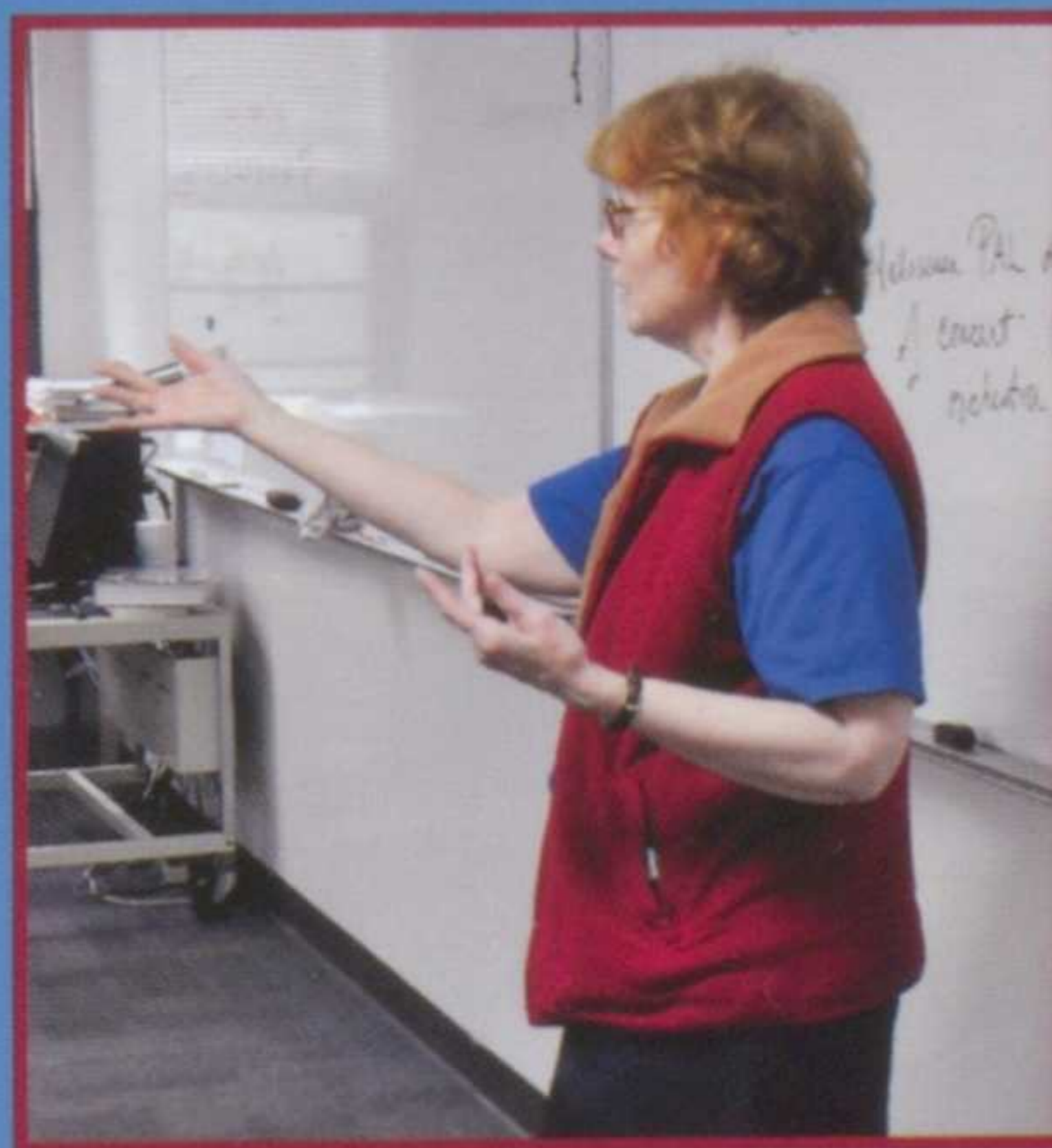
Activities



Film Club



Film Club is designed to expose students to classic films of all kinds (old and new) in order to broaden their cultural experiences. The goal is to help students appreciate movies as an art form and to make films relatable by pointing out everyday references to them in pop culture. Each year a theme is selected, and students watch films each month that are centered on that theme, with discussion and analysis following the conclusion of the film. The 2014-2015 theme: Films based on comic books or graphic novels. Membership is open to anyone, as long as he or she has submitted a parent permission slip for any R-rated films. Once the monthly meetings have begun, attendance is not mandatory; members can attend as much/as little as their schedules allow. The club is designed to be flexible and fun, to enhance students' appreciation of film and pop culture.



Bay Window

Bay High School Student Newspaper: The Bay Window. Students who write for The Bay Window speak for their peers with articles that are relevant, timely, and articulate. Club activities, class projects, social celebrations, and current-event reactions are featured in stories written by students in grades 9-12. Meetings are twice a month to discuss story ideas and claim writing assignments. Particularly popular are the movie and music review columns, with the front page reserved for BHS news. The Bay Window is the first newspaper in America to be "published" as a free phone app. This allows the writers to broadcast their news within hours of its production. Anyone can sign up at any time! The hard copy of The Bay Window is published at least once a month.



Project Earth



The main goal of Project Earth is to spread environmental awareness by interacting with elementary, middle, and high school students. Project Earth plans educational programs for the 4th grade, plants trees for Arbor Day with the 7th grade, and organizes the Waterways Clean Up events and Bike to School Challenge at the High School and throughout the community. The Waterways Cleanup is hosted by Project Earth twice a school year (once in fall semester and one spring semester). The club is currently working to increase the number of school events that are zero-waste, improve our recycling program, and transition toward a school-composting program. The club's other activities include rock climbing, sailing, snow hiking, and more. The club meets every Monday throughout the school year. New members are welcome anytime. 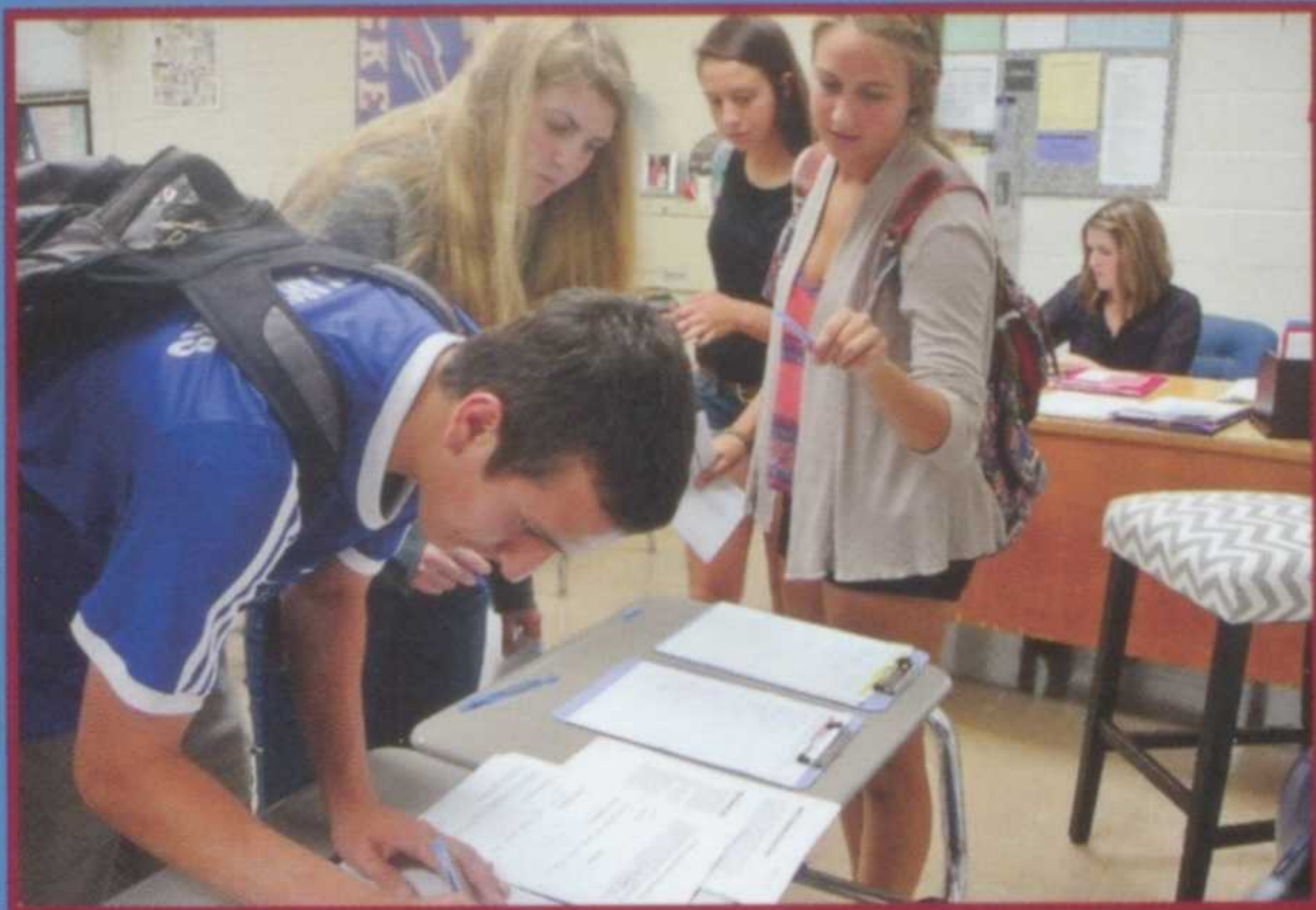
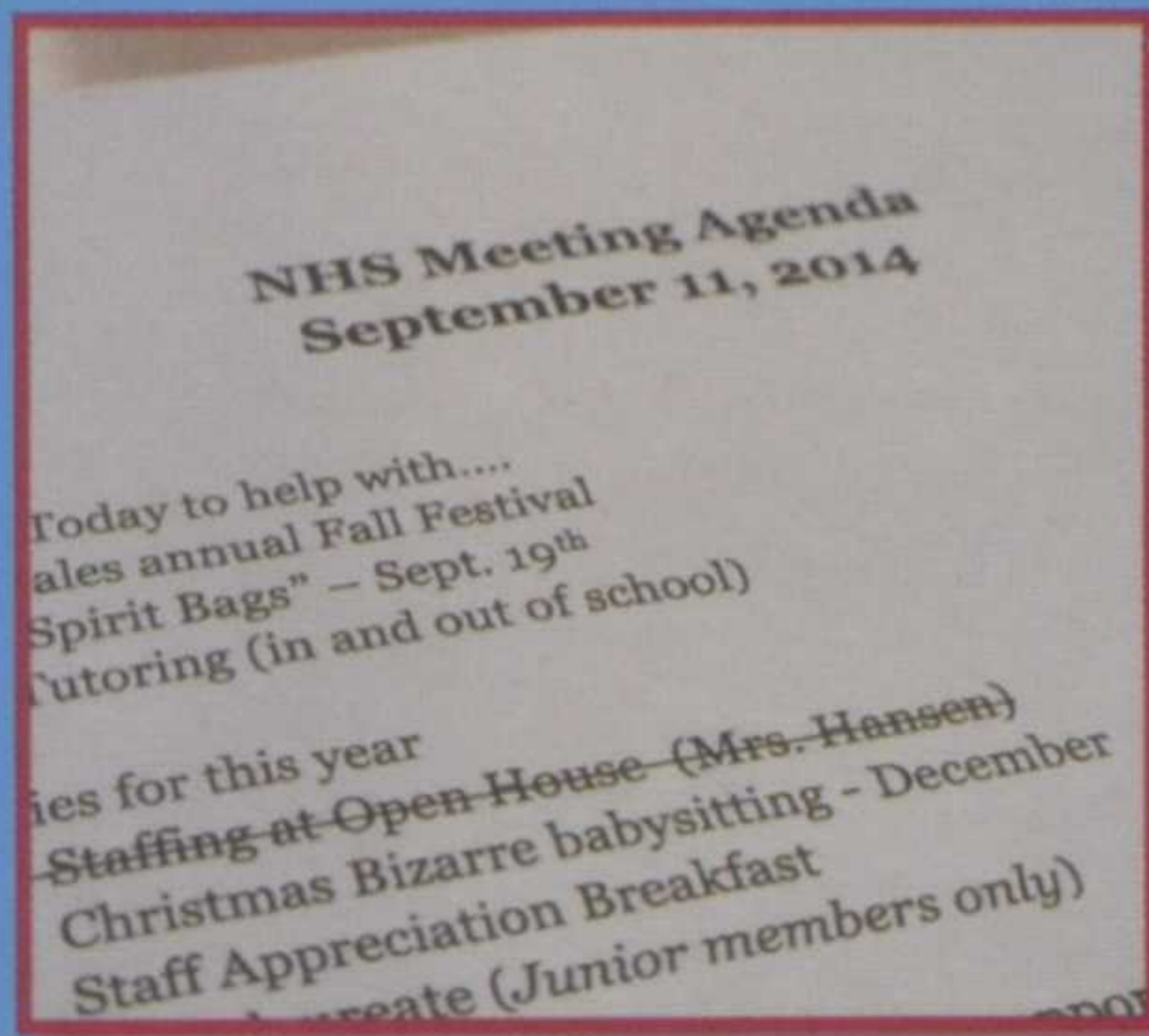
Key Club



Key Club is an international student-led organization which provides its members with opportunities to give service, build character, and develop leadership. Members learn the value of philanthropy by volunteering within in the community. Key Club members visit the residents at Knickerbocker, run water stations in local races, and face paint at festivals. The students collaborate with the Bay Village Kiwanis Club in activities such as selling Christmas trees, flipping pancakes at annual breakfasts, and making curly fries at the fourth of July fair. Their partners include March of Dimes, Children's Miracle Network Hospitals, and UNICEF. In this year's major project, members coordinated a community Cow Plop at a Friday night football game to raise funds for the Eliminate Project, which works to end maternal/neonatal tetanus in third world countries. Through a week of farm-themed activities, more than \$8000 was raised and will go to save the lives of mothers and her future children. Over one-hundred students have chosen to dedicate themselves to service that has made a lasting impact on their peers and community.



National Honors Society



Members of the Bay High Chapter of National Honor Society maintain at least a 3.6 cumulative GPA and demonstrate the qualities of leadership, service, and character. National Honor Society is a service-oriented student group which plans projects based on members' interests. NHS members, guided by adviser **Mrs. Rutt**, and president **Joe O'Brien**, offer district-wide tutoring, organize a staff breakfast in May, and serve as ushers at Baccalaureate & Graduation, among other activities. Students apply to join the club early in their junior year of school, and if chosen, will continue to act as academic role models for their peers.

Science Club



The Bay High School Science Club's mission is to foster friendships through participation on interesting science projects, movies, events, and outings. The club presently participates in the Chain Reaction Contraption Contest at the Carnegie Science Center in Pittsburgh on an annual basis. They won the competition in 2009! In other years, Bay has made the top 8 finalists. The contest involves designing, constructing and operating a Rube Goldberg type machine of 20 or more steps which completes a specific task. This year's task is 'to transport an object,' The title of the project is 'The Incredible Cure' which is a take off on our theme of the Incredible Hulk! The students are incredibly excited about the project!

GSA



The BHS Gay-Straight Alliance (GSA) serves as a safe place for any and all types of students or people. The club holds weekly meetings, attends LGBTQ events, and raises awareness of LGBTQ issues throughout the school. The GSA organizes "days of silence" to promote their cause.

They meet Wednesdays at 3:15 in room 106. **Ms. Balas** is the advisor (with **Mr. Stelter** standing in for the part of the year), while **senior Olivia Swasey** is president. The club members encourage all students to be a part of the club, which is rapidly growing in size and membership.

