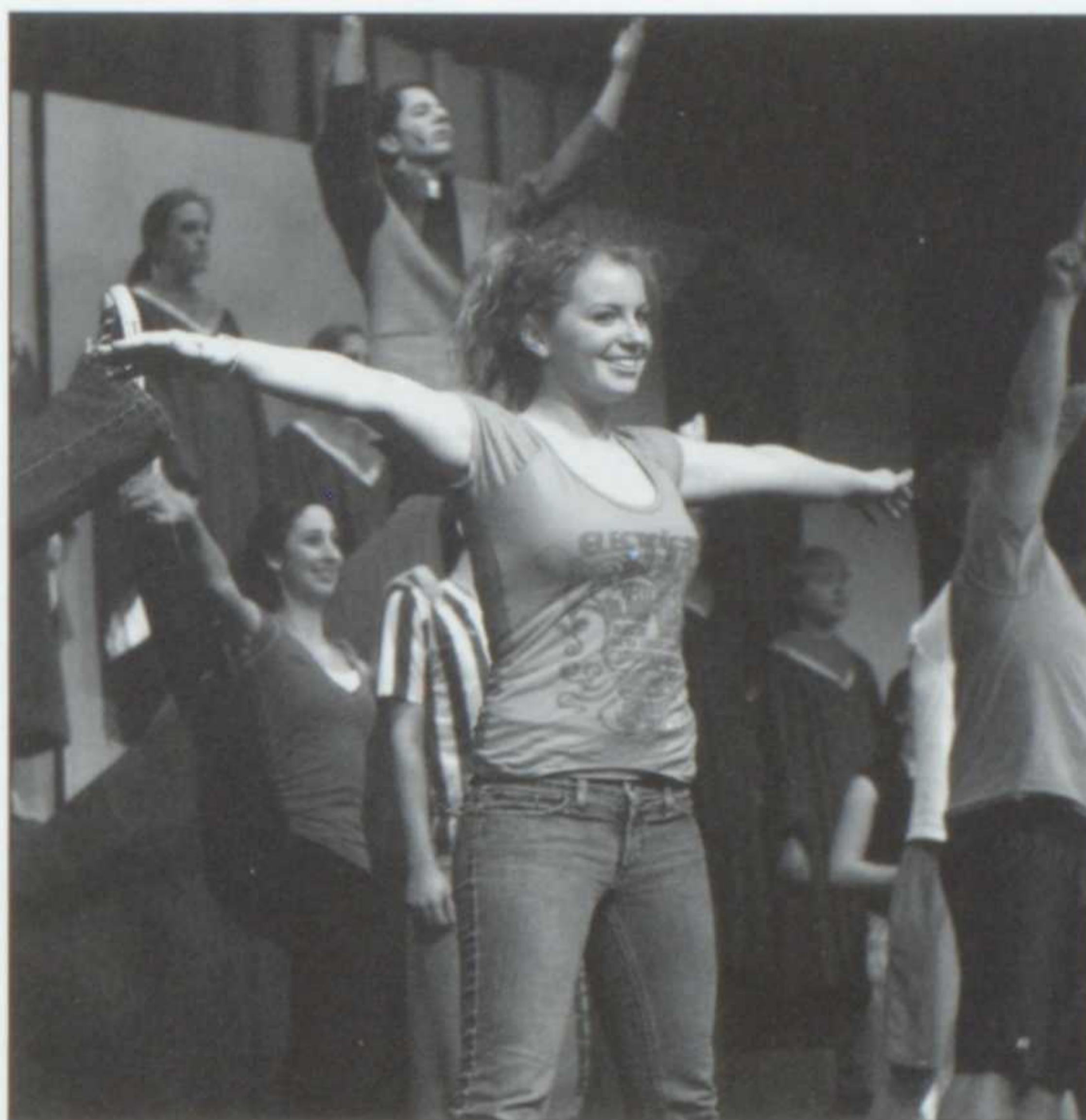

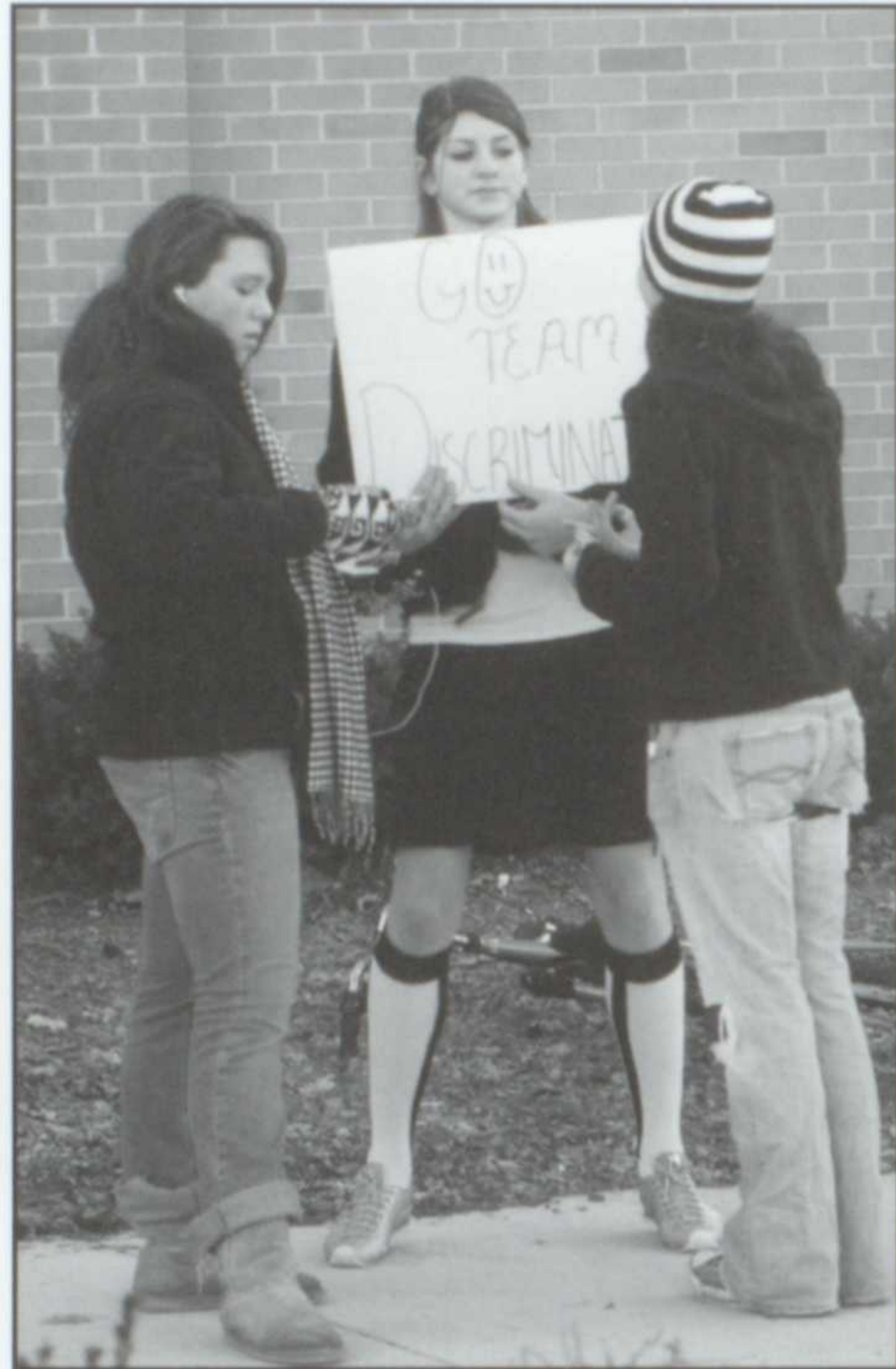

