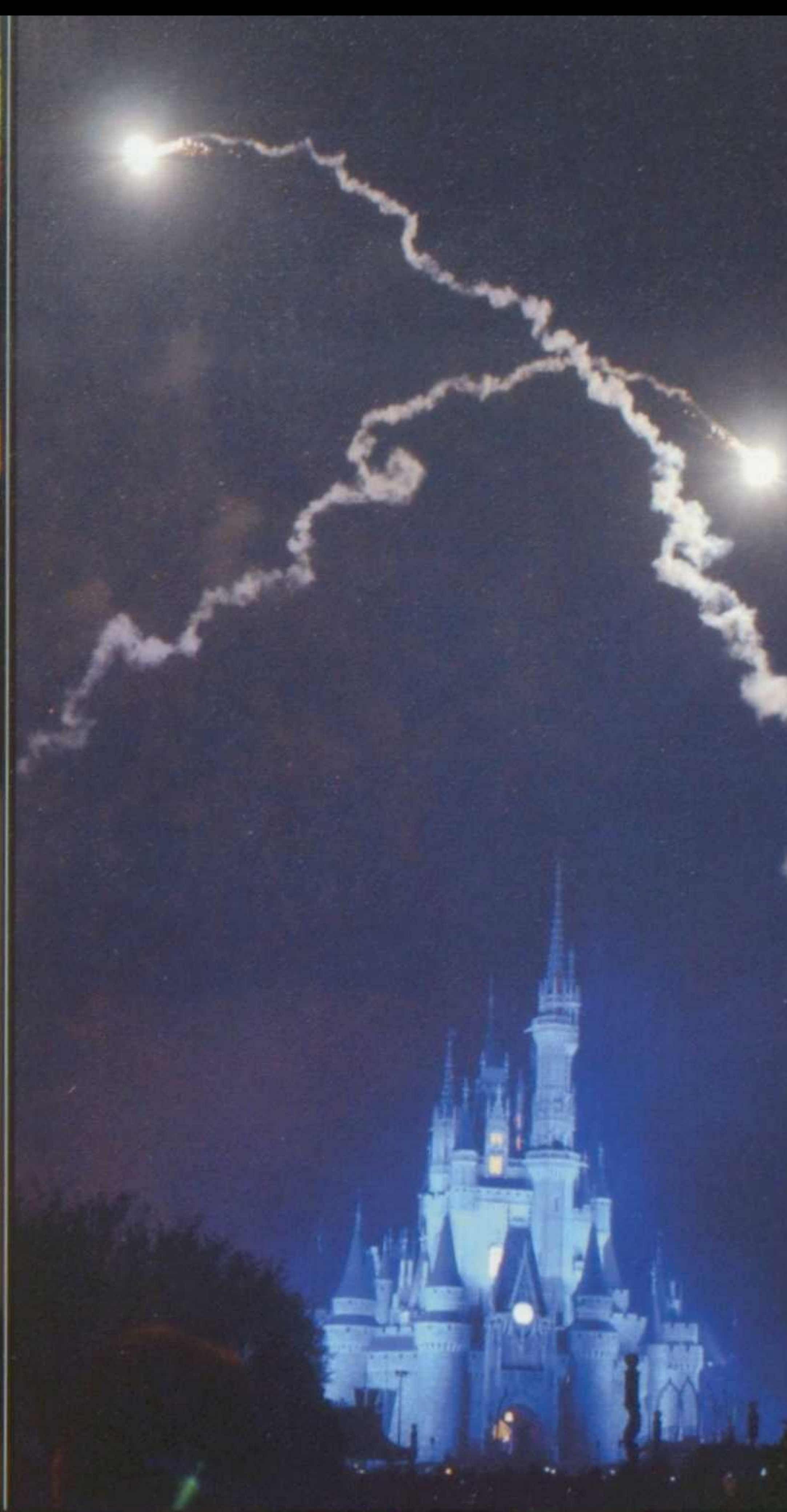


The year included many fun events, such as... *Disney World!*

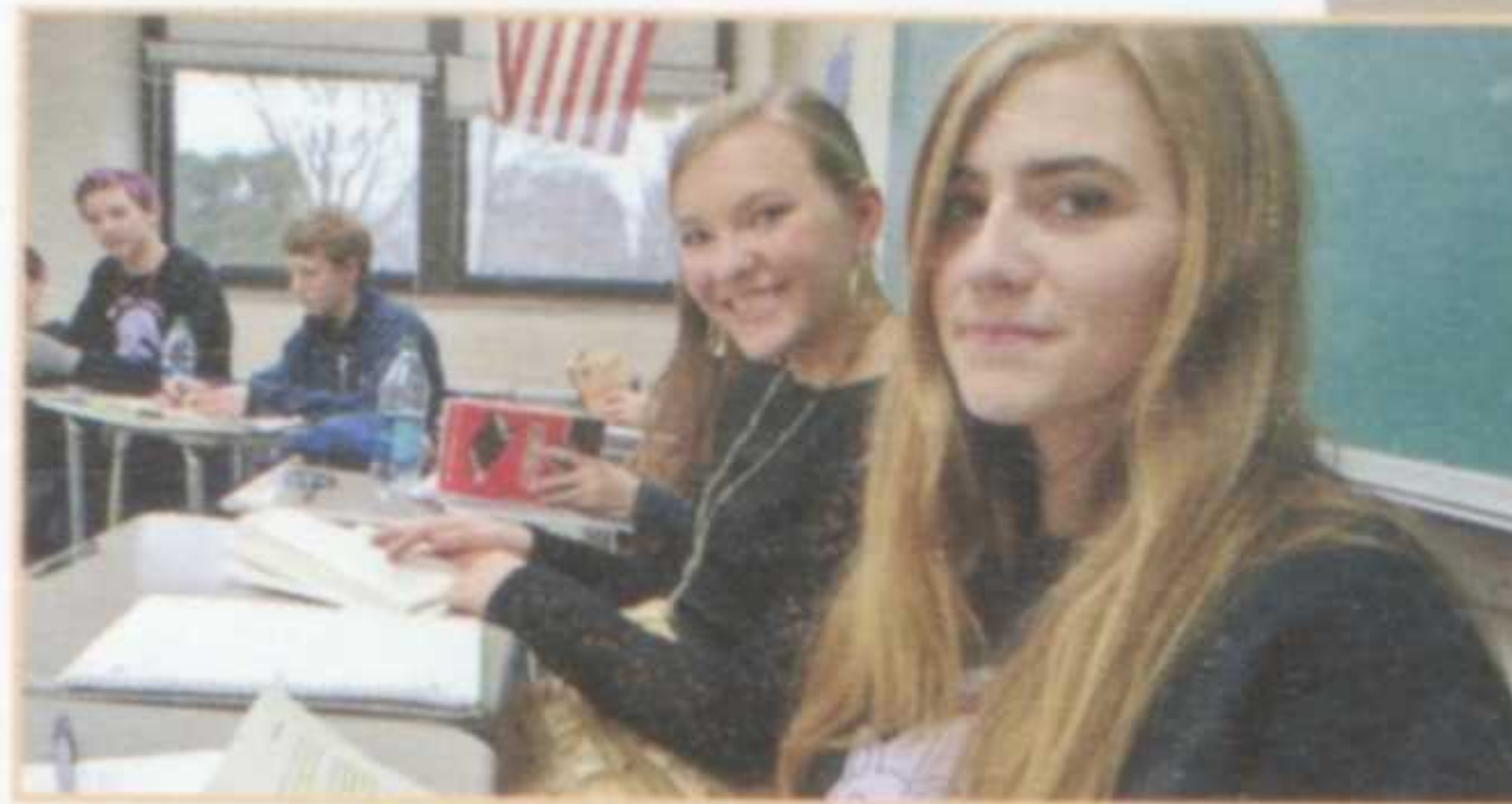




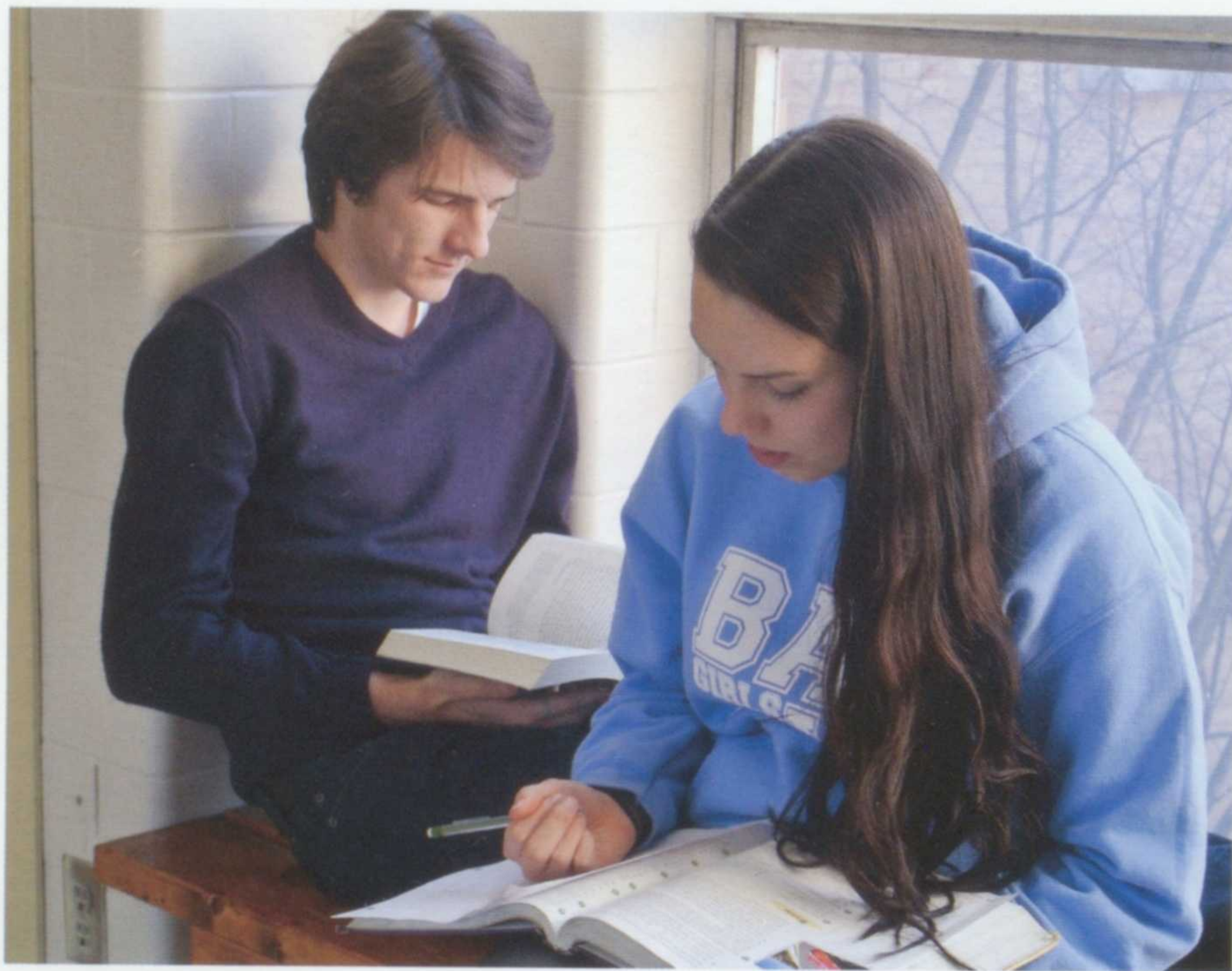
# Academics

Bay High is reputed as one of the best high schools in the state of Ohio. Its numbers are relatively small, with approximately 800 students in the school, yet the building has achieved many accolades. For the 2012-2013 school year, the State Report Card gave the high school an A for indicators met. The passing rate for AP students was outstanding. In the spring of 2013, 233 students took AP exams in 11 subject areas. 366 tests were taken and the passing rate was 83 percent, well above national standards. This excellence of achievement also extends itself to the ACT/SAT scores.

As a whole, the district has received local and national attention. In 2010, Bay High won the prestigious Blue Ribbon award from the State Education Department. The high school has been recognized by U.S. News and World Reports and Newsweek as one of the top schools in the nation. The Rockets started the season off with a trip to Charleston, SC to participate in the Hanahan Invitational Tournament. They played well in SC but came home 0-3, having gained great insight on what skills they needed to work on for the upcoming season. The start of the season was a rough one; they lost the first 4 games in the WSC by one run. The Rockets finally broke out from a 0-12 start by pounding out 15 hits and 9 runs over Fairview. After this, the team played like Dr. Jekyll and Mr. Hyde; some days the offense would show up but the pitching and defense would take the day off. The boys continued to battle, at one point winning 6 of 8 contests. The team finished the regular season 6-20 and 4-10 in the WSC. In the first round of the OHSAA tournament, the club lost to cross town rival Rocky River, 6-5 in 11 innings.

The Rockets were led this season offensively by Craig Linder. He hit over .400 and was responsible for most of the offense. Senior Marty Schuerger and Grad Jake Peters were just behind Linder's offensive contributions. Defensively, the Rockets were "strong up the middle," due to catcher Max Lamb, Grad; shortstop Will Wilson, 12; and sophomore second baseman, Jacob Crossan. The Rockets will be returning ten varsity letter winners and hope to continue to build off the late season success. Marty Schuerger, the projected team leader, looks to conclude his high school career as a star with both the bat and arm.

Of the 2013 campaign, Coach Cheney said, "I was always excited about arriving to the ball park this season. It was a fun group of guys to coach, and they were competitive in every game. Leaving the ball park each night after so many tough losses was a different story!!"

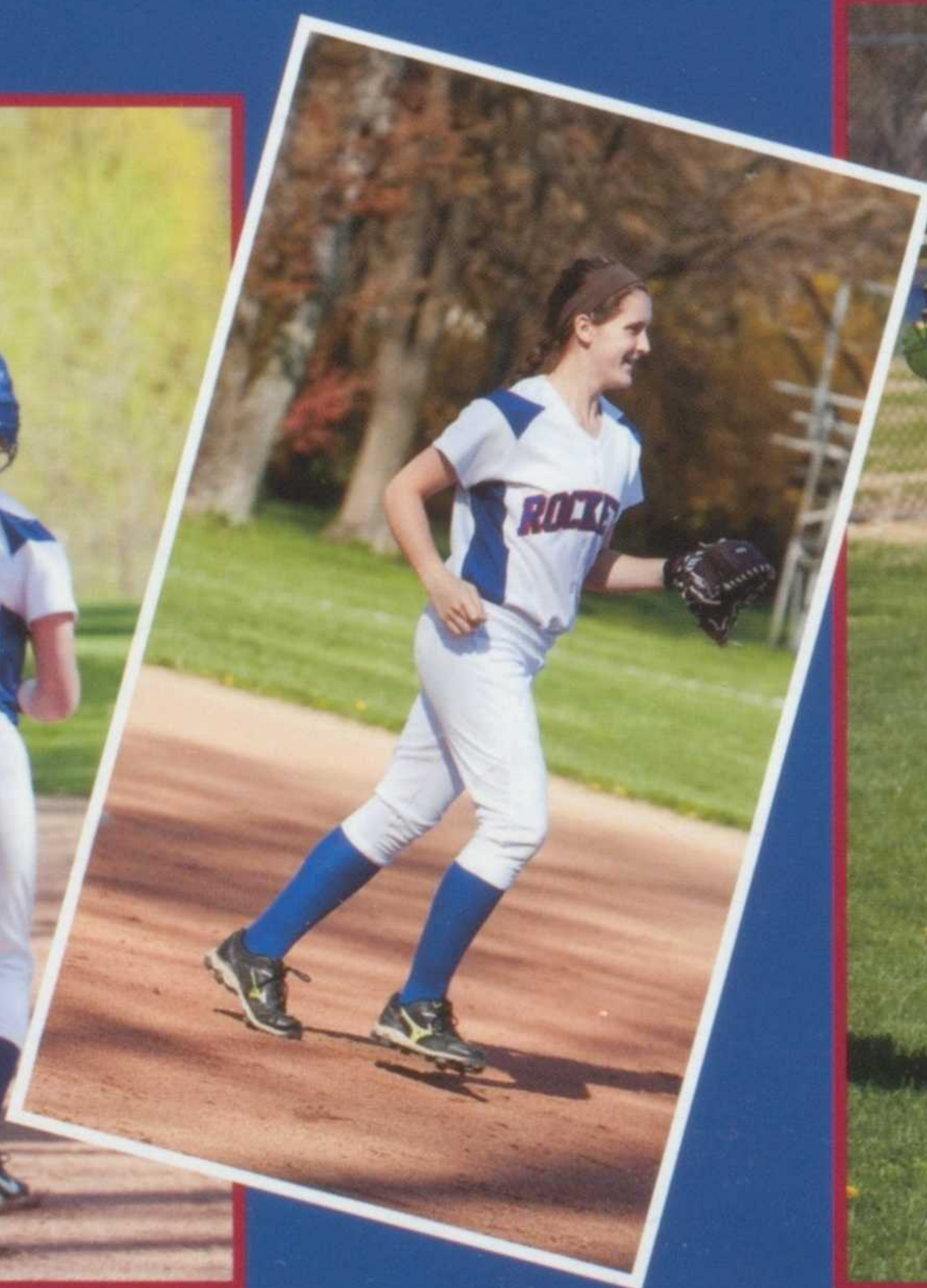

The Lady Rockets were led by the terrific trio of seniors: Stephanie Sheppa, Courtney Woodworth, and Lowry Wisner. They each brought enthusiasm, support and leadership to the game, never giving up the fight to win. The Rockets finished the season with a 9-18 record. After spending three days in Summerville, South Carolina at the Azela Tournament, the Varsity team brought home one win. The trip brought the team closer together and gave them an opportunity to prepare for the fierce competition early in the season. Back in Bay, the Lady Rockets went into the season determined. Courtney Woodworth was the star pitcher, leading the team on the pitcher's mound. She also tied Stephanie Sheppa for the most home runs, breaking the school record with two each. Courtney also lead the team with 29 stolen bases, and a batting average of .393. Lowry Wisner supported the team as a stellar first baseman, always determined to get the out. Her height and agility enabled her to defend the base. She ended the season with a batting average of .302 and the most RBIs, 25. Stephanie Sheppa lead the team with a batting average of .422. She was the leader of outfield in center, never losing focus. She was consistently encouraging and supportive. Stephanie also led the team in OB% at .485. The Lady Rockets welcomed Coach Shetzer to the team as the assistant varsity coach. Leading the outfielders, he aided in the development of a stronger outfield, always reminding them that the first step is always back. His determination combined with Coach McCarthy's enthusiasm benefited the girls attitude toward success. Despite the losing record for the team, Coach McCarthy said, "The season had its ups and downs but the girls always worked hard. We were in a lot of games and had only one inning get away from us. We had a lot of firsts this year with girls hitting home runs and high batting averages. The team as a whole improved every day. The group of girls is such a great group of people. They are some of the nicest kids at Bay High School. In Round Two of the playoffs, Bay lost to to top-seeded Chagrin Falls. Two varsity players received post-season awards from the OSLA: Sophia Steyns and Ellie Faile.