Ultimate Frisbee



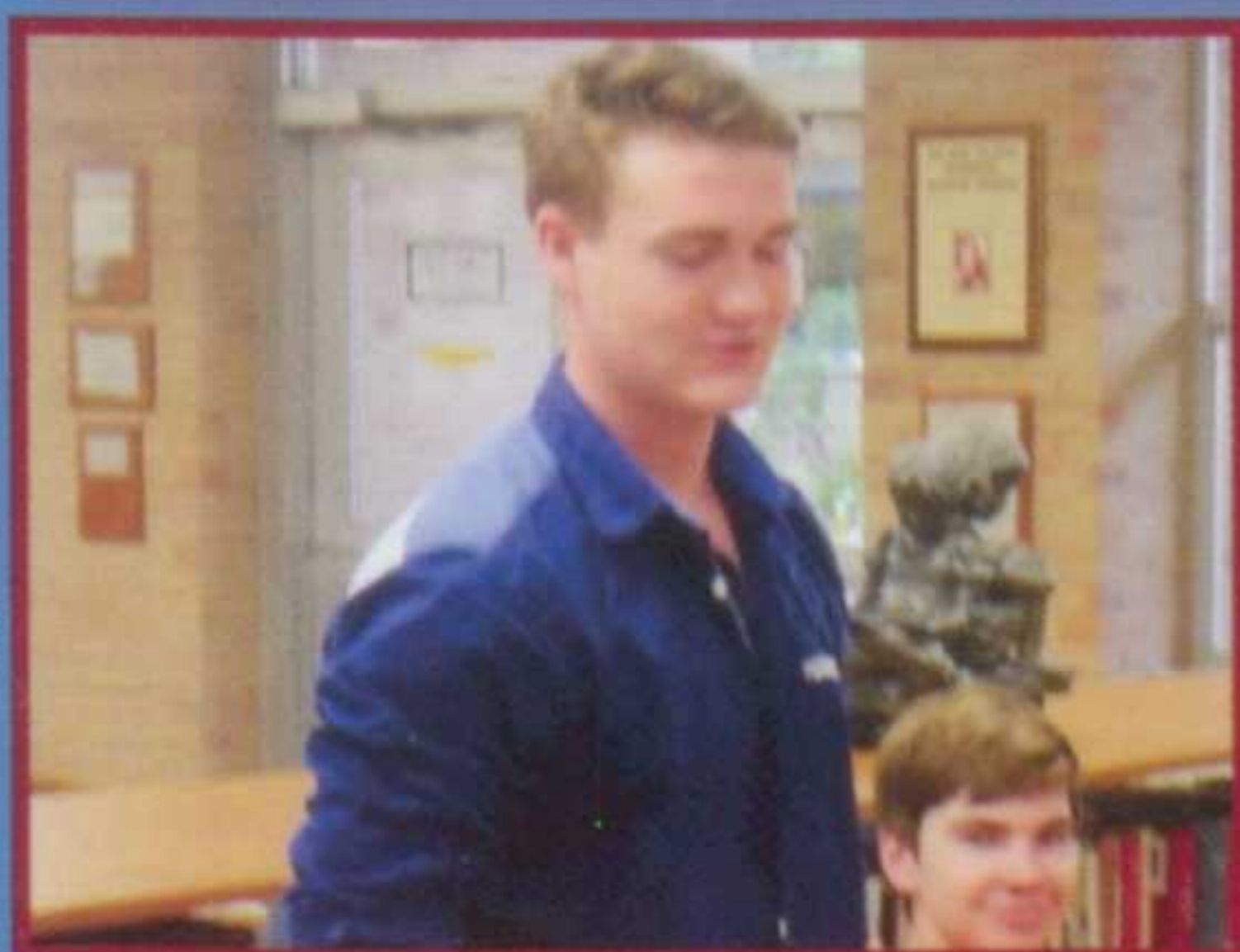

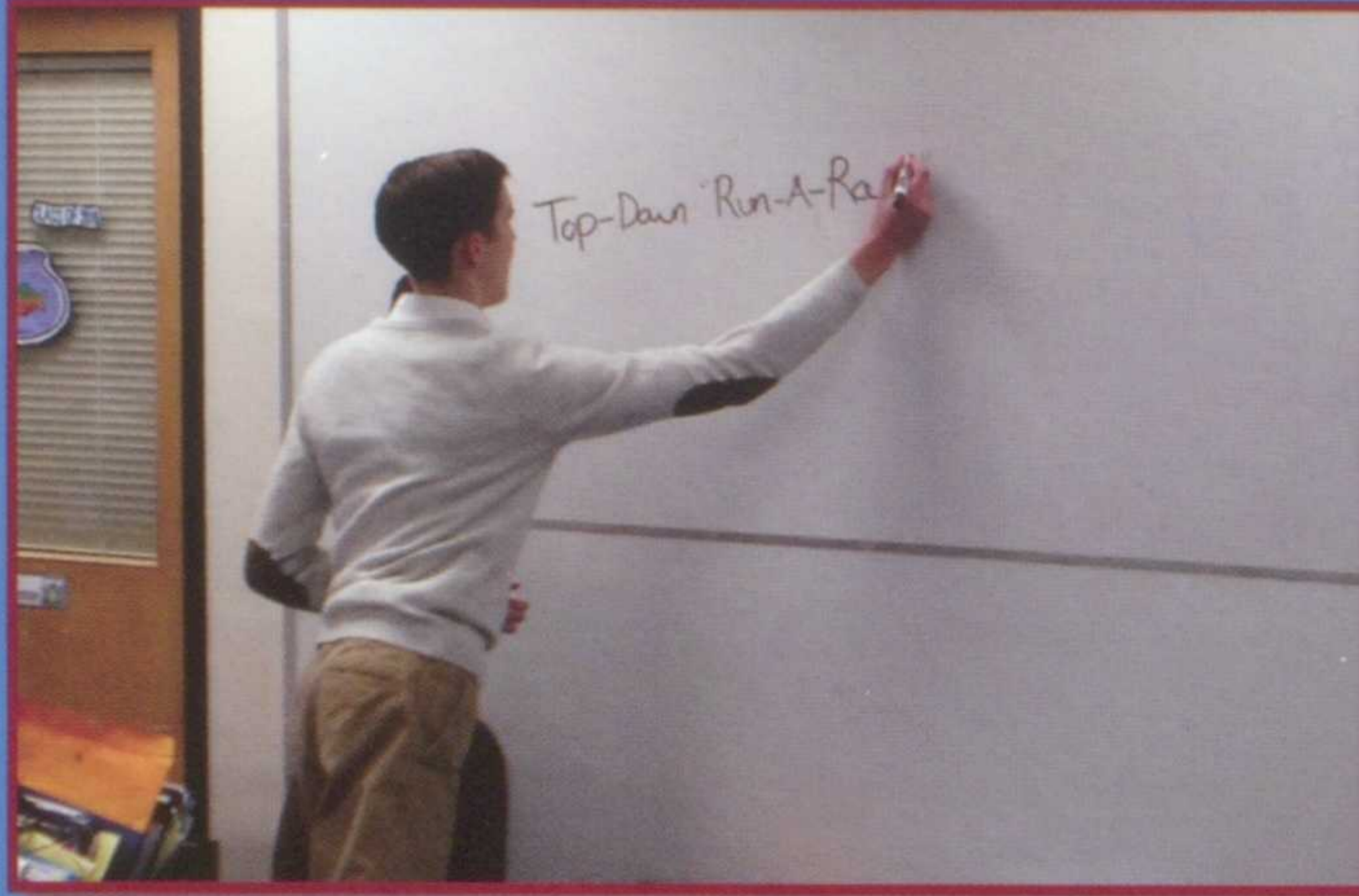
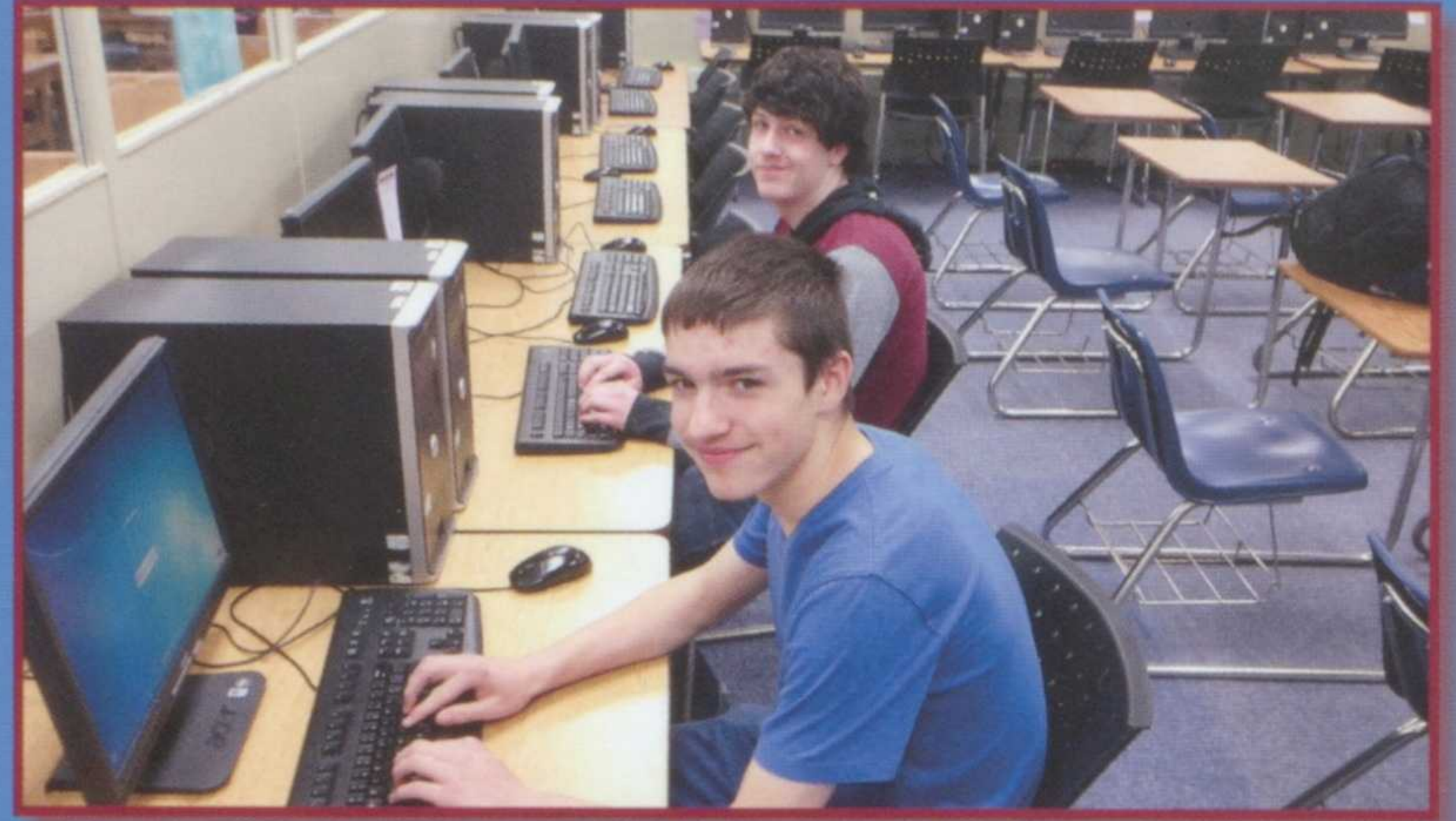
Yearbook

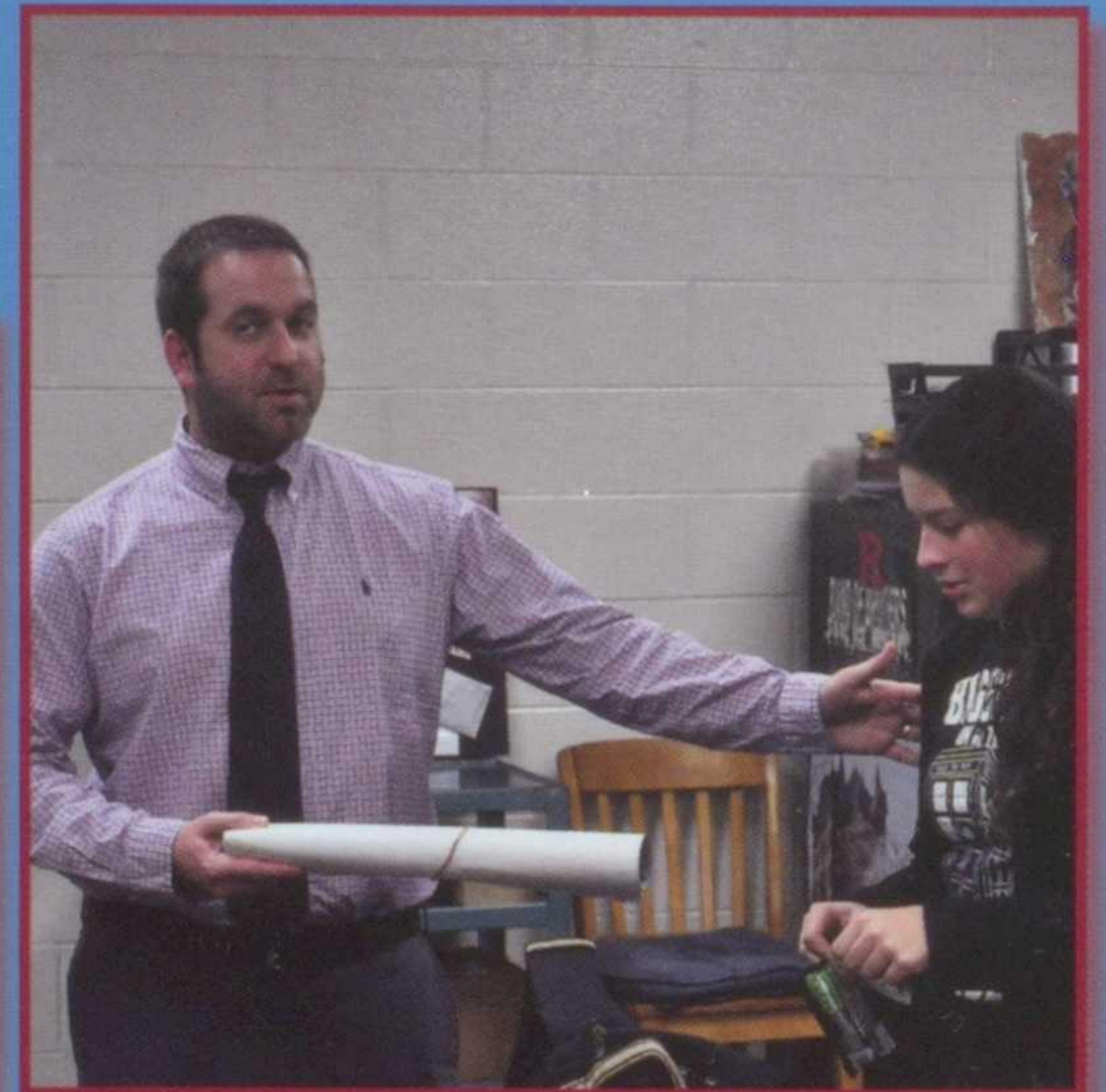


Tech Club

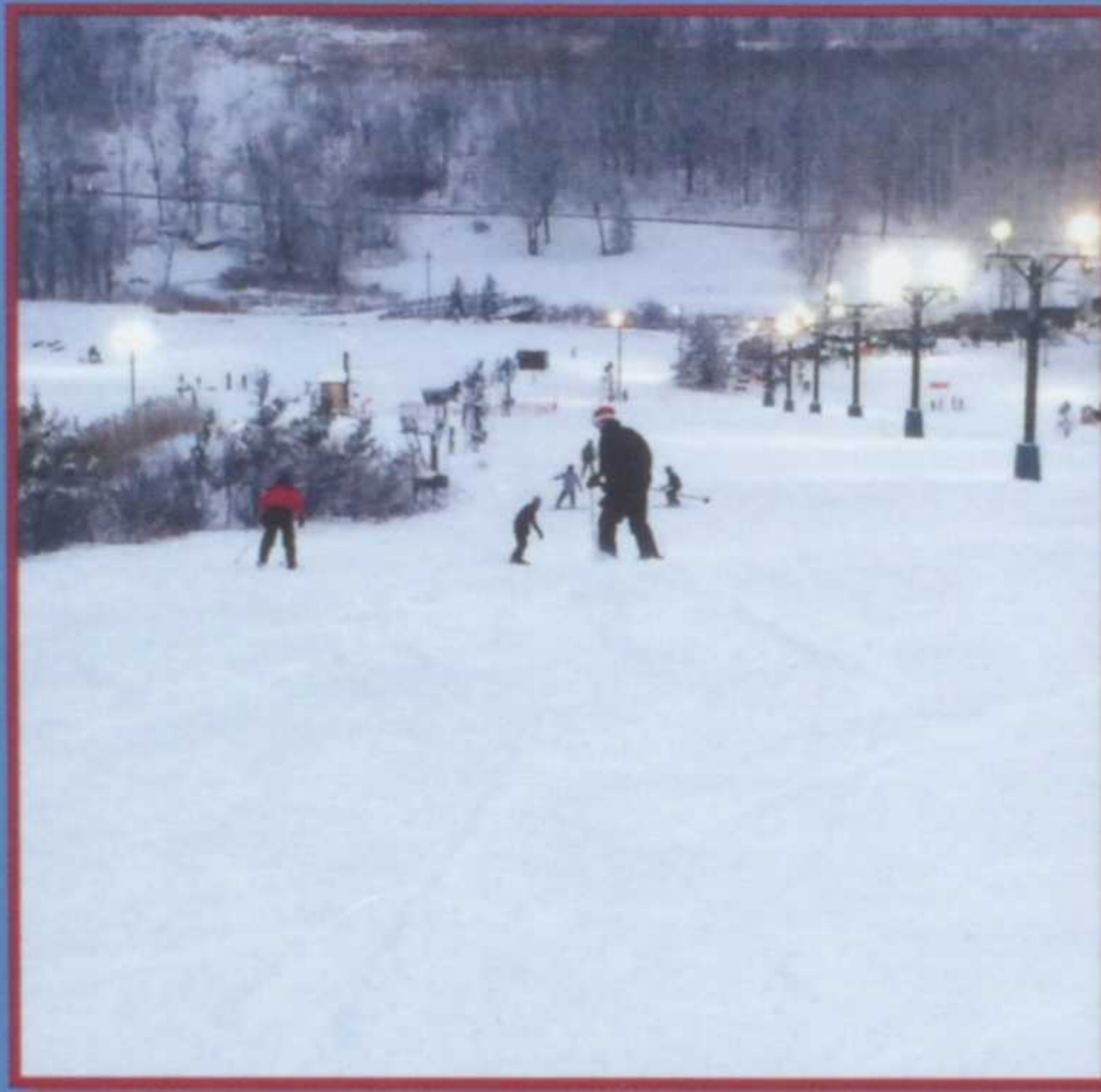
PAL

Team Africa



The World Student Organization, also known as Team Africa, is a group of students who are seeking to broaden their knowledge of, and experience with, international people and events. The club does this by inviting students who have studied or traveled abroad to share about their experiences with us. They also seek out international news events and stories to stay up to date on. They hold winter and spring fund raisers for international issues, usually specific to Africa. This year Team Africa held candy cane sales to raise money for the "More Than Me" organization in Liberia. Originally the main mission was to educate girls, now their focus has turned to fighting Ebola. The club also invests in Kiva, a non profit organization with a mission to provide loans to people with small businesses world wide in an effort to alleviate poverty. In addition, Team Africa holds a winter retreat at The Family Ministry Center in Cleveland, in which they invite local organizations and people to come and share about their life and experiences that are different than what we are familiar. Club members then take time to reflect and discuss what we have been exposed to. For this retreat, main presenters are typically The Without Words Movement, and students from The International Newcomer Academy in Cleveland. Meetings are held weekly at 7:15 a.m. Average attendance is about twenty. There is a leadership team of 5 students (11-12th graders) including the club president, **Fiona Allan (12th grade)**.



HUDDLE



HUDDLE (Helping Us Develop Dedication, Leadership & Enthusiasm).

Membership consists of a select group of 10-12th grade role models, who teach healthy lifestyle lessons to elementary students throughout the school year. Youth Philanthropy Fellowship (YPF) originally began as "The Laurie Wilder Foundation" to raise money for cystic fibrosis. Laurie, who was known for her enthusiasm and school spirit, was a Bay High School graduate of the class of 1982. Sadly, she passed away from cystic fibrosis just a few years after she graduated. Over time, YPF has expanded into an organization that raises money throughout the year for different charities and to fight diseases. The group organizes an annual powder puff football game, and to stay in touch with its roots, also holds "Laurie Wilder Week" every November to raise money for cystic fibrosis. The organization has also hosted fundraisers featuring silent auctions, provided support for Relay for Life, and held toy drives. In 2013, YPF spearheaded Bay High's participation in "Hoops for Hunger" which raised 50,000 units of food and financial contributions for the Cleveland Foodbank between the combined efforts of Bay and Rocky River students.