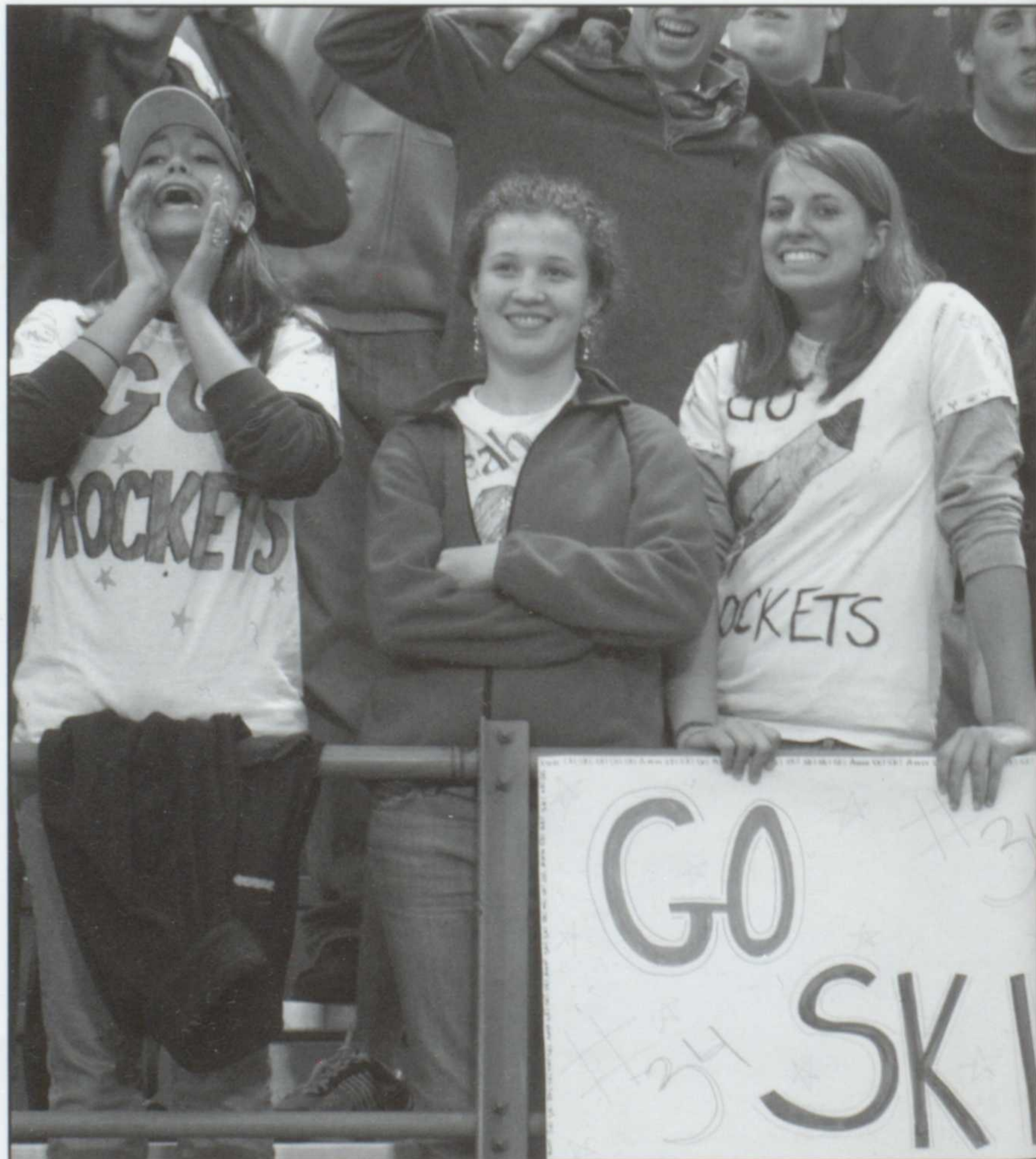

