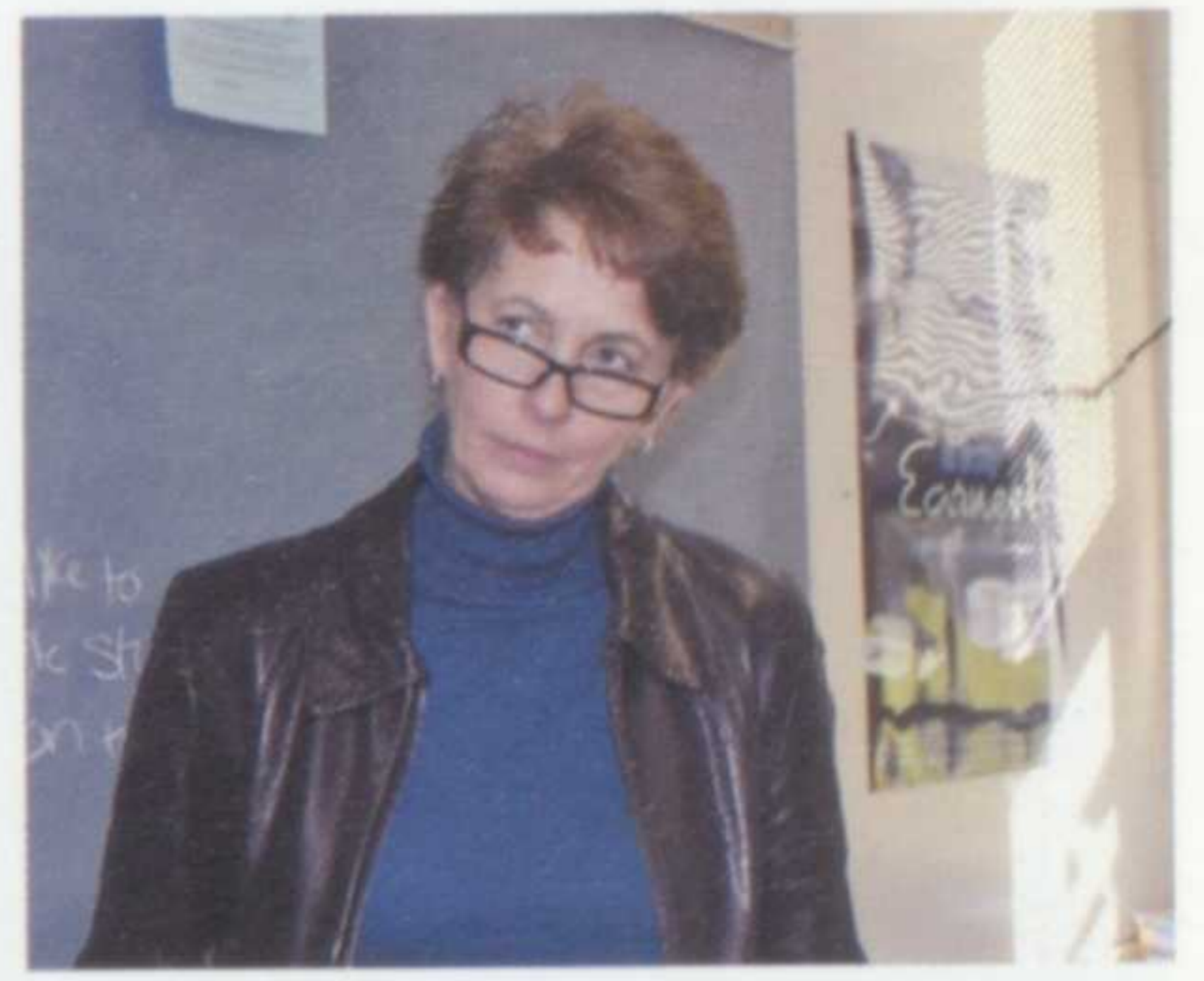




NHS

National Honors Society is a respected organization throughout the country and a great opportunity for many students at Bay High. The club includes the best and the brightest, recruiting students with a 3.6 GPA or higher. Applicants ask teachers to fill out recommendations, and a committee, led by Mrs. Knight, picks the most fitting candidates. Students are encouraged to show off their talents in every aspect, as the application states, "Do not be modest!" For the 2012-2013 school year, 55 students were admitted to the club, only 6 of them being seniors. On the evening of November 5, these 55 students were welcomed into the club at an induction ceremony led by President Campbell Slatton, Vice-President Meghan Olson, Secretary Margaret Francati, and Treasurer Katelyn Ramella. Inductees recited the pledge and were enlightened on the principles of NHS: character, scholarship, leadership, and service. These students, and those already a part of the club, will participate in service activities throughout the year, such as babysitting for the PTA and tutoring football players, an idea introduced by Mr. Gorius. Everyone is also offered the opportunity to act as a tutor to younger students in any subject they desire. SADD is an organization designed to discourage poor choices. The hope is that friendships will blossom and grow, lasting for a lifetime. Mr. Manderine took over four years ago and the program has grown dramatically. Eleven of Mr. Manderine's students are paired with forty PALS who participate in events such as dances, ice-cream socials, and movies. One of the bigger events is the Halloween Dance, which took place on Oct. 26th—just before the major storm—at Bay High. It was an exclusively Bay event, where kids dressed and danced all evening.