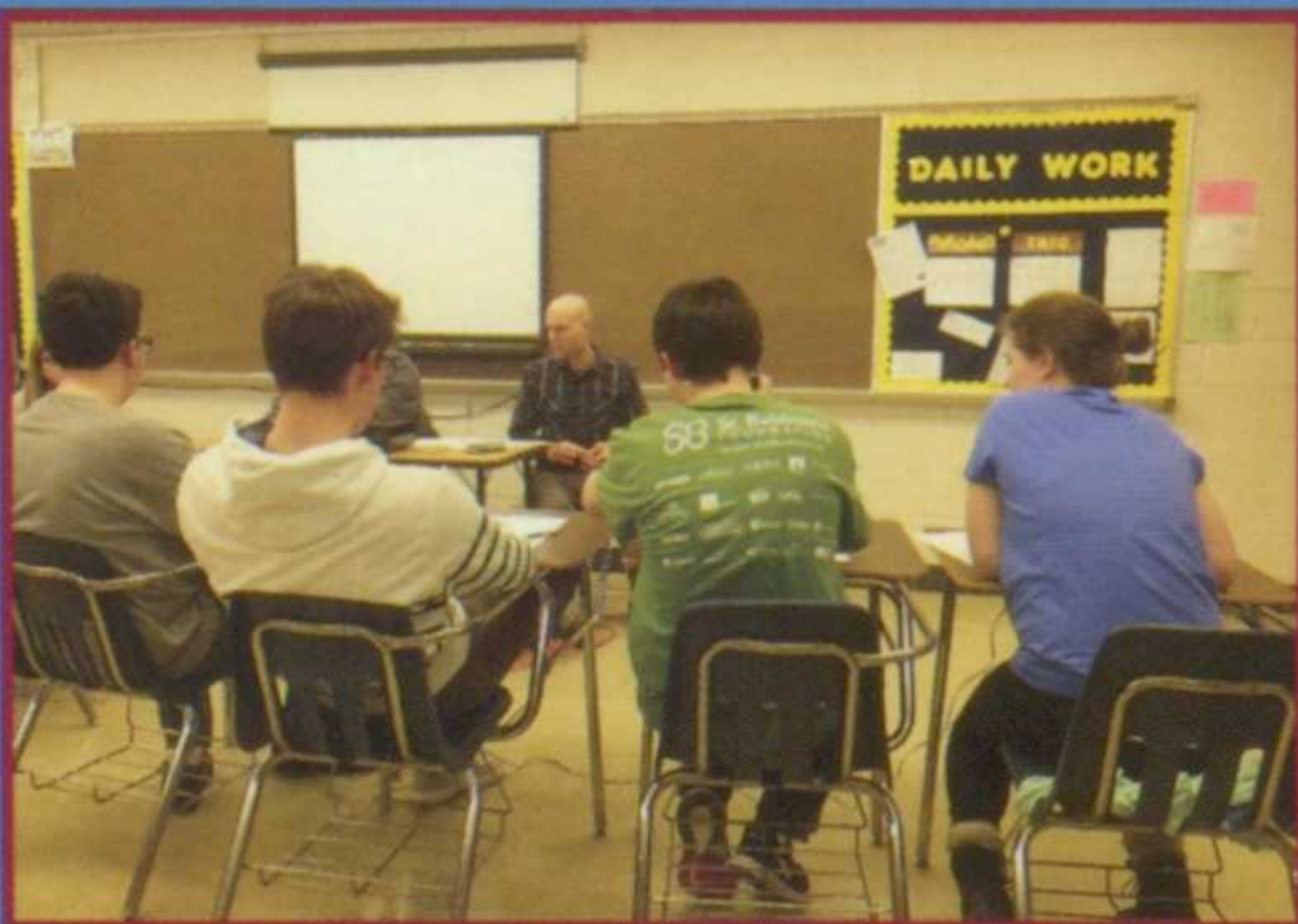


Book Club

Academic Challenge



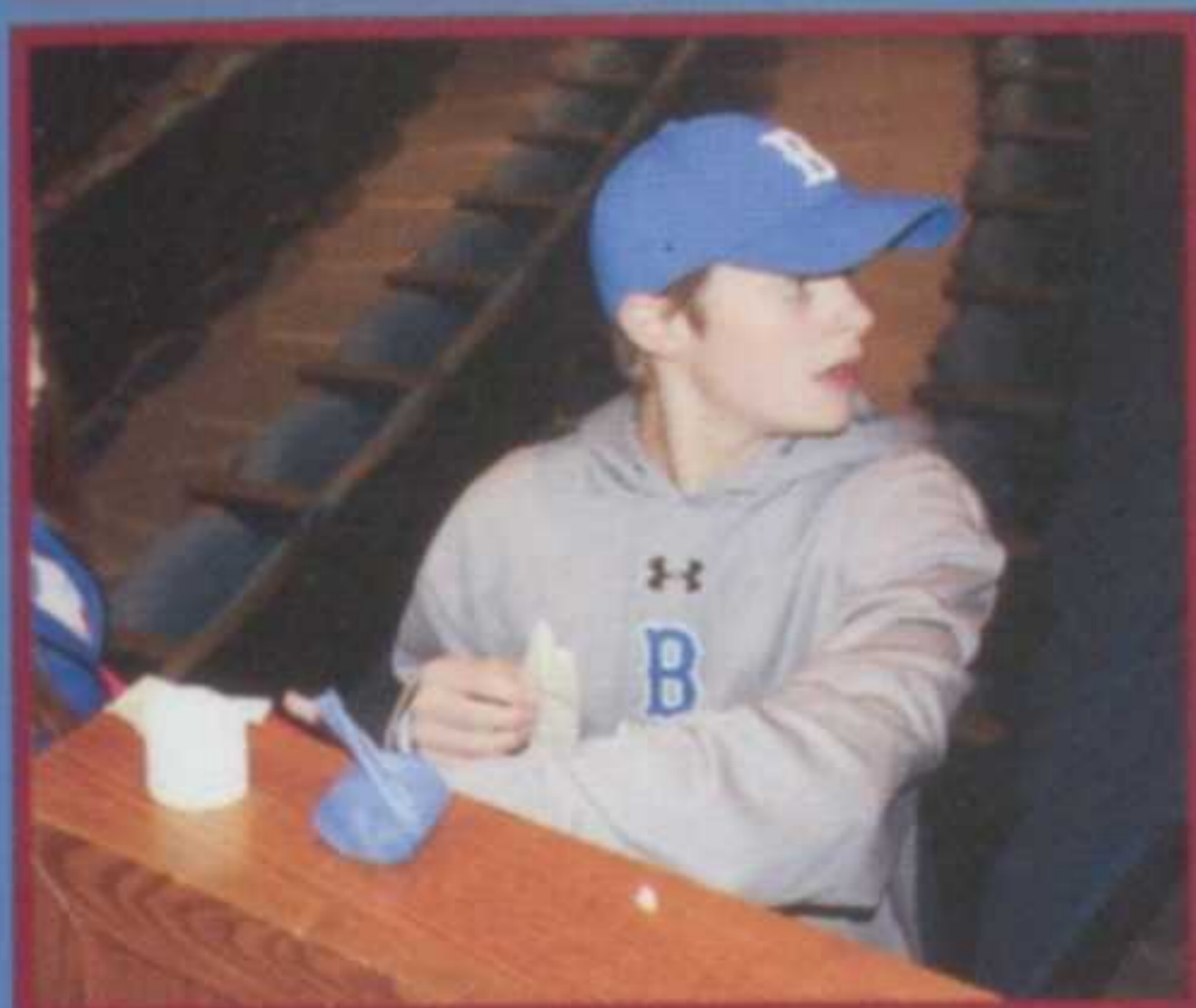

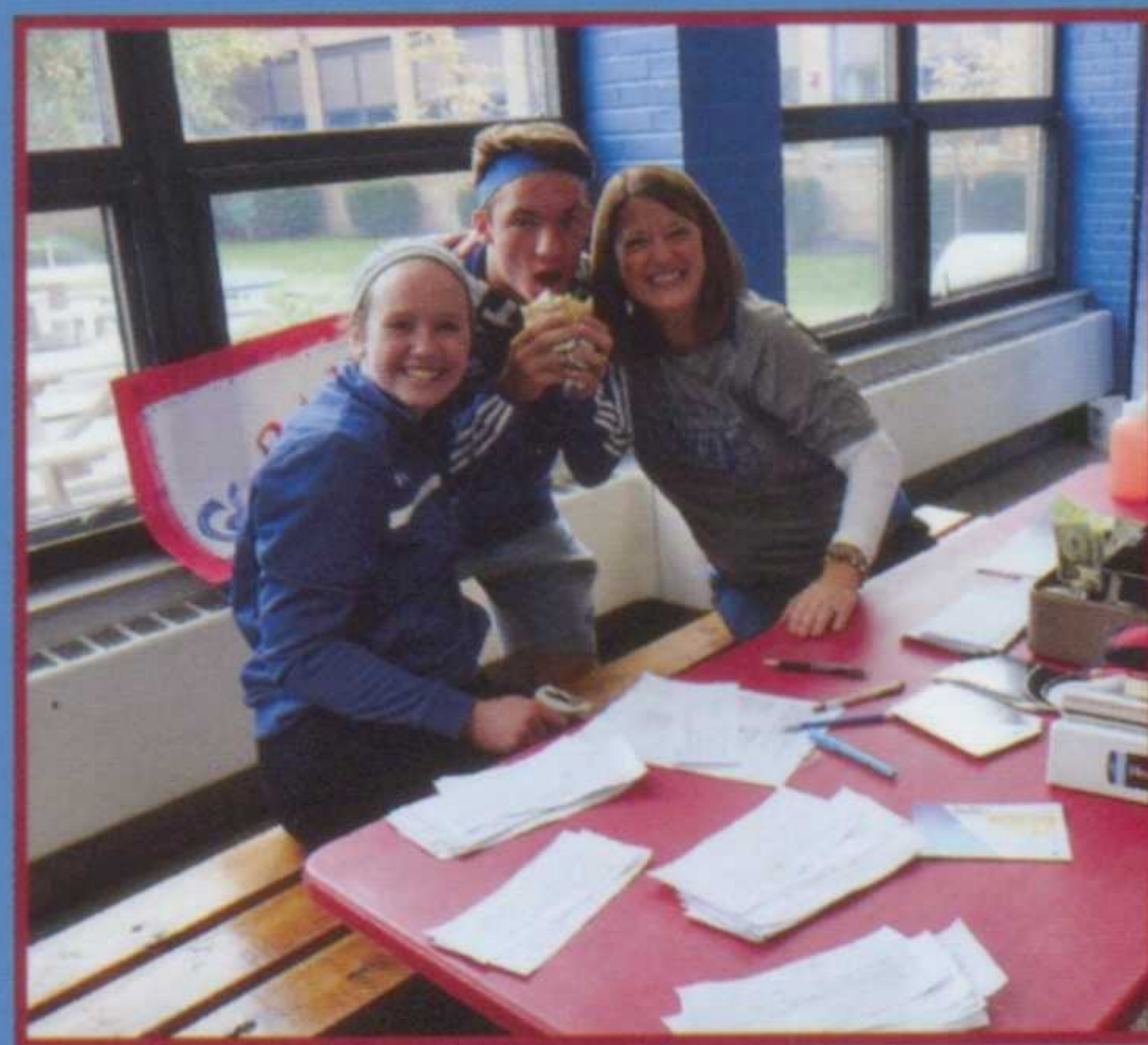
Student Council

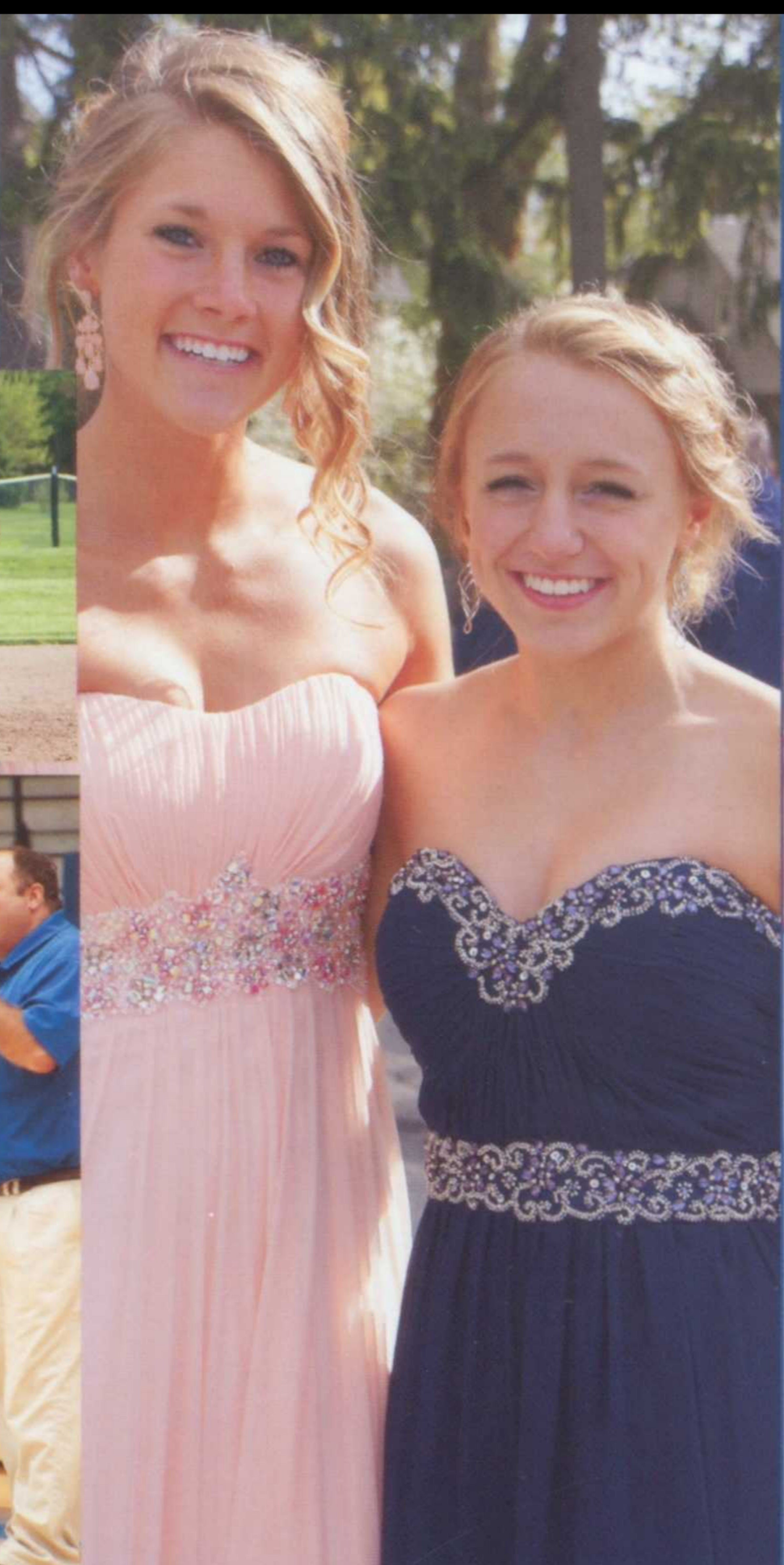


Senior Class Officers

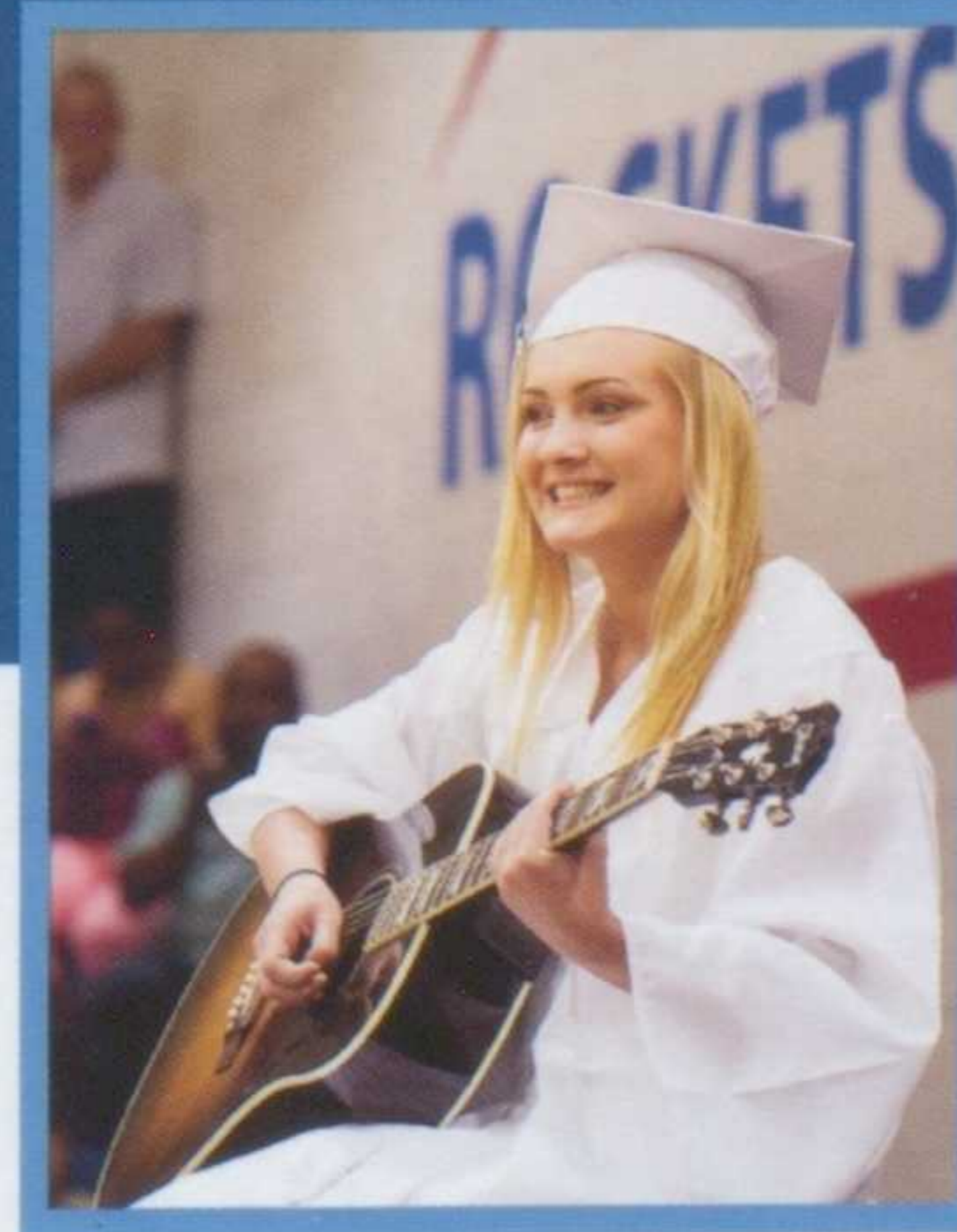

Krista Bliumentalis explained that Bay Village is not just the normal city.