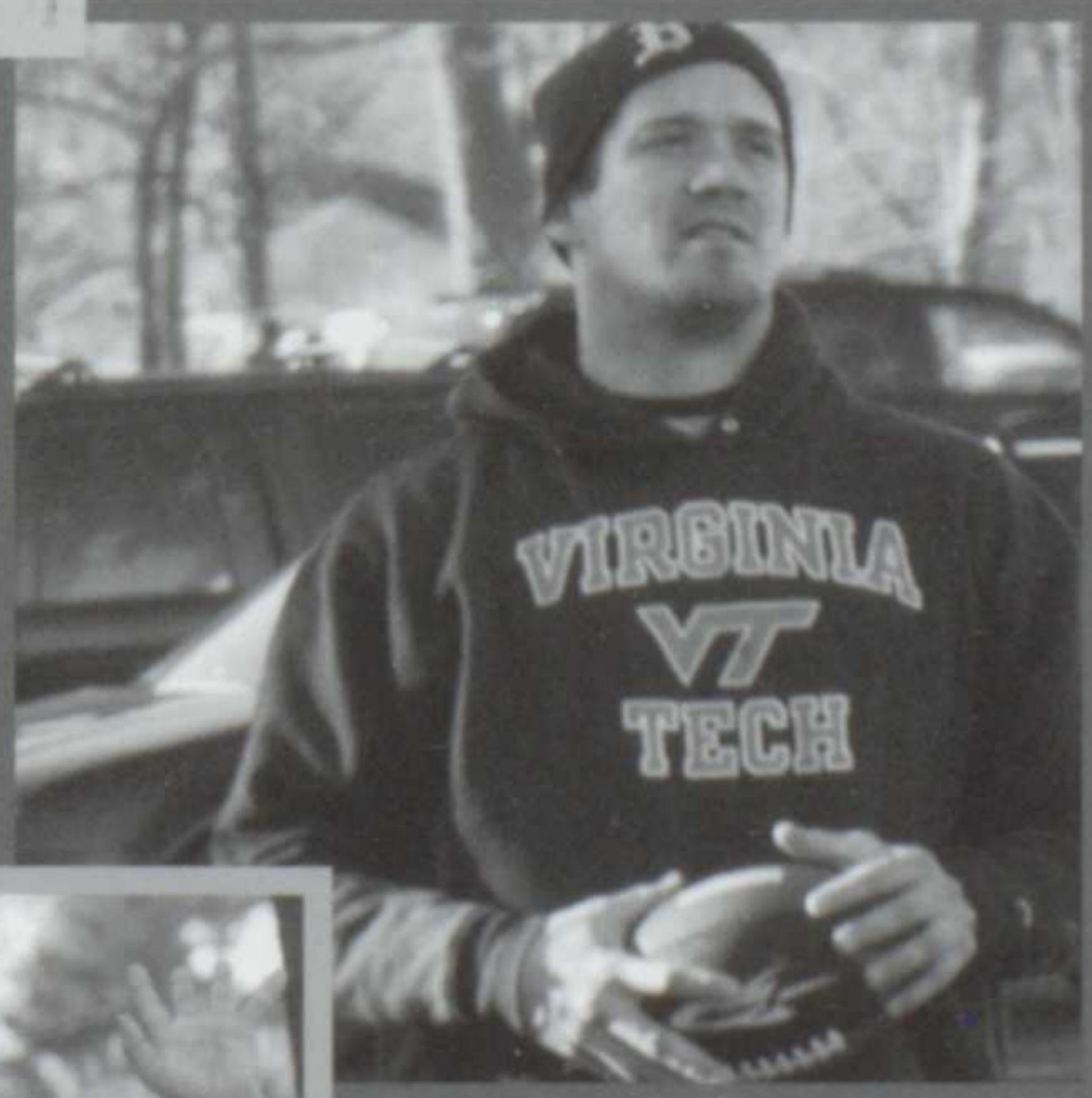
## TEAM SPIRIT!

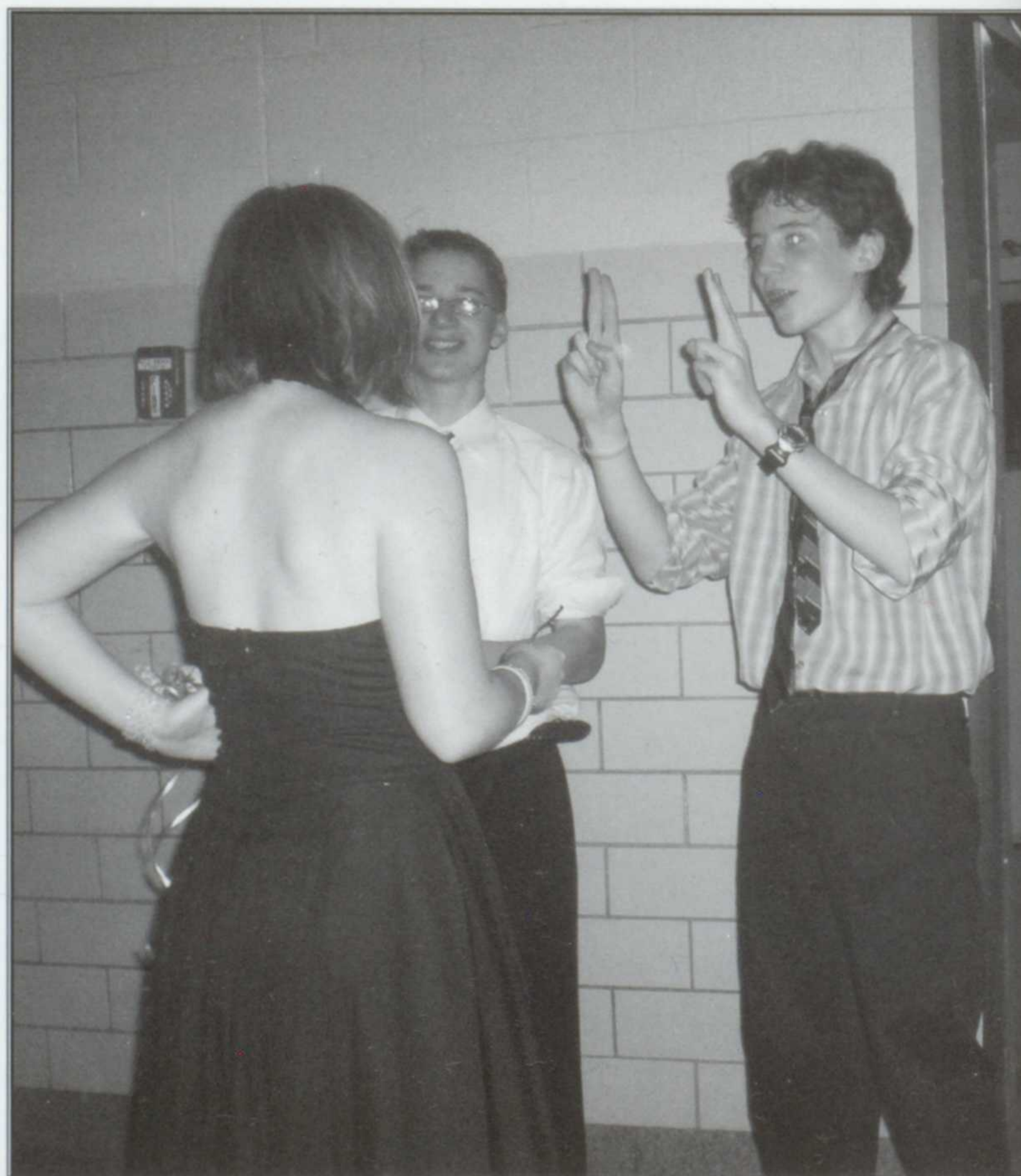

