Tech Club

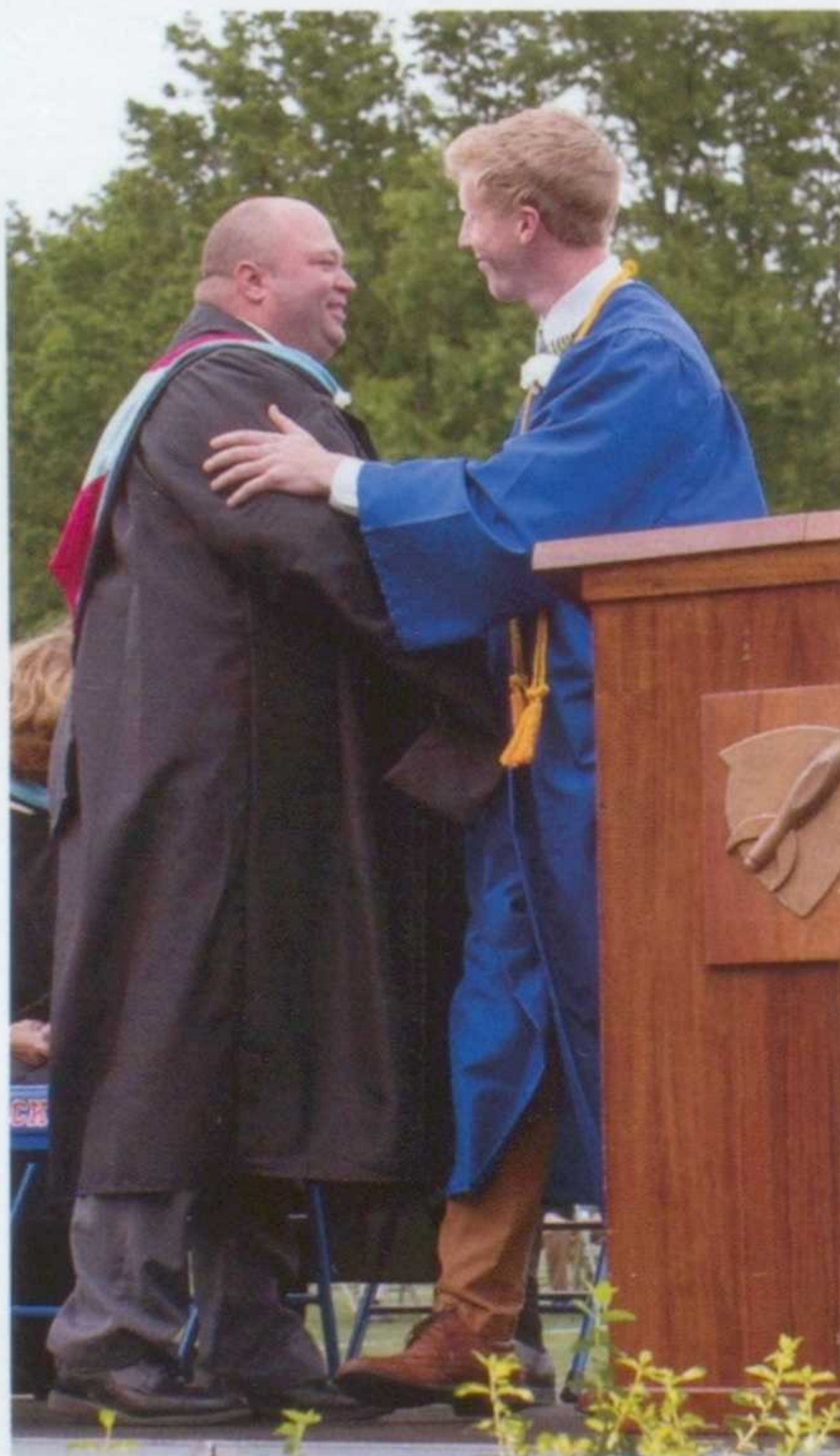
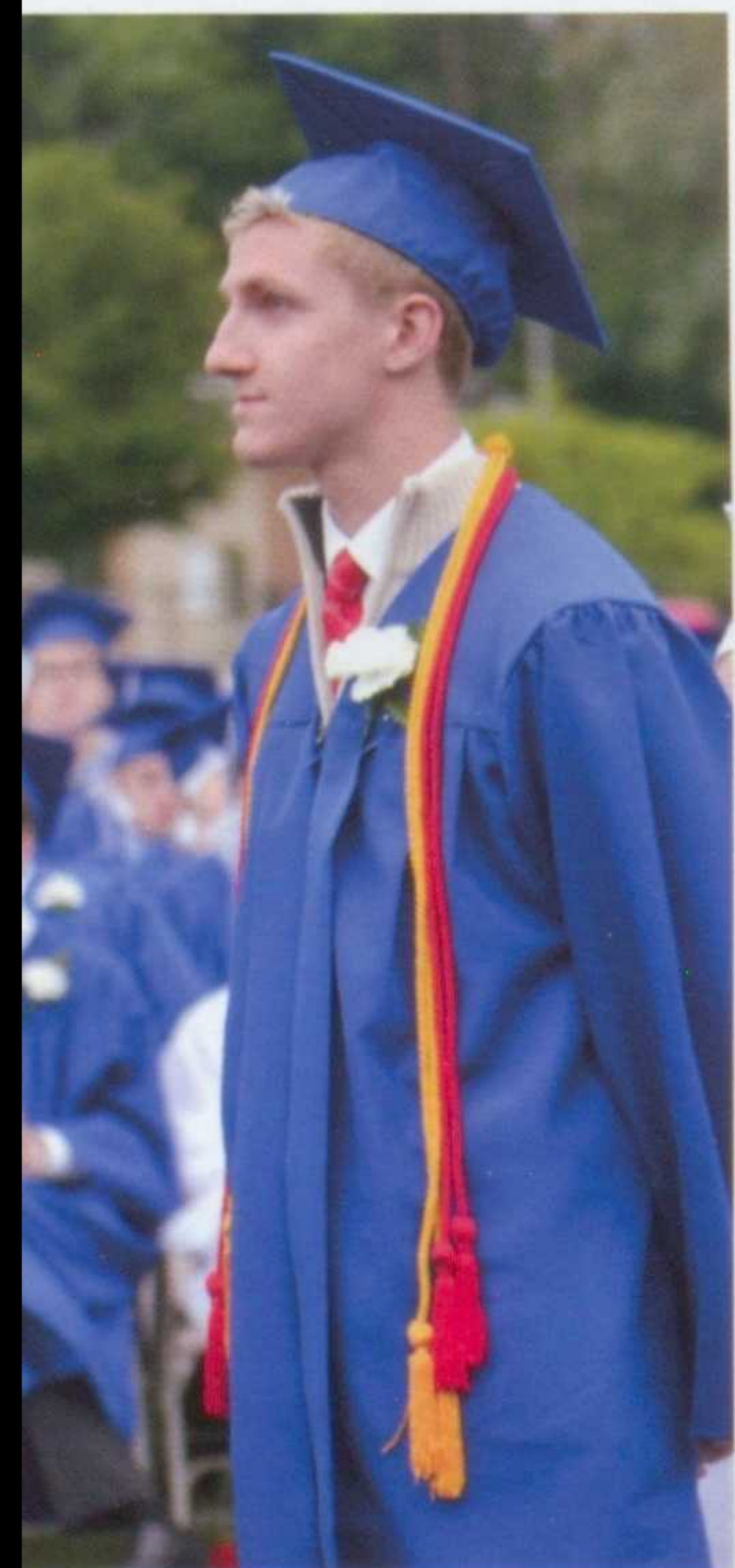

Good Luck Class of 2015!