# It starts at the draw

Perhaps the biggest story of the young lacrosse team has been the success of **Sophia Steyns**. The team's captain will graduate this season, leaving the squad without a superstar. Like her older sister, Lydia, Sophia started her career in sixth grade, playing for the Rocky River Recreation League because Bay was without lacrosse. In River, Sophia started as a mid-fielder and learned the essence of the game from coach Kim Russel. Russel, now the coach at BW, taught Sophia the basics from cradling to zone defense and dodges and draw control. After rec league, Sophia progressed to Ohio Premiere Lacrosse. Russel coached this exclusive league, which consisted of northeast Ohio's best players performing in national play. During her time in Premiere League, Sophia developed from her competition against older and more accomplished players. (Some of them were up to four years older.) After six years, Russel and Sophia still work with one another in the off-season, and Sophia calls her a "role model." Bay did not have a Lacrosse team during Sophia's freshman year, so she took the summer off, playing Premiere Soccer. When Bay announced the start of the lacrosse team, Sophia was, "happy and excited because my mom was one of the people who pushed for the Lacrosse team." In her first season of high school lacrosse, she scored the inaugural goal for Bay High; overall, she was the lead scorer and carried the team two games into the playoffs. As a junior, Sophia was chosen as the team captain—the first girls' captain—and also led the team in all offensive categories: goals, points, ground balls, and assists. Sophia awaits the spring because, "We have a lot of natural outthauls that are gaining a love for the game as well. And we are going to work even harder this year to improve our record yet again."

Several other records broken throughout the season included: Most ground balls per game, which was broken by Senior Jake Best (with 21 versus Padua), and most saves per game, which was broken by graduate goalie P.J. Nye versus Kenston, who also broke the record for most saves in a career with 297. **Steve Burns, Grad** (right), broke the record for the most points in a season with 71 and the most points in a career with 170. Burns also broke the record for most goals in a career with 116.







# Sweet Sixteen- Again!



The Bay Boys Lacrosse team finished a successful season with an overall record of 10-6, going 4-2 in the conference. The boys defeated Holy Name in their first tournament game outscoring their opponent by 16-1. A senior, Jacob MacMillan, (left) broke two records that game, having 7 assists as well as 11 points. Graduate Steve Burns lead the team across the board with 46 goals, 25 assists, and 71 points. Leading the team in ground balls with 90 was Grad Max Langer. The Bay High Boys Lacrosse team had two reward winners for the season: Jake Best and Steve Burns. Jake Best received the DII Northwest Region 2nd Team award for midfield, while Steve Burns received the DII Northwest Region 1st Team award for attack. Senior Henri Adams offered his input: "The 2013 season was a good one for the Boys Lax Team. We made it to the Sweet Sixteen in the State for the second season in a row, but it would have been nice to continue on further. This year's team was the strongest in the program's history, and we are sad to say goodbye to our valiant seniors: Steve Burns, Joe Kubinski, Bubbles Nye, Alex Tober, Dylan Accorti, Andy Barbour, Max Langer, and Brandon Farnham."

**Q:** What is your experience as a tennis player?

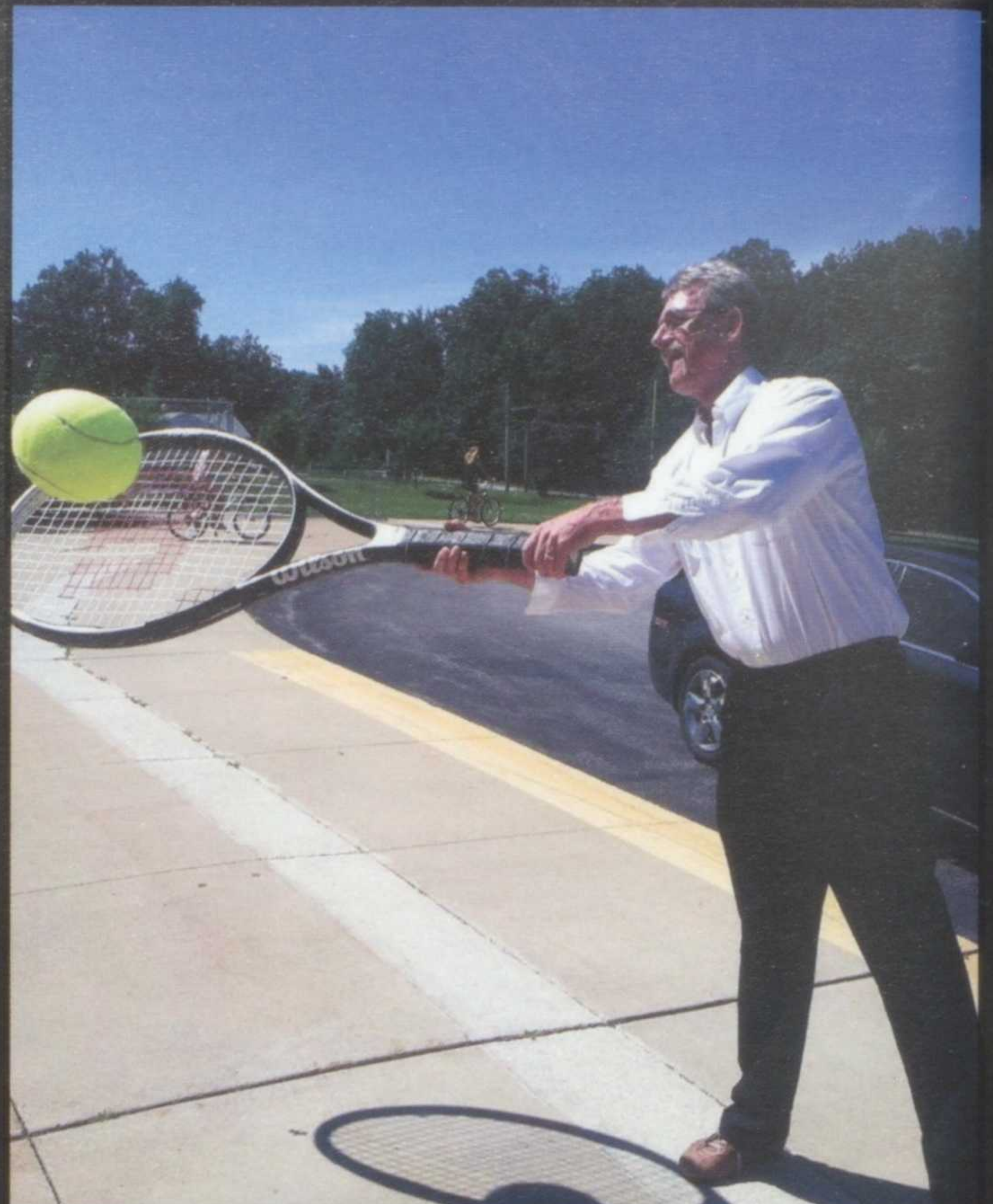
**A:** I played high school and college tennis at the varsity level, and then after that, I primarily played in leagues and tournaments. I'm still pretty active in an old man's league, since I'm an old man. So, I'm coaching clinics...all the good stuff.

**Q:** How does Bay's tennis program differ from other schools?

**A:** I think we have a larger focus on participation and skills development. My assistant coaches and I try to make this the most positive experience that we can, and although we like to win, and we've won conference championships and sent teams to States, the goal of the program is to develop a passionate and lifelong skill. You can take this wherever you go, whether you play in leagues or just knock the ball around with your family. We develop an enthusiasm for the sport throughout competition and the program.

**Q:** It is well known that you were a professional basketball player in Germany. Care to give us some background on your career there?

**A:** Ah yeah, well, that sounds a lot better than it probably actually was. I took college basketball skills to Germany, and they have Olympic quality basketball now, but when I played there, I was a man among boys. I did make money playing basketball there, but because of my requirements in college and grad school, I could only play a season and a half total. And the pay wasn't such that I could make a career out of it.



Basketball players last five, ten years max, so that was not my life path. It was fun while it lasted; playing hoops was something I really loved, before my knees deserted me. I made a lot of good friends and had a good experience in Germany.

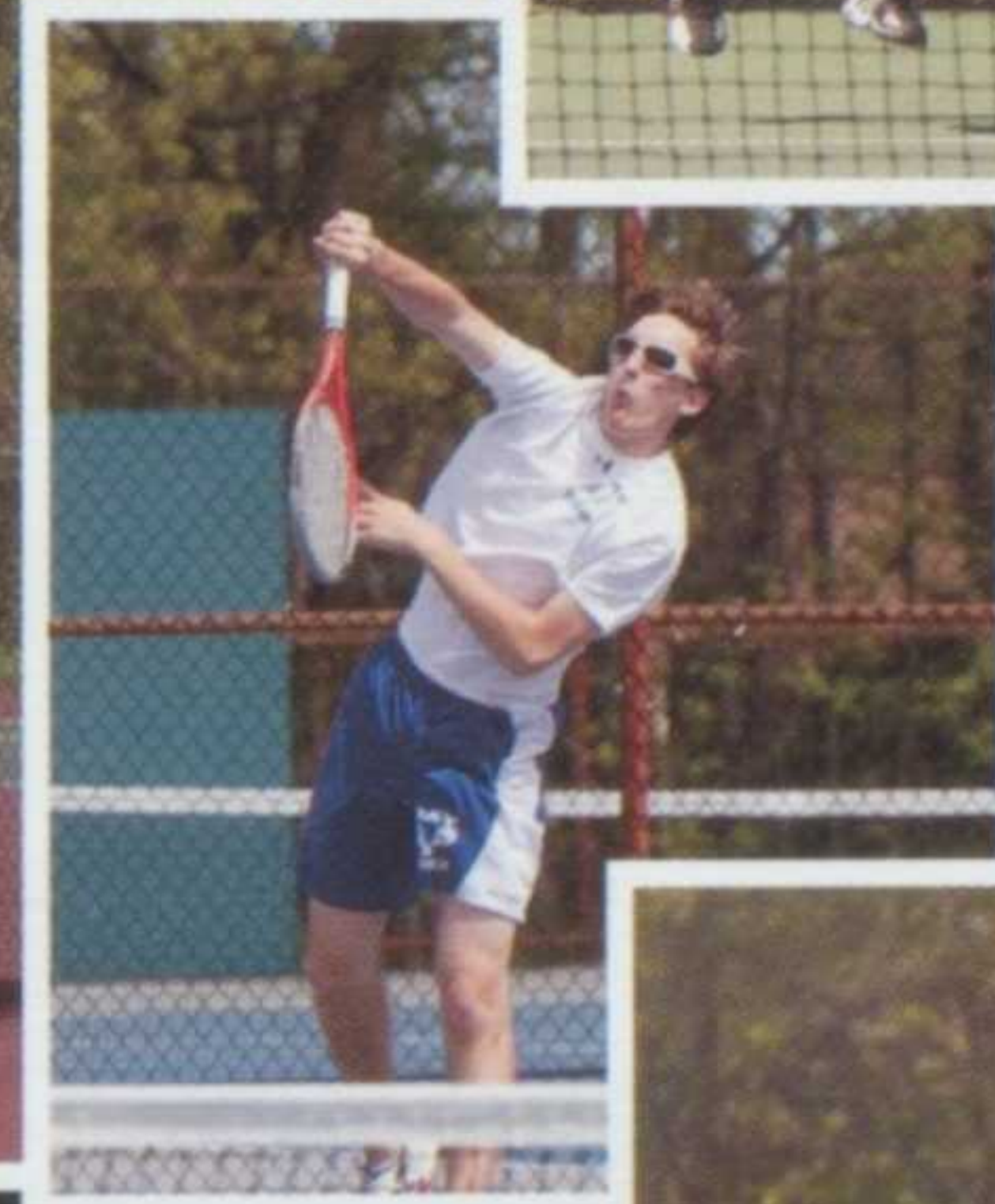
**Q:** Aside from sports, you seem to have many academic interests, and students and faculty admire you. Would you like to share how you came to such a great love for learning?

**A:** I love anything with humanities, whether it's history, or the arts, or music and literature. To be interested in that stuff is to be interested in

life. I teach those things, but it is also my life's hobby. You probably know that I'm a potter, and I'm also an avid gardener, and that's kind of the beauty of life. We're not stuck doing the same things over and over again. We can expand what we can do and we can create things. The history is basically looking at the creations of other people and how they went right and how they went wrong. I'm fortunate enough that my parents passed on this enthusiasm to me, so I can pass it on to the students I have in my classroom as well.