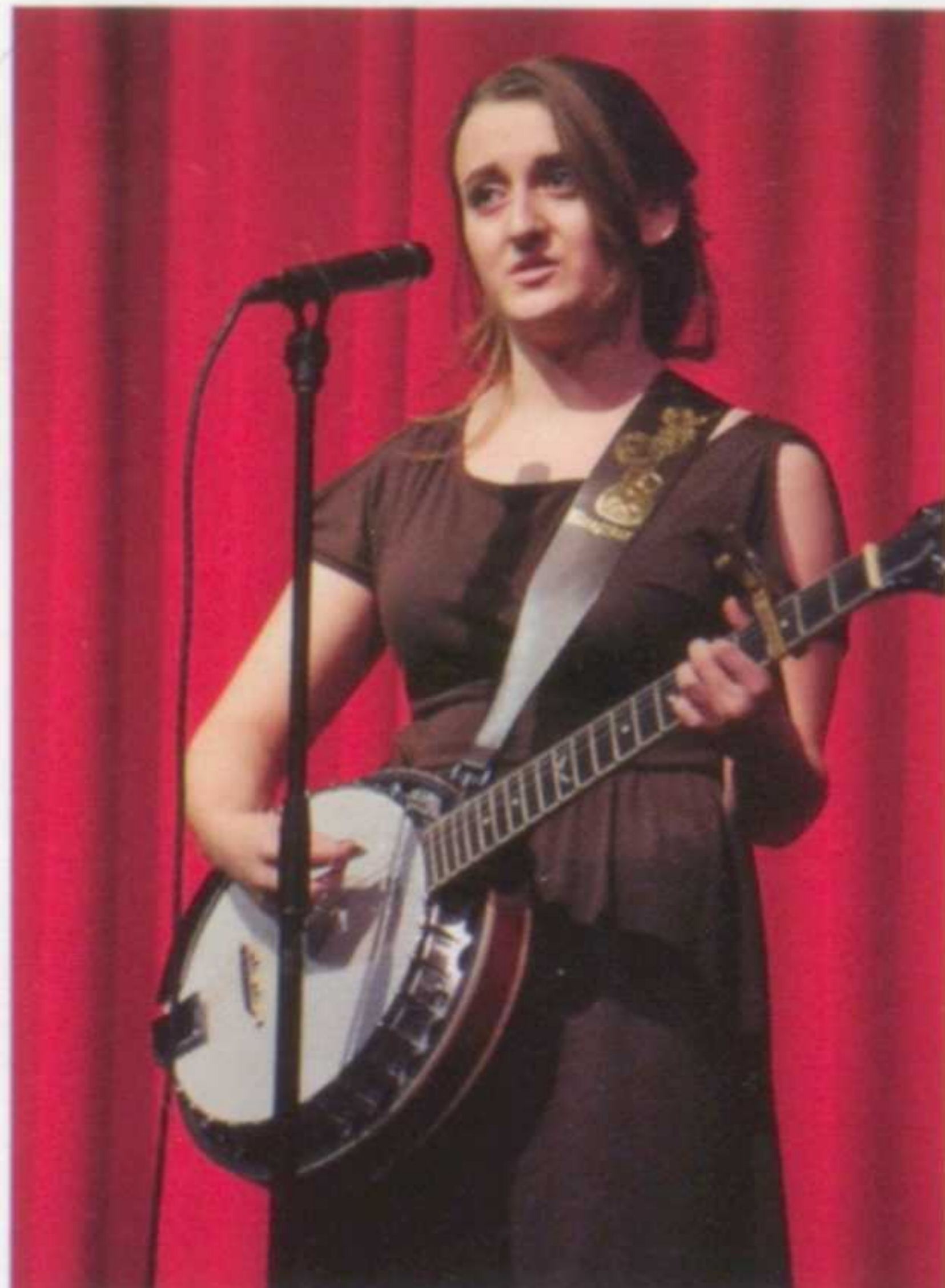

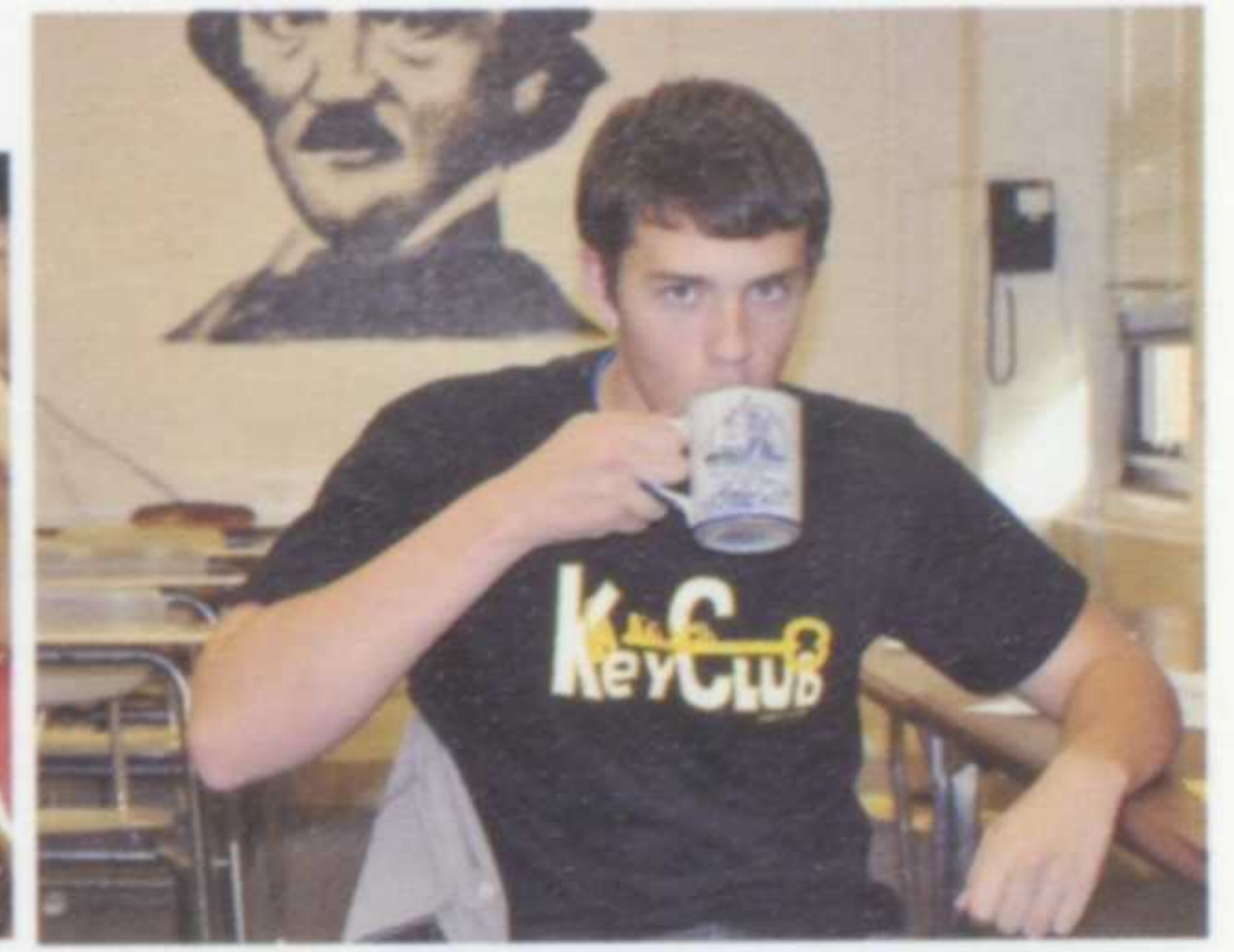




Talent Show

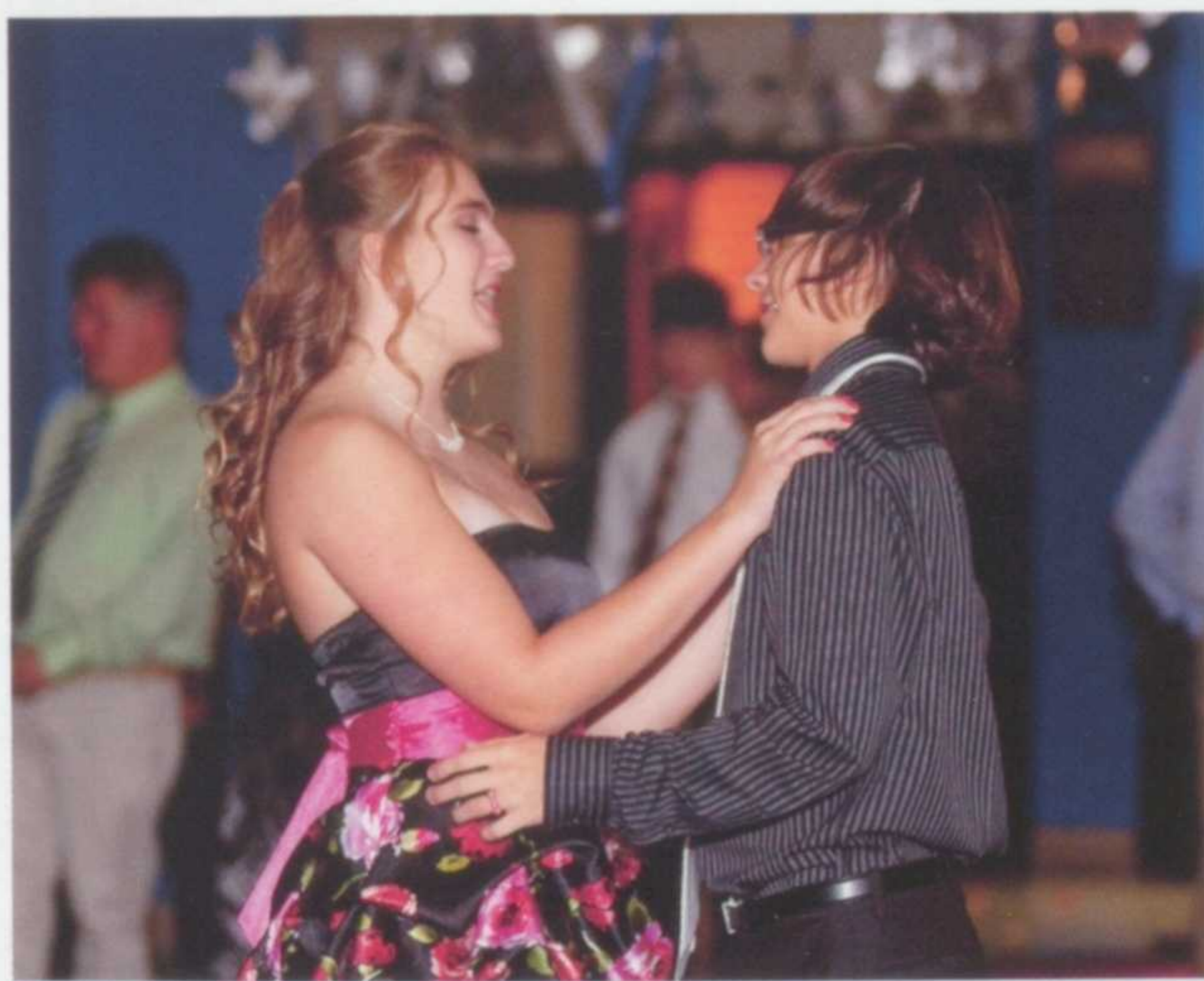

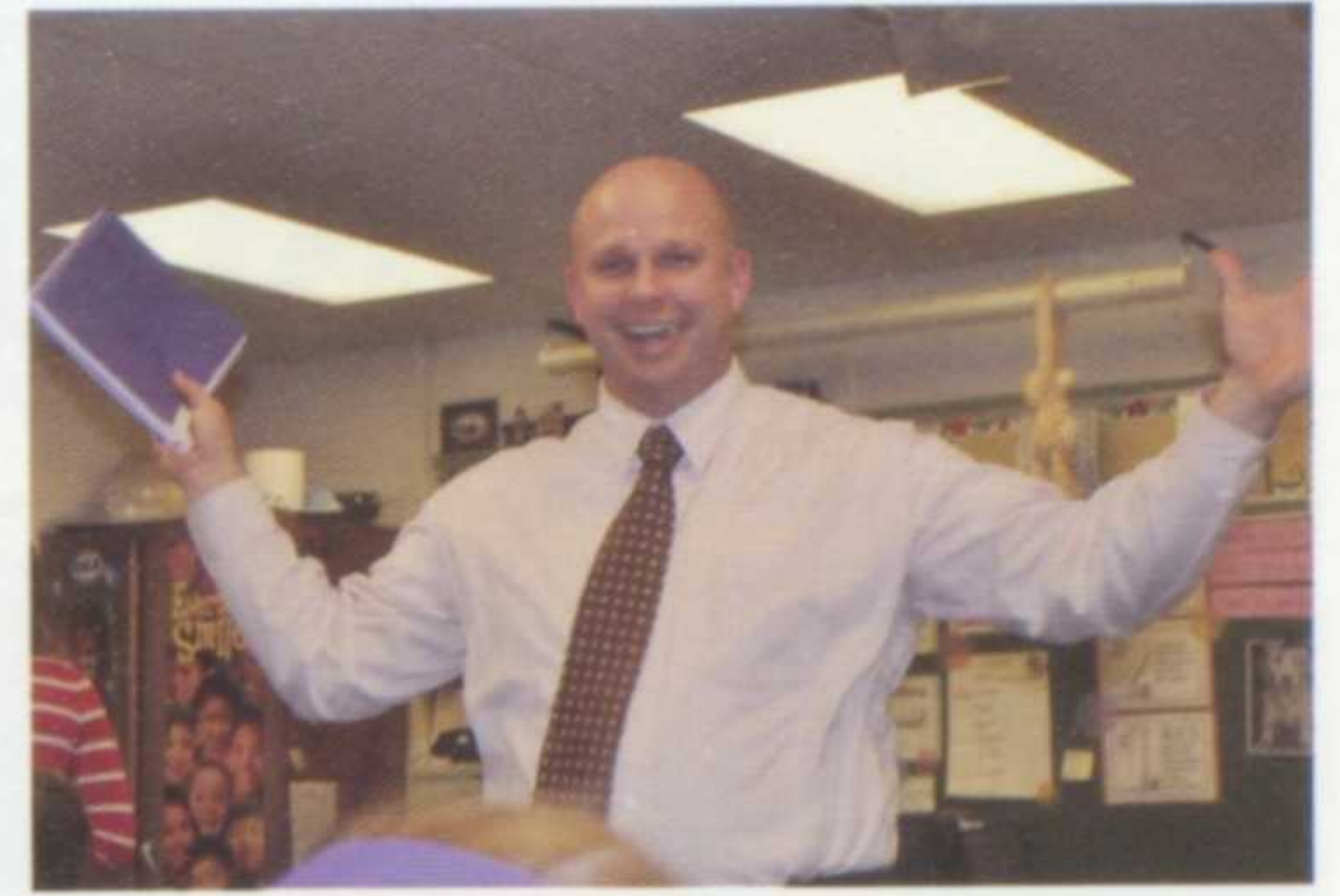

HUDDLE stands for helping us develop dedication, leadership and enthusiasm. The club was started twelve years ago by Mr. Cahoon and is now led by Mr. Ereditario. Each month high-schoolers meet with students from the third to fifth grade. Mentors are chosen through an application and interview process. 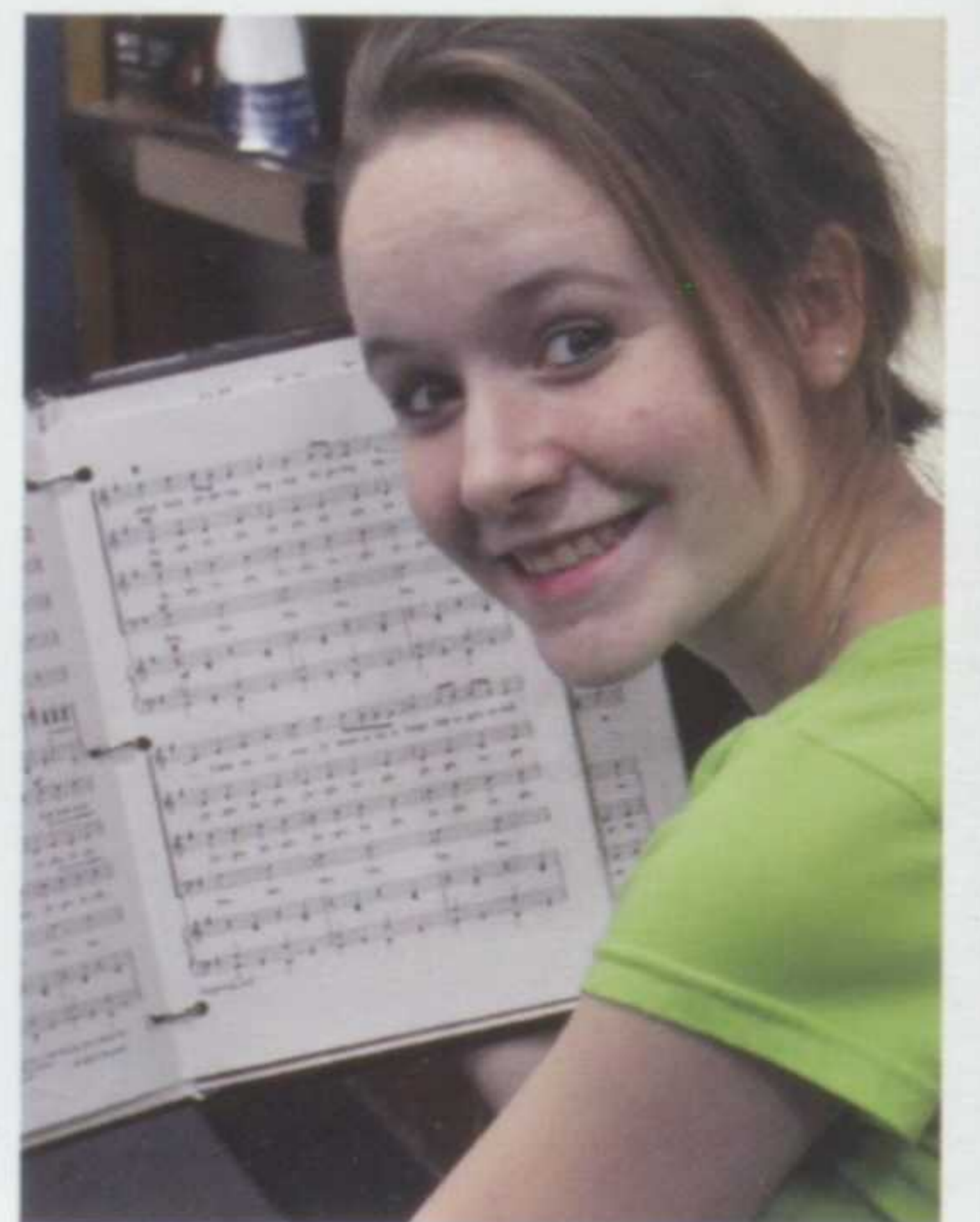
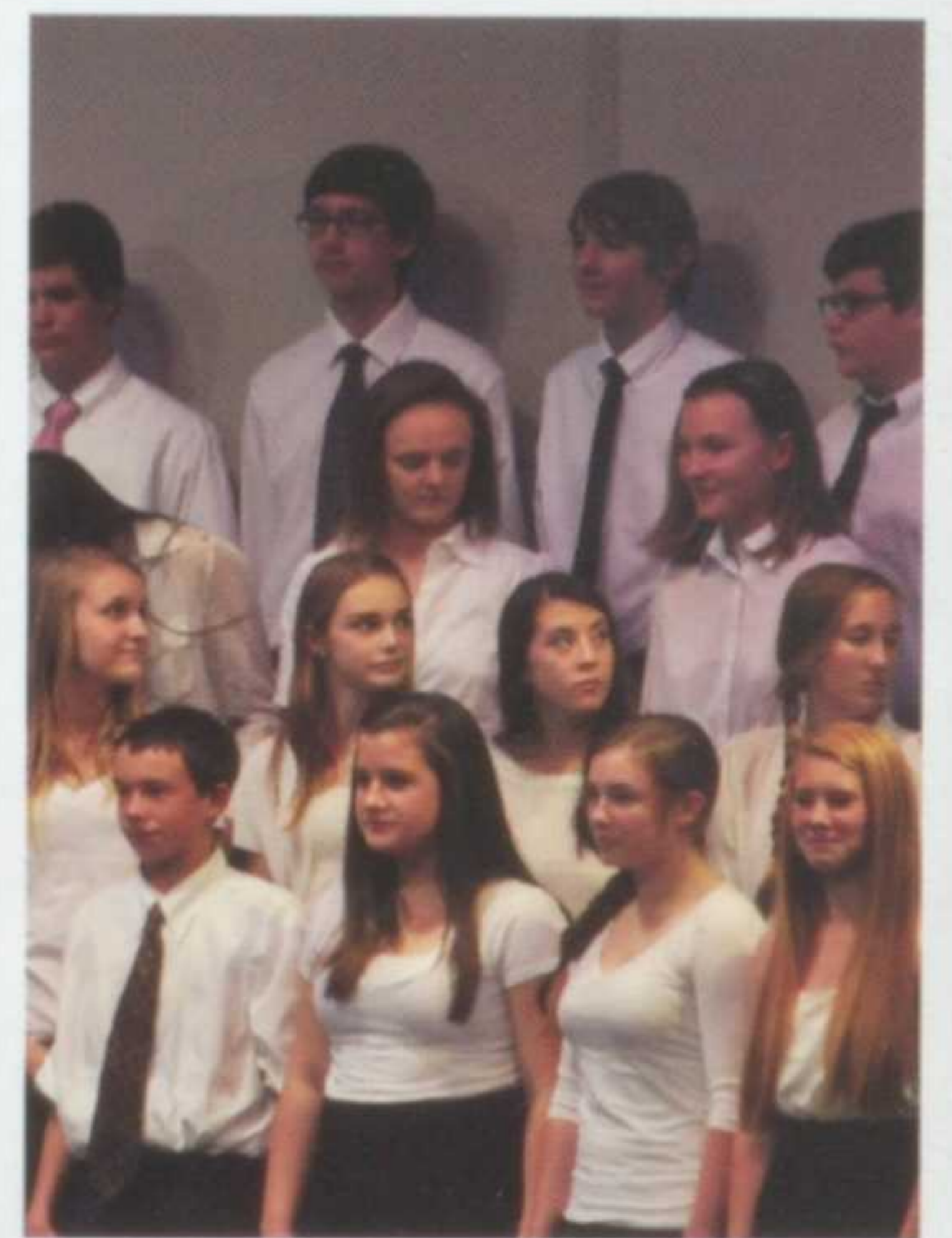
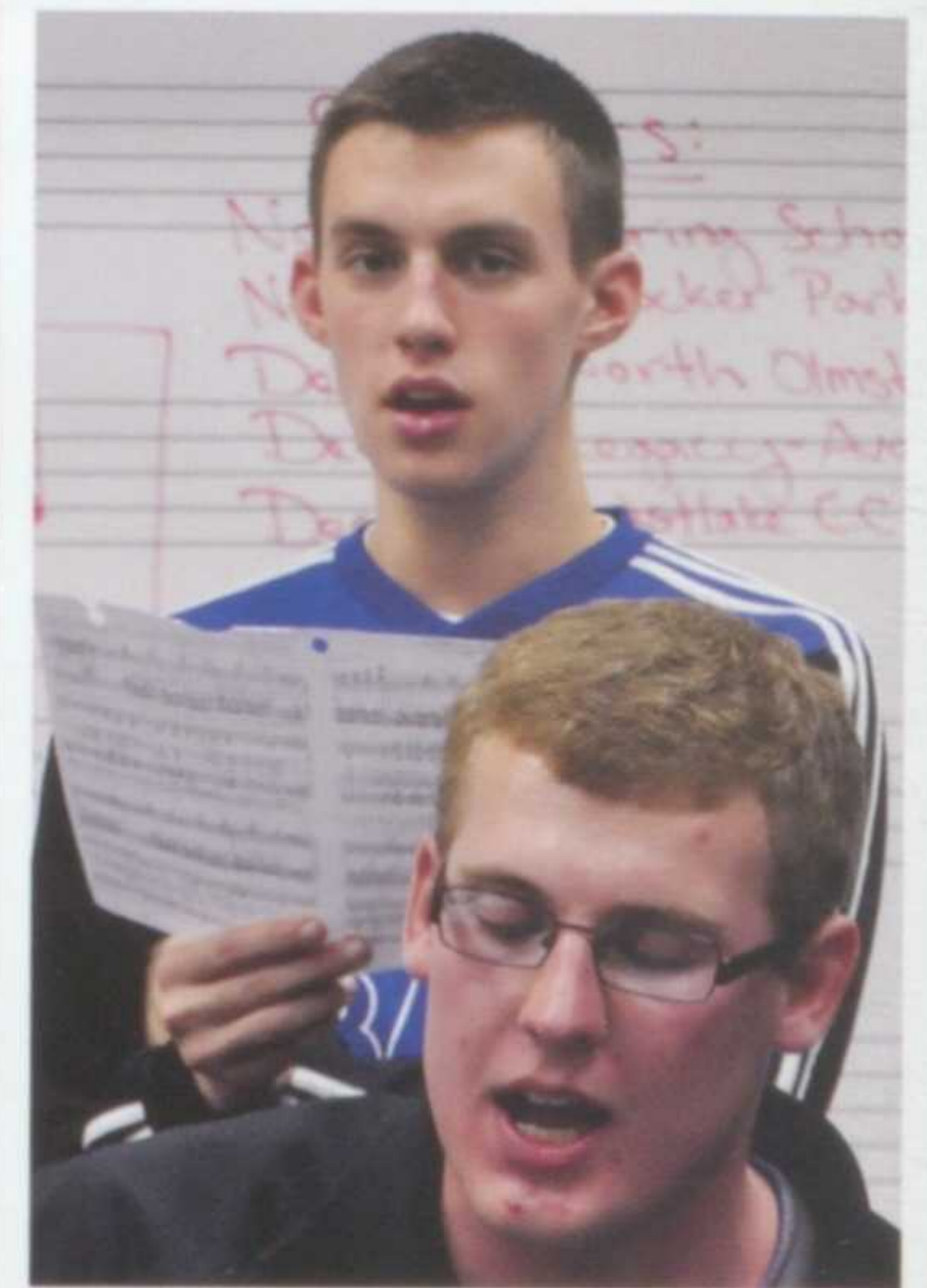
Choir