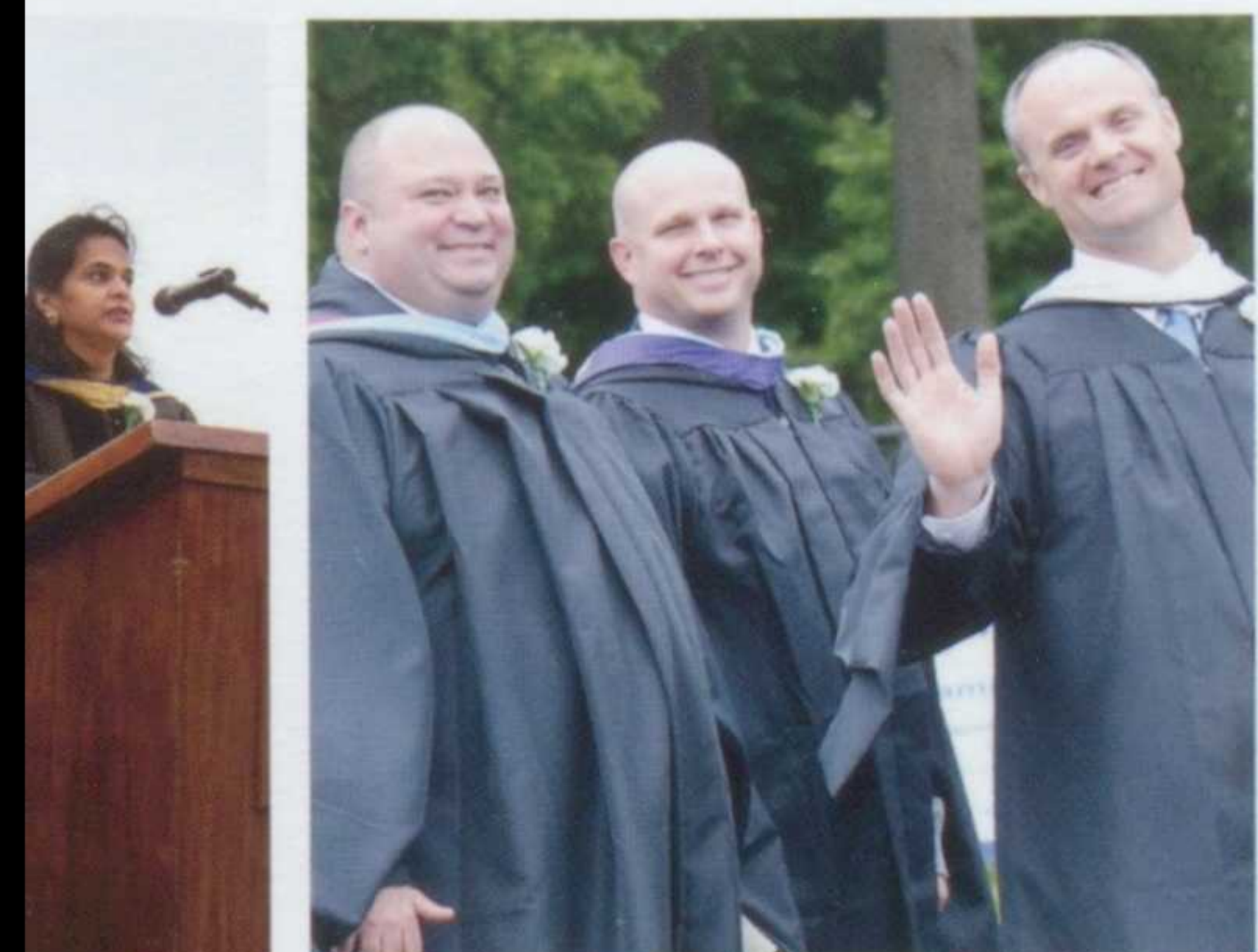

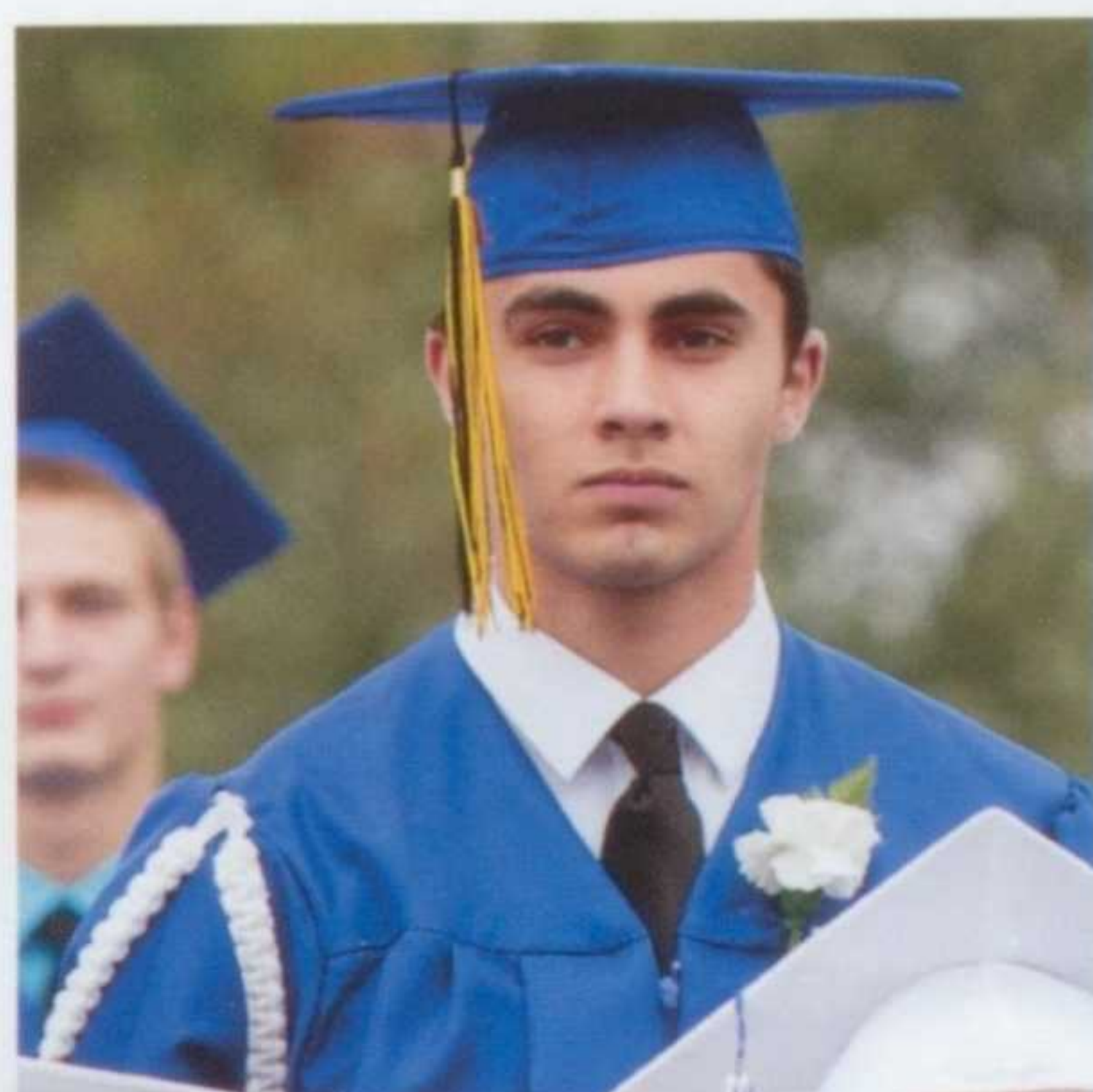


Claire Mercer pauses her speech to acknowledge the great success our football team experienced this year.

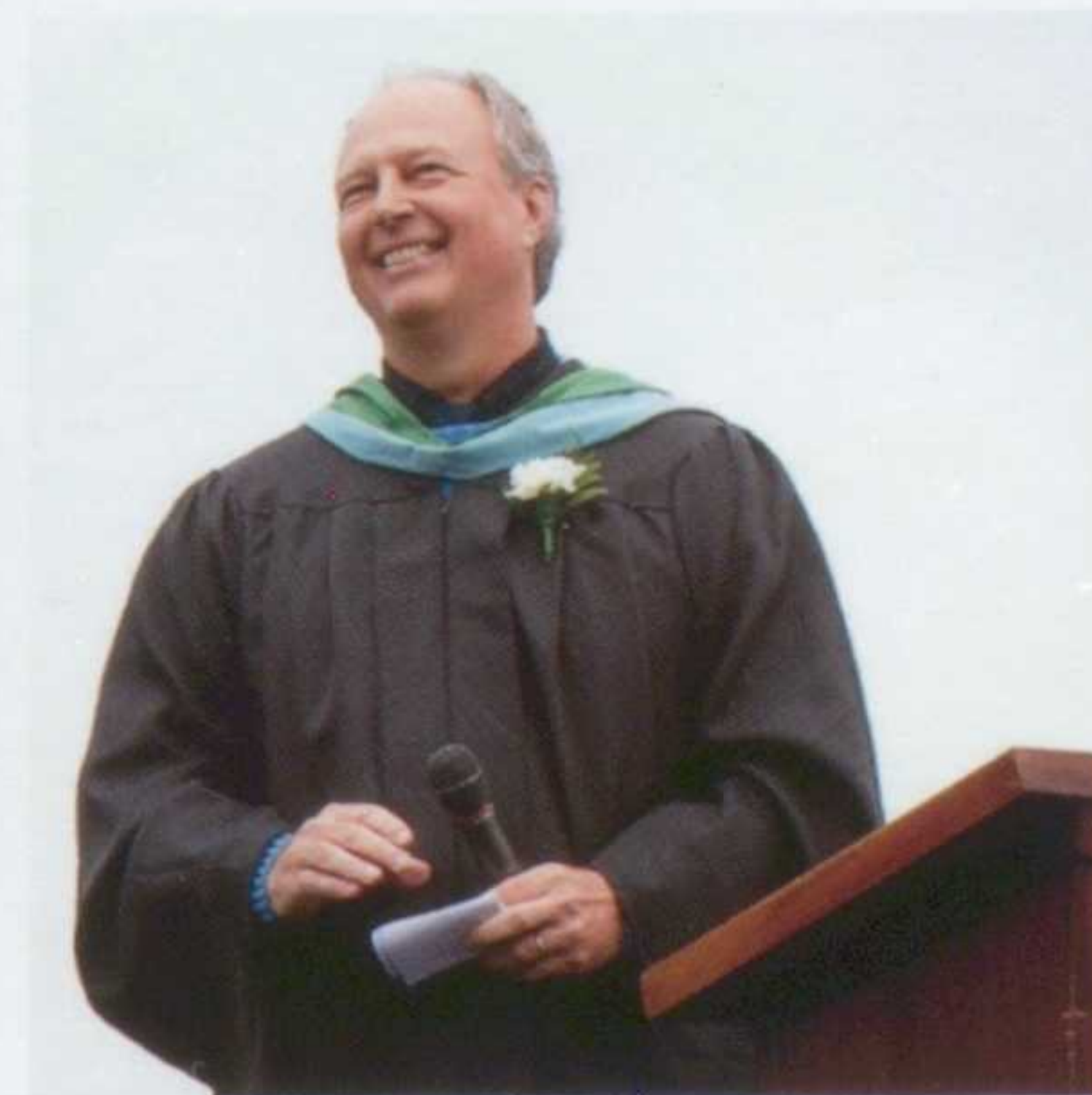

Graduates, Peter Sullivan and **Matt Orr**, as well as **Senior, Jack Hautz** qualified for the State meet this season.

Graduate, Dan Berger commented about the field athlete's season: "Improving throughout the season can be difficult for some throwers. Trying to meet a specific distance that you are striving to reach is very stressful at times because no matter how much power you give it you still can come up short. Form is the master key to throwing and Peter Sullivan and I worked so well together critiquing each other towards better technique that we became top throwers in our conference. I finished the season placing 6th in the conference for discus, while Peter finished 1st in discus with a state qualifying throw of 172'-06", and 6th in shot put. We both went on to place in the district meet. I placed 8th in the discus and 7th in the shotput. Peter had yet another impressive performance and took 2nd to improve onwards towards regionals. He then qualified for the state track meet at regionals and placed a very impressive 7th in the state of Ohio for all Division 2 discus athletes., winning Bay High's 2015 field MVP."

Womens Track and Field had a terrific season, finishing third in the West Shore Conference Championships. Great teamwork, leadership, and lots of dedication to the sport paid off during the regular season. The team had achievements that included placing fourth out of sixteen at the Avon Relays and winning third place in their two invitationals.

WSC MVP and Sprint MVP, **Olivia Bechtel**, earned district champion for the 200M and 400M, as well as runner up in the long jump. At State, Olivia placed 4th in the 400M and 10th in the 200M and long jump. WSC Field Event Co-MVP and Field MVP, **Kaylie Harden**, won district runner up for pole vault as well as breaking the school pole vault record at 10'6". Kaylie's pole vaulting qualified her for regionals where she placed 10th. **Graduate**, **Maddie Voiers**, who has been a member of the team all four years of her high school career, finished her last year with a personal best of 2:22 during the 4x800 at regionals. 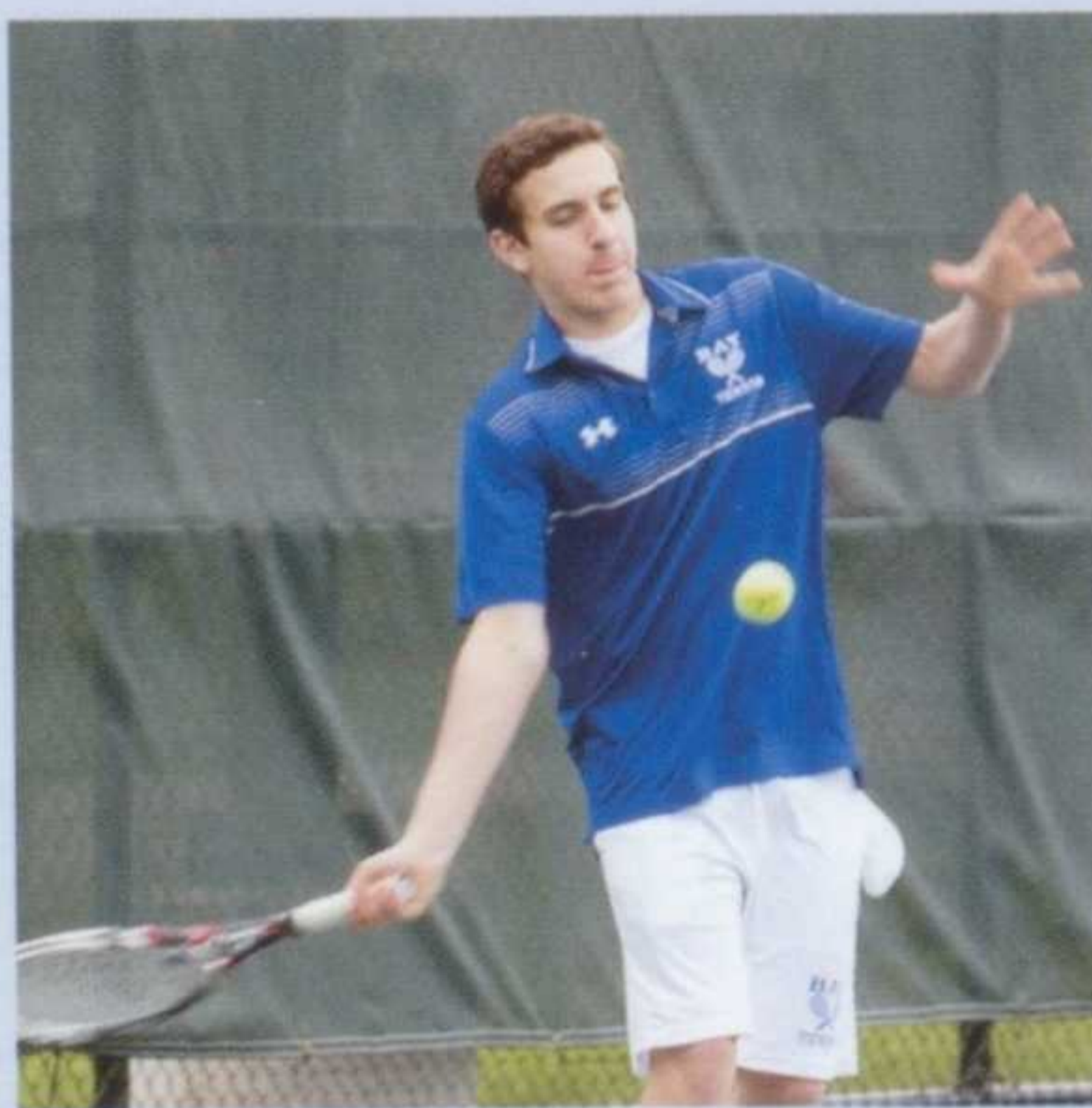