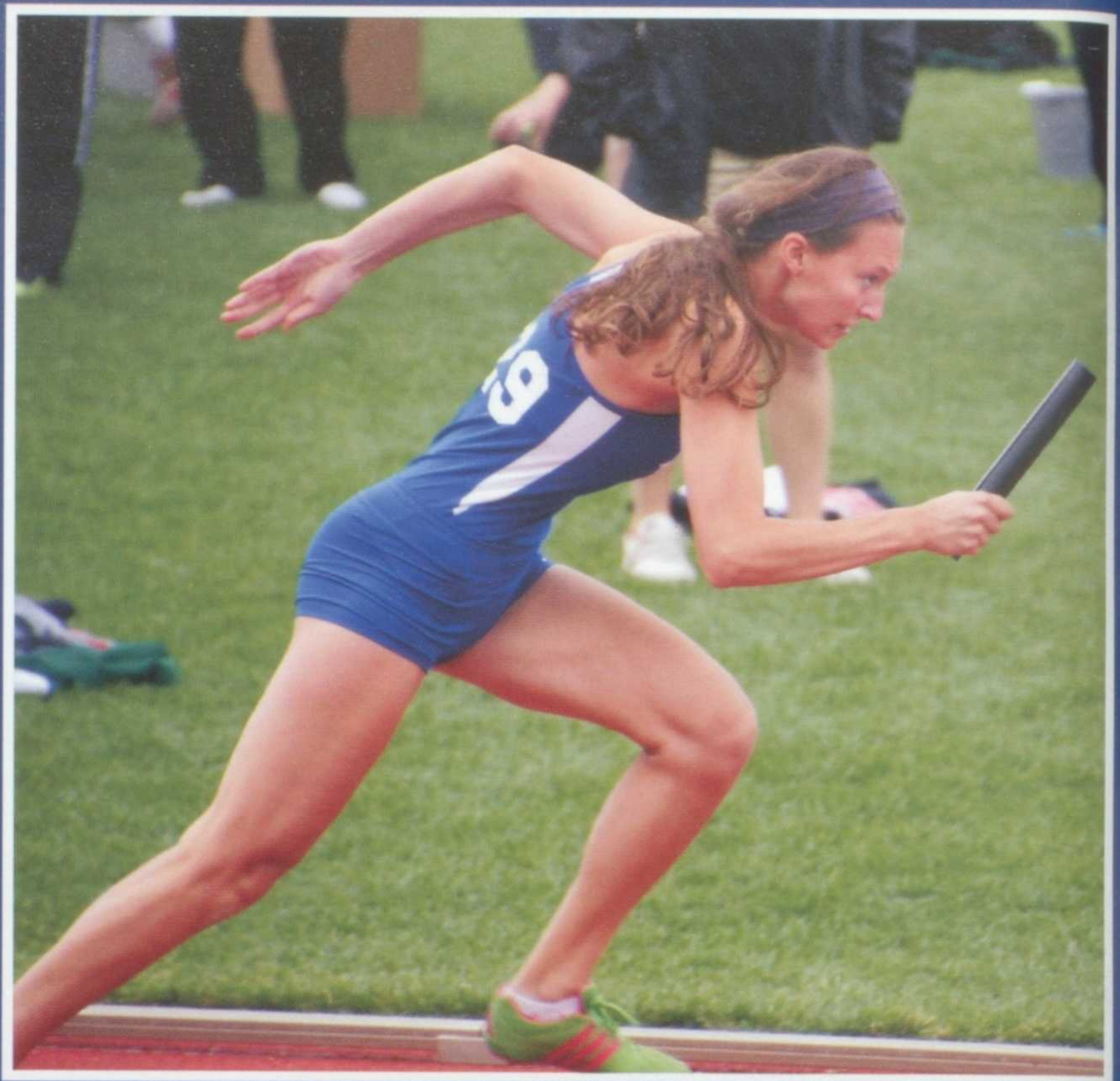


# Scrubs City to the States

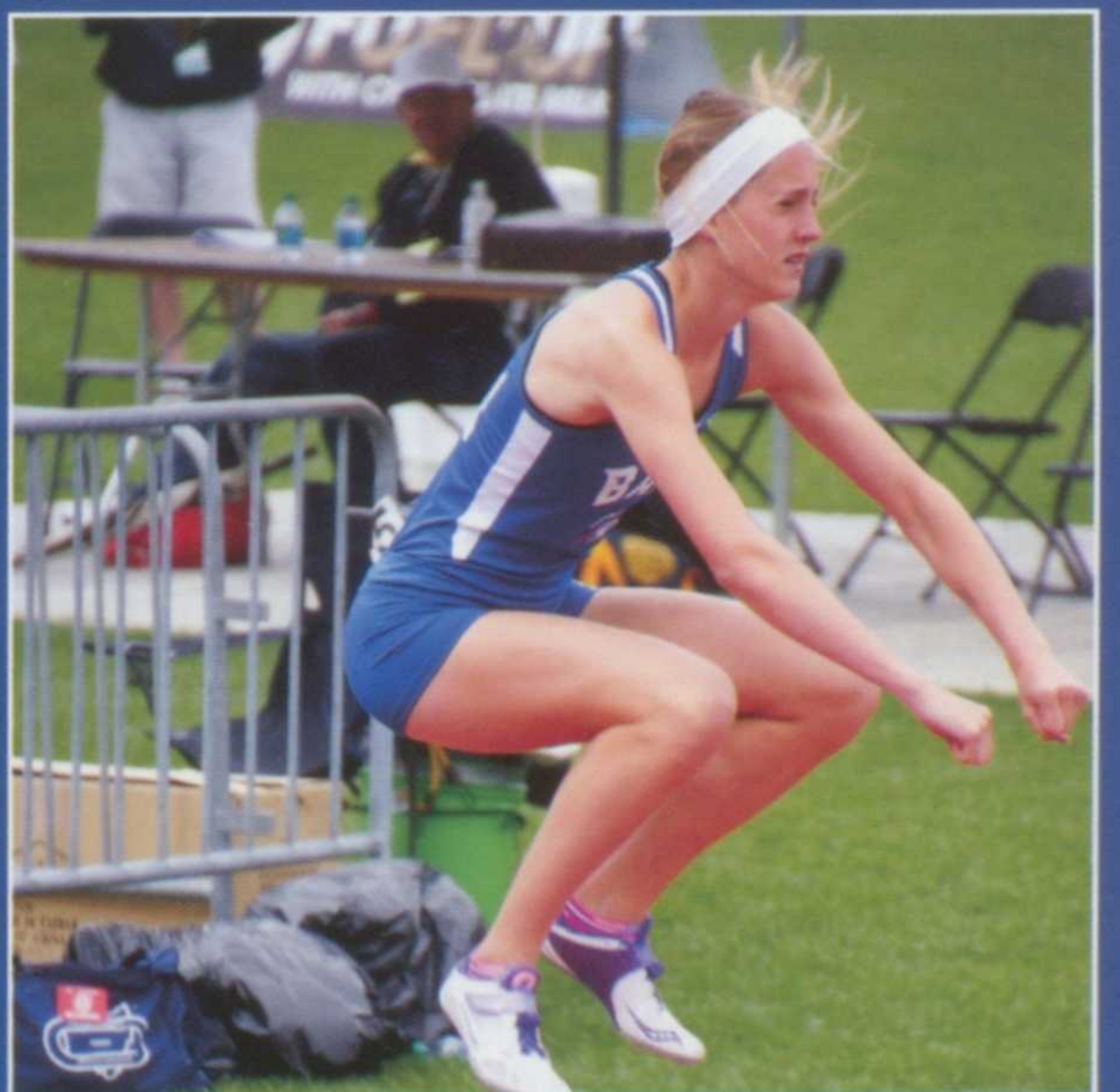


Graduate James Fell classified the boys 4 by 800 team as a motley crew, a scrub city of sorts: "Scrub city because we were a bunch of scrubs. All teams looked the same- but our team did not. We all looked different; we had one kid who played basketball, one kid who played football, and Isaac, who is a seasonal runner. I'm the only full time runner. We weren't expecting to go to the State or make it to 8th." The boys made 8th with a season best time of 8:01.73. Fell lead the relay off with a 1:59 split which put the team in great position. Isaac Mertic ran a strong second leg with a 2:04. Matt Orr kept the team in striking distance with a 2:01, and then anchor Zach Baumgard was able to catch a couple of teams in the last few hundred meters with a 1:56 split. The girls track team sent representatives to multiple events. Olivia Bechtel shined as a first year track member. The former middle school champion in the 400 ran the event during the States competition and also participated in the 4 by 200.

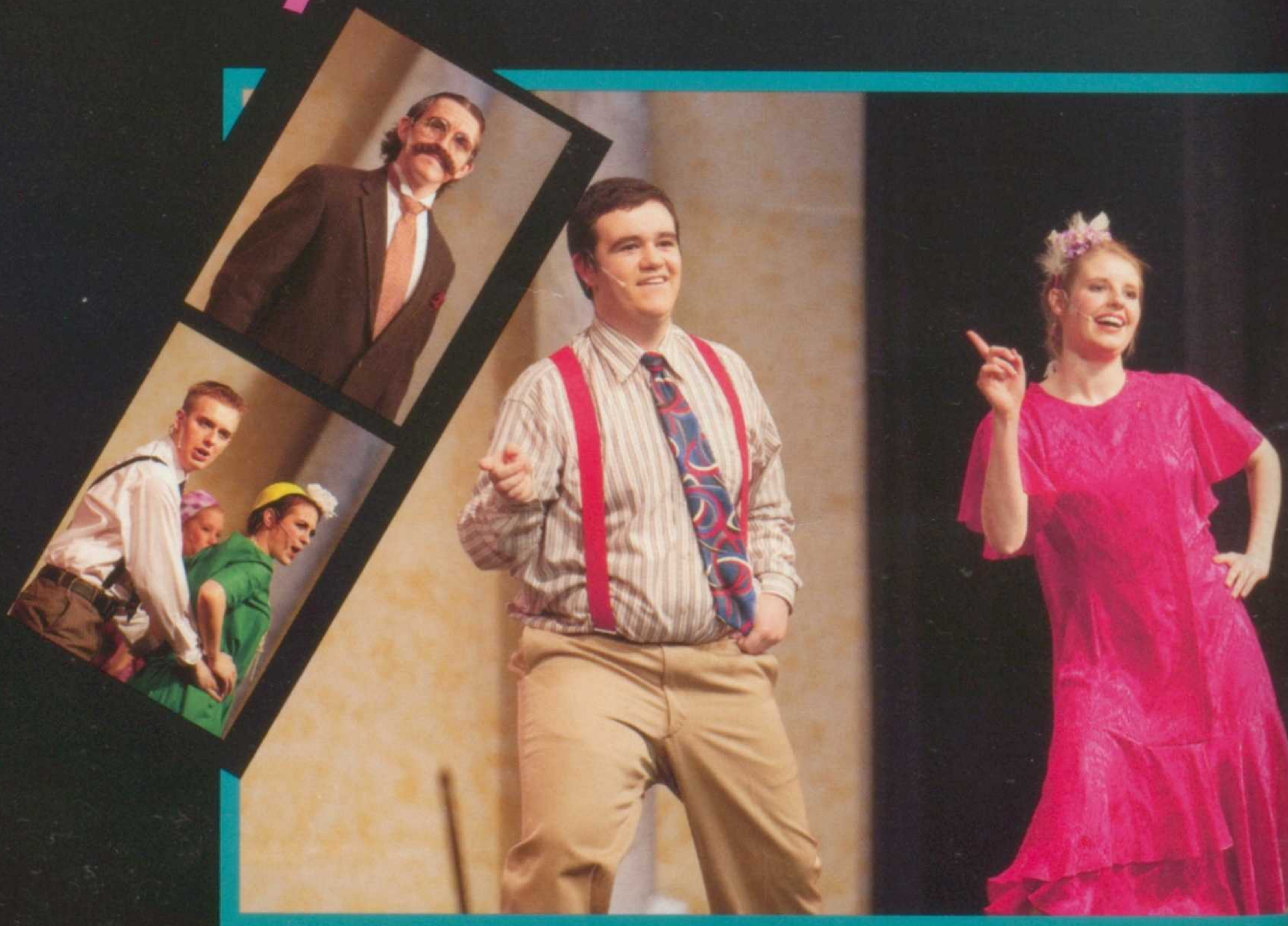

The production received positive feedback from both the cast members and the audience. Some cast members offered commentary on their experience in "The Boyfriend":