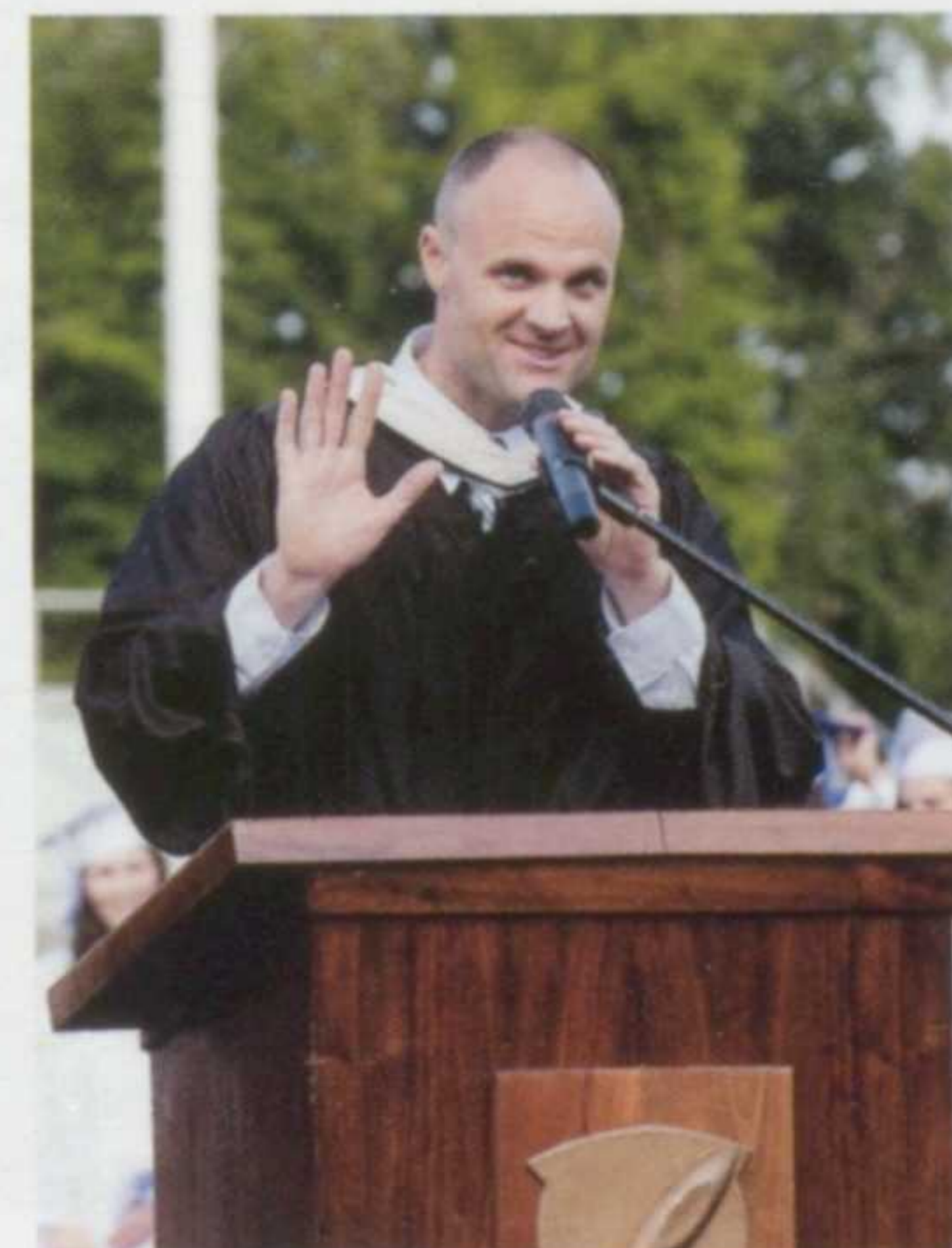
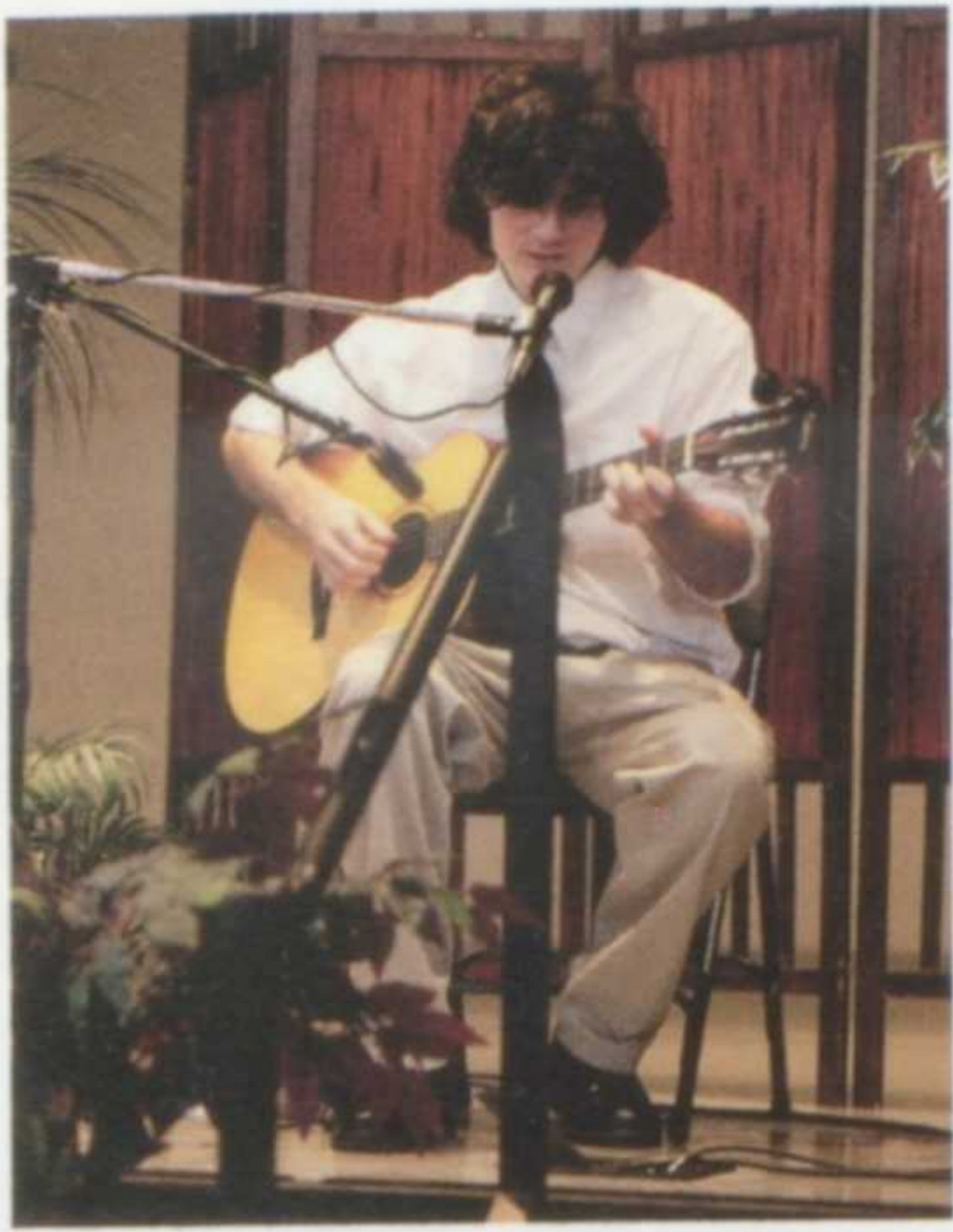
The choir classes evidenced dramatic changes for the 2012-2013 year. Long-term substitute Emily Garloch replaced Mrs. Gess, who is on maternity leave to take care of her new son, Caden. "Of course we miss Mrs. Gess" said junior Hannah McDermott, "But Ms. Garloch has been a wonderful addition. She's a great director and we were so lucky to have her for the time that we did!" The fall concert was the first choir performance of the year and turned out to be stellar; Ms. Garloch held everyone together, inspiring them to sing their best at all occasions. In total, there are five sectors of choir at Bay: Acappella, Treble Choir, Ladies' Show, Freshman Choir, and the famous Choraleers, a small, elite group of some of the most talented singers Bay has to offer. Between these sections, numerous melodies have been sung beautifully, including "Sleigh Ride," "Baby It's Cold Outside," and an arrangement of "Oh Come Oh Come Emanuel," which the Acapella choir performs partially in Italian. 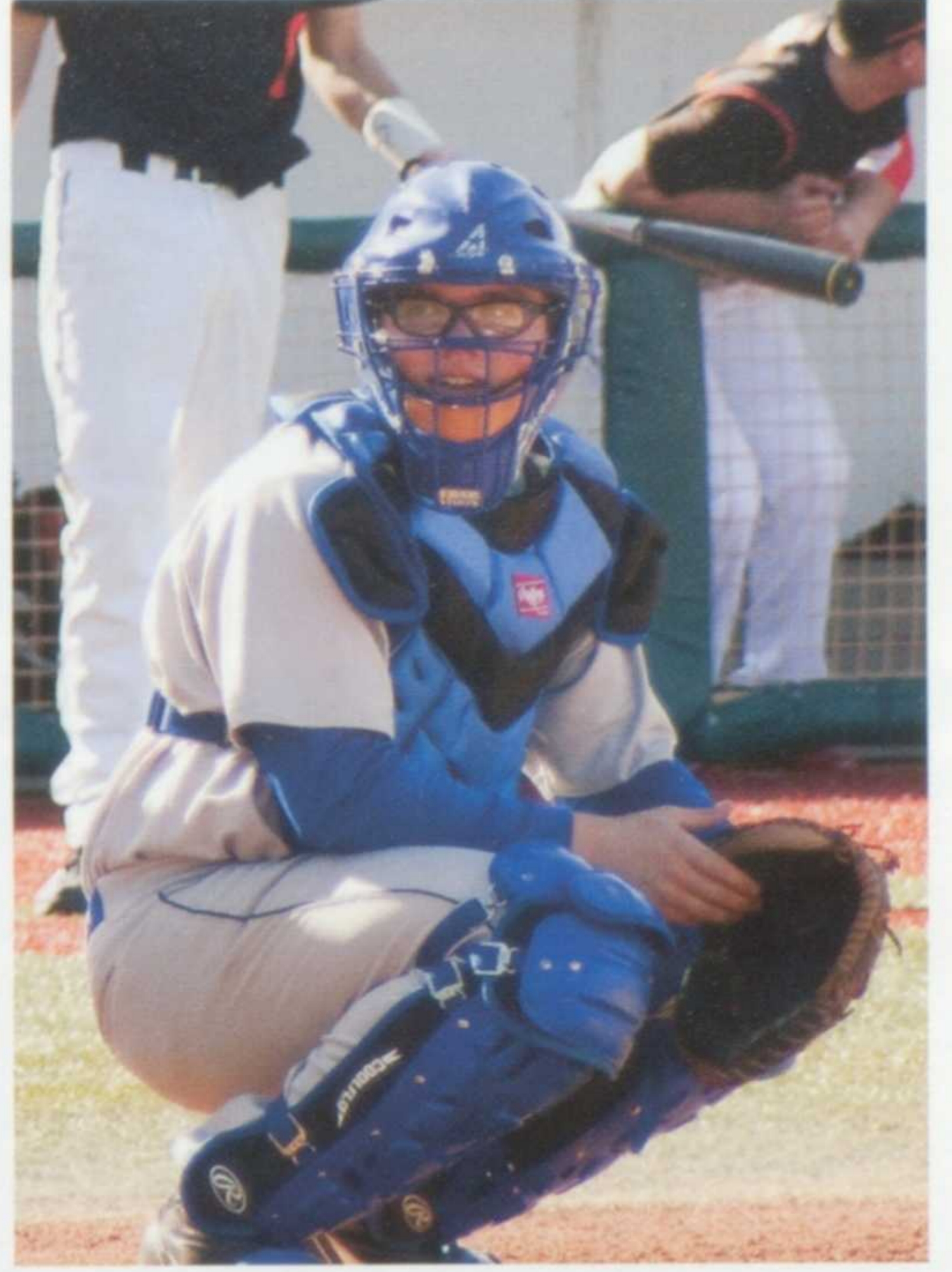

Baseball

The boys baseball team, coached by Joe Cheney, finished the season 7-19-1, with a conference record of 5-7. In spite of the poor standing, the team performed with tenacity, losing nine games by 1 to 2 runs. The seniors starters played well, and the losing season warranted some highlights. The experienced line-up of Buffington, Uram, Rising, and Cooper will be missed. Both Rising and Buffington will continue their careers post high school. First-baseman Robbie Rising, who came within one home run of the Bay record, will play for Baldwin Wallace, and catcher Randy Buffington will play for Muskingum. Other accomplishments were illustrated when Cooper and Rising were selected to play in an All-Star competition at Progressive Field. Junior Marty Schuerger pitched a complete game shut-out and bested an undefeated Avon in a 1-0 game. He went on to complete the season with a 2.44 ERA. Robbie Rising lead the team in batting average, hitting an impressive .377. The team's future seems optimistic: six out of seven starters were underclassmen, and the younger Bay programs boast high numbers and talent.

Softball

The 2012 season was the first for Coach McCarthy who replaced Coach Andrews after three seasons. Overall, the softball team finished with a record of 12-16 in the conference: the best record for the team since 1982. Unfortunately, they lost in the district semifinals to the Keystone Wildcats, a squad that was undefeated throughout the entire season. (The Cats concluded a perfect season by winning the Division II state title.) Meghan Kevesdy started the game, and Bay scored six runs early—the most anyone scored against Keystone during the season. At one time, Bay was up 4-0 nothing; however, they lost the game 13-6. Their greatest victory of the season came against long-time rival Vermillion in which they won 4-2. Throughout the season, the stars of the team were seniors Michele McGovern, Meghan Kevesdy, and Chelsea Woodworth, who caught for the first time this season. The seniors will be dearly missed, as the program will be numerically depleted in 2013.

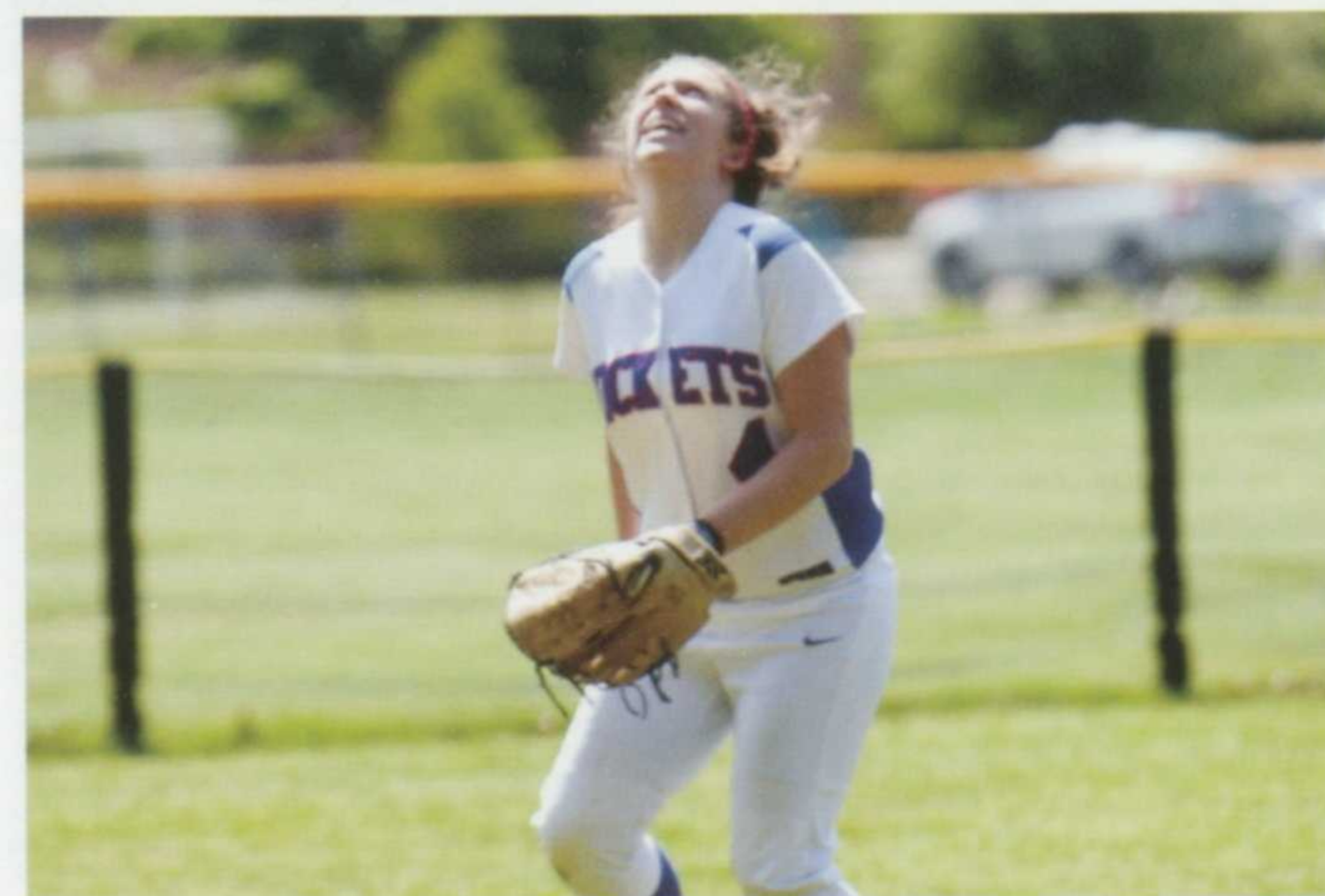

Boys Lacrosse

The boys lacrosse team, coached by Ryan Smith, a former OSU attacker, finished with a record of 9-7, third in their division. The season was a successful: the boys advanced to the Sweet 16 tournament within the state playoffs yet lost to Rocky River 14-4. This is the farthest a Bay team has reached in its four year existence; furthermore, they averaged an impressive 8.44 goals per game. The team was led by two senior captains: Mitch Voll, who solidified the offense, leading the team in goals, and Nate Notarberadino, a defensive anchor who also starred on the football team as an inside linebacker and guard. Voll broke six Bay Village records: career points(138), goals(80), assists (57),ground balls (221), and most assists in a game(4) and a season(27) . He will continue his career at Bowling Green. In spite of losing Voll and Notarberadino, the team has many future stars: Jake Best, Henri Adams, Steve Adams and Jacob MacMillan.