Boys Ace the Season



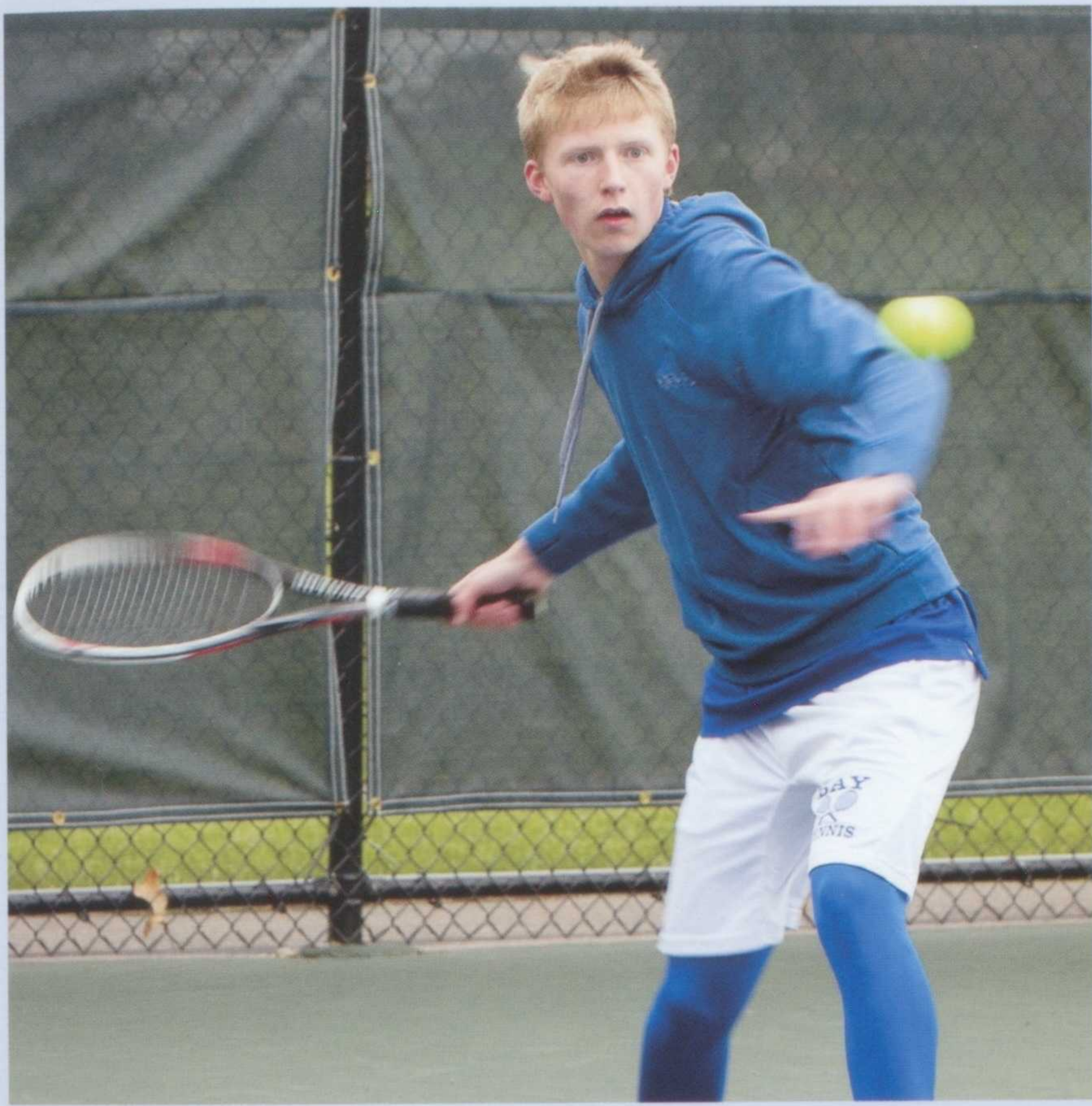

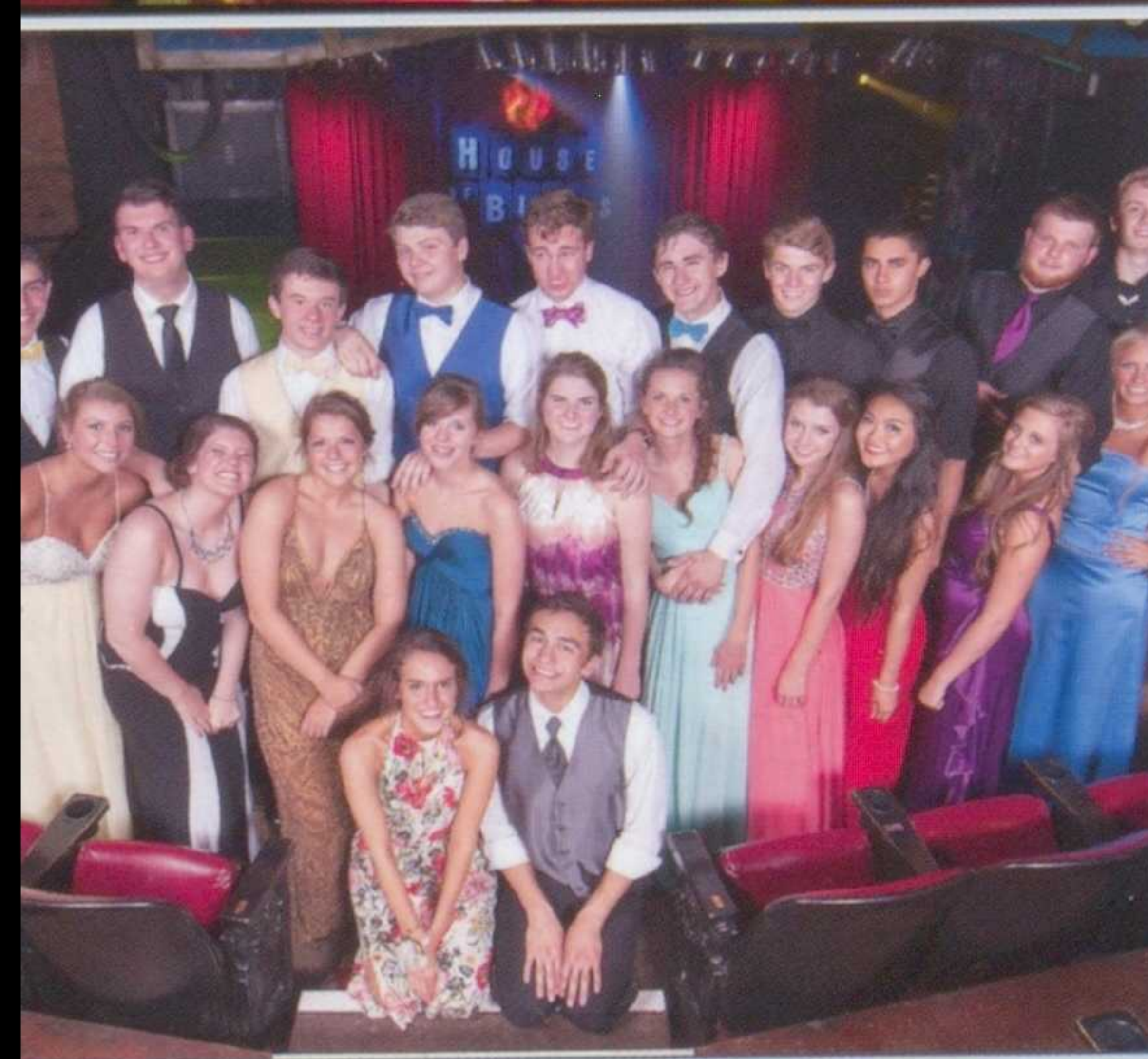
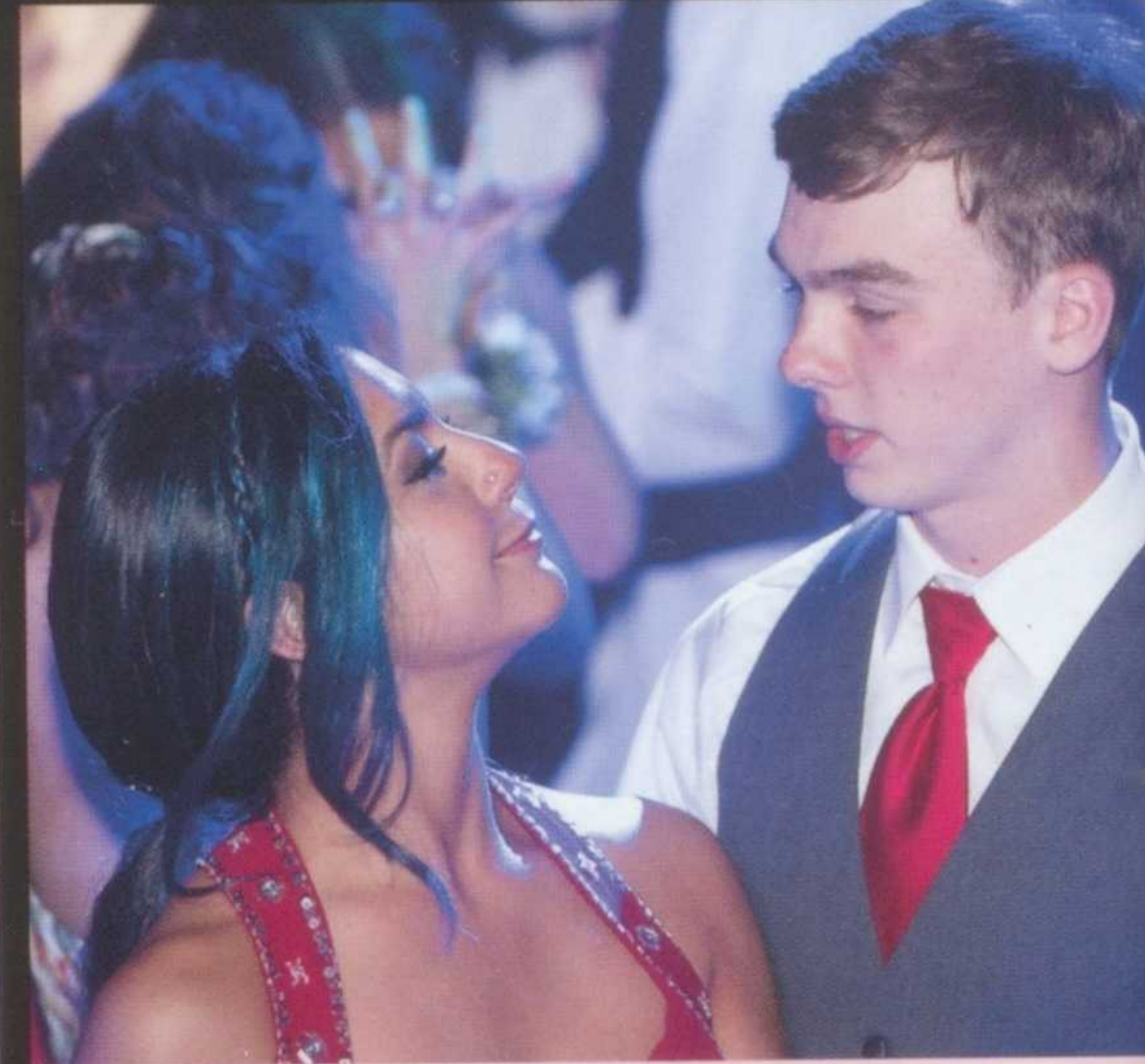
Memories at the House of Blues