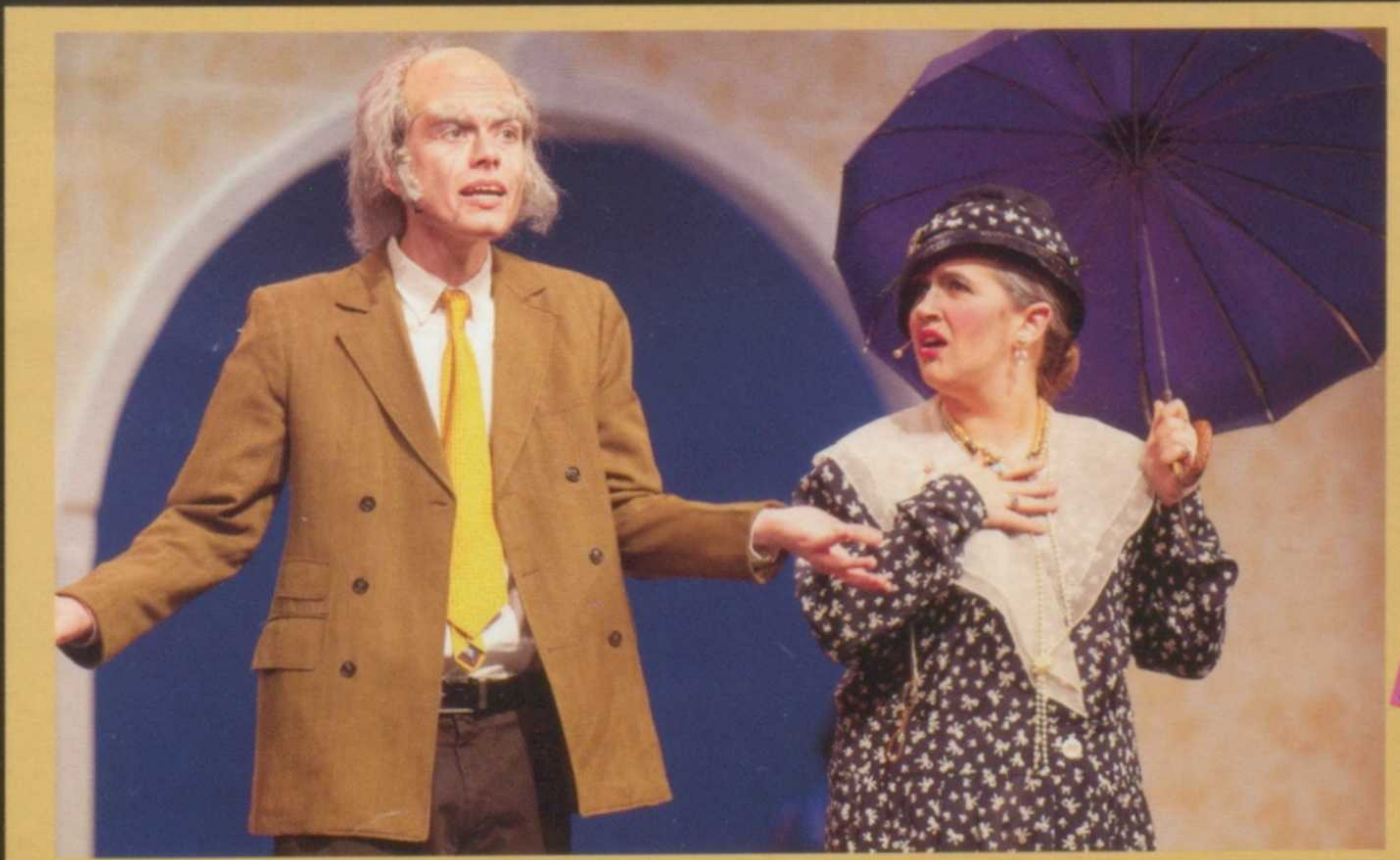

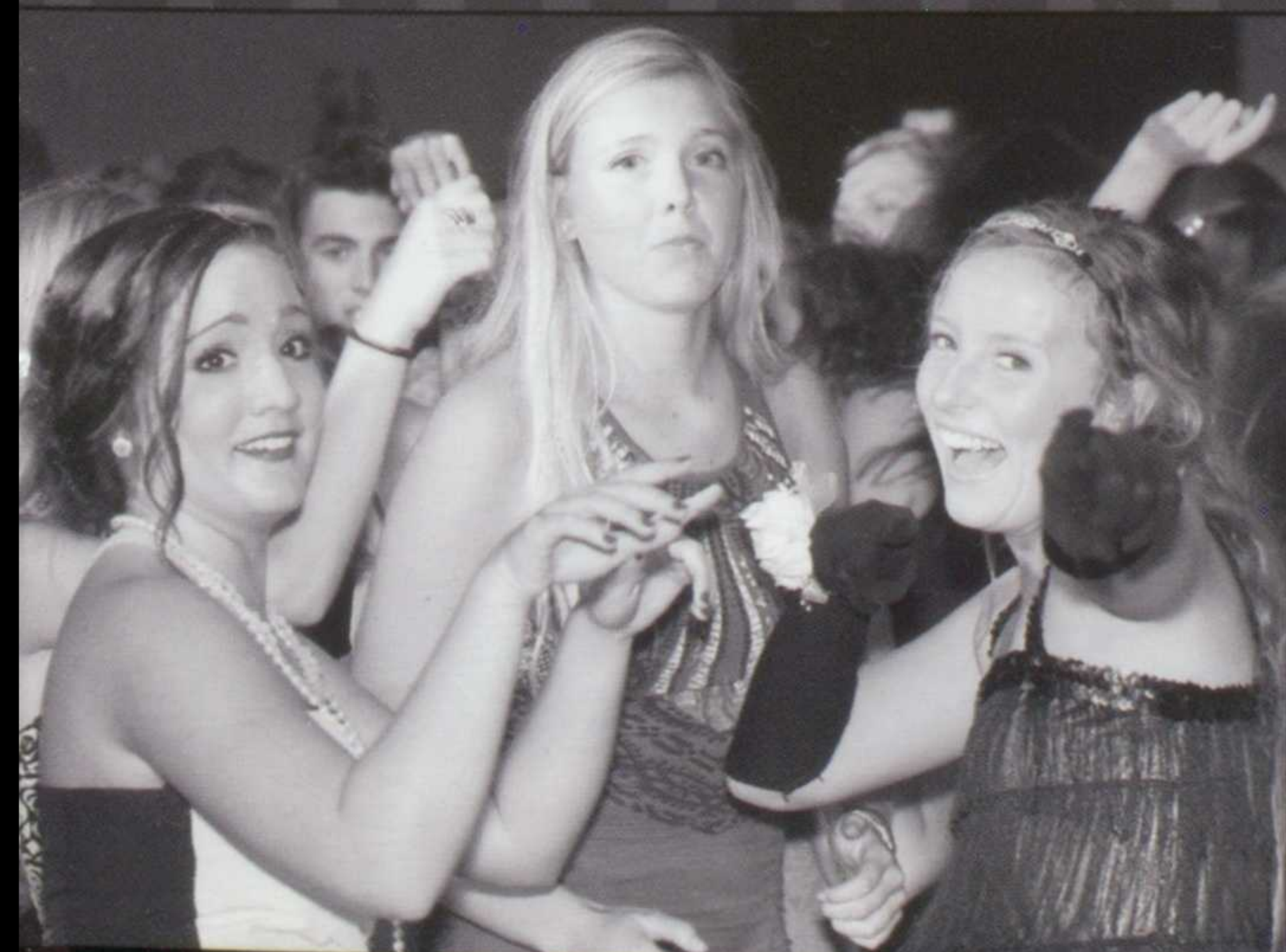




## Dance like nobody's watching

# BAND OF Brothers



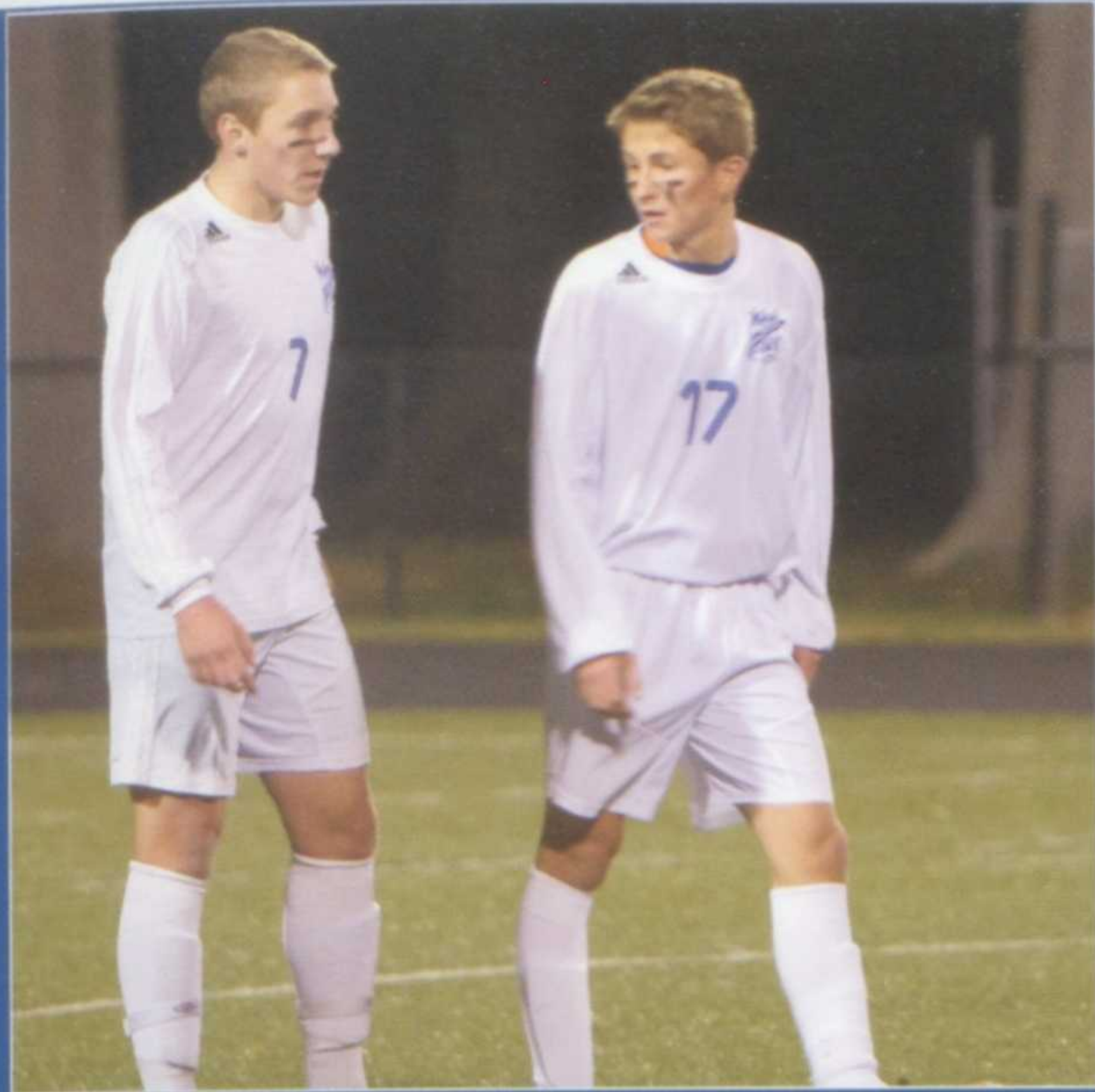

# Just For Kicks

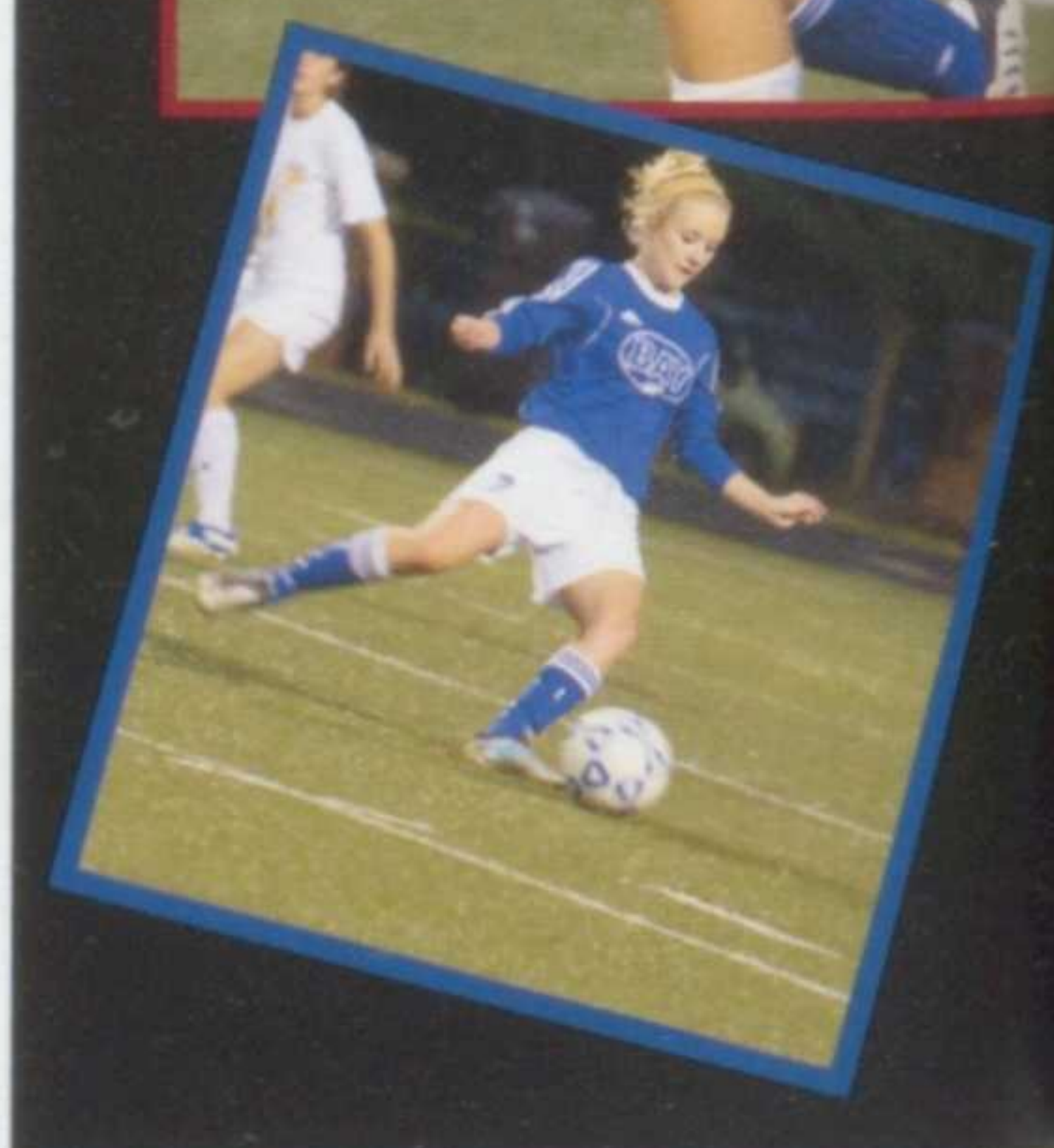

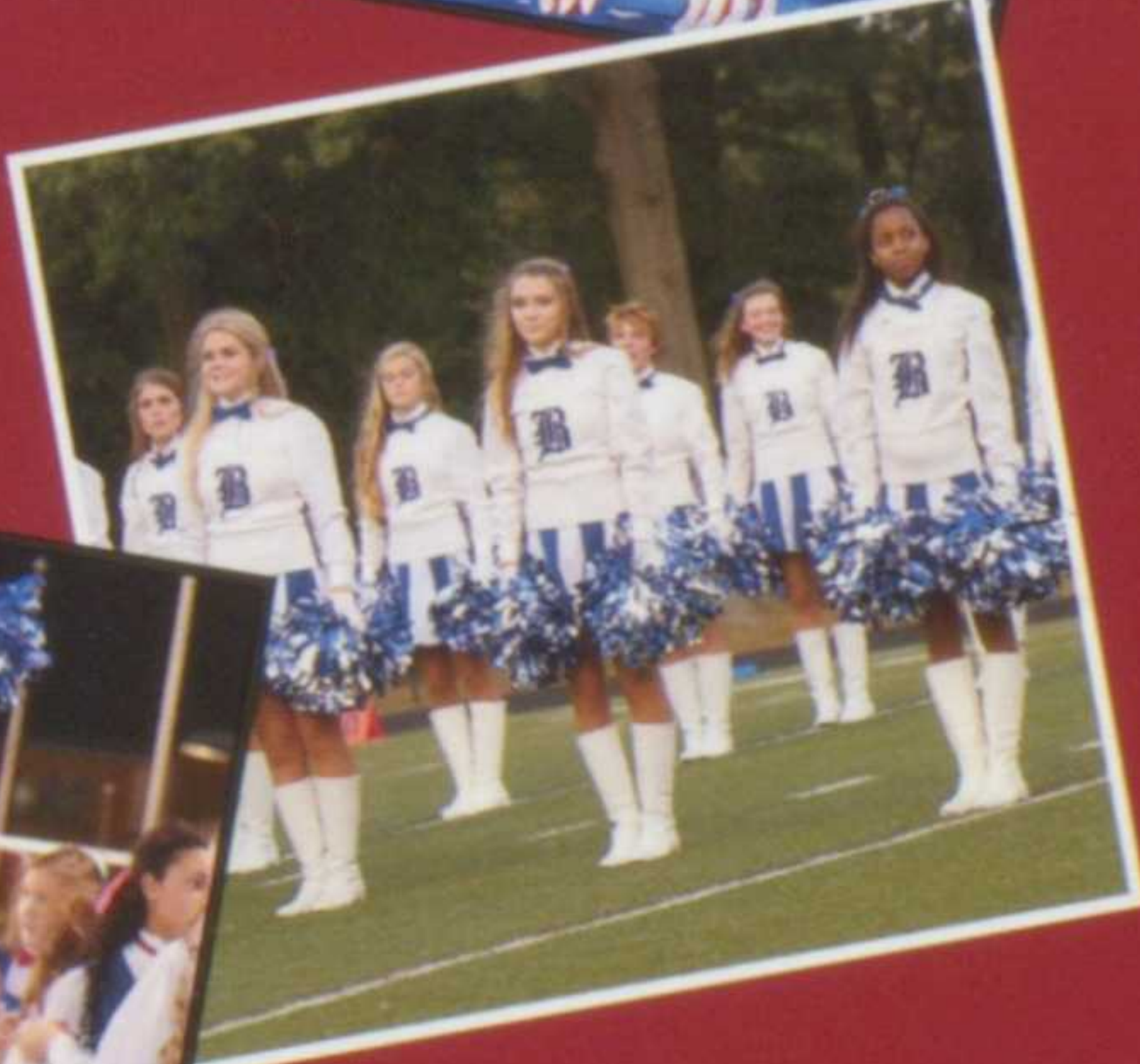

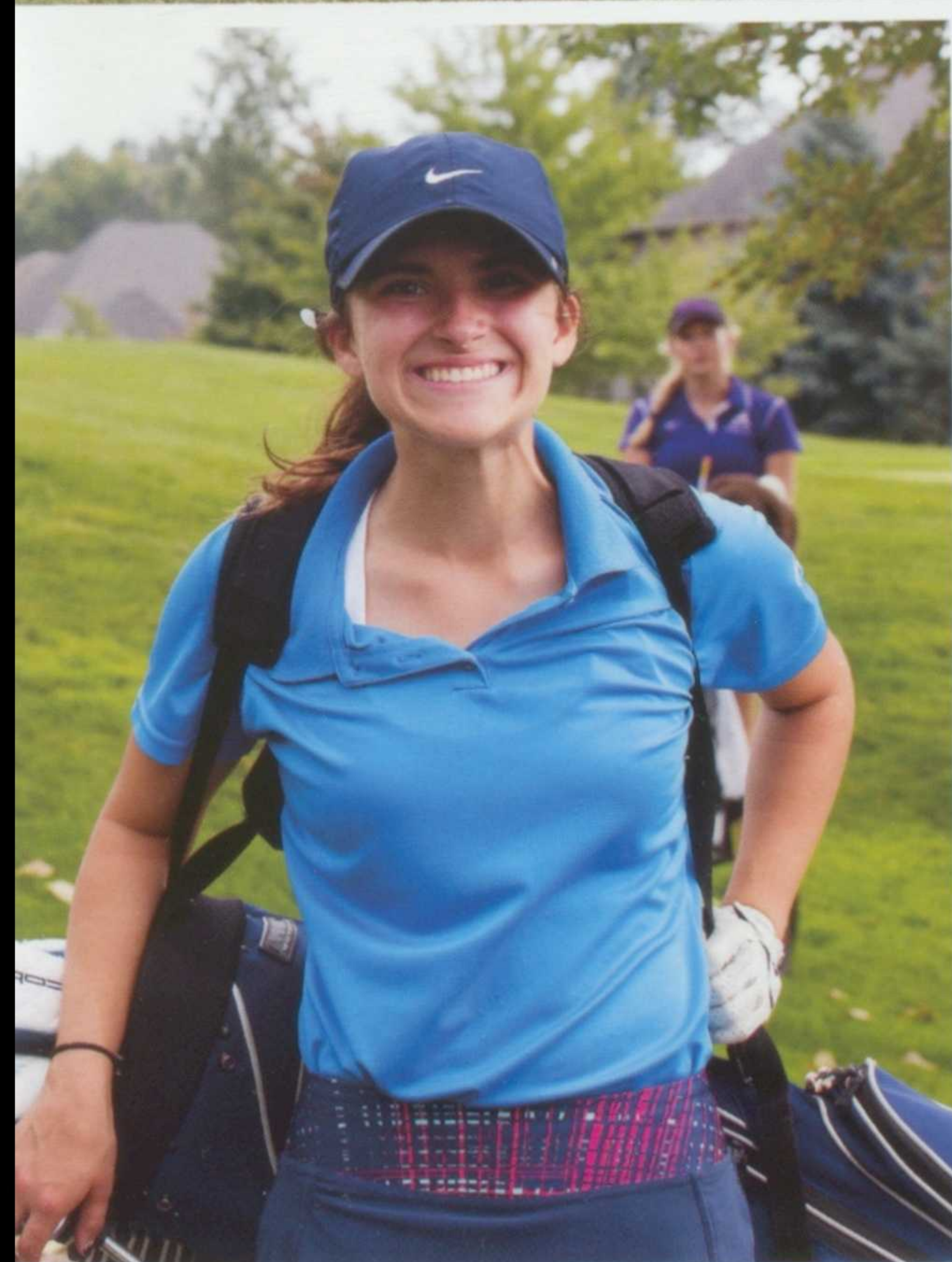

Dominic Muccio shot an 80 and missed individually qualifying by one stroke as well. Despite the disappointment, Jack Kyle shot a 79. As a reward for the great play of Muccio and Kyle, they received honorable mention for the All-West Shore Conference team.