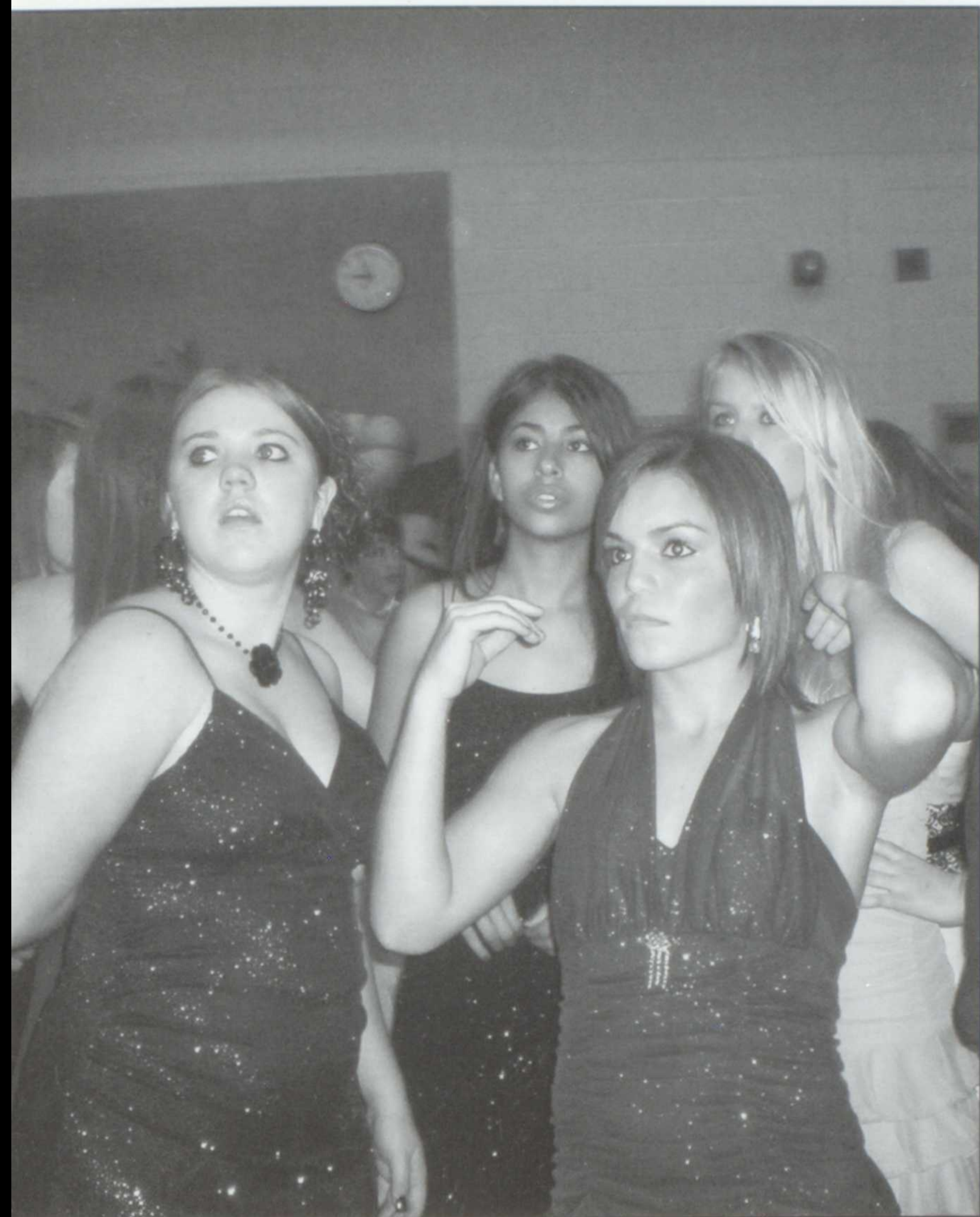