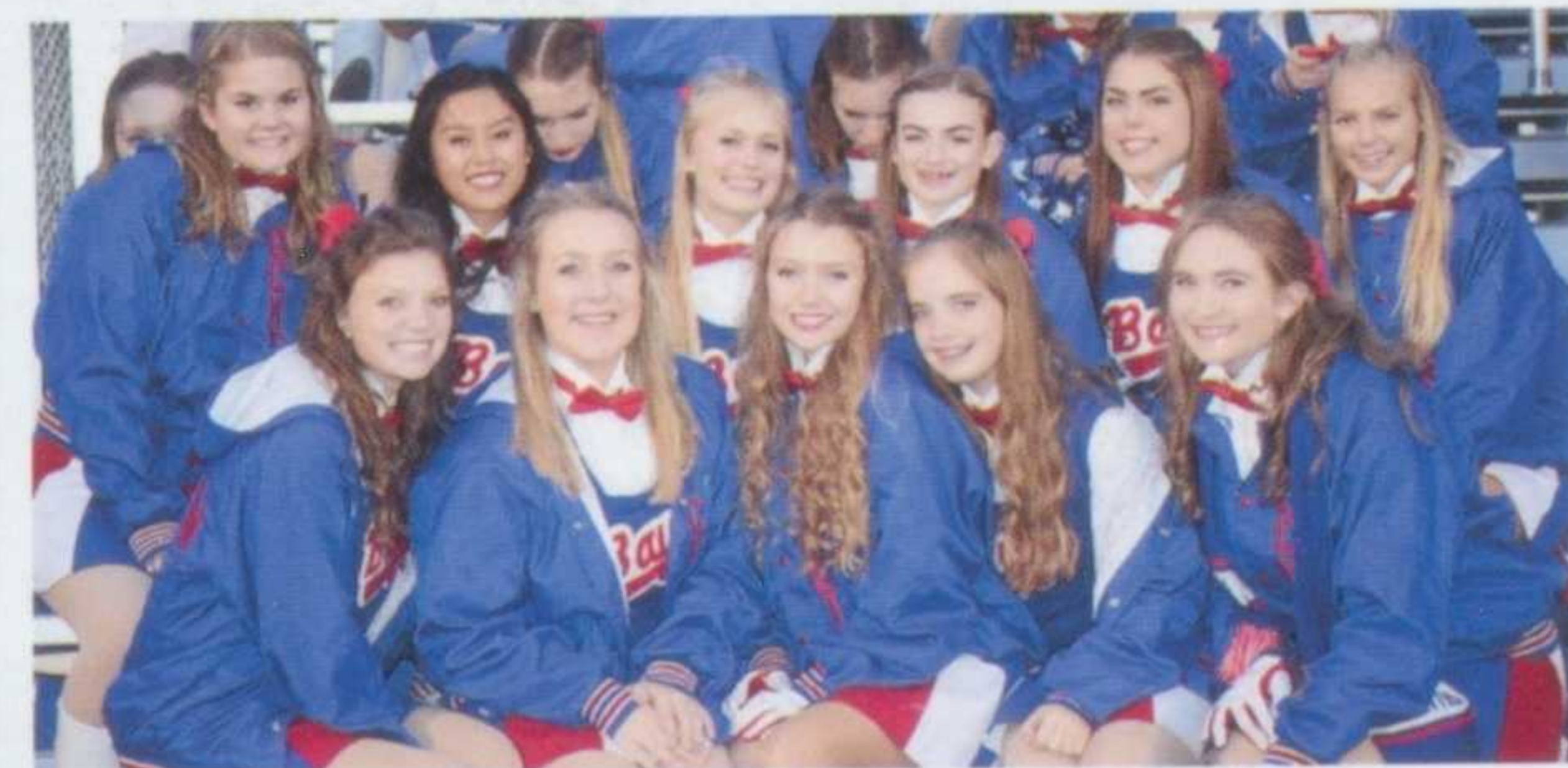

Band, Ten, Hut!