Jack Kyle received the 2013 Most Valuable Player award, granted by the team. His nine hole scoring average was 39.3; his eighteen hole scoring was 80.5. 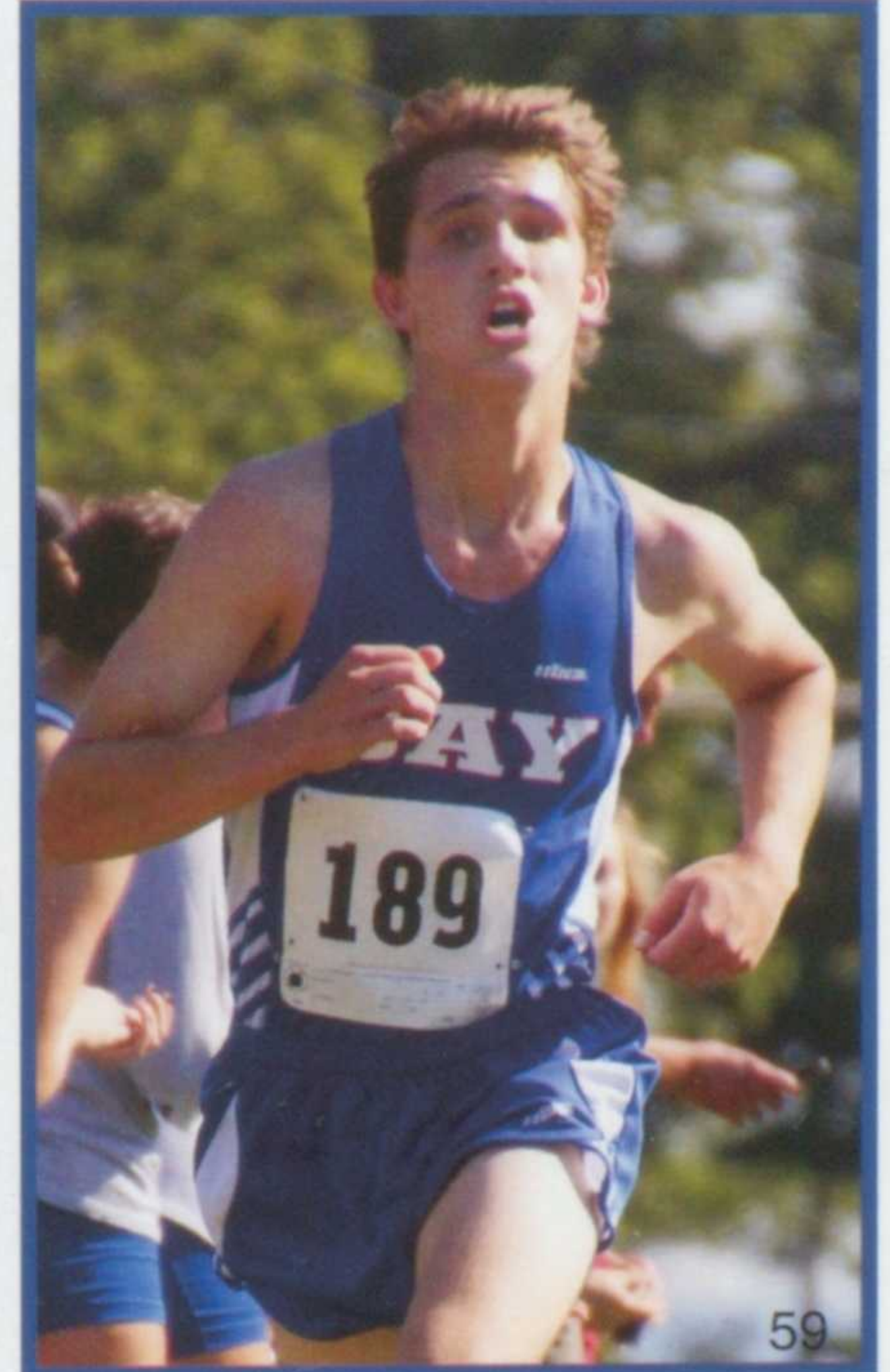