Girls Lacrosse



The girls lacrosse team was approved by the Bay Village Board of Education on February 27, 2012. Efforts to create a team started in June of 2011. Parents Dawna Finley, Anne Kerka, and Dawn Galang started the foundational work to develop a Bay squad by meeting with Northeast Ohio lacrosse contacts and coaches and developing a proposal. During the first eight months of planning, the team assumed 20-25 girls would be interested in officially playing for a club team. Once the team was approved, 80 girls attended the first meeting. Out of the initial 80, 57 ended up rostering on the team. The team was coached by former Wooster player, Joanna Amendola, and Dave Lowery served as an assistant. The girls advanced to the second round of the Division II playoffs, beating Beaumont(10-8) in the first round yet losing to Hawkin (2-16) in round two. Their overall record was 5-7. Two players received laurels from area high school lacrosse coaches: **Sophia Steyns, 11** was voted Second Team All District and **Dokota Meisenberg, 9** received an Honorable Mention.

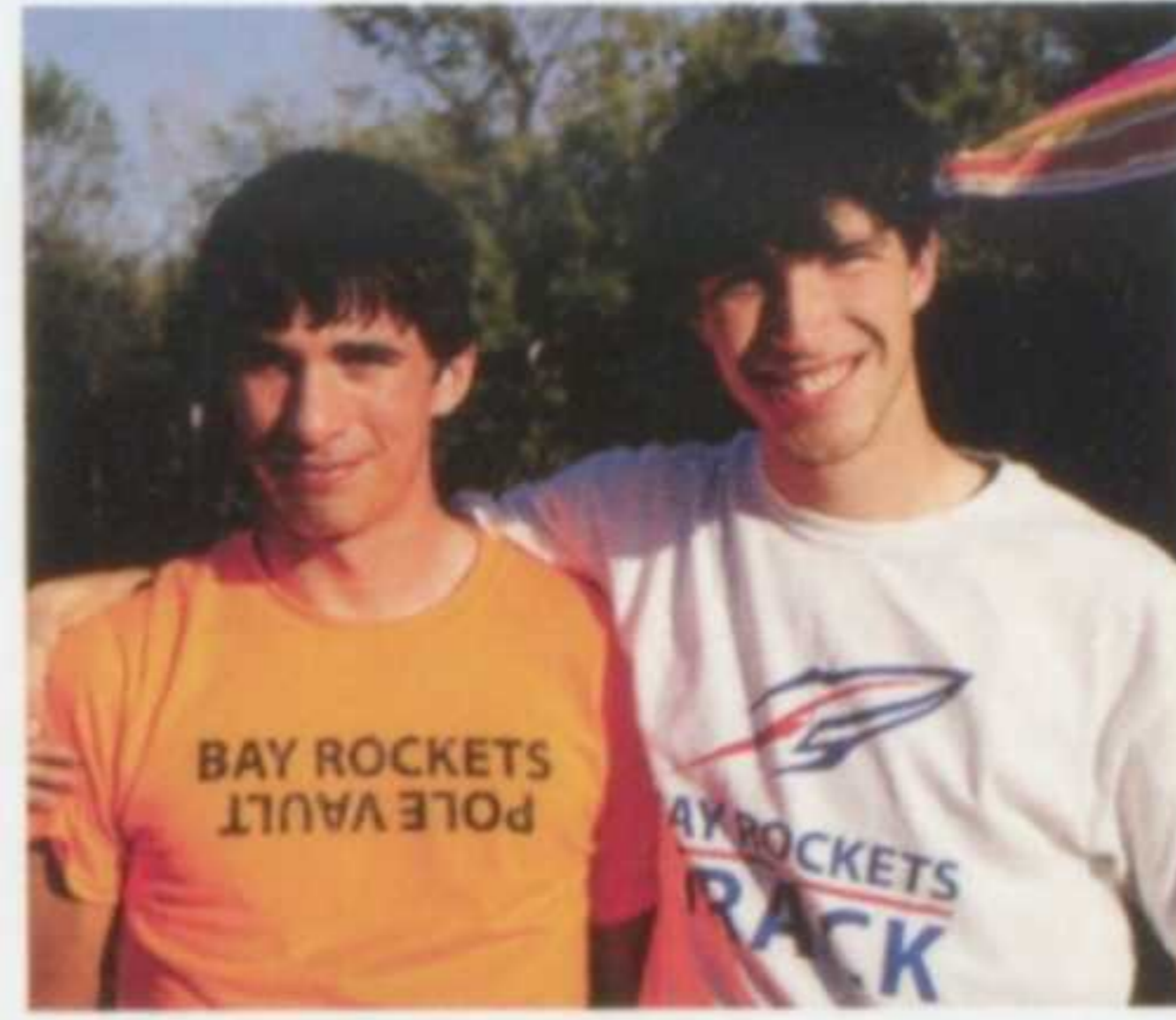

Of the season Coach Rutt said, "We had a really great season. The kids worked hard and competed well. Most kids showed improvement with times and distances."

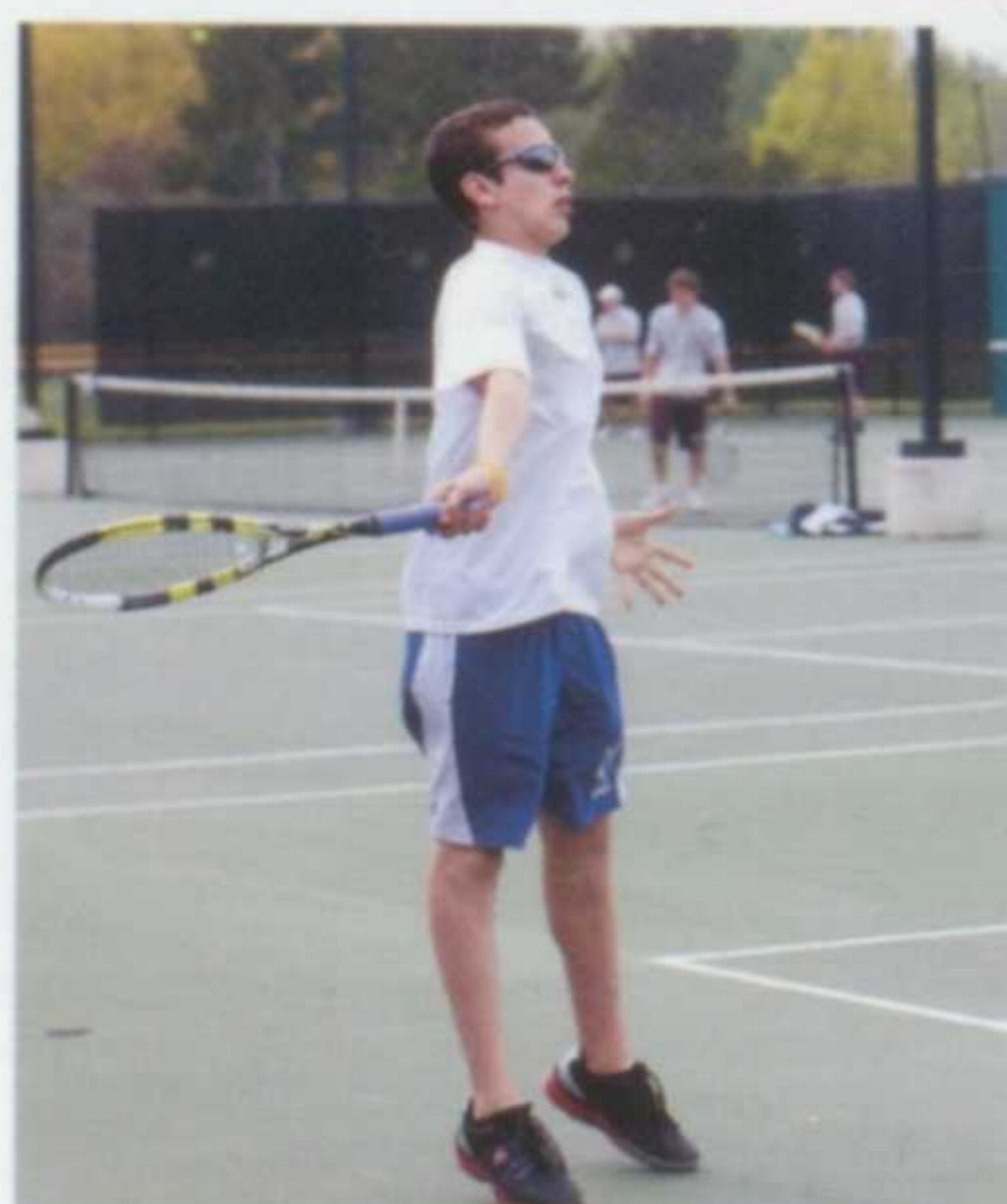

The season was one of rebuilding; star Pete Scanniello graduated— and now continues his career at John Carroll—leaving the path open for rising stars such as Zak Messina and Brandon Myers. This season, Messina and Geuther were the two most outstanding players of the spring. They were the WSC champs for doubles and qualified for Districts. Geuther was 9-2 on the season and 3-0 in WSC, placing first for the conference. Reflecting on his career, Geuther stated, "Deciding to play tennis was one of the best decisions I made throughout high school. It was a thrill to be a part of a winning doubles team taking the conference two years in a row. I had a blast playing with my teammates and enjoyed making friends with them in the process. I developed a special bond with Coach Peters that I will always remember throughout my life. He not only taught me skills about tennis games, but he also helped me to become a better person in general." Messina also was 3-0, in WSC play, and posted a record of 9-6. Coach Peters commented on the year: " We were the youngest and most inexperienced team in the conference, yet we managed to finish in the top 3. The underclassmen relished the challenge, fought the long odds, took their lumps, and finished the season as one of the best teams in the conference. Bodes quite well for the future of the program. 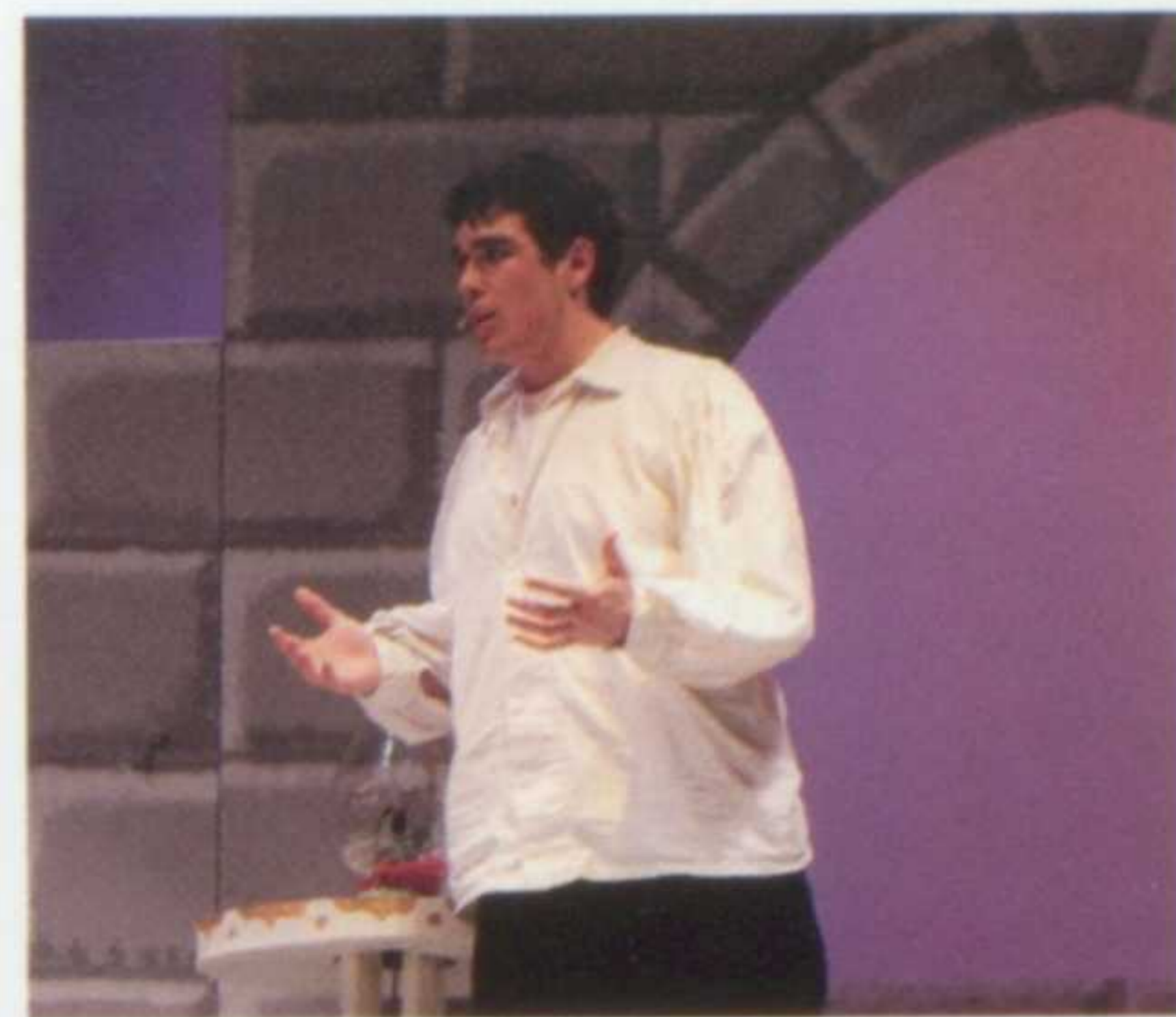