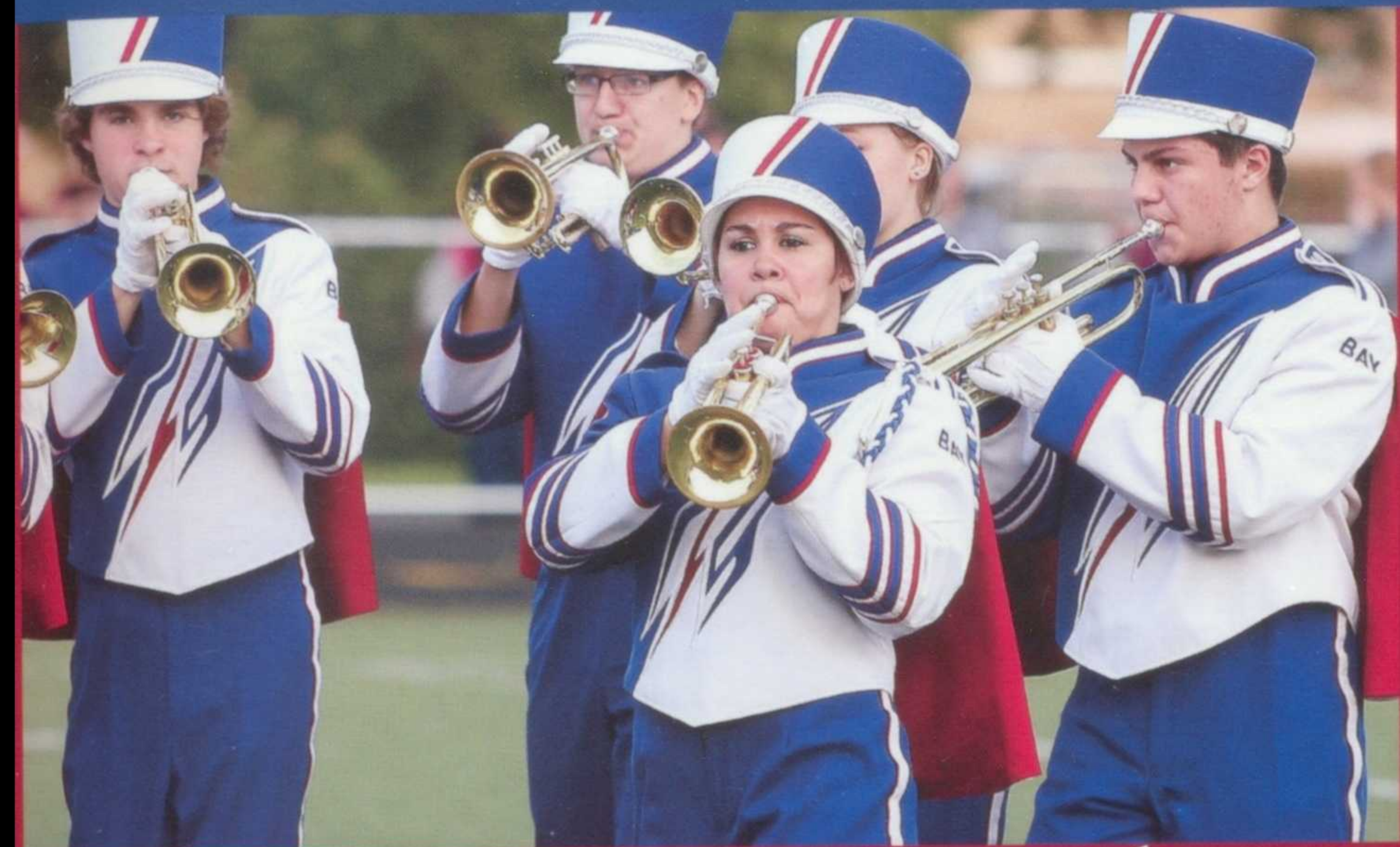

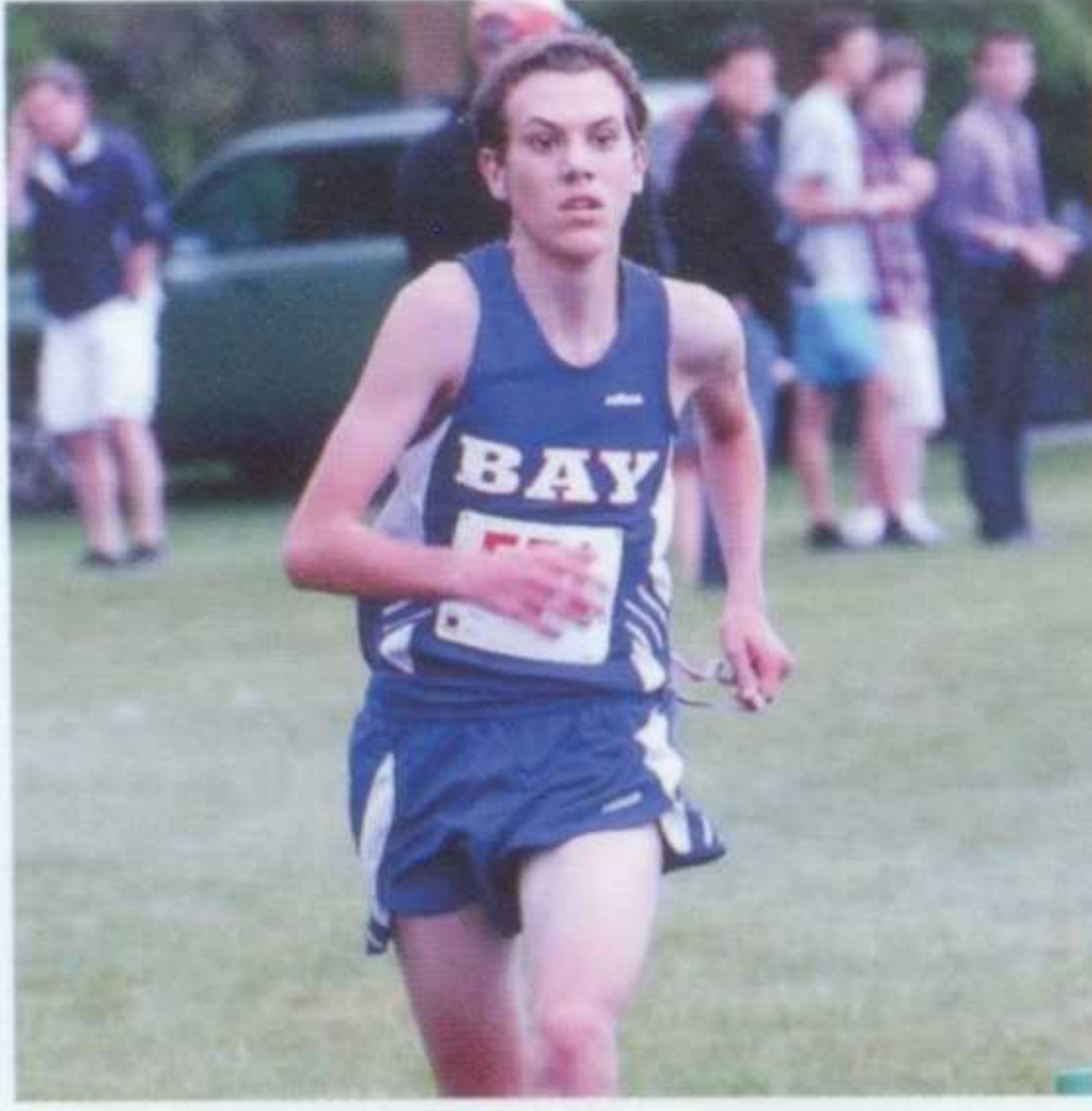

Make a Run For It



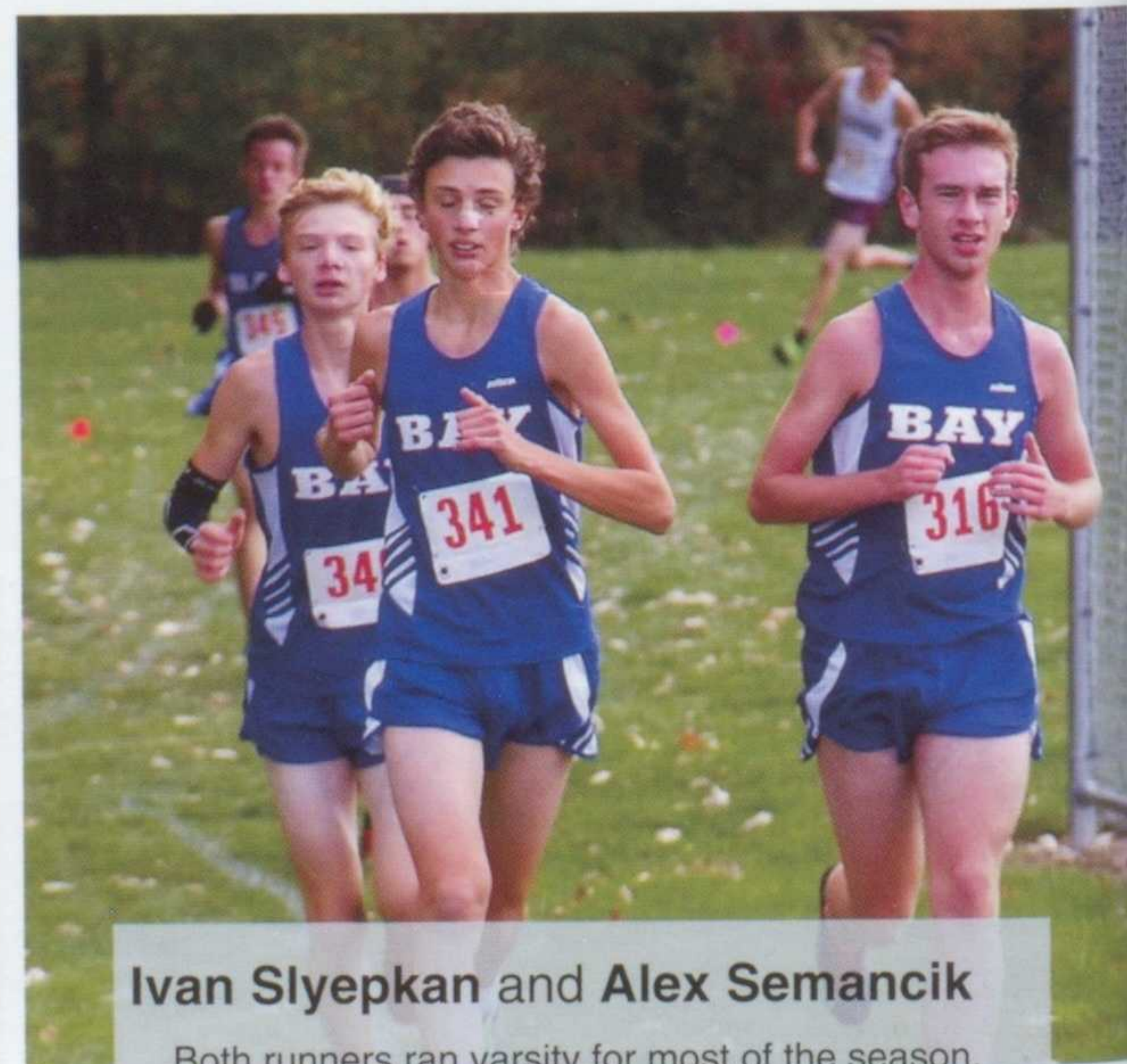

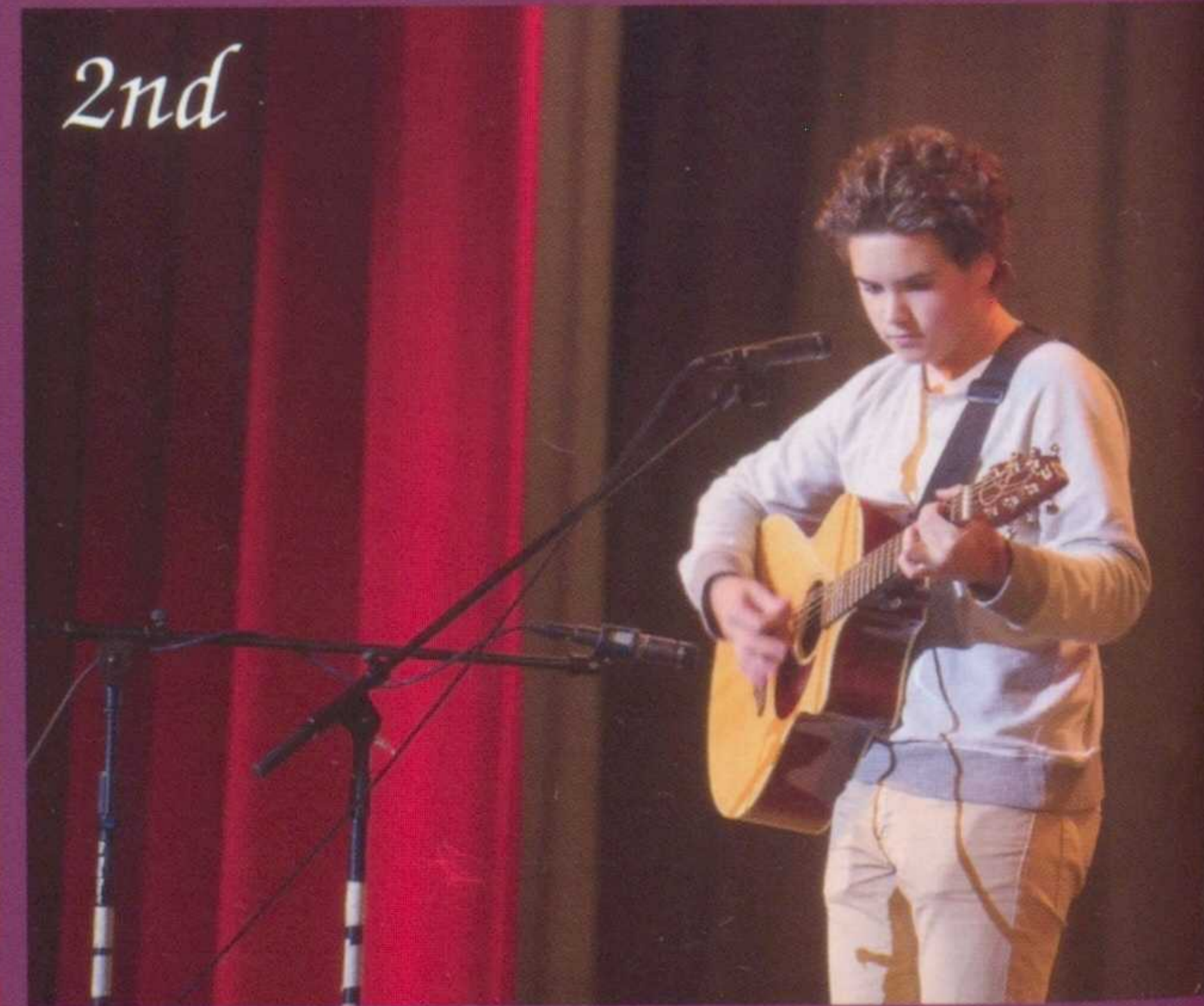
Talent Show

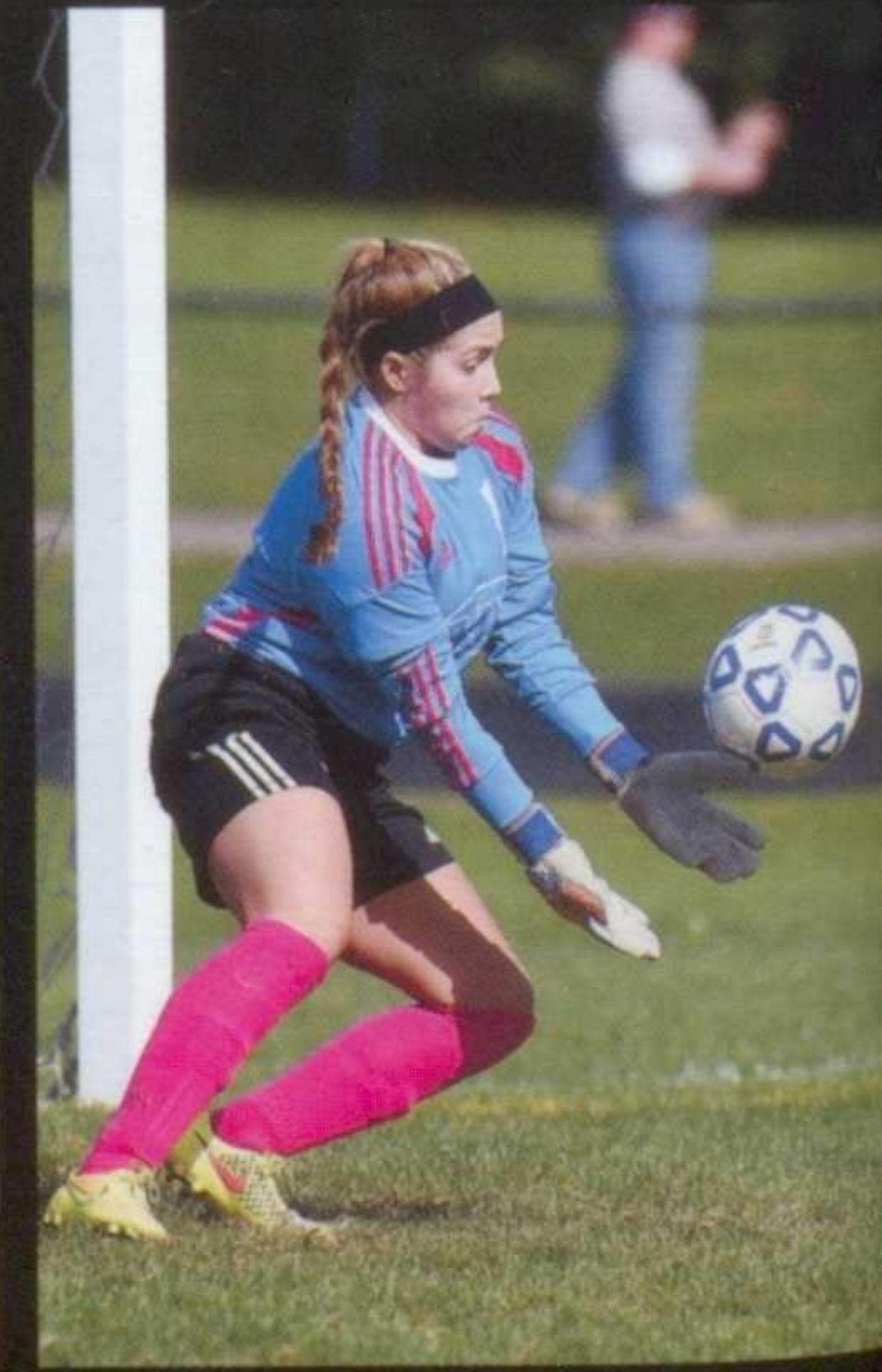