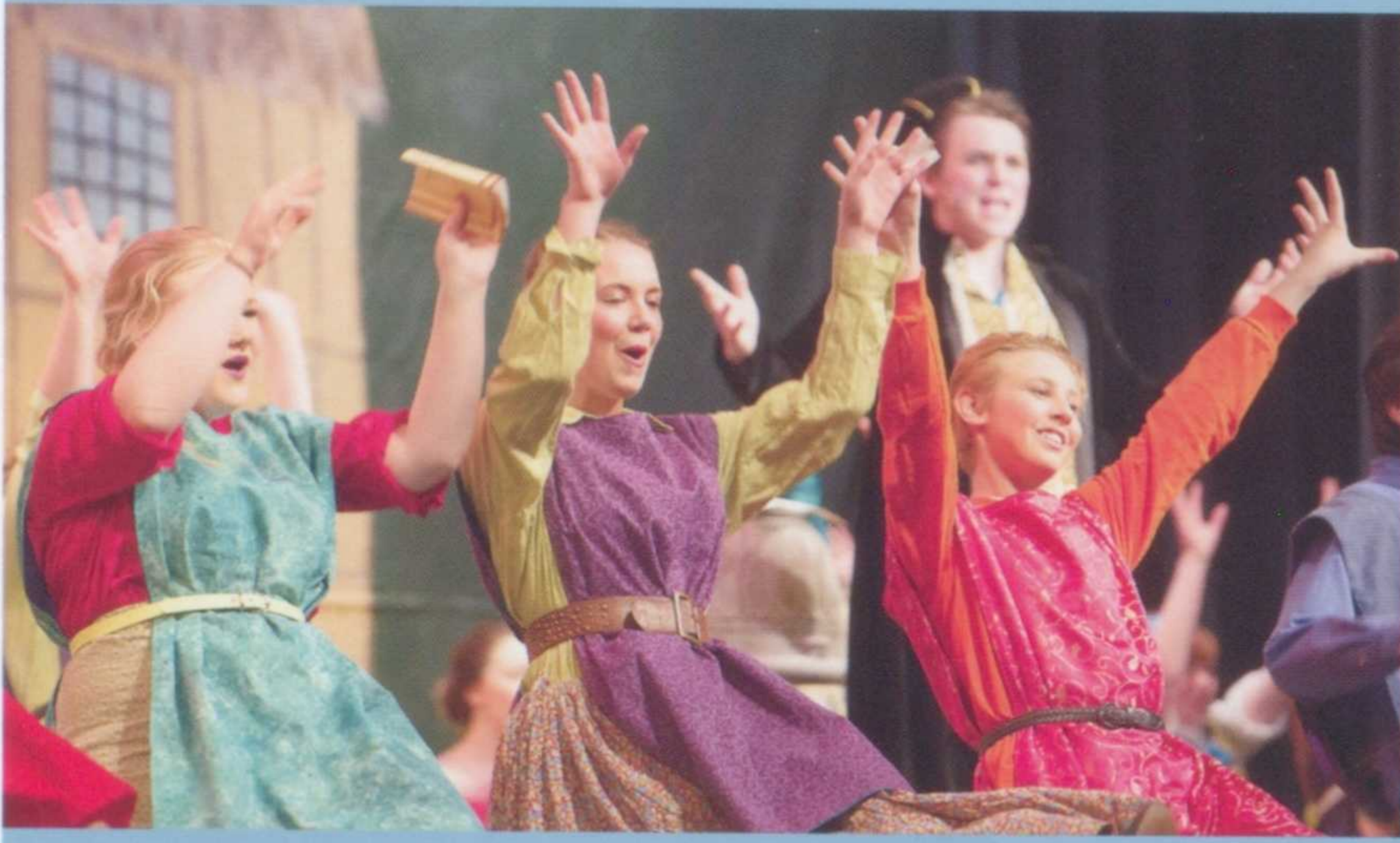

Cinderella

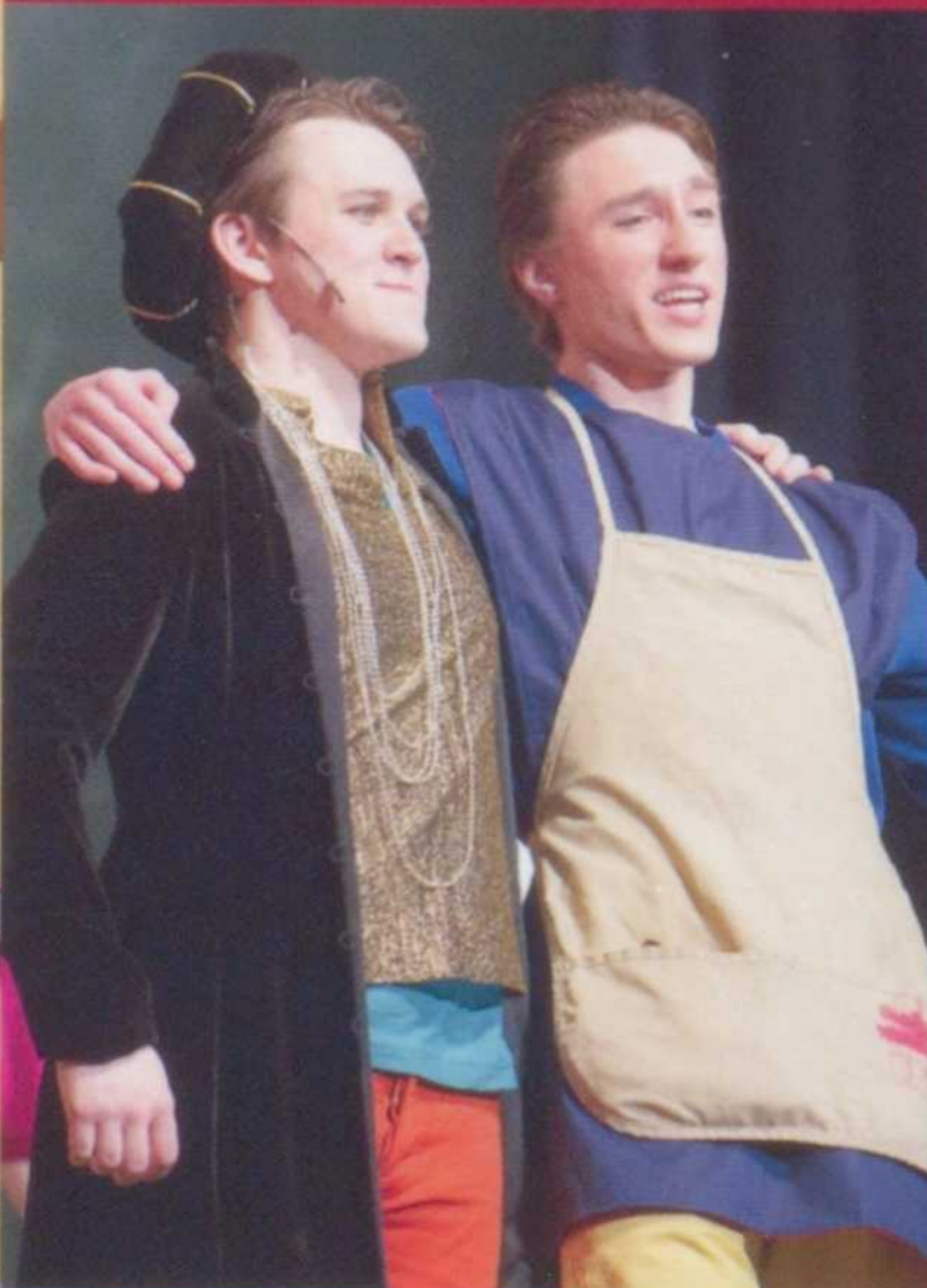

A night to remember...

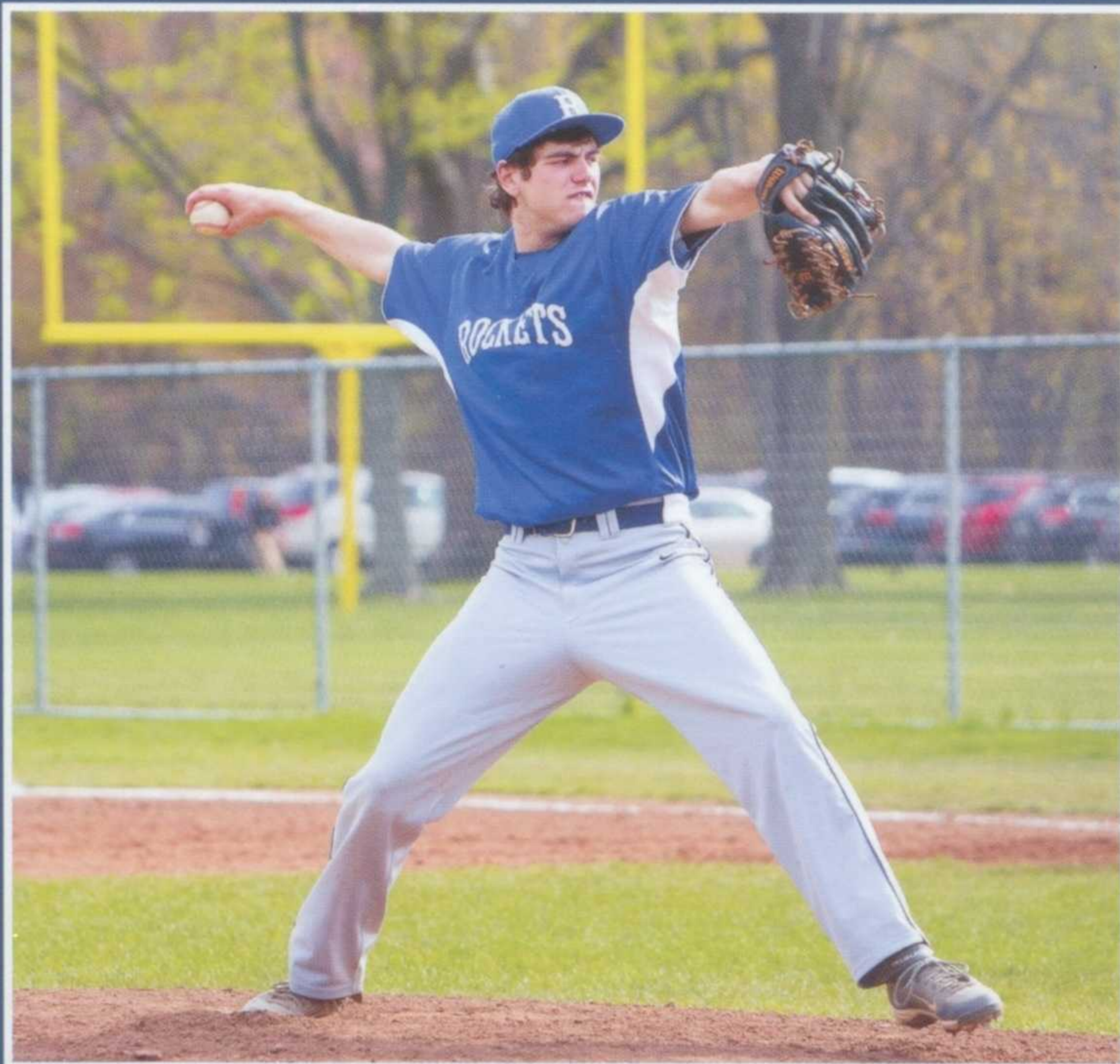

Baseball

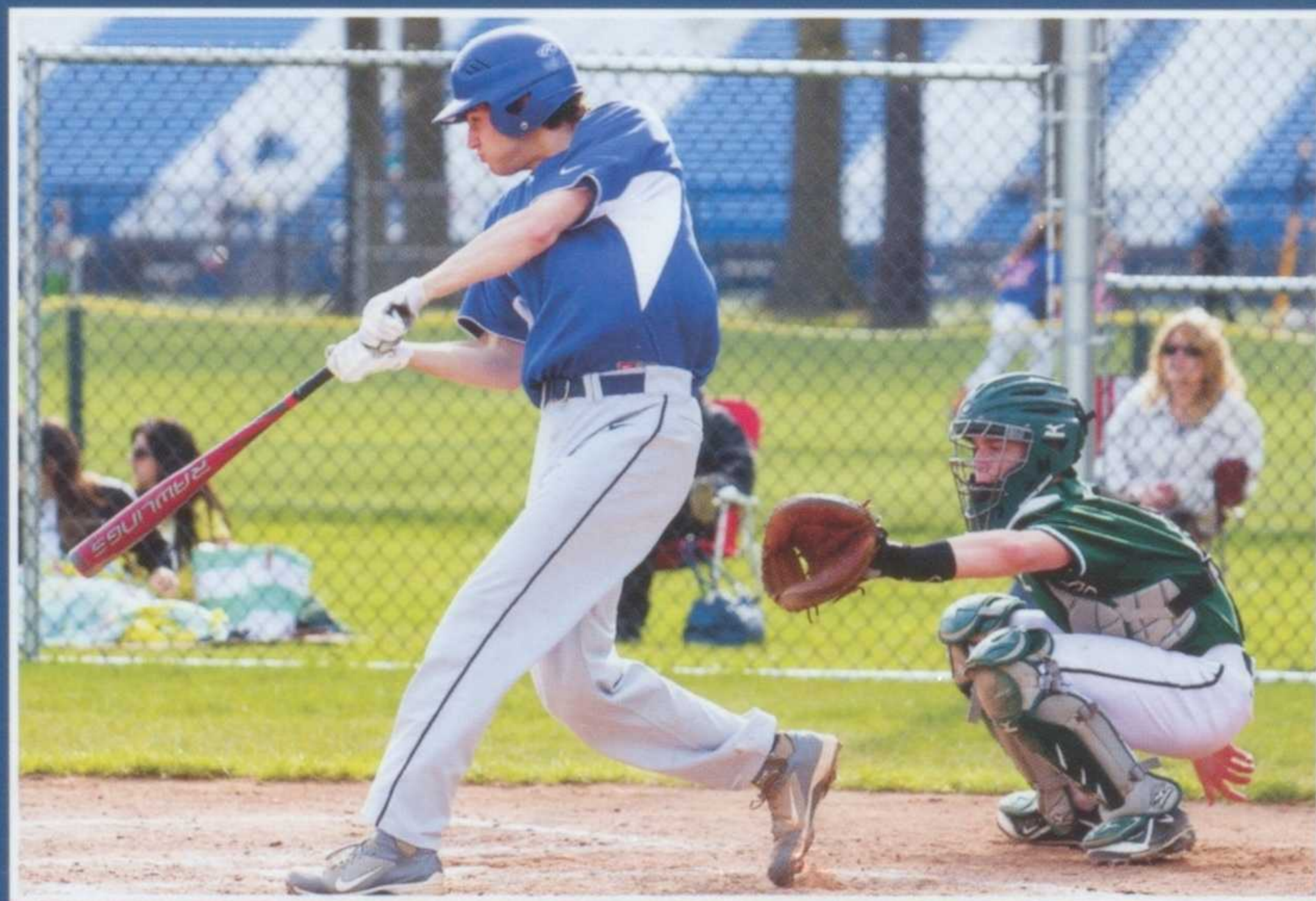
Runs Batted In

With that being said, the Bay Rockets Varsity Baseball Team had an outstanding season. They started the year playing two non-conference teams: Benedictine and Western Reserve Academy. Despite the unfamiliarity of the opponents, the Rockets prevailed and soundly won both of the games. Soon after those two competitive matches, Bay cruised over the competition with a six-game win streak. In addition, Bay showed their highly competitive spirits when they soundly beat Avon on May 1 by nine points. The early success for the Rockets was truly astounding; the team's 12-4 start launched the Rockets to a Top 20 Ohio Division II placement for the first time in ten years. Despite a few close losses towards the end of the season, the baseball team finished well with an overall season record of 14 wins and 10 losses. **Coach Joe Cheney** was incredibly proud of the baseball squad. He stated that "The 2014 baseball season was filled with excitement. We had a new field, new scoreboard, new assistant coaches and a team that was eager to erase back-to-back disappointing seasons." 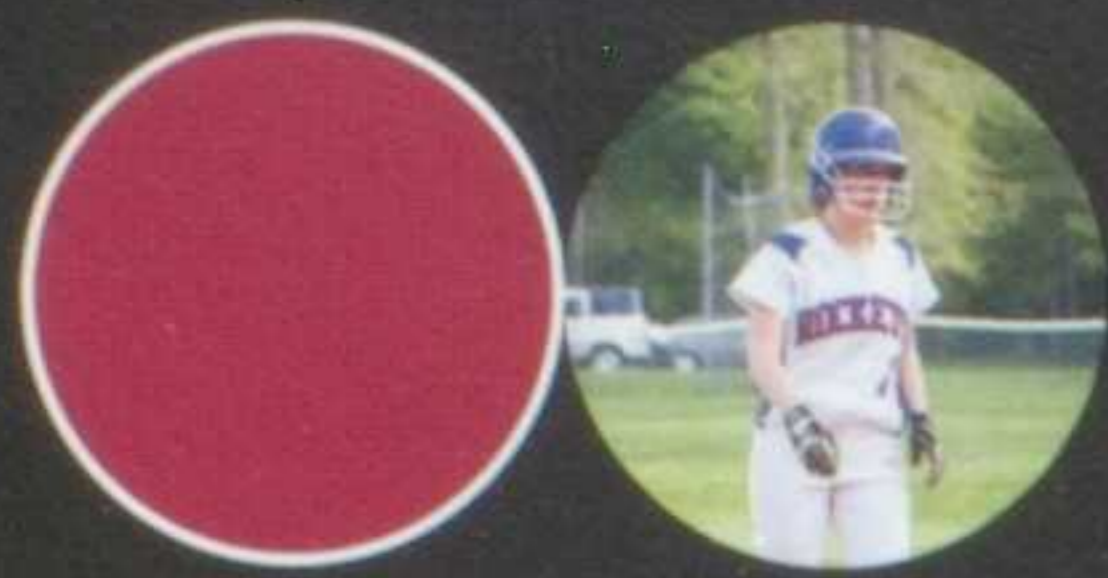

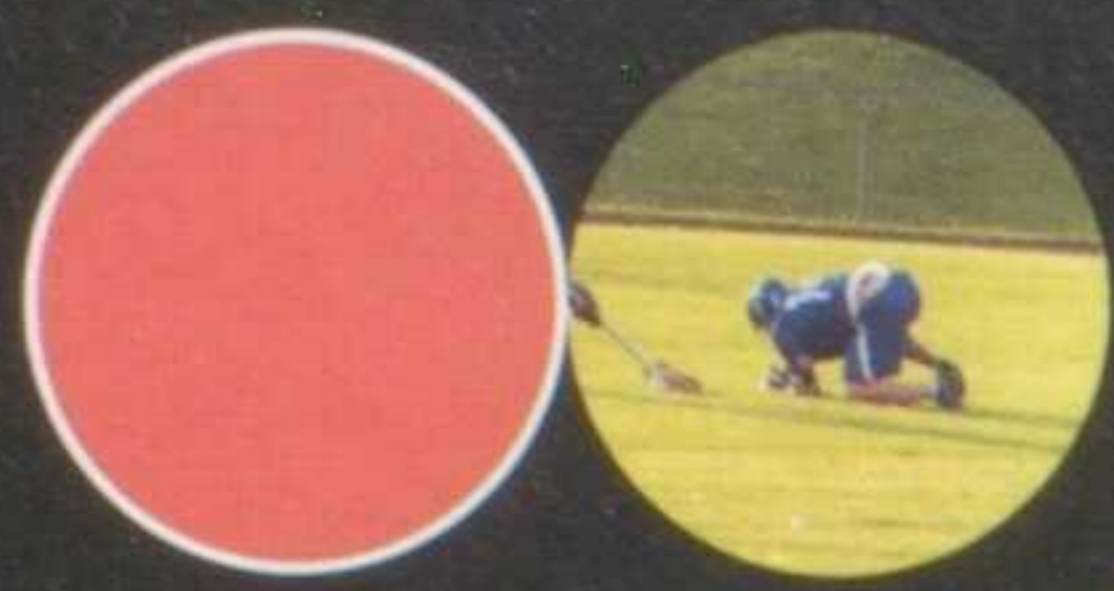

Mens Lacrosse ended with a winning record of 7-6. The team lost in the first round of the playoffs to Kent Roosevelt: 7-10. They were ranked 58 out of 108 teams. the team and the squad faces opponents like Hoover--who have over 100 kids in their