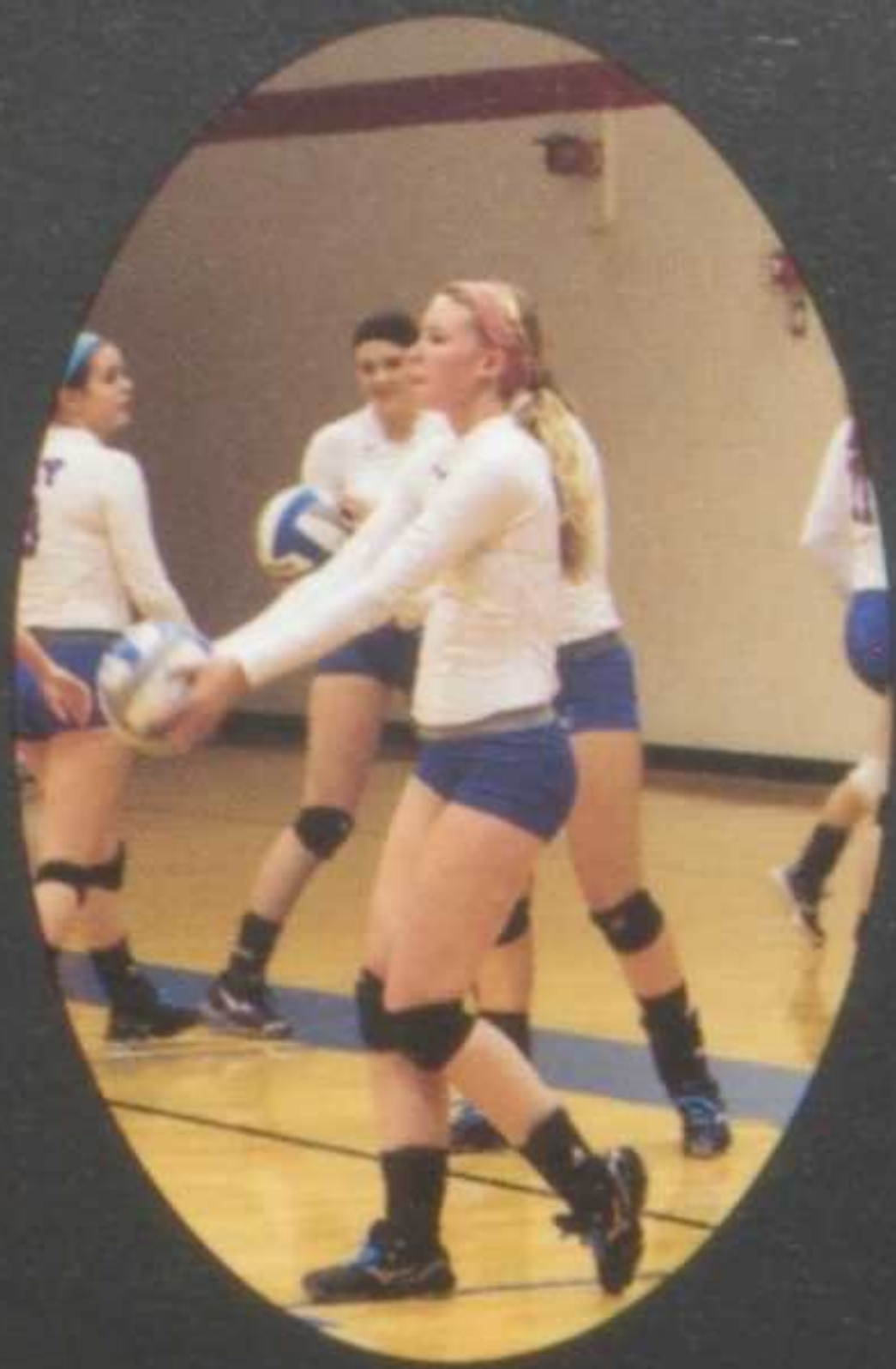

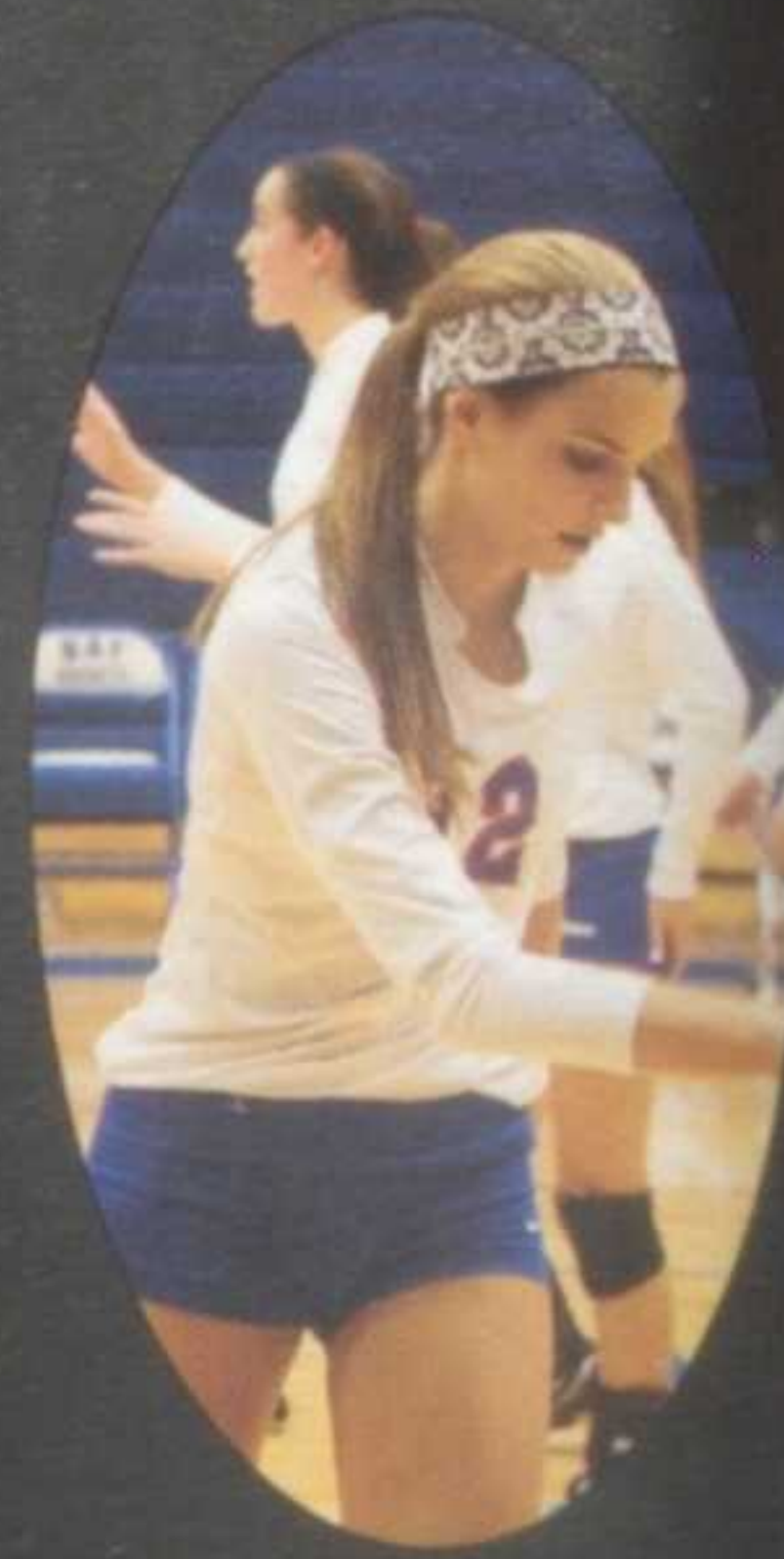

# Can you dig it?



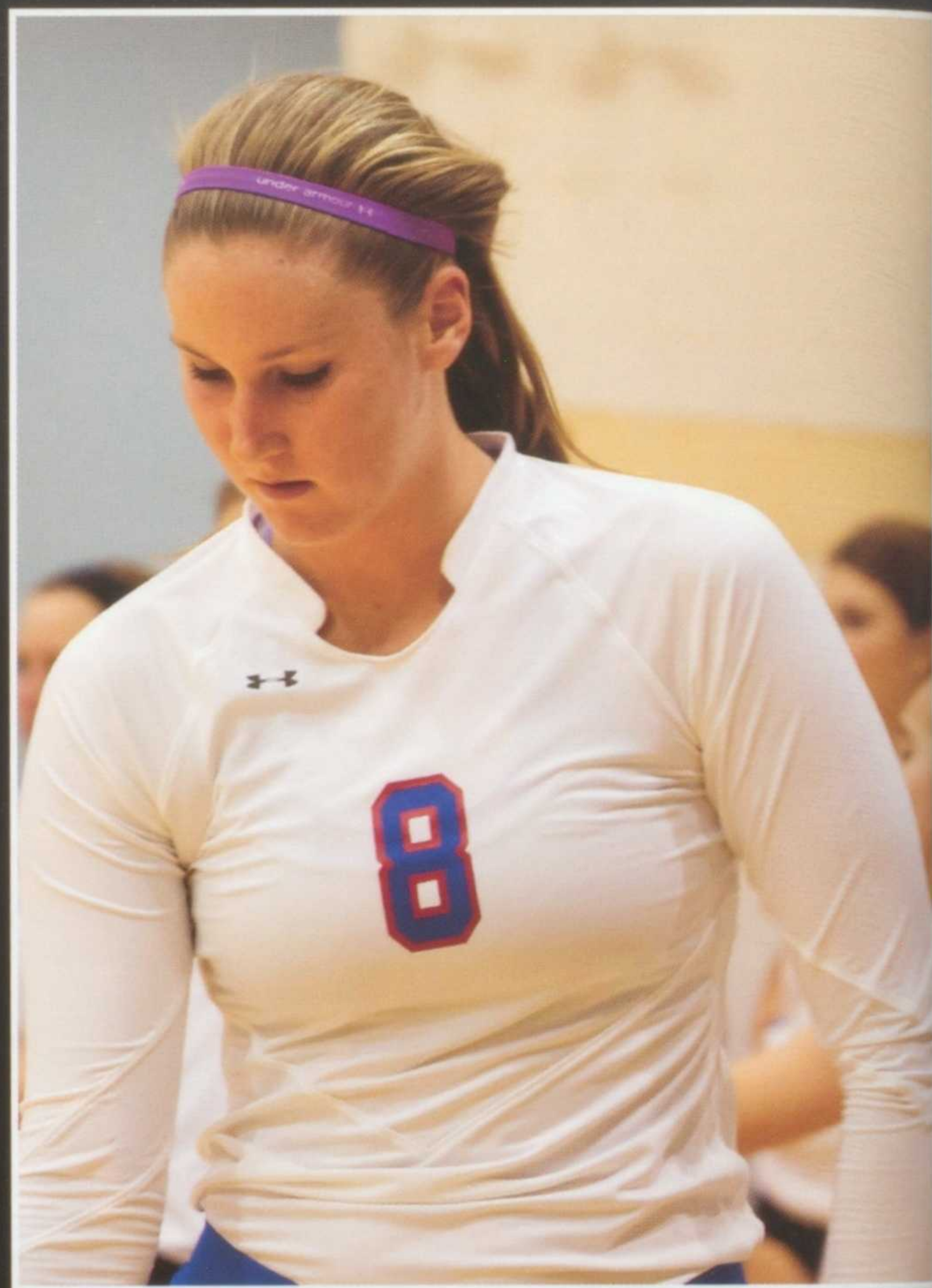

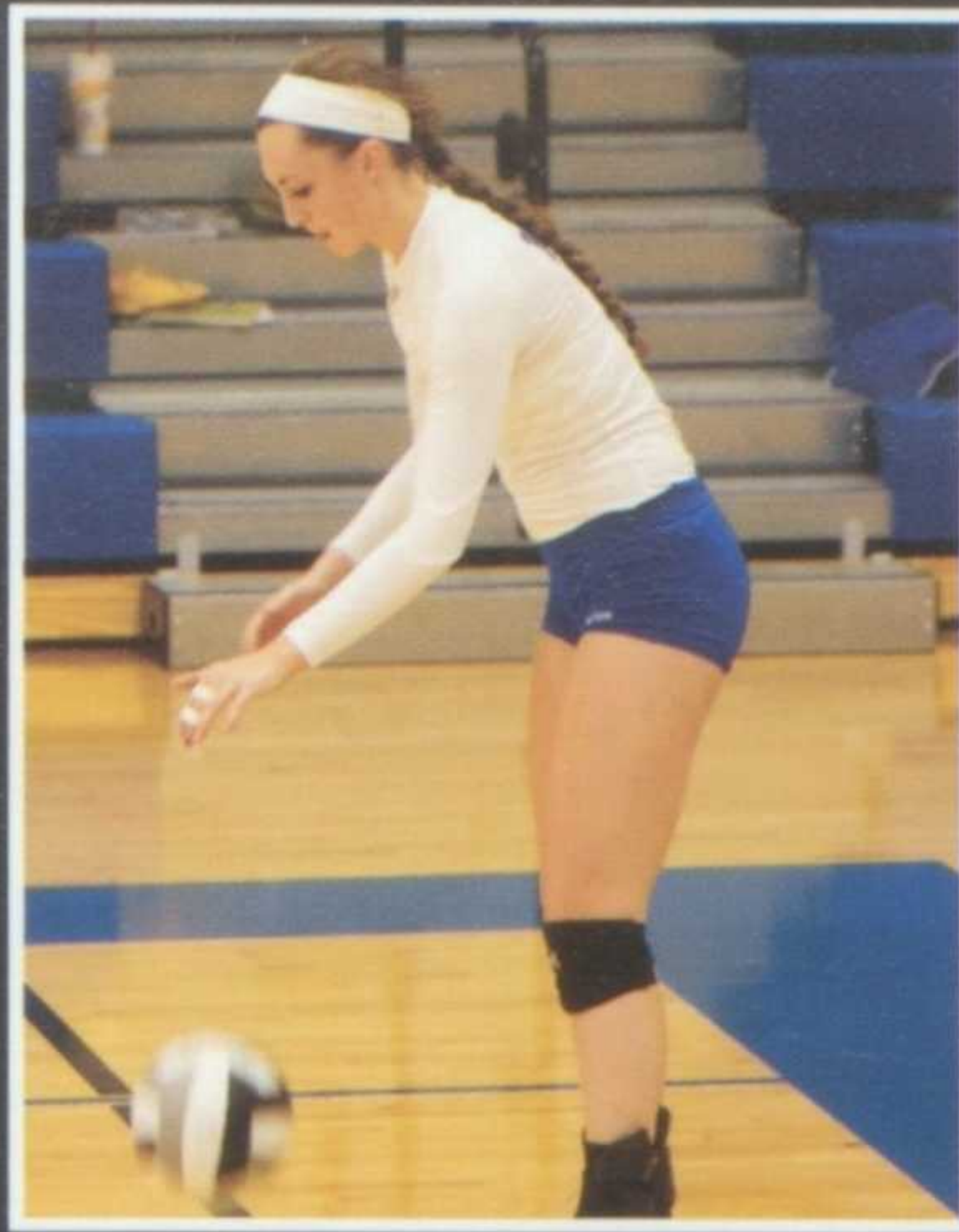

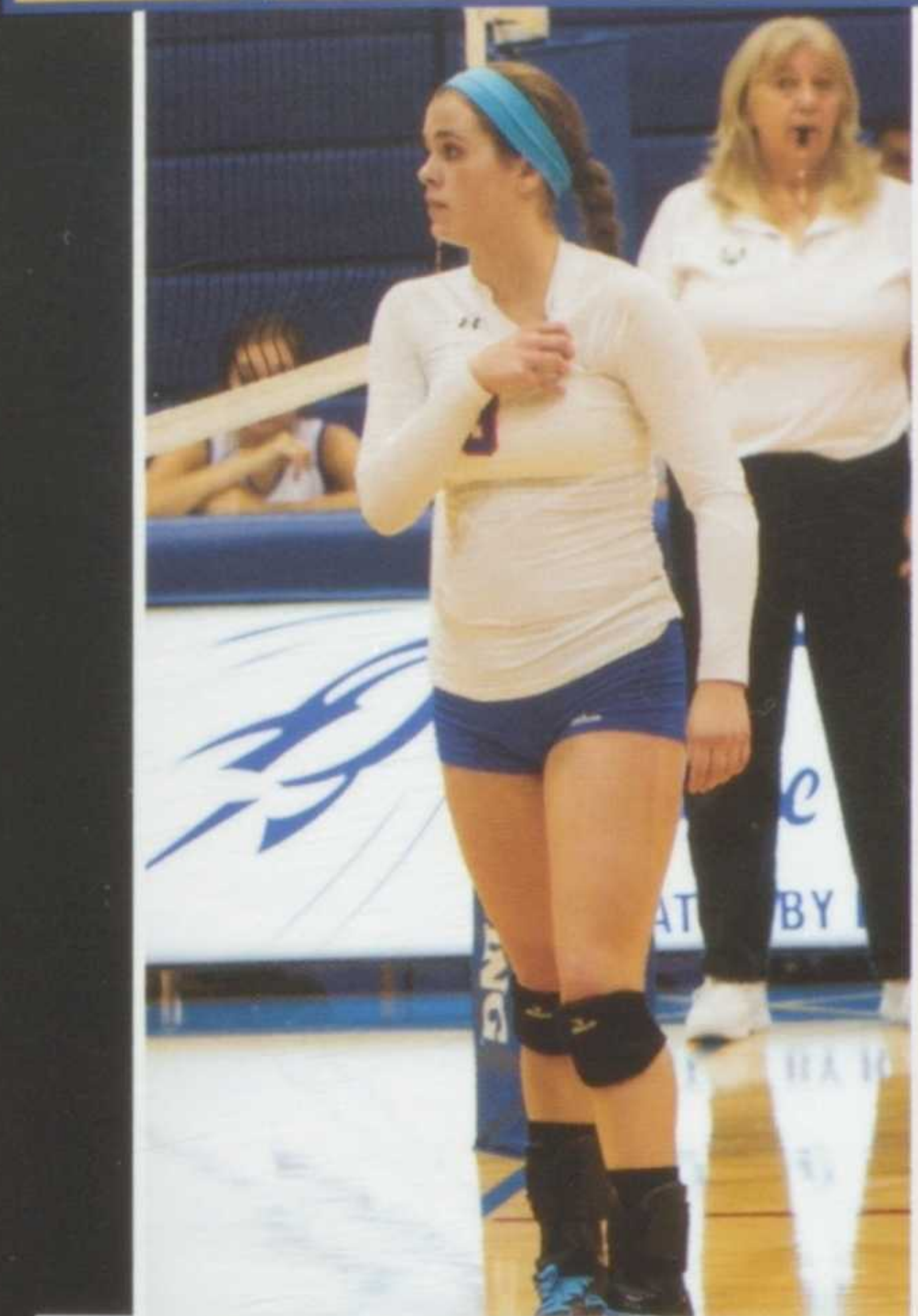

# Three Claps

The girls tennis team ended their season with an overall record of 8-13.

