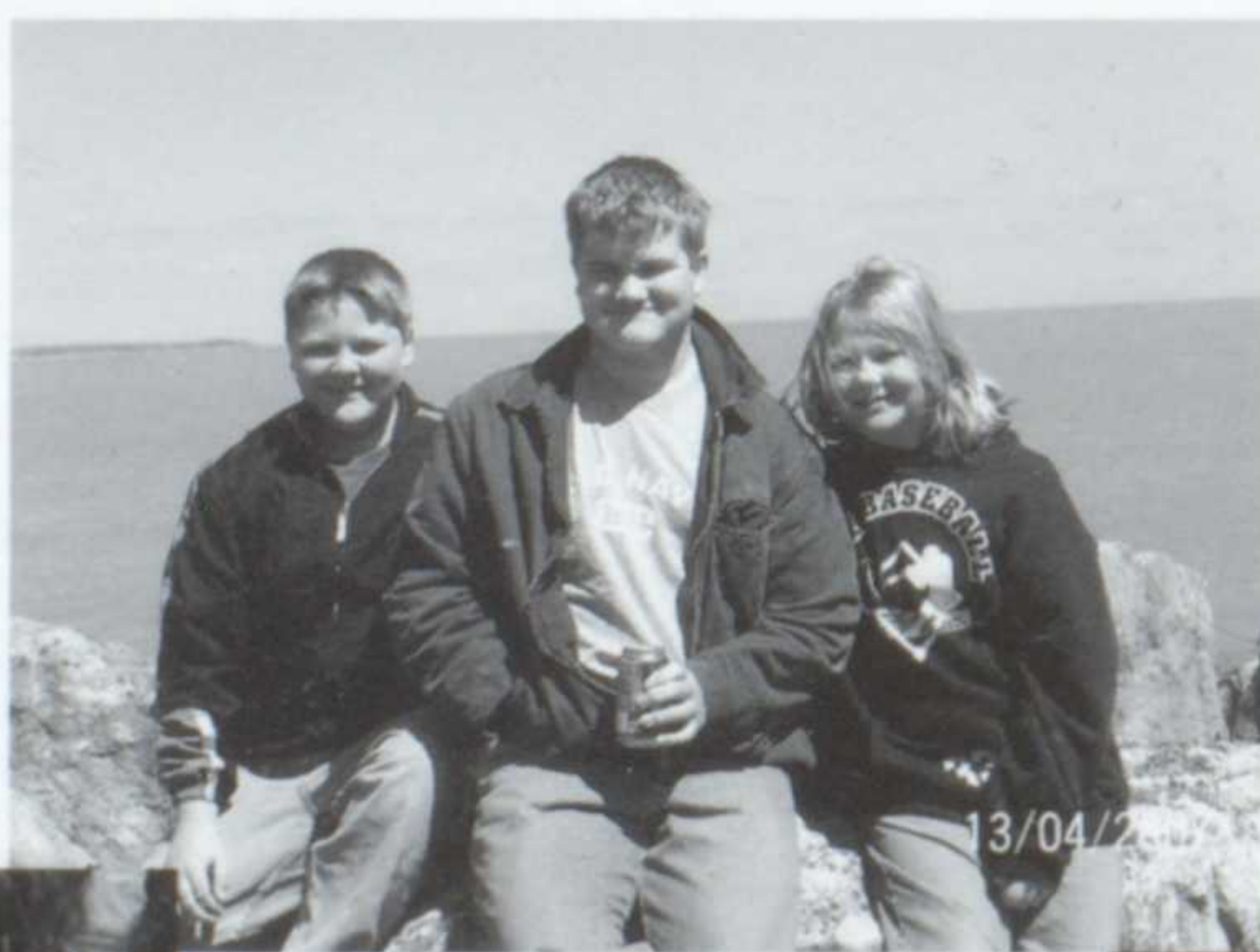
BRANDON HASKETT

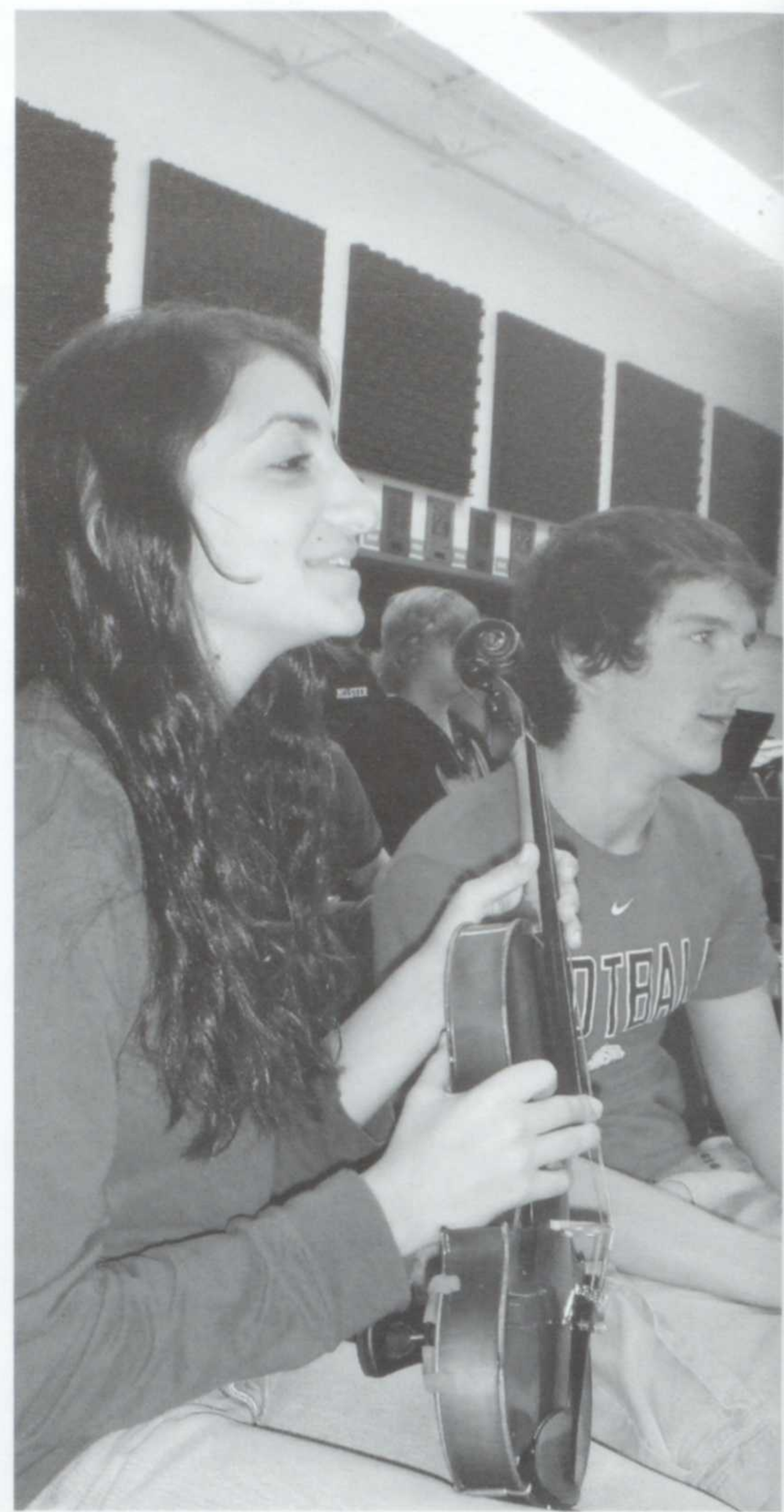

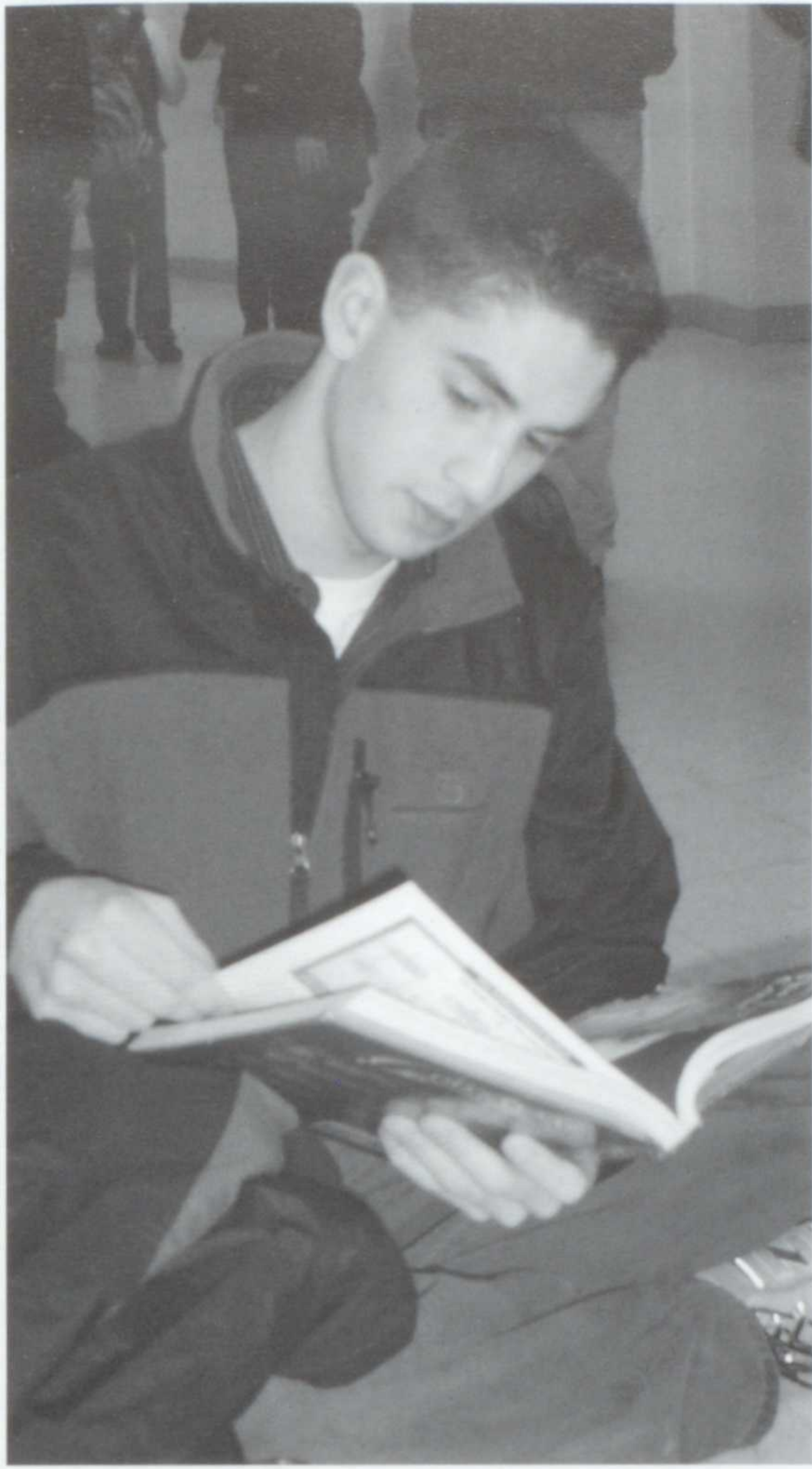
Maral Demirjian

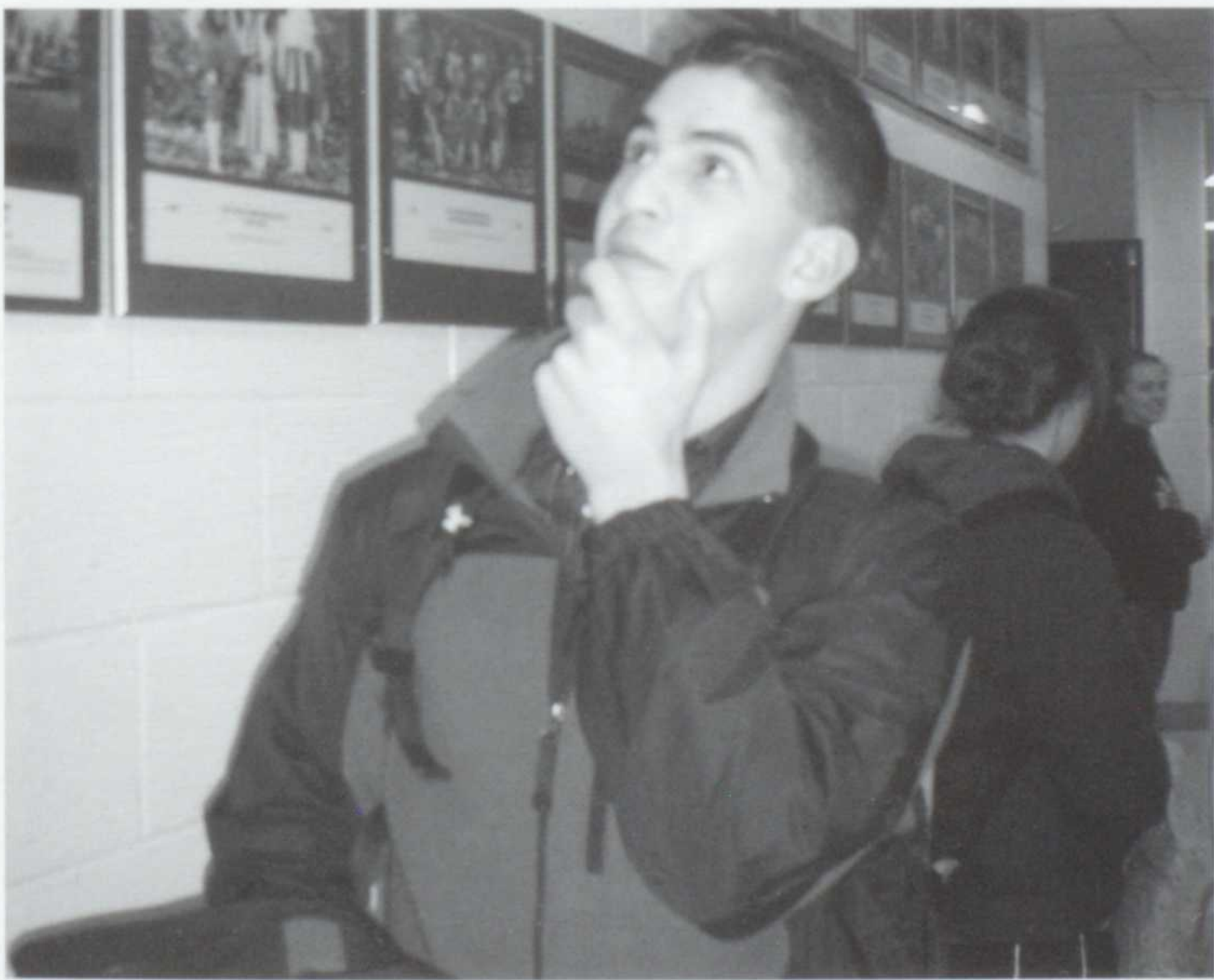

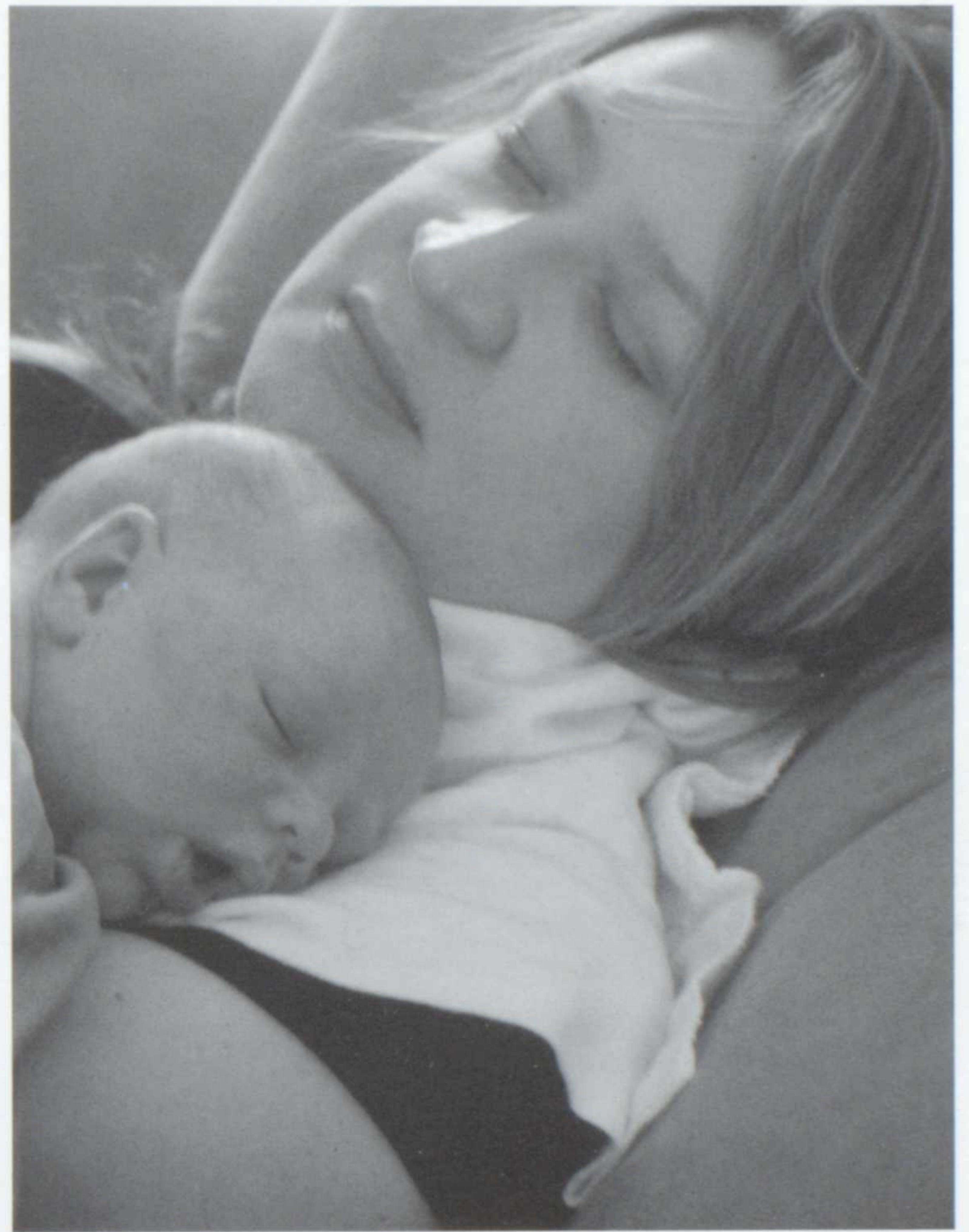

teacher by day, mommy by night

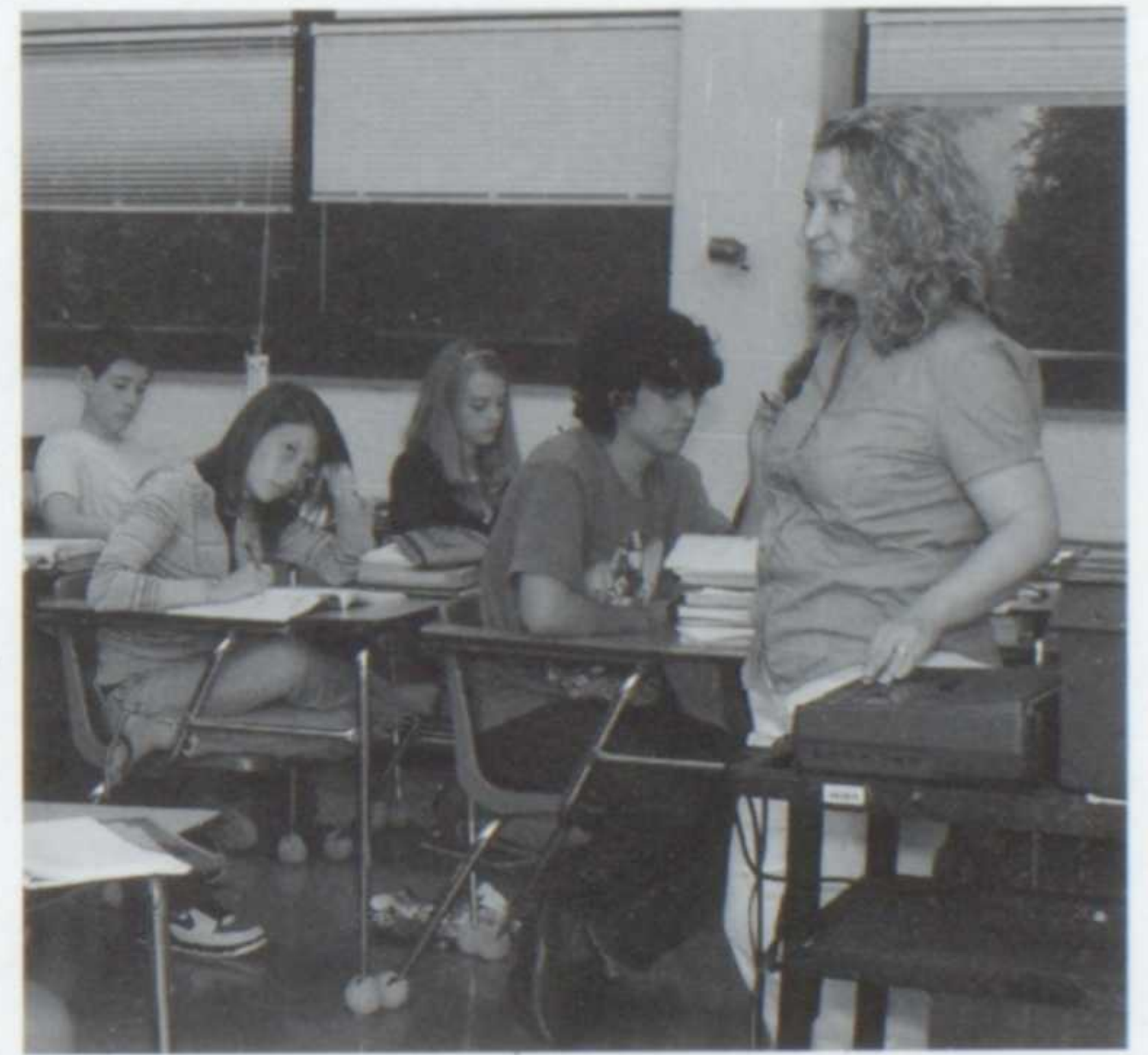

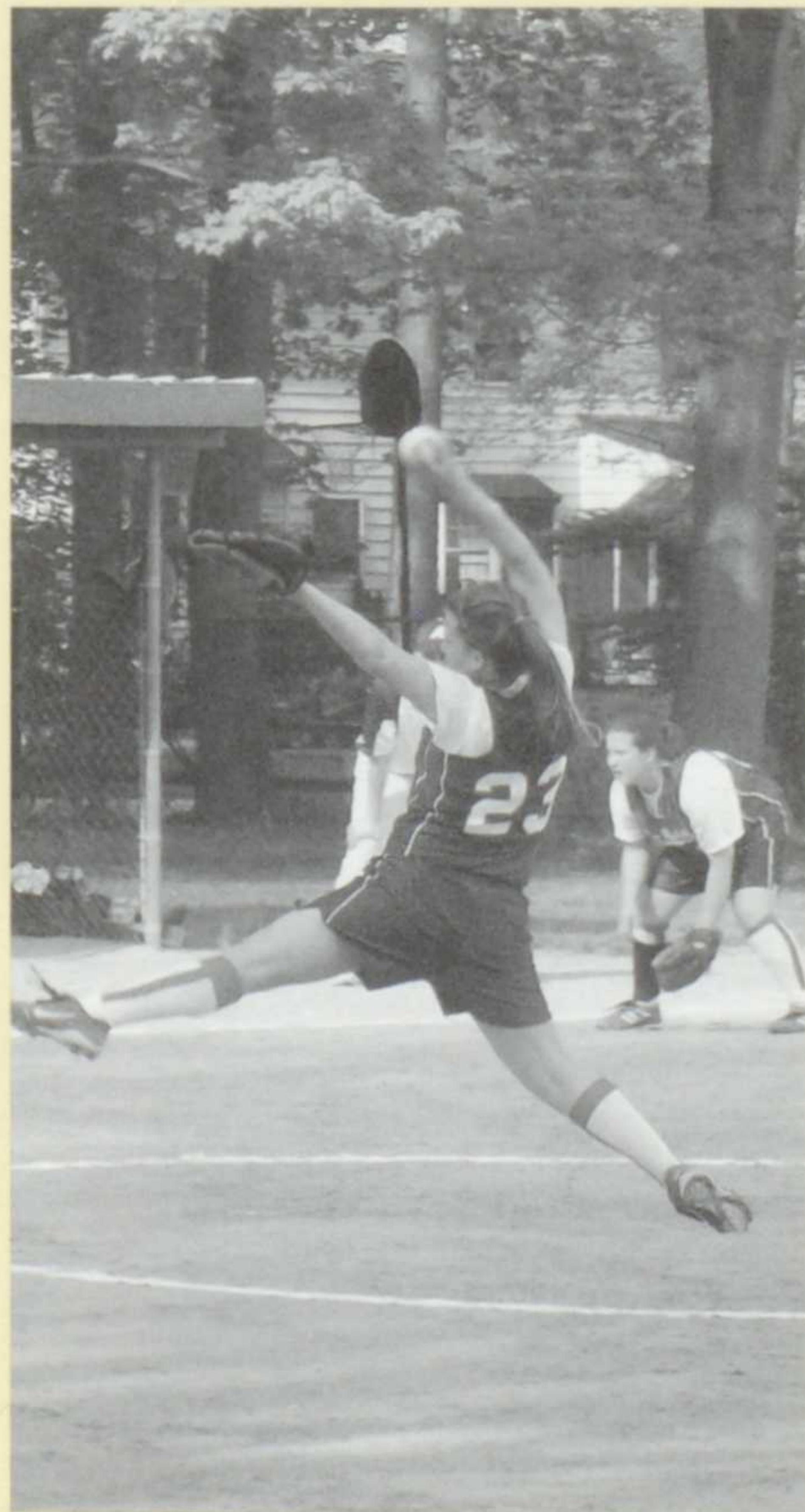

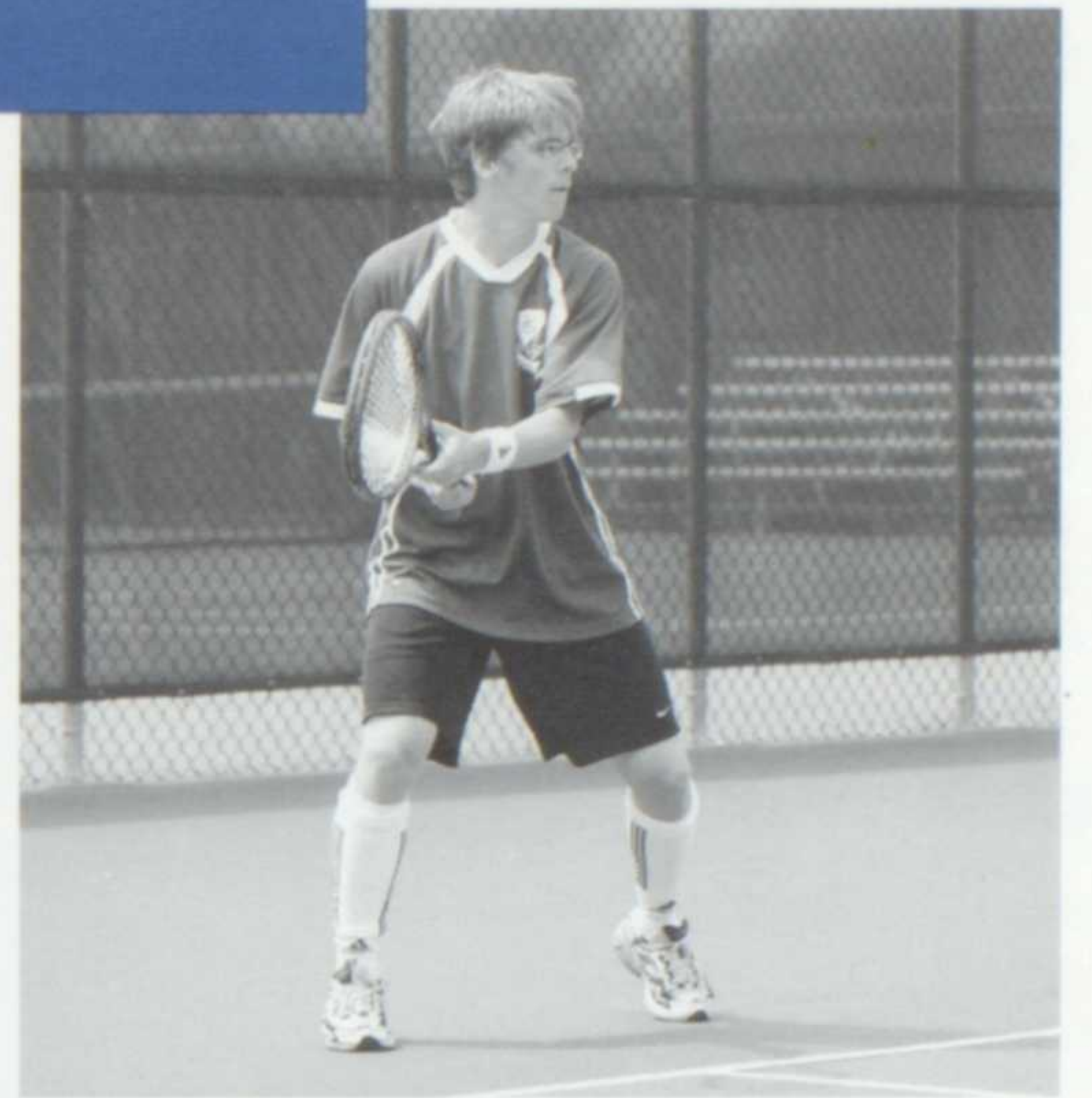

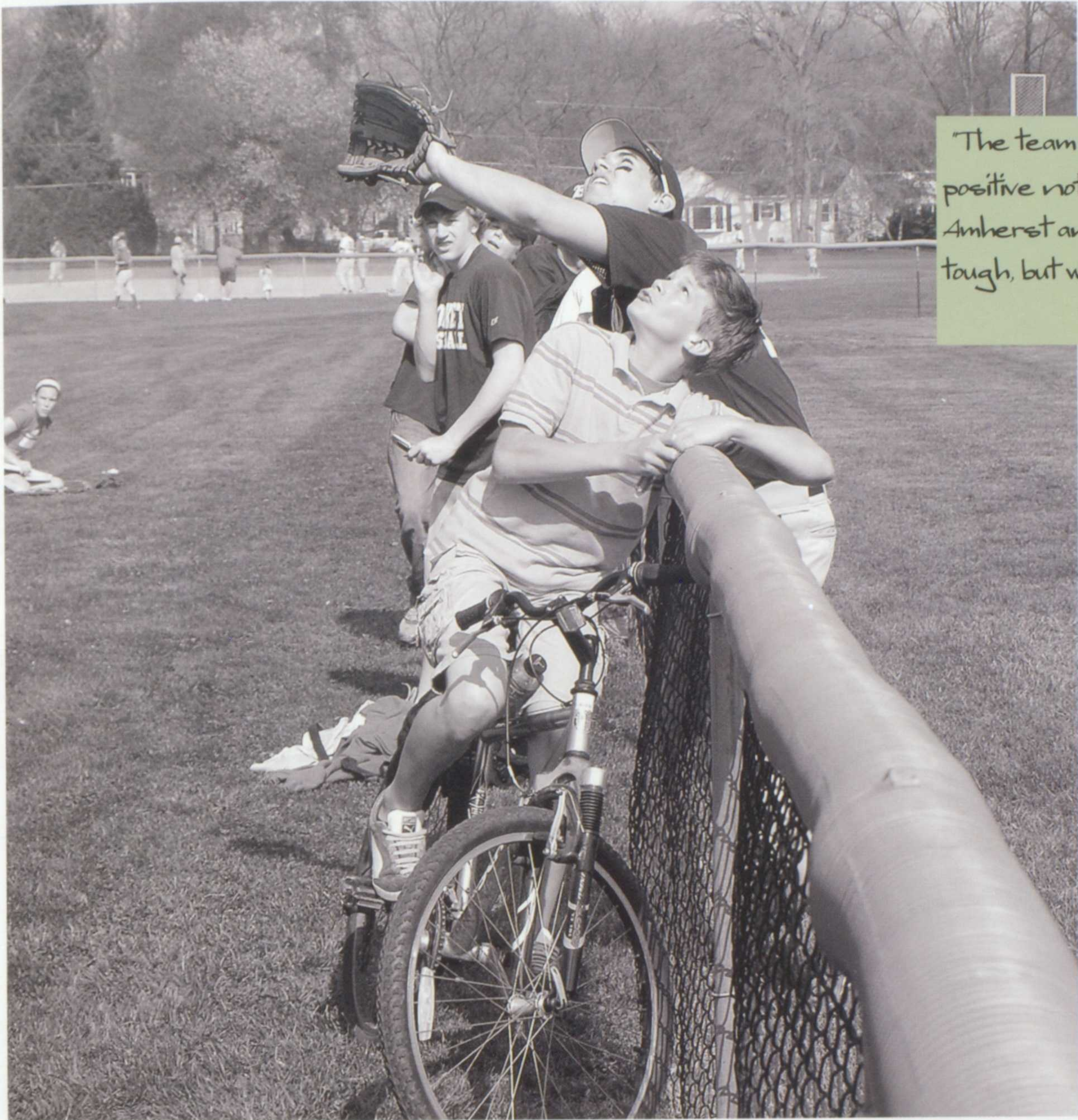

