

It was a time to feel the revitalization of our treasures as we made new discoveries and created a safe space for the artifacts we have. The fire arms, dating back to the 1800's, were evaluate and cleaned by Bob Shaw. Barb Comienski created a report and appraisal of each of the dolls revealing some interesting discoveries. Ed Rowe revitalized one of our walking wheels so that spinning demonstrations on it are now possible.

The latest item we rediscovered is a table rug hand made in 1840. It is a striking artifact that was "hiding" in the library behind the Osborn weather vane. We recently welcomed Bob and Gigi Monroe back to Rose Hill. The Monroe's played a critical role in the transformation of Rose Hill from a library to a museum creating a solid foundation for the museum to go forward. Wischmeyer Boatbuilding Project

His Boat Is Finally Being Built

The Bay Village Historical Society holds a collection of boat plans drawn by Henry Wischmeyer, a hobbyist naval architect whose family ran a small Lake Road tourist hotel perched above a sandy Lake Erie beach. One of his proposed boats is finally being built 70 years after he designed it.

The Cleveland Amateur Boatbuilders (CABBS) won a John Gardner Fund grant from the Traditional Small Craft Association to build Henry's 1953 design for a 10ft. pram. A pram is a boat with a sawn-off or flat front end rather than a conventional pointy end. It is made for getting into tight spaces.

The Wischmeyer boat will be used to clean-up a debris trapping channel of North Coast Harbor, the lakefront area behind the Rock-n-Roll Hall of Fame. The channel is very narrow and has a right angle turn in it which creates floating mats of debris visible to thousands of passing pedestrians. The Wischmeyer boat is small enough to fit into the channel and will work in conjunction with the Port of Cleveland clean-up boats, FLOTSAM and JETSAM to dramatically clear the channel on a regular basis.

Want to see the boat under construction? The Cleveland Amateur Boatbuilders workspace will be open to visitors on **each Sunday in May 1:30 – 4:30 PM.** Visitors can see boatbuilding activity and – possibly - join in for some hands-on experiences. Children are welcome!