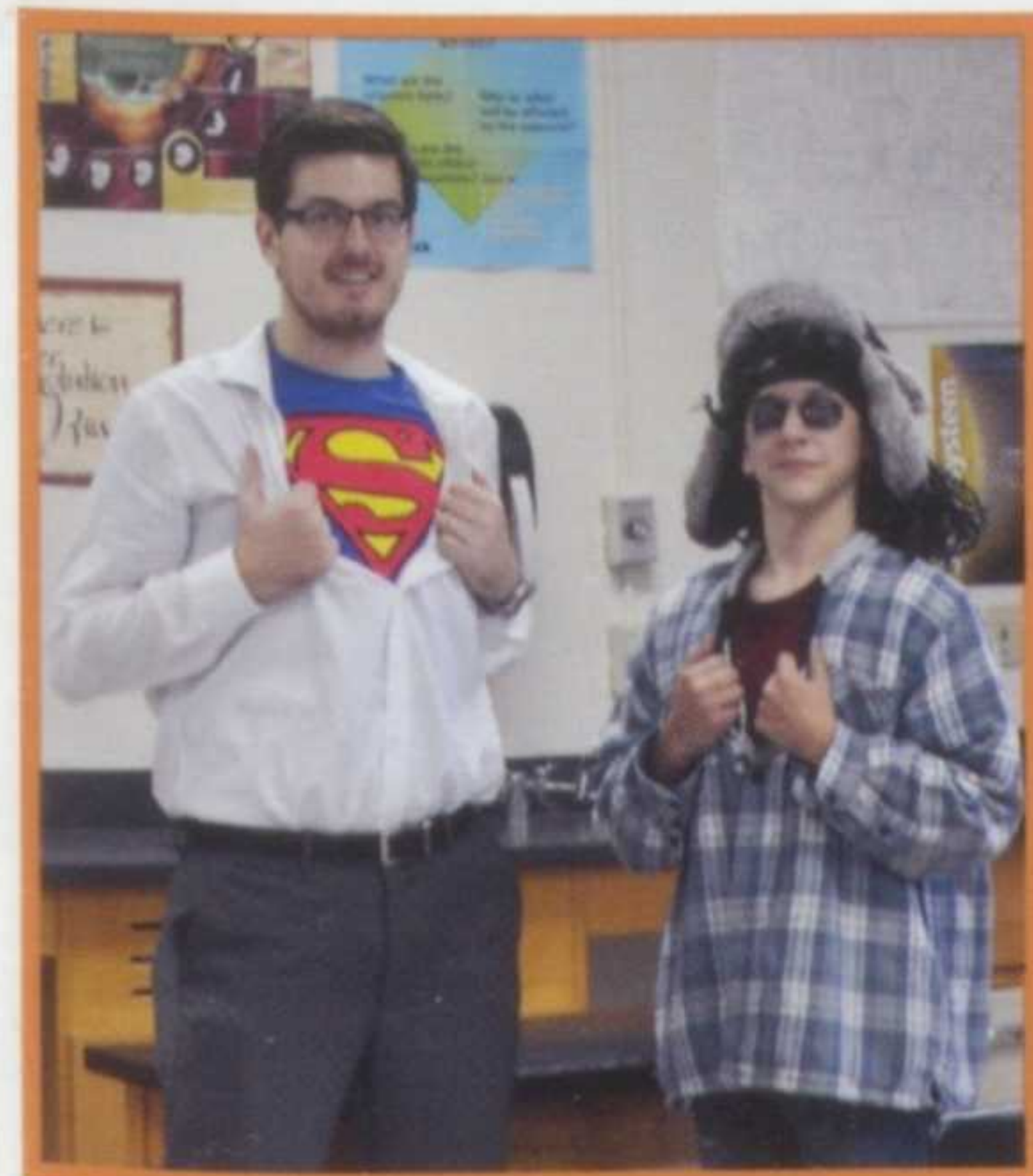

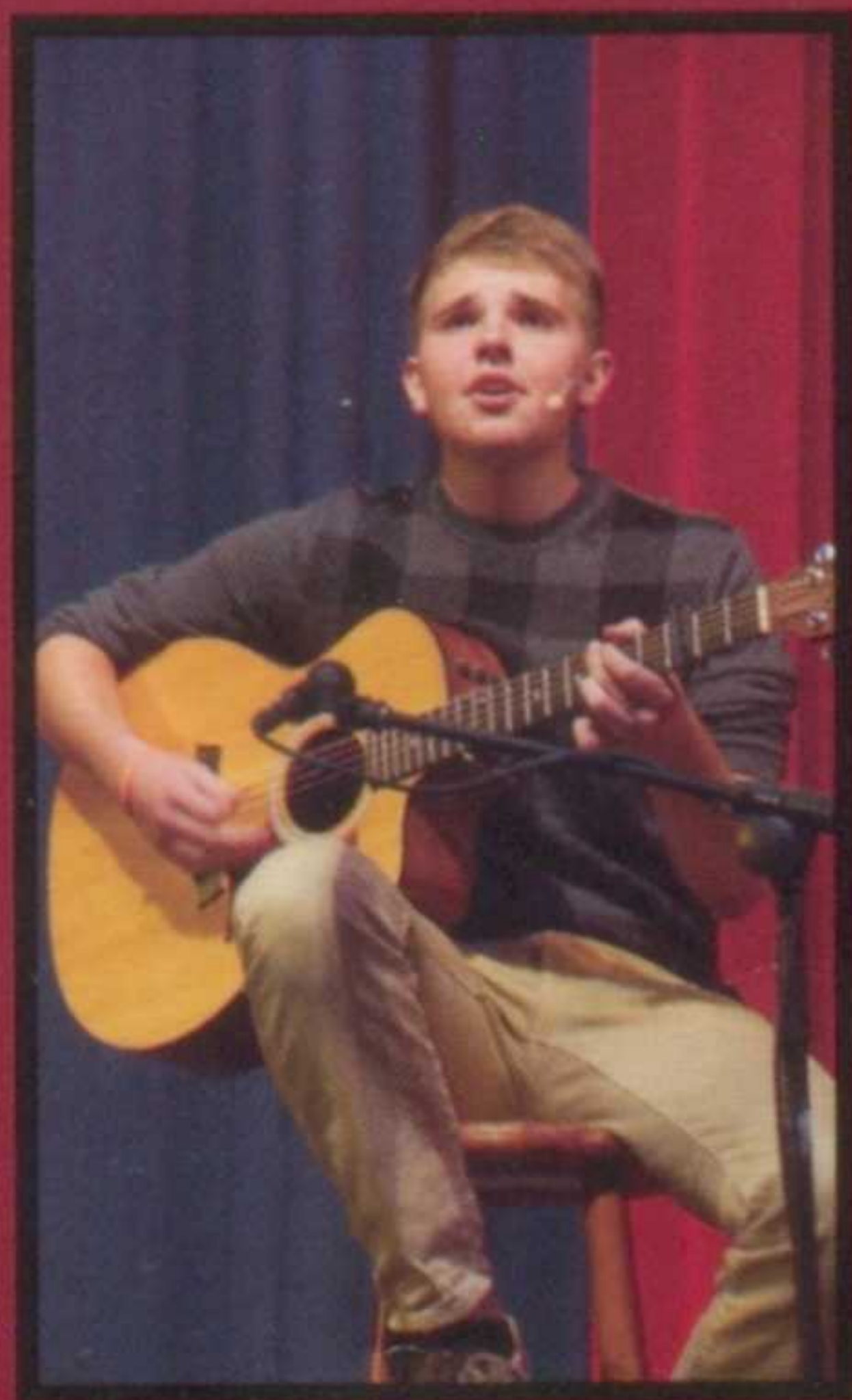




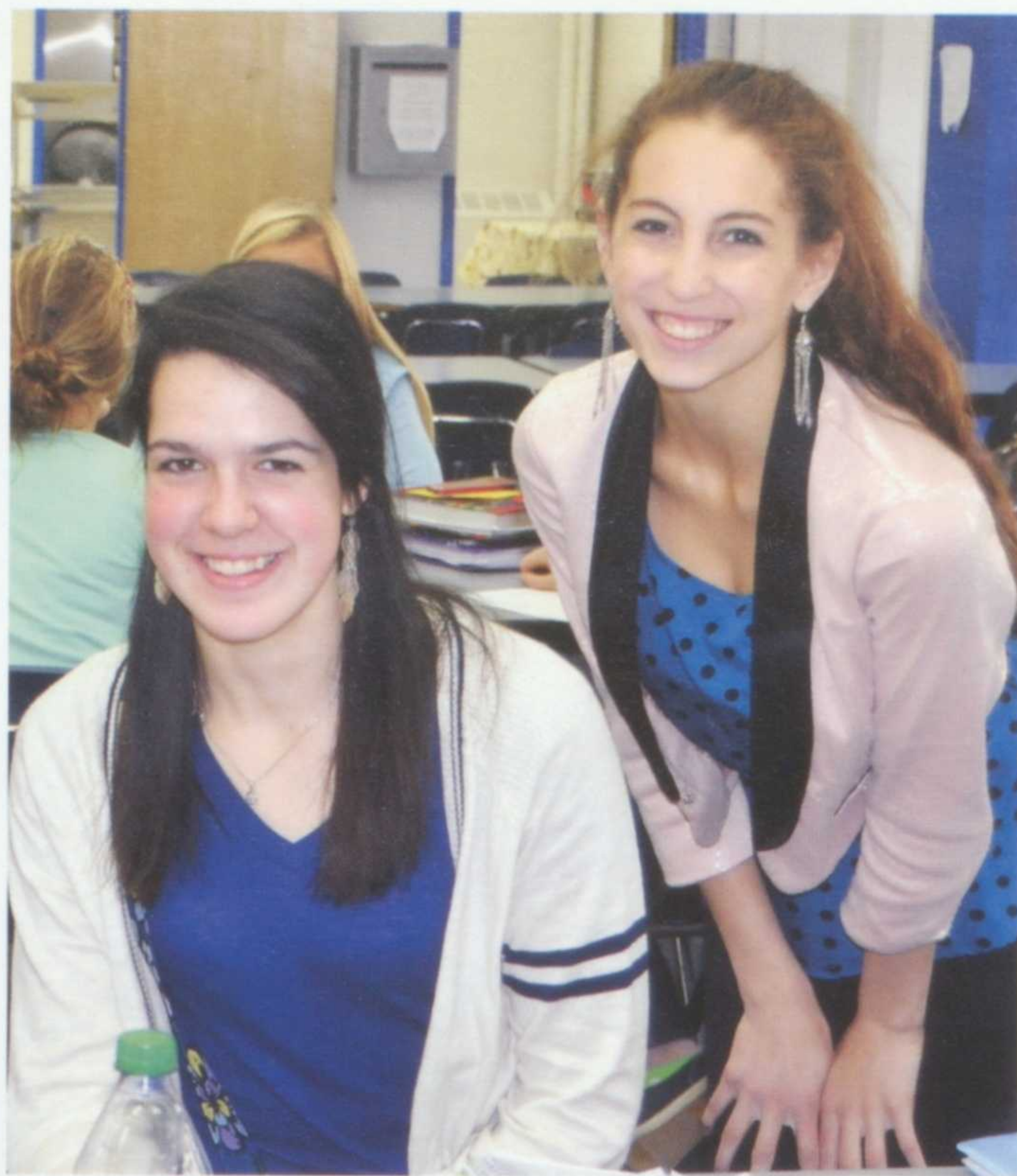
# & the Talent Show

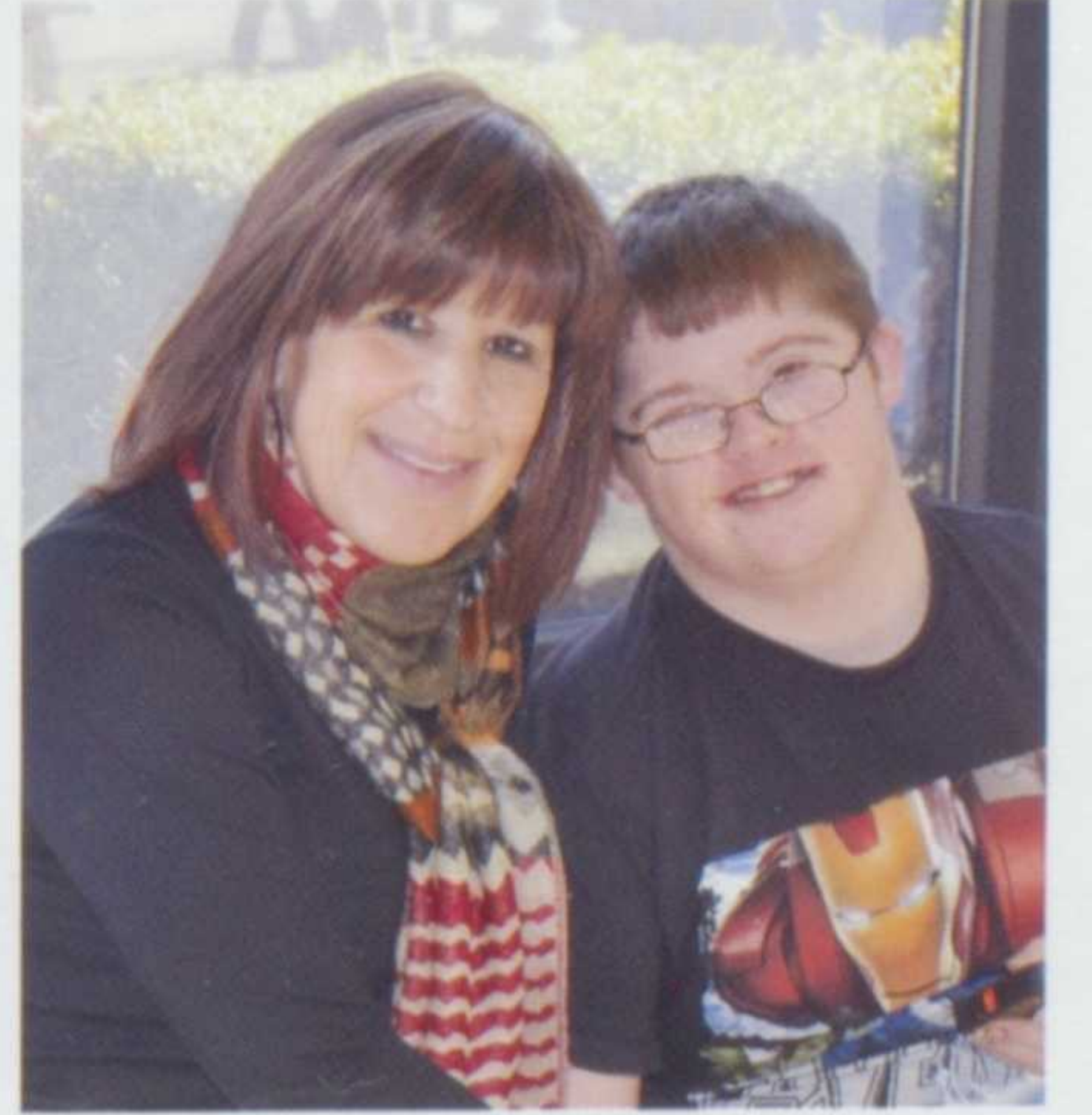
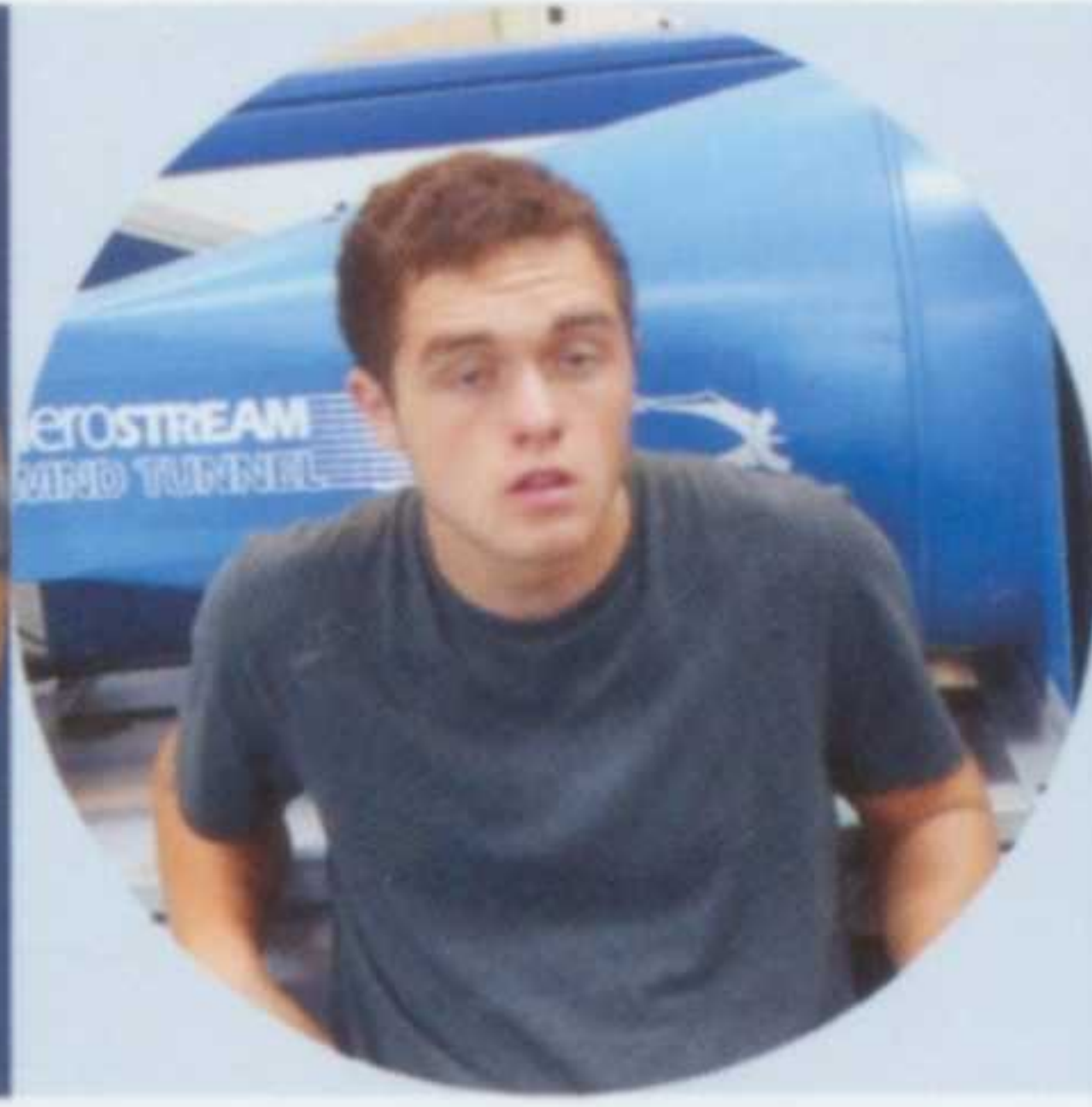

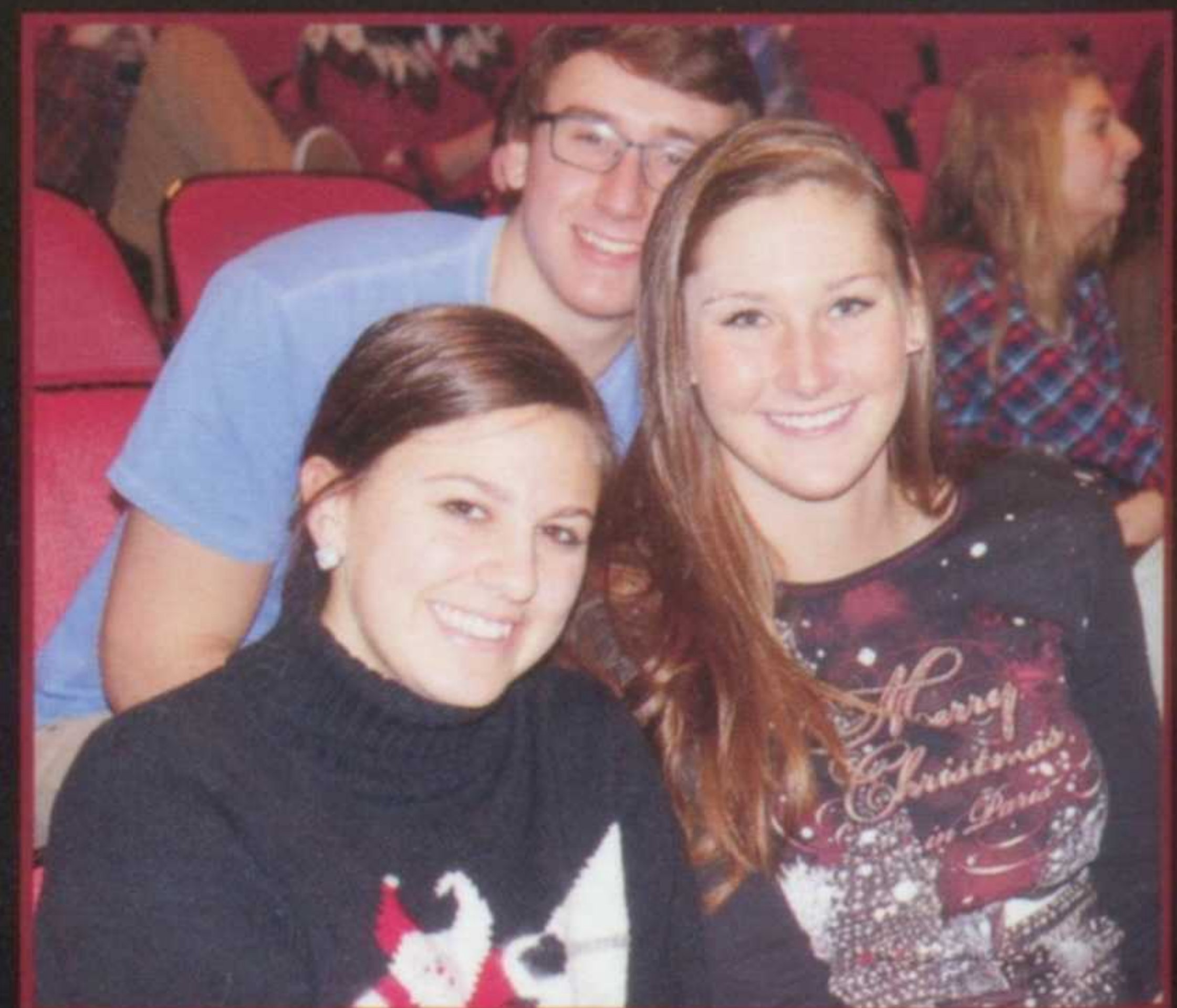

# Bay High Water Pushers

The 2013-14 season brought a great amount of success for the Bay High swimming and diving team. The boys finished second at the WSC and the girls won at Sectionals. From the early onset of the season, both Elizabeth Auckley and Trevor Lake had already received attention for their 2013 performances. The team, however, demonstrated talent beyond the two state-recognized swimmers. Each member contributed to the outstanding performances, and the swim team is known for its familial bond. Members celebrate team spirit through pot-luck dinners, seven hour meets, head-bleachings, and head-shavings.

The successful 2014 season opened with new coaches and positive vibes all around. The first meet occurred over the Thanksgiving break in North Olmstead. Bay dominated! The Rocket Relays occurred next and the men ranked fourth, while the women took third. Over the Christmas break, both the men and women placed second after 24 events. To conclude the regular

season, Bay participated in the River meet. Here, they again placed second, a consistency which was carried to the WSC Championship. During the sectionals meet, the boys 200 yard medley relay team won with a finals time of 1:42.8. Trevor Lake won the 50 yard freestyle with a time of 21.29, and the 100 yard freestyle at 46.73.

The girls won the 200 yard medley relay with the finals time of 154.69 and the 400 freestyle yard relay at 345.01. Elizabeth Auckley won the 100 yard butterfly with a time of 59.15 and the 100 yard backstroke with the time of 58.76.

Ten swimmers and one diver—Jessica Mosier—advanced to States.

Elizabeth Auckley, concluding her career as a high school swimmer, finished third in the backstroke, but the overall highlight of the event was Trevor Lake. He emerged victorious in the 50 and 100 yard freestyles, breaking the state record in 100. Because of his accomplishments, Trevor will not play lacrosse; instead, he will dedicate the entire off-season to swimming.





# Crash the Net

The 2013-14 hockey team posted a young roster with only three seniors—Chris Gulley, being the only senior with hockey playing experience. Nine juniors were on the roster, zero sophomores, and four freshman joined the team. The two captains were Kevin Dailey and Chris Gulley. The 2013 season started off with optimism and a record of 2-0. The Rockets beat local rival Avon Lake and Brooklyn. Due to the cancellation of the Parma tournament, Bay played in the Cleveland Junior Lumberjacks Tournament. (The Lumberjacks are a club Triple A team, which means the players were chosen based on talent.) Bay did not fare well, as they competed against arranged teams. More league games resumed. Against Avon Lake, Chris Gulley and Kevin Dailey scored hat-tricks and the game ended 6-0-Bay. On February 1st, the Rockets played Normandy at the Quicken Loans arena; the final score was a 4-1 Normandy victory, in spite of Bay winning the two previous contests. This match was needed for the team to make the Baron Cup; and due to the loss, they missed advancement. Next, the Rockets played NDCL and lost 5-3. The final match was a State Tournament game against Avon; the Rockets lost by ten goals.

Although the team finished sub-.500, Kevin Dailey, Chris Gulley and Dan Linhart were all voted Blue All-Team League 3rd team.