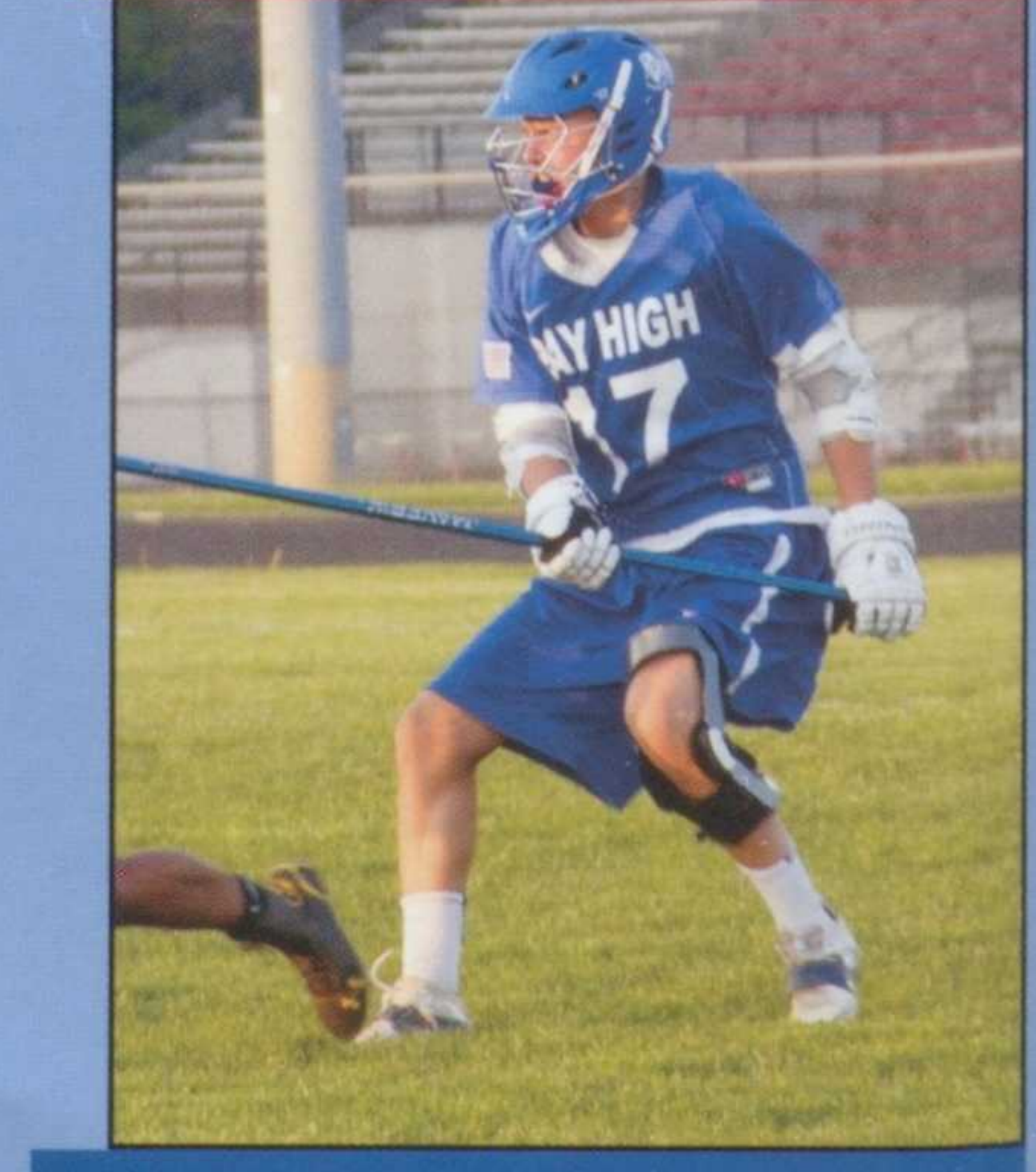
program. The future, however, is secure. **Nick Best**--All

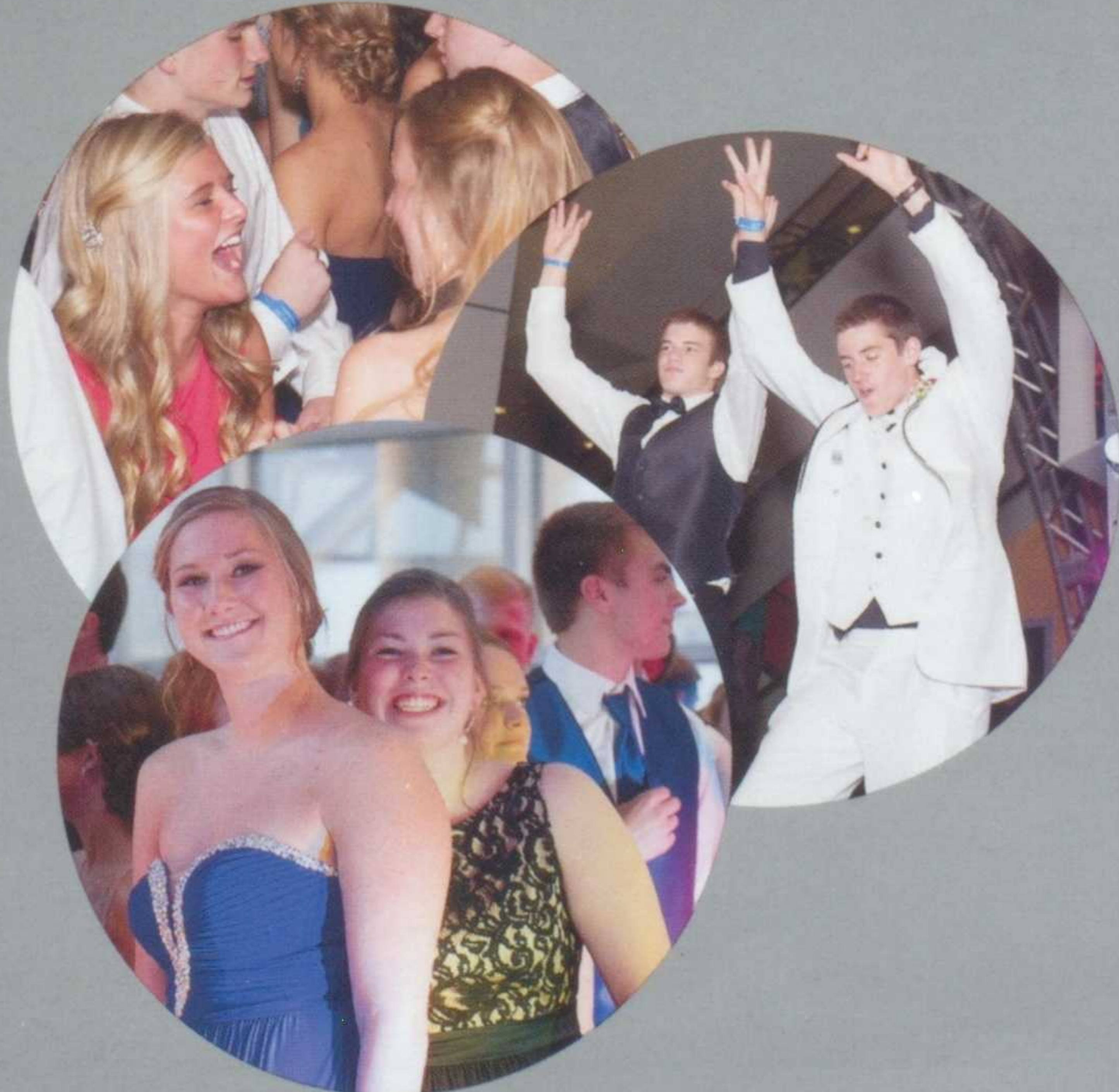
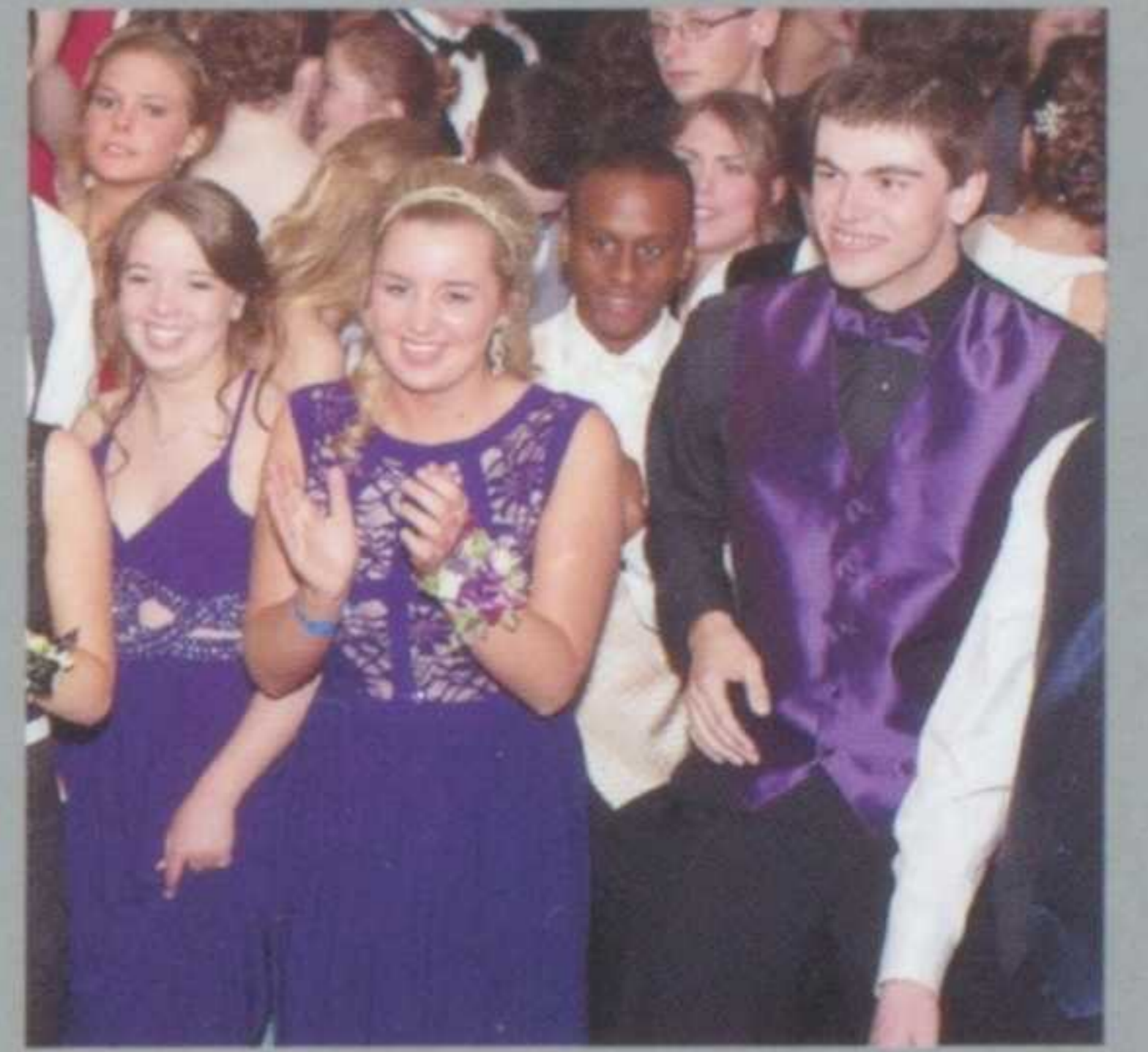
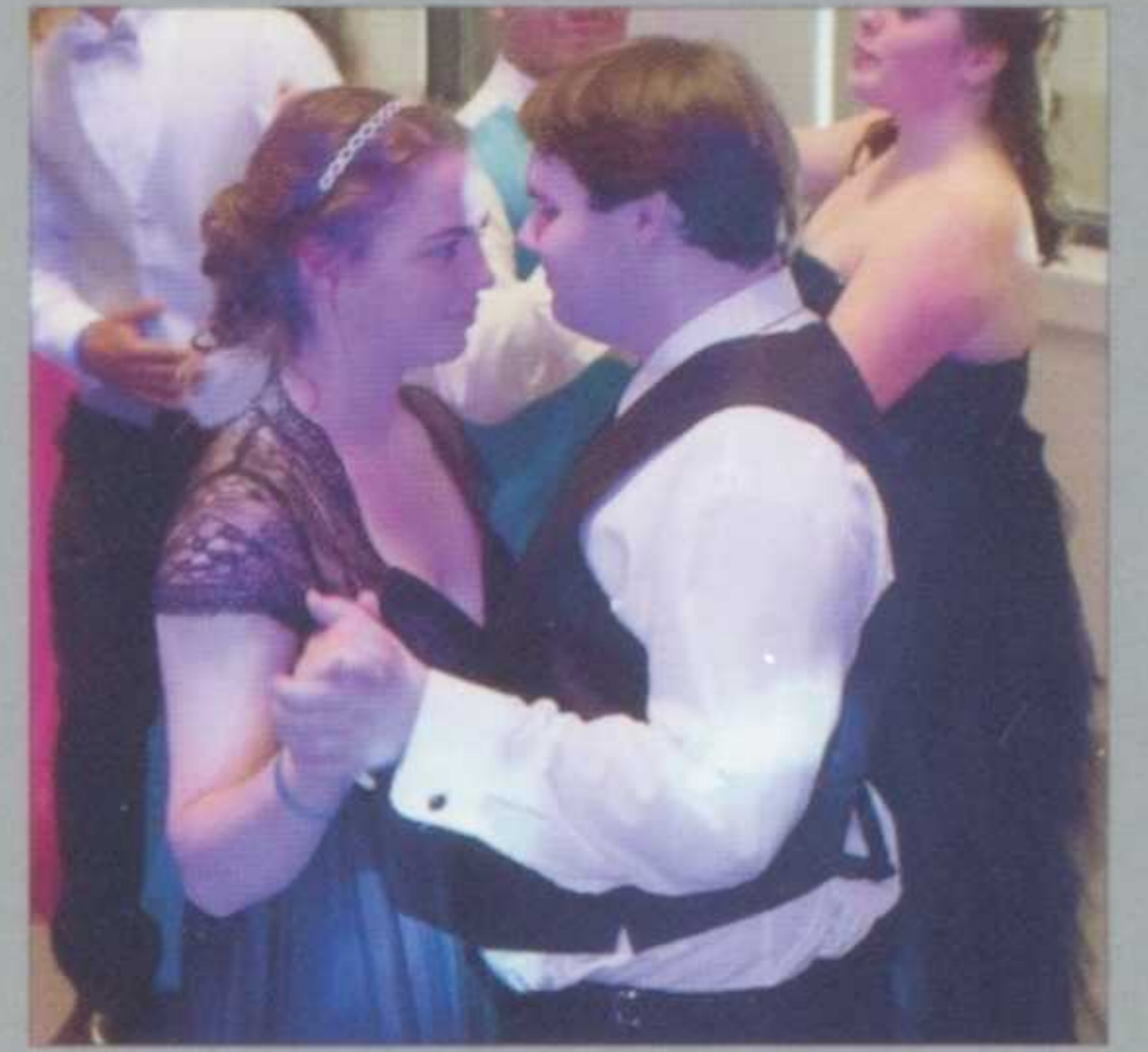
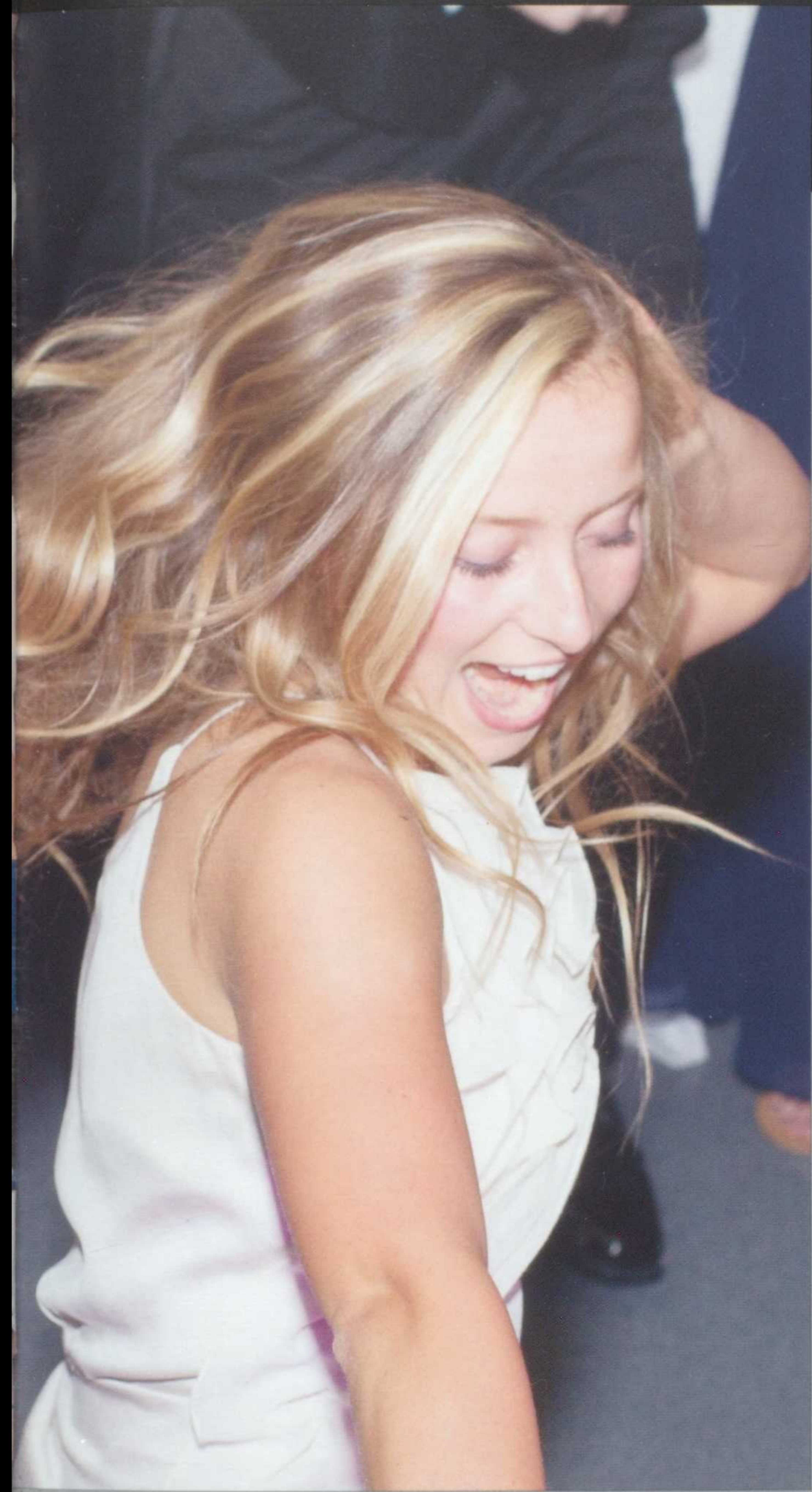
Rock and Roll Hall of *Seniors*