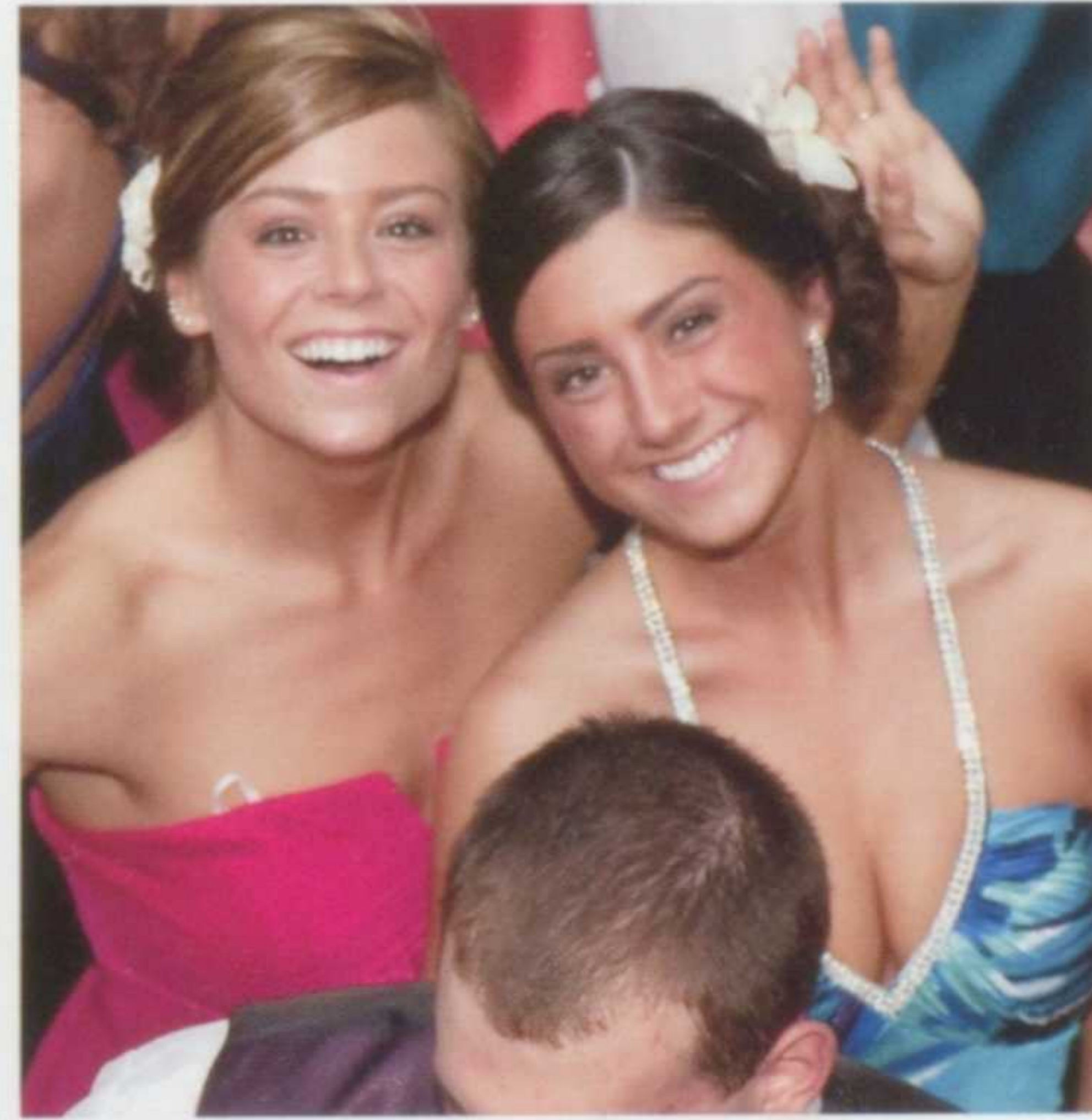
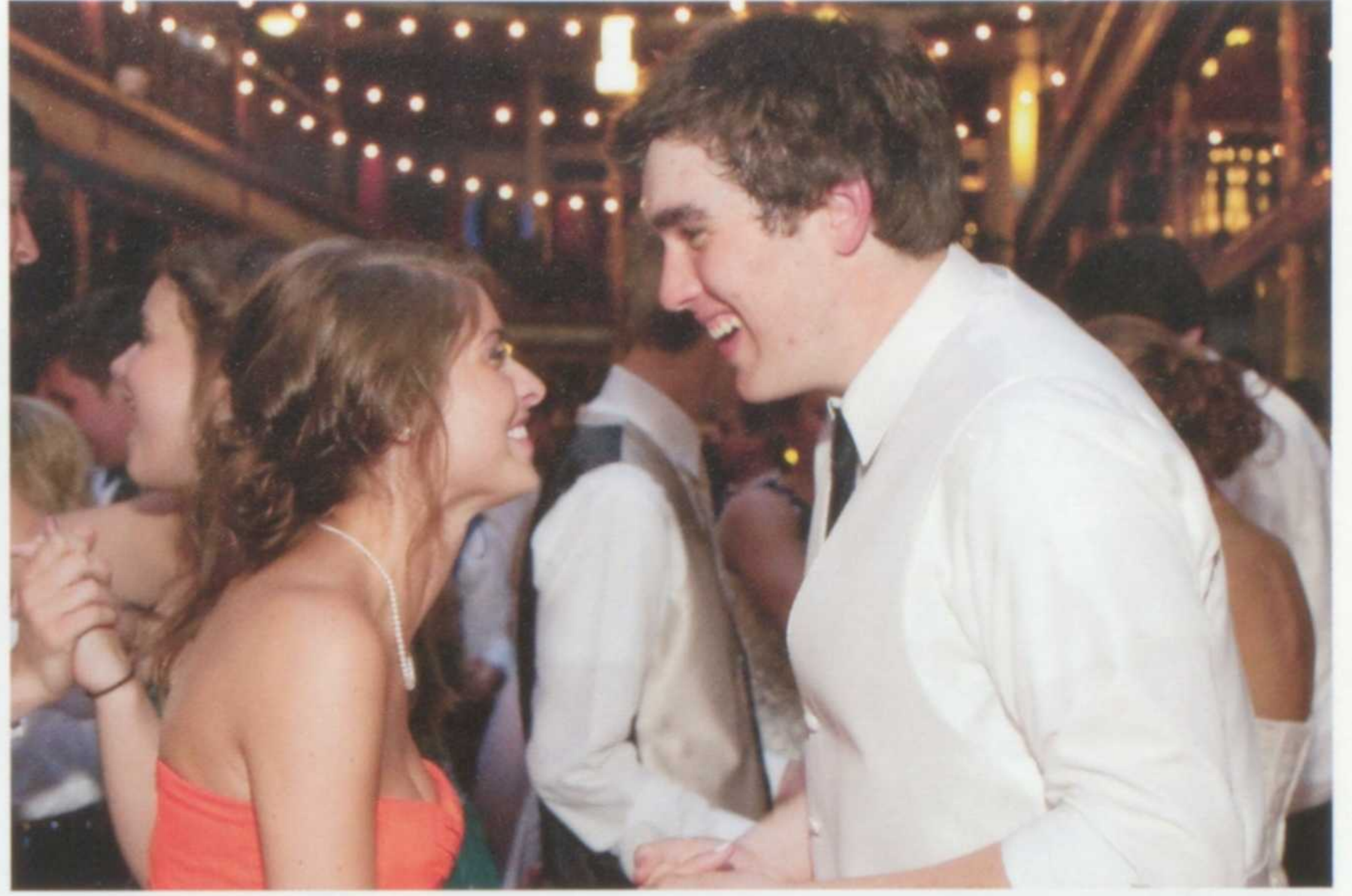
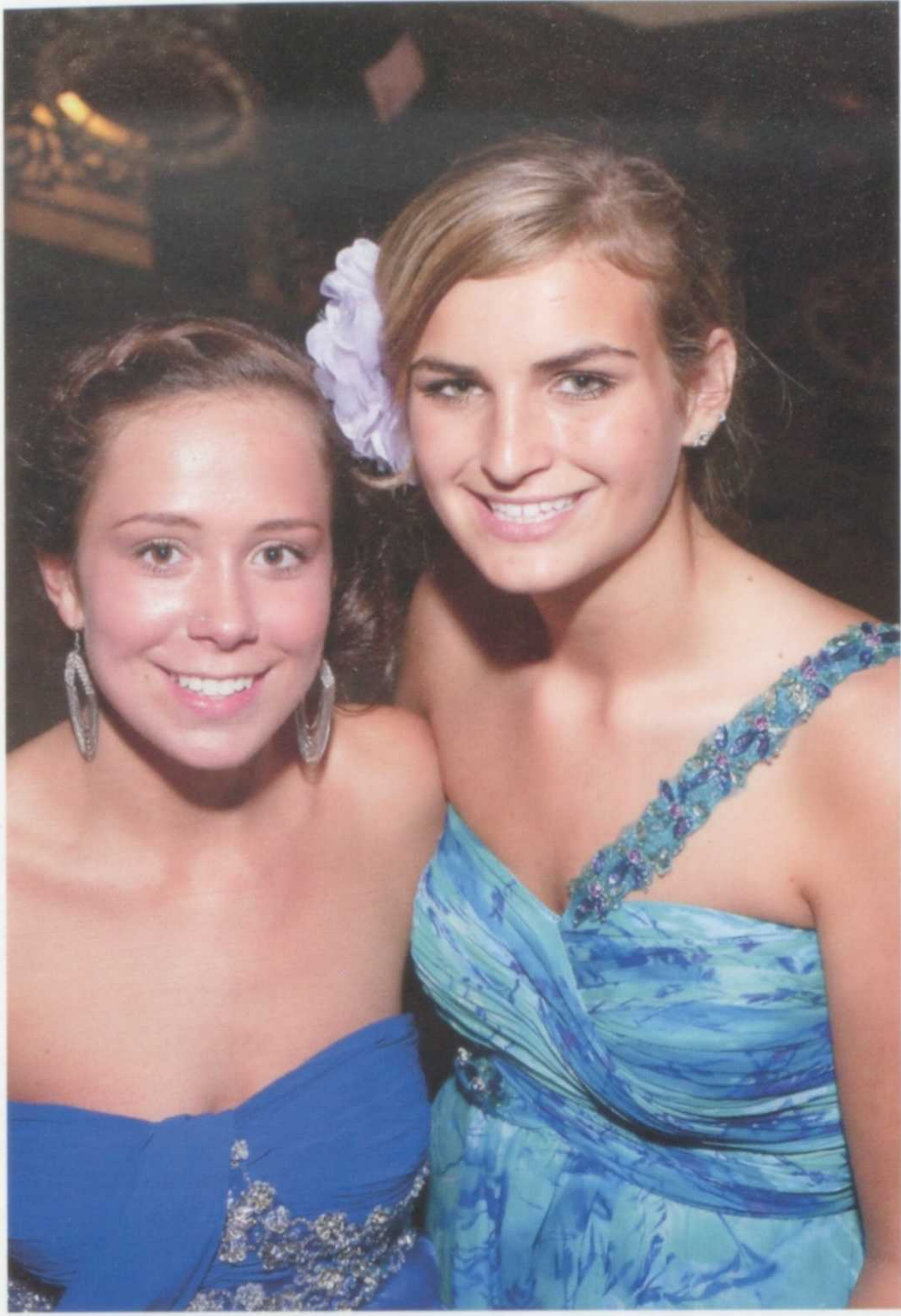
Prom