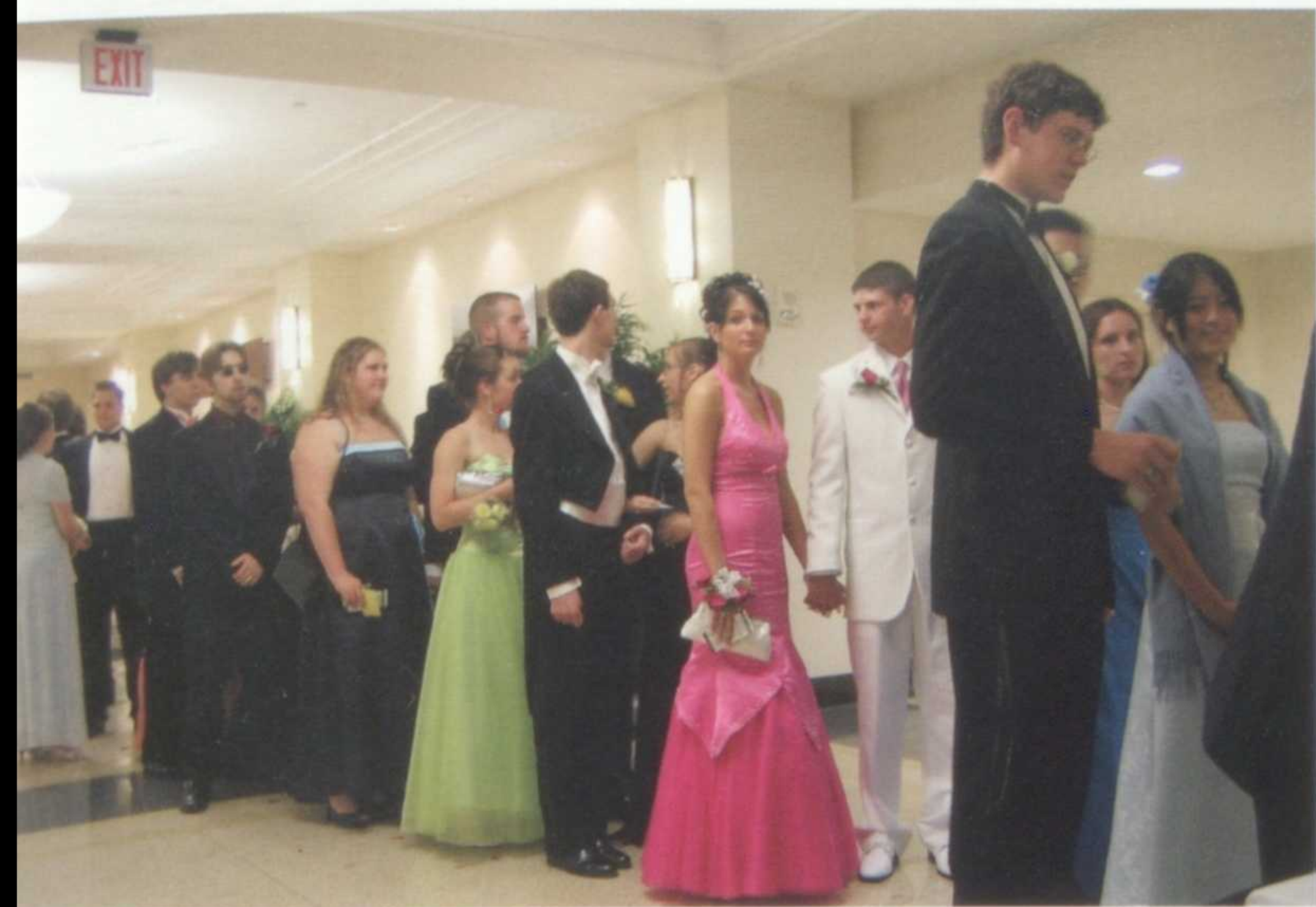

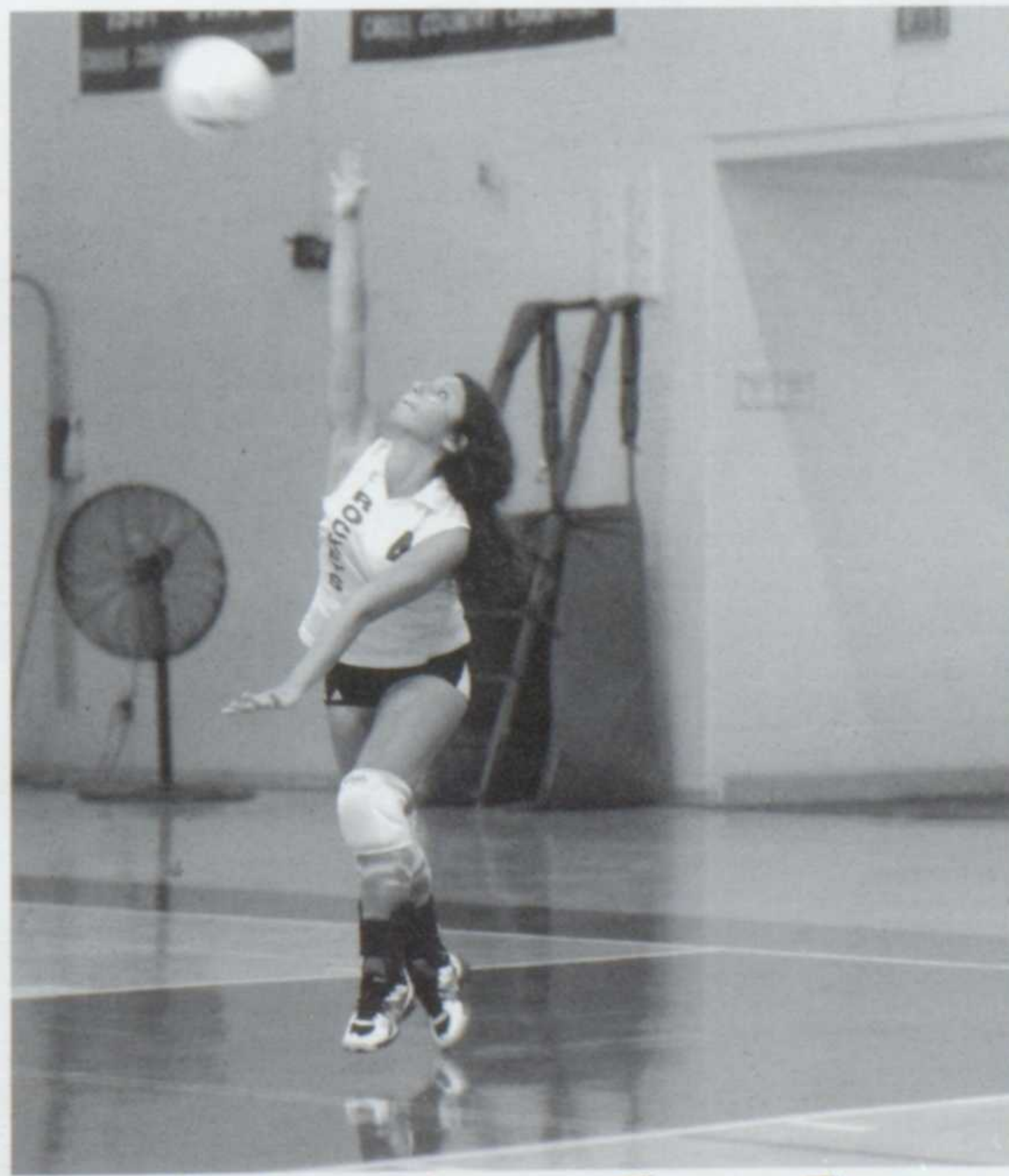

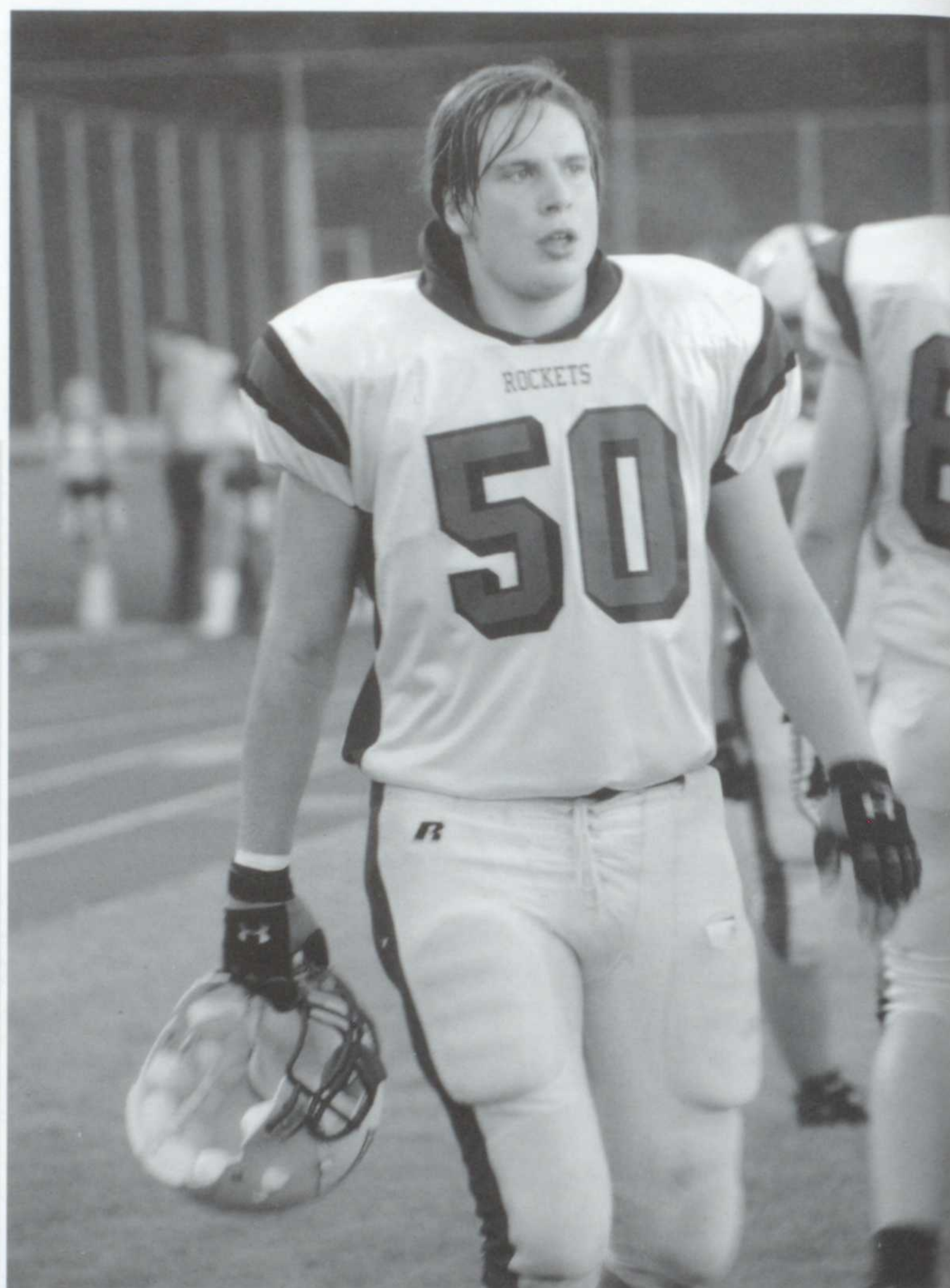

I went to the first MUN conference in November and represented the country of Slovakia in Human Rights Council. I decided to join MUN because I began to really enjoy politics and history this year. I researched the topics of the rights of indigenous people, the issue of the human rights violations and implications of the Israeli occupation of Palestine