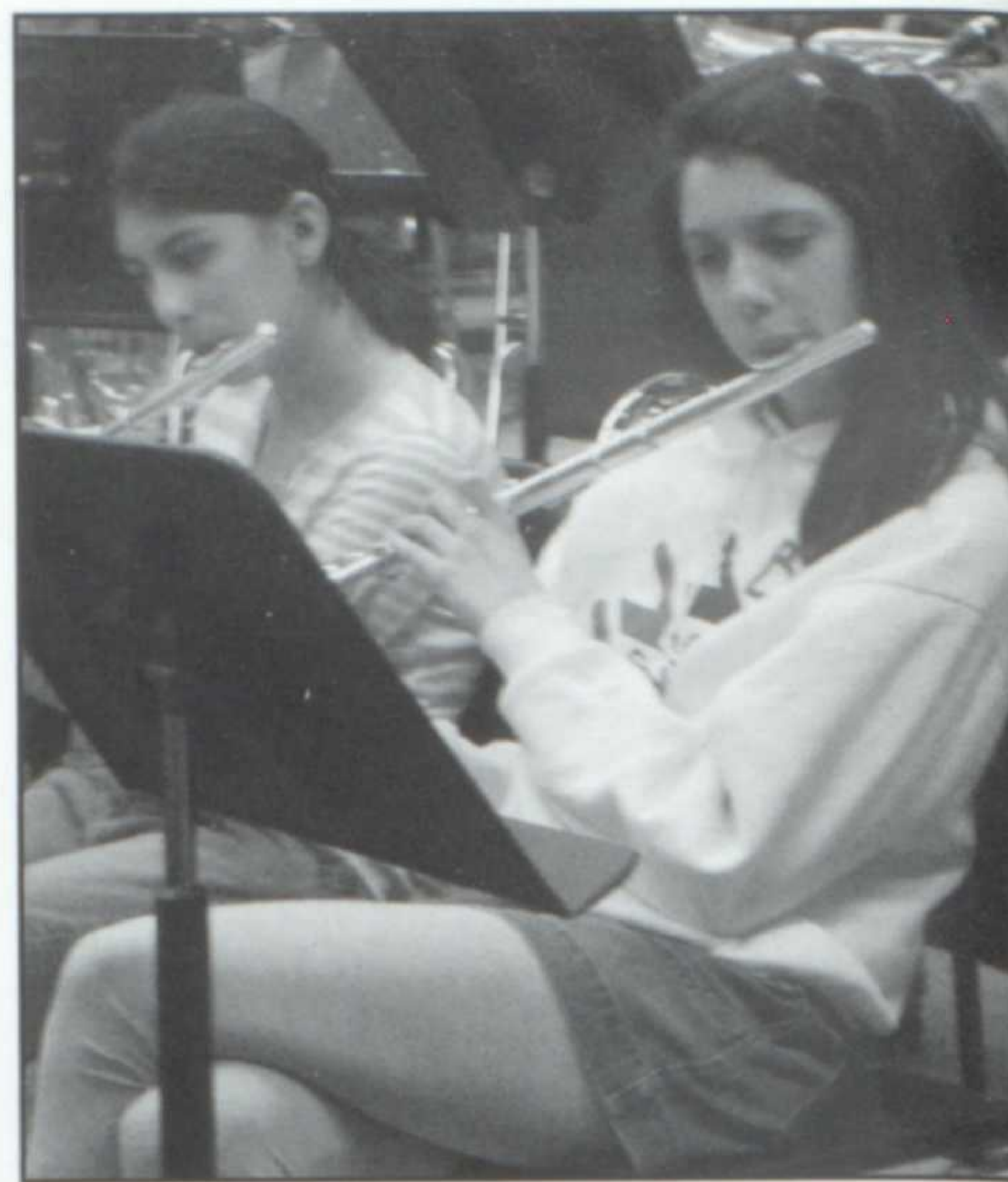

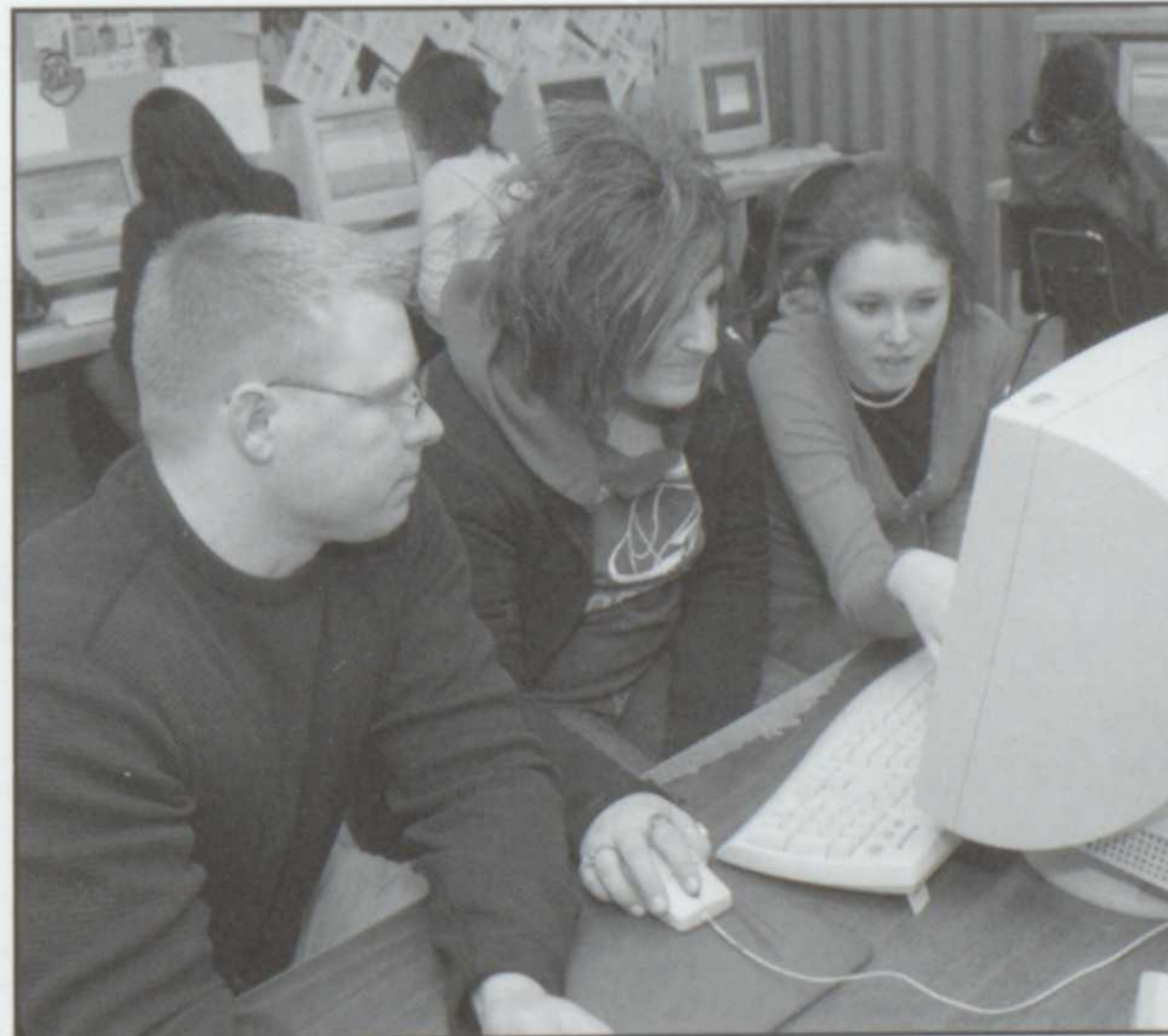