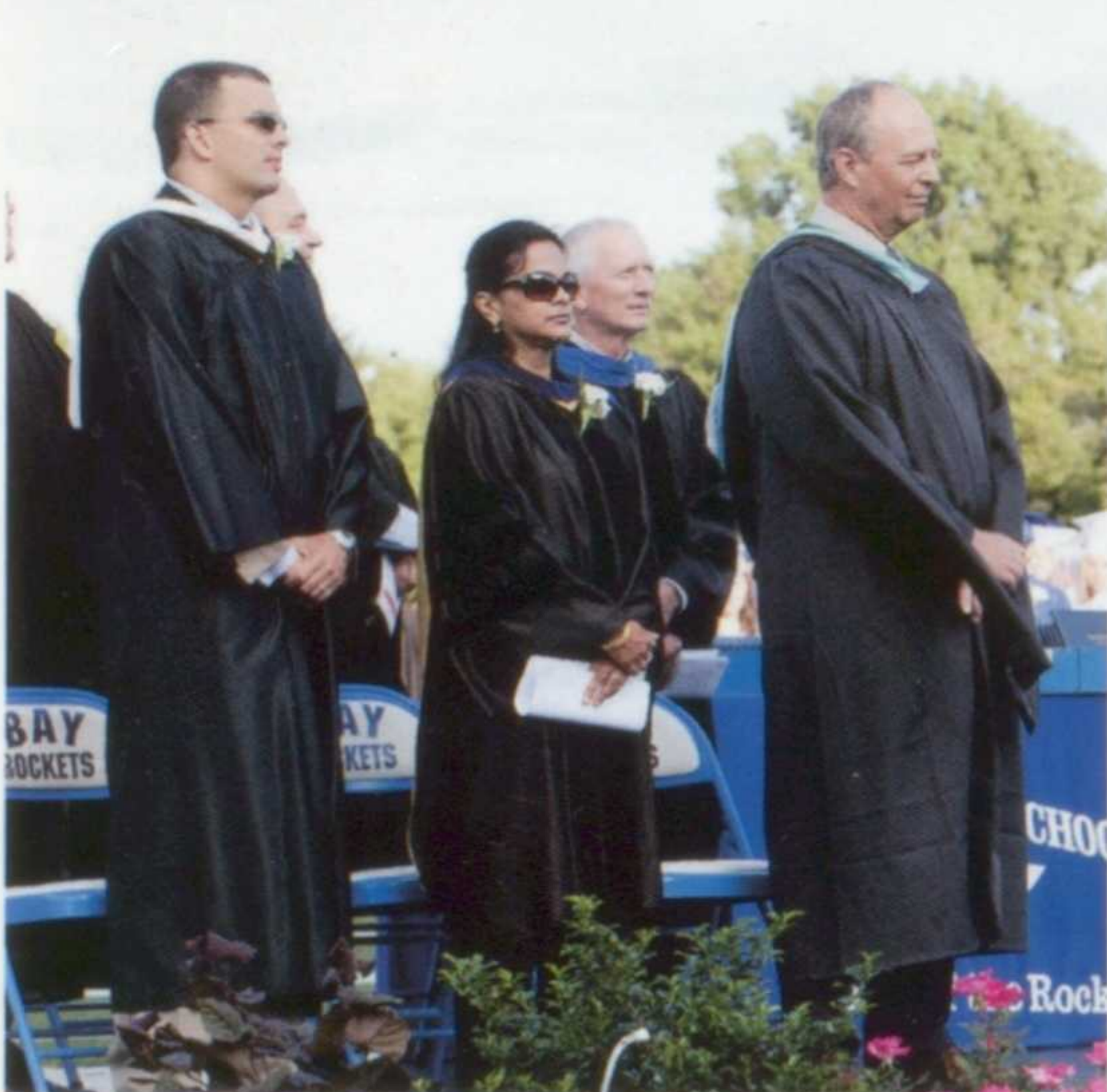

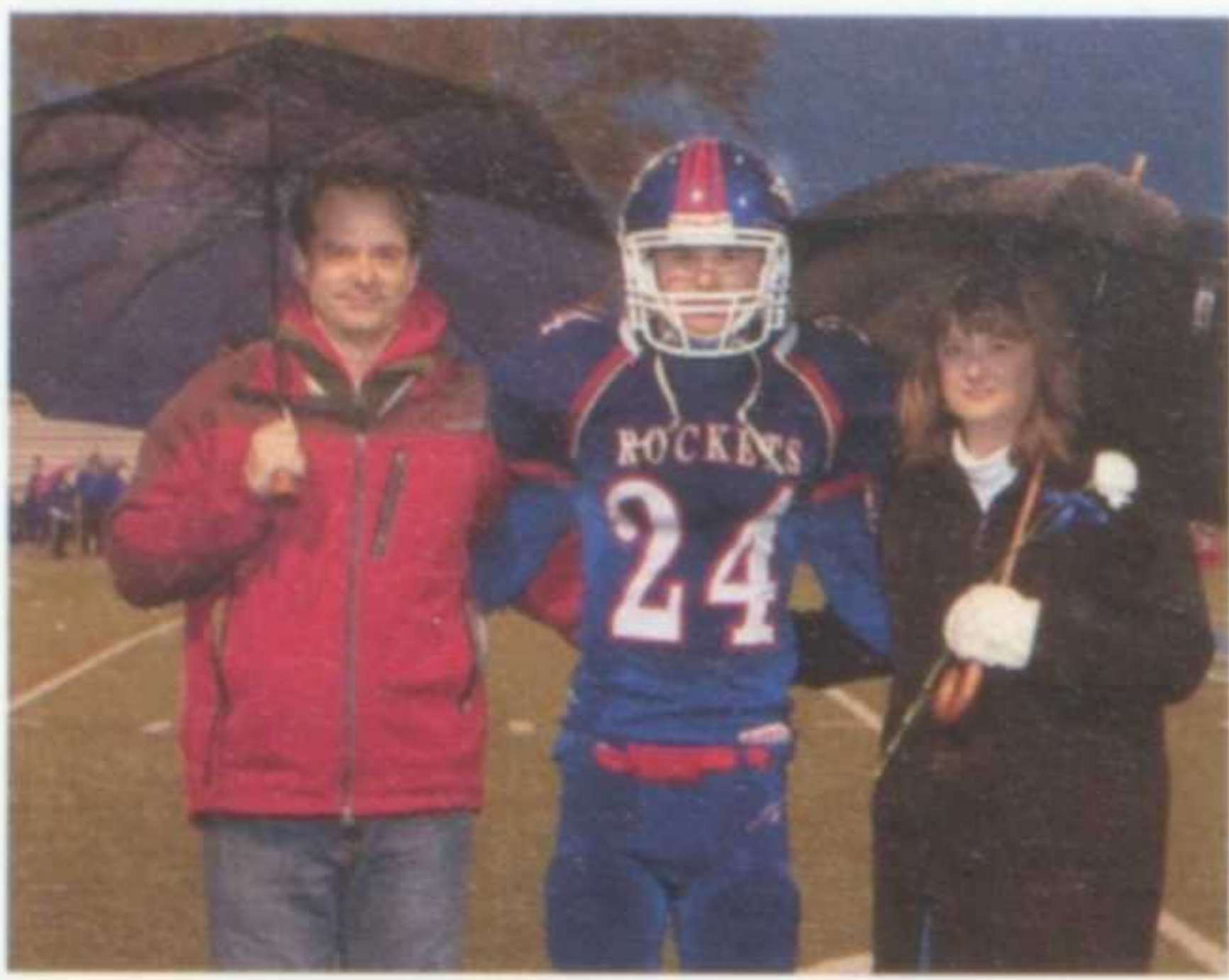

Football

The football team finished with a record of 3-7 with a 1-6 league record. Unlike the prior season, Bay had a consistent starting QB. Jake Best, 11 played the duration of the season at the quarterback position and threw for 955 yards in his first season as a full-time starter. (Only three other passes were made by back-ups.) Best's mobility also gained him 424 yards on the ground, making him the team's second leading rusher. This consistency at the QB position did not lead to success during the season, and early victories, which provided some optimism, later turned into a rough season. Most promising was the development of Ryan Voiers as a running back. Voiers rushed for 546 yards and caught 13 passes for a total of 240 yards, averaging an impressive 18 yards per reception.

A leader in receiving and rushing, Voiers acumen extended itself to the defensive side of the ball, where he averaged eight tackles a game. Boys Soccer

The 2012 boys soccer team were conference champions with an overall record of 14-5-3 (6-0-1 in conference). Their MVP was Brady Kinsey, who was also All-State. Twins Adam and Ben Tepper led team in assists with 9. 19 different people on the team scored goals over the season. The team made it to the final 4 (States) after winning five playoff games, four of which were shut-outs. Their highest ranking all year was 9 in the state. Overall, the team gave up 24 goals and scored 60. Coach Dougherty said, "The biggest thing about this season was ending the way it did. It was a pleasant ending. A lot of people asked me if I was surprised about the ending. I said, "No! It was just nice to believe we could do it and go and do it."

This time—a personal best—qualified Hallie for the Bay record books. It was the fifth best performance ever for a Bay girls runner. Her legacy will live on through her sister Olivia Bechtel who finished the State Meet only 19 seconds slower than her sister.

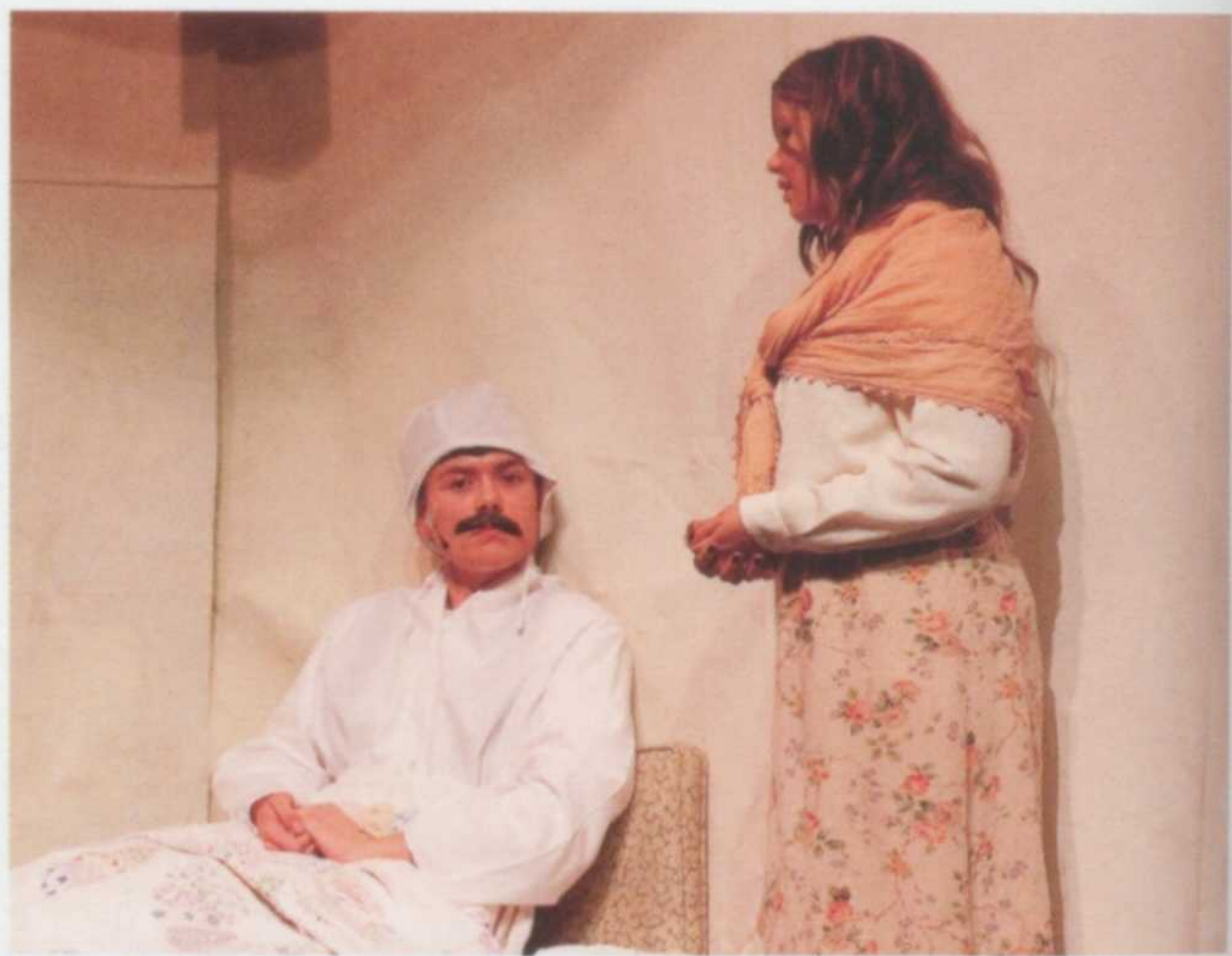

Several other swimmers came through with personal-bests such as Colleen Farley—a first time District swimmer in 500 meter freestyle—and Ryan Grimm, who broke a personal best.