and other occupied Arab territories. I also researched the current situation in Darfur and persons deprived of liberty in the context of counter terrorism measures along with my partner Liz Bonham. The conference itself was very intimidating at first, because our moderators insisted on rigid rules, unlike most at Jefferson. The United Kingdom proposed that we discuss the situation in Darfur, but the Sudan obviously did not agree. The first night went horribly, because all the countries argued against the Sudan, whose government supported the situation in Darfur. Both Liz and I were pretty quiet, since Slovakia really doesn't have a stand on Darfur. We don't have any contact with the Sudan. Our government is still a semi-monarchy, even though we claim to be a parliamentary democracy. By the end of the night, we still hadn't begun to write on our working paper, let alone a policy statement. The moderators definitely thought our council was inefficient, and most of us did as well.

We got back to the hotel at ten, but I doubt anyone slept until after midnight. I roomed with Molly Kasperek, Allie Puntel, and Sarah Lippertman. We ordered pizza, and some kids went down to the little store next to the truck stop. Most of us pretended to prepare for the next day, but we read and watched TV instead.

Surprisingly, the second day went extremely well. I proposed a topic, and the boy representing Belgium, who looked exactly like Barack Obama, lead the working paper. Our council finished two other working papers and got them approved as well. The United Kingdom continued to be a nuisance, opposing almost everything, along with China. If everyone but China and the United Kingdom voted for an action, both of them would oppose. It became a very long second day and I still wonder if we could have finished a fourth working paper.