The 2014 football season featured Ron Rutt in his head-coaching debut. Rutt, a former Bay football player, took over a team that had not made the playoffs in 21 years. Rutt provided the team--known as The Wolfpack-- with well-needed optimism--consequently, the year was the best in Bay history. The first win was a blow-out against Brookside, which propelled the momentum to recapture the Brown Jug from Westlake. On the unseasonably cold evening of November 7th, the Rockets won their first playoff game in the history of the school by beating Crestwood 18-7. The second round was played against NDCL, in Twinsburg, after a snowstorm. Bay won 27-24. In third round, Benedictine ended Bay's historical season with 35-7 win. 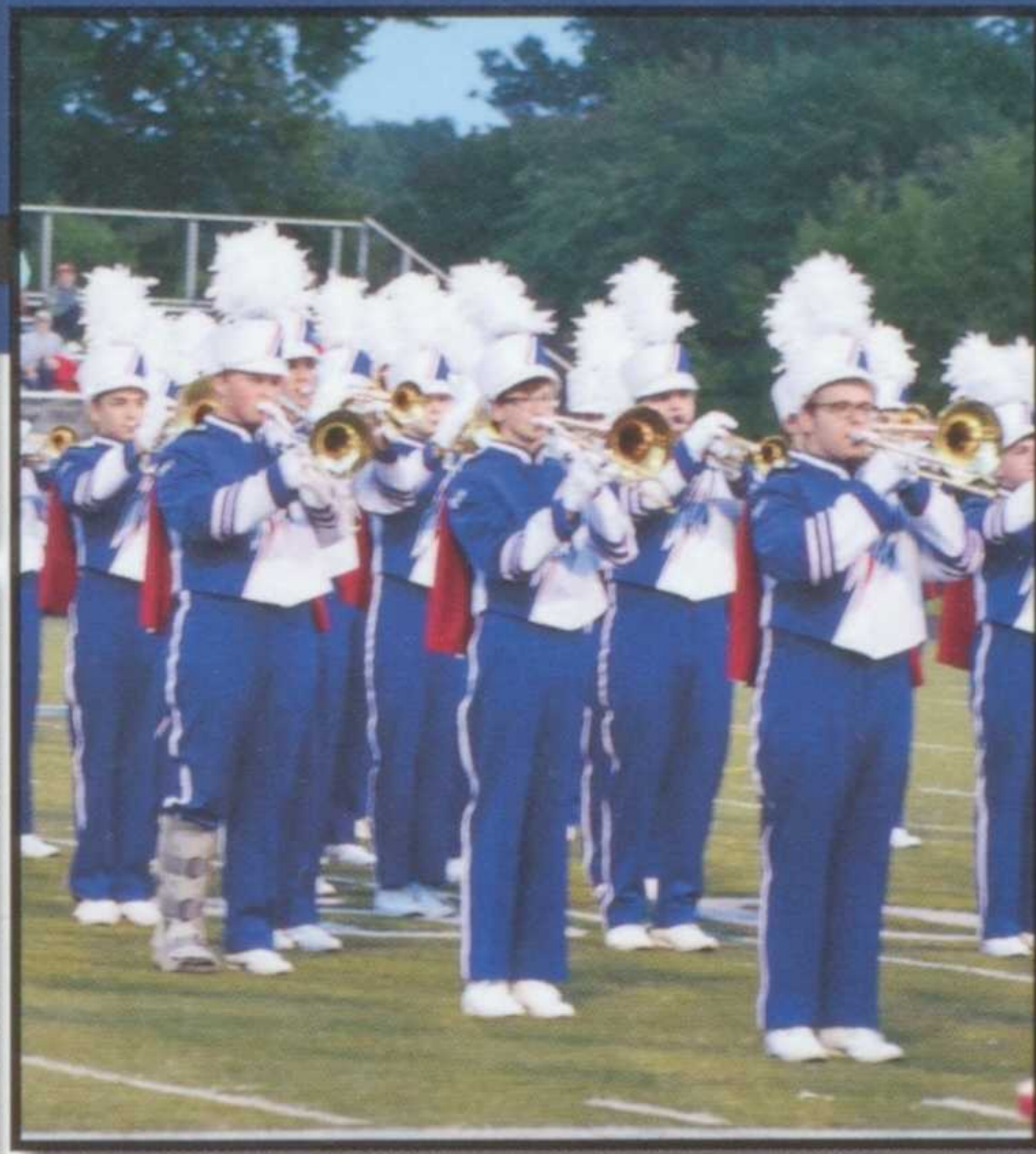
Taking the Field

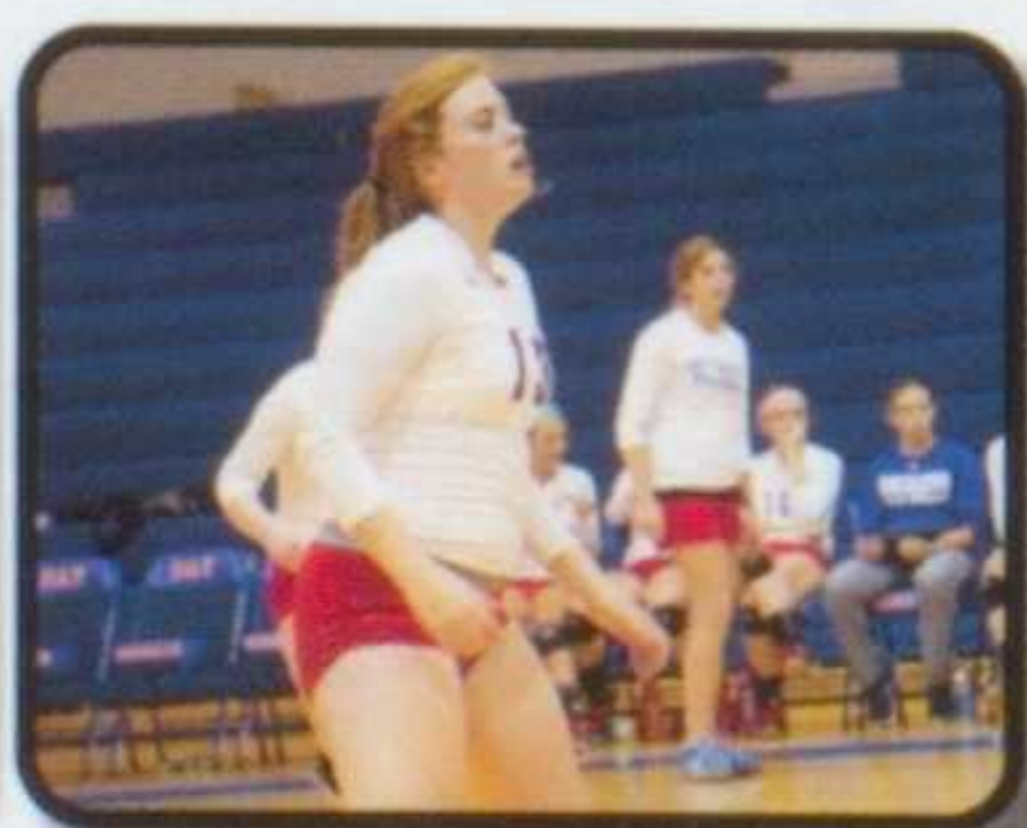


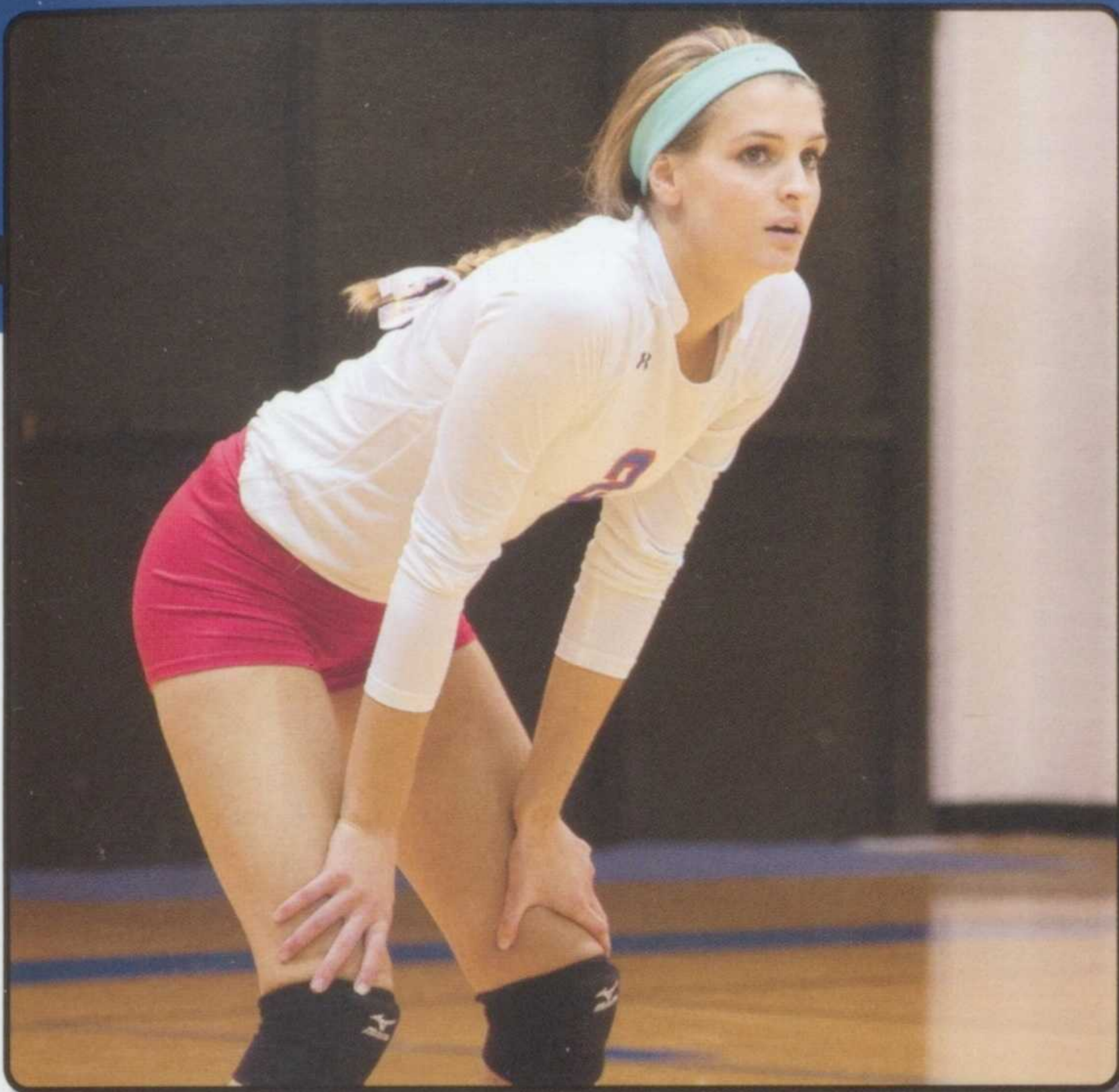
GIRLS VOLLEYBALL

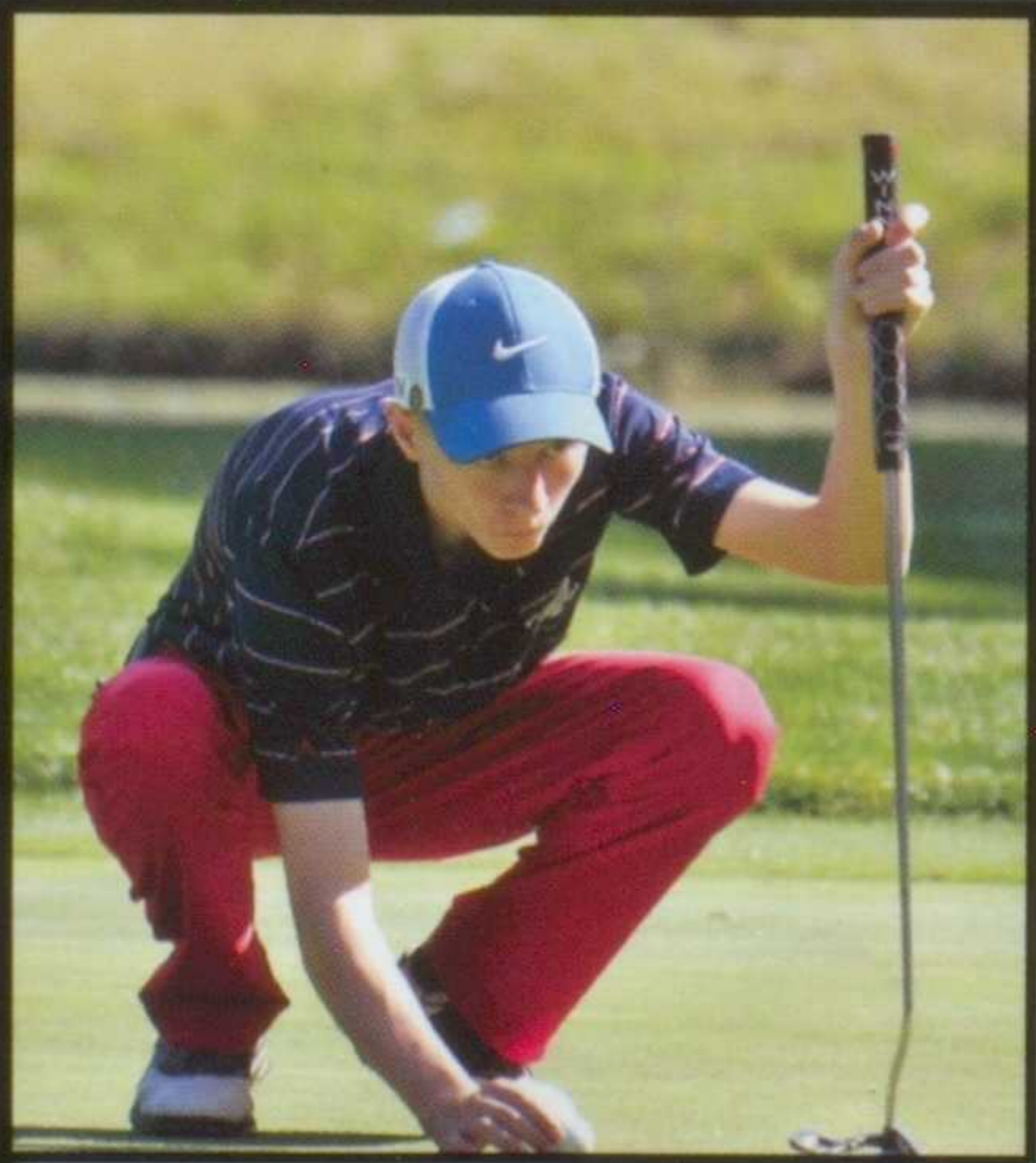
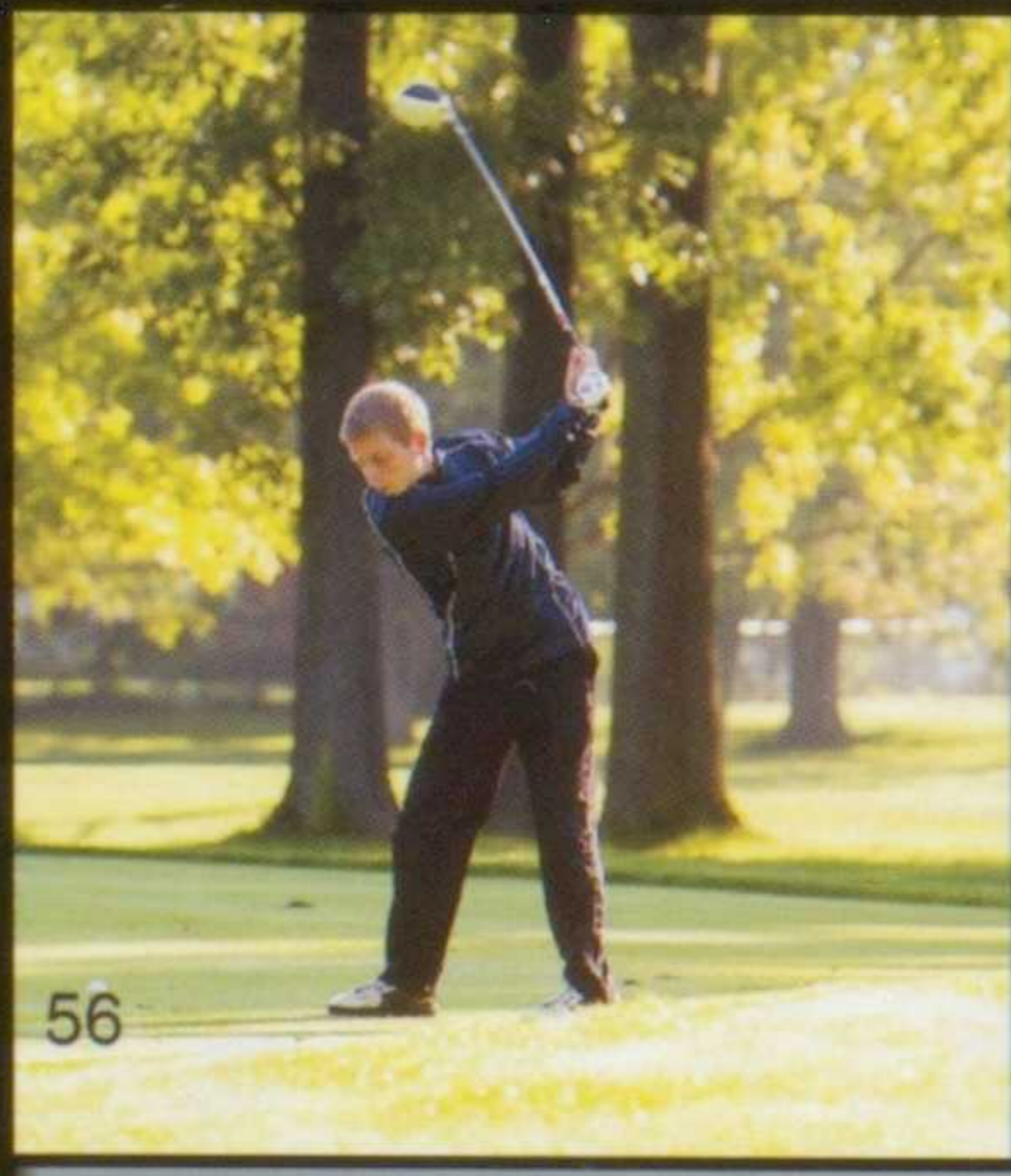
Dominic Muccio