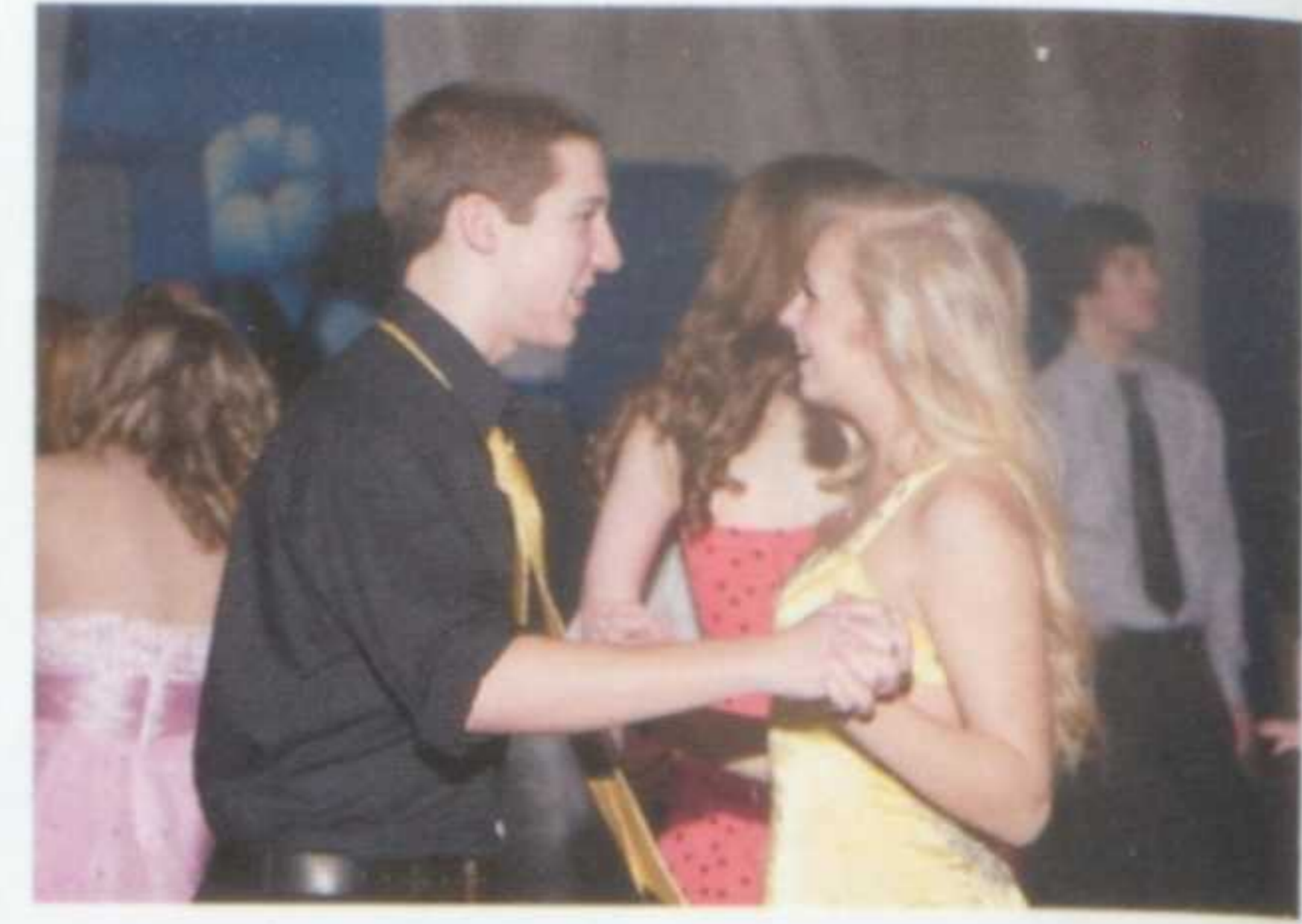

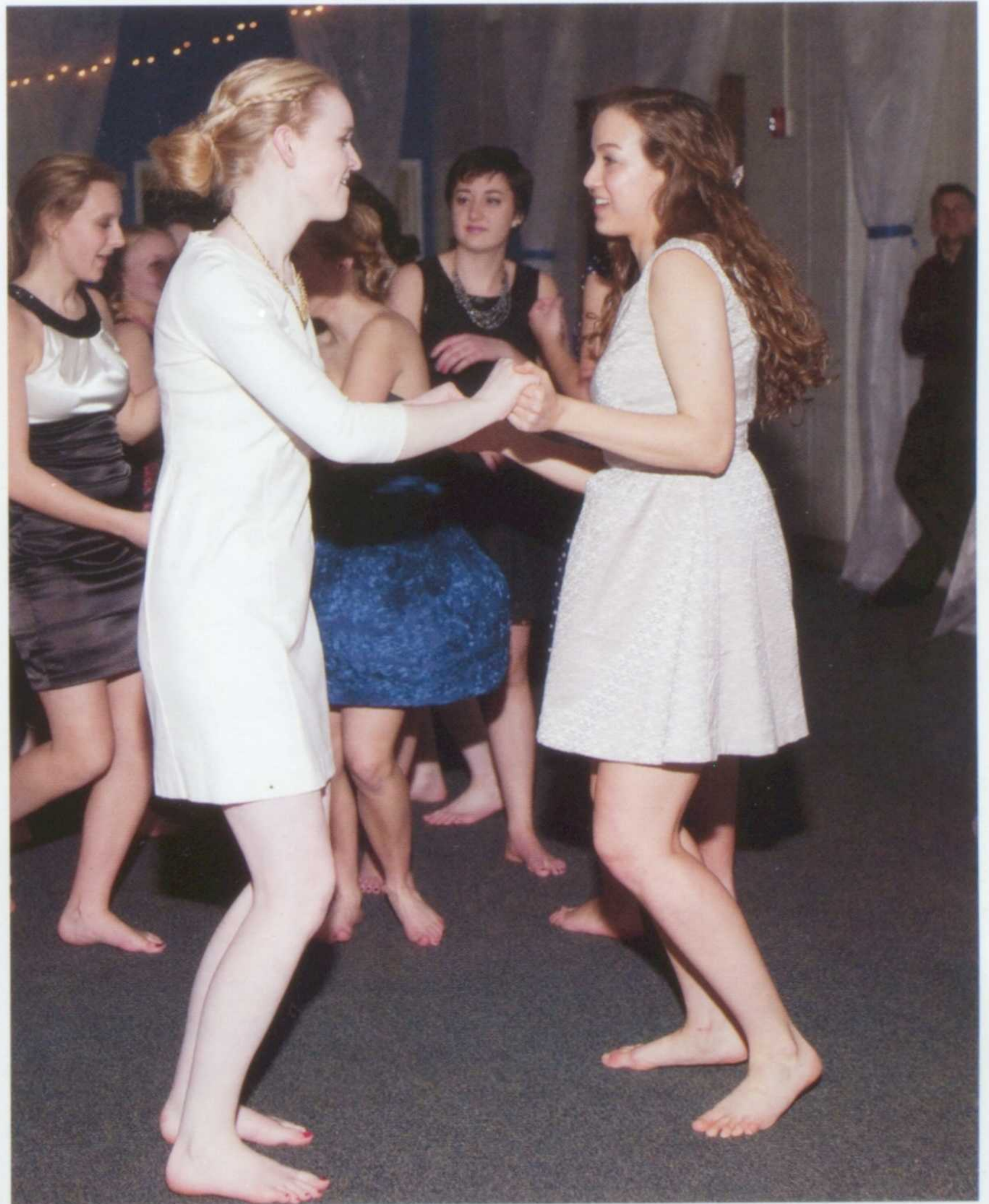




Snoball

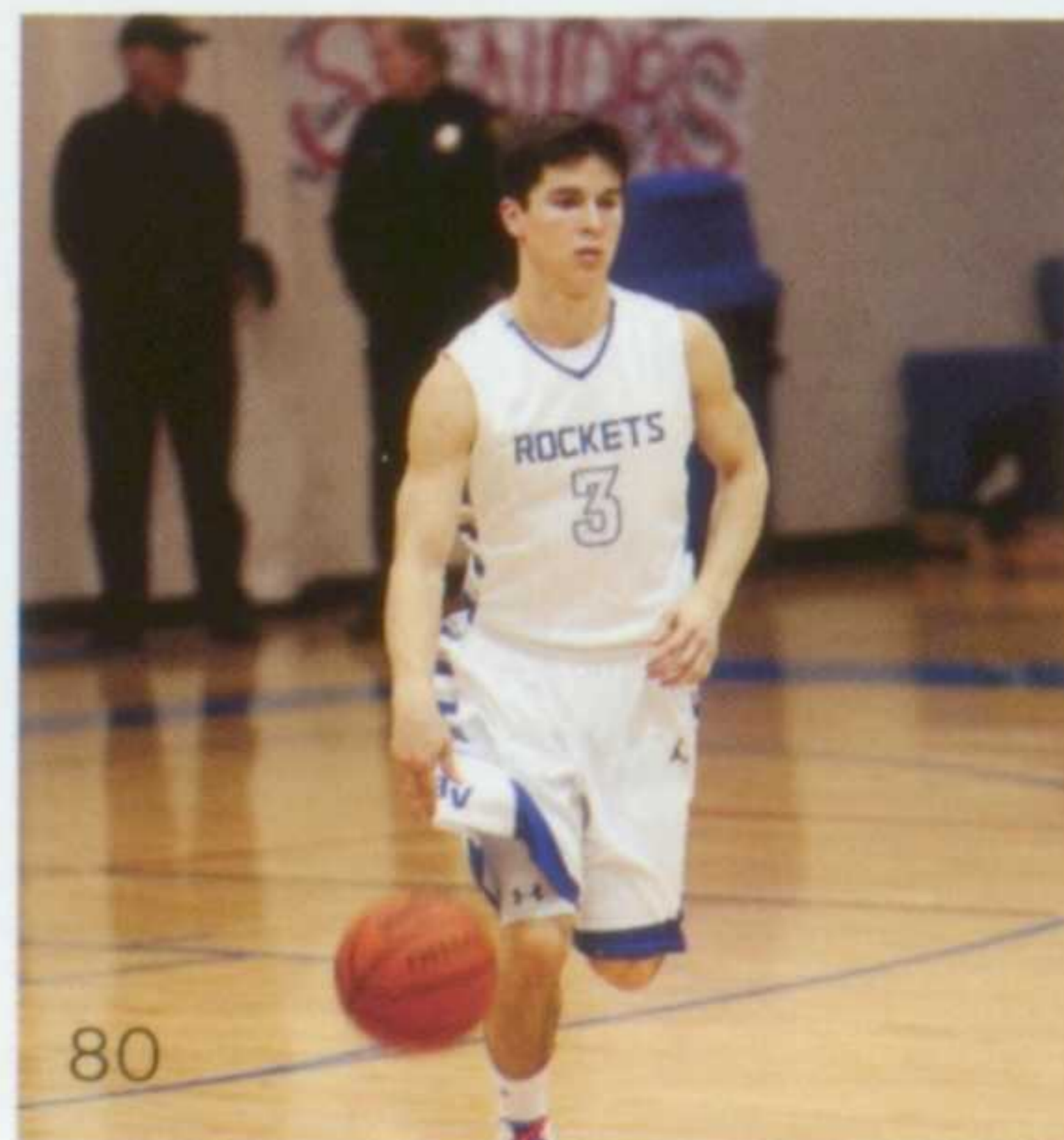

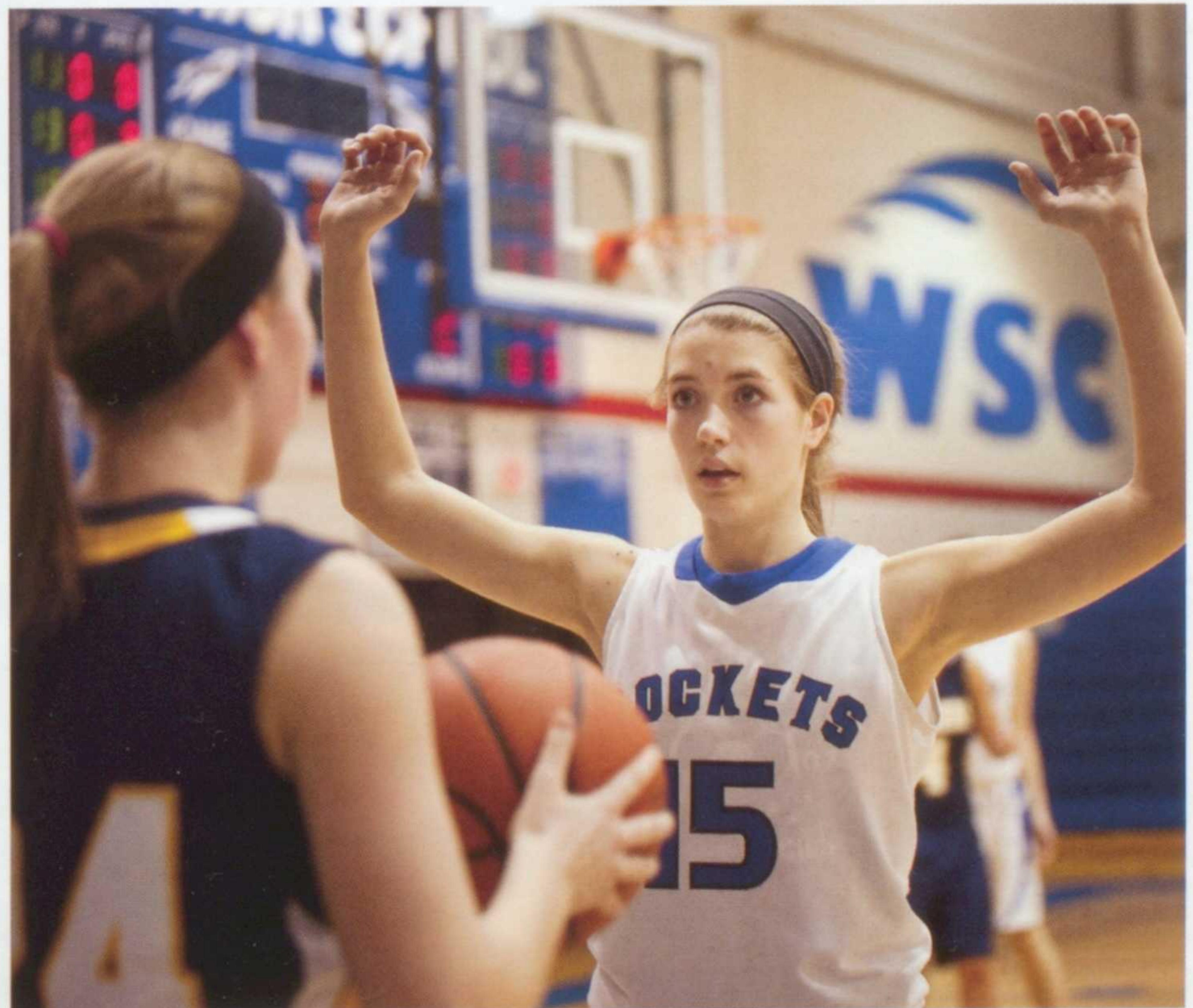
Girls Basketball

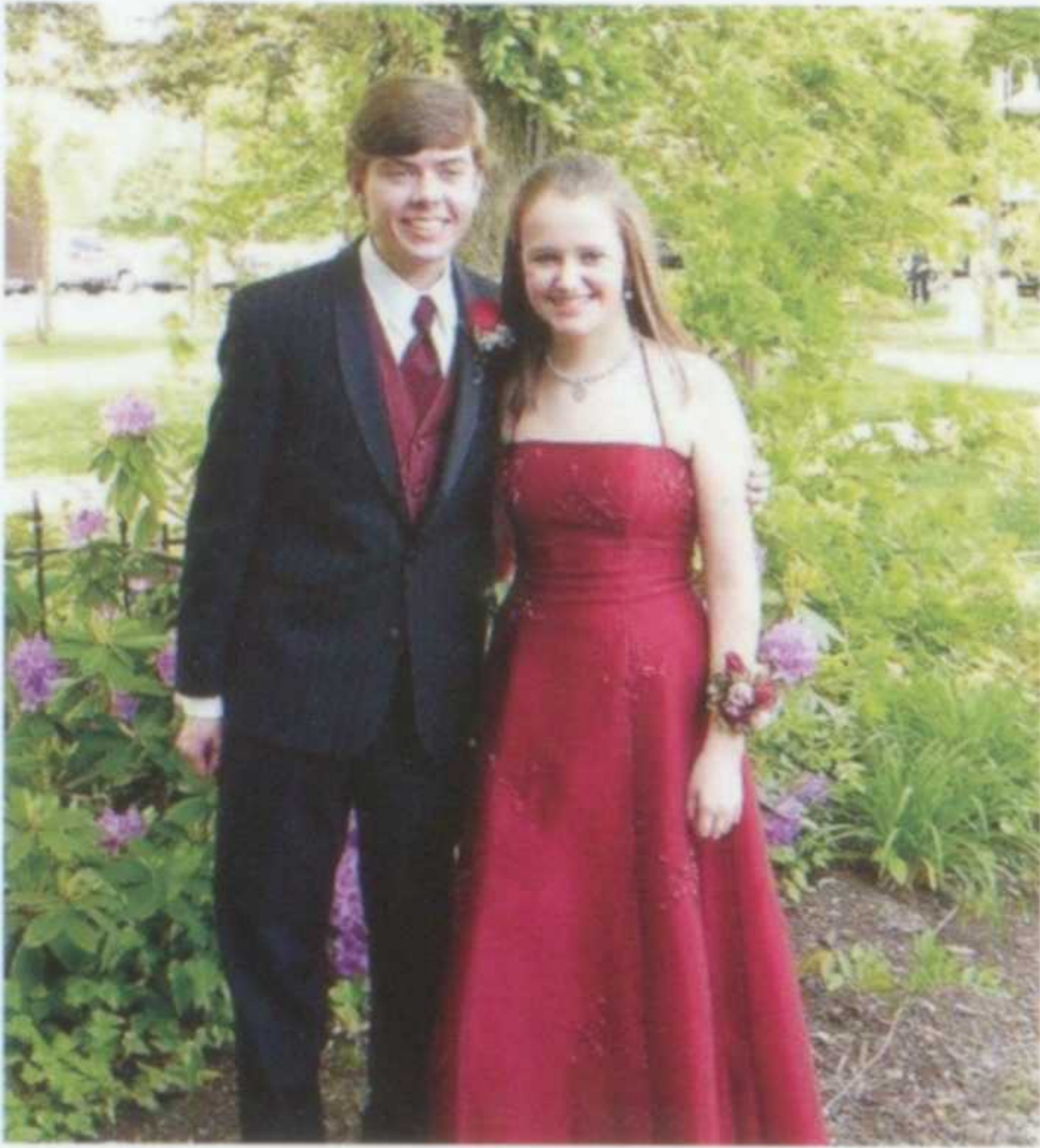
Cheerleading

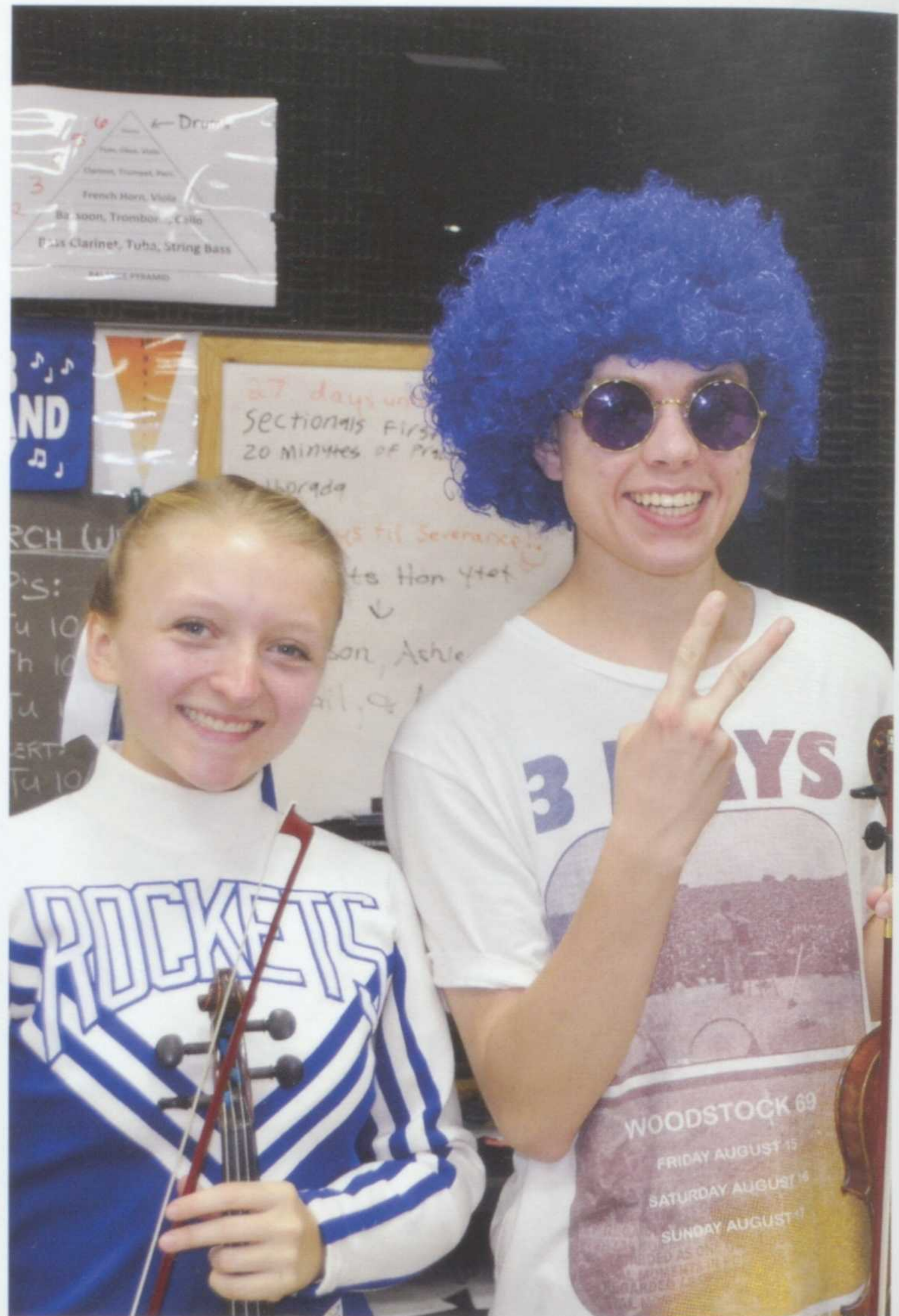

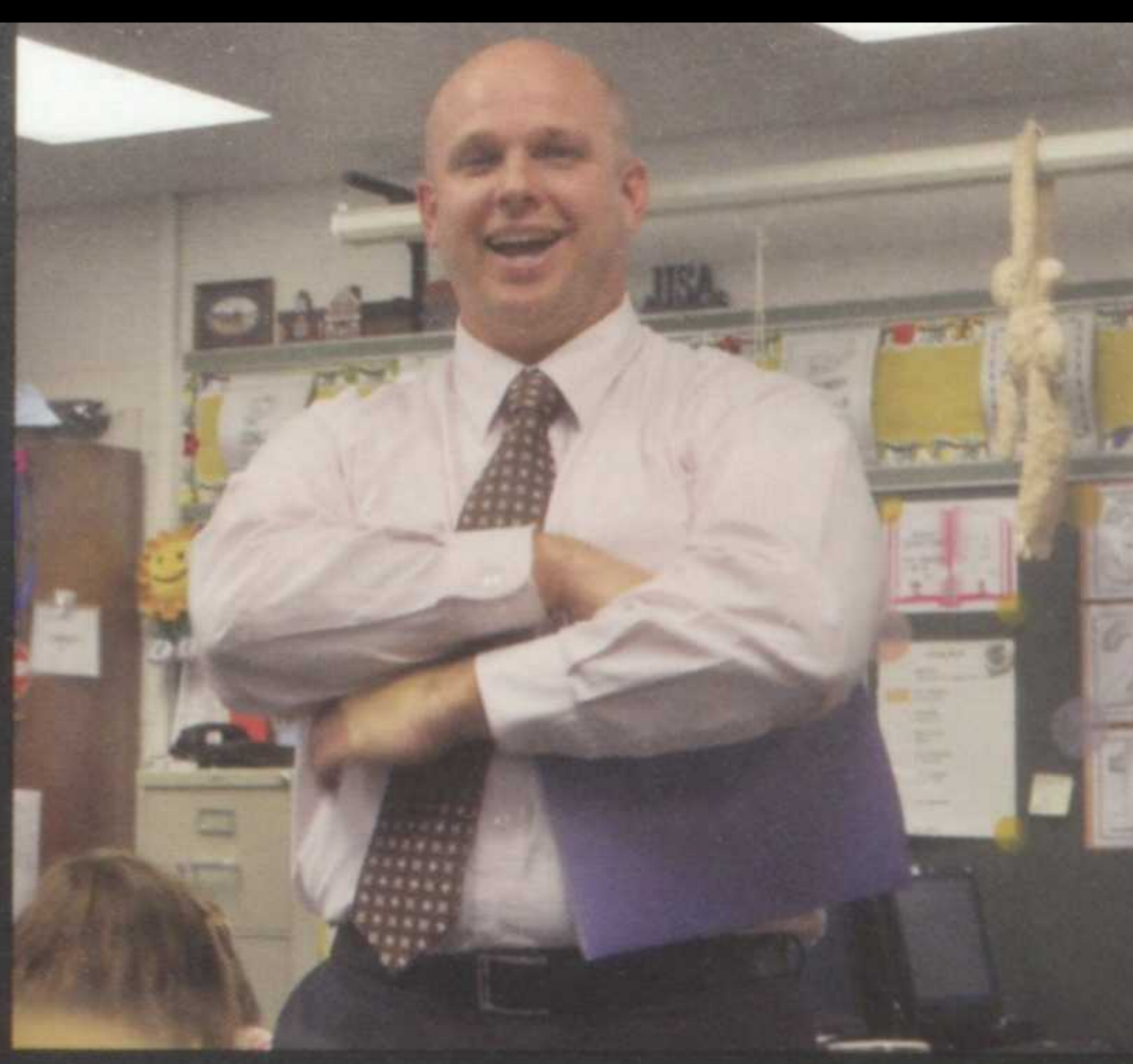
Jackson Brothers

The Use of a Health and Healing Box to Increase Comfort in PACU Patients

Introduction

A holistic approach to medicine incorporates healing the physical body while also being mindful towards the harmony of the mind, body, spirit, and emotion of the patient. In order for this approach to be successful, all four of these dimensions must work together and receive adequate attention. Holistic medicine has been utilized since the time of Hippocrates, and incorporates methods including music, therapeutic massage, guided imagery, prayer and aromatherapy. In recent years, a holistic approach to medicine through the use of CAM (complementary and alternative medicines) has been made use of within hospitals to reduce the anxiety and pain of patients while also increasing their overall satisfaction with their hospital stay. Cleveland Clinic offers several CAM services to patients including Reiki healers, massage therapists, and pastoral care, among others, to help improve patient comfort and satisfaction. Music therapist specialists are also available at the Main Campus, Lakewood, and Hillcrest locations.

Hypothesis

Will the use of items from the Health and Healing Box (music, guided imagery, aromatherapy, stress balls, prayer, etc.) enhance the patients' post-operative experience resulting in an increase in patient satisfaction?



Methodology

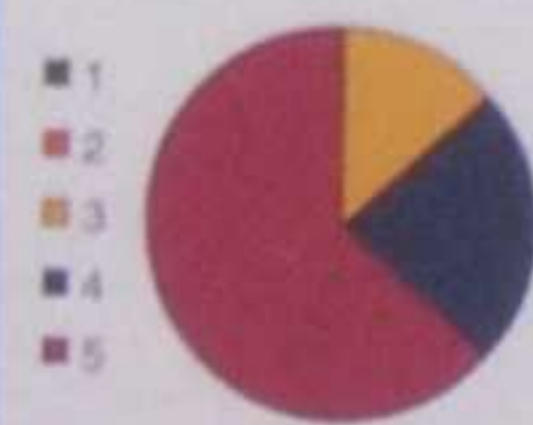
- First, a preliminary literature review was performed.
- Then, the study was executed by offering patients one or more of the Health and Healing services which include:
 - Aromatherapy with either peppermint or lavender oil
 - Music therapy
 - Deep Breathing
 - Guided Imagery
 - Prayer
 - Stress balls
- The items in the Health and Healing Box were used to increase comfort and decrease anxiety in patients after their surgical procedures. Patients in the post anesthesia care unit (PACU) were offered one or more of these services during their stay.
- Of the 30 patients, 21 were asked the questions upon discharge and 9 were asked during their post discharge phone call.