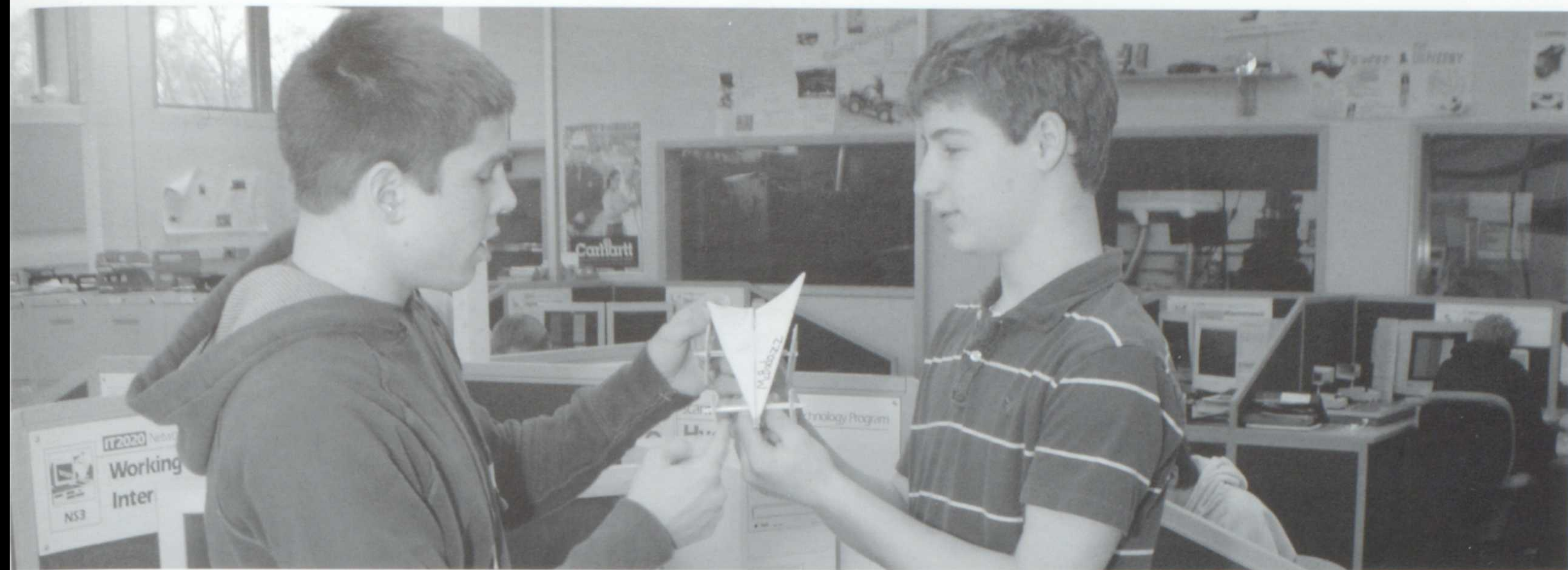

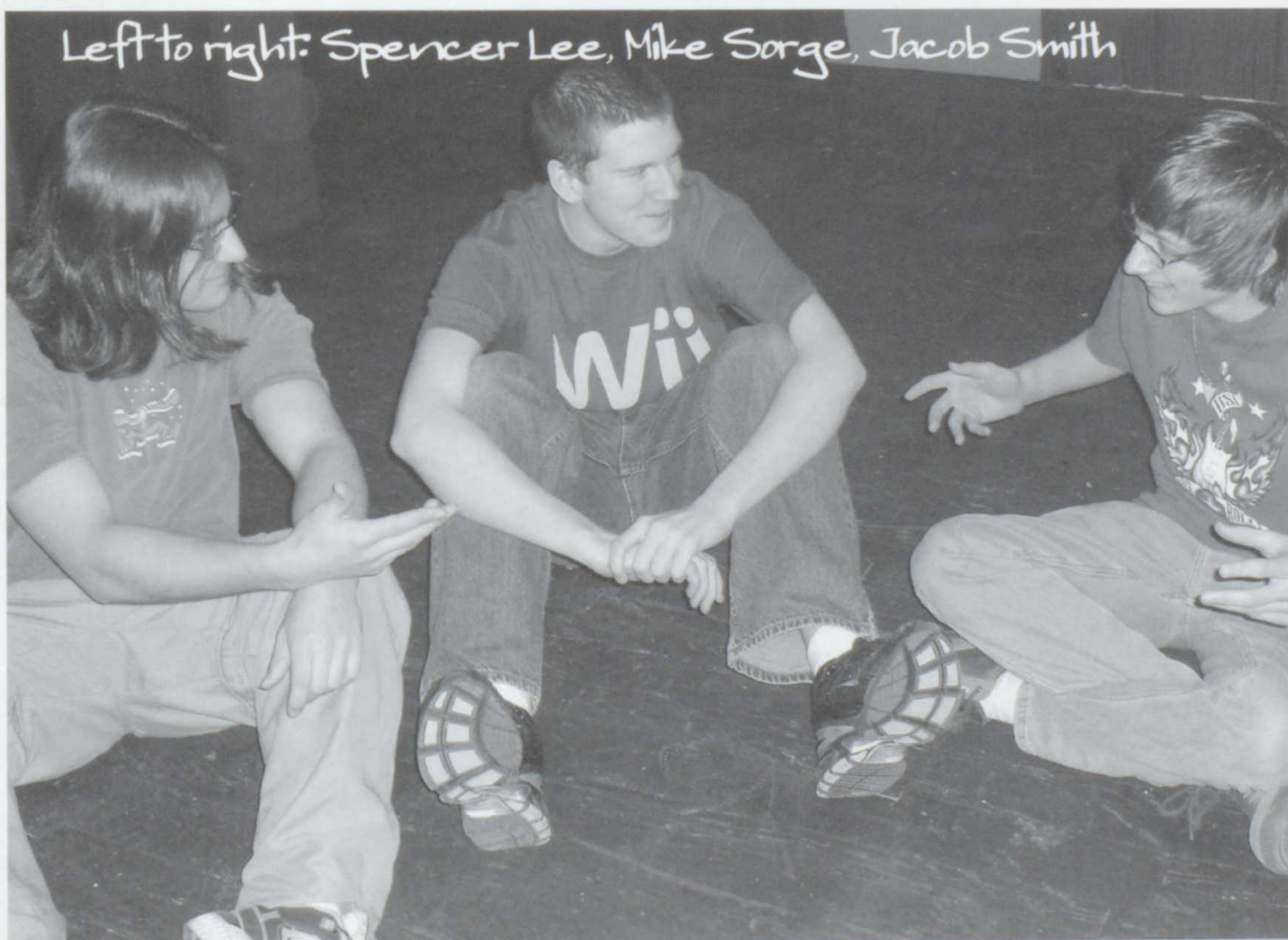

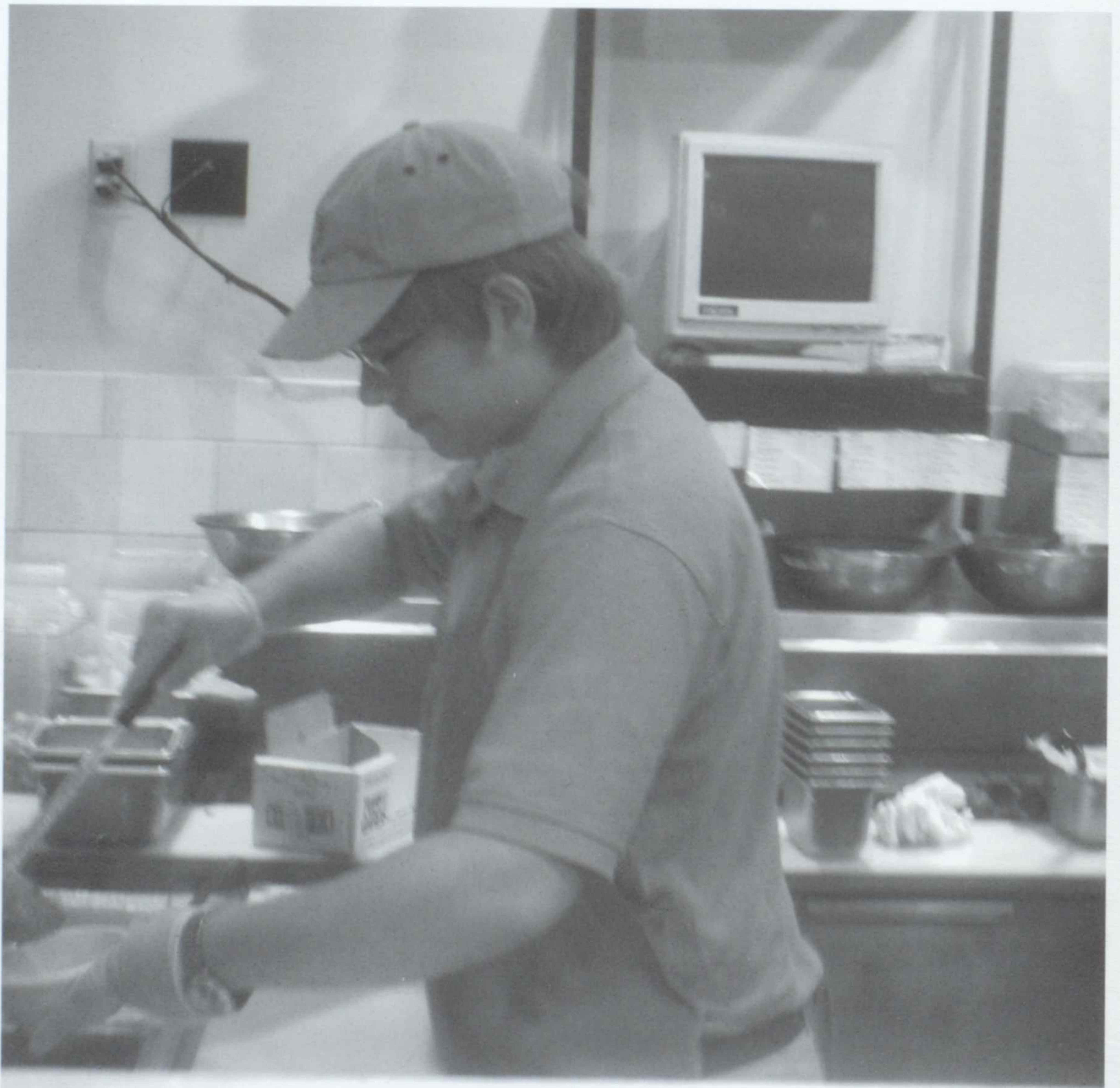

Upon the death of a student or faculty member, the yearbook will acknowledge the death by running a gray bar over the name and printing the years of birth and death with a formal portrait with request of family.