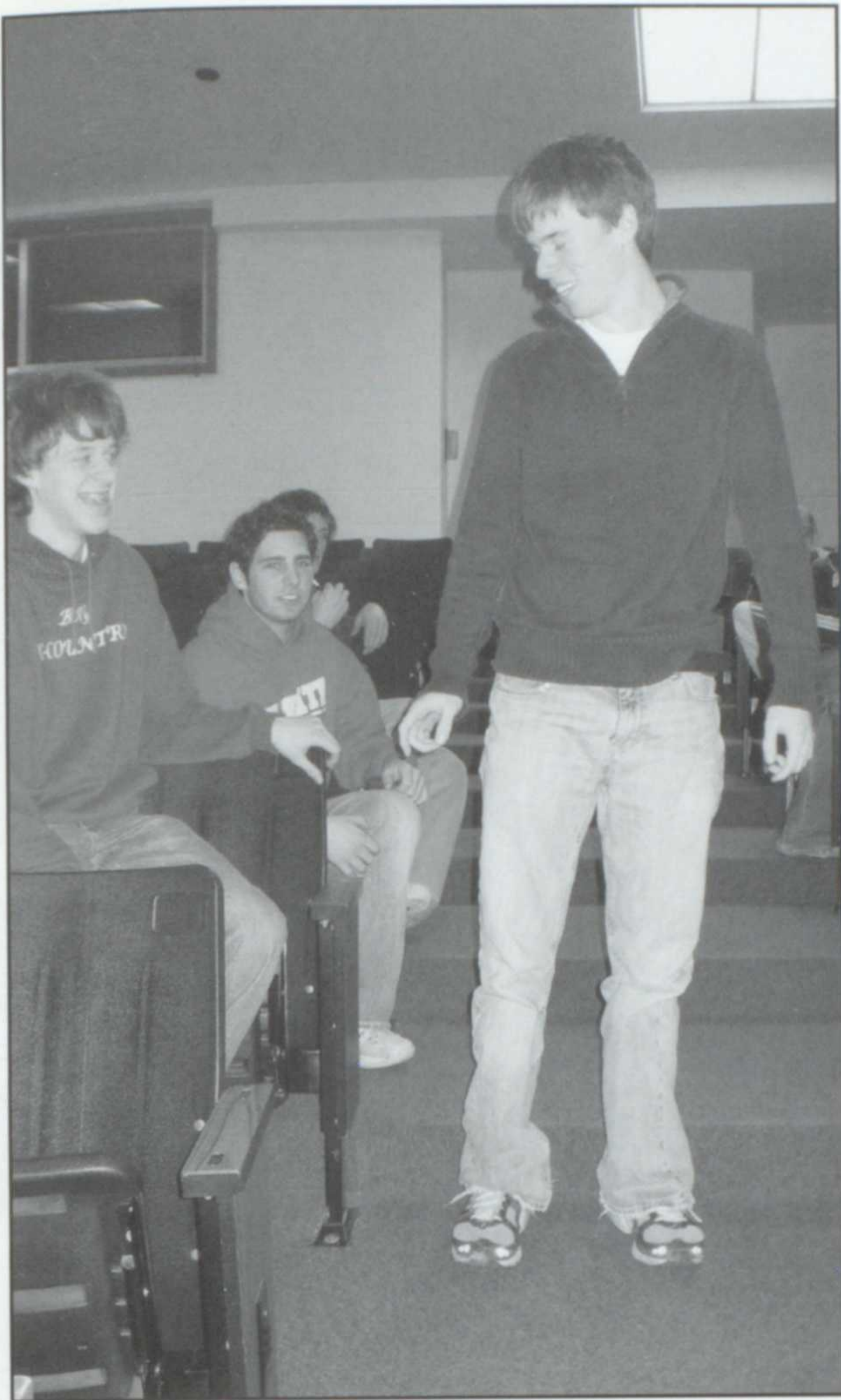

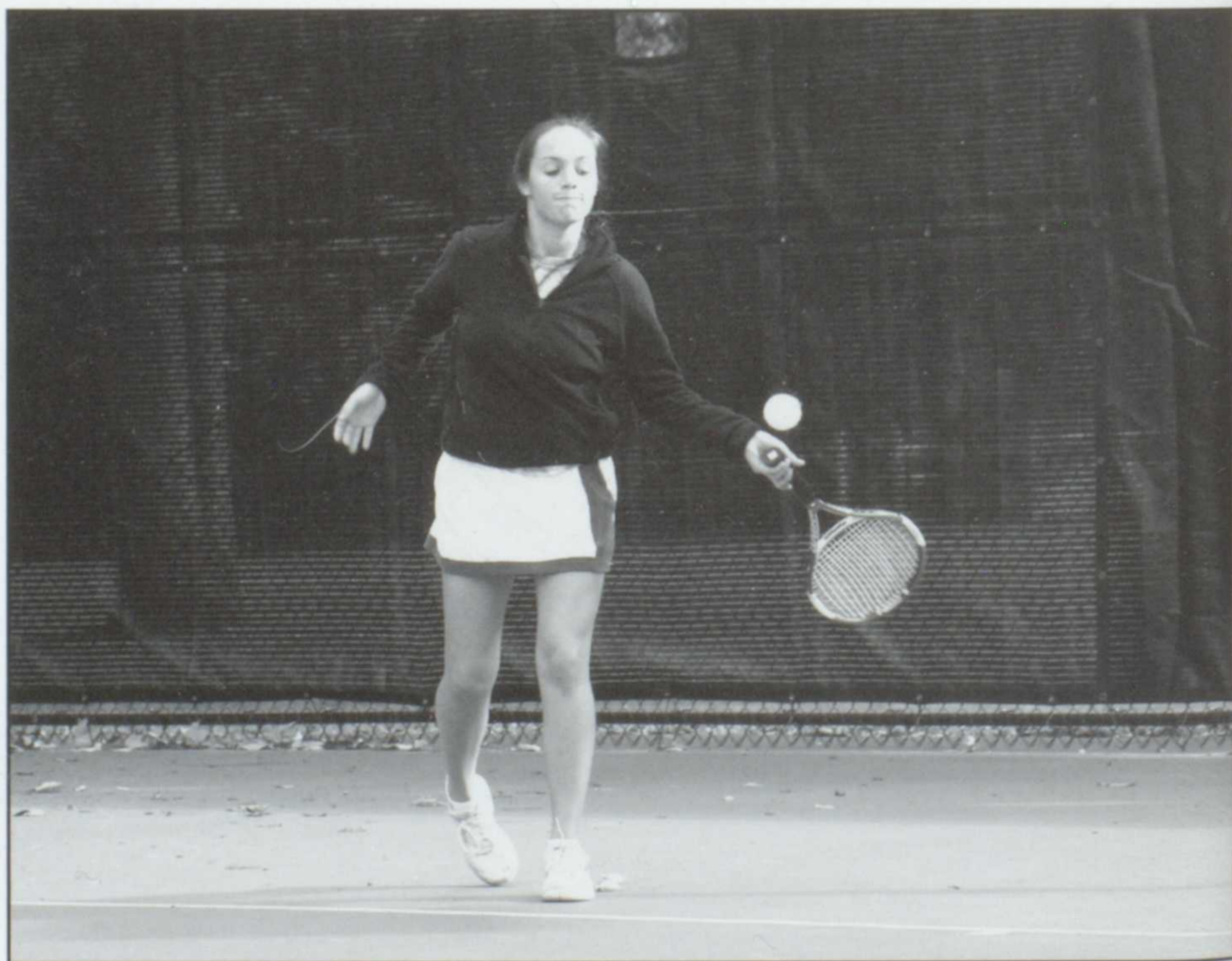