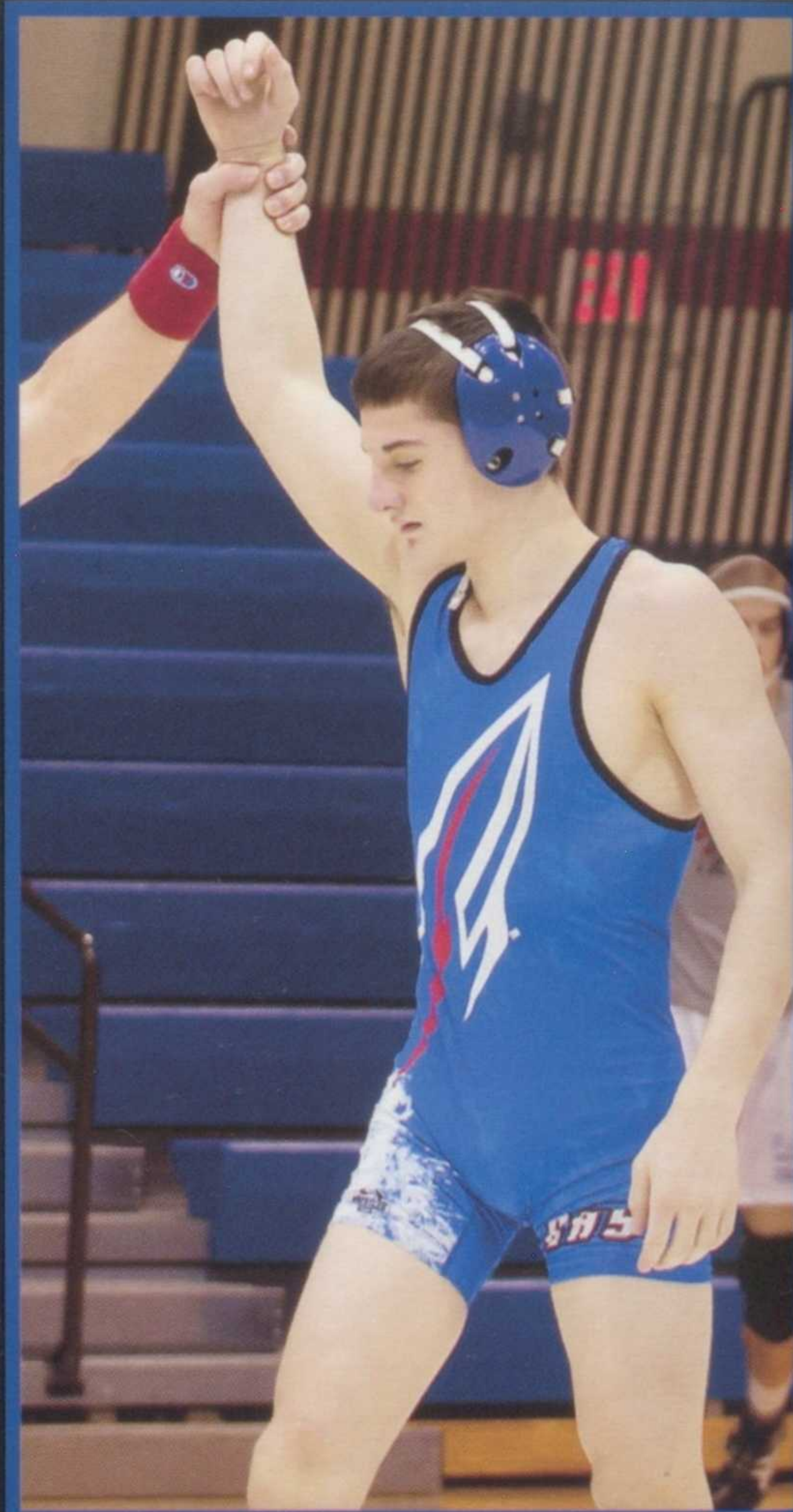

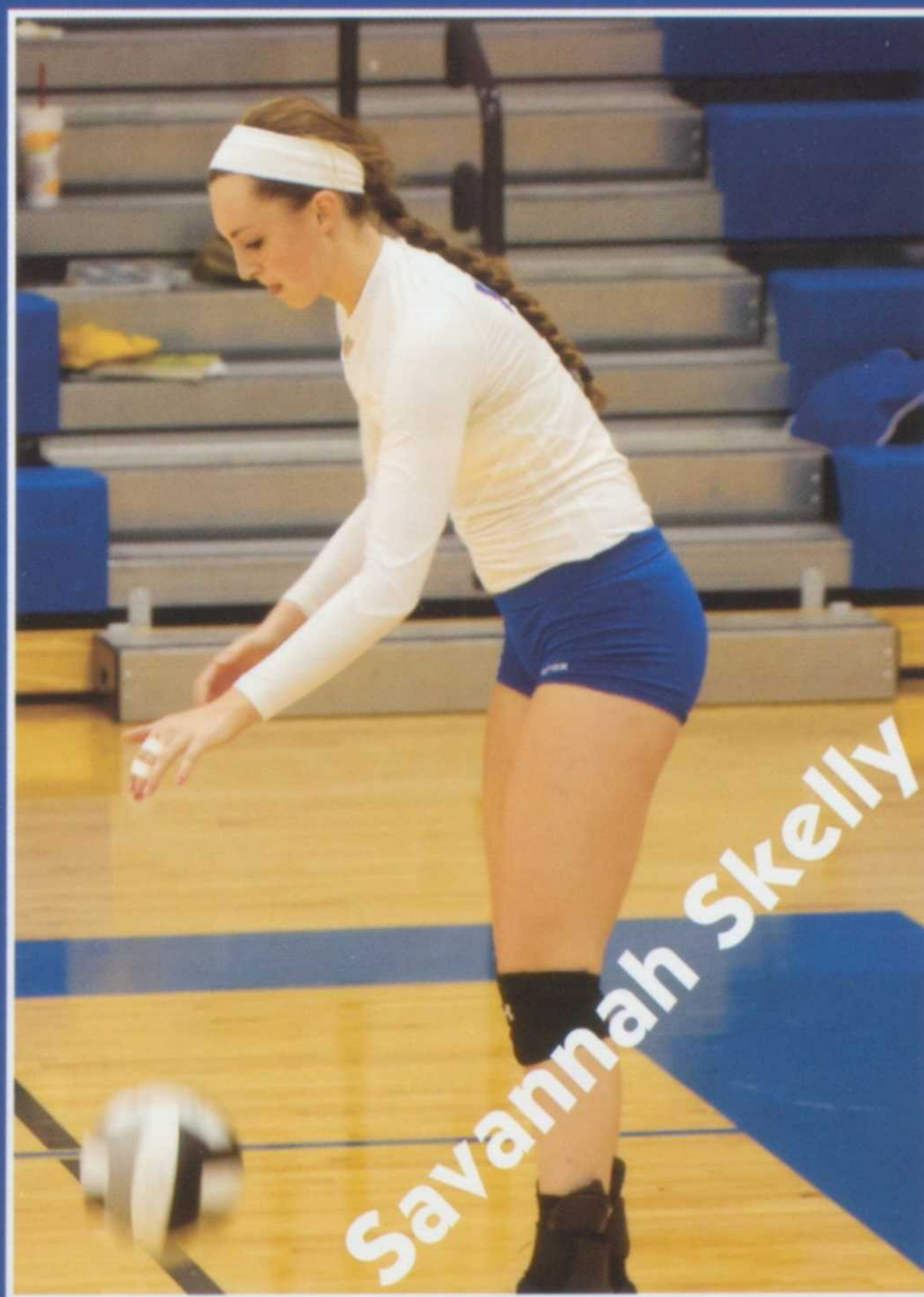
## SWIMMING

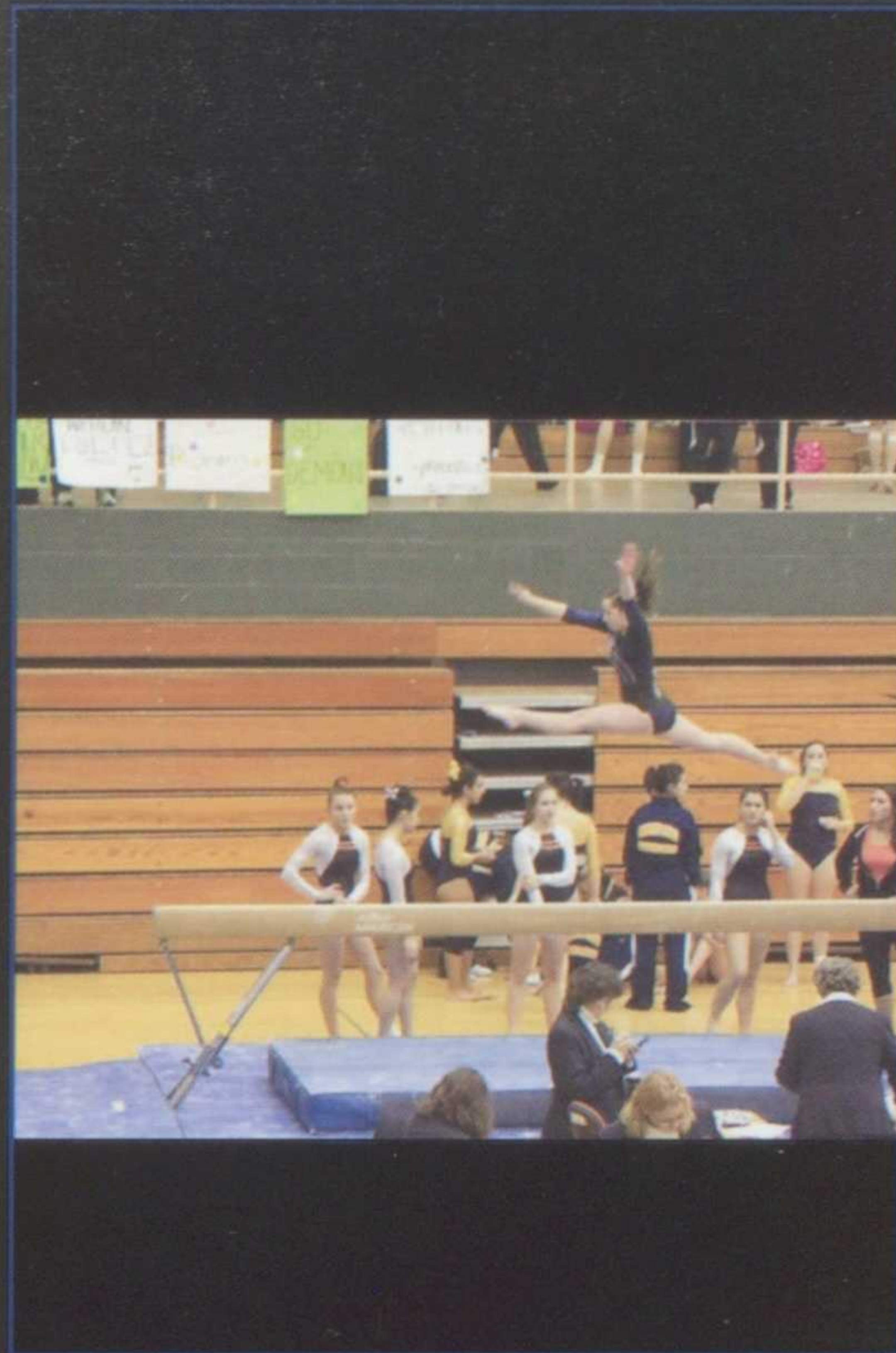






# Jessy Leusch

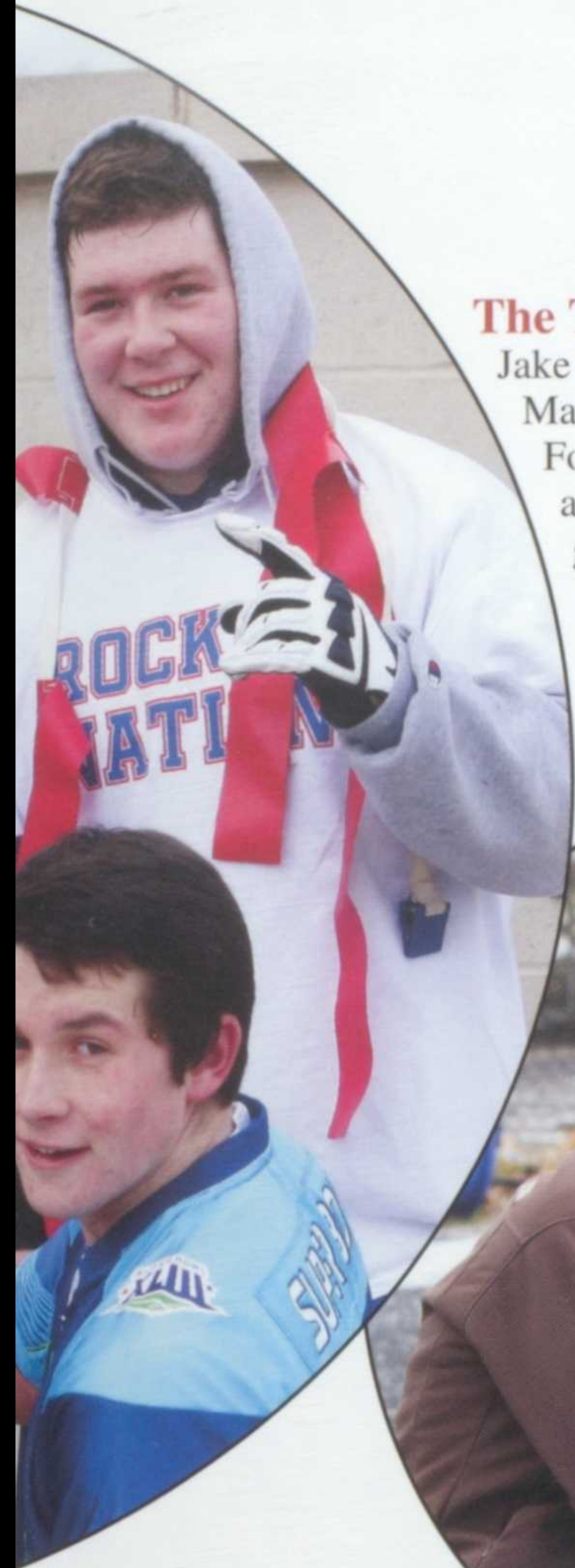
Bay High has a dynamically active student body. From sports, to musicals, to student government, students are involved in multiple facets of the Bay High community.

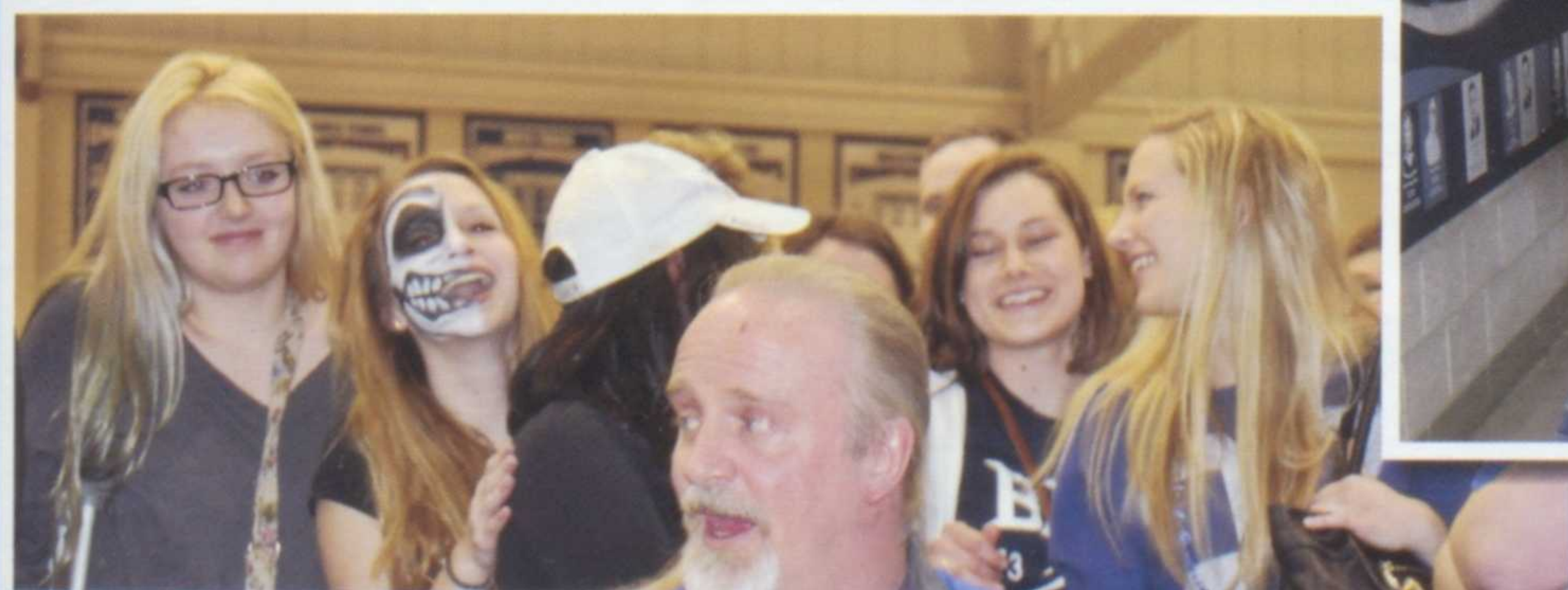


# St. Baldrick's: Helping Cure Childhood cancer