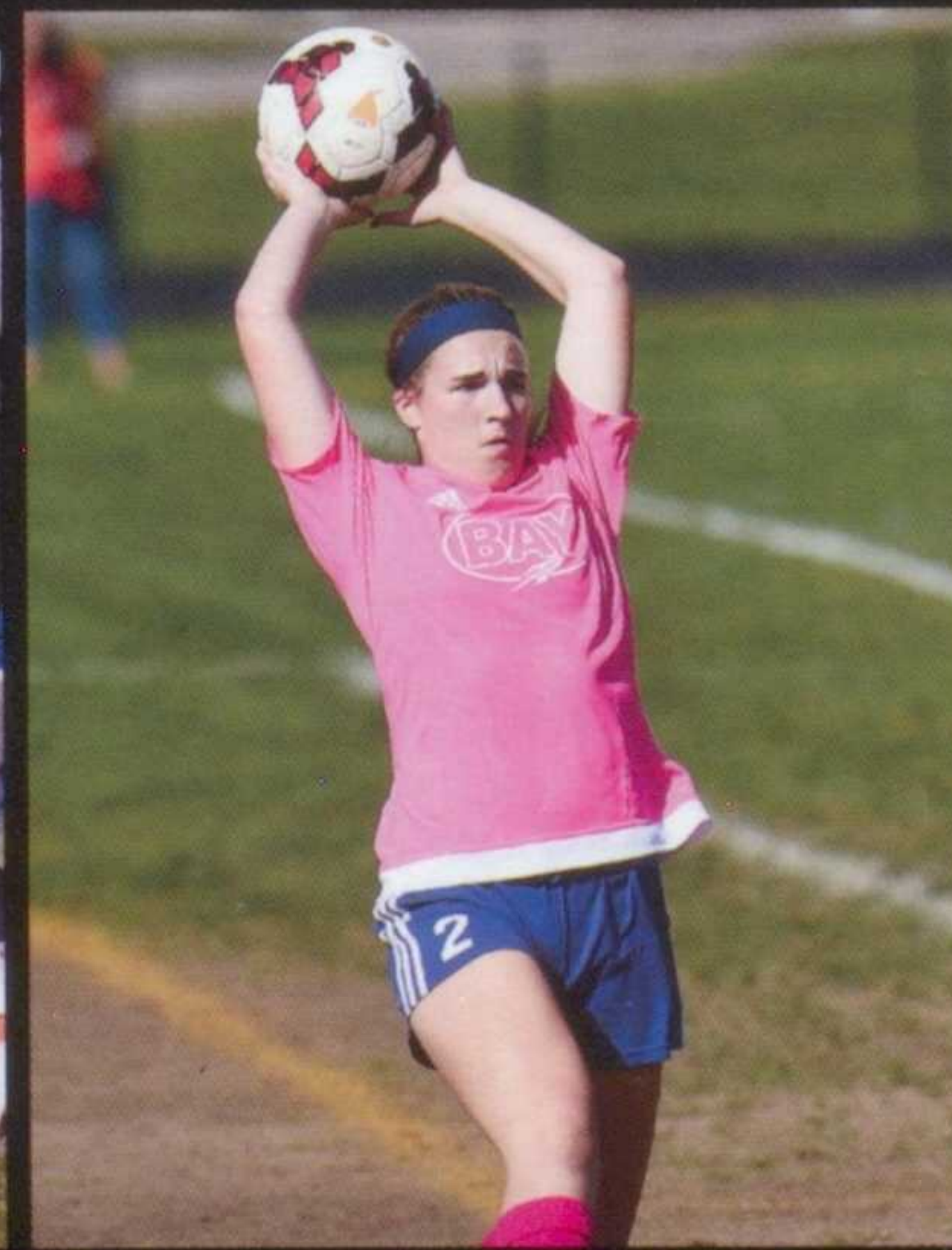
The Men's soccer team finished out the 2015 season in Columbus at the state finals. As Division 2 State Runner-Ups, the Band of Brothers had an outstanding season.