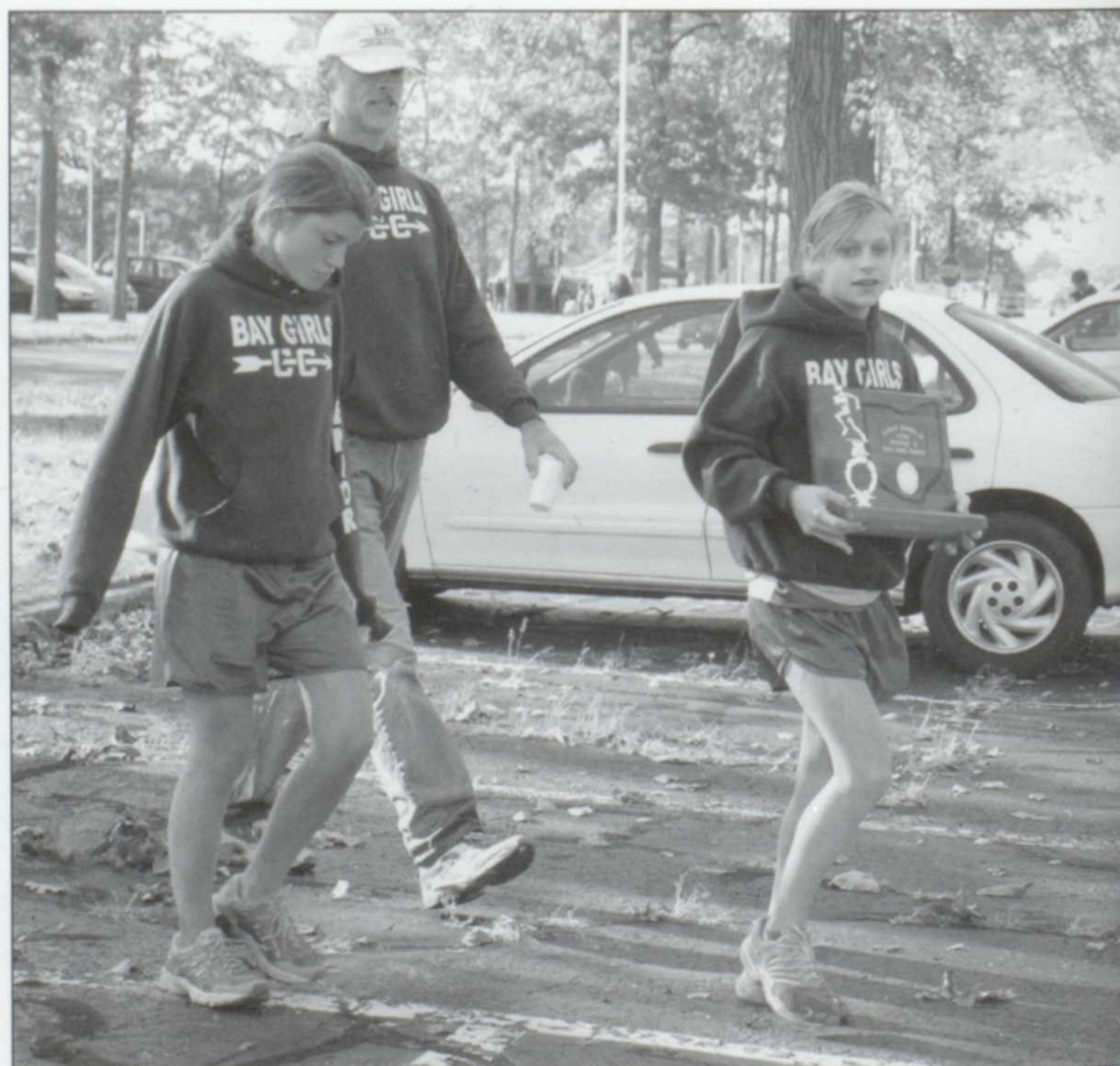

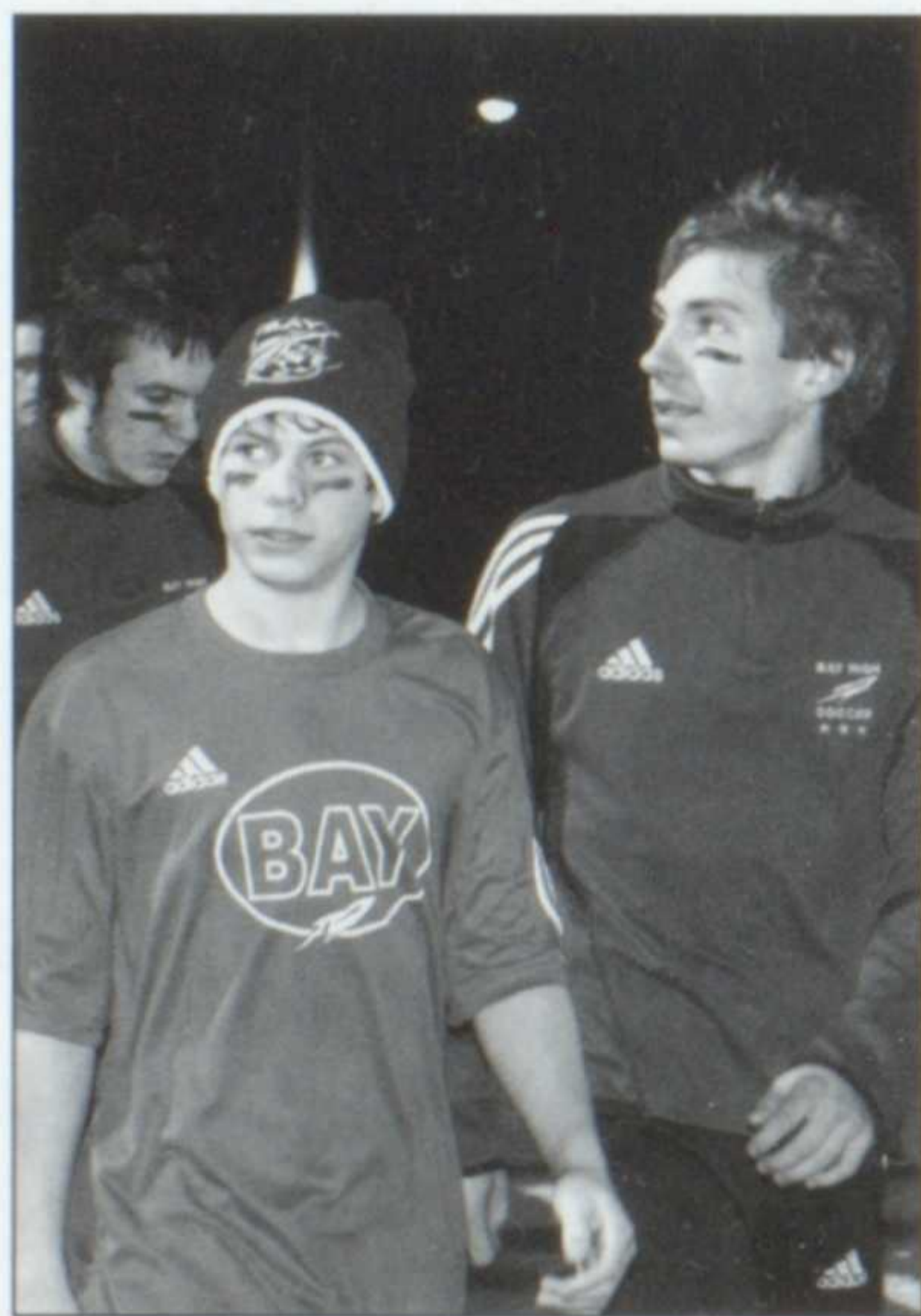