- Then patients were asked to answer questions about the services they were offered. Question number one was presented to post discharge patients.
- **Question 1**-You were offered one of our Health and Healing services such as... (the service the patient was offered was then stated). Do you remember this service?
 - **Question 2**-On a scale of 1-5 how satisfied were you with these services; how comforted were you? (1 being unsatisfied and 5 being very satisfied)
 - **Question 3**-On a scale of 1-5 how likely are you to choose these services again? (1 being not likely and 5 being very likely)
- A total of 30 patients were included in the study; age ranged from 24-77.



Data and Results

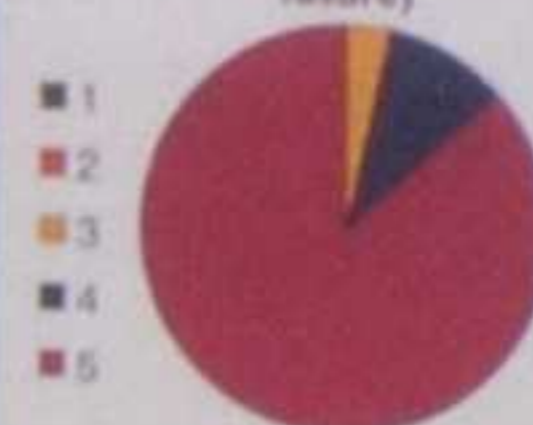
- The scores given by the patients to the second and third questions were recorded and charted.
- Only patients who chose to participate and give the services a score were recorded.
- In one case, a patient brought their own Healing Touch therapist. She was included in the study because she was provided extra services by the PACU staff and chose to give her scores to the questions asked.

Responses to Question 2 (satisfaction scores)



As shown in the graph on the left, most people were satisfied with the services provided. A majority of people responded with a score of 5, meaning they were very satisfied.

Responses to Question 3 (use of services in the future)



The graph on the left shows that while not everyone was completely satisfied, almost 87% of patients replied that they would definitely use them again.

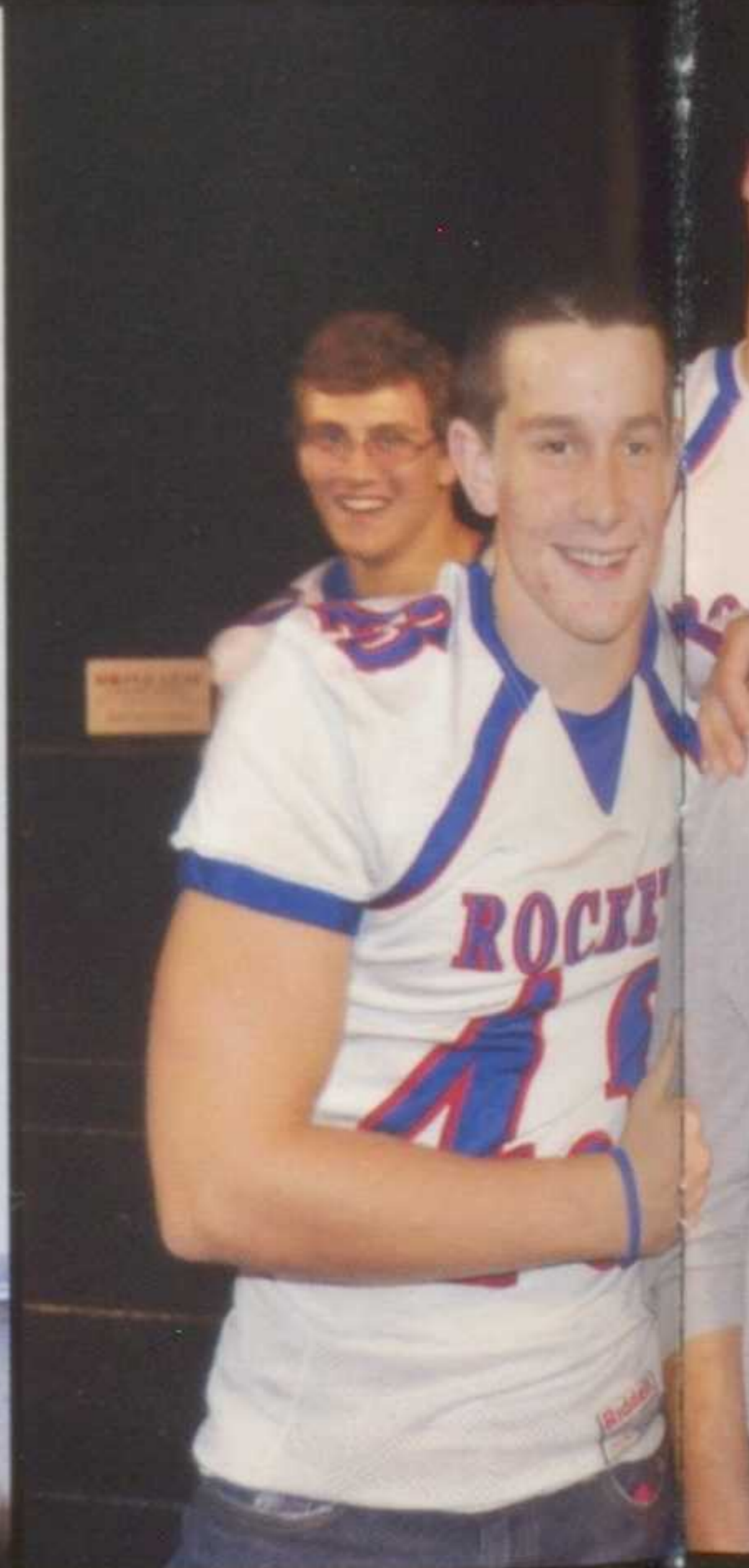
Conc

- Most of the Health and Healing services were participated in.
- It was seen that patients who participated with the services were only in the second quarter.
- There was no one unsatisfied with the services they were given meaning they gave a 5.
- Additionally, while not everyone was completely satisfied they would use the services of a 4 or 5 to the third quarter.
- This study displays that additional services improve satisfaction of postoperative patients.

Recommendat

- It is recommended that the evolving patient centered study would take into account and allow the patient to choose the type of music they prefer.
- Additionally, further study on the effects of the H&H on pain and amount of needed administered.
- Finally, more research on other areas of hospital PACU.

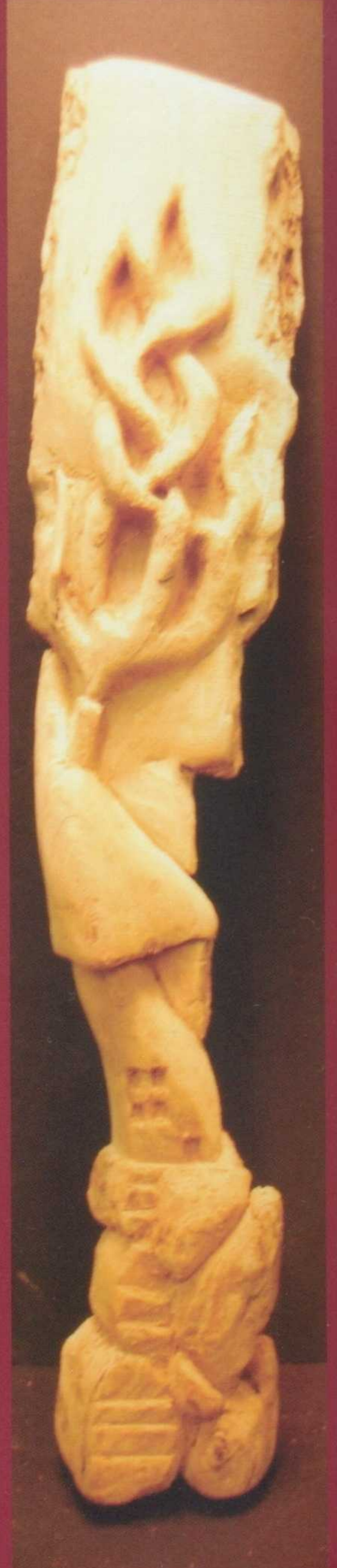

What it means to be an artist

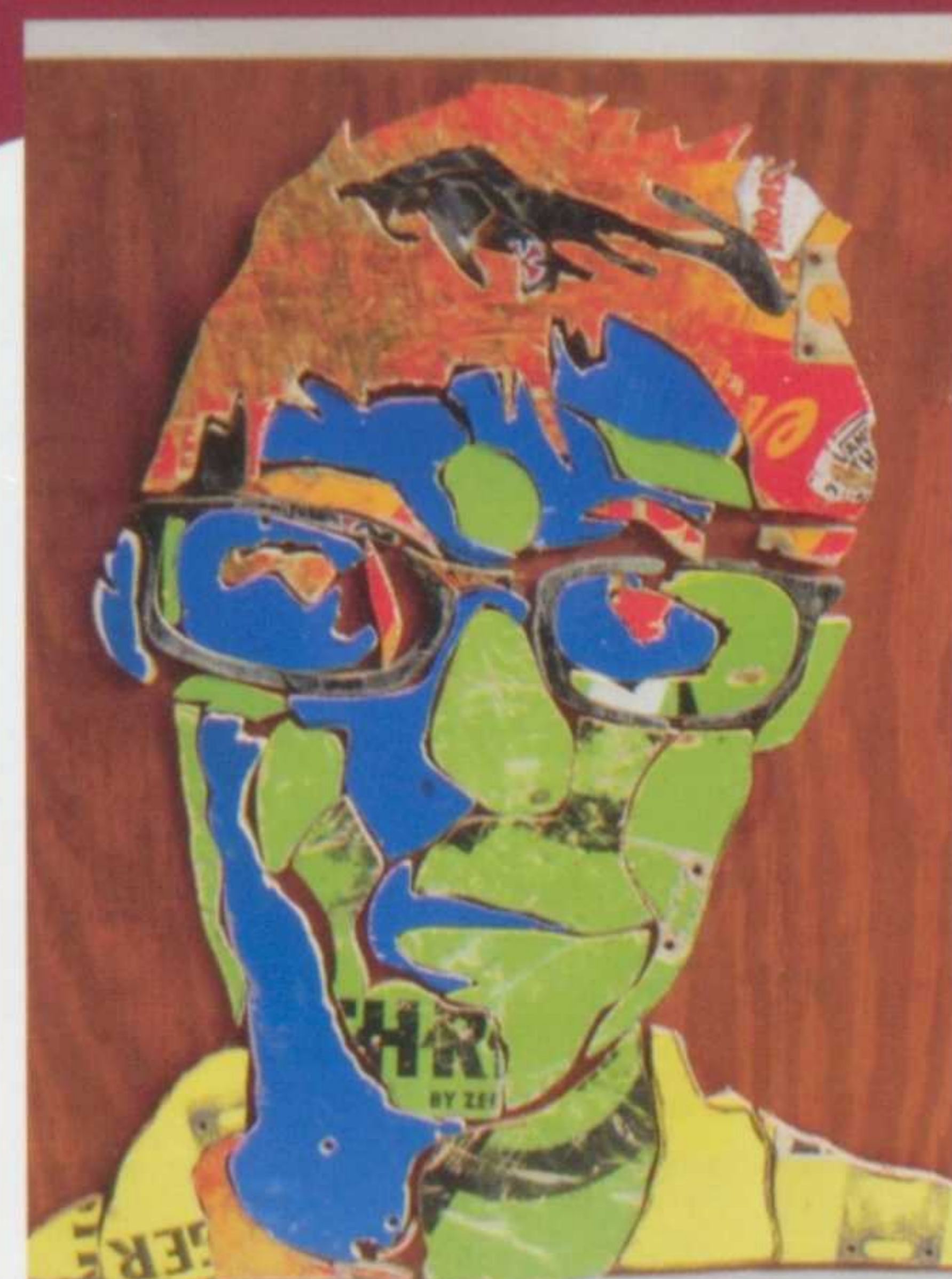