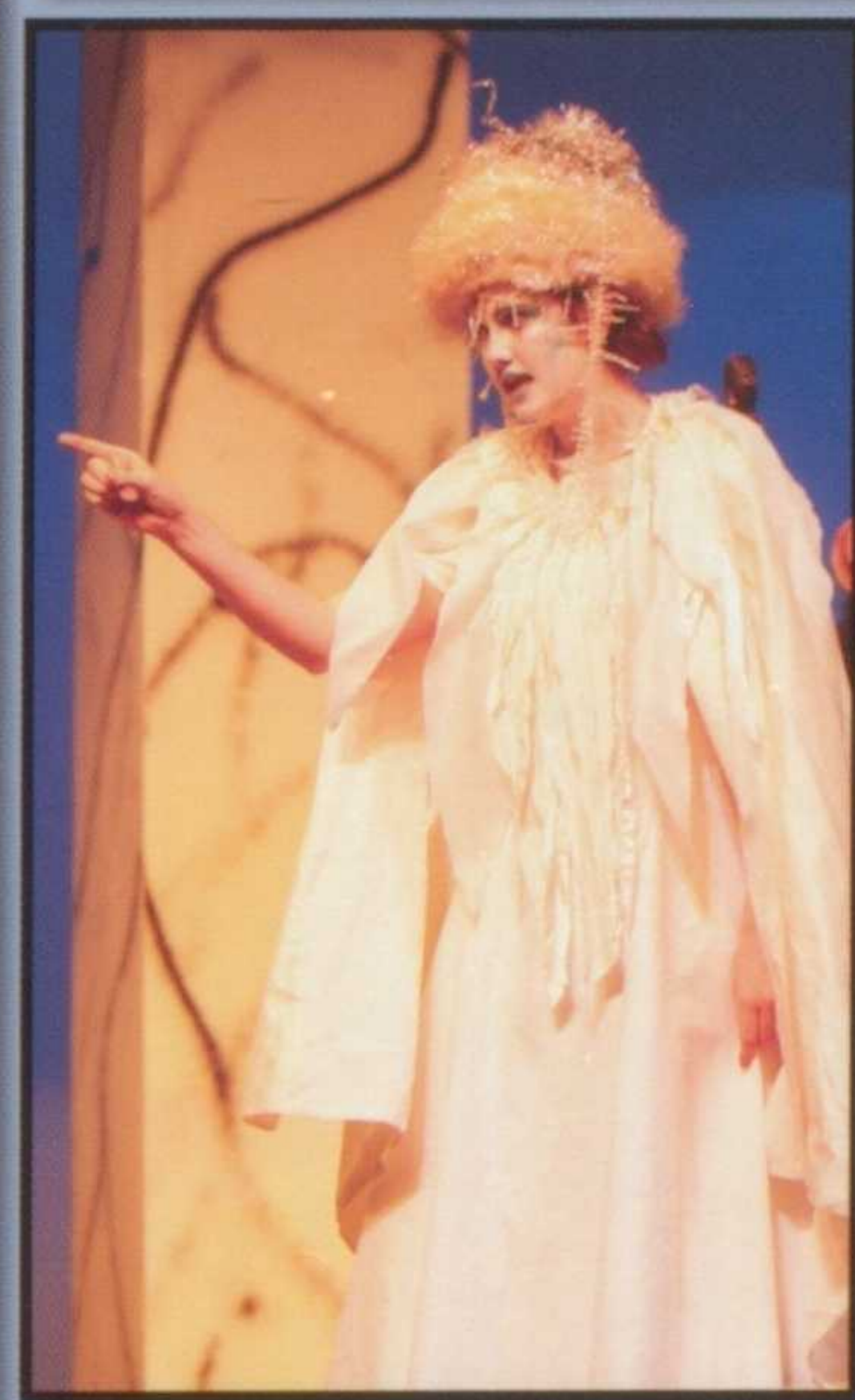

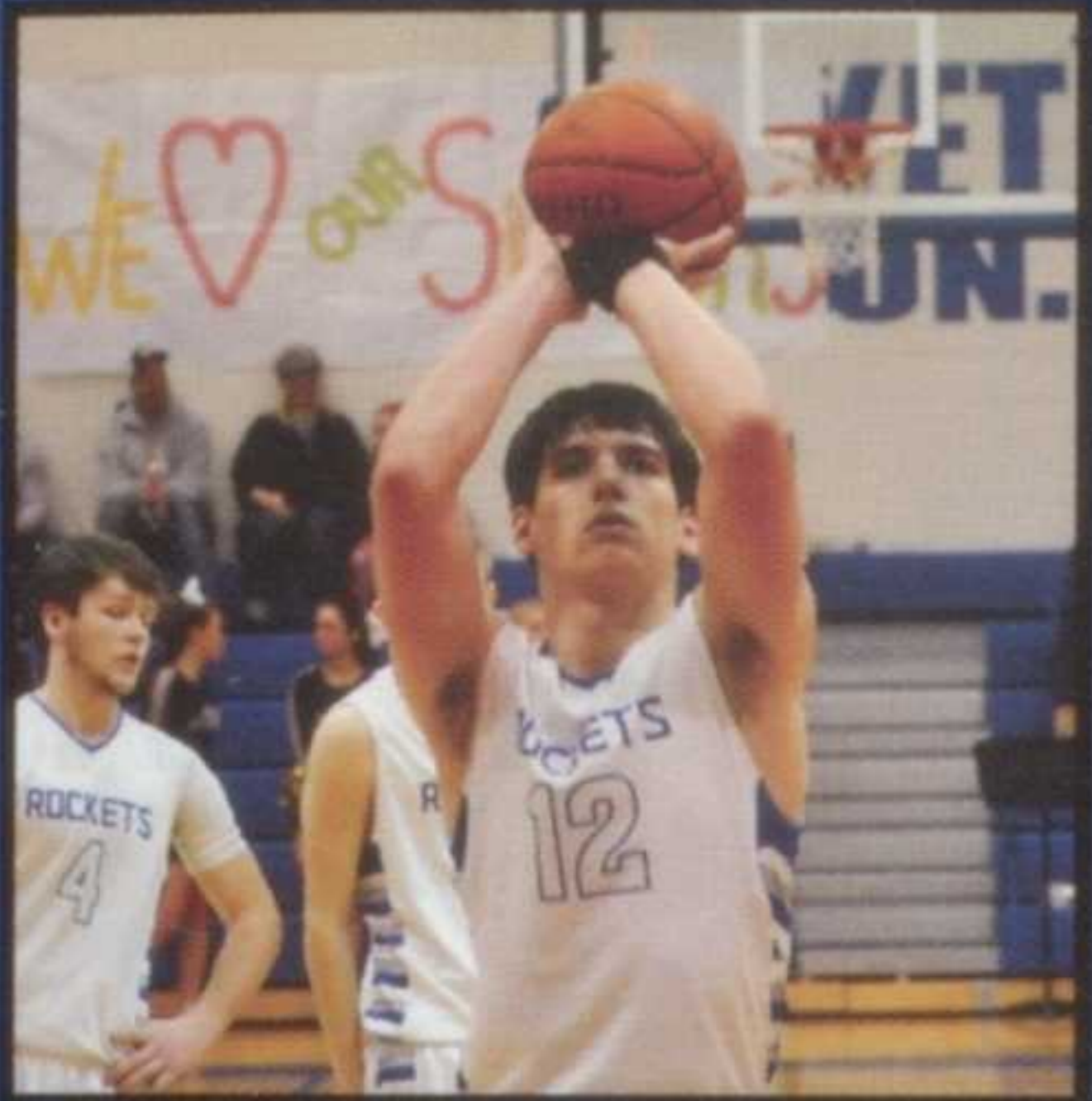
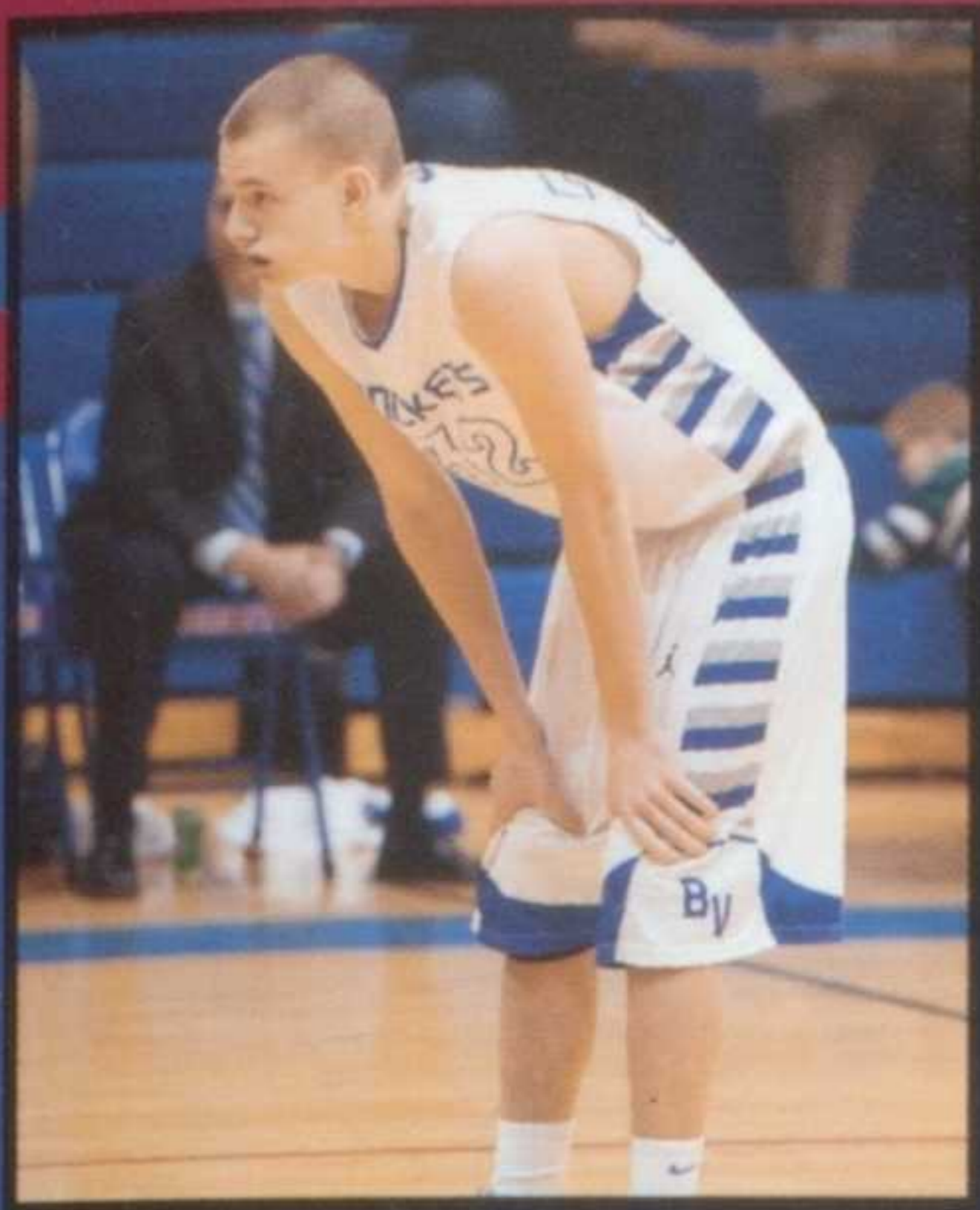
The 2014-15 basketball season restored Bay's reputation as a WSC powerhouse. Lead by Coach of the Year **Jared Shetzer**, the team concluded the season as first in the conference, going 1-1 in post season play, losing to rivals Vermilion in the District Semi-final. The season was chock-full of accolades: a nine game winning streak; two First Team All-WSC winners: **Rex Sunahara, 12**, and **John Koz, 11**; a Second Team All-WSC winner: **senior Brandon Morris**; and two All-WSC Honorable Mentions: **seniors Danny Heideloff** and **Jonathon Brajdic**. (These players also received awards from the All District team.) Four school records were broken: Most Blocks in a Career: Rex Sunahara 178; Most Blocks in a Season: Rex Sunahara 99; Most Blocks in a Game: Rex Sunahara 9; and Most 3's Made in a Game Team: 20 vs Amherst and 16 vs Westlake.

The offense outscored opponents 1740-1293 with 311 rebounds, while the defense totaled 571 rebounds with 162 steals. In his final season, center Rex Sunahara--also a major component in Bay's football turnaround-- scored 345 points and led the team in rebounds with 209--completing a dream senior year. John Koz, a junior, lead the team in points scored with 374; he will be the lone starter returning next season.