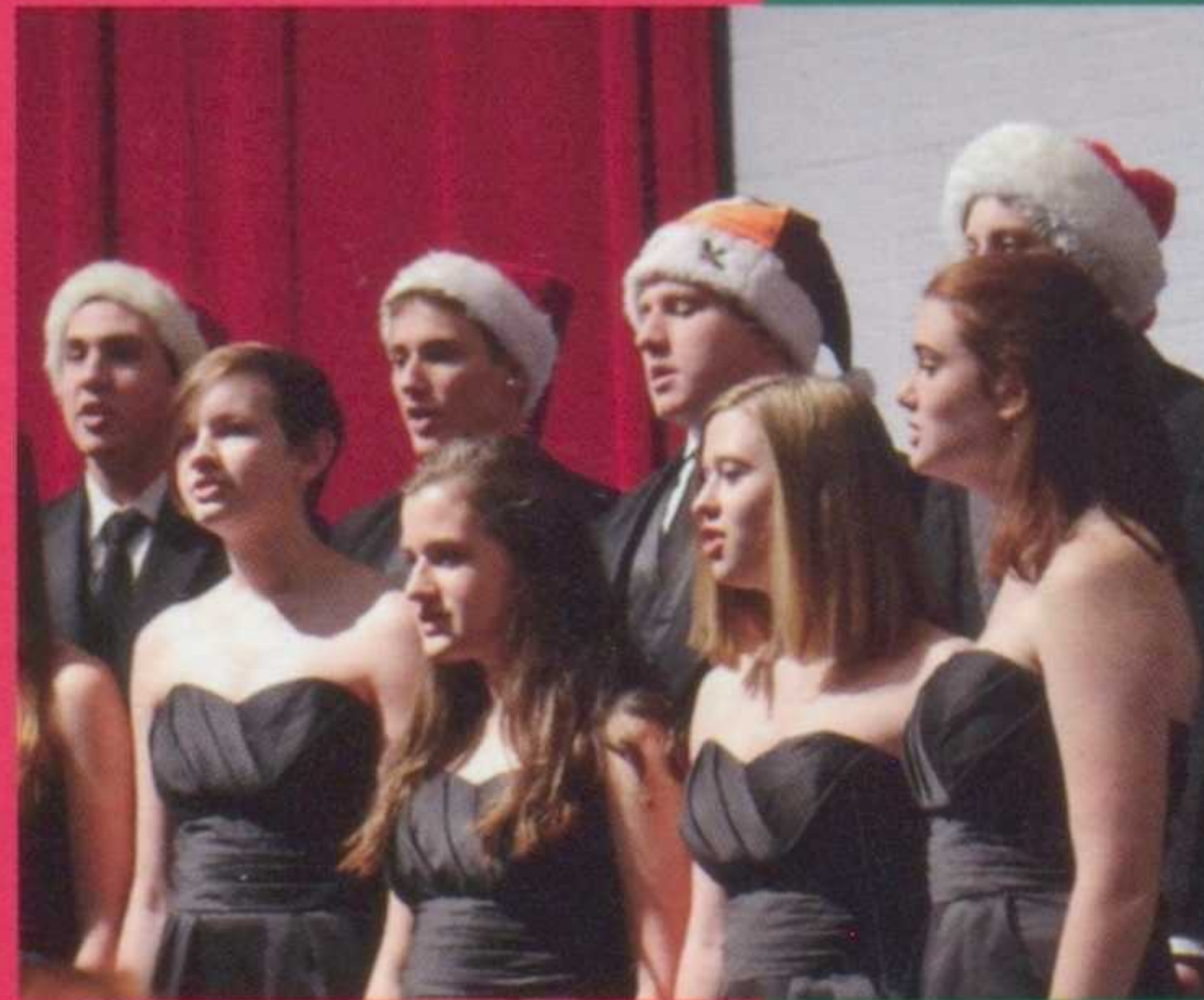
Holidays

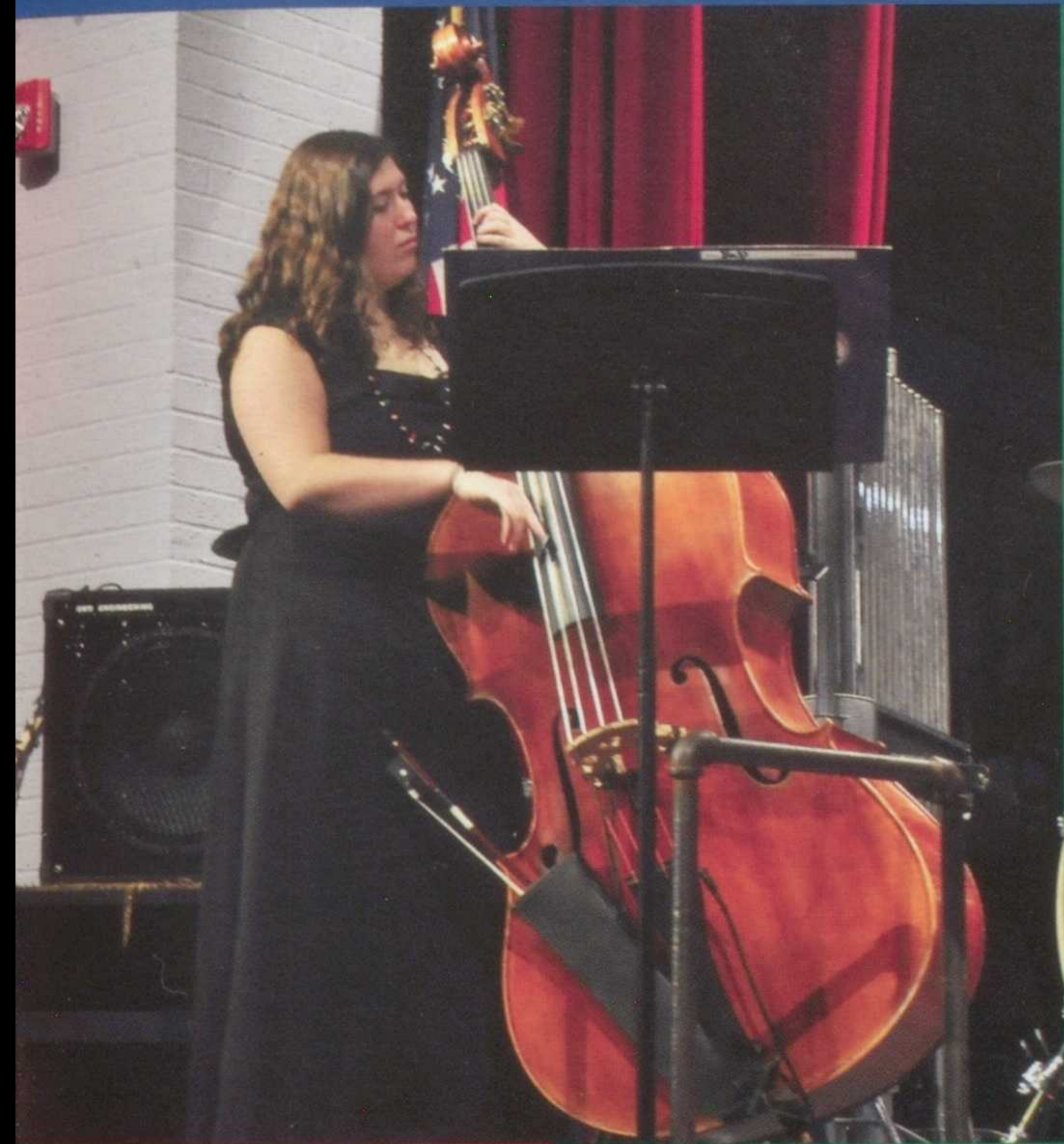

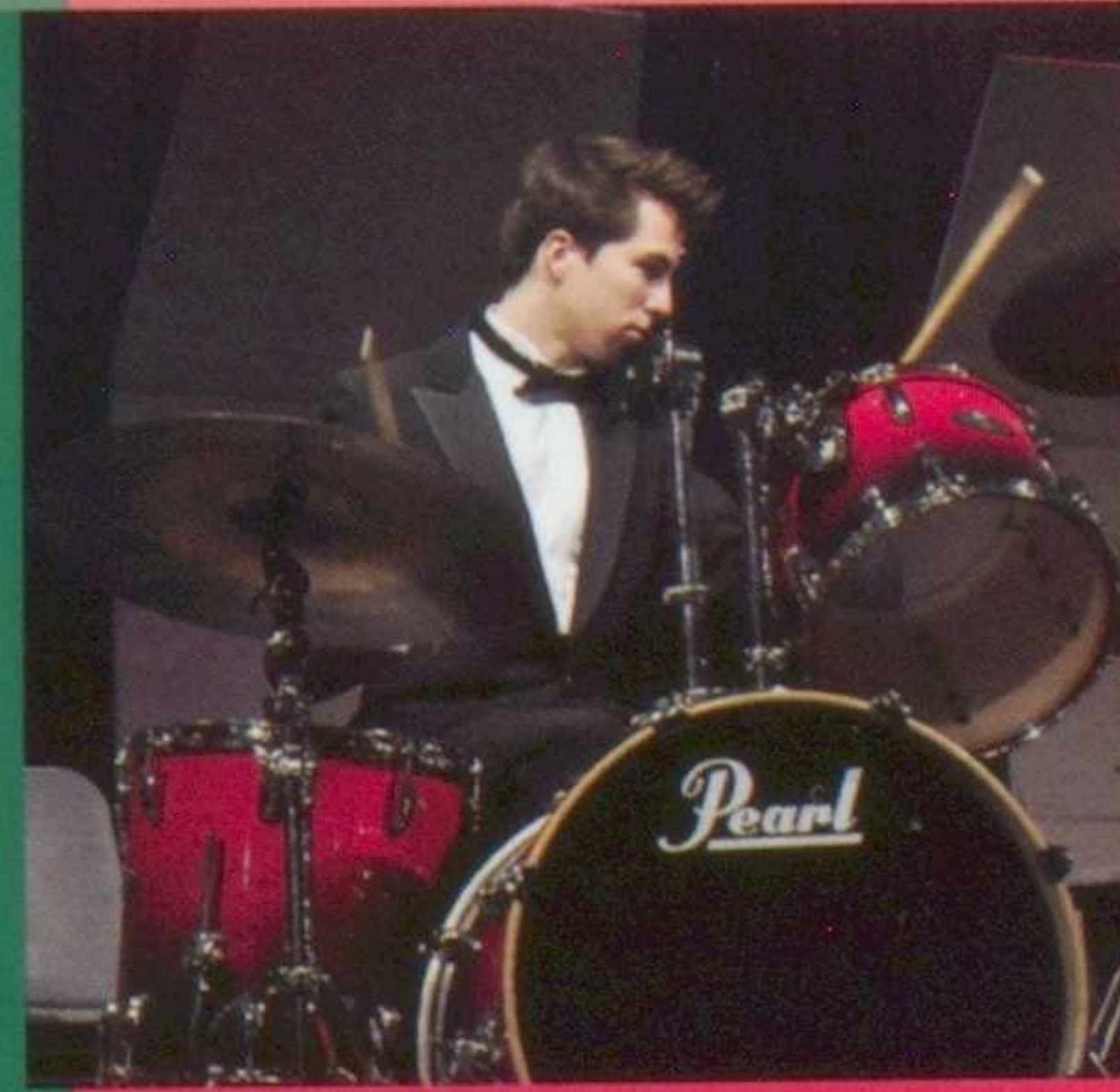
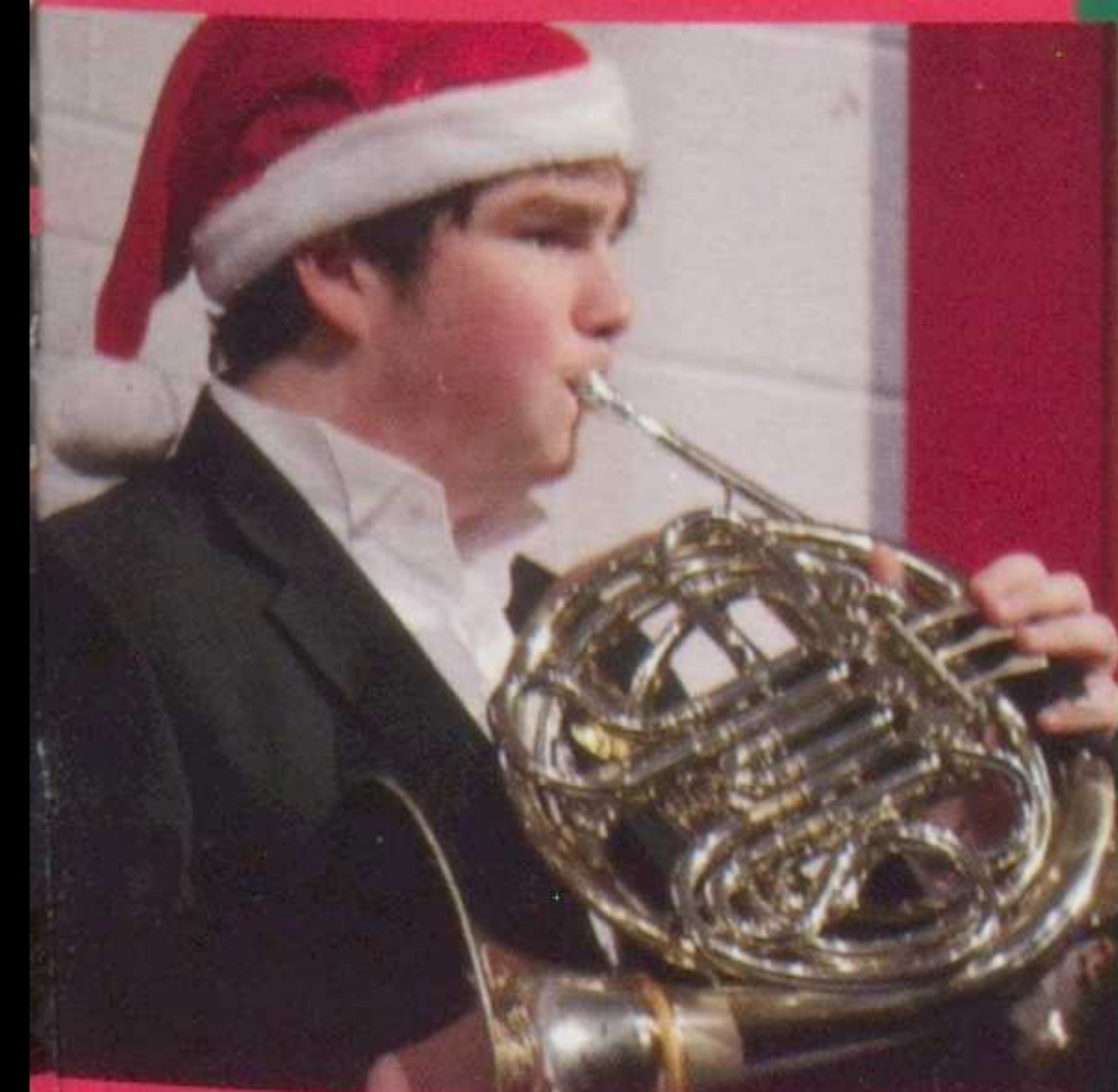

Setting records...

The 2015-2016 basketball season was a record setting year--the most accomplished basketball team in the history of Bay sports. Coach Shetzer's team--this was his third year as a head-coach--built upon a successful a 2014-15 campaign and advanced to the Division II Final Four, losing to the state champs, New Concord John Glenn team: 84-56. (All five John Glenn's starters signed with Division 1 colleges.) At conclusion of the season, Shetzer was awarded with two coach of the year awards: GLC coach of the year and Conference.

The season started with a tough game against North Olmstead in which the Rockets suffered their only home loss of the season. Afterward, the team went 1-1, beating Vermillion and losing to Holy Name. The 1-2 Rockets then caught fire, winning all remaining games but two. (Later in the season, they avenged both the North Olmstead and Holy Name loss.) In the postseason, the Rockets dominated. They crushed Brookside in their first match with a 90-36 victory. Until the John Glenn game, no opponent could trade baskets with Bay's starting five. Buckeye, Keystone, Napoleon, and Ottawa fell by at least 10 points.