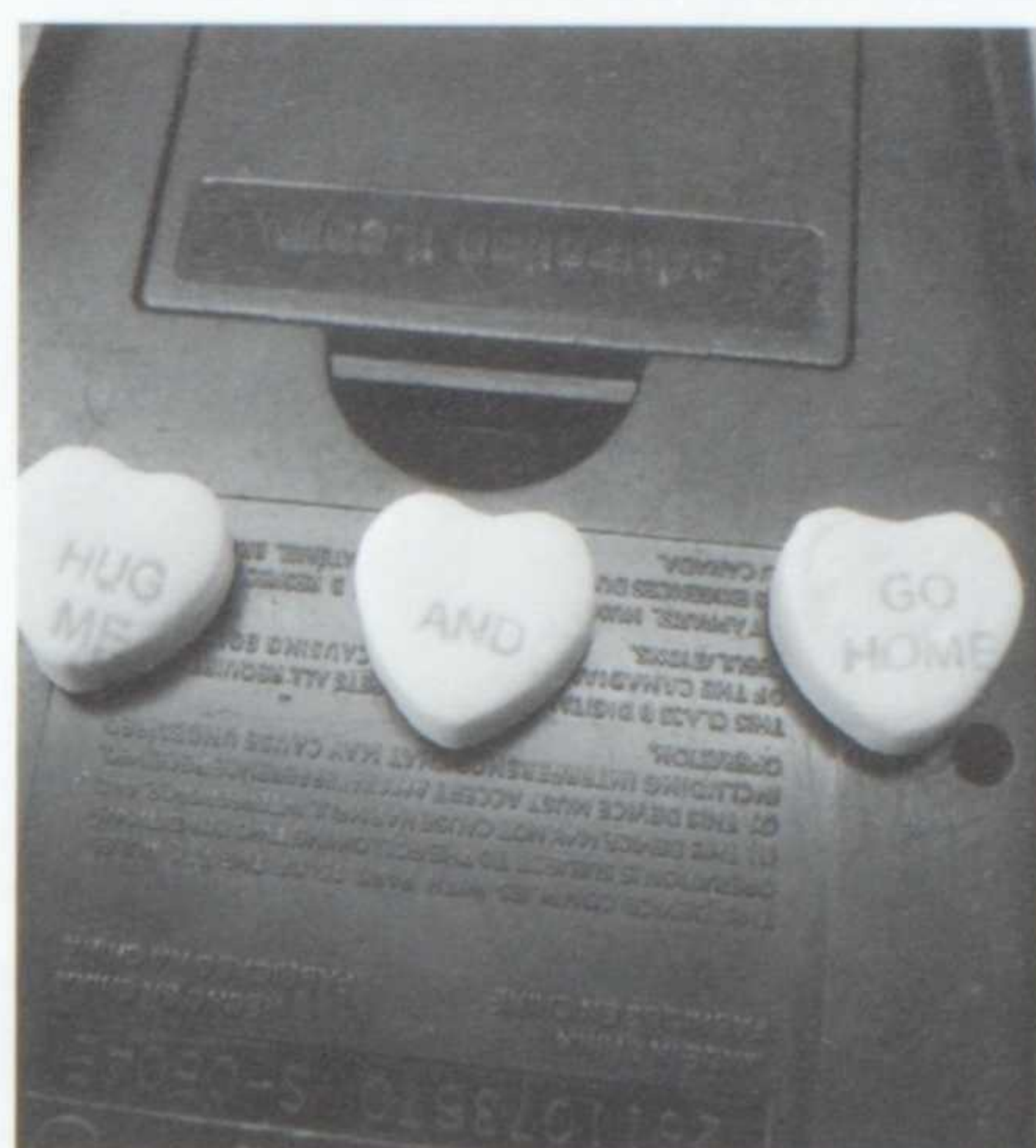

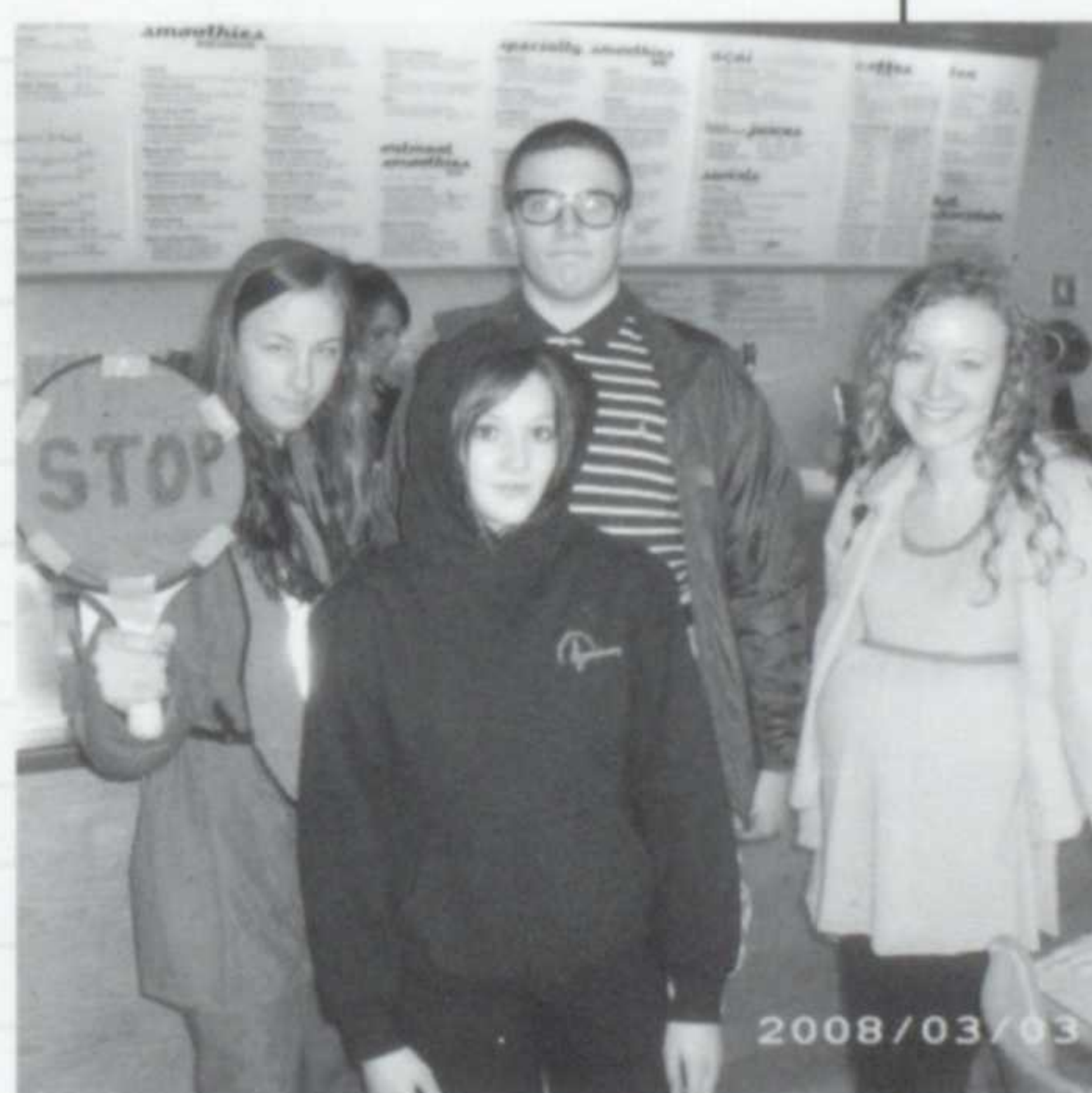


it aLL adds up