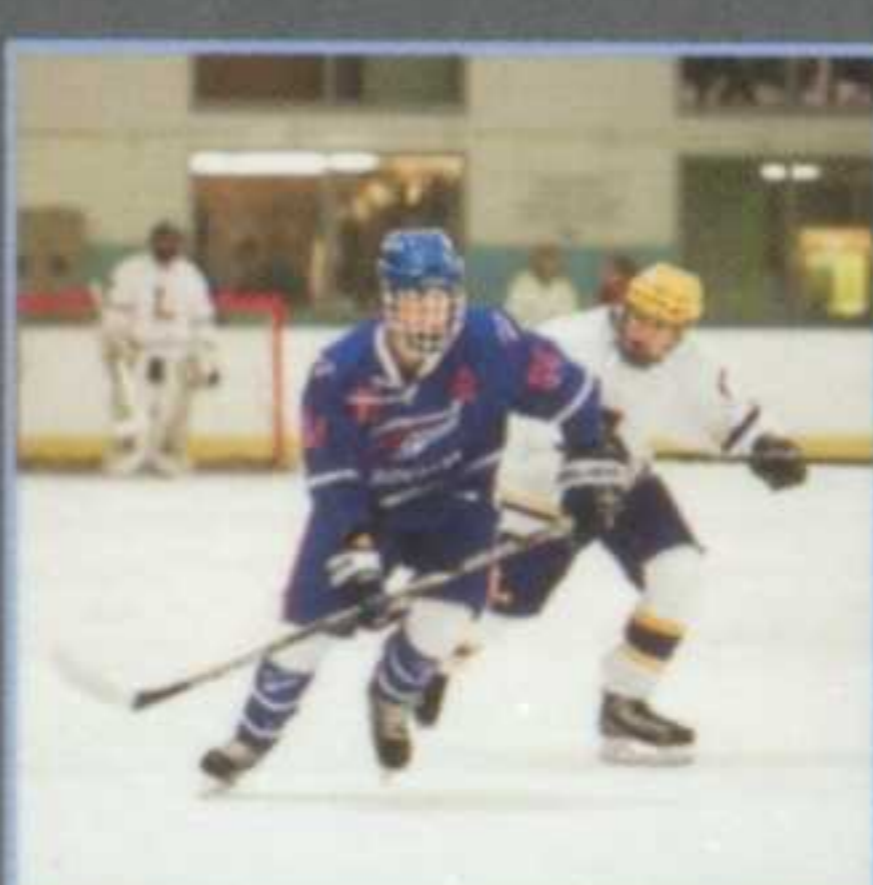
Daniel Linhart

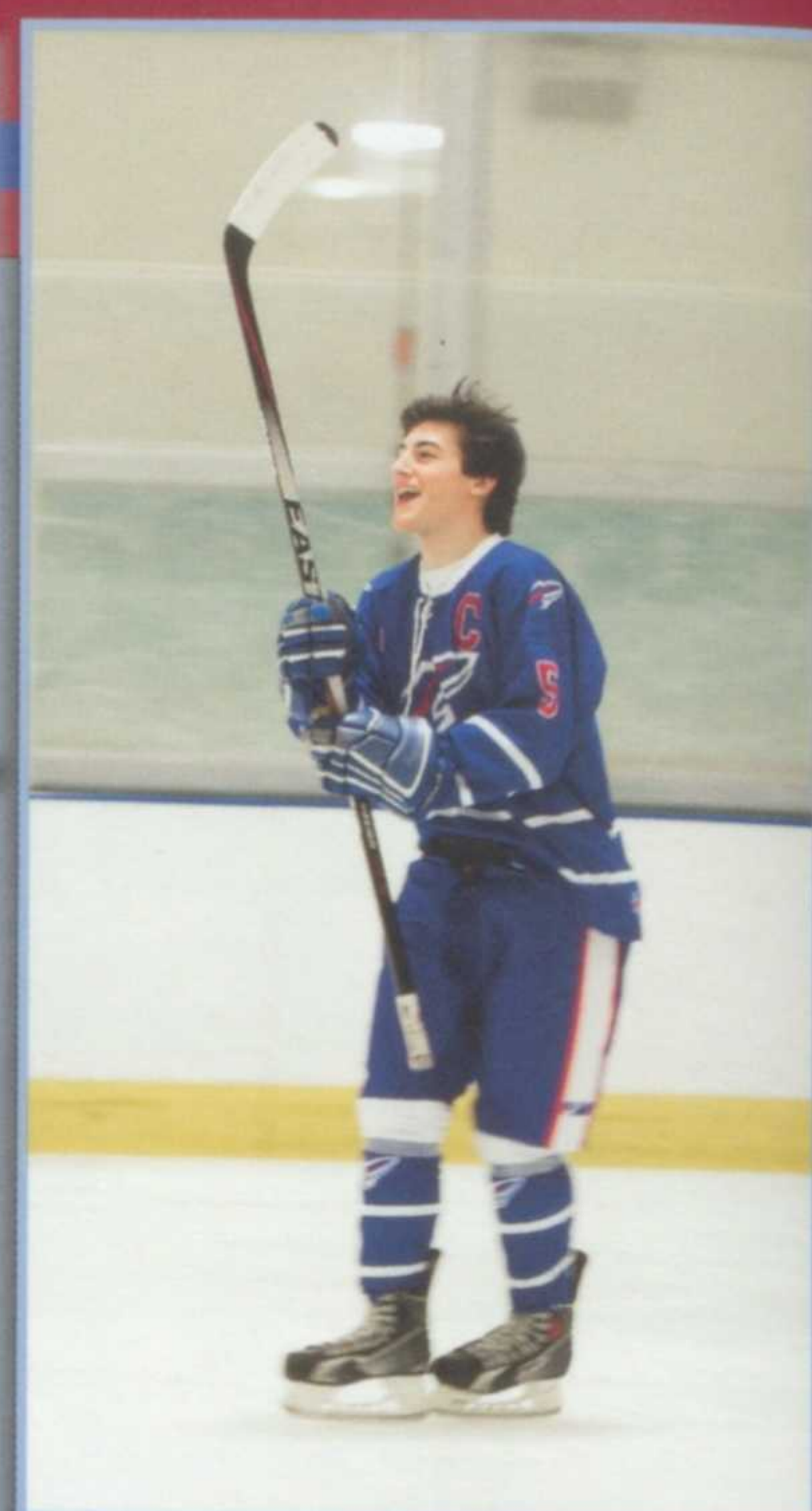

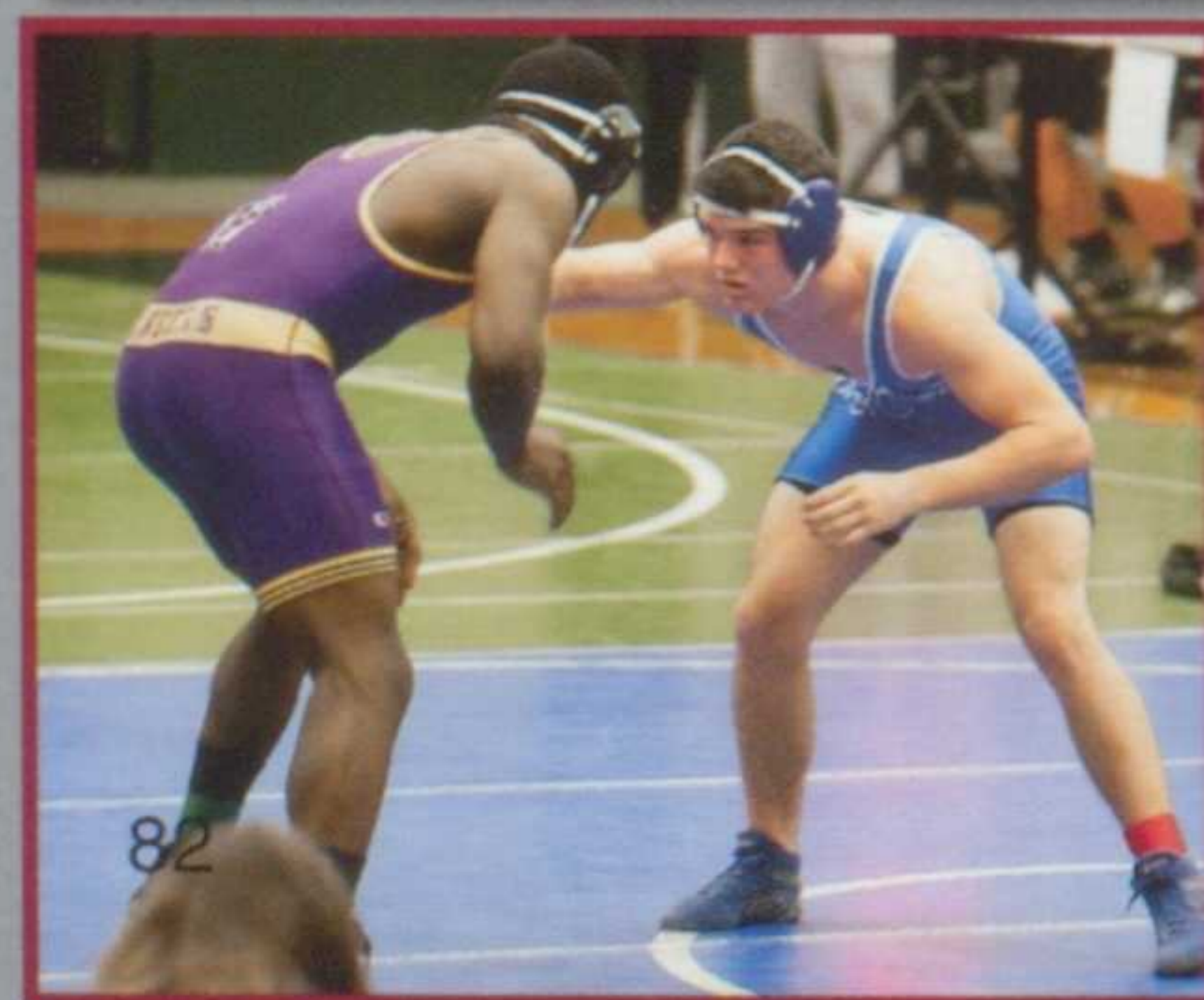
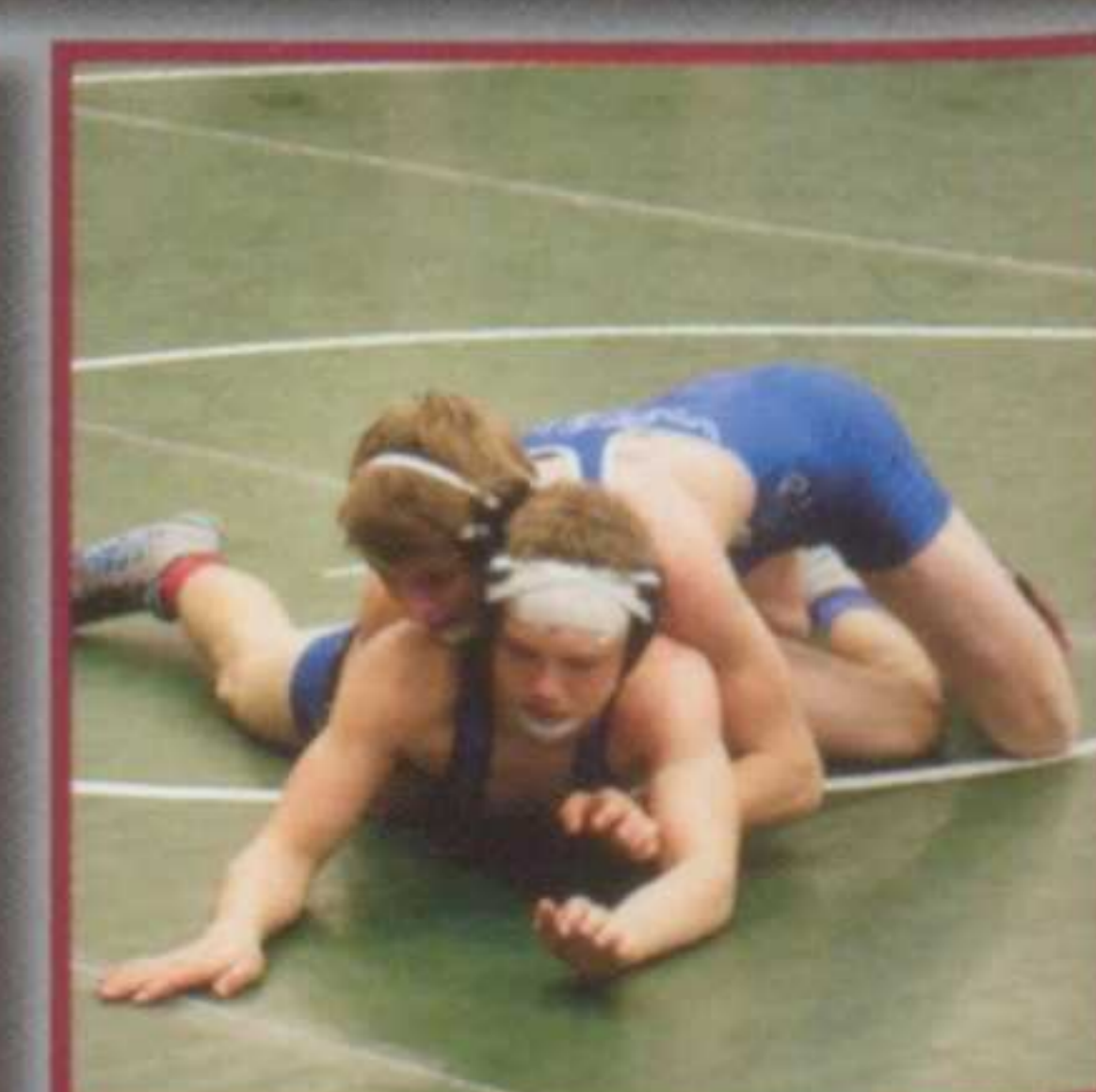
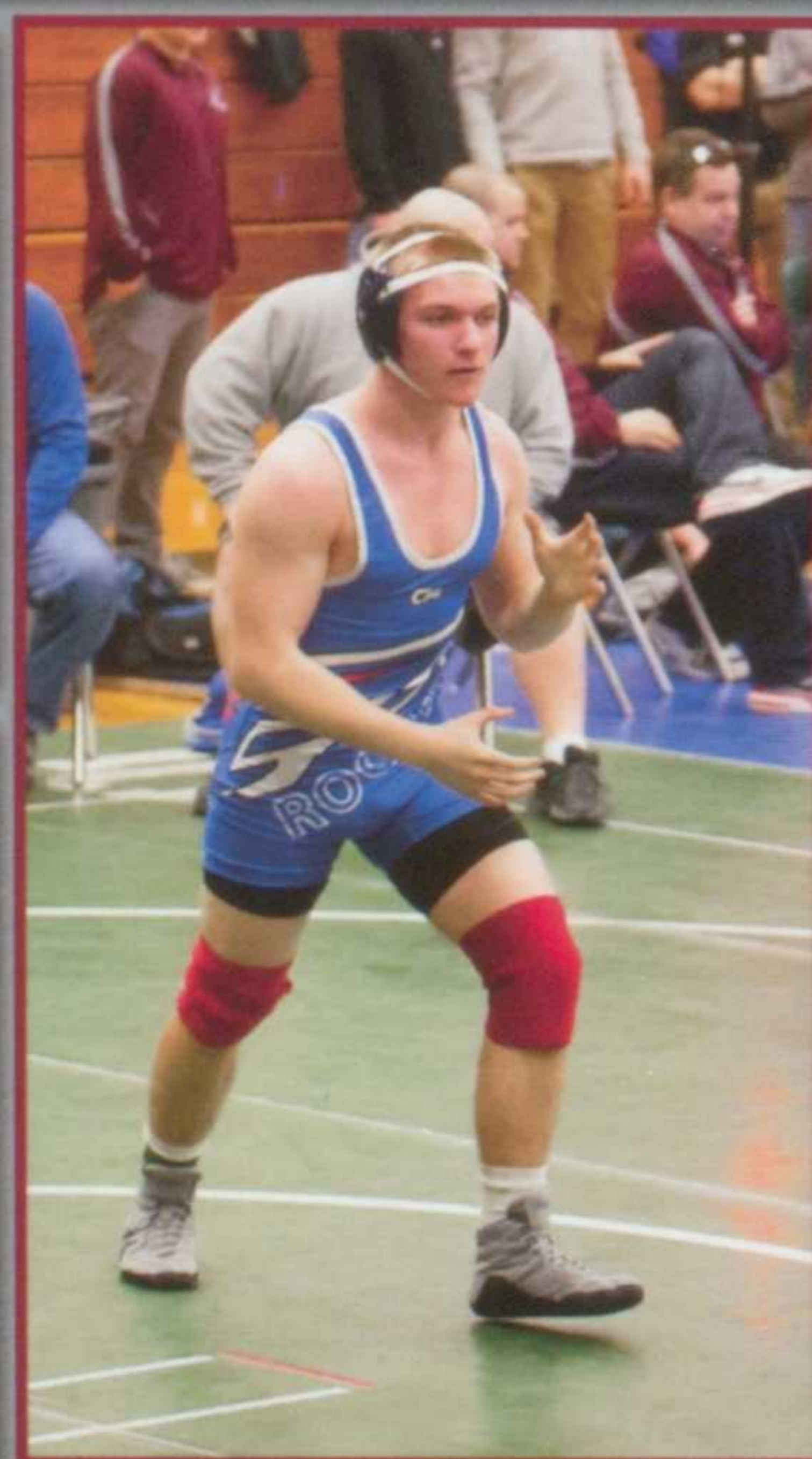


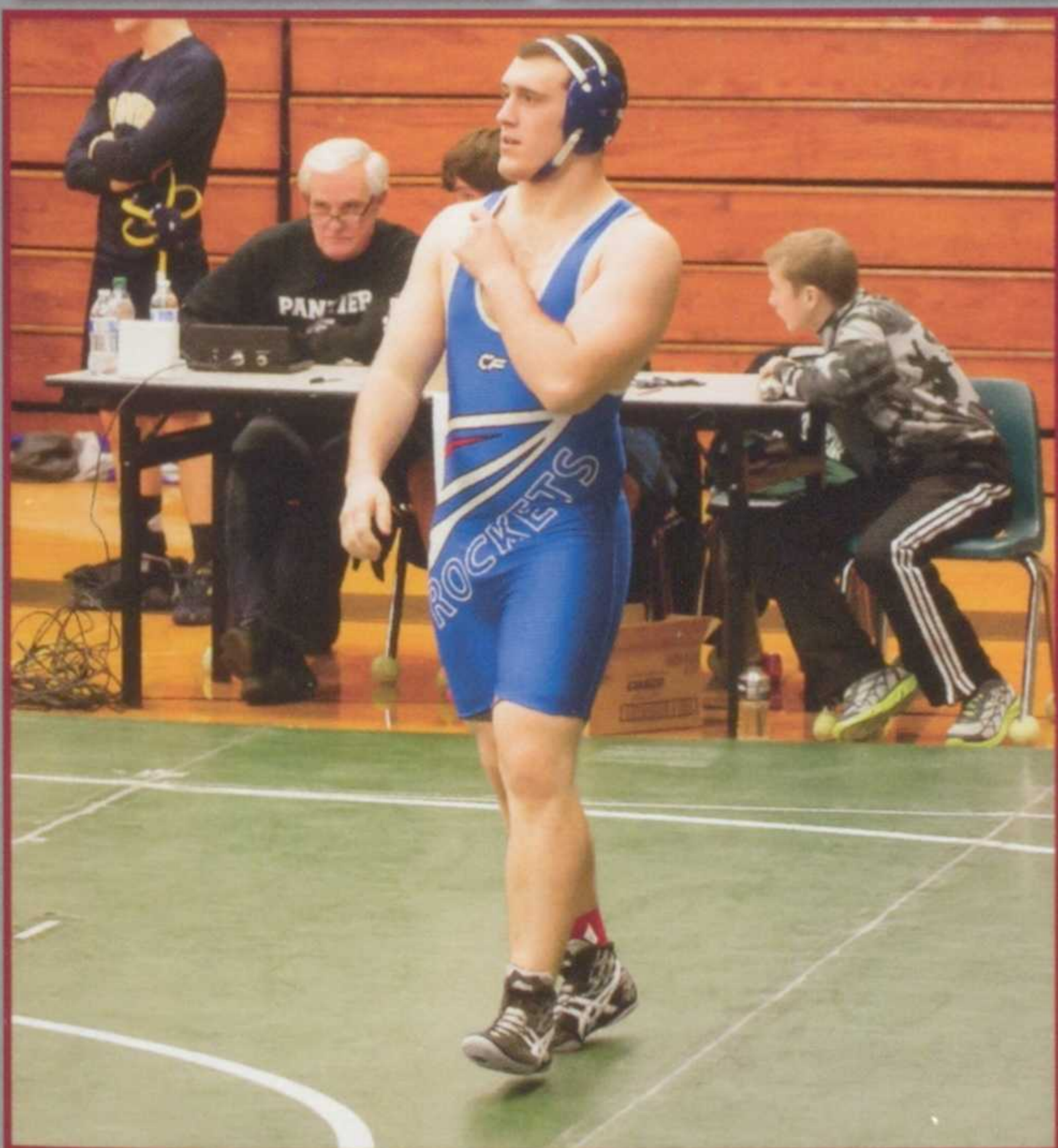
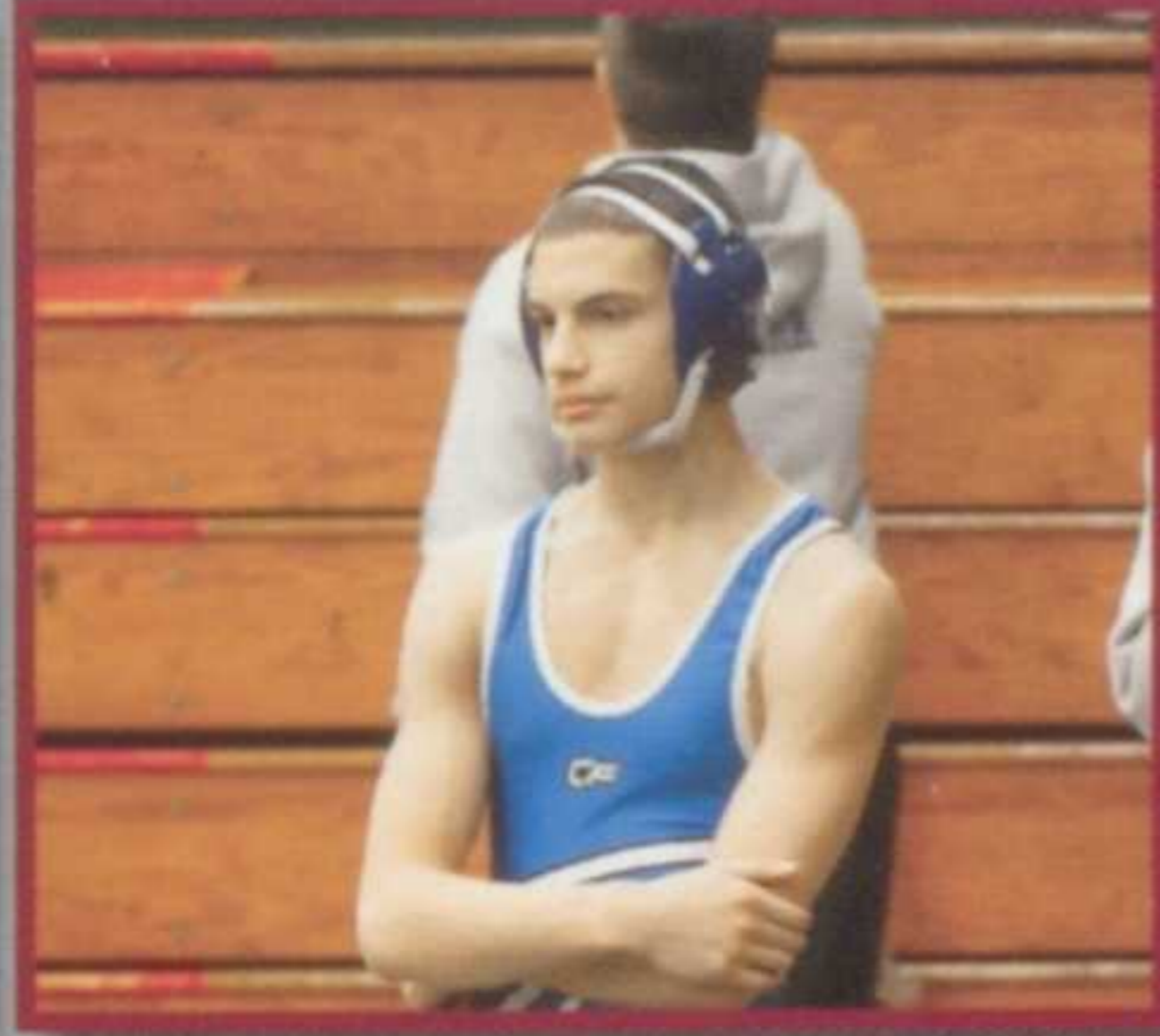
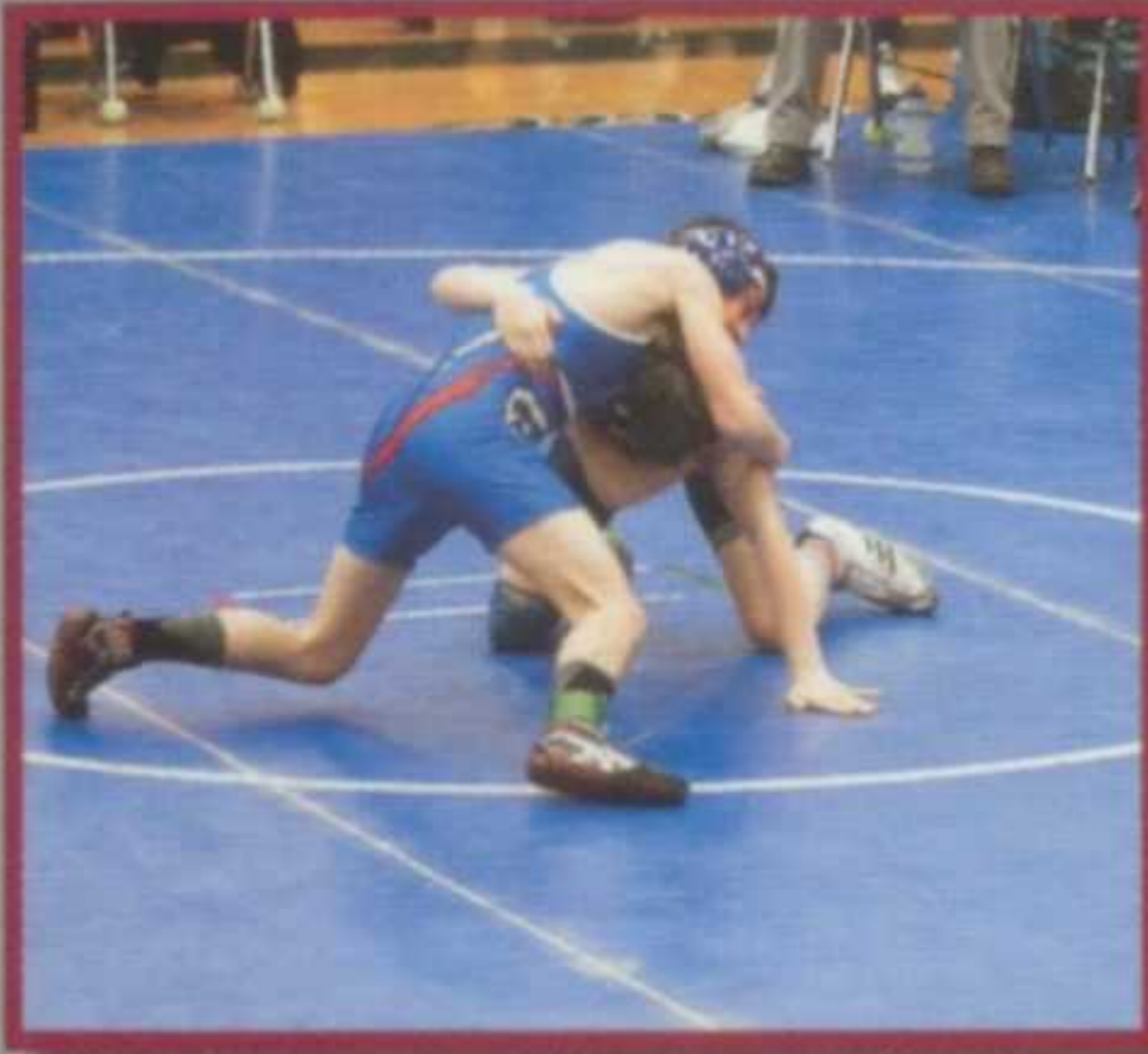
Wrestling