John Koz, 12 stood out among many great players and now holds the team record for most career points scored with 1,279. In his final season, he averaged 21 points per game and totaled 604 points(a single season record). For his effort, he was awarded with the GLC player of the year. Freshman phenom **Erik Painter** averaged 12.2 points in his rookie season and scored a total of 342 points. **Jack Jelen, 11** lead the team in assists with 192 and **Scott Durham, 12** lead with rebounds: 261. Other major contributors were **Cole Gergye, 12; Nick Caddy, 11; and Kyle Thompson, 12.**



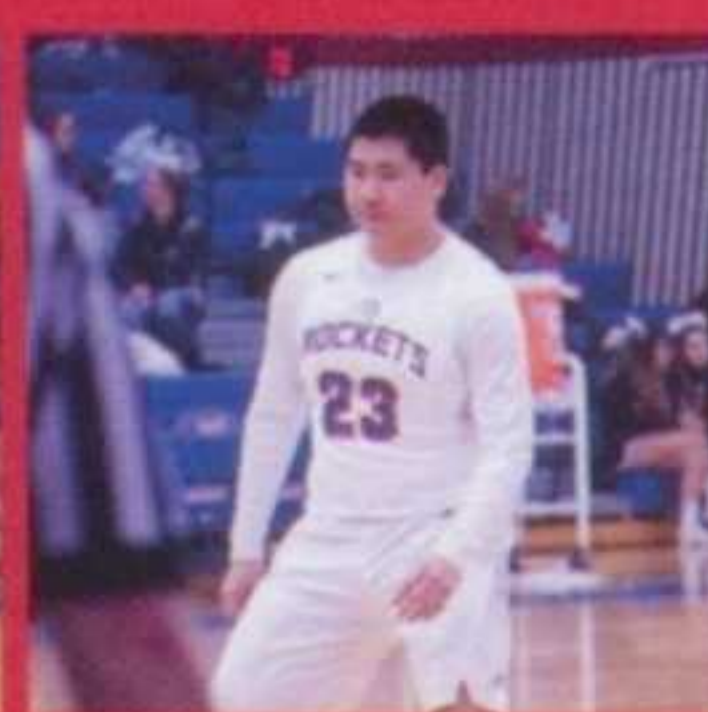

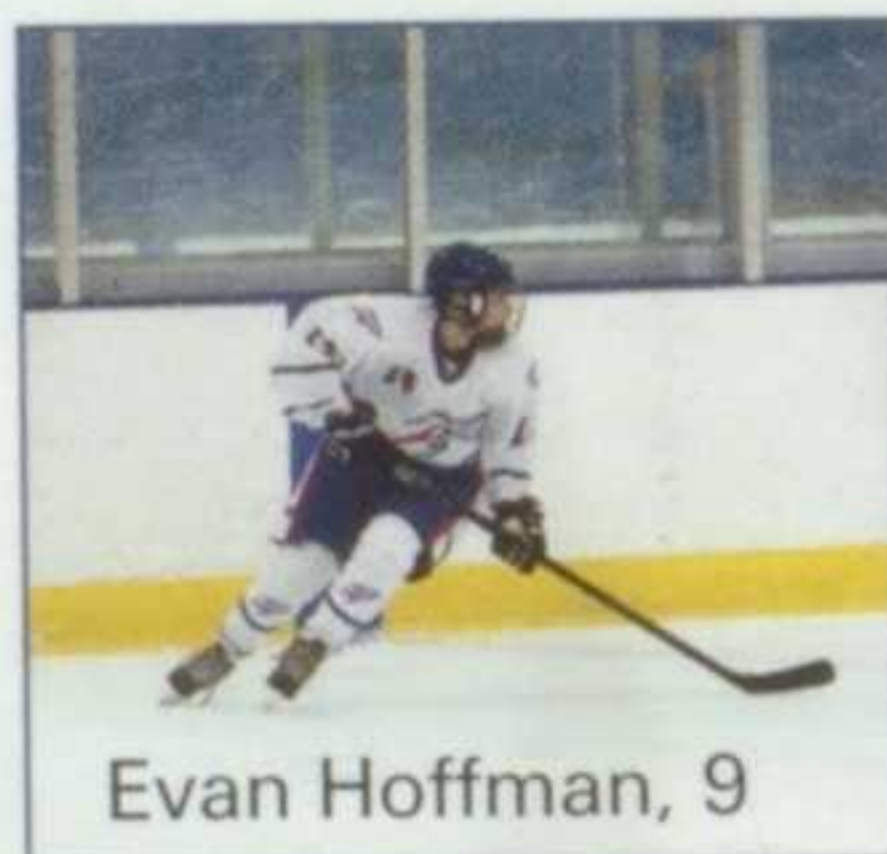
Playing for the Cup

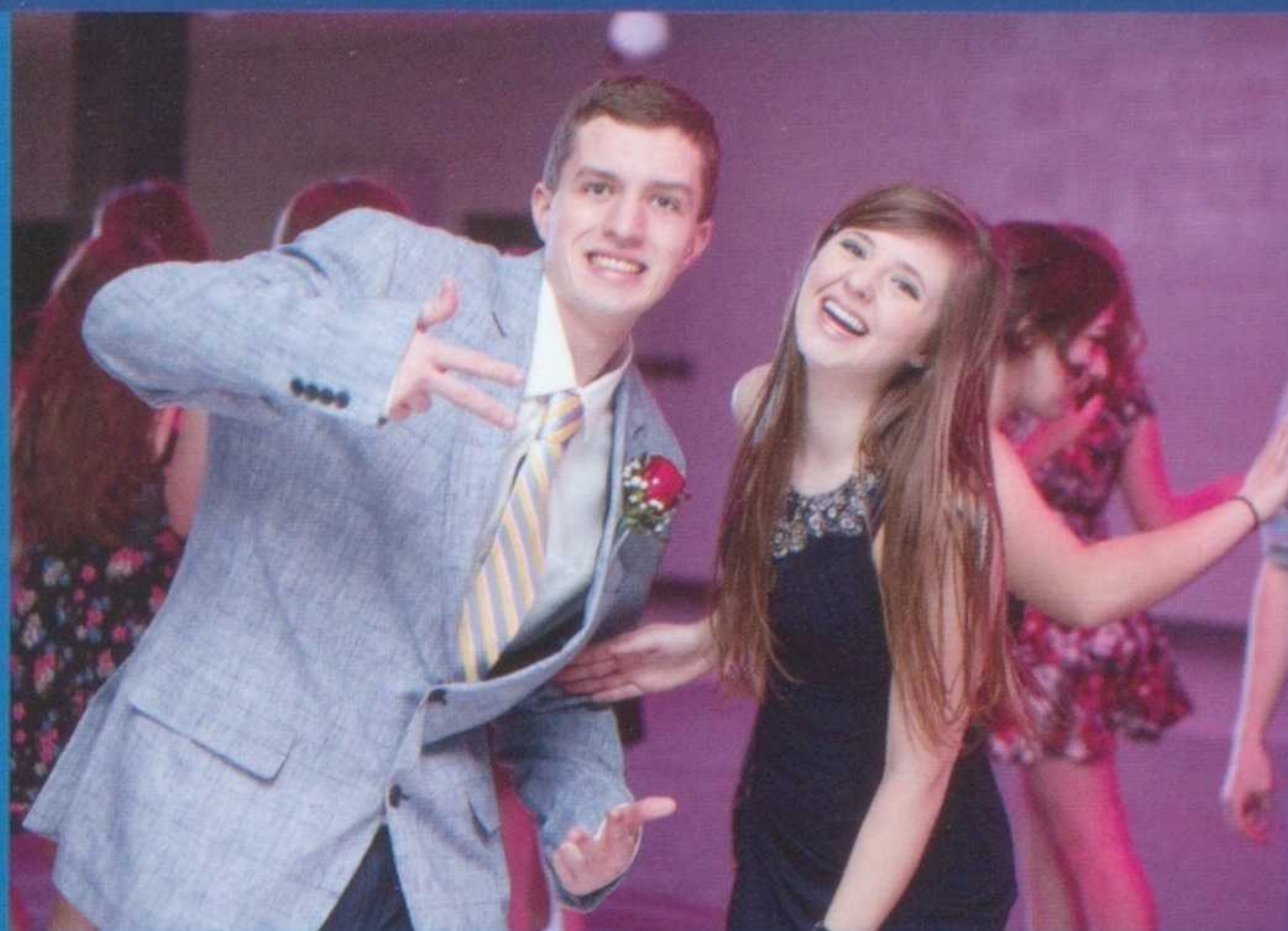
Snoball Dance

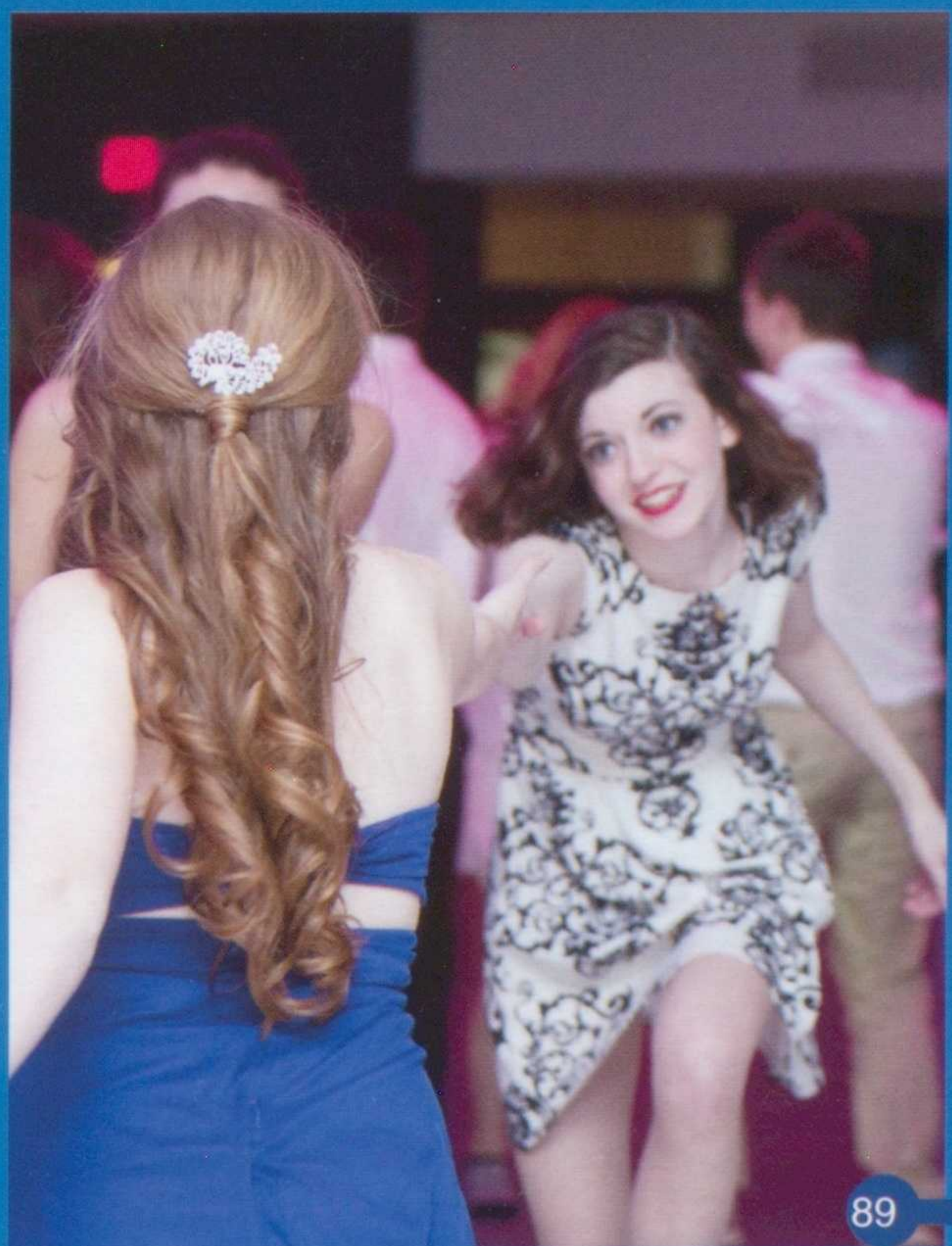

Some 50,000 students out of the 1.5 million that take the PSAT/NMSQT each year join this elite collection of individuals, and become eligible for select scholarships. In September of 2015, about 34,000 of these students receive Letters of Commendation for their outstanding academic promise; the remaining third of high-scorers become Semifinalists. As Semifinalists, these individuals are responsible for reaching high academic standards, as well as other requirements, to advance and become Finalists, where they will have the opportunity to be considered for a National Merit Scholarship. Semifinalists are notified in February of their senior year that they have advanced to Finalist standing and are officially in the competition for scholarships. This year,