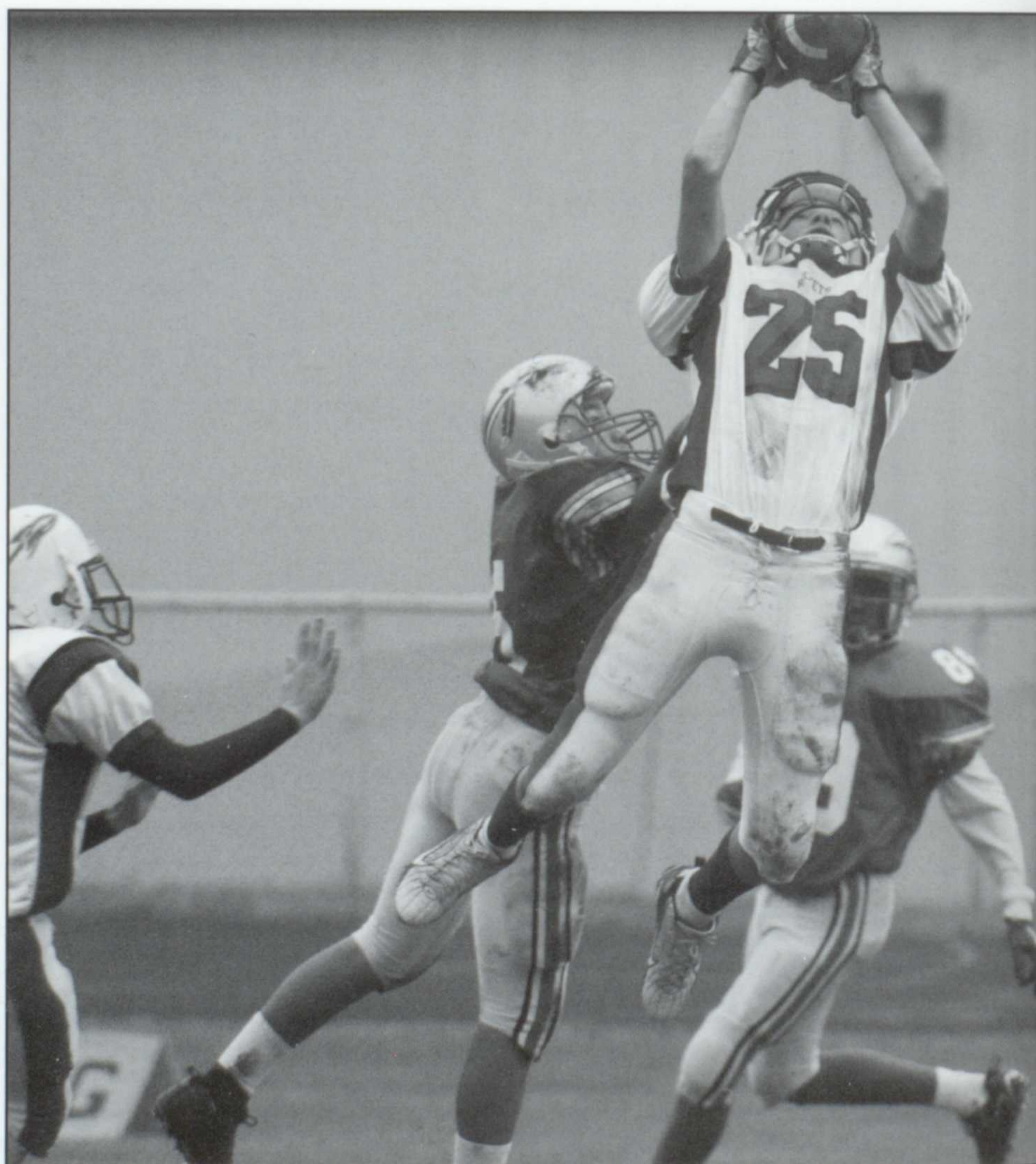

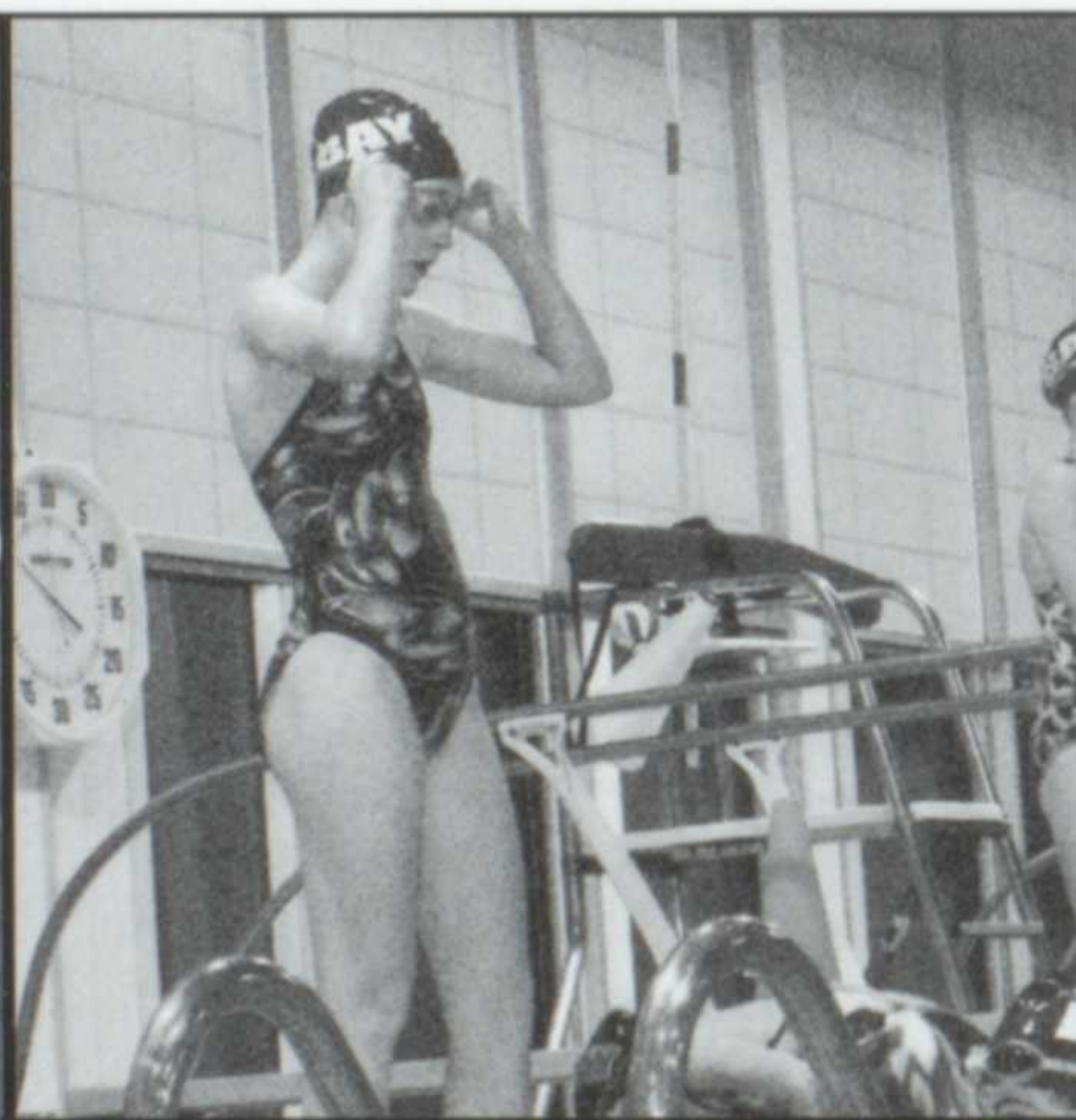
